### ROYAL COMMISSION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God of Great Britain and Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, Greeting:

To the Honourable William Charles Angwin, C.M.G., of Fremantle, Member of the Fremantle Harbour Trust; Stephen Bede Donovan, Esquire, of Cunderdin, Farmer; and Joseph Samuel Foulkes, Esquire, of Perth, Accountant. I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint you William Charles Angwin, Stephen Bede Donovan, and Joseph Samuel Foulkes to be a Royal Commission (you the said William Charles Angwin to be Chairman of the said Commission) to investigate, report, and advise upon the following matters:—

(1) The operations of all persons, firms, companies and other bodies engaged in carrying on, whether for profit or otherwise, the bulk handling of wheat in Western Australia during the wheat season last past;

(2) The operations and transactions of the Commissioner of Railways and any other State Government Department or State instrumentality in connection with or incidental to the bulk handling of wheat as carried on in Western Australia during the wheat season last past;

(3) All other matters, transactions, and things connected with, relating to, or incidental to the operations in respect of the bulk handling of wheat as carried on in Western Australia during the wheat season last past;

(4) Any other matter which in your opinion it is expedient to investigate, report, and advise upon in connection with the operations in respect of the bulk handling of wheat as carried on in Western Australia during the wheat season last past;

(5) In relation to the matters set forth in paragraphs 1 to 4 above, both inclusive, to investigate, report, and advise in particular upon the following matters:—

- (a) In so far as concerns the bulk handling of wheat as carried on in Western Australia during the wheat season last past by all or any of the companies or bodies following, that is to say, The Co-operative Bulk Handling, Limited; The Wheat Pool of Western Australia, Westralian Farmers, Limited; and Westralian Wheat Farmers, Limited, the connection and relationship (if any), financial and otherwise, existing between the said companies;
- (b) the charges and costs made and incurred by Co-operative Bulk Handling, Limited, in connection with the bulk handling of wheat as carried on in Western Australia by that company during the wheat season last past, and the wastage and deterioration of the grain, including over and under grade wheat, rejected wheat, dock-ages, and surplus or deficit of out-turn which occurred in the course of the bulk handling of wheat as carried out as aforesaid;
- (c) the differential shipping charges and costs and rebates (if any) which were made or incurred as the result of the operations of Co-operative Bulk Handling, Limited, in the course of the bulk handling of wheat as carried on by that company as aforesaid;
- (d) whether the bulk handling of wheat as carried on in Western Australia during the wheat season last past has been of advantage to the wheat-growing industry of Western Australia, and, if so, to what extent;
- (e) whether the bulk handling of wheat as carried on in Western Australia during the wheat season last past has involved the State Government or Governmental or semi-Governmental activities in any loss, either in capital moneys or by way of revenue, and, if so, to what extent;
- (f) whether the balance of gain or loss arising from the bulk handling of wheat as carried on in Western Australia during the wheat season last past warrants the continuance or discontinuance of the method or methods of bulk handling of wheat as carried on in Western Australia during the wheat season last past;

(g) all other considerations having any relevant and important bearing on the continuance of any method or methods of bulk handling of wheat as carried on in Western Australia during the wheat season last past, and, in particular, the question of the displacement of labour (if any) which arose therefrom.

(6) The best method of handling the wheat harvest in Western Australia, having due regard to all relevant and material considerations in relation thereto.

(7) The probable cost which would be incurred in establishing and operating throughout the State an efficient, comprehensive, and otherwise generally approved system of bulk handling of wheat, including cost covering railways and harbours, and, in comparison, the probable cost which would be incurred in establishing and operating throughout the State any other method of handling the wheat harvest in Western Australia as considered and reported upon by you under this Commission.

And I declare that you shall, by virtue of this Commission, be a Royal Commission within "The Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902," as reprinted in the Appendix to the Sessional Volume of the Statutes for the year 1928, and that you shall have the powers of a Royal Commission or the Chairman thereof under that Act.

And I hereby request you as soon as reasonably may be to report to me in writing the result of this your Commission.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 222 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919-33," that a Road Board may adopt in any area defined for that purpose by Proclamation the system of valuation on the Annual Value, and whereas it is desired to enable the Meckering Road Board to adopt the system of valuation on the Annual Value on that portion of the District described in the Schedule hereto: Now, therefore, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the Meckering Road Board may adopt the system of valuation on the

Annual Value on that portion of the District described in the Schedule hereto, and may impose Rates on the rateable land within such area on the Annual Value thereof, in accordance with the relative provisions of the said Act and any Proclamation heretofore or hereafter issued thereunder and for the time being in force.

##### Schedule.

All that portion of Cunderdin Townsite bounded on the Northward by a line commencing at the junction of the prolongation North of the West side of Togo Street with a North side of Forrest Street and extending East, North, and again East along part of the Northern boundary of the Townsite to the North-East corner of Lot 1 of Avon Location 2222 (L.T.O. Plan No. 2296); thence East through Avon Location 2223 for a distance of one chain; thence South through said location to its Southern boundary and Westward along said boundary to its South-West corner; thence South, Eastward, Northward, and again Eastward along part of the Northern boundary of the Townsite to its East boundary.

Bounded on the East by the East boundary of the Townsite from the last-mentioned point to the production East of the North side of Sixth Street.

Bounded on the Southward by a line commencing at the last-mentioned point and extending West along said production and North side of Sixth Street to the Eastern side of Cubbine Street; thence Northward along said side of Cubbine Street to the production East of the South side of Watts Street; thence West along said production to the Eastern side of Halbert Street; thence Northward along said side of Halbert Street to the production East of the South boundary of Cunderdin Lot 118; thence West along said production and South boundary of Lot 118, and the South boundaries of Lots 117 and 116 to the East side of Counsel Street; thence along said side of Counsel Street to the production East of the South boundary of Lot 57; thence West along said production and South boundary of Lot 57 and North along its West boundary to the South side of Yilgarn Street; thence West along the last-mentioned to its junction with the West boundary of the Townsite.

Bounded on the Westward by part of the Townsite boundary; from said junction to the starting point.

The Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 15th day of July, 1932, page 995, under the provisions of Section 213 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," empowering the Meckering Road Board to adopt the system of valuation on the Annual Value and defining an area for that purpose, is hereby repealed.

"(o) 'Shift worker' shall mean a worker who changes his starting and finishing times in alternate weeks and works twelve (12) hours or more (before 7 a.m. and/or after 6 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive and 1 p.m. on Saturdays) in one of such weeks."

Hayward & Son, Limited; Tippings, Limited; Narrogin Trading & Agency Co., Ltd.; Caris Bros.; H. H. Sherry; T. P. Chadd; Prosser's Boot Palace; Roy's Hardware Store; Manchester House; R. Forrest & Co.; "Ezywalkin," Limited (hereinafter called "the Employers"), and in the matter of an Application by the abovenamed Union for a Declaration that the said Agreement be made a Common Rule.

UPON hearing Mr. R. Bourke, on behalf of the applicant Union, there being no appearance on behalf of any party desiring to be heard in opposition, and upon being satisfied that the requirements of the Act and the Regulations have been complied with, the Court doth declare that the Industrial Agreement dated the 6th day of June, 1934, and registered No. 7 of 1934, made between the Union and the employers, shall have the effect of an Award and be a Common Rule of the industry or industries to which it relates within an area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the Post Office, Bunbury.

General Hospital Industrial Agreement.

No. 2 of 1935.

Operating from 1st September, 1934.

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, between the Minister for Public Health for the State of Western Australia, as the Minister controlling the Perth Hospital; the Fremantle Hospital; the King Edward Memorial Hospital, and the Old Women's Home, Fremantle (the said Minister for Public Health entering into these presents in respect of the said Perth Hospital, Fremantle Hospital, and the King Edward Memorial Hospital, and Old Women's Home, Fremantle, only); the Children's Hospital, Incorporated; Home of Peace, Incorporated (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the one part, and the Hospital Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. (Coastal Branch) (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part: witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office, in the City of Perth.

2.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of one year from the 1st September, 1934.

3.—Definition.

"Head orderly"—The term "Head orderly" shall mean a person performing the duties of an orderly, and who is responsible for directing the activities of other orderlies.

4.—Hours of Duty.

(a) Forty-four hours to be worked on any six days of the week shall constitute a week's work for workers employed at the King Edward Memorial Hospital and the Old Women's Home, Fremantle.

(b) Laundry workers:—Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work, and, except where other hours are mutually agreed upon between the Union and any institution, shall be worked between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and between 3 a.m. and noon on Saturdays.

(c) In the event of altered hours being required by any institution and the Union not agreeing to such alteration, the matter may be referred to a Reference Board for decision.

(d) All other workers:—Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work, and shall be worked on any six days of the week.

5.—Overtime.

(a) Laundry staff:—All time worked in excess of eight hours, on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and four hours on Saturday shall be regarded as overtime and be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and thereafter double time.

(b) All other workers:—All time worked on any day in excess of the time for which the worker is rostered shall be regarded as overtime, and paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and thereafter double time:

Provided that, if the overtime is occasioned through the failure of another worker to report for duty, equivalent time off duty may be granted in lieu of paying for overtime.

(c) Workers required to work on the day on which they are rostered off duty shall, at the option of the worker, be paid at the rate of double time for time worked or be paid at ordinary rates and allowed equivalent time off.

(d) Workers called upon to work, in addition to ordinary duties, in the venereal clinic at night shall, for time so worked during the night, be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and thereafter double time.

## 6.—Rosters.

Weekly rosters shall be kept posted in a convenient place, setting out the hours of starting and finishing, and the duties of each worker thereon, together with the day each worker is booked off duty. Such roster shall be drawn up in such a manner as to show the hours of each worker, forty-eight hours preceding the date on which the roster commences, and may only be altered on account of the sickness or the absence of a worker, or on account of any contingency that the employer could not reasonably foresee.

## 7.—Time Book.

(a) A time book, to be open for inspection by the Union secretary at reasonable time, shall be provided. Each worker must record in such book the exact time he or she starts and finishes duty on each day, and also the time booked off for meals or breaks in shift: provided that if the "clocking" system be introduced it will, for the purpose of this clause, be considered as a time book.

(b) The wages sheets shall, upon reasonable notice being given, be open for inspection by the secretary at the head office of the institution.

## 8.—Holidays.

(a) The following days shall be observed as holidays, namely, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Foundation Day, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Anzac Day. Any worker required to work on the foregoing days shall be paid at the rate of time and a half, or be allowed time off in lieu thereof.

(b) A holiday of two weeks on full pay, together with a board and lodging allowance of £1 0s. 10d. per week, in the case of those workers who are paid on a living-in basis, shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of service. A worker not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holiday in proportion to the length of his or her service. Provided always, that if the worker be dismissed for misconduct or any offence, no payment for annual leave or holidays will be granted for any period subsequent to the date of the offence.

## 9.—Sick Leave.

(a) In the case of illness, provided a satisfactory medical certificate is furnished, full pay shall be allowed as follows:—

- Workers with less than six months' service—nil.
- Workers with six months' and less than one year's service—14 days.
- Workers with one year's and less than two years' service—28 days.
- Workers with two years' service and over—42 days.

Such sick leave shall be granted in one or more periods, but the aggregate amount of leave on pay shall be as provided.

(b) The total sick leave in any one triennial period shall not exceed 42 days; the triennial period to be the three years preceding the date of illness for which leave is claimed.

(c) No payment for sick leave shall be made when the illness is due to the worker's own misconduct, or to an accident met with off duty.

(d) Sick leave, if granted, will only be recognised provided a medical certificate be placed in the hands of the Hospital secretary within forty-eight hours of the rostered time for commencement of duty.

(e) When workers are required to live-in, a charge of £1 0s. 10d. per week will be made for "Board and lodging."

(f) Where employees who are paid on living-out basis are provided with meals by the institution, a deduction shall be made from the wages at the rate of 7d. for each meal provided.

## 11.—Payment of Wages.

Wages, including overtime, if any, shall be paid fortnightly, and such payment shall be made in cash.

## 12.—Dressing Room.

Reasonable facilities for rest rooms for those boarding-in, and dressing rooms for laundry staff living-out, shall be provided.

## 13.—Uniforms.

(a) All uniforms, i.e., uniformity in dress, shall be supplied free of cost to all workers required to wear them. Aprons shall be provided for all female workers on the Kitchen and General Staff.

(b) Suitable clothing shall be available for men on "dirty work."

(c) Boots shall be available for kitchenmen, laundrymen, and washhouse-women.

## 14.—Casual Workers.

All persons engaged for a period of less than six days in any one week shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent., in addition to the rates hereinbefore prescribed, with a minimum engagement of one day: Provided that this shall not apply in the case of a worker summarily dismissed for misconduct.

## 15.—No Reduction.

Provided that nothing contained in this Agreement shall operate to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Agreement is being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.



16.—General Clauses.

(a) No female worker shall be called upon to clean men's lavatories in or about any institution.

(b) A worker required to take a day off duty not already shown on the roster for such day must be so informed before booking off on the day previous.

(c) All washing to be provided as at present.

(d) Space shall be provided at the workers' quarters for the purpose of posting Union notices.

(e) A worker who is required to do work which carries a higher rate in this Agreement than that which such worker usually performs shall be entitled to the higher rate while so employed.

(f) When a worker is entitled to annual leave under this Agreement, such worker shall be given at least two weeks' notice of the date when such leave is to commence, and such leave shall be for an unbroken period.

(g) Copy of this Agreement shall be posted in a conspicuous position by the Secretary or Chief Resident Medical Officer of every institution.

(h) Overtime rates shall be calculated and based on the aggregate wage, i.e., the amount paid in cash, plus the deduction for board and/or lodging.

(i) If a worker's day off falls on a day prescribed by this Agreement as a holiday, such worker shall be allowed another day in lieu thereof.

(j) Letter racks shall be provided in the dining rooms for male and female workers.
