NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934," which reads as follows :---

# BAYSWATER TOWN PLANNING SCHEME. T.P.B. 448/33.

THE Hon. the Minister for Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Sections 7 and 8 of the Town Planning and Development Act, No. 39 of 1928, has approved of the Bayswater Town Planning Scheme and the Regulations thereunder, as hereinafter set forth.

TOWN PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ΔCT, 1928.

Bayswater Town Planning Scheme and Regulations. Work No. 1.

Zoning or districting the Road Board District for industrial, shopping and residential purposes, as shown on Plan and described in the Schedule hereunder, and for the prohibition of buildings in low-lying areas until such land is drained or filled in.

# Industrial Areas.

#### Regulation.

(a) No portion of the Road Board District shall be used for industrial purposes, except those lands coloured purple, and excepting the areas defined in the Schedule. Industrial purposes shall mean any work, manufactory, or industrial enterprise not included in a shopping or business area.

(b) No noxious trade as, defined by the Health Act shall be established in any residential or shopping area, and shall be confined to the gazetted industrial area and in such location as the Road Board may deem best in the interests of the ratepayers and public health.

(c) Any noxious trade must provide for drainage disposal and the elimination of smoke and odours which the Road Board may consider detrimental to residential areas of the general amenity of the Road Board District.

(d) Where an industry is established at the date of the gazettal of the Town Planning Scheme, the land shall not be used for any other industrial purpose or change of purpose without the approval of the Road Board in terms of the Scheme.

# Schedule of Industrial Areas.

#### Regulation.

1. All those lots on which industries are established at the date of gazettal of this scheme.

2. All lands bounded by purple line on plan as follows:-

3. Commenience at North-West corner of Lot 978, Deposited Plan 3263, Swan Location Q1; thence Eastward along Broadway to Walker Road following the District boundary Southward to the Railway line, continuing on boundary South of Railway line to Colwyn Street; thence along Colwyn Street Westward to River Road; thence North-West along River Road to Bassendean Road; South along Bassendean Road to Clavering Road; thence North-West along Clavering Road to Beechboro Road; thence North-West along Drynan Road to Rothbury Road; thence North along Rothbury Road continuing along the Western boundary of Lot 284 on Diagram 3346 to Sanderson Street; South-West along Sanderson Street to Beechboro Road and North-West along Beechboro Road to point of commencement.

# Residential Areas.

#### Regulation.

(a) All lots or land within the Road Board District not included in the industrial or shopping areas may be used for residential purposes: Provided not more than one dwelling is erected on an area of 6,000 square feet or under: Provided also, that where a subdivision or separate title has existed prior to the gazettal of the Scheme for lots of less than 6,000 square feet, the Road Board may permit the erection of single family dwellings, subject to Health and Building By-laws, and subject to any Regulations under the scheme.

(b) Churches, public buildings, or other institutional buildings may be erected in the residential area with the approval of the Road Board.

(c) No residential lot shall be built on to cover more than one-third of the area of such lot.

- (d) No lot shall be built on where such land is below the seven feet contour as defined on the plan, unless:-
  - (1) The land is drained to the satisfaction of the Road Board, and/or
  - (2) The land is built up to the level of the crown of the road (whether existing or to be built) on which the lot fronts.

#### Shopping Areas Regulation.

(a) All those lots on which shops or businesses are erected at the date of gazettal of the scheme

(b) The whole of the frontages in South Crescent from Slade Street on the East to King William Street on the West; the whole of the frontages in King William Street from South Crescent to Murray Street on the West side and from South Crescent to Lot 36, Deposited Plan 2621 on the East side; the whole of the frontages in Slade Street from South Crescent to Lot 8 on Deposited Plan 3404 on the East side and from South Cres-cent to Lot 10, Deposited Plan 2621, Location U, on the West side, and frontage of Lots 4 and 5, Deposited Plan 4062, Location U; also Lots 77 and 78, Deposited Plan 2683, Location V, corner of Murray and Leake Streets; Lot 91, Deposited Plan 2683, Location V, corner of Murray and Milne Streets; the whole of the frontages on Guildford Road between Leake Street on the West to Wisbech Street on the East; the whole of the frontages in Guildford Road between Garratt Road and Crowther Street on the North and South sides of the road, and Lot 21 on Deposited Plan 2212, Location W, corner of Guildford Road and Garrett Road; the whole of the frontages in Guildford Road between Kenilworth and Grosvenor Streets.

(c) The whole of the area described as industrial area in this scheme.

The shopping area may include any of the following uses:-

(a) Any of the uses permitted in a residential area.

- (b) The following:-
- 1. Theatre, hall, club or place of amusement.
- 2. Office, bank, or hotel.
- 3. Fire station, police station, post office, or public building.
- 4. Shops, salesroom, or showroom for the conduct of retail or wholesale business.
- 5. Workrooms connected with retail business, in which not more than 50 per cent. of the total floor area is devoted to workrooms.
- 6. Garage, or petrol-selling or service station.
- 7. Blacksmithing business.
- 8. Such other accessories as the authority might determine, but shall not include any industry, trade or manufactory.

# THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-31.

#### Wanneroo Road Board.

Traffic By-law.

P.W. 1557/30.

THE Wanneroo Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council, under Section 43 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-31," and in exercise of the power therein conferred, doth hereby make the following By-law, to have effect within the Wanneroo District:—

The passage of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic over the following roads, namely, Gnangara Road, extending Westwards from Wanneroo Road (Road No. 3) to the intersection of Sidney Road (Road No. 8807); thence along Sidney Road to the Western border of Lake Gnangara, within the Wanneroo District, is prohibited.

For the purpose of this By-law "Heavy traffic" means the traffic of all vehicles engaged in the carriage or conveyance of sleepers (sawn or hewn), split, and other timber, firewood, bricks, stone, gravel, salt, lime, cement, farm produce, or other material in bulk, and the traffic of any vehicle the weight thereof ineluding load exceeds 15 cwt. per wheel.

Any person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £20.

# TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-31. Traffic Regulations, 1931.

P.W. 1194/34.

THE Traffic Regulations, 1931, are hereby amended, as follows:—

1. Paragraphs (c) to (h), inclusive of Regulation 26 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 30th day of June, 1931, and as amended in *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of April, 1934, are hereby revoked and the following inserted in lieu thereof:—

- (c) Every Certificate of Registration for a motor vehicle issued by the Licensing Authority shall be affixed to the vehicle in respect of which the certificate is issued, in the manner prescribed by and in accordance with these Regulations;
- (d) Every Licensing Authority shall, if so required by the owner of a vehicle which is not equipped with a wind-screen, and in respect of which a Certificate of Registration is issued by such Authority, supply to such owner, on payment of the fee of one shilling and sixpence, a holder which has been supplied for such purpose by the Minister to such Licensing Authority;
- (e) No person to whom a certificate of registration has been issued shall place or keep such certificate in any holder other than that supplied to him in accordance with paragraph (d) hereof by the Licensing Authority which issues such certificate. Provided that, if any person already possesses a holder properly supplied to him under paragraph (d) hereof by any Licensing Authority, it shall not be necessary for him to obtain another holder from another Licensing Authority subsequently issuing a certificate of registration when in respect of the same vehicle upon which such holder is affixed as required by this Regulation.

(f) A Certificate of Registration issued in respect of a vehicle shall be in the form prescribed for each class of vehicle, and shall be issued and shall have effect only for the duration of the particular license in relation to which it is issued, and shall be printed in the colours shown hereunder for the respective vehicles:—

> (i) Certificates for motor cars, when licensed for the full year, shall be printed in black on a white ground;

> (ii) Certificates for motor ears, when licensed only for the first half-year, shall be printed in black on a white ground, with one red vertical stripe;

> (iii) Certificates for motor cars, when licensed only for the second half-year, shall be printed in black on a white ground with two red stripes crossed diagonally;

> (iv) Certificates for motor wagons, locomotives, and traction engines, when licensed for the full year, shall be printed in black on a red ground;

> (v) Certificates for motor wagons, locomotives, and traction engines, when licensed only for the first half-year, shall be printed in black on a red ground, with one white vertical stripe;

> (vi) Certificates for motor wagons, locomotives, and traction engines, when licensed only for the second half-year, shall be printed in black on a red ground, with two white stripes crossed diagonally;

> (vii) Certificates for motor cycles, when licensed for the full year, shall be printed in black on a brown ground;

> (viii) Certificates for motor cycles, when licensed only for the first half-year, shall be printed in black on a brown ground, with one white vertical stripe;

> (ix) Certificates for motor cycles, when licensed only for the second half-year, shall be printed in black on a brown ground, with two white stripes crossed diagonally;

> (x) Certificates for trailers or semi-trailers shall be issued upon forms similar to those issued for the respective kinds of vehicles drawing such trailers or semi-trailers, and with the word "trailer" or "semi-trailer," as the case may be, indersed on the face of the certificate.

- (g) The Licensing Authority shall, at each subsequent issue of a License for any vehicle, issue a new Certificate of Registration, as prescribed under these Regulations.
- (h) The Certificate of Registration shall be affixed to and carried on the vehicle for which the certificate is issued, as hereinafter prescribed:—

(i) On any motor vehicle that is equipped with a wind-screen, the certificate shall be affixed on the inside of such wind-screen not more than four inches from the bottom near side corner.

(ii) On a motor cycle, the holder and certificate shall be affixed in the near side of the handle bar or on the near side front fork, and the front of the certificate shall face towards the front of the motor cycle.

(iii) On a trailer or semi-trailer the holder and certificate shall be affixed on the near side of the tray, not more than twelve inches from the front of the tray, and the front of the certificate shall face towards the front of the trailer or semi-trailer.

(iv) On any motor vehicle not equipped with a wind-screen, a locomotive, traction engine, or any other motor vehicle not already specified, the holder and certificate shall be affixed by a bracket attached to the holder, on the near side of the vehicle not less than two fect six inches, and not more than five feet above the level of the ground, and not more than eight and not less than four feet from the most forward part of the vehicle, and the front of certificate shall face towards the front of the vehicle. 2. The Second Schedule to the Regulations is hereby amended by deleting Forms Numbered 38 to 46, inclusive, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of April, 1934, and inserting the following in lieu thereof:—

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#### THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1934.

Department of Works and Labour, P.W. 2011/25. Perth, 11th April, 1935.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor has been pleased, pursuant to paragraph 43 of Section 204 and Section 206 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934," to make and authorise the publication in the Government Gazette of the By-laws set forth hereunder, to operate as uniform general By-laws and have the force of law in all Road Districts in the State.

The Road Districts (Petrol Pump) By-laws published in Government Gazette on the 9th day of February, 1934, are hereby repealed.

# By-laws for the Erection and Use of Petrol Pumps in or near any Street or Way.

These Regulations shall apply to any petrol pump which is placed so that the point of delivery of petrol from the pump is situate within or is extended for delivery to within ten feet of a street or way.

Applications for licenses to erect and use petrol pumps for the delivery of petrol in or near any street or way.

1. No petrol pump used or intended to be used for the delivery of petrol in or near any street or way shall be crected or used by any person before a license is obtained from the Board under these By-laws.

Subject to compliance with these By-laws, such licenses may be granted on payment of the prescribed fee.

2. Any person desirous of obtaining a license for the erection and use of any petrol pump in or near any street or way shall make application to the Board in Form No. 1 in the Schedule of these By-laws, and will submit with such application a plau showing the location of the nump.

No pump shall be erected or used unless it is of a type approved by the Board.

A license shall be in Form No. 2 in the Schedule.

3. The Board may, in its absolute discretion, and on the written application of the licensee, transfer a license to the person named in such application, on payment of a fee of two shillings and sixpence.

Construction and Maintenance, etc., of such Pumps.

4. All fittings and pipes connecting such petrol pump with the supply tank, and all other pipes or fittings through which the petrol flows, shall be constructed and maintained in such a manner that there shall be no escape of petrol in the form of liquid or vapour therefrom.

5. All tanks used to supply petrol to pumps shall be fitted with a ventilating pipe, which shall be carried to an approved position in the open air not less than twelve feet above the ground, and shall there terminate in one or more bends, the opening in the end of the vent pipe to be covered with brass wire gauze of not less than 28 meshes to the lineal inch, secured in such manner that the gauze may be removed for examination and cleaning.

6. Petrol pumps shall be creeted only in such positions in or near any street or way as may be approved by the Board.

#### By-laws for Safe Working.

7. All petrol delivered to a tank serving a petrol pump, the intake of which is in or near any street or way, shall be delivered through an approved pipe designed and sufficient to prevent the escape of petrol or vapour.

8. No petrol shall be allowed to remain in the visible (or measuring) container of any petrol pump, except at such times as the container is in actual operation of being filled or discharged.

9. No person shall deliver petrol, or permit petrol to be delivered from any pump to the fuel tank of any motor vehicle when the engine of such motor vehicle is running.

10. No person shall use any petrol pump whilst there is any light capable of igniting petrol vapour within ten feet of any container while the same is being filled with petrol from any pump.

11. No person shall negligently permit any petrol to escape from the discharge or delivery pipes attached to a petrol pump into any street or other public place.

12. The operator of any petrol pump shall at all times take all reasonable precautions to protect all persons and property from injury or damage.

13. All petrol pumps erected before gazettal of these By-laws shall conform to the Board's requirements under these By-laws within six months of notice of such requirements being served upon the owner or user of such pumps. Where such owner or user fails to comply with such requirements of the Board, the pump may be removed by the Board at the expense of such owner or user.

14. An Inspector appointed by the Board shall have the right at all reasonable times to make an inspection of pumps licensed by the Board, to ascertain if these Bylaws are being observed.

15. The fee payable under these By-laws shall be One pound (£1) per aunum for each service station, ir-respective of the number of pumps licensed.

16. Any person who by act or omission commits a breach of these By-laws shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20.

17. These By-laws may be cited as the Road Districts (Petrol Pumps) By-laws, 1934.
