GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God of Great Britain and Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, Greeting:

1. Inquire into and consider the provisions of "The Electoral Act, 1907-1921," and the provisions of "The Constitution Acts Amendment Act, 1899," dealing with electoral matters, with the periodical election of members of the Legislative Council and with the periodical general election of members of the Legislative Assembly, and to make any recommendations which the Commission think advisable for the amendment of the laws contained therein or appertaining thereto.

2. Consider the advisability or otherwise of having a joint roll or rolls for both Commonwealth and State parliamentary elections, and to make any recommendations in connection therewith which the Commission

And I hereby appoint you the said John Collings Willcock to be Chairman of the said Commission.

And I declare that you shall, by virtue of this Commission, be a Royal Commission within "The Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902," as reprinted in the Appendix to the Sessional Volume of the Statutes for the year 1928, and that you shall have the powers of a Royal Commission or the Chairman thereof under that Act.

And I hereby request you, as soon as reasonably may be, to report to me in writing the result of this your Commission.

# Dedication of Public Highways. City of Perth Municipality. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, | By His Excellency Sir James Mitcheli, | K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

L. & S. 2753/34. WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange as Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the City of Poeth Myniging Council has requested that see City of Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain lands, named and described in the Schedule hereunder, which have been used for streets or ways within the Municipality of City of Perth be declared public highways: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said lands to be public highways, and such lands shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as highways, within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this twenty-third day of January, 1935, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 882/34.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend waterworks, sewerage works and stormwater drainage works; And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from ecrtain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22 and 23 of the said Act:—

Description and Location of Reticulation Works Approved and Exempted:—The construction as a reticula-tion work of a 12-inch diameter pipe sewer, with manholes and all other apparatus connected therewith:— Commencing at Manhole 27 on Second Section of Claremont Main Sewer and proceeding in a Southerly direction for a distance of 1,461 feet along Stirling Road to Manhole 259, on South side of Stirling Highway, in lieu of 9-inch diameter sewer between Manhole 27 on Second Section of Claremont Main Sewer, and proceeding in a Southerly direction for a distance of 1,461 feet along Stirling Road to Manhole 259, on South side of Stirling Highway; also commencing at Manhole 352 on the South side of Stirling Highway opposite the North-West corner of Lot 1, Stirling Highway, and proceed-ing in a Southerly direction for a distance of 175 feet through Lot 1, Stirling Highway, to Manhole 359 situated in right-of-way South of Lot 1, Stirling Highway, in lieu of 6-inch diameter sewer between Manhole 372 situated on the South side of Stirling Highway opposite the North-West corner of Lot 3, Stirling Highway, and proceeding in a Southerly direction for a distance of 175 feet through Lot 3, Stirling Highway, to Manhole 371, situated in right-of-way South of Lot 3, Stirling Highway, which were portions of the works advertised in the Government Gazette of Western Australia on the third day of August, 1934, and as detailed in the plans and specifications therein referred to; also the construction as a reticulation work of a 6-inch diameter stoneware pipe sewer, with all manholes and all other apparatus connected therewith, commencing at Manhole 297 situated in Chatsworth Terrace opposite the North-West corner of Lot 3, Stirling Road, and proceeding Westerly along the South side of Chatsworth Terrace for a distance of 200 feet to Manhole 298; thence in a Southerly direction for a distance of 135 feet through Lot 11, Chatsworth Terrace, to Manhole 299 situated in the North-East corner Lot 8, Stirling Highway, in lieu of 6-inch meter sewer between Manhole 296 situated in the North-West corner of Lot 2, Stirling Highway, and proceeding in a North-Westerly direction for a distance of 132 feet, through Lot 3, Stirling Highway, and Lots 15 and 14, Chatsworth Terrace, to Manhole 297; thence proceeding in a Westerly direction for a distance of 88 feet, through Lots 13 and 12, Chatsworth Terrace, to Manhole 298, in Lot 11, Chatsworth Terrace; thence proceeding in a Southerly direction for a distance of 40 feet through Lot 11, Chatsworth Terrace, to Manhole 299, situated in the North-East corner of Lot 8, Stirling Highway; also commencing at Manhole 367 in the North-West corner of Lot 3, Cliff Road, and proceeding in a South-Easterly direction for a distance of 204 feet through Lots 3 and 4, Cliff Road, to Manhole 368 situated in the North-West corner of Lot 5, Cliff Road; thence in a South-Easterly direction for a distance of 210 feet through Lots 5 and 6, Cliff Road, and Lot 69, Richardson Avenue, to Manhole 369 situated in the South-East corner of Lot 69, Richardson Avenue, to Manhole 369 situated in the South-East corner of Lot 69, Richardson Avenue, in lieu of 6-inch diameter sewer between Manhole 343 situated in the South-East corner of Lot 3, Richardson Avenue, and proceeding in a South-Easterly direction for a distance of 166 feet through Lots 3, 4, and 69, Richardson Avenue, to Manhole 344; thence in a South-Easterly direction for a distance of 235 feet through Lot 69, Richardson Avenue, to Manhole 345 situated in the South-East corner of Lot 69, Richardson Avenue; also commencing at Manhole 377 in Prospect Place and proceeding in a Southerly direction for a distance of 216 feet across Prospect Place and through Lots 1, 2, and 3, Renown Avenue, to Manhole 376; thence proceeding in a Westerly direction for a distance of 70 feet through Lot 43, Prospect Place, to an inspection opening situated in the South-East corner of Lot 42, Prospect Place, in lieu of commencing at Manhole 354 in Prospect Place, and proceeding in a Southerly direction for a distance of 300 feet across Prospect Place and through Lots 1, 2, 3, and 4, Renown Avenue, to Manhole 355, which were portions of the works as advertised in the Government Gazette of Western Australia on the third day of August, 1934, and as detailed in the plans and specifications therein referred to.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the first day of February, 1935.

> Part IV., By-law No. 18A: Milking Machines.

- (a) In these By-laws, where the words vessels, or utensils, or receptacles, or articles used to contain, or treat or manipulate milk, are used, the terms shall include all movable parts of any milking machine, including buckets, tubing, claws, cups, or any other moveable parts of the apparatus.
- (b) No rubber tubing or rubber connections shall be used in connection with the collecting or manipulation of milk, unless such tubing and connections are free from cracks or crevices, and are to the satisfaction of the Inspector.
- (e) At the conclusion of milking operations, all movable parts of the milking machine and connections shall be disconnected, thoroughly cleansed, and forthwith placed in the milk room until again required for active use.

The permanent lines of tubing shall be thoroughly eleansed at the conclusion of milking operations, and all openings immediately protected by a fly-proof cover which will admit air.

(d) Where permanent tubing is installed for delivery of milk to containers, the tubing shall be continuous in length from the milking shed to the milk room. No open conduits shall be used. All joints in the tubing shall be of such a pattern as to be easily disconnected for inspection purposes. When closed, the joints shall provide a smooth internal surface.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve under "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and amending Acts, of the By-laws as set out hereunder, for the Dongarra Public Cemetery, Reserve No. 21208.

#### PUBLIC CEMETERY, DONGARRA.

By-laws,

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Dongarra, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

- 1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.
- 2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.
- 3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.
- 4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.
- 5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the secretary.
- 6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate, bearing the name of the deceased, stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this By-law shall be admitted to or interred in the Cemetery.
- 7. Every grave shall be at least 6 feet deep at the first interment, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3 feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.
- 8. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.
- 9. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery, unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.
- 10. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—lst September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.; 1st May to 31st August—week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m., and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour, except by written permission of the Trustees.
- 11. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.
- 12. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the Cemetery, or proceed, except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 13. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.
- $14. \;$  It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the Cemetery or to discharge any fireworks therein.
- 15. No dogs shall be allowed within the Cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the Cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 16. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 17. No person shall promote, or advertise or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

- 18. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.
- 19. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees in writing, specifying the locations of the grave, and whether it it proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deseased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.
- 20. Subject to the By-laws the secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.
- 21. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the prescribed "Form" in the Schedule.
- 22. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the prescribed "Form" in the Schedule.
- 23. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any grave or vault shall be allowed, unless upon production of the "Order for Right of Burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.
- 24. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.
- 25. If application be made for an "Order for Right of Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.
- 26. Should the grantee be unable to produce the "Grant of Right of Burial" on making application for a grave to be reopened for the purpose of interment, through having lost same, the said grantee shall make a sworn declaration to this effect, and shall pay the fee for a copy of such "Grant of Right of Burial," as prescribed in Schedule A, before an "Order for Burial" will be issued by the Trustees.
- 27. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."
- 28. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.
- 29. The materials used in every such crection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection.
- 30. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing same.
- 31. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees, the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws is not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.
- 32. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all materials required by the tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.
  - 33. No catacomb shall be allowed.
- 34. Subject to the approval of the Trustees, each applicant for an "Order for Right of Burial" shall, within three months from the date of the application, enclose the grave mentioned in such application with a kerbing of tiles, slate or stone, and shall cause to be placed thereon a number-plate, bearing the number of the grave or vault. Every grave, vault, monument, tombstone, kerbing, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the grantee. Should the

grantee's residence not be known, or be out of the State, the Trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the grantee. No mounds shall be allowed.

- 35. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.
- 36. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave, except such as shall be approved by the Trustees.
- 37. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workmen permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees, commit an offence against these By-laws.

- 38. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

- 41. No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the Trustees, or those licensed by the Trustees, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.
- 42. Any person committing any breach of these By-laws and Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations or By-laws, lawfully made under authority of any Act relating to Cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and, in case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall forthwith be removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees, the secretary or other officer of the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly. be proceeded against accordingly.
- 43. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation, and number of grave, and a Register of all Certificates of "Right of Burial" shall be kept at the Office.

# Additional By-laws.

- 44. Notwithstanding anything contained in the existing By-laws to the contrary, permission may be granted to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth to erect headstones on the graves of deceased soldiers, without payment of any fee.
- 45. Free ground may be granted, if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Trustees:—

  (a) That the deceased was a returned soldier, and that he
  - died as a result of injuries or disease received in the late war;
  - (b) and that the relatives of the deceased are in necessitous circumstances: provided that such "Grant" shall be made subject to the condition that only the remains of deceased soldiers shall be interred in the grave.
- 46. The Trustees may maintain the graves of deceased soldiers, free of cost, for a term of seven years.

7. Every grave shall be at least 6ft. deep at the first interment, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3ft. from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

- 9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—1st September to 30th April—week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.; 1st May to 31st August—week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m., and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour, except by written permission of the Trustees.
- 10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.
- 11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the Cemetery, or proceed, except at and by such roads, as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 12. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.
- 13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the Cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.
- 14. No dogs shall be allowed within the Cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the Cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.
- 17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall be be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration be receives from the Trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.
- 18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees in writing, specifying the locations of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the name of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.
- 19. Subject to the By-laws the sceretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.
- 20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the prescribed "Form" in the Schedule.
- 21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees, may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the prescribed "Form" in the Schedule.

  22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws
- 22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any grave or vault shall be allowed, unless upon production of the "Order of Right of Burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.
- 23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.
- 24. If application be made for an "Order for Right of Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.
- 25. Should the grantee be unable to produce the "Grant of Right of Burial," on making application for a grave to be reopened for the purpose of interment, through having lost same, the said grantee shall make a sworn declaration to this effect, and shall pay the fee

for a copy of such "Grant of Right of Burial," as prescribed in Schedule A, before an "Order for Burial" will be issued by the Trustees.

26. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclose in any part of the Cemetery, must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

27. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom

of the grave.

28. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

29. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from

the Cemetery by the person causing same.

- 30. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing work within the Cemetery, deposit with the secretary to the Trustees the sum of Ten shillings, which shall be forfeited, if either of the two last preceding By-laws is not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.
- 31. All materials required in the crection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all materials required by the tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material, with wheels less than four inches broad, shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

32. No catacomb shall be allowed.

- 33. Subject to the approval of the Trustees, each applicant for an "Order for Right of Burial" shall, within three months from date of the application, enclose the grave mentioned in such application with a kerbing of tiles, slate or stone, and shall cause to be placed thereon a number plate, bearing the number of the grave or vault. Every grave, vault, monument, tombstone, kerbing, or any other erection, shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the grantee. Should the grantee's residence not be known, or be out of the State, the Trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the grantee. No mounds shall be allowed.
- 34. No wooden fence, railing, cross or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault without permission of Trustees.

35. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave, except such as shall be approved by the Trustees.

- 36. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workmen permitting any breach of these Regulations and Bylaws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees, commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 37. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules—
  (a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed
  - a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed;
  - (b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.
  - (c) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees;
  - (d) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.
- 38. Prior to the conduction of any interment within the Cemetery or making use of the Cemetery for any surpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the Trustees an annual fee of £1 1s., and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given and

The Trustees may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantees so to do. If the grantees do not desire the Trustees to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Trustees for that pur-

No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the Trustees or those licensed by the Trustees, shall be

permitted to decorate any grave.

41. Any person committing any breach of these Bylaws and Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations or By-laws, lawfully made under authority of Act relating to Cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and, in case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall forthwith be removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees, the secretary or other officer of the Trustees, Trustees, the secretary or other officer of the frustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly.

42. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation, and number of grave and a Register of all Certificates of "Right of Burial" shall be kept at the Office.

# $Additional\ By \hbox{-} laws.$

Notwithstanding anything contained in the exist-43. Notwithstanding anything contained in the existing By-laws to the contrary, permission may be granted to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth to creet headstones on the graves of deceased soldiers without payment of any fee.

44. Free ground may be granted if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Trustees:—

(a) that the deceased was a returned soldier, and that he died as a result of injuries or disease received in the late war;

(b) and that the relatives of the deceased are in necessitous circumstances; provided that such "Grant" shall be made subject to the condition that only the remains of deceased soldiers shall be interred in the grave.

The Trustees may maintain the graves of deceased soldiers free of cost for a term of seven years.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held at their Office, Morawa, on the 10th day of November, 1934.

# STANDARD SURVEY MARKS ACT, 1924.

Regulations.

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 30th January, 1935.

4109/94. IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under Section 7 of "The Standard Survey Marks Act, 1924," of the Regulations set out hereunder being made for the purpose of the said Act:—

#### Regulations.

1. All Standard surveys shall be performed under the instructions of the Surveyor General, and must be carried out by Surveyors licensed under "The Licensed Surveyors Act, 1909."

- 2. No Standard surveys shall be accepted nor approved by the Surveyor General unless same are in accordance with these Regulations, and such amendments thereof, as may from time to time be authorised.
- 3. A micrometer theodolite, or other theodolite approved by the Surveyor General, of not less than five inches in diameter, and with sensitive bubbles, shall be used on all Standard surveys, and angles read with the greatest possible accuracy. At least four repetitions of each angle shall be made, both verniers or both microscopes being read at each repetition, and the whole of the readings being recorded in the field book. One half of the repetitions of the angles should be taken with circle right, the other with circle left, and a note to this effect must be made in the field book.
- 4. Linear measurements shall be made with a steel or invar band, tested frequently with the Departmental standard. A constant tension, to be shown in the field book, shall be applied and measurements corrected, where necessary for temperature. The temperature shall be observed as each length is taken, and recorded in the field notes. The method of chaining shall be as approved by the Surveyor General.
- 5. Field notes, except in exceptional cases, must be kept in ink. All work performed in the field, with temperature and other corrections shall be fully recorded, while in each field book the temperature and tension at which the chain used is standard shall be plainly noted. Each page of a field book where notes appear shall be initialed by the Sorveyor and shall bear the date on which the survey was made.

The following certificate shall be signed by the Surveyor at the end of the field book:—

This is to certify that these field notes have been taken in the field by me personally and are the actual results of the observations and measurements.

# 3.—Hours of Duty.

The ordinary hours of duty shall be from 9.0 a.m. to 5.0 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, with an interval of one hour off for lunch, and between 9.0 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

# 4.—Overtime.

All time worked outside the ordinary hours of duty shall be deemed as overtime and paid for as follows:-All time worked on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, at the rate of time and half, and all time worked on Saturdays outside the usual hours and all time worked on Sundays and holidays at the rate of double time.
