Gascoyne-Minilya Road Board.
PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, | By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, | K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia tis Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

PURSUANT to Section 222 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934," I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, do hereby proclaim and declare that the Gascoyne-Minilya Road Board may adopt the system of valuation on the annual value, on that portion of the District described in the Schedule hereto, and may impose rates on the rateable land within such area on the annual value thereof, in accordance with the relative provisions of the said Act and any Proclamation heretofore or hereafter issued thereunder and for the time being in force.

Schedule. Gascoyne-Minilya Road Board. Description of Special Area.

The area bounded by lines commencing at the intersection of the North boundary of the Carnarvon Municipality and the West boundary of Gascoyne Location 185, and extending North along said West boundary and East along the North boundaries of said Location 185 and Locations 184, 183, and 182, South along part of the East boundary of the last-mentioned location, East along the North boundaries of Locations 50 and 49, and South along part of the East boundary of the last-mentioned location to the prolongation West of the North boundary of Location 143; thence East along said prolongation and North boundary of Location 143, Northward along the Western boundaries of Location 101, East along the North boundaries of said Location 101 and Locations 102-105 (inclusive), North along the West boundaries of Locations 108-112 (inclusive) to the North-West corner of the last-mentioned location; thence East and North-East along the North

boundaries of Locations 112, 113, 121, and 144, and the North-West boundaries of Locations 145-154 (inclusive), 94-96 (inclusive), and 175-177 (inclusive), to the Eastern side of a two-chain road along the Eastern boundary of the last-mentioned location; thence Southward along said Eastern side of road, crossing the river and to and along the Eastern side of the road along the Eastern boundaries of Locations 181, 180, and 179, and South-Westward along the South-Eastern sides of Road No. 194 to the North-East corner of Special Lease 1099/41A; thence South along the East side of said lease and West along its South boundary and the South boundaries of Special Lease 1098/41A and Locations 123, 122, and 4, South along part of the East and West along the East and South boundaries of Location 33, South along part of the East boundary of Location 31 to the Northern side of a one-chain road, Eastward along said Northern side, South along the East boundary of Locations 34 and 42, West along the South boundary of the Lastmentioned location, South, West, and North along part of the East boundary of Location 38, the East and South and part of the West boundaries of Location 47, West and North along the South and part of the South boundary of Location 40, West along the South boundary of Location 41, West and North along the South and part of the East, the South and part of the West boundary of Location 41, West and North along the South and West boundary of Location 41, West and North along the Southern side of a one-chain road along the Southern side of Location 27, and South and West along the East and South boundaries of Location 32 to the East boundary of the Carnarvon Municipality; thence North and West along parts of the East and North boundaries of the Municipality to the starting point:

Also all that area bounded by lines commencing at the intersection of the North boundary of the Carnarvon Municipality and the West boundary of Gascoyne Location 188, and extending North along said West boundary and East along the North boundaries of said Location 188 and Locations 187 and 186 to the latter's North-East corner; thence South along part of the East boundary of Location 186 to the North boundary

of the Carnaryon Municipality and Westward along the said North boundary to the starting point.

The Aborigines Act, 1905. Reserve at Southern Cross. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, { By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

Abos. 388/34. WHEREAS by "The Aborigines Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown Lands to be Reserves for Aborigines: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Aborigines should be declared at Southern Cross: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare a Reserve of ten acres, being the whole of Reserve No. 21346, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Aborigines.

#### Schedule.

Southern Cross Lot 737, being the area bounded by lines starting from a point on the North-West boundary of Lot 699 (Reserve 10033), situate 30deg. 11min. about 11 chains from the West corner of the latter lot and extending 300deg. 11min. about 850 links; thence 30deg. 11min. to the West side of Lake Polaris; thence Southward along same to the North corner of Lot 699 aforesaid, and thence 210deg. to the starting point.

Dedication of Public Highway. East Fremantle Municipality. PROCLAMATION

Corres. No. 2075/34. WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the

Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the East Fremantle Municipal Council has requested that certain land, named and described in the Schedule hereunder, which has been used for a street or way within the Municipality of East Fremantle, be declared a public highway: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway, within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

Description and Location of Reticulation Works Approved and Exempted.—Perth District.—Reticulation Area No. 22:—9-inch reticulation sewers, with all manholes, inspection shafts and all other apparatus connected therewith:—Commencing at a point in the centre of Mill Street and St. George's Terrace and proceeding in a South-Easterly direction along the centre of St. George's Terrace to a point opposite the East boundary of Lot 1, St. George's Terrace; thence in a South-Westerly direction across St. George's Terrace along the East boundary of said Lot 1, St. George's Terrace along the East boundary of said Lot 1, St. George's Terrace, to and across right-of-way, and along the East boundary of Lot 15, Bazaar Terrace, and its prolongation to the centre 15, Bazaar Terrace, and its prolongation to the centre of Bazaar Terrace; thence in a North-Westerly direction along the centre of Bazaar Terrace to the centre of Mill Street; thence in a North-Easterly direction along the centre of Mill Street to the point of commencement as shown in pink on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934," which reads as follows:—

The Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners hereby amend the Regulations made under "The Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902," and its amendments and as reprinted by the Government Printer, with all amendments up to the 5th day of September, 1934, as follows:—

#### No. 1.—Interpretation.

By deleting the term "Interstate vessel" and the meaning assigned thereto and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—

- "Interstate vessel" means a vessel owned and registered within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia, New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, the Irish Free State, or Newfoundland (as signatories to the "British Commonwealth Merchant Shipping Agreement" dated 10th December, 1931), provided that such vessel trades only between—
  - (a) this State and any other Australian State and/or New Zealand; or
  - (b) this State, and any port or ports in the Dutch East Indies, the Straits Settlements, the Federated Malay States or Borneo, via the North-West ports of Western Australia.

#### No. 119.

By deleting therefrom the words "provided that such vessel is owned or registered in one of the States of the Australian Commonwealth and is trading as a coasting or interstate vessel."

#### No. 125.

By deleting therefrom the words "a vessel owned or registered in one of the Australian States and trading only as."

#### No. 126.

By deleting "a" in line 2 and inserting in lieu thereof "an operative," and by inserting after the words "Certificate," in the same line, the words "and does not require a pilot."

#### MOORA DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

Rules and Regulations.

#### 1.—Name.

The name of the Institution shall be the Moora District Hospital.

#### 2.—Board of Management.

The administration of the Hospital shall be vested in a Board of Management of seven members, appointed by the Governor. They shall be selected at the annual general meeting of the subscribers held in the month of July of each year. The members selected shall be appointed for two years, with the exception, that of the members selected at the annual general meeting to be held in July, 1935, three members shall be appointed for a period of one year and four members for a period of two years. For the purpose of determining the period of appointment of the members selected at the annual general meeting to be held in July, 1935, the four members receiving the largest number of votes shall be appointed for two years and the remainder for one year. In the event of equality of votes, or the selection being held without a poll, the members to be appointed for the different periods shall be selected by lot. Retiring members shall be eligible for re-selection.

The Board shall be responsible for the entire control of the Institution.

#### 3.—Definition of Subscriber.

- (a) Every person subscribing not less than £10 in one amount, the money not having been collected from the public shall be entitled to be declared a life governor.
- (b) Every person subscribing 10s. 6d. or more per annum shall be deemed a subscriber.

Annual subscriptions shall be due on the 1st of July of each year.

#### 4.—Benefits for Subscribers.

Subscribers who are financial will be entitled to a reduction of 1s. per day off the scale of charges as set out in Rule 20. This shall also apply to the wife or dependant of any financial subscriber.

Subscribers shall not be entitled to benefits in cases of:—1 Accouchements, abortive or otherwise; 2 Over-indulgence in intoxicants; 3 Venereal disease; 4 Insan-ity; 5 Workers' compensation cases; 6 Dental operations; 7 Operations of choice.

#### 5.—Selection of Board.

Only life governors and financial subscribers shall be eligible for selection as members of the Board.

Nominations for selection to the Board must be lodged with the Secretary at least seven days before the date of the annual general meeting and must be signed by two life governors or financial subscribers and by the candidate.

#### 6.-Annual Meeting.

The annual general meeting of subscribers shall be held in the month of July of each year, and not less than seven clear days' notice of such meeting shall be given by the Chairman or Secretary. Notice of the meeting shall be advertised in one or more papers circulating in Moora and District.

A special general meeting of subscribers shall be called within fourteen days, on the requisition to the Chairman of at least ten financial subscribers. quisition shall state the business of the meeting, and no other business shall be dealt with at such special general meeting.

The order of business at the annual meeting shall be and include:

Confirmation of minutes of the previous annual meeting;

Report of Board for the previous year; Secretary's report, balance sheet, and statement; Auditor's report;

Business of which due notice has been given; Selection of the Board of Management and Auditor; Any other business allowed.

#### 6a.—Appointment of Officers.

The Board shall, after it has been duly appointed and at its first meeting after such appointment, elect one of its members to be Chairman.

The Chairman shall, when present, preside at all meetings of the Board, and shall be ex officio member of all Sub-committees.

#### 7.—Board Meetings.

The Board shall hold a regular meeting at least once in each calendar month. A special meeting may be called by the Chairman or Secretary, or by the Secretary, when requested to do so by three members of the Board. In each case all members of the Board are to be notified.

The order of business at Board meetings shall be:-Minutes of the last meeting;

Business arising from minutes;

Reports;

Correspondence;

Accounts; Notice of motion;

General.

In the case of any member of the Board being absent from three consecutive meetings, without reasonable explanation or leave of absence, the Board may recommend to the Governor that his seat be declared

#### 8.—Quorum.

A majority of the members of the Board shall form a quorum.

#### 9.—Vacancies.

Should a vacancy occur on the Board during the year, the Board shall recommend a suitable person to the Governor for appointment, until the next annual general meeting; provided that such vacancy does not occur by the resignation of a member and such resignation being in the nature of a protest, in which case a public meeting shall be called for the purpose of electing a member to fill the vacancy.

#### 10.—Visiting Committee.

A Sub-committee of two may be appointed at each ordinary meeting to be a Visiting Committee, who shall visit and inspect the Wards weekly, between the hours of 1 and 8 p.m., and receive any complaints from patients.

The Board may appoint two ladies each year to act as visitors to the Hospital. Such appointment may be at any time cancelled, and vacancies filled at the discretion of the Committee.

#### 11.—Admission of Patients.

No infectious diseases to be treated in the Hospital,

except in cases of emergency.

No patient suffering from V.D. or delirium tremens to be admitted to the Hospital, except in cases of emergency.

#### 12.—Appointment of Staff.

The Board may appoint from time to time Medical Officer, Secretary, Matron, Nurses, Orderlies, Cook and other servants, as may be deemed necessary, and may assign reasonable remuneration for their services, and may remove them and appoint others in their stead. Written agreements must be made between the Board and all officers and servants.

#### 13.—Duties of Matron.

The Matron shall, subject to the direction of the Board, have full control of the internal administration of the Hospital, and all things appertaining thereto.

The Matron shall be responsible for the good order and cleanliness of the Institution, and the clothing of the patients, the preparation and service of meals, and the proper and efficient nursing of patients. She shall see that the Hospital is at all times left in charge of She shall a competent nurse; that the report books are entered up regularly daily; shall be responsible for the stores, and see that the directions of the Medical Officer are carried out; take charge of all moneys and valuables of patients, and, in the ease of insanity or death, hold the same to the order of the Board. A report shall be drawn up at the end of each month showing the record of the Hospital for that period. The report shall be written by the Matron, and handed to the Secretary for presentation to the Board. All accounts shall be checked by the Matron, and the same shall, after being checked, be certified as to their correctness or otherwise. The Matron shall receive such payment for her services as shall be defined by the Board from time to time.

The Matron shall, on taking charge, check and sign a stock book containing a list of all furniture, bedding, linen, clothing, glass, crockery, cutlery, cooking and kitchen utensils, etc., and be responsible for same.

The Matron shall requisition the Board for clothing, bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, crockery, utensils, and appliances of every kind required for the use of the Hospital. She shall enter them in the stock book and be responsible for them.

The Matron shall not permit strangers or visitors to remain after the usual visiting hours, nor to crowd around any bed, but shall quietly request such visitors to retire; and if such request is not at once complied with, shall report the same to the Board.

#### 14.—Nursing and Domestic Staff.

Each Nurse shall be responsible to the Matron for the efficient nursing of the patients, the charge of all linen, furniture and other articles under her charge, and the cleanliness and management of her ward. She shall strictly obey the orders of the Matron, and take such day or night duties as directed by the Matron. Unless otherwise approved by the Board, all Nurses shall reside on the premises.

Eash Probationer shall be responsible to the Matron, who shall lay down a programme of duties from time to time. Probationers' salaries shall be dealt with by the Board at intervals of six months, and no increase shall be granted unless the same has been recommended by the Matron.

All members of the domestic staff shall be ready to carry out orders at any time. They shall carry out faithfully all orders of the Matron, and shall be respectful and orderly in conduct.

#### 15.—Annual Leave.

Three weeks' annual leave shall be granted to the Matron, Sisters and Nurses, and two weeks' annual leave to all other employees of the Board, in addition to one day per week. No leave is to be allowed to accumulate, and all applications for leave to be approved by the

#### 16.—Secretary.

The Secretary shall be appointed by the Board, subject to any written agreement. He shall conduct the correspondence and have charge of all documents relating to the Hospital. He shall summon and attend all meetings of the Board relating, and of Sub-committees, and shall keep minute books, in which all the proceedings of these meetings shall be inserted, and shall see that, as far as practicable, all resolutions or orders passed at such meetings are forthwith carried into effect.

The Secretary shall keep the following books:-Minute Book, Cash Book, Fees and Donation Ledger, Letter Book, Letter File, Stock Book, inventory of all furniture and effects, record of all accounts passed, record of all salaries, monthly return of patients, monthly return of fees and donations received, monthly return of fees outstanding each month.

#### 17.—Residential Rule.

No person other than the Hospital Staff or patients shall reside on the premises or have any meals there without permission of the Matron; nor shall any visitors to employees be permitted to remain after 9 o'clock p.m., except for exceptional circumstances, for which permission may be granted by the Board.

#### 18.—Ministers of Religion.

Ministers of religion shall have access to patients of their respective denominations between the hours of 1 and 6 p.m. daily, and at such other times as may be necessary, but, prior to entering the Ward, must obtain Matron's consent.

#### 19.—Visitors.

- (a) Visitors may be admitted on Wednesdays and Sundays between the hours of 3 and 5 p.m. Visitors at any other times will only be allowed by special permission of the Matron (vide Board notice).
- (b) All visitors must obey the directions of the Matron or Nurse on duty.
- (c) No visitor shall enter any ward without first obtaining permission from the Matron or Nurse in Charge.

#### 20.—Scale of Charges.

Surgical cases (including medicines and dressings, but not drugs)—9s. per day. General cases—8s. per day.

Children—8s. per day
Maternity cases—£3 10s per week; waiting time 25s per

week, or 4s. per day.
Out-patients—2s. 6d. per attendance. Theatre fee (major operation)—£1 1s.
Theatre fee (minor operation)—10s. 6d. Private ward—£1 ls. per week extra. X-Ray (minor)—10s. 6d.; X-Ray (major)—£1 ls.

#### 21.—Complaints.

Complaints from subscribers or patients shall be made or taken in writing and lodged with the Chairman of the Board or the Secretary within fourteen (14) days of the occurrence, or within such further time as the Board shall decide. Such complaint shall be dealt with by the Board, and their decision shall be final and binding on all parties.

The Board may refuse to inquire into any complaint which is not lodged within the time specified.

#### 22.—Amendment of Rules.

These Rules shall not be altered, amended, varied, or added to except under notice given in writing to the Secretary, stating the proposed alteration or amend-ment, and the Secretary shall give each member of the Board not less than seven days' clear notice in writing thereof prior to the proposed alteration being discussed.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE LEONORA DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

#### Rule 1.

- 1. Minutes of previous meeting to be read and, if approved, confirmed.
- 2. Correspondence, outward and inward, to be read and discussed.
  - Reports. 3. Finance. 4.
  - General business.
  - Discussing and receiving notices of motion.
    - Reading rough minutes.

#### Proceedings of the Committee.

- 2. This Institution shall be known as the Leonora District Hospital and shall have for its objects the usual functions of a hospital, subject to the following rules and
- 3. The administration of the Hospital shall be vested in a Board of Management of thirteen (13) members, hereinafter called the Board, appointed by the Governor; five members to represent the subscribers within the Town, one to represent outside mines, one Gwalia, one Woodline, one pastoral industry and four the Gwalia Medical Fund, during the continuance of agreement between the Hospital Board and the Gwalia Medical Fund. The boundaries of the Districts to be those as shown on the map in the Secretary's office. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the second Tuesday in each month, at 8 p.m., or on such day, hour, and place as may be fixed by any meeting of the Board; seven members to form a quorum.

- 4. Should a quorum not be present fifteen minutes after the hour appointed for such meeting, those present may fix a day and hour to which the meeting shall stand adjourned, otherwise the meeting shall stand adjourned until the next day of regular meeting.
- 5. A subscriber is any person who, being married, shall pay the sum of £3 16s. per annum, £1 18s. per half year, 19s. per quarter, or 7s. per calendar month in advance, and shall have been two weeks paid up; or an unmarried person who shall have paid £2 15s. per annum, £1 7s. 6d. per half year, 14s. per quarter, or 5s. per calendar month in advance, and shall have been two weeks paid up; or junior workers, receiving less than £3 per week—8s. per quarter or 3s. per month; married persons, receiving less than £4 10s. per week—11s. per quarter. On mines or other works employing men who voluntarily subscribe through the pay office—5s. per month or 2s. 6d. per fortnightly pay; widows and their families at the same rate as unmarried persons. The Board may at any time, at its discretion, alter the ruling rates or conditions of subscribers.
- 5A. No subscriber shall be entitled to any of the privileges regarding treatment or Hospital accommodation for any condition for which he is already covered by insurance under the terms of "The Workers' Compensation Act."
- 6. (a) Every married subscriber, widow, widower, man or woman of a family shall be entitled to have wife, sister, or other person occupying the position of head of the household, also his or her children up to the age of 16 years, treated free in the Hospital.
- (b) In the event of the Medical Officer being of the opinion that a patient, who is a subscriber, requires the opinion or services of a specialist, then, and in such case, the Board shall not be responsible for any of the expense incurred for such treatment or advice.
- (c) That in cases diagnosed as chronic or the after result of an accident which occurred prior to a person becoming a subscriber to the Hospital, the Board shall have the power of determining to what extent (if any) the benefits shall be extended.
- (d) A subscriber who is financial at the time of admittance to the Hospital shall be entitled to all the privileges of a financial member until such time as the subscriber is no longer in need of medical treatment, when such subscriber shall be liable for all arrears of subscriptions.
- 7. The Chairman, Vice-Chairman, and Treasurer shall be elected annually by the Board at its first meeting after the general election.
- 8. The Finance, Works and other Subcommittees shall be elected by the Board. The Chairman shall be an ex-officio member of all Committees.
- 9. If the Chairman or Vice-Chairman be not present at the time the meeting is constituted, any other member may be chosen to act as Chairman of the meeting by a majority of the members present.
- 10. If any member of the Board shall be absent from more than two consecutive meetings without leave of absence, or shall cease to be a subscriber, the Board may recommend to the Governor that his seat be declared vacant, and also recommend the appointment of another person in his stead.
- 11. A vacancy occurring in the office of Chairman, Vice-Chairman, or Treasurer shall be filled at the next general meeting of the Board after such vacancy has been declared, previous notice having been given in the circulars convening the meeting.
- 12. Any Subcommittee formed either as a social, ball, sports, or for any other purpose in aid of the Hospital funds shall have at least two members of the General Committee elected to it. Such members to be responsible to the Board in all matters connected therewith.
- to the Board in all matters connected therewith.

  13. At all meetings voting shall be by show of hands, unless in any case a ballot be called for by any member present, provided that the election of executive officers be by ballot only.
- 14. All members attending a meeting shall vote for or against all motions tabled during their attendance at such meeting. Each member, including the Chairman, shall have one vote, and, in case of an equality of votes, the question shall be declared carried in the negative.
- 15. Special meetings may be convened at any time on 48 hours' notice in writing to the members, either at the request of the Chairman or any three (3) members.
- 16. No member of the Board shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question during debate.

- 17. No resolution arrived at, or act, matter, or thing done or authorised by or at any meeting shall be rescinded or amended at any subsequent meeting, unless notice be given in the notice convening the meeting at which such resolution or amendment is proposed.
- 18. The Board may from time to time appoint a Subcommittee or Subcommittees of any number, with such powers, rights, and privileges, and subject to such conditions and restrictions as the Committee may at such appointment or thereafter determine.
- 19. The Board shall regulate the several Departments of the Hospital in accordance with the regulations or any by-laws, and, more particularly in reference to all sanitary matters, and shall take immediate steps to rectify any defects that may require prompt attention.
- 20. The Board may suspend or discharge, upon sufficient cause, any officer or servant, with power in the meantime to employ some other properly qualified person to officiate in the place of the officer or servant so suspended or discharged. The Chairman shall have power to suspend the Secretary and call a special meeting to deal with the matter, subject to Rule 15.
- 21. The Board shall hear all complaints that may be made by patients, officers, or servants when submitted in writing, and take such action as they may deem necessary in the matter, and shall see that the various duties are performed by all the officers and servants of the Hospital.

#### Auditors.

22. Audits shall be conducted monthly and years ending on the 30th June. The Auditor shall be paid at the rate of £1 1s. each monthly audit. He shall be elected by the Board and hold office during the pleasure of the Board.

#### Finance Committee.

23. The Finance Committee shall consist of the Chairman and two members of the Board, and shall examine monthly the books, vouchers, receipt books, etc., kept by the Secretary, and recommend accounts for payment; also present a financial statement at each monthly meeting of the receipts and expenditure of the past month. Such Committee to met at 7.45 p.m.

#### Works Committee.

24. The Works Committee shall consist of the Chairman and two members of the Board, and shall recommend the carrying out of such works as they consider necessary, and shall supervise all works approved of by the Board: Provided the Works Committee may carry on any work urgently needed at no expense greater than Ten (£10) pounds, without the previous consent of the Board.

#### Visiting Committee.

25. The Visiting Committee shall consist of the Chairman and all members of the Board, and shall visit the Hospital at such times as the members may desire, and shall report upon their visits at the subsequent meeting of the Board.

#### Treasurer.

26. The Treasurer shall examine at any time the bank receipt slips for all moneys banked by the Secretary, and shall also at any time satisfy himself as to the correctness of the eash book and the financial position of the Institution.

#### Election.

- 27. The annual general selection for members of the Board of Managemut for the ensuing twelve months shall be held during the month of July in each year, the date during such month, hour, and place to be fixed by the retiring Board.
  - 28. All selections, when contested, shall be by ballot.
- 29. Every subscriber who has paid into the Hospital for three weeks prior to a selection shall be entitled to vote at such selection, and shall also be qualified to stand as a candidate for selection, and shall be known as a financial subscriber.
- 30. Candidates for selection to the Board of Management must be nominated and seconded, in writing, to the returning officer or his deputy by financial subscribers only.
- 31. Any subscriber who resides more than one mile distant from the secretary's office, or who through illness is unable to attend at the polling place to record his vote, may vote by post.

32. The Chairman shall act as returning officer, or may appoint a deputy returning officer.

GOVERNMENT GAZETTE, W.A.

- 33. Any candidate may appoint a scrutineer, who must be a financial subscriber.
- 34. The returning officer, in conjunction with the scrutineer of each candidate, shall take charge of the voting papers, and, at the close of the poll, shall draw up a minute of the result, which, when countersigned by the Chairman, shall be entered in the minute book, and shall not be subject to any after-dispute or inquiry, except as next mentioned.
- 35. If the validity of any election is disputed, all questions in dispute shall, within seven days of the election, be referred to and settled by the Board of Management.
- 36. Should any extraordinary vacancy occur on the Board, the procedure to fill such vacancy shall be the same as for the annual general election of members of the Board. Should no nomination be received on the day and hour appointed for such, then the Board shall be empowered to elect a subscriber to fill such vacancy at their next meeting.
- 37. A roll of subscribers shall be prepared by the Secretary and handed to the returning officer, or the deputy returning officer, at all elections.
- 38. The annual general meeting of subscribers shall be held in July of each year, the financial year terminating on 30th June preceding. Subscribers shall be notified by advertisement at least seven days before the date of such meeting.
- 39. At the annual general meeting the annual reports and balance sheet of the Hospital shall be presented by the Chairman; such balance sheet to be published at least seven clear days before the meeting, and to be signed by the Chairman, Auditors and Secretary.
- 40. Any ten subscribers may requisition the Chairman at any time to call a special meeting of subscribers. The Chairman, upon receipt of such requisition, shall then call a meeting of subscribers by advertisement inserted in a local paper at least seven days before the date of holding such meeting.
- 41. Any subscriber having any complaint or other bus ness to bring before the Board shall submit the same in writing to the Board, and, if required, shall personally attend the meeting of the Board.
- 42. On mines or other works employing men who voluntarily subscribe through the pay office, or who are expected by the management to pay the Hospital Secretary, such subscribers shall be deemed financial subscribers from the time of starting work on the mine or works; provided that, on the first pay-day ensuing, they subscribe to the Hospital (notwithstanding anything contained in Rule 43). Immediately they cease work they are not entitled to any benefits, unless they pay a fortnight's subscription in advance to the pay office.
- 43. No subscriber shall be entitled to derive any benefits from the Hospital, unless he or she has been a subscriber for two clear weeks preceding his or her seeking benefit. Any subscriber being over two weeks in arrears shall become unfinancial and shall not be entitled to benefits free, but may make self financial, provided not needing benefit at time of making payment. No person receiving medical attention, or in need of same at the time of joining the Hospital as a subscriber, shall be entitled to any benefits arising from such subscription. No subscriber shall be entitled to free accommodation in the Hospital for operations of choice, unless such subscriber has been financial on the books for six months immediately preceding such operation.
- 44. The Medical Officer shall not, nor shall any person admit as an in-patient, except in cases of emergency—(1) Any pregnant female for the purpose of confinement, except as hereinafter provided for; (2) any person suffering from an incurable disease; (3) any person who has disorders for the cure of which other establishments are provided, such as lunatics, etc.; (4) any person requiring food and not medicine, who is more properly a subject for a benevolent institution; (5) any person whose admission might endanger the other patients; (6) any person from the lockup, except an urgent case; (7) any infant on account of the condition of the mother alone (8) any person suffering from venereal disease; (9) the Medical Officer may admit any person suffering from alcoholic complaint, such person to be charged £4 4s. per week, subscriber or not; (10) any person for dentistry.

- 45. Any adult in-patient, not being a subscriber, or indigent, shall be liable to pay at the rate of £4 4s. per week. Any in-patient not being a subscriber, or indigent, under the age of sixteen years, shall be liable to pay at the rate of £2 2s. per week for his or her maintenance and treatment while an inmate of the Hospital. But the Board reserve the right to charge any patient, not being a subscriber, or indigent, the sum of £5 5s. per week who may be admitted to the Institution suffering from an infectious disease. Subscribers and indigent patients shall be entitled to anaesthetics free of charge in all operations of necessity, but they shall pay the sum of £2 2s. to the anaesthetist for anaesthetics in all operations of choice. The Board shall not be responsible for payments for anaesthetics other than the above cases of necessity. Any matter being admitted solely on account of her child shall be liable to a charge of six shillings per day, subscriber or not.
- 46. Maternity cases may be admitted by paying in advance the following fees—Subscribers who have been financial on the books for the immediately preceding twelve months—£3 3s. per week, in all other cases the charge shall be £4 4s. per week. This does not include the Medical Officer's fees. Pre-maternity cases will be charged at the rate of £2 2s. per week.
- 47. All persons coming to the Hospital desiring admittance or medical attendance as Hospital in-patients shall be examined by the Medical Officer, and if in his opinion they sufficiently require treatment, he or she shall be attended to or admitted.
- 48. All out-patients requiring treatment, and who, in the Medical Officer's opinion, are in need of treatment, shall be attended to, and the Matron shall enter such patients' names in the books in the dispensary provided for out-patients.
- 49. Applicants for admission to the Hospital shall, when required by the Secretary, make a Statutory Declaration that they are unable to pay for treatment and are not entitled to benefits from any Friendly Society.
- 50. No patient shall be discharged from the Hospital without the consent of the Medical Officer in charge of the case, except when ordered by the Board in case of misconduct.
- 51. Any patient found gambling, or using profane or indecent language, or being intoxicated, or committing breach of any rule or by-law, or any order of the Board or of the Medical Officer, shall be liable to instant dismissal by the Medical Officer, who may exercise that power, and afterwards report the case to the Board.
- 52. Patients are not allowed to leave the Hospital precincts without the special permission of the Medical Officer, given by "pass," which must be shown on demand to any officer of the Hospital, and all parcels brought back by patients on their return may be examined by the nurse on duty.
- 53. Patients are to take their meals at the ward tables, except in cases of necessity. They are to keep their beds nice and tidy, the bed clothes properly arranged, and attend scrupulously to personal cleanliness. They shall also observe a respectful demeanour towards the officers of the Hospital, the Nurses, and each other. Any person having cause of complaint shall submit some to the Medical Officer or to a member of the Board or the Secretary, at the time, or within seven days of his or her discharge from the Hospital. Any person wishing any complaint or matter brought under the notice of the Board shall record the same in a book, to be produced to him or her on application to the Matron.
- 54. On the admission of any patient to the Hospital, his address and that of his immediate relatives, his professed religion, and other particulars, shall be given to the Secretary, Medical Officer, or Nurse.
- 55. Patients having money or valuables in their possession on admission shall deliver up same to the nurse or attendant, who will immediately hand same, with written particulars, to the Secretary for safe custody, a receipt for which shall be given by him and countersigned by the Matron or Nurse. The Hospital will not be responsible for money or other effects, the property of patients, unless this rule is observed.

#### Medical Officer.

- 56. The Medical Officer shall be appointed by the Board and be a duly qualified medical practitioner.
- 57. He shall have the immediate superintendence of the professional staff in connection with the professional work of the Hospital, and shall preserve order and

- sobriety, and, in case of any insubordination or gross default of duty on the part of any of those employees, he shall suspend the same and report fully on each case to the Board immediately, through the Secretary.
- 58. He shall keep an accurate record of the surgical operations performed, and all names of patients treated, with results. He shall report monthly to the Board particulars of the number of patients treated, with results. He shall report monthly to the Committee particulars of the number of patients treated in Hospital during past month, number admitted, number discha ged, nature of complaint, and number of out-patients, and give the Secretary daily a list of all out-door paying patients treated at the Hospital.
- 59. He shall have charge of and be responsible for all surgical instruments and apparatus, and, on taking office, shall sign an inventory in correctness thereof. No new instrument shall be ordered, and no new additions to any instrument made, except on his written direction, subject to the approval of the Committee.
- 60. He shall be in attendance at the Hospital daily during the hours defined by the Board, and, in addition, shall attend, in case of emergency, whenever summoned by the Matron.
- 61. He shall afford the Board every information and furnish them with reports on all matters within his control, as may seem to them necessary.
- 62. He shall be responsible for, and with the assistance of the Secretary shall, prepare the annual report, in so far as the medical portion is concerned.

#### Secretary and Collector.

- 63. The Secretary shall be appointed by the Board and shall hold office during the pleasure of the Board. He shall receive £78 per annum, in monthly instalments of £6 10s. per month. He shall also receive 20 per cent. commission on general subscriptions, but not on subscriptions paid through a Mines Pay Office, and 5 per cent. on fees collected from paying patients. The Board may vote him an honorarium for acting Secretary to any entertainment promoted for the benefit of the Hospital. The Board may at any time, at their discretion, alter the remuneration to be paid to the Secretary.
- 64. He shall conduct the correspondence, and have charge of all documents relating to the Hospital. He shall summon and attend all meetings of the Board and Committees, and shall keep minute books, in which all the proceedings of these meetings shall be recorded, and shall see, as far as practicable, all resolutions or orders passed at such meetings are forthwith carried into effect.
- 65. He shall, under the direction of the Board, keep the books, forms, and accounts of the Hospital, and shall submit his account books to the Board and the Finance Committee whenever required.
- 66. He shall, at the end of the financial year, prepare and submit to the Board an inventory of the bedding, linen, clothing, glass, crockery, cutlery, cooking, and kitchen utensils, etc.
- 67. He shall carefully examine all tradesmen's bills for provisions and other articles, and make up the accounts for presentation to the Finance Committee at the next monthly meeting.
- 68. He shall receive all moneys paid to the Hospital, and enter the same in the cash book, and pay the same into the bank in accordance with Rule 78.
- 69. He shall present a copy of the rules to every employee who may be appointed, immediately after his or her appointment, and obtain his or her signature to a duplicate copy, which he shall keep in his office for that purpose.
- 70. He shall report to the Board any repairs, etc., which may be necessary for the proper upkeep of the Hospital. He shall have all urgent repairs attended to without delay. When tenders for work are called he shall post a description of the work to be done on a board outside his office, and shall supervise all works being done for the Board. He shall also see that all fittings and appliances are in an efficient state. He shall, in conjunction with the Medical Officer, see that proper sanitary conditions are maintained, and the directions of the Board carried out.
- 71. He shall report to the Board any matters which in his opinion require their attention.
- 72. He shall balance the cash book at the end of each month, noting whether such balance agrees with that shown by the bank book, and, if not agreeing, explain the cause of their difference.

- 73. Any financial subscriber shall have permission at all reasonable hours to examine any books—financial or administrative—of the Institution, save and except any book kept for the purpose of recording transactions held in camera.
- 74. He shall keep a book for the purpose of recording the minutes of all meetings held in camera, and such books shall be open only to the inspection of members of the Board.
- 75. He shall keep the contributors' books and enter therein and in the cash book all subscriptions and donations, and shall report the same at next monthly meeting of the Board, and supply to the Matron a list of financial subscribers, to be kept at the Hospital, and he shall, when visiting the Hospital, make such entries as may be necessary for the purpose of keeping the list complete.
- 76. He shall keep a copy of all letters written on the business of the Institution, and shall execute all orders he may receive from the Board or any Committee, or the Chairman thereof.
- 77. He shall be at his office from 10 a.m. to 12 noon, to attend to all business connected with the Hospital, and visit the Hospital not less than four days weekly; always providing that business of importance connected with the Hospital may prevent such attendance, in which case he must report the matter to the Chairman.
- 78. He shall not hold a larger sum than £20 for a longer period than seven days, and pay same into the bank, according to Rule 68, and shall furnish a guarantee bond to the amount of £100 as a guarantee of good faith against fraud or misappropriation of the funds of the Hospital.
- 79. He shall order all goods, drugs, etc., required by the Hospital, with the exception of bread, meat, milk, ice, and shall carefully examine all accounts and bills.

#### Matron.

- 80. The Matron shall be appointed by the Board and shall hold office during the pleasure of the Board.
- 81. She shall take entire charge of the domestic affairs of the Hospital.
- 82. She shall see that all articles of clothing, bedding, etc. (including mattresses), in use in the wards are frequently changed and regularly aired in the grounds, and that no bedding, when it has been in use, be stored away without previous airing.
- 83. She shall inculeate strict economy in the use of fuel, ctc., and shall see that all unnecessary lights are dispensed with during the night, and that order and cleanliness and punctuality prevail throughout the establishment.
- 84. She shall requisition the Secretary, on the forms provided, all goods, excepting bread, meat, milk, and ice required for the domestic management of the Hospital, and shall check, or cause to be checked, same on receipt, as to quality and quantity, and shall immediately inform the Secretary of any shortness or receipt of unsuitable articles.
- 85. She shall be responsible to the Board for all clothing, bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, crockery, utensils, and stores of every kind required for use of the Hospital, and for the custody and care of which she shall be responsible, and shall enter same in a book provided for the purpose.
- 86. She shall have control over the female employees of the Hospital and see that the Medical Officer's directions are carried out in the wards. She must make a monthly report in writing to the Board. She shall employ and dismiss the female domestics, and report to the Board particulars of such action.

#### Visitors.

- 87. Any friends, not exceeding two at any one time, may, unless prohibited by the Medical Officer, be admitted to the wards to visit patients on every day between the hours of 2.30 p.m. and 5 p.m., and shall leave the wards punctually at the latter hour. Exceptions to the above rule will only be allowed by special permission of the Medical Officer, or, in his absence, by the Matron, in favour of near relations or friends of patients in a dangerous state, or to persons residing at long distances, and who may otherwise be unable to visit their sick friends at the regular visiting hours. This rule does not apply to members of the Board.
- 88. Visitors are strictly forbidden to introduce food, drink or refreshments of any kind whatever without the sanction of the Medical Officer, and to insure the per-

fect observance of this rule, all parcels must be opened in the presence of the Nurse on duty in the ward.

89. Visitors must remain at the bedside of the patient they are visiting.

#### Religion.

- 90. Patients are at liberty to receive the visits of ministers of (or members of any sisterhood in connection with) religious denominations to which they respectively belong, and the professed religion of every patient must be entered in the admission book on admission. Ministers and such other persons as aforesaid, however, will not be allowed to remain in the wards (except in cases of great emergency) during the visits of the Medical Officer, and they shall retire from the ward during such time as may be necessary for the latter-named gentleman to discharge his duties.
- 91. It is also to be insisted upon that ministers of religion and other such persons as aforesaid visiting the Hospital for the purpose of administering religious instructions to the patient, shall so conduct their services as not to interfere with the repose and quiet of other patients in the near vicinity.
- 92. Any patient wishing any particular minister, sister, or friends to give religious counsel in case of dangerous illness, apprehension of the approach of death, may signify the same to the Matron, who shall at once communicate with the Medical Officer or Secretary, who shall obtain the presence and service of the minister, sister, or person required, if possible.

#### General.

- 93. That no servant of the Hospital, whether Medical Officer, Secretary, Matron, Nurse, Wardsman, or Cook shall have or hold any proprietary interest in any private hospital or similar institution in or out of this District, and any such servant so offending shall be liable to summary dismissal.
- 94. No Asiatic or coloured alien shall be employed within the Hospital reserve, nor shall any such Asiatic or coloured alien be permitted to trade within such area.
- 95. All members of the Hospital Staff shall be entitled to benefits as Hospital subscribers free of charge, but shall not be entitled to attend meetings of the Board or vote at election of candidates, or in any way have a voice in the management of the Hospital, except in their official capacity.
- 96. The Matron, Nurses, and the whole of the domestic staff shall each be entitled to two weeks' leave on full pay, after twelve months' service, subject to the approval of the Board.
- 97. It shall be lawful for the Board in its discretion to, for, and on behalf of the Institution, to enter into with any Friendly Society, Union of Workers, Club, Society, or association of persons (whether incorporated under any statute or not), an agreement or agreements as occasion may require.

The Board shall have power to make any further rules and regulations, or alter any of the foregoing rules from time to time.

IN accordance with Section 63, Subsection (9) of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906," His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor has been pleased to make the undermentioned General Rule under Regulation 4 of the Regulations under the said Act:

#### First-Aid Outfit.

- 51. (1) Where any men are employed at a mine, whether underground or on the surface, an adequate first-aid outfit shall be kept on the mine for immediate use in case of accidents.
- (2) The nature, quality, and adequacy of the firstaid outfit kept in a mine in compliance with paragraph (1) of this regulation, and the nature, quality, and adequacy of the ambulances or stretchers and surgical requisites kept on a mine in compliance with general rule (46), as contained in Section 32 of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906," shall at all times be subject to the approval of an Inspector of Mines.
- (3) Any requisition in relation to any of the matters aforesaid made in writing under the hand of an Inspector of Mines, and given to any person liable to comply with the provisions of paragraph (1) of this regulation, or of general rule (46) in Section 32 aforesaid, shall be binding upon such person, and such person shall forthwith observe and comply with such requisi-

IN accordance with the provisions of Section 63 of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906," His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to cancel Rule 1 of Regulation 4 of the Regulations made under the said Act (published in the Government Gazette of the 27th day of May, 1932) and to substitute the following:-

#### Ventilation of Mines.

1. In any part of the underground workings of a mine which has not been closed off as disused as here inafter provided-

(a) The total quantity of carbon dioxide present in the air shall not exceed 0.25 per cent. by volume, but at any point where firing of explosives has taken place, a greater percentage of carbon dioxide shall be permissible until thirty minutes have elapsed since the last explosion:

- (b) The temperature shall not exceed 87 deg. Fahrenheit, measured with dry bulb thermometer, unless firing of explosives has taken place in such part not more than 30 minutes previous to the taking of the thermometer's reading; but the Inspector may, in writing in the Record Book, allow a higher limit of temperature if satisfied that it is impracticable to maintain the temperature below 87 deg. Fahreuheit;
- (c) The reading of the wet bulb theremometer shall, not exceed 80 deg. Fahrenheit;
- (d) There shall be a perceptible current of air sufficient to distinctly deflect the flame of a candle from the vertical, but the test shall not be made within ten feet from the face of any drive or crosscut, or from the top of a rise or bottom of a shaft or winze, nor while rock drills are working so close to the testing point as to cause agitation of the air;
- (e) When instructed by the Inspector, in writing, the Manager, or some person appointed by him, shall make tests in the working faces to show that the foregoing requirements have been complied with in all rises, winzes and underlay shafts in course of excavation, and in all "ends" of levels and crosscuts in progress when such ends are over fifty feet in length, and also if the adequacy of the ventilation is in any way doubtful in all parts of the mine where men are working. The results of all such tests shall be entered in the Record Book. The Inspector may, in writing, require tests to be made at more frequent intervals in workings in which he may consider such necessary, and the Manager shall comply with such requirements;
- (f) Where the ventilation in any place is inadequate, no work excepting such as is necessary for the purpose of remedying the conditions shall be undertaken in that place until the ventilation is adequate;
- (g) The ventilation in any place shall be determined by the Senior Inspector of Mines;
- (h) From the decision of a Senior Inspector of Mines an appeal shall lie to the Mines Ventilation Board hereinafter constituted. Such appeal shall be instituted by notice in writing to the other parties affected and to the Under Secretary for Mines, which notice must be given within seven days from the date the parties appealing are notified of the Senior Inspector of Mines' decision. The Under Secretary for Mines will then convene the Board, which shall meet as soon as possible on a date to be notified by the Under Secretary for Mines;
- (i) For the purpose of this general rule the Mines Ventilation Board is hereby constituted, such Board to consist of-

the State Mining Engineer;
 the Commissioner of Public Health;

- (2) the Commissioner of Public Health;
  (3) a workman's Inspector of Mines appointed by the Union.
  (4) a representative appointed by the employer or, if unable to act, their respective nominees. The State Mining Engineer (or his nominee) shall be Chairman of the Board. The Commismissioner of Public Health shall be a number of the Board in an advisory. member of the Board in an advisory member of the Board in an advisory capacity only and without a vote. The decision shall be in accordance with the majority of votes. The presence of four members shall be necessary for a quorum. The decision of the Board shall be final.
- (j) All reasonable costs and charges of the Board and the members shall be rendered to the Under Secretary for Mines, who shall apportion them equally between the Mines Department and the parties to this award. Provided that the Board may order any appellant to pay the whole or a certain proportion or amount of the costs of any appeal which the Board may declare to be trivial, and such appellant shall forthwith pay any such sum.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Minister for Agriculture, with the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has, pursuant to Section 59 of "The Dairy Products Marketing Regulation Act, 1934," made further Regulations under and for the purposes of the said Act, as set forth in the Schedule hereto, which further Regulations are added to and shall be read with and become part of the Regulations made under and for the purposes of the said Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 8th day of March, 1935.

### Schedule.

I. The following Regulations are added to the said Regulations after Regulation 13, namely:—

Selection and Nomination of Representative Members of the Dairy Products Marketing Board.

- The following conditions shall apply in relation to the persons to be selected and nominated for appointment as members of the Board, namely:-
  - (a) Only adult persons who are natural born or naturalised British subjects, and are not undischarged bankrupts shall be eligible for selec-
  - (b) The persons to be selected for nomination as the Government representative, and as the representative of the consumers respectively, may, sub-

ject to paragraph (a) hereof, be such persons as the Minister may be pleased to select;
(c) The person to be selected for nomination as the representative of the manufacturers shall be either-

- (i) a licensed manufacturer, in the case of an in-
- dividual person; or

  (ii) a partner in any firm which is licensed as a manufacturer; or
- (iii) a director, trustee, member, or officer of any incorporated body or non-corporate body which is licensed as a manufacturer;
- (d) Any person mentioned in paragraph (c) hereof shall not be eligible for selection for nomination as a representative of the producers or of the dealers;
- (e) Persons to be selected for nomination as representatives of the producers shall be bona fide producers within the meaning of the Act, but shall not be eligible to represent the manufacturers or the dealers at the same time;
- (f) The person to be selected for nomination as representative of the dealers shall be a licensed dealer and shall not be eligible for selection as the representative of the manufacturers or the producers:
- (g) Subject to the preceding paragraphs of this Regulation, where a producer or a dealer is a partnership, any one (but not more than one) of the partners may be selected for nomination; and where a producer or a dealer is a company or any other corporate or non-corporate body, a director, trustee, member or officer thereof may be selected for nomination.
- The following conditions shall apply in relation to the submission of candidates for nomination and appointment as members of the Board, namely:
  - (a) For the purpose of every nomination under paragraphs (c), (d) and (e) of section eight of the Act, the Minister shall appoint some person to be the Returning Officer. The Chairman or Secretary of the Board or any other person may be so appointed. The address of the Returning Officer shall be published in the Government Gazette and the "West Australian" Newspaper;

(b) No person shall be entitled to propose or second the submission of a candidate for nomination unless he is at the time when such submission is signed by him duly enrolled as an elector on the electoral roll prepared for use in relation to such nomination;

(c) Every submission of a candidate for nomination and appointment as a member of the Board shall be made in writing, upon a submission form as prescribed in Form No. 10 in the First Schedule hereto, and shall be signed by the candidate himself and also by his proposer and seconder;

(d) Every submission of a candidate shall be sent or delivered to the Returning Officer so as to be in his hands not later than 4 o'clock in the afternoon of the day fixed by these Regulations as the last day for the receipt of submission

forms by the Returning Officer;

(e) Forthwith after the expiration of the time fixed for receipt of submission forms, the Returning Officer shall examine all the submission forms received by him, and satisfy himself that the candidates whose names are submitted on the submission form are eligible for selection within the provisions of Regulation 14 hereof, and that the persons who have signed the submission form as proposer and seconder are entitled under these Regulations so to sign the same;

(f) The Returning Officer shall reject any submission form which in his opinion is not in order as required by these Regulations; and any such rejection shall be final and conclusive as against

the candidate;

- (g) Where the number of candidates submitted for nomination and appointment does not exceed the number of representatives to be nominated and appointed, the Returning Officer shall forthwith certify that fact, together with the names, addresses, and occupations of the candidates submitted, in accordance with form No. 11 in the First Schedule hereto, to the Minister; and such certificate, when received by the Minister, shall be deemed to be and shall be treated as the nomination of the candidates whose names appear in the certificate by the constituent body whose representatives they are intended to be on the Board.
- (h) As soon as reasonably may be after the receipt of the said certificate from the Returning Officer, and not later than the nomination day hereinafter prescribed, the Minister shall submit to the Governor in Council for appointment as members of the Board the name or names of the person or persons mentioned in the said certificate.
- Where the number of candidates whose names have been submitted exceed the number required to be nominated and appointed, the Returning Officer shall hold an election in accordance with these Regulations as hereinafter provided.

## Elections.

- 17. On the thirty-first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, or as soon as reasonably may be thereafter, and on the thirty-fist day of January, or as soon as reasonably may be thereafter in each and every third year after the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, the Returning Officer shall prepare separate electoral rolls for each of the following classes of persons, namely:—(a) Manufacturers; (b) producers; and (a) dealers classes of persons, namely:-producers; and (c) dealers.
- 18. (1) The said rolls, when prepared, shall be signed on each page or sheet thereof by the Returning Officer, and when so signed shall be the electoral rolls for use at electious under the Act and these Regulations subsequently held during the calendar years for which such rolls are prepared.
- (2) The signature of the Returning Officer shall be conclusive as to the correctness thereof, save and except that the Returning Officer may add to or remove from any roll the name of any person which has been omitted from or inserted in such roll by error.
- Only persons whose names appear on the electoral roll shall be entitled to vote at any election in respect of which such electoral roll has been prepared and is used.
- 20. (1) Any person desiring to have his name enrolled on an electoral roll shall make application in writing in accordance with Form 12, 13, or 14 (as the case may require) in the First Schedule hereto, to the Returning Officer not later than 4 o'clock in the afternoon on the thirtieth day of January next preceding the date fixed for the preparation of the electoral roll upon which he desires to have his name enrolled.

- (2) Every application for enrolment shall be completed and attested in accordance with the directions s t out on the application for enrolment.
- (3) Applications for enrolment shall be addressed to the Returning Officer and may be sent to or delivered at the address of the Returning Officer as advertised as aforesaid.
- (4) Any application for enrolment received at the address aforesaid later than the time mentioned in paragraph (1) hereof shall be rejected by the Returning Officer.
- (5) Where any application for enrolment is sent by post, but the postage thereon is wholly unpaid or insufficiently prepaid thereon, the Returning Officer shall refuse to accept such application, and the application shall be deemed not to have been sent or delivered to the Returning Officer.
  - 21. (1) Subject as hereinafter provided.
  - (a) Any person who holds a license as a manufacturer issued under the Act and still in force shall be entitled to apply for enrolment and to be enrolled on the electoral roll of manufacturers; and
  - (b) Any person who holds a license as a dealer issued under the Act and still in force shall be entitled to apply for enrolment and to be enrolled on the electoral roll of dealers; and
  - (c) Any person who satisfies the Returning Officer that he is a bona fide producer within the meaning of the Act shall be entitled to apply for enrolment and to be enrolled on the electoral roll of producers.

## Provided that-

- (i) no person shall be entitled to be enrolled or be enrolled on more than one electoral roll at the same time: and
- same time; and
  (ii) a person who is licensed as a manufacturer shall not be entitled to be enrolled or be enrolled on an electoral roll of dealers or of producers merely because he is a licensed dealer or a bona fide producer within the meaning of the Act; and
- (iii) a person who is licensed as a dealer shall not be entitled to be enrolled or be enrolled on an electoral roll of manufacturers or of producers merely because he is a licensed manufacturer or a bona fide producer within the meaning of the Act.
- (2) Where a manufacturer, dealer, or producer who desires to be enrolled on an electoral roll is a partnership, company, or other corporate or non-corporate body, the following provisions shall apply, namely:—
  - (a) In the case of a partnership, either one of the partners may apply for enrolment and be enrolled, but not more than one of the partners shall be enrolled on the electoral roll at any one time;
  - (b) In the case of a company, the board of directors of the company may authorise any director, manager, secretary or other officer of the company (being a person not already curolled or entitled to be enrolled on any electoral roll under these Regulations) to represent the company as an elector, and upon receipt of an application for enrolment from such representative person, together with a certificate in writing of such authority aforesaid under the hand of the managing director of the company, the Returning Officer may, subject to all other requirements of these Regulations being satisfied, carol such representative person on the electoral roll in accordance with his application.
  - toral roll in accordance with his application.

    (c) No person shall be entitled under paragraph (b) hereof to act as the representative of more than one company at the same time.
  - (d) In the case of an association or of any other corporate or non-corporate body (other than a company) the management committee there-of may authorise any trustee, member, or officer of such association or body aforesaid (being a person not already enrolled or entitled to be enrolled on any electoral roll under these Regulations) to represent the association or other body aforesaid as an elector, and, upon receipt of an application for enrolment from such representative person, together with a certificate in writing of such authority under the hand of the president or chairman of such

management committee, the Returning Officer may, subject to all other requirements of these Regulations being satisfied, enrol such representative person on the electoral roll in accordance with his application.

(e) No person shall be entitled under paragraph (d) hereof to act as the representative of more than one association or other body aforesaid

at the same time.

(f) Every authority given under paragraph (b) or paragraph (d) hereof shall have effect only in relation to the electoral roll upon which the person authorised thereby is enrolled; and, whenever application for enrolment is made by any representative person as aforesaid, a fresh authority as aforesaid shall be obtained for the purpose of such application.

(g) Any company, association, or other body aforesaid may cancel or revoke any authority given by it under this regulation by notice in writing under the hand of the managing director of the company or the president or chairman of the management committee of the association or other body, sent or delivered to the Return-

ing Officer.

Provided that any such cancellation or revecation shall not invalidate any vote given by the representative person enrolled and voting by virtue of such authority at an election held previously to such concellation or revocation.

- (h) Upon receipt of notice of cancellation or revocation of authority as aforesaid, the Returning Officer shall forthwith remove from the electoral roll the name of the representative person whose authority has been so cancelled or revoked.
- 22. (1) Every submission of a candidate for nomination as a representative to be appointed a member of the Board shall be sent or delivered to the Returning Officer at his address, published as aforesaid, so that it shall be received by him not later than 4 o'clock in the afternoon on the sixth day of February in the year in which persons are to be nominated for appointment.
- (2) Every submission of a candidate received by the Returning Officer after the time aforesaid shall be rejected by him.
- (3) Where any submission of a candidate is sent by post, but the postage thereon is wholly unpaid or insufficiently prepaid thereon, the Returning Officer shall refuse to accept such submission, and such submission shall be deemed not to have been sent or delivered to the Returning Officer within the meaning of these Regu-
- 23. (1) Whenever upon the receipt and acceptance by the Returning Officer of submissions of candidates the number of candidates submitted makes it necessary that an election shall be held, the Returning Officer shall fix a day, being not less than fourteen days and not more than forty-two days from the closing day for submissions of candidates for the closing of the poll at such election, and shall publish notice of the day so fixed by him as aforesaid in the Government Gazette and the West Australian newspaper.
- (2) In any event, the day fixed for the closing of the poll at the election shall be so fixed as to enable sufficient time for the counting of the votes, and the declaration of the result of the election, at least three days before the nomination day mentioned in Regulation 24 hereof.
- 24. (1) The thirtieth day of March in each year in which persons are required to be nominated for appointment as members of the Board under paragraphs (c), (d), and (e) of section eight of the Act is hereby appointed and fixed as the nomination day for the purposes of the said section.
- (2) The names of candidates who have been selected for nomination and appointment in accordance with these Regulations shall be submitted to the Minister on or before 4 o'clock on the afternoon of such nomination day.
- 25. (1) When, after the receipt of submissions of candidates, an election is necessary to select the candidate or candidates to be nominated, the Returning Officer shall, as soon as practicable after the closing day for the receipt of the submissions, but within seven days thereafter, cause ballot papers to be printed in

- accordance with Form No. 15, in the First Schedule hereto, containing the names of all the candidates in alphabetical order.
- (2) The ballot paper shall set forth, in a space provided for the purpose, notice of the day fixed for the closing of the poll.
- 26. (1) When the ballot papers have been printed as aforesaid, the Returning Officer shall send by prepaid letter post to each person whose name appears as an elector on the electoral roll at his postal address as shown on his application for enrolment, one ballot paper, with the initials of the Returning Officer indorsed on the back thereof, together with—
  - (a) an envelope marked "Ballot Paper Envelope"; and
  - (b) a form of declaration in accordance with Form No. 16 in the First Schedule hereto, to be completed and signed by the elector; and
  - (c) an envelope addressed to the Returning Officer.
- (2) The envelope marked "Ballot Paper" shall also have marked thereon words identifying such envelope, and the ballot paper to be enclosed therein, with the particular election in which the elector by his ballot paper is entitled to vote.
- (3) The Returning Officer may, before sending the declaration aforesaid to an elector, fill in the particulars required to be furnished therein, so that the same will be ready for signature and completion by the elector when marking his ballot paper.
- 27. (1) For the purpose of casting his vote at the election, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper received by him as aforesaid in the manner hereinafter provided, and shall then place the same in the euvelope marked "Ballot Paper," and seal the envelope. He shall then sign and complete the declaration in accordance with the directions stated thereon; and then place the sealed envelope, with the ballot paper enclosed therein, and the declaration signed and completed in the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer, and seal such last-mentioned envelope.
- (2) The elector may then send by prepaid letter post, or may deliver the envelope, addressed to the Returning Officer, with its said enclosures to the Returning Officer at the address shown on the said envelope, but so that such envelope shall be in the hands of the Returning Officer not later than 4 o'clock in the afternoon of the day fixed for the closing of the poll.
- (3) Where any envelope containing the ballot paper is sent by post to the Returning Officer, but the postage thereon is wholly unpaid or insufficiently prepaid thereon, the Returning Officer shall refuse to accept the same, and such envelope with its enclosures shall be deemed not to have been sent or delivered to the Returning Officer within the meaning of these Regulations.
- 28. (1) The elector, when completing and signing the declaration mentioned in Regulation 27 hereof, shall complete and sign the same in the presence of an authorised witness, who shall then sign his name in his own handwriting in the place provided for the purpose, and shall add thereafter the title under which he acts as an authorised witness, together with the date when he signed as such witness.
- (2) For the purpose of this regulation, the following persons shall be authorised witnesses:—
  - (a) any person authorised by "The Declarations and Attestations Act, 1913," to witness documents;
  - (b) any director, manager, or proprietor of any dairy products factory;
  - (c) any Justice of the Peace or solicitor;
  - (d) any other elector; and
  - (e) any district manager or district inspector of the Agricultural Bank of Western Australia.
- (3) Any person who (not being an authorised witness) signs any declaration as an authorised witness shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and on conviction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 29. If, prior to the closing of the poll, an elector satisfies the Returning Officer that he has not received a ballot paper and is entitled to vote at the election, or that the ballot paper or envelopes received by him have been lost or destroyed, and that he has not already voted at the poll, the Returning Officer may post or give per-

- sonally to the elector a ballot paper and envelopes, or a further ballot paper and envelopes, as the case may be.
- 30. (1) Voting shall be by means of a preferential ballot.
- (2) When only one candidate is to be elected and there are not more than two candidates, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes.
- (3) When only one candidate is to be elected and there are more than two candidates, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference, and he shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the numerals 2, 3 and so on (as the case requires) opposite their names, so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.
- (4) When two candidates are to be elected the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and the numeral 2 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his second preference, and he shall give contingent votes for all the remaining caudidates by placing the numerals 3, 4, and so on (as the case requires) opposite their names, so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.
- 31. (1) The Returning Officer shall keep a locked and sealed ballot box, with the words "Dairy Products Marketing Board Ballot Box" marked thereon, for each class of election held, and as and when the envelope containing the ballot paper and the declaration are received by him from an elector, he shall open the outer envelope and extract therefrom the declaration and the sealed envelope containing the ballot paper.
- (2) He shall thereupon examine the declaration and satisfy himself that the same is in order, and that the elector who signed the declaration is on the electoral roll and entitled to vote.
- (3) If and when he is so satisfied, he shall place the declaration in some place of security for safe keeping, and shall immediately place the envelope containing the ballot paper, unopened, in the proper ballot box, and so leave the same until the close of the poll.
- (4) If upon examining the declaration as aforesaid the Returning Officer is not satisfied that the declaration is in order, or that the person who signed the same is on the electoral roll and entitled to vote, he shall retain such declaration and the envelope containing the ballot paper, unopened, in a safe place, and at once notify the elector in writing that his ballot paper has not been accepted, for the reasons to be stated in the notice.
- (5) If, before the closing of the poll, a voter who has received notice as provided for in paragraph (4) hereof satisfies the Returning Officer that he is an elector and entitled to vote at the election, the Returning Officer shall forthwith place the sealed envicope containing such elector's ballot paper, unopened, in the proper ballot box, and leave the same there until the closing of the poll.
- (6) If a voter who has received notice as provided for in paragraph (4) hereof fails to satisfy the Returning Officer in the manner required by paragraph (5) hereof, the Returning Officer shall reject the ballot paper received from such voter. Upon such rejection, he shall indorse on the envelope containing the ballot paper the word "rejected," and sign the same, and then place such envelope, unopened, in some place of security for safe keeping until after the election.
- 32. For the purpose of counting the votes cast at an election, the Minister may nominate and appoint two persons to act as scrutineers: Provided that no candidate shall act as a scrutineer.
- 33. (1) The counting of the votes cast at an election shall be carried out by the Returning Officer in the presence of the scrutineers.
- (2) Subject as hereinafter provided, the method of conducting the count shall be the same as that prescribed under "The Electoral Act, 1907-1921," for the

counting of the votes taken at an election of members of the Legislative Assembly.

Provided that-

- (i) When two candidates are to be elected, the count shall be conducted as if only one candidate were to be elected, until only two candidates remain in the count, whereupon such two candidates shall be the two candidates elected.
- (ii) Votes shall not be deemed to be informal, except in the cases hereinafter mentioned.
- (3) As soon as practicable after the closing of the poll, the Returning Officer shall, in the presence of the scrutineers—
  - (a) open the ballot box, and remove therefrom the envelopes containing the ballot papers; and
  - (b) open the envelopes containing the ballot papers and extract the ballot papers therefrom; and
  - (c) examine the ballot paper, and satisfy himself that the same bears his initials indorsed thereon, and decide whether such ballot paper is formal or informal; and
  - (d) count all the formal ballot papers and reject all the informal ballot papers.
- (4) The Returning Officer shall be the sole and final judge as to whether a ballot paper is informal.
- (5) Any candidate may attend and be present at the counting of the votes.
  - 34. (1) A ballot paper shall be informal—
  - (a) if it is not initialed by the Returning Officer; or,
  - (b) if, subject as hereinafter provided, it is marked in any other manner than prescribed in Regulation 30 hereof; or,
  - (c) if it has upon it any mark or writing not authorised by these Regulations which in the opinion of the Returning Officer will enable any person to identify the elector; or,
  - (d) if it does not indicate the elector's vote, or if, when there are more than two candidates, it is not marked so as effectively to indicate the elector's preference as regards all candidates; or
  - (e) if no mark is indicated on it.
- (2) A ballot paper shall not be informal for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in paragraph (1) hereof, but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention, so far as his intention is clear; and, in particular, when only one candidate is to be elected and there are only two candidates, a ballot paper shall not be informal by reason only of the elector having indicated his vote or first preference by a cross instead of the numeral 1.
- 35. As and when the Returning Officer shall have completed the counting of the votes, he shall declare the result of the election in the presence of the scrutineers and of any candidates who may be present at the time.
- 36. (1) When the result of an election has been ascertained and declared, the Returning Officer shall forthwith furnish a certificate of such result in accordance with Form No. 17 in the First Schedule hereto, and state therein the names, addresses, and occupations of the candidates who have been elected; and such certificate, when received by the Minister, shall be deemed to be the nomination, within the meaning and for the purposes of section eight of the Act of the persons named in such certificate by the constituent body whom they have been elected to represent as members of the Board.
- (2) Such certificate shall be final and conclusive evidence that the persons named therein have been duly and properly elected.
- 37. (1) On the receipt of the said certificate from the Returning Officer, the Minister shall, on or before the nomination day hereinbefore prescribed and appointed, or, in the event of any inadvertent delay, as soon as practicable thereafter, submit the names of the persons named in such certificate to the Governor in Council for appointment as members of the Board, under and as required by section eight of the Act.
- (2) Every appointment of a member of the Board shall be published in the Government Gazette.

- 38. The appointment of a member of the Board shall be deemed to run from the date of such appointment by the Governor in Council
- 39. All costs, charges, and expenses as incurred by the Returning Officer in connection with the receipt of submission forms of candidates, preparation of rolls, and the conduct of elections or in connection with any other matters incidental thereto, and as certified in writing by the Returning Officer under his hand, shall be borne and paid by the Board or reimbursed to the Returning Officer by the Board out of its funds.

Provided that the Board may at its own expense have the accounts of the Returning Officer audited by the Auditor-General, whose decision thereon shall be final as between the parties.

- 40. In the event of any extraordinary vacancy arising in any representative membership of the Board under paragraphs (e), (d), or (e) of section eight of the Act, the following provisions shall apply:—
  - The Chairman of the Board shall notify such vacancy to the Minister and the Minister shall, upon receipt of such uotice, instruct the Returning Officer to invite submission of candidates for selection and nomination to fill such vacancy;
  - (2) The Returning Officer shall publish notice in the Government Gazette and the "West Australian" newspaper of the following matters:—
    - (a) of the vacancy in the membership of the Board;
    - (b) invitation for submissions of candidates for selection and nomination to fill such vacancy;
    - (c) of a date, being not less than seven or more than fourteen days after the date of such advertisement in the Government Gazette, on or before which submissions of candidates will be received by the Returning Officer;
    - (d) of a date, being not less than fourteen or more than forty-two days after the last day fixed as aforesaid for the receipt of submissions of candidates as the day fixed for the closing of the poll in the event of any election being necessary;
    - (c) of a date, being not more than ten days after the date fixed as aforesaid for the closing of the poll in the event of an election being necessary as the nomination day for the nomination of the elected candidate for appointment to fill the extraordinary vacancy.
- 41. (1) Where the name of only one candidate is received for nomination to fill an extraordinary vacancy, such candidate shall be deemed to be the nominated candidate, and thereafter the provisions of paragraph (g) of Regulation 15 shall apply.
- (2) Where more than one candidate is submitted for nomination to fill the extraordinary vacancy, then an election shall be held, and, insofar as the Regulations herein relating to elections are applicable, such election shall be held in accordance with such Regulations.

Provided that the date for the closing of the poll and the date for nomination of the elected candidate shall be the dates fixed and advertised as provided for in Regulation 39.

(1) Where an extraordinary vacancy has arisen. and notice thereof has been published as provided for in Regulation 39, then, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in these Regulations, any whose name is not enrolled as an elector on the electoral roll then in existence, and who would be entitled to apply for enrolment on such electoral roll under Regulation 21, if a new electoral roll were then being prepared in accordance with Regulation 17, may at any time before 4 o'clock in the afternoon of the day fixed as the last day for the receipt of submission of candidates for nomination for the extraordinary vacancy, make application in accordance with Regulation 20 for enrolment as an elector upon the said electoral roll, and, subject to the requirements of the said Regulation 20. the Returning Officer shall enrol the name of the applicant upon such electoral roll.

- (2) Upon any person being enrolled upon the electoral roll under paragraph (1) hereof, he shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of an elector as if he had been enrolled upon the electoral roll when the same was prepared in accordance with Regulation 17.
- (3) Where any person whose name appears on the roll to be used at the election held under this regulation has ceased to be qualified to be enrolled on such roll by reason of having ceased to carry on that class of business which qualified him for enrolment at the time when he was so enrolled, such person shall not be entitled to vote at the election merely because his name appears as an elector on the said roll; and in any such case the Returning Officer shall cause the name of such person to be struck off such roll.
- 43. The Returning Officer shall retain all ballot papers and declarations received by him in connection with any election held under these Regulations until the expiration of three months after the declaration of the result of such election, and shall then cause the same to be destroyed.

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of "The Indus-THIS Agreement made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this second day of May, 1935, between the Chief Secretary for the State of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as the "Minister"), of the one part, and the Western Australian Gaol Officers' Union of Workers (hereinafter referred to as the "Union") of the other part, witnesseth. nesseth:-

#### 1.--Term.

The currency of this Agreement shall be two years from first day of March, 1935.

### 2.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all members of the Western Australian Prison Service enumerated in Clause 15 of this Agreement, and shall operate over the whole

## 3.—Definitions.

(a) The definitions referred to hereunder shall apply only for the purpose of this Agreement, and shall not be taken to conflict in any manner whatsoever with the general orders and regulations dealing with the control and management of the Prison Service of Western Aus-

(b) "Probationary" shall mean a man not permanently appointed but undergoing instruction and proving his suitability for permanent appointment as a member

of the Western Australian Prison Service.

(c) "Employee" means any person permanently appointed to the Western Australian Prison Service enumerated in Clause 15 of this Agreement, and includes, except where the context otherwise shows, any chief

warder, principal warder, warder, or probationer.
(d) "Practicable" means practicable in the fair and reasonable opinion of the Controller General. Provided that, if any dispute arise as to whether in any case such opinion is fair and reasonable, the matter shall be referred to the Court of Arbitration.

## 4.-Lodging Allowance.

A lodging allowance of £29 per annum shall be payable where quarters are not provided.

## 5.—District Allowances.

The following district allowances shall be paid:-

(a) Pardelup:-

Officer in charge, £48 per annum. Other officers, £12 per annum.

(b) Employees working outside the South-West Land Division shall be paid district allowances as prescribed in the Public Service Regulations.

# 6.—Relief Allowances.

When relieving or on temporary duty at an outstation or elsewhere, employees shall be paid at the rate of 2s. 6d. per day extra.

# 7.—Clothing Allowances.

Uniforms shall be provided by the Minister at the following scale:-

Any employee when relieving instructors in cookhouse, boilerhouse, workshop, or hospital shall receive an allowance of 1s. per diem for any period exceeding 7 days.

# 9.-Hours of Work.

All employees shall work 96 hours per fortnight.

#### 10.-Meal Time.

Employees working on an 8-hour continuous shift shall be allowed 20 minutes for the purpose of having crib. Sentries shall take crib while on duty.

### 11.—Overtime.

- (a) Any employee who performs more than 96 hours per fortnight shall be given equivalent time off in lieu thereof as soon as practicable.
- (b) Officers who have reported prisoners for misconduct shall receive time-off in lieu of period occupied outside of working hours in connection with prosecutions.

### 12.—Annual Leave.

(a) Employees shall be granted 21 days' leave for each year of service.

Employees with at least one month's continuous service but less than twelve months, and leaving the employ of the Minister, shall be entitled to a pro rata annual

The following public holidays shall also be granted:—Christmas Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, Anzac Day.

  - (b) Where the Chairman or any member necessarily travels from a distance to attend a meeting of the Board duly held within this State, he shall be entitled to receive a first class railway fare on any available railway, and, in addition thereto, a traveling allowance of such amount not exceeding twelve and sixpence per day or part of a day, as the Board may from time to time determine.
- 2. When the Chairman or a member of the Board (other than the Chairman) attends any conference of the Board with any other Dried Fruits Board or Boards, whether such conference is held within or outside the State, the following special fees and allowances shall be payable to them, that is to say:—
  - (a) When sitting in Conference, the Chairman shall be entitled to and shall be paid a fee of £2 16s. 3d. per day, and each member (other than the Chairman) shall be entitled to and shall be paid a fee of £1 17s. 6d. per\_day; and
  - (b) While travelling to and from the place where the Conference is held, and whilst in attendance at such place on days other than the days when sittings of the Conference are held, the Chairman and each member (other than the Chairman) so travelling and in attendance as aforesaid shall be entitled to and shall be paid a travelling allowance of £1 per day; and
  - (c) While travelling to and from the place where the Conference is held the Chairman and each member (other than the Chairman) so travelling shall be entitled to and shall receive the first class railway fare on any available railway, and while in attendance at the place where the Conference is held the Chairman and each member aforesaid shall be entitled to receive and shall be paid the amount of his actual hotel and other living expenses, not exceeding £1 per day.
- 3. The accounts of the Board shall, at the cost of the Board, be audited by the Auditor General once at least in every year, and a report shall be furnished by the Auditor General to the Minister.
