Magnet Shop District, praying that the day on which such shops in that locality shall remain open until nine o'clock in the evening shall be Saturday, and it is desirable to accede to the prayer of such petition: Now therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and determine that, subject to the said Act, the day in each week on which all such shops as aforesaid in the Mt. Magnet Shop District shall remain open till nine o'clock in the evening shall be Saturday.

- (2) the portion of the Nullagine Road District described in Schedule B hereto be severed and annexed to the Tableland Road District.

The Forests Act, 1918. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1637/34. WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

- (a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation;
- (b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934," which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.

FINANCIAL EMERGENCY ACT, 1934, AND AMENDMENT ACT, 1934.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has approved—under Sections 6 (1) and 7 (1) of "The Financial Emergency Act, 1934"—of exemption or partial exemption being granted to the extent necessary to give effect to the following, as from January 1, 1935:—

Female Officers:

- (a) Adjustments in the salary rates of female officers will be made on the basis of 75 per cent. of male basic wage variations (since 30-6-1930), in the case of salaries up to £216 per annum as at 30-6-1930, and 80 per cent. in the case of rates over £216 per annum as at 30-6-1930, and 80 per cent. num; provided that, in making adjustments, a female rate will not be increased to a rate in excess of an adjusted male rate which was higher on 30-6-1930;
- (b) Rates for juniors will be reduced pro rata.

 Where the reductions prescribed in the Amendment Act are less than the percentage as per (a), the existing reduction will continne:
- (c) Amounts in excess of £500 per annum will be subject to the prescribed percentage reduction in the same manner as for male officers.

- Superannuation and Retiring Allowances:
 (a) Up to £250 per annum payments will be exempt from reduction;
 - (b) Subject to exemption up to £250 as per (a) and the avoidance of anomalies, the proportion over £250 will be reduced (to the nearest £) by 20 per cent., in cases in which such percentage reduction would be less than the reductions prescribed in the Financial Emergency Act Amendment Act, 1934;

(e) Subsequent variations in the basic wage amounting to £5 per annum or over will be taken into account as provided in the Amendment Act.

Nos. 12 and 13 of 1934.

Between Amalgamated Engineering Union of Workers, Collie Branch, and the Australasian Society of Engineers, Collie River District Industrial Union of Workers, Applicants, and Amalgamated Collieries of W.A., Ltd., and Griffin Coal Mining Company, Limited, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the Industrial Dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

AWARD.

1.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the Coal Mining Industry in the South-West Land Division of Western Australia.

2.—Term.

The currency of this Award shall be for three (3) year from the date thereof: Provided that, at any time after the expiration of twelve (12) months from the date thereof, the Court may alter or amend same on the application of any party affected by its provisions.

This Award shall take effect from the commencement of the first pay period next following the date hereof.

3.—Rates of Wages.

Basic wage at the rate of £3 11s. 6d. per week.

Workers employed on oxy-acetylene or electric welding plants shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per shift, in addition to the ordinary rate of pay whilst so engaged.

4.—Special Rates and Provisions.

- (a) Wet work: If any worker under this Award has to work in water, that is, if he has to stand in water while working, or if water drips on him in sufficient quantities to inconvenience him in his work, he shall be paid one shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) per shift extra.
- (b) Dirt money: Dirt money, at the rate of one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per shift, shall be paid to all workers whilst engaged in stripping and replacing gear wheels of pumps and haulages which are covered with oil or grease, also stripping, repairing, and replacing sprocket wheel of creeper chains, and for work on creeper chains, screens, and coal conveyors whilst in position, and which are covered with oil or grease, and for work done inside crankcase engines and generally for all work of a similar nature where the parts are covered with oil or grease.

No dirt money shall be paid to blacksmiths or their assistants whilst they work in the shop or to fitters and turners or assistants whilst working on the bench, lathe, or other machines.

- (c) Underground work: In the event of a worker being employed underground for a period of four (4) hours or more in any one day, his working shift shall be reduced by one half hour.
- (d) A blacksmith and his assistant shall each be paid, while employed shoeing horses with greasy heels, one penny halfpenny (1½d.) for each hour or part of an hour whilst so engaged.
- (e) When more than one of the disabilities entitling a worker to extra rates exist in the same shift, the employer shall be bound to pay only one rate, namely, the highest, except when work is done in the sump involving the removal of the upper garments.

5.—Higher Duties.

In the event of a worker being called upon to work in a grade higher than that in which he is usually employed for more than two (2) hours in any one day, he shall be paid the higher rate for that day.

6.—Definition.

"Casual worker" means a worker whose engagement is terminated before the expiration of six (6) consecutive working days. In construing the term "working days," Sundays and holidays and all other days upon which workers under this Award do not usually work shall be excluded, except work is actually done by the worker engaged, in which case such day shall count as part of the six (6) consecutive working days.

A casual worker shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rates prescribed in Clause 3.

7.—Hours of Duty.

Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work on pay week, and forty-two (42) hours in the back week. No day's work shall exceed seven (7) hours, but on pay Saturday five (5) hours shall be worked and paid for as seven (7) hours. These hours are exclusive of crib time.

In the case of a worker being permanently employed underground, his time shall be computed from bank to bank. In the event of a shop hand being engaged on underground work of a casual nature, his time shall be computed from shop to shop.

8.—Overtime.

- (a) For all work done beyond the hours of duty on any week day, other than a holiday, payment shall be made at the rate of ordinary time for the first hour, time and a-half during the next four (4) hours, and double time thereafter.
- (b) No worker shall be permitted to work more than twenty-four (24) hours' overtime in any one fortnight: Provided that this subclause shall not apply to cases where after application to the local Secretary of the applicant Union, extra competent labour is not available within a reasonable time.
- (c) Work done on Anniversary Day, Labour Day, Easter Monday, Good Friday, Anzac Day, Boxing Day, Christmas Day, New Year's Day and Sunday shall be paid for at double time rates, except in the case of workers effecting repairs or renewals to the machinery of the employer which has broken down and has caused a stoppage of operations, for the purpose of enabling work to be safely resumed on Monday or the earliest working day, in which case payment shall be made at the rate of time and a-half.

Any worker called on to work on any of the above-mentioned days shall be paid for at least four (4) hours' work at the rates aforesaid.

- (d) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving a job, he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours' at overtime rate.
- (e) When a worker is required to hold himself in readiness for a call to work after the ordinary hours, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for the time he so holds himself in readiness: Provided that, in cases where the worker is notified that he will be required to commence work at a specified time, then he shall be paid at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.
- (f) When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than two (2) hours, he shall be provided with any meal required, or shall be paid two shillings (2/-) in lieu thereof.
- (g) When a worker is required to work during his usual meal time and for a period of not less than one (1) hour afterwards, he shall be paid at overtime rates from the commencement of his usual meal time until he is permitted to take his meal.

9.—Holidays.

- (a) Each worker, other than a casual worker, shall be entitled to twelve (12) days' annual leave each year on full pay; or, should the period of continuous employment be less than one year, the worker shall be paid in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment. Annual leave shall be taken at a time suitable to the convenience of the employer, but shall in any event be taken within six (6) months after becoming due.
- (b) The undermentioned days are to be observed as holidays: New Year's Day, Anniversary Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

10.—Shift Work.

All workers employed on afternoon or midnight shift, shall be paid the following additional amounts per shift, namely, afternoon shift, sixpence (6d.), midnight shift, one shilling (1/-).

11.—Existing Customs and Conditions.

This Award is based on existing customs and conditions not inconsistent with this Award.

12.—Reduction of Hands.

In the event of a reduction of hands at a mine, the last worker employed in the particular class of work shall be the first to be dismissed, but this provision shall not apply to any worker dismissed for gross misconduct or refusal to obey lawful orders. If a worker has been shifted from one class of work to another, then his length of service for the purpose of determining seniority shall be deemed to date from the last time he signed on at the mine during his current period of employment.

13.—Record Book.

A record or time book shall be kept by each employer, in which record or time book shall be entered the name of each worker, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages earned by him each fortnight; the said record or time book shall be open to the inspection of the accredited representative of the Union at any time during the working hours, and he shall be allowed to take necessary extracts therefrom.

14.—Preference.

All workers under this Award must be members of one of the Unions mentioned herein. All workers engaged by the employer shall make application to become members of one of the Unions within three (3) weeks of their engagement. The Union shall accept them as members: Provided that they are persons of good character and tender the entrance fees and subscriptions in accordance with the rules of the Union.

Provided that this shall not oblige a Union, where its rules so provide, to accept as a tradesman-member anyone other than a person who has duly served his time as an apprentice or is otherwise considered to be a competent tradesman.

Provided further, that this clause does not apply where temporary assistance is being rendered by a member of the Miners' Union to workers provided for under this Award.

15.—Absence from Duty.

In the event of a worker being absent from work through any cause, he shall notify the management on the day prior to his intended resumption that he is returning to his work the following day. Failing such notification there shall be no obligation on the part of the management to provide him with work for the day on which he returns, if the employer is under an obligation to pay another worker for such day.

16.—Deductions from Wages.

The employer may deduct from the worker's wages the amounts agreed upon on account of contributions for medical benefits, contributions to the Accident Relief Fund, and the Aged and Infirm Coal Miners' Superannuation Fund, and any other contributions agreed to by both parties.

17.—Pay Day.

The wages shall be paid to all workers on every alternate Friday.

18.—Board of Reference.

- (a) The Court appoints, for the purpose of the Award, a Board of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a Chairman, who shall be the Inspector of Machinery allocated to the District for the time being, or, if his services are not available, the Government Inspector of Mines, and two other representatives, one to be chosen by the Union and the other by the employer. The employer and the Union may at any time by notification to the Registrar and the other party change such representative.
- (b) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of:—
 - (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award, or any of them; in particular deciding questions as to what constitutes in any particular instance "wet work" or "dirty work";
 - (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time;
 - (iii) an appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Regulations to "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," which for this purpose are embodied in and form part of this Award (Regulation 92).
- (iv) There shall be no cessation of work pending the reference to and the settlement of any dispute by the Board.

19.—Apprentices.

- (a) The employer taking an apprentice or a probationer shall, within fourteen (14) days thereafter, register such apprentice or probationer, by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration on the prescribed form. A probationary period of three (3) months previous to being bound shall be allowed. Such probationary period to be deemed part of the apprenticeship.
- (b) The number of apprentices allowed to the employer shall be in proportion of one apprentice to three (3) or part of three (3) tradesmen employed by him on the particular branch of work. The term of apprenticeship shall be five (5) years. Apprenticeship shall not commence before the apprentice is fifteen (15) years of age.
- (c) Should the employer, from unforescen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term of apprenticeship to another employer, but it shall be encumbent on the former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration of the date of the said transfer on the prescribed form. It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer, if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him. When an apprentice cannot be usefully employed because of a strike, the employer shall be relieved of his obligations under the apprenticeship contract during the period of the strike.
- (d) Slackness of work may form a proper ground of transferring an apprentice to an employer willing to take the responsibility of teaching him. When an apprentice is discharged, notice in the prescribed form attached hereto shall be given to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration.
 - (e) (i) The rates of pay for apprentices shall be as under :-

- (ii) Apprentices employed on afternoon shift or midnight shift shall be paid the following additional amounts per shift, namely, afternoon shift sixpence (6d.), midnight shift one shilling (1s.).
- (iii) Apprentices employed at present shall receive the wages that they are entitled to under their existing contracts of apprenticeship.
- (f) Every apprentice shall be bound to attend such classes at the Technical School, or continuation classes, as are provided for his trade.
- (g) The period during which apprentices are to attend such Technical School or classes shall be four (4) hours per week, if instruction is available: provided, if technical instruction is not available in Collie and is available by correspondence at reasonable cost, to be approved by the Court, the Court may prescribe such correspondence course as the technical instruction to be taken by the apprentice and paid for by the employer.
- (h) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination at the places and times prescribed by the Court.
- (i) Every apprentice shall, prior to submitting himself to examination, produce to the examiners a certificate that he has made at least 70 per cent. of attendances at the Technical School or other place of instruction, unless he is exempted from such attendance for good cause.
- (j) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the examiners of the names and addresses of the apprentices required to submit themselves to examination.
- (k) The employer shall place at the disposal of the examiners such materials and machinery on his premises as may be required by them and shall in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examinations.
- (l) The Board of Examiners shall consist of persons skilled in the industry. It shall comprise equal numbers of representatives nominated by the employers and workers in the particular trade. Failing such nomination or nominations, the Court may appoint such person or persons as it may deem fit. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners, the matters in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them or nominated by the Court or the President, at the request of any of the examiners, and the decision of such person shall be final and conclusive.
- (m) It shall be the duty of the examiners to examine the work, require the production of the certificate of attendance,

inquire into the diligence of each apprentice, and as to the opportunities provided by the employer for each apprentice to learn, and to submit a report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination within one (1) month from the date of holding the examination, but this period may be extended by the Court,

- (n) Such examinations shall, where possible, include theory and practice as applied to the trade, industry, craft, occupation, or calling to which the apprentice is indentured.
- (o) The Registrar shall, after the examination, issue a certificate to each apprentice indicating his degree of proficiency, taking into consideration the term of apprenticeship served. A duplicate of such certificate shall be lodged by each apprentice with his employer and the secretary of the Union, each of whom shall keep the same in safe custody, and produce the same for inspection by the Industrial Ins-spector, whenever demanded by the latter to do so. When the final examination has been passed the certificate shall be signed by the examiners.
- (p) The examiners shall each be entitled to the following fees, namely :

For every five or fraction of five (5) apprentices examined: one guinea, with a minimum fee of two (2) guineas.

In addition to the foregoing fees, where examiners in the performance of their duties as such are required to travel, they will be entitled to reimbursement of all fares and necessary expenses actually incurred, particulars of which must be submitted to and approved by the Registrar before payment is made

- (q) Whenever it is possible so to do, the examiners, before entering upon the examination following the issue of these Regulations, shall draw up a syllabus showing what, in their regulations, shall draw up a syllaous showing what, in their opinion, is the stage of proficiency which an apprentice should attain at each of the examinations prescribed. The syllabus shall be subject to review by the Court at any time, and shall be kept as a record by the Clerk of the Court and a copy handed to the examiners before each examination. The said syllabus may be subject to alteration from time to time by the examiners, who shall forthwith notify the Clerk of the Court thereof.
- (r) In lieu of the Board of Examiners above referred to the Court may appoint in substitution thereof, wholly or partly, examiners to be appointed by the Director of Technical Education for the whole or any portion of the subjects of instruction.
- (s) Apprentices shall be allowed to the following trades: (i) Fitter and turner; (ii) machinist; (iii) blacksmith; (iv) electrical fitter; (v) millwright.
- (t) The employer shall pay the apprentice for all time lost through sickness, or the holidays prescribed by this Award, provided :-
 - (i) payment for such sickness shall not exceed a total of one (1) month in each year;
 - (ii) where the time lost through sickness exceeds four (4) consecutive working days, the employer may demand from the apprentice the production of a medical certificate, and a further certificate or certificates may be required if any time is lost through sickness within seven (7) days from the date of resumption of duty, the cost, if any, of such certificate or certificates not exceeding five shillings (5s.) to be borne by the employer;
 - (iii) an apprentice shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident, not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident or sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (u) In the event of, and whilst work is not available, for an apprentice in the calling to which he is bound, he may be employed in some other occupation connected with this Award during such period: Provided, however, that this provision shall not be deemed to authorise any action on the part of the employer that might jeopardise the training of the apprentice in his proper calling.

- (a) That the apprentice shall and will truly serve and will diligently attend to his work at the said trade, and will at all times willingly obey the reasonable directions of the employer, his managers, foremen, and overseers, and will not, during the apprenticeship, without the consent in writing of the employer, sell any goods which the employer makes, or employ himself in the service of any other person or com-pany in any work, or do any work which the employer undertakes, other than for the employer, and will not absent himself from the employer's service without leave, and will comply with the provisions of the Regulations and of all Awards and Agreements made under "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," or any other Act in force so far as the same shall relate to his apprentice-
- (b) That the apprentice will not do or knowingly suffer any damage to be done to the property of the employer.
- (3) The employer for himself, his heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns hereby covenants with the apprentice as follows :-
 - -(a) That the employer will accept the apprentice as his practical training of the apprentice in the said trade.
 - (b) That the technical instruction of the apprentice, when available, shall be at the expense of the employer and shall be in the employer's time, except in places when such instruction is given after the ordinary working hours.
 - (c) In the event of the apprentice, in the opinion of the examiner or examiners appointed by the Arbitration Court, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense to enable the apprentice to reach the necessary standard.
 - (d) That the employer will observe and perform all the conditions and stipulations of "The Industrial Arbitration Act 1912–1925," or any Act or Acts amending the same, and any regulations made thereunder, so far as the same concern the apprentice, and also the conditions and stipulations of any relative Award or Industrial Agreement for the time being in force.
