WHEREAS by Section 122, Subsection (1) of "The Health Act, 1911-33," it is provided that no building shall be erected within any Municipal District unless and until plans and specifications thereof have been submitted by the owner or occupier to, and have been approved, in relation to ventilation, lighting, and sanitary construction, and also as to the area of the open space appurtenant to such building by the Local Authority: And whereas, under Subsection (2) of Section 122, the Governor may from time to time declare by Proclamation that Subsection (1) of the said section shall apply in any other District or in any portion of any other District, and may at any time revoke any such Proclamation, and, while such declaration remains in force, Subsection (1) of the said section shall apply in any such District or portion of such District as if it were a Municipal District: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation, declare that Subsection (1) of Section 122 shall apply to the Cue Health District.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-34.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following amendments to the Regulations under the above Act.

1. The following Regulation is added after Regulation 3:—

(3a)—

- (a) Any farmer desirous of making application for the writing down or suspension of his debts, or both the writing down and suspension of his debts, shall at the time of making application submit a statement of his assets and liabilities in the Form No. 4A, together with the supporting lists mentioned therein in the schedule. Every such statement, together with any accompanying lists or schedules, shall be verified by the statutory declaration of the farmer;
- (b) The Director shall consider the scheme and advise the farmer as to whether in his opinion the scheme is practicable or equitable under the circumstances;
- (c) If the Director is of the opinion that the scheme submitted is not practicable or equitable under the circumstances, the Director shall submit a modified scheme to the farmer for his approval. The scheme as finally agreed upon by the farmer shall be submitted by the Director to a meeting of the creditors of the farmer in the manner provided in Section 6 of the Act;
- (d) The Director shall report on the scheme for the information of the creditors, and give such information as may be necessary for the creditors properly to consider the same;
- (e) The form of proposal for the writing down and suspension of the debts of the farmer is given in Form 4B in the schedule, and any proposal under the Act may be in such form or as near thereto as the circumstances of the case may require.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE LAVERTON DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

Name.

1. The Institution shall be known as the Laverton District Hospital.

2. The objects of the Hospital shall be to secure medical and surgical attendance, and to provide hospital treatment and medical and surgical dressings for subscribers and their dependants and for paying and indigent patients.

Subscribers' Qualifications and Privileges.

3. Any person who subscribes 1s. 9d. per week, £1 1s. per quarter or £4 per annum, or any male person under the age of 18 years, or any single woman or widow who subscribes 1s. per week, shall be termed a subscriber. Subscriber shall mean any person who has paid his or her subscription and is financial, and shall include the wife or husband, parents or female relative occupying the position as head of the household, and children up to and including the age of 16 years; provided they are residing with the subscriber and are dependent on him or her.

4. All employees subscribing through any gold mine, mining company, other company or employer shall be deemed to be financial as from the date of their employment; provided that the management undertakes the collection of their subscription from wages due.

5. Subscribers may nominate to have their name placed on the list of any Medical Practitioner approved by the Board, in accordance with the provisions of Rule No. 33. Every subscriber shall be entitled to surgical and medical treatment at the Hospital as an in-door or out-door patient, and to medicines and surgical dressings and appliances, free of charge, subject to the conditions and limitations set forth in the Rules and Regulations, and for so long as the Medical Officer or Medical Practitioner on whose list the subscriber's name appears deems necessary. No subscriber, not being an in-door patient, shall be supplied with any medicines or dressings, except on the authority of the Medical Officer or Medical Practitioner on whose list the subscriber's name appears, or the Matron, who shall record same in a diary to be kept for that purpose.

6. Subscribers shall not receive free treatment in any of the following cases:—(a) Incurable diseases; (b) disorders for the cure of which other establishments are provided; (c) any person requiring food and not medicine, and who is more properly a subject for a benevolent institution; (d) any person whose admission might endanger other patients; (e) any person from the gaol or lock-up, unless an urgent case, and the police provide attendant or custodian, if necessary; (f) any infant, on account of the condition of the mother alone, unless practically unavoidable; (g) venereal diseases; (h) alcoholism (except on payment of £4 4s. per week); (i) den-

tristly; (j) insanity; (k) cases coming under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act.

7. Maternity cases may be admitted by paying in advance the following fees:—Subscribers who have been financial on the books for the immediate preceding three months, £2 10s. per week, other persons £4 4s. per week; these do not include medical fees. Pre-natal cases will be charged at the rate of 30s. per week.

Administration.

8. The administration of the Hospital shall vest in the Board of Management appointed by the Governor. Four members shall be nominated by the subscribers of the Lancefield Ward, three by the subscribers of the Laverton Ward, one by the subscribers of the Ida H. and Burtville Ward, one by the subscribers of the Morgans Ward, and all shall hold office for one year, to terminate on the 31st July. Nominations must be lodged with the Secretary at least 14 days prior to the date of ballot, and must be signed by a proposer and seconder, who must be subscribers, and have the consent of the candidate, who shall also be a subscriber, indorsed thereon. The ballot for the selection of members shall be held on the 14th day of July in each year; when this date falls on a Saturday or Sunday the ballot shall be taken on the Monday next following. After candidates have been selected their names shall be submitted to the Governor, through the Medical Department, with a recommendation for appointment.

9. The members of the Board shall elect one of their number to be Chairman at the first meeting after the appointment of the Board. The Chairman, when present, shall preside at all meetings. The members of the Board shall also elect a vice Chairman and Treasurer. The Chairman shall be a member of all sub-committees.

10. The time appointed for the meeting of the Board shall be the third Tuesday in each month.

11. If any member of the Board shall be absent from more than two consecutive meetings, without leave of absence, or shall cease to be a subscriber, the Board may recommend to the Governor that his seat be declared vacant, and also recommend the appointment of another person in his stead.

12. The Board shall elect two of their members to form a Finance Committee. The Finance Committee shall submit to the Board accounts which it recommends for payment, present a statement of receipts and expenditure for the past month, and an estimate for the ensuing month.

13. An Auditor may be appointed by the Board of Management and shall receive such remuneration as the Board may think fit.

14. The order of business at meetings of the Board shall be:—(a) Minutes of previous meeting to be read and, if approved, confirmed; (b) correspondence, inward and outward to be read and discussed; (c) reports; (d) questions; (e) finance; (f) discussion of Notice of Motion; (g) receiving Notice of Motion; (h) general business.

15. At all meetings of the Board, all the members present shall vote on any question submitted, and the question shall be decided by the majority. Each member, including the Chairman, shall have one vote, and, in the case of an equality of votes, the question shall be declared carried in the negative.

16. Special meetings of the Board may be convened by the Secretary at any time, on 24 hours' notice being given to all members, either at the request of the Chairman or of any four members. Any resolution of the Board may be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, either by the unanimous vote of all the members, or by a vote of a majority of the Board; subject in such last-mentioned case to the condition that, seven days at least before such subsequent meeting, notice in writing thereof, and of the proposal to alter or revoke such resolution, shall have been given to each member.

17. The Board may, from time to time, appoint a sub-committee of any number, with such rights, powers, and privileges, and subject to such conditions and restrictions as the Board may at such appointment or thereafter determine.

18. The Board shall regulate the general Departments of the Hospital, and more particularly in refer-

ence to all sanitary matters, and shall take immediate steps to rectify any defects that may require prompt attention.

19. No ball, bazaar, sports meeting or other entertainment or function shall be held in aid of the Hospital Funds without the consent and authority of the Board.

20. The Board of Management shall appoint from among themselves a House Committee of two to be elected monthly, who shall attend to the internal management of the Hospital and such other matters as may be delegated to them. They shall furnish monthly reports to the Board of Management. The House Committee shall report to the Board any repairs, etc., which may be necessary, and give attention to same during progress of any work. They shall also see that all fittings and appliances are in an efficient state.

Patients' Circumstances.

21. The Secretary shall cause full inquiries to be made into the circumstances of indigent patients.

Meeting of Subscribers.

22. The annual general meeting of subscribers shall be held on the first Sunday after the ballot for the selection of Board members. The financial year terminates on the 30th June. Subscribers to be notified by advertisement at least two weeks before the date of such meeting and 20 of the number of subscribers to form a quorum. At the annual meeting the annual reports and balance sheet of the Hospital shall be presented by the Chairman, such balance sheet to be published at least seven days before the meeting, and to be signed by the Chairman and Secretary.

Special Meetings.

23. The Secretary shall, whenever required by the Chairman, Board, or, upon a requisition signed by not less than 20 subscribers, convene a special meeting of subscribers, the requisition shall express the object of the meeting, and shall be left with the Secretary, who shall forthwith convene a special meeting. In the event of the Secretary failing to do so within 10 days from the time of the requisition being received by him, the requisitionists, or any number of them, may convene a special meeting. At least 14 clear days' notice of the annual and every special meeting shall be given each subscriber by advertisement in the local paper, or other means, as the Board may direct; such notice shall specify the place, the day and the hour of meeting and the general nature of the business. At an annual or special meeting, 20 subscribers shall form a quorum. If within 15 minutes of the time appointed for the meeting a quorum of subscribers is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of subscribers, shall be dissolved; in another case it shall stand adjourned to a time and place to be fixed.

Scale of Fees.

24. Indoor patients.—The fees for non-subscribers shall be 10s. per day for maintenance and nursing, but not including medical attendance. Drugs and dressings will be charged for in addition. The fees for children under 18 years of age shall be 6s. per day for non-subscribers.

Complaints.

25. Any subscriber or member of the staff having any complaints or other business to bring before the Board should submit the same in writing to the Board, and, if required, shall attend personally the meeting of the Board.

Out-door Patients.

26. All out-patients shall be attended by the Medical Officer, who shall enter the names in the book provided under the headings to which they belong. All fees collected are to be handed to the Secretary. Out-patients receiving medicine bottles must leave a deposit of 6d. on each bottle, to be refunded on return of bottle.

27. All patients who in the Medical Officer's opinion require treatment shall attend the hospital whenever requested to do so, but the Medical Officer or Medical Practitioner on whose list the subscriber's name appears shall also, in case of necessity, gratuitously attend subscribers at their own homes, always except-

ing midwifery and other cases mentioned in Rules 6 and 7. Subscribers outside the three-mile radius requiring a special visit of the Medical Officer shall pay to him the sum of 2s. 6d. per mile, one way, during the hours of 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., and 4s. 6d. per mile, one way, from 8 p.m. to 8 a.m., excepting Lancefield subscribers, when the charge shall be 7s. 6d. between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. and 13s. 6d. between 8 p.m. and 8 a.m. for each special visit.

Indoor Patients.

28. Accidents or urgent cases shall be received at all hours of the day or night. Persons shall be admitted to the Hospital as inpatients, on production of a certificate from a Medical Practitioner that they require treatment. Non-subscribers shall be examined by the Secretary or Matron as to their means to pay the Hospital for such treatment. Applicants for admission to the Hospital shall, when required by the Secretary, make a statutory declaration that they are unable to pay for treatment and are not entitled to any benefits from any Friendly society.

29. Patients having money or valuables in their possession shall deliver up same to the Matron or Nurse, who shall immediately hand them, with written particulars, to the Secretary for safe custody, a receipt for which will be given by him and countersigned by the Matron. The Hospital will not be responsible for patient's money or valuables unless this rule is observed.

30. On the admission of any patient to the Hospital, his address and that of his immediate relatives, his professed religion, age, and other particulars, shall be given to the Medical Officer, Matron, or Secretary.

31. Patients shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner and strictly observe all the directions of the Medical Officer, Matron or Nurse, and such Regulations as may be made by the Medical Officer or Board of Management. Patients are not allowed to leave precincts without the special permission of the Medical Officer or Matron. No reward or gratuity is to be received by the Nurses or other servants on account of services performed, or to be performed by them in the Hospital, without the consent of the Board. Patients quitting the Hospital at their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving, or such declaration shall be signed by the friend removing such patient. No patient shall be discharged from the Hospital without the consent of the Medical Officer in charge of the case, except when ordered by the Board, in case of misconduct.

The Medical Officer.

32. The Medical Officer shall be a legally qualified practitioner under the Medical Practitioners Act of Western Australia, and shall be appointed by the Board of Management, and his salary shall be fixed by them; he shall enter into an agreement approved by the Board. On taking office he shall check and take charge of all surgical instruments, implements, and apparatus, and shall sign an inventory thereof, and, on the termination of his agreement, he shall hand them over to his successor, or to the Board, and receive an acknowledgment thereof. All new instruments, implements and apparatus procured shall be added to the inventory, which shall be a correct record of all such articles. No instrument, implement, or apparatus shall be loaned, destroyed, or disposed of without the consent of the Board. The Medical Officer shall report to the Board from time to time that any instrument, implement, or apparatus is worn out, obsolete, or otherwise useless. Such instrument, implement, or apparatus may then be written off the inventory by the Board's approval. No new instruments shall be ordered, and no additions to any instruments or apparatus made without the approval of the Board. He shall have charge of and account for the medical stores, and, whenever necessary, prepare and submit to the Board a list of all medicines that may be required, and shall from time to time report to the Board such medicine stores as he may deem to be in excess of requirements or useless, and, with the approval of the Board, have same destroyed or otherwise disposed of. He shall be in attendance at the Hospital during the hours defined by the Board, and, in addition, shall attend in cases of emergency, whenever summoned by the Matron. The hours of attendance shall be posted in a conspicuous position at the Hos-

pital and at any other place the Board may direct. He may, if he wish, appoint hours at which he will see subscribers at his private surgery. Subscribers shall have first call on the Medical Officer's services. He shall have the immediate superintendence of the professional staff in connection with the professional work of the Hospital, and shall preserve order and sobriety, and, in case of any insubordination or gross default of duty on the part of any of those employees, he shall suspend the same and report fully on each case to the Board immediately, through the Secretary. He shall be responsible for a daily report of all cases under his charge and see that a diet card is placed for each patient, such daily report to be recorded in a book for that purpose. He shall keep an accurate record of the surgical operations performed and all names of patients treated, with results. He shall report monthly to the Board particulars of numbers of patients treated in Hospital during past month, number admitted, number discharged, nature of complaints, and number of out-patients and give the Secretary weekly a list of all out-door paying patients treated at the Hospital between the hours as arranged, together with an estimate of the cost of all medicine and dressings supplied to them. He shall afford the Board every information, and furnish them with reports on all matters within his control, and attend meetings, when required. He shall be responsible for, and, with the assistance of the Secretary, shall prepare the annual report, in so far as the Medical portion is concerned. He shall not absent himself from the town without the consent of the Chairman of the Board, and, in the event of the appointment of a *locum tenens* being necessary, the Medical Officer shall make all necessary arrangements, and submit the name of the proposed *locum tenens* for the approval of the Board before his appointment. The Board shall have the right to withhold their approval, if in their opinion the proposed *locum tenens* is not a suitable person. In the event of the Medical Officer neglecting his duties, or being absent for more than 24 hours without the consent of the Chairman and the appointment of a duly qualified *locum tenens* approved by the Board, he shall, after receipt of notice under the hand of the Secretary, immediately cease to hold office, and shall have no claim on the Board for salary after receipt of such notice, and he shall be liable to the Hospital for any expense which the Board may incur caused by his absence or neglect. The agreement between the Board and the Medical Officer may be mutually terminated upon either party giving to the other three months' notice in writing of such termination.

Medical Practitioners.

33. The Board may approve of any legally qualified Medical Practitioner, who is in public practice in Laverton, attending to Hospital subscribers. Subscribers wishing to be treated by any such Medical Practitioner must notify the Secretary in writing of their choice immediately on becoming a subscriber, or not later than the 27th day of December, March, June, or September, for their names to be included on the Medical Practitioner's list as from the first day of January, April, July, or October respectively. Subscribers not making any choice will have their names placed on the Hospital Medical Officer's list. Medical Practitioners may treat their private patients in the Hospital; beds will be allotted to each Medical Practitioner in proportion to the number of subscribers on his list.

Secretary.

34. The Secretary shall be appointed by the Board, and shall hold office during the pleasure of the Board. He may hold office in an honorary or paid capacity. If holding office in an honorary capacity he may be paid an annual bonus, should the Board consider it advisable. If a paid officer, his salary shall be fixed by the Board from time to time. He shall conduct the correspondence and have charge of all documents relating to the Hospital, and shall file and record them in a methodical manner to the satisfaction of the Board. He shall summon and attend all meetings, and shall keep minute books, in which all proceedings of the meetings shall be recorded, and shall see, as far as practicable, that all resolutions or orders passed by such meetings are forthwith carried into effect. He shall, under the direction of the Board, keep the books, forms, and accounts of the Hospital, and shall submit his account books to the Board

and Finance Committee whenever required. He shall see that the Medical Officer takes over and signs for all surgical instruments, etc., as provided in Rule 32. He shall receive from the Medical Officer on behalf of the Board the report required by Rule 32, and be responsible for the rendering of accounts of all amounts due and unpaid. He shall see that the Matron on her appointment complies with Rule 35, and shall submit such inventory, certified to by the Matron as correct, to the Board at the end of the financial year. He shall receive all tradesmen's bills for provisions and other articles, from the Matron, and make out accounts for presentation to the Finance Committee at the next monthly meeting. He shall receive all moneys paid to the Hospital, and enter same in the cash book, and pay same into the bank. No money shall be held for a period longer than seven days. No account shall be passed for payment unless it is initialed as correct by the Secretary and by the Medical Officer or Matron. All payments authorised by the Board shall be made by cheque payable to the creditor, signed by the Chairman, any one member of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary. He shall present a copy of the Rules to every employee immediately after his or her appointment, and obtain his or her signature to a duplicate copy, which he will keep in his office for that purpose. He shall keep an inter-leaved book containing the Rules, and shall insert any new rule or order as soon as it shall have been passed by the Board, and shall at once communicate it to any person to whom it may relate. He shall balance the cash book at the end of each month and reconcile with the bank pass-book. He shall, on the day following each Board or sub-committee meeting transcribe in the minute book fair copies of the minutes taken during each meeting. He shall keep the contributor's book and enter therein and in the cash book all subscriptions and donations, and shall report the same at the next monthly meeting of the Board. He shall keep a duplicate or true copy of all letters written on the business of the Hospital, and shall execute all orders he may receive from the Board or the Chairman. He shall be at his office at such times as the Board may from time to time appoint, and such hours shall be posted outside his office and at the Hospital. He shall be guaranteed for £100 by some responsible guarantee society, or by some responsible person; the premium of such guarantee to be paid out of the funds of the Hospital.

Matron.

35. The Matron, who shall be a certified Nurse and registered Maternity Nurse, shall be appointed by the Board of Management, and shall hold office upon such terms as they may direct. She shall reside in the quarters provided for her, and devote her time and attention to the superintendence and general management of the Nursing Staff of the Hospital. She shall also take entire charge of the domestic affairs of the Nurses' Quarters, and of the Hospital generally, and have, under the Medical Officer, control over all the Nurses and employees attached to the Hospital, and, in case of disobedience of the orders, misconduct, or neglect of duty on the part of any Nurse or employee, she shall fully report thereon forthwith to the Chairman or Secretary of the Board. The Matron shall also do the ordinary nursing duties of the Hospital, as the Medical Officer may direct. The Matron shall not make public any matter or matters connected with the Hospital. Termination of service to be by one month's notice on either side. She shall, on taking charge, check and sign a stock book containing a list of all furniture, bedding, linen, clothing, glass, crockery, cutlery, cookery, and kitchen utensils, etc., and be responsible for same, and, on relinquishing her duties, shall hand same to the Secretary, or her successor, as directed by the Board, fair wear and tear being allowed. She shall not be absent from the Hospital for more than 24 hours without the consent of the Medical Officer or Chairman. She shall requisition the Board for clothing, bedding, linen, glass, crockery, cutlery, utensils, and appliances of every kind required for the use of the Hospital. She shall enter them in the stock book and be responsible for them. She shall be careful to see that articles of clothing bedding, etc., are kept in thorough repair and marked, and that all articles of bedding (including mattresses) in use in the wards are frequently changed and aired, and that no bedding that has been in use be stowed away without previous airing, and that no article of the Hos-

pital under her control be lent without the consent of the House Committee. She shall inculcate strict economy in the use of fuel, etc., and see that all unnecessary lights are dispensed with during the night, and that order, cleanliness, and punctuality prevail throughout the establishment. She shall be responsible for the internal economy and general management of the Institution, the quality, quantity, and preparation of the food, the state of the dormitories, and the comfort generally of the patients. In the event of any patient requiring the presence of any minister of religion, she shall take measures to have the request complied with. She shall not permit any of the patients to receive unauthorised food or liquors, and see that all rules respecting visitors be observed, and not permit provisions or any property to be conveyed away from the Hospital. She shall take charge of the private clothes of each patient, and store them up for examination, and, if necessary, cause them to be cleaned and disinfected. She shall always have in readiness a proper assortment of bandages, lint, strapping, and other dressings. She shall preserve order and decorum in the wards; prohibit improper conduct and conversation, and see that the patients adhere to the rules. She shall not permit strangers or visitors to remain after the usual visiting hours, nor to crowd around any bed, but shall quietly request such visitors to retire, and, if such request is not at once complied with, shall report same to the Medical Officer.

Nursing Staff.

36. Each Nurse shall be responsible to the Matron for the efficient nursing of the patient, the charge of all linen, furniture, and other articles, and the cleanliness and management of the wards. She shall strictly obey the orders of the Matron, and shall take such day or night duties as the Matron may direct. Her conduct shall be quiet and orderly, and she shall not receive any visitors without the permission of the Matron. All Nurses shall reside on the premises. Nurses shall not absent themselves without permission of the Matron. Termination of services shall be by one month's notice on either side.

Domestic Staff.

37. The wardsman or yardman shall be appointed by the Board of Management. Domestic employees shall be appointed by the Board of Management under the guidance of the Matron. They will perform their duties entirely under the direction of the Matron, and will endeavour, by strict obedience, to promote the economic and harmonious working of the domestic portion of the Hospital. The hours of leave shall be at regular intervals, to be determined by the Matron; provided always, that the efficiency of the Hospital is not thereby interfered with. The Matron shall have power to dismiss any domestic employee, and may obtain temporary assistance when such is required, and enter same in her report to the Board of Management. All employees shall be entitled to two weeks' annual leave on full pay for each completed year of service. Such annual leave must be taken out each year and at a time approved by the Board of Management.

Ministers of Religion.

38. The Hospital must be considered to be strictly non-sectarian. Ministers of religion shall have admission at all time to patients of their respective denominations, but, prior to entering the ward, must obtain the Matron's consent. It is expected that Ministers will not remain in any ward when requested to retire by the Medical Officer or the Matron. Any Minister may attend any patient when requested by such patient. It is also to be insisted upon that ministers of religion and such other persons as aforesaid visiting the Hospital for the purpose of administering religious instruction to the patient, shall so conduct their services as not to interfere with the repose and quiet of other patients in the near vicinity.

Visitors.

39. Visitors shall be admitted to see patients daily between the hours of 3 p.m. and 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. and 8 p.m., and at other times by special permission of the Medical Officer or Matron. All visitors must leave the Hospital as soon as they have seen their friends. The Medical Officer has power to close any ward he may think fit, or refuse visitors access to any patient. Visitors

must respectfully and quietly obey the Sister or Nurse in Charge of the ward, be quiet in their movements and conversation, and be careful not to disturb the ward in any way. Loitering about the premises is strictly prohibited. Male visitors shall not be admitted to the ward for females, without the consent of the Nurse in Charge. Visitors must remain at the bedside of the patient they are visiting. No person shall read aloud or conduct public or religious services in the wards of the Hospital. No person other than patients or those employed by the Hospital Board shall reside on the Hospital premises. Persons wishing to visit the Hospital regularly or at other times than those assigned to ordinary visitors may obtain a special general permission, upon application to the Medical Officer; such special visitor must avoid all religious teachings, except with members of their denomination, and be generally subject to the rules under the head of "Ministers of Religion." The Medical Officer, on complaint being made to him, may prohibit any special visitor from entering the wards, pending an investigation by the House Committee, who shall have power to cancel any permission.

Common Seal.

40. The common seal of the Board shall be kept in the Board's safe, and shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument, except by order of the Board.

New Rules.

41. The Board shall have power to alter, amend, cancel, or add to these Rules, and to make new rules, but no such alteration or addition or new rule shall be made unless approved by the Board, after the notice of motion to make such alteration, addition, or new rule has been given at the previous meeting of the Board, and due notice has been given to every member of the Board, and such alteration, addition, or amendment shall only remain in force until the next general or special meeting of subscribers, unless it is adopted and approved at such meeting.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-33.

WHEREAS by Section 295 of "The Health Act, 1911-33," it is provided that the Governor may cause to be prepared By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which By-laws may be made by a Local Authority, under any of the provisions of the said Act, and that a Local Authority may, of its own motion, by resolution, adopt the whole or any portion of such By-laws: And whereas a Model By-law has been prepared in accordance with the said section and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st day of February, 1935: And whereas the Commissioner of Public Health may exercise all or any of the powers of a Local Authority in any place which does not lie within the boundaries of a District: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in the said Act, the Commissioner of Public Health does hereby resolve to adopt By-law No. 18A of Part IV. of the Model By-laws above referred to for such portion of the State as is not within the boundaries of any Health District.

By-laws—Brookton Common—Reserve No. 6068.

Department of Lands and Surveys,

It is hereby notified, for general information, that under Section 34 of "The Land Act, 1933," His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws for the control and management of the Brookton Common, Reserve No. 6068.

The Brookton Road Board, as a Board of Management of Brookton Common, being Reserve No. 6068, does hereby, under the provisions of Section 34 of "The Land Act, 1933," and any amendments thereof, make and publish the following By-laws for the regulation and management of the Brookton Common:—

1. These By-laws shall be known as the Brookton Common By-laws.

2. The following words and expressions used in these By-laws shall, unless there is something in the context repugnant thereto, have the meaning set against them respectively—

"Owner."—The person having the property in or having the possession or apparent possession, control, management, or custody of animals or stock.

"Cattle."—Bull, bullock, ox, cow, heifer, calf.

"Travelling Stock."—Any stock taken or driven, or about to be taken or driven, to any place more than 30 miles from the place upon which such stock was depasturing previously to starting.

"Stock."—Any horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, mule, bull, ox, cow, heifer, steer, calf, ram, ewe, wether, lamb, goat, and the young of any of them.

"Road Board."—The Brookton District Road Board, howsoever constituted, its successors and assigns.

"Common."—All that piece of land under the control and management of the Brookton District Road Board, and being the whole of the land contained in Reserve No. 6068, and as gazetted in the *Government Gazette* of the 2nd September, 1898, page 2575.

"Teamster."—Any driver of any team of horses, mules, donkeys, bullocks actively engaged in plying for hire or carrying goods, whether as owner, master, lessee, contractor or servant.

"Ranger."—Any person appointed by the Road Board, or the lessee of the Common for the time being.

"Constable."—Any officer or member of the Police Force.

"Secretary" means the secretary to the Road Board or the person acting for the time being in that capacity.

3. All stock running on the Common otherwise than in accordance with these By-laws shall be treated as trespassing stock, and shall be subject to "The Cattle Tres-

pass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," and its amendments, and may be dealt with as provided for by the said Act or these By-laws, or otherwise, according to law.

4. No owner or persons shall depasture any stock upon the Common or any part thereof, without having first given notice in writing, setting out particulars and brands or marks, and obtaining permission from the secretary of the Board in writing.

5. That, with the exception of stock owned by bona fide travellers, travelling teamsters, and as hereinafter provided for, no stock of any description shall be allowed to run or depasture on the Common.

Dairymen shall be allowed to depasture on the Common no greater number than five head of cattle, and as hereinafter provided and on payment of the fees prescribed.

6. The scale of charges for all stock depasturing on the Common shall be as follows:—All great stock, including horses and cattle and dairy stock above the age of six months, a fee of sixpence per head per week shall be charged, and for all sheep, not including lambs, one half-penny per day of twenty-four hours or twopence half-penny per head per week or part of a week.

7. Any person or persons having permission to run stock on the Common may change such stock from time to time, providing that he or they do not at any time exceed the number allowed by these By-laws, and that all fees as prescribed have been paid, and, furthermore, that notice in writing has been given to the Board setting out particulars as regards brands and marks of stock replacing stock previously registered.

8. That no entire horse, bull, or ram over the age of six months shall be allowed on the Common and, in addition to the penalties hereinafter prescribed under these By-laws, the owners thereof shall be liable to be dealt with under the provisions of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," and any amendments thereof.

9. The Board shall not be responsible or liable for any damage or loss sustained by any person, by reason of the injury or death from any cause whatsoever of any stock traversing or depasturing on the Common under the provisions of these By-laws, and whether permission to depasture has or has not been obtained.

10. The Board prohibits the doing, by unlicensed person or persons, of any act or thing for which a license may be granted under the provisions of these By-laws, and any unlicensed person or persons doing such things shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

11. All stray stock proved to be accidentally on the Common (the onus of proof that such stock are accidentally on the Common to be upon the owner) shall not be subject to liability for Common fees, but shall be treated in all respects as trespassing stock, and shall be subject to "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," and its amendments and these By-laws.

12. Any person or persons who shall introduce, cause, or allow to be introduced or depastured on the Common any diseased stock, or allow the same to be depastured, shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each offence, and two pounds per head per day of the animals affected, for a continuation of the offence, but not more than twenty pounds in the aggregate.

13. Any person or persons killing stock taken off the Common must render to the secretary or ranger, on each Monday of every week, a list of brands of each head of stock killed, and the secretary or ranger shall have the right to inspect the hides of any stock killed at any time.

14. The Board shall be the sole judge of what constitutes a dairyman, teamster, or drover within the meaning of these By-laws.

15. Every owner, person, or persons having permission to depasture stock under these By-laws shall produce his permit, upon being required so to do by the Board, secretary, ranger or constable.

16. The owner, person or persons of any stock dying on the Common shall be liable for the removal of same, failing which the Board may remove such dead stock and recover the cost of such removal from the owner, by law if necessary.

17. There shall be a general mustering of stock, at such time or times and at such place or places as the Board may direct.

18. No entire horse, bull, or ram over the age of six months shall be allowed to run or depasture on the Common, and, in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws, such entire horse, bull, or ram thereon may be dealt with as trespassing stock in the manner prescribed under "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," and any amendments thereof and by these By-laws.

19. The owner, person, or persons granted permission under these By-laws shall be solely responsible for any act of trespass on any adjoining lands to the Common, or for any damage done to adjoining lands.

20. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or anything contrary to these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding five pounds.

21. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary revenue of the Board.

22. If at any time the Board may require the services of a ranger, the person appointed by the Board will be required to find two sureties of £25 each for the full and faithful performance of his duties under these By-laws.

23. All moneys for fees and expenses owing to the Board or the lessee of the Common for the time being under these By-laws, for the depasturing of stock on the Common, or otherwise expenses incurred in connection therewith under these By-laws, shall constitute a debt to the said Board or lessee, recoverable by civil action, at the suit of the said Board or lessee in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

24. The secretary, lessee, or ranger shall at any time with the approval of the Board, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of fees unpaid, or the recovery of any fine or penalty for any breach of the within By-laws or any of them.

25. All existing By-laws relating to the Common are repealed as from the date of the publication of these By-laws in the *Government Gazette*.

MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1906, AND THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1934.

Petition bearing date the 6th day of November, 1934, to dissolve the Municipality of Busselton and merge same into the Sussex Road District.

Department of Works,
Perth, 20th February, 1935.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that a Petition, the substance and prayer whereof are as follows:—1, That the Municipality of Busselton be dissolved; 2, That the District now controlled by such municipality be annexed to the District controlled by the Sussex Road Board, has been presented to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934."

The reasons stated by the petitioners are as follow:—

1. The area of the Municipality (one square mile) is too small and much of this area is unrateable or exempt from rates; that its actual rateable value and the income from rates is too small for a Municipality, and that, as a consequence of the small rateable area, the financial burden of the ratepayers of the Municipality is far greater than it should be;

2. As disclosed by the last annual statement the Council has a large overdraft from the Bank of New South Wales, and this is often the position, whereas the Sussex Road Board, it is alleged by the petitioners, has or had a large credit balance at the date of the Petition;

3. Most of the building during the last ten years has taken place outside the Municipality, in an area known as "West Busselton," which is separated only from the Municipality by the width of a road called West Street. This area is served with electric light and power and, in some cases, water, by the Municipal Power House, which is situated in East Busselton;

4. Owing to the swampy nature of much of the land surrounding most of the other parts of Busselton, the Town has naturally grown towards the West, and is still growing in that direction. It is stated that instances can be quoted of persons removing their places of business and residence altogether from the Municipality and re-erecting them in West Busselton;

5. In West Busselton there are about 188 houses which, being in the Sussex Road Board, pay nothing towards the maintenance of the public utilities of the Municipality, which they enjoy equally with the Municipal ratepayers, nor do they pay any Municipal Loan Rates;

6. Owing to the small size of the Municipality and the small population, the Council only consists of six members (five of whom are at present general storekeepers) and the Mayor (who is a contractor). The remaining Councillor is a carpenter. This is too small, and renders such a Council liable to domination by one or two individuals;

7. The rates in West Busselton are pounds less than they are in the Municipality; notwithstanding this, far more developmental work can apparently be done there than seems possible within the Municipality;

8. Owing to the disparity in rating land values are falling in the residential portion of the Municipality, but the high rating continues, and in some cases has been increased. If this drop in values in the Municipality continues it may eventually affect the Loan position;

9. In the event of the Road Board at any time deciding to have their own officials (which has recently been suggested), it would be very difficult for this Council to maintain its position financially;

10. A Health Board now exists, consisting of representatives of the Road Board and Council, which has jurisdiction over the Municipality and West Busselton, and there is also a meat area over a still larger district. This fact alone shows that the affairs of the Municipality and West Busselton can be administered by one local governing body, and that the retention of the Municipality is not warranted;

11. That the Municipality has spent the public money on works which have proved to be useless for example, the seawall, now partly washed away; removal of sand hills, which formed a natural break-water against the ocean on a low lying shore;

12. The Road Districts Act would make for better government, so far as your petitioners are concerned, as the Road Districts Act is much more up to date than the Municipal Corporations Act, and stricter supervision is kept over the local governing bodies under that Act;

13. That the Council has not kept ratepayers properly posted with information dealing with its expenditure and general business. It is suggested that breaches of Sections 39 and 161 have taken place during the past five years.

The Petition, and the reasons advanced in support of the Petition, have been referred to the Council of the Municipality of Busselton, and the Council has advanced the following reasons against granting the prayer of the Petition:—

1. Neither the area nor the rateable value of the Municipality has been proved to be too small and the Council instances the progress of the Municipality since 1897. As regards property exempt from rating, the position could not be altered if the area were controlled by a Road Board; the unrateable land as such would retain its significance. The burden of rates compares fairly with that imposed by other Municipalities;

2. The statement regarding the overdraft is untrue and calculated to mislead. It is stated that, as evidenced by the latest audit report, there was a net debit of only £49 13s. 7d., whilst as at the 4th February, 1935, there was a credit balance;

3. The value of new buildings in the Municipality and alterations and extensions to existing buildings during the past ten years has increased considerably, and it is alleged that the annual increase in the value of property will bear out this contention;

4. Isolated instances of buildings being removed from the Municipal area to West Busselton are admitted. It must also be conceded that buildings have been removed from the Sussex Road Board District to the Municipal area. Swamp land is not confined to the Municipal area, but it is anticipated that drainage and filling completed, and further works authorised by the Municipality, will alleviate much flooding;

5. The Council agrees with the statement advanced in reason No. 5 in support of the Petition, but at the same time states that this is not a good ground for the dissolution of the Municipality and annexing of the district to the Sussex Road Board;

6. The Council is constituted by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and if there is any grievance as to the constitution of the Council this can be rectified under that Act;

7. The Council denies that its development works are less than those which have been carried out in West Busselton;

8. A thorough revaluation of all rateable property was made in 1933, and many anomalies rectified. Individual ratepayers have adequate remedy under the Act, if valuations are considered too high. Any abnormal drop in values will have to be met when the occasion demands. Reference to the Loan position is obscure, but repayment of all current loans is well provided for; and all present loans, with the exception of the new Electric Light Loan, should be paid off by 1937. The objective is the elimination of Loan Rates on loans raised for the Electric Lighting Undertaking;

9. The present arrangement regarding the office staff is the subject of an agreement between the two bodies and their officers, at the acquiescence of the Department, and the Council has no knowledge of any proposal to alter this arrangement. In any event, it is not agreed that the Municipality would have financial difficulty in maintaining its own separate staff;

10. The Council agrees that the combined area could be best administered by one Local Authority, but considers that if an alteration is made the Local Authority should be a Municipality;

11. It is denied that money has been wasted on works;

12. It is contended that efficient control can be exercised under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906";

13. The Council denies that any breaches of Sections 31 and 161 have taken place, or that there has been any unwillingness on the part of the Council to publish anything relating to the affairs of the Municipality;

Furthermore, that the financial position of the Sussex Road Board cannot be compared with that of the Municipality, and the condition of the roads in the Municipality is much better than in the Road Board.

Any ratepayer of either the Municipality or the Road District desiring to advance reasons why the prayer of the Petition should or should not be granted should forward same to the undersigned not later than the Fifteenth day of April, 1935.
