FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934," which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not during the operation of such Stay Order. Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.

To His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G.,
Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western
Australia:

THE humble Petition of the undersigned sheweth as follows:—

1. That your petitioners are a majority in number of the electors living in the area comprised within a circle having a radius of forty chains from the centre of all that piece of land situate in Stirling Highway, Claremont, and being part of Lot 9, Swan Location 1029, described in Certificate of Title Volume 356, Folio 168, on Deposited Plan No. 1590.

Regulations.

Part VIII.—Quota and Accommodation Milk.

1. Regulations 29-33 inclusive are repealed as from the 28th day of February, 1935.

Part XII.

2. Regulation 64 is repealed as from the 15th day of February, 1935.

3. The following new Regulation shall be substituted for Regulation 64 as from the 15th day of February, 1935:—

64. (a) All milk supplied or sold by dairymen to milk vendors shall be supplied and/or sold under and by virtue of the provisions of a contract in writing between the parties concerned; (b) Every dairyman shall apply to the Board for its approval of all contracts in which he is interested before executing the same, and not less than seven days before commencing to deliver milk thereunder respectively.

4. Regulations 67 and 68 are repealed as from the 28th day of February, 1935.

Part XIV.—Limitation of Sales.

5. Regulations 83-91 inclusive are repealed as from the 28th day of February, 1935.

6. New Regulations shall be added after Regulation 91 as follows:—

Part XV.—Milk not for use as Whole Milk.

(92) (a) In this Regulation "year" shall mean the period of twelve months commencing on the first day of July and ending on the thirtieth day of June next following;

(b) Any person who in any year intends to produce for sale in the metropolitan area or to bring into the metropolitan area for sale any milk other than milk for use as whole milk, shall give notice thereof in writing to the Board on the form in the Fifth Schedule set out, and shall within seven days after the expiration of every calendar month in such year, deliver to the Board at its office a return in writing on a form provided by the Board, showing the quantity of milk so produced and/or brought into the metropolitan area during such month, and the manner of its disposal.

Part XVI.—Limitation of Sales.

(93) Subject to Regulations 94-96 inclusive, the Board may fix the maximum daily quantity of milk of his own production which may be supplied or sold by any dairyman holding the appropriate license or licenses—

- (a) to milk vendors, and/or
(b) to consumers in the metropolitan area from and after the 28th day of February, 1935.

(94) (a) Except as provided in Subclauses (b) and (c) the maximum daily quantity fixed for each dairyman shall not be less than the average daily quantity of milk of his own production supplied or sold by him to milk vendors and/or consumers in the metropolitan area during the months of March to May, inclusive, in the year 1933, plus the following percentage increase:—

Average daily Quantity of own production Supplied or Sold in March to May, 1933, inclusive.	Percentage increase.
Up to 20 gallons	40 per cent.
21-30 gallons	35 per cent.
31-40 gallons	20 per cent.
41-50 gallons	15 per cent.
More than 50 gallons	10 per cent.

(b) The maximum daily quantity for any dairyman who has sold any portion of his business since 1st March, 1933, shall be fixed at the discretion of the Board; but, in fixing the same, the Board shall make the following calculations:—

A. The Board shall ascertain the minimum daily quantity which could have been fixed for the dairyman under Subclause (a), if he had retained the whole of his business.

B. The Board shall then compute what proportion of the dairyman's business at the date of sale is still retained by him.

The quantity fixed for that dairyman shall not be less than the proportion ascertained by calculation B. of the quantity ascertained by calculation A.

(c) The maximum daily quantity for—

- (i) a dairyman who has sold the whole of his business since the 1st March, 1933, and has, subsequent to such sale, purchased another business;

(ii) a dairyman who has purchased his business since 31st May, 1933, shall be fixed at the discretion of the Board, but the quantity fixed shall not be less than the minimum daily quantity which could have been fixed under these Regulations for the vendor of such purchased business.

(95) Having fixed maximum daily quantities as aforesaid, the Board shall give notice by registered post to each dairyman stating the maximum daily quantity of milk of his own production which may be supplied or sold by him to milk vendors and/or consumers in the metropolitan area from and after the 28th February, 1935, if he holds the appropriate licenses.

(96) If any dairyman considers that the maximum daily quantity mentioned in the notice given to him as aforesaid is less than the minimum prescribed in Regulation 94, he may within 14 days after receiving such notice, produce evidence to the Board establishing that he is entitled under Regulation 94 to supply or sell a greater daily quantity of milk of his own production than the quantity fixed as aforesaid, and the Board, if satisfied that such evidence is correct, shall increase the maximum daily quantity which he may supply or sell as aforesaid so as to conform with Regulation 94.

(97) From time to time after fixing maximum daily quantities as aforesaid, the Board may increase the same, if satisfied that the requirements of milk vendors or consumers in the metropolitan area warrant such increase.

(98) If and whenever daily quantities are increased as aforesaid, the Board shall give notice by registered post to each dairyman concerned, stating the maximum daily quantity of milk of his own production which may be supplied or sold by him to milk vendors and/or consumers in the metropolitan area from and after the date specified in such notice, if he holds the appropriate licenses.

(99) No dairyman shall, on any day after the 28th February, 1935, supply or sell to milk vendors and/or consumers in the metropolitan area any quantity of milk of his own production greater than the maximum daily quantity fixed as aforesaid in relation to his business.

By-laws for the Management of Reserves under the Control of the Board, and the Playing of Games thereon.

THE Augusta-Margaret River Road Board, under and by virtue of the power conferred on it by Section 204, Subsection (49), of "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934," and of every other power enabling it in this behalf, do hereby make and publish the following By-laws:

1. In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires:—

(a) The word "Board" shall mean the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board;

(b) The word "Reserve" shall mean any ground owned by, vested in, or otherwise under the control of the Board;

(c) The word "Caretaker" shall mean any person appointed by the Board to take care of any reserve or reserves.

2. No person shall damage or interfere with any property or thing placed or used in or belonging to any reserve, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave therein any litter, rubbish, or waste-matter of any kind.

3. No person shall stand on or climb or jump over the seats, trees, or fences of any reserve, or cut letters, names, or marks on, or otherwise damage the structures, trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences thereon, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

4. No person, except those in the employ of or authorised by the Board, shall bring into any reserve any horse or other animal or vehicle.

5. No person shall light any fire within any reserve without the permission of the Board.

6. No person, except the officers or servants of the Board acting in the discharge of their duty, shall enter any reserve on such days as may be set apart for games, sports, shows, amusements, or entertainments, except through the proper entrance for that purpose, and on payment of the fee chargeable for admission at the time; but on such days as are not set apart as aforesaid the reserves shall be open to the public free of charge.

7. No person shall enter the reserves for the purpose of playing any games or sports or trotting therein until he has first obtained a permit so to do from the Board, unless he is a bona fide member of any club or other body authorised in that behalf.

8. No person or authorised club having obtained such permit as aforesaid shall practise, play at, or carry on any game, sport, or amusement, except upon such portion of the reserve as may be specified for that purpose.

9. The Board may, in its discretion, prohibit any person, club or other body from playing at, carrying on any game or sport, or otherwise using any portion of any reserve at any time.

10. No person shall bring or take any horse or other animal on to any reserve for the purpose of training or exercising such horse or other animal, without having first obtained a permit from the Board so to do.

11. No person shall smoke any pipe, tobacco, or cigarettes in any of the dressing rooms of the reserves.

12. No person shall, except with the permission of the Board, bet, gamble, or call the odds or offer to bet or gamble within any reserve; and any person found betting, gambling, or calling the odds, or offering to bet or gamble within any reserve without such permission, may be forthwith removed by the caretaker or any other officer or servant of the Board, or by any member of the Board, or of the Police Force, and such person shall also be liable to prosecution for a breach of this By-law.

13. No person, other than a member of a sporting body duly authorised in that behalf, shall enter any dressing room on the reserves, or use any locker, without having first obtained a permit for that purpose, and every person holding such permit shall produce and exhibit same when required by due authority.

14. No person shall address an audience or public meeting on any reserve, without having first obtained permission so to do from the Board.

15. No unauthorised person shall camp, lodge, tarry overnight, or frequent for the purpose of camping, lodging, or tarrying overnight on the reserves.

16. No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix or exhibit, or cause to be posted, stamped, stuck, stencilled, painted, or otherwise affixed or exhibited, any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement or any document whatsoever upon any tree, post, fence, gate, or building on any reserve, without having first obtained the written consent of the Board.

17. No person shall sell or expose for sale any food, drink, goods, wares, merchandise, or things on any portion of the reserves, unless the consent of the Board shall have been previously obtained.

18. No fermented or spirituous liquors shall be brought into or consumed on any reserve, except when permitted by the Board in writing.

19. Any person found in a state of intoxication in any reserve, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language, or committing any act of indecency or misconducting himself, or committing any breach of this By-law therein, may be forthwith removed from such reserve by the caretaker, or by any officer or servant of the Board, or by any member of the Police Force, without affecting such person's liability to prosecution for an offence against this By-law.

20. No person, club, sporting body, or association shall sublet any portion of any reserve the use of which may be granted to any such person, club, sporting body, or association, nor permit the same to be used by any person or persons whatsoever without the written consent of the Board.

21. The sums to be charged by the Board to the various persons, clubs, sporting bodies, or associations for the use of any reserve or any portion thereof shall be such as shall be fixed by the Board from time to time.

22. The Board may grant the exclusive use of any reserve, or any portion thereof, to any particular person, club, sporting body, or association for any particular day or days, and the fees to be charged to the public for admission shall be such as shall be fixed, with the consent of the Board, by the person, club, sporting body, or association to whom such exclusive use shall be granted.

23. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.
