#### The Fisheries Act, 1905-21. PROCLAMATION

[L.S.]

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitcheil, to wir. K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and JAMES MITCHELL, Lieutenant-Governor. Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia

1287/30.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: whereas it is deemed desirable to cancel a certain portion of the Proclamation under the said Act dated the 28th day of December, 1934, and published in the Government Gazette of the 11th January, 1935, prohibiting the taking of fish by means of fishing nets in the waters described in the said Proclamation during a specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the power aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, cancel the sixth paragraph of the Schedule of the said Proclamation, and proclaim and declare as follows:— That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets, and also against the use of fishing lines set for the capture of sharks, as from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette until the 31st day of December, 1935, inclusive.

#### Schedule.

Scarborough Beach:-All that area of Western Australian waters at Scarborough Beach commencing at a point fronting the Western extremity of Reserve Street and extending in a Southerly direction to a point two chains South of Brighton Road, and to a width of one half-mile from high-water mark.

- 1. In pursuance of Section 20 of the said Act, that the number of members of the Wiluna Road Board (hereinafter called the Board) be increased as from the 1st day of March, 1935, from eight to nine, and that the additional member be allocated to the Mines Ward of the District of the Board;
- In pursuance of Section 14 of the said Act, that an Election shall be held on the 27th day of April, 1935, for the purpose of electing the additional member, and that no new Election in respect of the offices of the existing memers shall be held by reason of such increase in members.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 5/1932.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, Sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22 and 23 of the said Act:

Description and Location of Reticulation Works Approved and Exempted:—Metropolitan Reticulation Main Improvements: - Canning Road District:

- (1) Proposed four-inch diameter water main commencing at the existing four-inch diameter main at the intersection of Station Street and Campbell Street and proceeding thence in a South-Easterly direction along Campbell Street to Lacey Street (length about twentythree chains).
- (2) Proposed three-inch diameter water main commencing at the above-mentioned proposed four-inch diameter main at the junction of Campbell Street and Lacey Street and proceeding thence in a South-Westerly direction along Lacey Street to connect with the existing inch-and-half diameter main opposite Lot 415 (length about twelve and a half chains).
- (3) Proposed four-inch diameter water main commencing at the existing eight-inch diameter main at the junction of Railway Parade and Lacey Street and proceeding thence in a North-Easterly direction along Lacey Street to connect with the existing inch-and-a-quarter diameter main at the junction of Lacey Street and Henry Street (length about eight chains).

The above mains to be complete with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, and the existing tube mains to be lifted as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 5478.

(4) Proposed four-inch diameter water main commencing at the existing four-inch diameter main at the intersection of Gibbs Street and Central Terrace and proceeding thence in a North-Easterly direction along Gibbs Street to Stephen Street (length about thirtynine and a half chains).

(5) Proposed three-inch diameter water main commencing at the above-mentioned proposed four-inch diameter main at the junction of Gibbs Street and Stephen Street and proceeding thence in a North-Easterly direction along Gibbs Street to a point opposite Lot 66 (length about seven chains).

The above mains to be complete with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus and the existing tube main to be lifted as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 5479.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 8th day of March, 1935.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 30/35. W.A. No. 5454.

  - (4) Where the Under Treasurer of the State is on any occasion, or for any period through absence, or for any other reason unable to attend any meeting of the Board, or to carry out his duties as such member, he may by writing under his hand appoint any other Treasury officer as his deputy to act in his place as a member of the Board on the occasion or during the period aforesaid, and all and whatsoever such person shall do as such deputy shall be deemed to have been done by the said Under Treasurer and shall have effect accordingly.

WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the power conferred by Section 33 of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906," by notice in the Government Gazette published on the 11th day of November, 1918, cancelled the whole of paragraph (g) of General Rule (3) of Section 32 of the said Act, and substituted in lieu thereof another paragraph (g) in respect of and to be observed by all mines as set out in the said notice: And whereas His Excellency the Administrator, in exercise of the said powers, by notice in the Government Gazette of the said powers, by notice in the Government Gazette published on the 27th day of May, 1932, amended the said last-mentioned paragraph (g) in the manner set forth in such last-mentioned notice, and by the same notice cancelled paragraph (h) of the said General Rule (3) of Section 32 aforesaid, and made another paragraph (h) in respect of and to be observed by all mines as set out in such notice: And whereas His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the said power, by notice in the Government Gazette published on the

28th day of October, 1932, amended the said last-mentioned paragraphs (g) and (h) in the manner set forth to be observed by all mines as set out in such notice: And whereas it is now deemed expedient to revoke the said last-mentioned notice and to make other provision in lieu thereof: Now, therefore, His Excelleney the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, having previously revoked the said notices published in the Government Gazette on the 11th day of January, 1918, and the 27th day of May, 1932, respectively, doth hereby revoke the notice published in the Government Gazette on the 28th day of October, 1932, and in exercise of the power conferred by Section 33 of the said Act doth by this notice vary paragraph (g) and paragraph (h) of General Rule (3) of Section 32 of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906," so far as relates only to the mines using rockdrills to bore holes for blasting underground, as follows:—

- 1. In respect of the mines using rock drills to bore holes for blasting underground, paragraph (g) and paragraph (h) of General Rule (3) of Section 32 aforesaid is varied so as to read, as follows:—
  - (g) (i) No explosives shall be taken into any working face in quantity exceeding what would be required for use during one shift in such face. No explosives shall be taken into such face, except in securely covered cases or canisters of size and construction approved by the inspector;
    - (ii) Fuses which have detonators attached to them shall not be carried into such face, except in a securely covered receptacle of size and construction approved by the inspector separate from the case or canister used for other explosives;
    - (iii) No workman or party of workmen shall have in use at any one time in any places more than one such receptacle for capped fuses and one such case or canister for other explosives.
  - (h) Detonators shall not be sent below ground in the workings of a mine unless attached to fuse in the form of "rods." All fuses to be used for firing charges of explosives shall be prepared in daylight, under cover, by being cut into required lengths with a sharp instrument, and detonators shall be placed on the fuse and crimped thereto by an approved tool. The distribution of capped fuses shall be undertaken in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (g) of General Rule (3) of Section 32 of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906."

IN accordance with Section 63 of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906," His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve the amendment of the undermentioned General Rules, under Regulation 4 of the Regulations, also an additional Regulation 17a, made under the said Act.

Regulation 4, General Rule 24, to insert after the word "remedies" the words "including oxygen gas." General Rule 38, paragraph (2), to insert after the word "fresh" the words "hot and cold."

General Rule 38, paragraph (3), to cancel the word "thirty" and insert the word "twenty," and after the word "shift" insert the words "and more, if in the opinion of the Inspector of Mines they are necessary," and after the word "be" insert the words "at least five feet apart."

General Rule 38, paragraph (4), after the word "weather" add the words "and for keeping clean and working clothes separate."

General Rule 38, to add an additional paragraph (6), as follows:—

(6) Change rooms shall be as near the haulage shafts as in the opinion of the Inspector of Mines it is reasonably practicable to have them.

General Rule 47, to cancel the words "properly covered" and insert the word "approved."

General Rule 49, to cancel all the words after the words "once a week," in the preceding paragraph and to substitute the following words, "Rules 47, 48, and 49 shall apply to and be observed only by the mines using rock drills to bore holes for blasting underground."

Regulation 17a, inserted as follows:-

- 17a, Certificates for Underground Supervisors.
- (1) Every person employed or acting as an underground supervisor in the capacity of an underground manager, foreman or shift boss, whose duty it is to exercise some control and supervision over twelve or more underground employees in any mine shall—
  - (a) have been employed underground for a period of not less than five years, and
  - (b) be the holder of a certificate of competency under this regulation.
- (2) For the purpose of granting certificates of competency and of service for the purpose of this Act, there shall be a Board of Examiners consisting of three members, viz.—
  - The State Mining Engineer, who shall be chairman thereof;
  - The Director of the School of Mines of Western Australia;
  - And an Inspector of Mines from time to time appointed by the Minister;
    who will examine the applicants in writing, or

who will examine the applicants in writing, or orally, or both, as may seem to the Board most advisable, and issue certificates to the successful applicants.

The subjects for examination shall be:-

- (a) mining, as detailed under Regulation 17, Clause(6), paragraph (a);
- (b) knowledge of the mining laws in force in the State, especially the Mines Regulation Act and Regulations.

The Board may refuse a certificate to any applicant if not satisfied as to his character.

- (3) (a) The Board will meet at such places and at such times as the Minister may appoint. Notices of intention to hold examination will be advertised in a paper or papers circulating in the mining districts of the State.
- (b) Any person desirous of presenting himself for examination shall notify the Secretary of the Board of Examiners for Underground Supervisors, Department of Mines, Perth, of the fact on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary. The notice shall be accompanied by a fee of £1 1s. This fee shall admit to one examination only.
- (c) Each candidate shall forward to the Secretary for the Board of Examiners, at least 14 days before the date of examination, satisfactory evidence as to experience and general good conduct, and as to his having been employed underground for a period of not less than five years. A statutory declaration shall be attached to the effect that all the representations contained in such statement are true.
- (4) If at any time representation is made to the Minister by an Inspector that any holder of a certificate under this regulation is incompetent or unfit to discharge his duties, or has been convicted of an offence against this regulation, the Minister may, if he thinks fit, cause inquiry to be made by the Board of Examiners into the conduct of the above-mentioned holder of a certificate, and with respect to every such inquiry the following provisions shall have effect:—
  - (a) The inquiry will be held at such time or place as the Board may appoint; the aforesaid holder of a certificate to have the right to defend himself at such inquiry. He shall receive twentyone days' notice of the Board's intention to hold the inquiry.
  - (b) The Board shall, at least ten days before the commencement of the inquiry, furnish the aforesaid holder of a certificate with a statement of the case upon which the inquiry is instituted.

- (c) The aforesaid holder of a certificate shall attend such inquiry and may produce such evidence as may be considered necessary.
- (d) The Board shall, upon the conclusion of the inquiry, forward to the Minister a report containing a full statement of the case, and their opinion thereon; and the Governor, on the recommendation of the Minister, may either cancel or suspend such certificate.
- (c) Any person shall, if ordered in writing so to do by the Minister, deliver into the charge of the said Board his certificate of competency or of service which shall be retained by the said Board during the period of his disqualification, and no such person shall during the period of such disqualification take charge of any mine, and any such person failing or neglecting to comply with this order shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation; and
- (f) Persons attending as witnesses before the Board shall be allowed such expenses as would be allowed to witnesses in a criminal case at the Supreme Court.
- (5) (1) The Board of Examiners may make such order as it thinks fit respecting the costs and expenses of the inquiry, and such order shall, on the application of any party entitled to the benefit thereof, be enforced by any Court of summary jurisdiction as if such costs and expenses were a penalty imposed by that Court.
- (2) The party entitled to the benefit of such order shall be entitled to obtain from the Board a certified copy thereof.
- (6) Where a certificate is suspended or cancelled in pursuance of this regulation, the suspension or cancellation shall be recorded in the register of the holders of certificates, and shall be notified by the Board to the Minister.
- (7) Whenever any person proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that he has, without fault on his part, lost any certificate granted to him under this regulation, the Minister may, on payment of a fee of ten shillings, cause a copy of the certificate to which the applicant appears by the register to be entitled to be made out and certified by the person who keeps the register,

- and delivered to the applicant; and any copy which purports to be so made and certified as aforesaid shall have all the effect of the original certificate.
- (8) Every person who commits any of the following offences (that is to say)—
  - forges or counterfeits, or knowingly makes any false statement in any certificate of competency under this regulation, or in any certificate of service granted under this regulation, or any official copy of such certificate; or
  - (2) knowingly utters or uses such certificate or copy which has been forged or counterfeited, or contains any false statement, or knowingly makes use of, or attempts to make use of, any certificate of competency or service granted to some other person; or
  - (3) for the purpose of obtaining for himself or any other person employment as an underground manager, foreman, shift boss or supervisor, or for the purpose of obtaining the grant, renewal, or restoration of any certificate under this regulation, or a copy thereof, either—
    - (a) makes or gives any declaration, representation, statement or evidence which is false in any particular; or
    - (b) knowingly utters, produces, or makes use of any such declaration, representation, statement, or evidence or any document containing the same.
    - containing the same, shall be guilty of a misdemeanour, and be liable on conviction to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months.
- (9) Any person who acts as an underground supervisor in the capacity of an underground manager, foreman or shift boss; without being the holder of the proper certificate, and every person who knowingly employs such uncertificated person in such capacity is liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, and to a further fine not exceeding two pounds for every day or part of a day during which he so acts, after notification by an Inspector of Mines or some other person authorised by the Minister that proceedings are to be taken against him for an offence against this regulation.

MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1906, AND THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1934.

Petition bearing date the 6th day of November, 1934, to dissolve the Municipality of Busselton and merge same into the Sussex Road District.

> Department of Works, Perth, 20th February, 1935.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that a Petition, the substance and prayer whereof are as follows:—1, That the Municipality of Busselton be dissolved; 2, That the District now controlled by such municipality be annexed to the District controlled by the Sussex Road Board, has been presented to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934."

The reasons stated by the petitioners are as follow:-

- 1. The area of the Municipality (one square mile) is too small and much of this area is unrateable or exempt from rates; that its actual rateable value and the income from rates is too small for a Municipality, and that, as a consequence of the small rateable area, the financial burden of the ratepayers of the Municipality is far greater than it should be;
- 2. As disclosed by the last annual statement the Council has a large overdraft from the Bank of New South Wales, and this is often the position, whereas the Sussex Road Board, it is alleged by the petitioners, has or had a large credit balance at the date of the Petition;
- 3. Most of the building during the last ten years has taken place outside the Municipality, in an area known as "West Busselton," which is separated only from the Municipality by the width of a road called West Street. This area is served with electric light and power and, in some cases, water, by the Municipal Power House, which is situated in East Busselton;

- 4. Owing to the swampy nature of much of the land surrounding most of the other parts of Busselton, the Town has naturally grown towards the West, and is still growing in that direction. It is stated that instances can be quoted of persons removing their places of business and residence altogether from the Municipality and re-erecting them in West Busselton;
- 5. In West Busselton there are about 188 houses which, being in the Sussex Road Board, pay nothing towards the maintenance of the public utilities of the Municipality, which they enjoy equally with the Municipal ratepayers, nor do they pay any Municipal Loan Rates;
- 6. Owing to the small size of the Municipality and the small population, the Council only consists of six members (five of whom are at present general storekeepers) and the Mayor (who is a contractor). The remaining Councillor is a carpenter. This is too small, and renders such a Council liable to domination by one or two individuals;
- 7. The rates in West Busselton are pounds less than they are in the Municipality; notwithstanding this, far more developmental work can apparently be done there than seems possible within the Municipality;
- 8. Owing to the disparity in rating land values are falling in the residential portion of the Municipality, but the high rating continues, and in some cases has been increased. If this drop in values in the Municipality continues it may eventually affect the Loan position;
- 9. In the event of the Road Board at any time deciding to have their own officials (which has recently been suggested), it would be very difficult for this Council to maintain its position financially;
- 10. A Health Board now exists, consisting of representatives of the Road Board and Council, which has jurisdiction over the Municipality and West Busselton, and there is also a meat area over a still larger district. This fact alone shows that the affairs of the Municipality and West Busselton can be administered by one local governing body, and that the retention of the Municipality is not warranted;
- 11. That the Municipality has spent the public money on works which have proved to be useless for example, the seawall, now partly washed away; removal of sand hills, which formed a natural breakwater against the ocean on a low lying shore;
- 12. The Road Districts Act would make for better government, so far as your petitioners are concerned, as the Road Districts Act is much more up to date than the Municipal Corporations Act, and stricter supervision is kept over the local governing bodies under that Act;
- 13. That the Council has not kept ratepayers properly posted with information dealing with its expenditure and general business. It is suggested that breaches of Sections 39 and 161 have taken place during the past five years.

The Petition, and the reasons advanced in support of the Petition, have been referred to the Council of the Municipality of Busselton, and the Council has advanced the following reasons against granting the prayer of the Petition:—

- 1. Neither the area nor the rateable value of the Municipality has been proved to be too small and the Council instances the progress of the Municipality since 1897. As regards property exempt from rating, the position could not be altered if the area were controlled by a Road Board; the unrateable land as such would retain its significance. The burden of rates compares fairly with that imposed by other Municipalities;
- 2. The statement regarding the overdraft is untrue and calculated to mislead. It is stated that, as evidenced by the latest audit report, there was a net debit of only £49 13s. 7d., whilst as at the 4th February, 1935, there was a credit balance;
- 3. The value of new buildings in the Municipality and alterations and extensions to existing buildings during the past ten years has increased considerably, and it is alleged that the annual increase in the value of property will bear out this contention:

- 4. Isolated instances of buildings being removed from the Municipal area to West Busselton are admitted. It must also be conceded that buildings have been removed from the Sussex Road Board District to the Municipal area. Swamp land is not confined to the Municipal area, but it is anticipated that drainage and filling completed, and further works authorised by the Municipality, will alleviate much flooding;
- 5. The Council agrees with the statement advanced in reason No. 5 in support of the Petition, but at the same time states that this is not a good ground for the dissolution of the Municipality and annexing of the district to the Sussex Road Board;
- 6. The Council is constituted by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and if there is any grievance as to the constitution of the Council this can be rectified under that Act;
- 7. The Council denies that its development works are less than those which have been carried out in West Busselton;
- 8. A thorough revaluation of all rateable property was made in 1933, and many anomalies rectified. Individual ratepayers have adequate remedy under the Act, if valuations are considered too high. Any abnormal drop in values will have to be met when the occasion demands. Reference to the Loan position is obscure, but repayment of all current loans is well provided for; and all present loans, with the exception of the new Electric Light Loan, should be paid off by 1937. The objective is the elimination of Loan Rates on loans raised for the Electric Lighting Undertaking;
- 9. The present arrangement regarding the office staff is the subject of an agreement between the two bodies and their officers, at the acquiescence of the Department, and the Council has no knowledge of any proposal to alter this arrangement. In any event, it is not agreed that the Municipality would have financial difficulty in maintaining its own separate staff;
- 10. The Council agrees that the combined area could be best administered by one Local Authority, but considers that if an alteration is made the Local Authority should be a Municipality;
- 11. It is denied that money has been wasted on works;
- 12. It is contended that efficient control can be exercised under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906";
- 13. The Council denies that any breaches of Sections 31 and 161 have taken place, or that there has been any unwillingness on the part of the Council to publish anything relating to the affairs of the Municipality;

Furthermore, that the financial position of the Sussex Road Board cannot be compared with that of the Municipality, and the condition of the roads in the Municipality is much better than in the Road Board.

Any ratepayer of either the Municipality or the Road District desiring to advance reasons why the prayer of the Petition should or should not be granted should forward same to the undersigned not later than the Fifteenth day of April, 1935.

#### METROPOLITAN MARKET ACT, 1926.

The Metropolitan Market Trust, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by "The Metropolitan Market Act, 1926," doth hereby amend the By-laws heretofore made under and for the purposes of the said Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 26th day of June, 1931, as follows:—

- 1. By-law 46 is rescinded and a new By-law is inserted in lieu thereof, as follows:—
  - 46. (1) Every lessee of premises where produce is sold by the lessee as an agent shall, as soon as practicable after the sale of any such produce, make out—
    - (a) an invoice to the buyer, recording the buyer's name or code (number or initials), and de-

- tails of the goods sold, including quantities, weights (where charged by weight), and prices;
- (b) an account sales of such produce in the name or code of the consignor, giving an accurate record of the goods sold on account of the consignor, the date thereof, and showing under separate headings the charges and disbursements deducted from the proceeds of sale.
- (2) Every lessee of premises where produce is sold by the lessee as an agent shall keep at his place of business in the market the following records relating to the sale of all such produce at his premises. Such records shall be kept legibly written up in the English language from day to day:—
  - (a) Records showing particulars of all goods received for sale; the date of the receipt thereof and the name or code of the consignor;
  - (b) A record, showing particulars of weights of all goods sold by weight, showing the name or code of the consignor;
  - (c) A sales journal or sales sheets recording details of all goods sold, and the prices, the name or code of the consignors, and the name or code of the buyers;
  - (d) Duplicate of invoices, or a book containing particulars of all invoices made out for buyers in accordance with the preceding Bylaw;
  - (c) A register containing the name and addresses of all buyers who have purchased goods on credit, giving the initials and surname of the buyer and business address, and buyer's code;
  - (f) Records of all account sales, showing the name or code of the consignor, the date of sale, the gross proceeds and the net proceeds, and the cheque number in respect of the cheque forwarded in payment of each account or record where such payments are made by cash, and the date of such payments.
- (3) All such books and records shall be kept for a period not less than six months and shall be available for inspection by the Secretary during business hours. The Secretary shall be entitled to take such copies of documents as he may consider desirable, but shall not divulge any information secured as a result of his inspection, except to the Trust.
- (4) Every lessee who fails or neglects to comply with the obligations of this By-law, or who refuses to permit or delays any inspection by the Secretary of any books or records which are to be kept under this By-law, or who keeps any record which is not correct, or who endeavours to mislead the Secretary in respect of any record, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds in respect of each such offence.
- (5) Any consignor who is dissatisfied as to the correctness of any return received by him from any lessee in respect of goods sold by such lessee as an agent shall be entitled to complain to the Trust. Such consignor may be required to furnish particulars of his complaint in writing, and upon receipt of same the matter shall be investigated by the Secretary, who shall report his investigation to the Trust. The Trust shall not be obliged to divulge either the details or the result of such investigation.

- 2. By-law 48A (published in the Government Gazette on the 20th day of October, 1933) is reseinded, and a new By-law is inserted in lieu thereof as follows:—
  - 48A. (1) No person shall sell by auction, or permit or suffer to be sold by auction in the Metropolitan Area, any fish elsewhere than in the premises of the Metropolitan Market Trust as established and conducted as the Fish Market by the said Trust under the Act.
  - (2) Any person who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.
- 3. New By-laws are added at the end of and shall become part of the said By-laws, to stand as By-laws Nos. 53, 54, 55, 56, and 57 respectively, as follows:—

Common Carriers plying for Hire upon the Premises of the Trust.

- 53. (a) (1) No person, whether as principal or agent or servant of another person, shall carry on or attempt to carry on the business of a common carrier upon any portion of the premises of the Metropolitan Market Trust, or frequent or use any portion of the said premises for the purpose of carrying on the business of a common carrier, unless and until such person, being the principal, shall have obtained a permit in writing so to do, signed by the Secretary of the Trust.
- (2) Any person desiring to obtain a permit under this By-law shall apply in writing signed by him to the Secretary.
- (3) Upon receipt of the application, and subject to payment of the fee fixed by the Trust for the hire of the identification disc or plate, hereinafter mentioned, the Secretary may issue to the applicant a permit under and for the purposes of this By-law, together with an identification disc or plate.
- (4) The Secretary may, and shall, if so directed by the Trust, refuse any application for a permit made under this By-law.
- 54. (1) A permit issued under the authority of the next preceding By-law shall, during the currency thereof, authorise the person to whom it is issued, or his bona fide servant or agent, while the identification disc or plate is exhibited conspicuously upon his vehicle, and, subject in other respects to the Act and these By-laws, to carry on the business of a common carrier upon or to frequent and use the premises of the Trust for the purpose of carrying on the business of a common carrier during the hours when such premises are open for the transaction of business in such places, and upon such ways as may be determined from time to time by the Trust.
- (2) Every such permit shall remain in force until revoked.
- (3) The Secretary may at any time, and shall, if so directed by the Trust, revoke any permit without giving any notice or reason of or for such revocation.
- (4) A permit may be revoked by notice in writing signed by the Secretary and given to the holder thereof.
- (5) If the holder of a permit shall be convicted of any offence against the Act or these By-laws, or, if he or his servant or agent shall fail to keep his identification disc or plate exhibited conspicuously upon his vehicle whilst carrying on the business of a common carrier upon the premises of the Trust, the permit of such holder shall forthwith be revoked.
- (6) Every identification disc or plate issued to the holder of a permit shall be and remain at all times the property of the Trust, and the person for the time being holding the same shall be deemed to be a hirer thereof only; and every such identification disc or plate shall be returned forthwith by the holder thereof to the Secretary

- on demand. If any such disc or plate be not so returned, when demanded, the same shall be recoverable at the suit of the Secretary from the person for the time being having the same in his possession as being the property of the Trust.
- 55. A permit and an identification disc or plate issued under these By-laws shall not be transferable by the person to whom the same is issued to any other person.

Provided that this By-law shall not apply to the use of a permit, or of an identification disc or plate, by the servant or agent of the person to whom the same were issued in the ordinary course of his employment or service by or for such permit holder.

- 56. (1) Any person upon the premises of the Trust who appears to be carrying on or to be engaged in the business of a common carrier may be required by the Secretary or any other officer of the Trust to produce his permit.
- (2) Any such person who fails to comply with any such requisition or otherwise to satisfy the Secretary or officer aforesaid that he is not carrying on or engaged in the carrying or. of the business of a common carrier upon the premises of the Trust shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.
- 57. Ingress and egress between North Road and Railway reserve—
- (1) No person shall use or attempt to use the gateway between the railway reserve and that portion of the premises of the Trust known as North Road for the purpose of passing from North Road aforesaid to the Railway Reserve, or from the Railway Reserve to North Road aforesaid, without a permit in writing first obtained from the Sceretary of the Trust.
- (2) The Secretary may issue a permit in writing signed by him to any person for the purposes of this By-law. Such permit shall remain in force until revoked by the Secretary by notice in writing given to the holder thereof. A permit given under this By-law may be revoked at any time.
- (3) Any person found by any officer of the Trust using or attempting to use the said gateway for the purpose mentioned in Subclause (1) of this By-law shall, upon demand, forthwith produce his permit under this By-law for inspection by such officer.
- (4) Any person who commits any breach or contravention of any provision of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

### DAIRY PRODUCTS MARKETING REGULATION ACT, 1934.

Regulations.

#### Licenses.

- 1. Application for a License as a Manufacturer shall be made in Form 1 of the First Schedule to these Regulations, and shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.
- 2. Applications for a License as a Dealer shall be made in Form 2 of the First Schedule to these Regulations, and shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.
- 3. A License to carry on the Business as a Manufacturer or Dealer shall be made in Form 3 of the First Schedule to these Regulations.
- 4. Application for a License for a Storage Place shall be made in Form 4 of the First Schedule to these Regulations and shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.
- $5.\;$  A License for a Storage Place shall be made in Form 5 of the First Schedule to these Regulations.
- 6. Every application for a License shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.
- 7. In the event of the application for any License being refused, the Board may in its discretion refund such fee or apply the same in and towards the expenses of administering the Act.
- 8. In considering the application for any License, the Board may require the applicant to attend before it and answer such questions as it desires relative to the application.
- 9. No License for a Manufacturer or Dealer shall be transferable.
- 10. An application for the transfer of a License of a Storage Place shall be made in Form 6 of the First Schedule to the Regulations and shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed in the Second Schedule to the Regulations, and the relative License shall be attached to the application form.
- 11. The memorandum of a transfer of a License for a Storage Place shall be indorsed on the License transferred and be made in Form 7 of the First Schedule to these Regulations.
- 12. Every person holding a License under the Act shall at all times—
  - (a) Furnish to the Board such returns relating to his operations under the License as the Board may require from time to time;
  - (b) permit the Board to have access to and make extracts from all books, documents, and records relating thereto.

#### The Board.

- 13. The fees and expenses payable to each of the members of the Board, excluding the Chairman, shall be as follows:—
  - (a) A sitting fee of £1 1s. per day or part thereof; and
  - (b) Time occupied in travelling, in excess of one day, to and from meetings, at the rate of £1 ls. per day or part of a day;

- (c) Travelling allowance at the rate of £1 1s. per day and proportionately for part of a day;
- (d) The actual cost of travelling from a member's home to the place where the Board meeting is held and return; provided such cost does not exceed the fare for a similar journey by train;
- (e) The Chairman shall not receive the sitting fee, but shall be entitled to the travelling allowance and actual cost of travelling on the basis set out in paragraphs (c) and (d) respectively when engaged on the business of the Board.
- (f) Whenever by the direction of the Board any member thereof makes any inspection or performs any other service on behalf of the Board under and for the purposes of the Act or Regulations, such member may, by resolution of the Board, be granted and paid out of the funds of the Board a fee by way of remuneration for his said services for and in respect of each day or part of a day during which the services are performed.

Provided that the fee granted and paid to any member hereunder shall not exceed £1 1s. per day.

# INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT—STATE FARMS, ETC.

No. 8 of 1935.

(Registered 23/2/1935.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 18th day of February, 1935, between the Minister for Agriculture February, 1935, between the Minister for Agriculture and the Minister for Education (hereinafter called the "Ministers"), of the one part, and the Australian Workers' Union Westralian Branch Pastoral and Agricultural Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed the one with the other as follows:--

- (b) Instructors at Muresk—15s, margin per week over basic wage; adult male farm hands—basic wage; adult domestics—basic wage.
- (e) Employees provided with board and lodging for themselves only shall be charged an amount equal to 28 per cent. of the male basic wage, and such amount shall be deducted from wages specified in Subclause (b). Employees provided with quarters shall be charged a reasonable rental, not exceeding 25 per cent. of the male basic wage: provided that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this clause, the existing arrangement re charges for quarters, use of cow, and supply of meat, shall continue.

# 4.-District Allowances.

District allowances shall be paid as follows—at Yilgarn, Salmon Gums, and Dampawah, 5s. per week.

# 5.--Holidays.

Employees shall be entitled to 16 paid holidays per anuum. When employed for a lesser period than twelve months, pro rata holiday pay shall be granted after one month's continuous service.

#### 6.—Preference in Employment.

Preference of employment shall be given to financial members of Unions: provided the Ministers shall not be under any obligation to communicate with a Union office to ascertain whether a member is financial.

#### 7.—Long Service Leave.

Long service leave shall be granted by the Ministers in accordance with the conditions relating to full time Government wages employees generally.

#### 8.—Term of Agreement.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three years: provided that, after the expiration of twelve months from the date hereof, either party may apply to the other for a variation or amendment of agreement, or any part thereof. In the event of the parties failing to agree, it is agreed that the matters in dispute shall be referred to the Industrial Registrar for final determination.

- (6) Should the places become steeper than 1 in 5, special arrangements shall be made.

The parties to this Agreement agree that the minimum rate of wages and conditions of labour shall be as follows:—

#### 2.—Hours—Overtime.

(a) Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work, from 1st May to 31st October, and forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work from 1st November to 30th April in each year. All time worked in excess of eight hours in any one day shall be deemed overtime and shall be paid for at time-and-a-half rates. Each day shall stand by itself.

## Sundays and Holidays.

- (b) All work performed on Sundays and holidays shall be paid for at double time.
- (c) Any employee called in on Sundays or holidays as set out in Clause 4, shall be paid a minimum of eight hours at Sunday or holiday rates, and any work performed on Sundays or holidays in excess of eight hours shall be paid for at double time,

#### 3.—Wages.

The wages shall be weekly, and shall be as follows:-

Basic wage-£4 2s. per week.

Per week of 44 hours and/or 48 hours.

£ s. d.

All classes of engine-drivers .. 6 13 0

Firemen .. .. .. 6 3 6

- (a) Where three shifts are worked, unless rotations of shifts is carried out, the afternoon shiftman shall be allowed and paid 6s. per week, and the night shift 9s. per week, in addition to the weekly rates as set out in Clause 3.
- (b) Where only two shifts are worked, unless rotation of shifts is carried out, the afternoon shift shall be allowed and paid an additional 6s. per week to the rates set out in Clause 3.

#### 4.-Holidays.

The following days shall be observed as holidays, but should any employee have to work on any of these days double time rates shall be paid. Holidays mean:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Brewery Employees' Pienic Day, Labour Day, New Year's Day, Kalgoorlie Cup Day, Boulder Cup Day, and Anzae Day, providing that, when Boxing Day falls on a Saturday, all men required to work on that day shall do so and another day given in lieu thereof.

#### 5.—Annual Leave.

Twelve days annual leave on full pay shall become due after twelve months' service, such leave to be taken at such times as mutually agreed upon between the 30th April and 30th September, each year, in addition to holidays enumerated in Clause 4: provided that, should the employment be terminated before the holiday is due, the worker shall, after the completion of one month's service, be entitled to one day's pay in lieu of holidays for every month of service and portion of month: provided that, where the worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct, he shall not be entitled to the provisions of this clause.

#### 6.—General.

No engine-driver or fireman shall be called upon to do other work which will preclude him from maintaining effective supervision or control of his engines and boilers.

7.

Where the employment or work involves functions of a mixed character, the minimum wage to be paid to the employee shall be calculated as if he performed such only of the said functions as involves the highest rate of wages under this Agreement.

8.

The engagement between the employer and employee shall be weekly, a week's notice from either side to terminate same, except in the case of the employee absenting himself without leave, not obeying the lawful commands, or being guilty of misconduct, or of the works of the employer being stopped by fire, tempest, or other act of God, when such Agreement may be terminated immediately.

9

Suitable washing and changing facilities shall be provided for members adjacent to the engine room.

# 10.—Definitions.

- (a) Engine-driver means any person who starts, stops, takes charge of, or drives any engine or engines or machinery of which the motive power is steam, gas, suction gas, oil, air, electricity, or any other motive power other than manual or animal power, but this clause shall not apply to motors of 15 B.H.P. or under.
- (b) Full Payment for Shifts.—After beginning a shift, workers shall not be paid less than a full shift's wages, unless they leave of their own accord, or are dismissed for wilful misconduct.

This Agreement shall be limited in effect to the works and undertakings of the employer situated on the Eastern Goldfields.

This Agreement to commence as and from 1st January, 1935, and to remain in force for a period of two years from this date.
