WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: And whereas it is desirable to vary Proclamations under the said section of the said Act, dated the 14th day of November, 1934, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 16th November, 1934, and dated the 17th day of December, 1934, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 21st December, 1934, respectively, in regard to certain Western Australian waters described therein being closed against the use of fishing nets: Now therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby vary

the said Proclamations by declaring that it shall be lawful to use fishing nets of legal length and size of mesh in the waters described in the Schedule hereto from the 1st day of July, 1935, until the 31st day of October, 1935, inclusive.

Schedule.

(a) Princess Royal Harbour (Albany).—All that area of Western Australian waters on the Northern side of Princess Royal Harbour, Albany, North of a line drawn from Residency Point to the Southern extremity of the Town Jetty; thence to the Southern extremity of the Deep Water Jetty; and thence North-Easterly to Point King.

(b) (12).—All that area of the Southern portion of the waters of Oyster Harbour (Albany) and the waters of the Channel Entrance to Oyster Harbour from King George's Sound bounded by the following lines:—On the South by a line drawn in an Easterly direction from a point on the foreshore ten (10) chains South of Emu Point to the opposite foreshore; on the North by a line drawn in a North-Easterly direction from a peg on the foreshore marked 14 (about 440 yards Westward of Emu Point) to the Southern extremity of Green Island; and thence by a line drawn in an East-South-Easterly direction from the Southern extremity of the said Green Island to a point on the Southern foreshore of Oyster Harbour 115 chains Eastward of the Eastern point of entrance to Oyster Harbour.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from—(a) Taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture; (b) Taking any fish whatsoever by any specified means of capture; (c) Taking any fish whatsoever by any means of capture whatsoever; in any specified portion of Western Australian waters during any specified time in any specified year, or during a specified portion of any year: Now therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of any other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing lines as from the 20th day of July, 1935, until the 31st day of October, 1935, inclusive.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage,
and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 287/35.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Storm-water Drainage Works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Section 20, 21, 22 and 23 of the said Act.

Description and Location of Reticulation Works
Approved and Exempted.

Metropolitan Sewerage.

Claremont District—Reticulation Area No. 7.—Commencing at manhole No. 730 in Florence Road on Section 31, and proceeding East across Florence Road and through Lot 22, Florence Road, to new manhole No. 731, situated in the South-East corner of Lot 22, Florence Road, a distance of 167 feet, in lieu of a 6-inch diameter sewer commencing at manhole No. 732, situated in the North-East corner of Lot 21, Florence Road, and proceeding West through Lot 21, Florence Road, to and including manhole No. 731 in Florence Road, a distance of 167 feet; also commencing at manhole No. 733 on Section 31, situated in the South-East corner of Lot 24, Florence Road, and proceeding North through Lots 24, 23, 22 and 21, Florence Road, parallel to, and about 3 feet West of the East boundaries of the said Lots 24, 23, 22 and 21, Florence Road, to manhole No. 732 situated about 3 feet North of the South boundary of Lot 18, Stirling Highway, a distance of 264 feet; thence East through Lot 18, Stirling Highway, to an inspection opening in Lot 19, Stirling Highway, a distance of 40 feet in lieu of a 6-inch diameter sewer commencing at manhole No. 733 on Section No. 31, situated in the South-East corner of Lot 24, Florence Road, and proceeding North through Lots 24, 23, 22 and 21, Florence Road, parallel to and about 3 feet West of the East boundaries of the said Lots 24, 23, 22 and 21, Florence Road, to manhole No. 732 situated in the North-East corner of Lot 21, Florence Road, a distance of 258 feet; thence East through Lots 21, Florence Road, and 34 Stanley Street, about 3 feet South of the North boundaries of the said Lots 21 Florence Road and 34 Stanley Street to an inspection opening in Lot 34, Stanley Street, a distance of 40 feet, which were portions of the works as advertised in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia on the 1st day of March, 1935, and as detailed in the plans and specifications therein referred to.

and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 30/35.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Storm-water Drainage Works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to

and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Sewerage.

Area No. 4—Extension of Reticulation, Cottesloe District.—6-inch and 4-inch reticulation sewers with all manholes and other apparatus connected therewith, between Broome Street and the right-of-way between Broome Street and Ocean Road and between Jarrad Street and Pearse Street within the boundaries as shown in pink on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 5520.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

MUNICIPALITY OF CLAREMONT.

Repeal of Paragraph 56 of Building By-law No. 123.

P.W. 1552/25.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Municipality of Claremont hereby orders as follows:—

That paragraph 56 of Building By-law No. 123 is hereby repealed and the following By-law substituted in lieu thereof:—

Verandahs.

56. (a) No person shall erect any verandah over any public footway within the limits of the Municipality of Claremont without having first obtained the consent of the Council, to be signified by the issue of a license in the form of Schedule "A" hereto.

(b) Any person desiring to obtain the consent of the Council to the erection of such a verandah shall deposit with the Building Surveyor a plan, elevation, section, and specification, showing in detail the proposed construction of such verandah and the manner in which it is proposed to secure it to the building to which it is proposed to be attached.

(c) No such verandah shall hereafter be erected unless it conform, save as hereinafter provided, to the plan numbered 1 (P.W.D., W.A., 27885) which has been settled and approved by the Council and deposited in the Office of the Building Surveyor: Provided that the strength of the materials used in the construction of any such verandah may, subject to the approval of the Building Surveyor, be varied according to circumstances.

(d) The minimum height of any verandah hereafter erected shall be eleven feet from the top of the kerb to the underside of the signboard. In the case of sloping ground the height shall be measured at the centre of the frontage: Provided that if the frontage shall exceed 20 feet, a break shall be made if so directed by the Building Surveyor.

(e) All verandahs in a street shall be erected of a uniform height and width. Subject to the last preceding section, the standard height and width of verandahs in each street shall be fixed by the Council.

(f) In the construction of every such verandah the following conditions shall be complied with:—

(i) The roof shall be covered with 24-gauge galvanised corrugated iron. The gutters shall be lined with galvanised plain iron not lighter than 24 gauge and shall be of a capacity sufficient to carry off all rain or storm water. Such capacity shall in no case be less than 27 square inches.

(ii) Down pipes shall be of 24-gauge galvanised iron with a minimum area of 9 square inches. The inlets from the gutters to the down pipes shall be at least twice the area of the down pipes and shall be funnel-shaped. Special provision shall be made for the head of the down pipes, and the lower lengths of such down pipes shall be of 18-gauge at least, and the portion thereof carrying water under the footpath shall be of wrought iron.

(iii) The ceiling shall be of ceelite plain galvanised iron or other approved non-inflammable materials securely fixed to the wood joists, which shall be 4in. x 2in. spaced not more than two feet, centres running parallel with the footpath and secured to the steel framing. All ceilings to be flat and level.

(iv) The hanging bolts are to be 1 $\frac{3}{8}$ in. diameter, attached to the framing as shown and securely bolted to the building and provided with a union screw, all quite plain.

(g) The fascia or signboard of every such verandah is to be framed as shown and covered with 24-gauge galvanised iron neatly fitted over the framing, and a flashing of 5lbs. lead must be fixed over the top as shown.

(h) Whenever a proposed verandah will abut on to an existing verandah, it shall be so finished as to prevent rain from falling between such verandahs. Provided that when the existing verandah is shorter than the frontage of the building to which it is attached, the person erecting the new verandah shall make the necessary extension to the existing one.

(i) Whenever the end of a verandah abuts on to the end of a right-of-way, street, or public place, the signboard shall be returned along such end to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor.

(j) No writing, printing, or trade notice of any description shall be exhibited on any portion of the verandah, except on the outer face of the signboard, and/or upon signboards under the ceiling of the verandah securely and rigidly fixed to the framework of the ceiling at right angles to the building line and having a maximum depth of 12 inches and at a distance of 12 feet between one and another.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Minister for Agriculture, with the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, has, pursuant to Section 59 of "The Dairy Products Marketing Regulation Act, 1934," made further Regulations under and for the purposes of the said Act, as set forth in the Schedule hereto; and that such further Regulations are added to, shall be read with and be deemed to be part of the Regulations made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of March, 1935, the 29th day of March, 1935, the 17th day of May, 1935, and the 31st day of May, 1935, respectively.

Schedule.

1. The following Regulations are added to the above-mentioned Regulations, after Regulation 43, namely:—

Storage Places—Section 21 ss. (3).

44. No storage place shall be licensed as such unless rooms are provided for dairy products only. Cheese and butter may not be stored together in the same room.

45. When butter is held in a storage place it shall be kept at a temperature (unless otherwise approved by an Inspector) not exceeding 12 degrees Fah.

46. Every room or chamber of a storage place shall be equipped with a self-registering thermometer of approved make which accurately and continuously registers the temperature of such room or chamber.

47. If the refrigerating machinery in any storage place becomes wholly or partly inoperative and the temperature of such storage place rises above 12 degrees Fah. while butter is stored therein, notice must be given immediately to the Board or to an Inspector.

48. Any cool chamber forming the whole or part of a storage place shall open only on an ante-chamber where the temperature is not more than 50 degrees Fah., or shall be fitted with a suitable air-lock so as to prevent atmospheric air entering the chamber when the door is open.

49. At each storage place there shall be a grading floor which shall conform to the requirements of the Board as to provision of natural light and means whereby temperature may be controlled between 40 deg. Fah. and 70 deg. Fah. The atmosphere must be clean and free from contaminating influences.

Marking of Dairy Products Offered for Sale.

50. No person shall sell for consumption in Western Australia butter, whether manufactured in Western Australia or elsewhere, unless the package containing such butter is correctly marked so as to show—

- (a) the registered brand or mark of the packer or the packer's name, and
- (b) the grade of the contents, and
- (c) the origin of the contents, which shall be indicated by the words "Local Factory Butter" or "Imported Factory Butter," or "Farm Butter," as the case may be.

Penalty—Fifty pounds.

51. No butter shall be offered for sale in Western Australia under a brand or mark, unless such brand or mark has been registered with the Board.

52. Application for registration of a brand shall be made to the Board in Form 18 of the First Schedule and be accompanied by a fee of 5s.

A facsimile of the brand or mark shall be shown on the Application Form.

53. No brand or mark shall be registered which is identical with one already registered or registered with the Commonwealth Trade Marks Department, or has such resemblance to a mark already on the register as to be calculated to deceive.

54. The Board shall cause to be entered in a book to be known as the Register of Brands or Marks the following particulars of brands or marks for which registration has been granted:—

- (a) the date registration granted or transferred,
- (b) the name and address of the owner of the brand or mark,
- (c) a facsimile of the brand or mark,
- (d) the date the registration of brand or mark is cancelled.

55. In the event of the application for registration of a brand or mark being refused, the Board may in its discretion refund such fee or apply the same in and towards the expenses of administering the Act.

56. Where registration of a brand or mark is granted a certificate in Form 19 of the First Schedule shall be issued to the applicant.

57. If the owner of a registered brand or mark desires to transfer the right to the use thereof to any other person, he shall join with such person in an application for transfer to be forwarded to the Board, whereupon the application, if in order, shall be granted and a record thereof shall be entered in the Register of Brands or Marks.

The Application for Transfer of a brand or mark shall be in Form 20 of the First Schedule and shall be accompanied by a fee of two shillings and sixpence which shall be returned if the application be not granted.

When the application for transfer of a brand or mark is granted, the Board shall cause a memorandum of the transfer in Form 21 to be indorsed on the certificate of registration of such brand or mark.

58. The registration of any brand or mark may be cancelled if it be proved—

- (a) that the owner thereof has not used the brand or mark for a period of six consecutive months; or
- (b) that the owner has ceased to exist or permanently left the State.

59. The grade of butter contained in the package shall be indicated by one of the following terms:—

"Choice Grade," "First Grade," "Second Grade," "Pastry Grade," "Renovated,"

and the terms shall have the respective meanings attached to them in the Regulations to "The Dairy Industry Act, 1922," and "The Health Act, 1911-1933."

Premises and Machinery, etc., used for Preparing, Packing, Transporting, or holding of Dairy Products for Sale.

(Section 32, Subsection (1), paragraph (c).)

60. (a) The occupier of every premises where dairy products are prepared, packed, or kept for sale, shall maintain such premises, together with all apparatus, instruments, fittings, utensils, and vehicles used in connection with the preparation, packing and transport of dairy products in a clean condition.

(b) Every occupier of such premises shall be responsible for the maintenance in a clean condition of all persons employed by him in the preparation, packing, or handling of dairy products for sale, and for the maintenance in a clean condition of the clothing of such persons.

(c) Every occupier of such premises shall see that such premises, machinery, plant, utensils, and vehicles, used in the preparation, packing, and transport of dairy products for sale, are kept entirely free from contaminating influences.

61. The occupier of every such premises shall, when so ordered by the Board, pave the floor or such portion thereof as may be directed, with impervious materials, in such manner as is specified in the order; and shall, when so ordered, further provide proper drainage, so

that all liquids falling upon such floor shall be conducted to a drain inlet situated outside the building within which the floor is laid.

62. Every occupier of such premises shall, when so ordered by the Board, line the walls of any such premises, or such portion thereof as may be specified, to such a height from the floor as may be directed.

63. The occupier of every such premises shall cause such premises to comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) Every room which is used in connection with the preparation, packing, or keeping of dairy products, shall be properly ceiled.
- (b) Every such room shall be provided with natural light in the ratio of one square foot of window area to every ten square feet of floor area.
- (c) Every such room shall be efficiently ventilated.
- (d) All offensive material or trade refuse produced upon such premises shall be immediately placed in an impervious receptacle, provided with a tight-fitting cover, and the contents of such receptacle shall be removed at least once in each week, or with such greater frequency as may be directed by an inspector.

64. Every occupier of any such premises shall cover all door and window openings and other apertures on such premises with screens of fine mesh wire gauze, and fit all doors so that they are self-closing, and every such occupier shall maintain the fittings of such doors and windows at all times in good order and repair.

65. (a) Every occupier of such premises shall provide for use by his employees wash hand basins in the ratio of one to every ten employees, and shall maintain a supply of soap and clean towels in connection with such basins.

(b) Every occupier of such premises shall provide an efficient supply of both cold and boiling water.

66. No person shall use any place for or in connection with the sale, preparation, storage, or packing of any Dairy Products for sale, which is at any time used as a sleeping or living apartment, or which communicates directly with a sleeping apartment, or in which anything is kept, or any animal allowed to be, or in which any work is carried on which would be likely to contaminate such Dairy Products, or injuriously affect its wholesomeness or cleanliness.

67. No person shall use or permit to be used any cellar in the storage and preparation of Dairy Products unless with the written consent of the Board.

68. Benches, machinery, utensils, and instruments, used in cutting, holding, or packing Dairy Products, shall be thoroughly cleansed with boiling water at least once a day.

69. Benches used for butter cutting shall have an impervious upper surface.

70. Only such premises as are approved by the Board shall be used for holding dairy products whilst thawing out.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, in accordance with Section 62 of "The Mine Workers' Relief Act, 1932," has been pleased to repeal all the regulations heretofore made under the said Act and in force at the date of the publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette* and in lieu thereof to make new Regulations under and for the purpose of the said Act as set forth in the Schedule hereunder to come into force as from the publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette* as aforesaid.

Schedule.

MINE WORKERS' RELIEF ACT, 1932.

Regulations.

1. These regulations may be referred to as "The Mine Workers' Relief Regulations."
2. The certificate of appointment mentioned in Section 7 of the Act shall be in the Form "A" in the First Schedule hereto.
3. Any Government medical officer or medical practitioner requiring any person occupied or employed in mining operations to submit himself for examination for symptoms of silicosis or tuberculosis shall do so by notice in Form "B" in the First Schedule hereto.
4. The certificate mentioned in Section 8, Subsection 3, shall be in Form "C" in the First Schedule hereto.
5. Within seven (7) days of the completion of examination of the mine workers employed on or in any mine, or persons engaged in prospecting, the medical officer or practitioner shall furnish a report in writing to the Minister stating the name, address, laboratory number and the date of examination of any such person found to be suffering from
 - (a) Tuberculosis without silicosis,
 - (b) Silicosis with tuberculosis,
 - (c) Silicosis in the advanced stage,
together with a medical certificate in the Form "D" in the First Schedule hereto in each case.
 - (d) The name and address and laboratory number of any such person found to be suffering from silicosis in the early stage.
 - (e) The number of men free from the diseases mentioned in the Act.
6. The Minister shall, on receipt of a report from the medical officer or practitioner under the provisions of Section 13, Subsection 1, serve upon the person named therein a notice in Form "E" or "F" in the First Schedule hereto, and upon the employer of such person a notice in the Form "G" or "H" in the First Schedule hereto, as the case may be.
7. The Minister shall, on receipt of a report under Section 16, Subsection 1, send notice to the person therein named in Form "I" or "J" in the First Schedule hereto, as the case may be.
8. The notice of appeal mentioned in Section 14, Subsection (1) of the Act shall be in the Form "K" in the First Schedule hereto and the certificate of the decision of the Board hearing the appeal shall be in the Form "L" in the said schedule.
9. The register of prohibited mine workers mentioned in Section 15 of the Act shall be in the Form "M" in the First Schedule hereto.
10. The register of employers mentioned in paragraph (a) of Section 21 of the Act shall be in the Form "N" in the First Schedule hereto.
11. The register of employees mentioned in paragraph (b) of Section 21 of the Act shall be in the Form "O" of the First Schedule hereto.

Rate of Contribution by Mine Workers.

12. Every mine worker shall contribute to the fund one shilling and sixpence per pay where the pay is half-monthly, and three shillings per pay where the pay is monthly.

Election of Mine Workers' Relief Board.

13. Prior to the 15th day of February, 1933, and the 15th day of February in every succeeding year, the names of persons nominated as candidates for the office of Member of the Mine Workers' Relief Board shall be lodged with the Secretary of the Board. Nominations shall be in writing, signed by the person nominated and also by his proposer and seconder. The proposer and seconder must be employers, in the case of candidates for elections as employers' representative, and mine workers, in the case of candidates for election as mine workers' representative, and in every case must be persons who are entitled to vote at the election.

14. If the number of candidates nominated by the Mine Workers exceeds the vacancy or number of vacancies or prospective vacancies amongst the mine workers' representatives of the Mine Workers' Relief Board, the Secretary shall cause ballot papers to be printed containing in alphabetical order all the names of the candidates and the Secretary shall in the case of Mine Workers post to the Employers a sufficient number of such ballot papers according to the number of contributing Mine Workers employed on the mine of the Employer and such Employer shall cause a ballot to be taken on any date that may be suitable to the Employer between the 14th and 20th days of April, inclusive, of all contributing Mine Workers engaged on the mine of the employer on that day. A mine worker when voting shall mark the ballot paper by placing a cross opposite the name or names of the candidate or candidates for whom he may vote and shall then place the ballot paper in a sealed box to be kept by the Employer for this purpose.

15. The ballot papers shall be collected and placed in a sealed box by the Employer and forthwith forwarded or handed to the Secretary in such box.

16. If the number of candidates nominated by the Employers exceeds the vacant or number of vacancies or prospective vacancies of Employer representatives on the Mine Workers' Relief Board, the Secretary shall cause ballot papers to be printed containing in alphabetical order all the names of the candidates and shall send one of such ballot papers to each Employer with an envelope marked "Ballot Paper." Each Employer when voting shall place a cross against the name or names of the person or persons for whom he votes and then place the ballot paper in the envelope marked "Ballot paper," and close it. The envelope marked "Ballot Paper" shall then be placed, together with a statement in writing of the name and address of the employer in another envelope addressed, stamped and posted or delivered to the Secretary on or before the 19th April.

17. The Secretary shall act as Returning Officer, and in the event of the nominations not exceeding the number of vacancies the Returning Officer shall forthwith declare those nominated duly elected. In the event of the nominations exceeding the number of vacancies, the Secretary as such Returning Officer shall forthwith fix a day as soon as possible after the 20th day of April for counting the votes in the presence of the Scrutineers or a quorum of the same.

18. If an election shall take place as provided for under clauses 14 and 16, the Returning Officer shall conduct the election, count the votes, and on the completion of the counting of the votes, forthwith declare in writing the result of the election. Such declaration as to the result of the election shall be final and conclusive.

19. The Mine Workers' Relief Board shall nominate two persons as Scrutineers and the Minister for Mines a third one to assist the Returning Officer—two Scrutineers shall be a quorum. No member or candidate for membership of the Mine Workers' Relief Board shall act as a Scrutineer.

20. The Secretary shall post the result of every election in his office and publish the same in the *Government Gazette*.

21. On an election of Mine Workers' representatives on the Mine Workers' Relief Board each Mine Worker shall have one vote.

22. On the election of Employers' representatives on the Mine Workers' Relief Board each Employer shall have one vote for every Mine Worker in respect of whom he contributes to the fund under the Act up to five. He shall have an additional vote for every additional five Mine Workers up to fifty, and an additional vote for every ten beyond the first fifty. The Attorney of an Employer may vote in his name.

23. When any extraordinary vacancy shall occur among the elected members of the Mine Workers' Relief Board, an extraordinary election shall be held to fill such vacancy in accordance with the provisions of Regulations 14 or 16 as the case may require, with such modification as regards dates as the circumstances may necessitate. Every such election shall be held within three months of the vacancy arising.

24. The Minister may authorise alterations in detail as may be deemed necessary by him.

25. Any person voting who is not entitled to vote, or voting more than once at the same election, shall be guilty of a breach of the Regulations and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each offence.

26. Returning officers and scrutineers appointed to attend at contested elections of Mine Workers' representative or Employers' representative on the Mine Workers' Relief Board will be allowed the following fees:—

Persons appointed under the provisions of "The Public Service Act, 1904," are authorised to receive and retain such fees as are provided for their use under this Regulation, in accordance with the procedure adopted in the Public Service.

Remuneration of Members of the Board.

27. Each member of the Mine Workers' Relief Board shall be paid out of the fund a fee not exceeding £2 2s. 0d. for each Board meeting he shall attend, but no member shall during any one year of office receive more than £100 for such fees.

Meetings of the Board.

28. The Mine Workers' Relief Board may meet for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they may think fit, and three members of the Board shall be a quorum. The Chairman or two members of the Board may at any time, and the Secretary shall, upon the request in writing of the Chairman or two members of the Board, summon a meeting of the Board. Notice of every meeting of the Board stating the general particulars of all business to be considered at such meeting shall be sent by post to each member of the Board at least three days before such meeting unless urgent circumstances require shorter notice, but the proceedings of any meeting shall not be invalidated by any irregularity in respect of such notice, or by reason of any business being considered, which is not comprised in such general particulars.

29. The minutes of resolutions and proceedings of the Board shall be entered in ink in a minute book to be kept for that purpose, and the minutes of every meeting of the Board shall be read at the next or any subsequent meeting thereof, and if found correct shall be signed by the Chairman of such meeting.

Benefits.

30. The notice mentioned in Subsection (1) of Section 46 shall be in the Form "P" in the First Schedule hereto.

31. The register mentioned in Subsection (2) of Section 46 shall be in the Form "Q" in the First Schedule hereto.

32. The benefits mentioned in Subsection (2) of Section 48 of the Act for mine workers prohibited as suffering from tuberculosis and silicosis or silicosis advanced, or for their dependants, shall be those specified in Scale I of the Second Schedule hereto.

33. The benefits mentioned in paragraph (b) of Subsection (1) of Section 49 of the Act for mine workers prohibited as suffering from tuberculosis without silicosis, or for their dependants shall be those specified in Scale I of the Second Schedule hereto.

34. The dependants of a mine worker who dies before he has received the sum of Seven hundred and fifty pounds mentioned in paragraph (a) of Subsection (1) of Section 49 of the Act shall, as from the date of his death, be entitled to the balance of such sum in accordance with the benefits specified in Scale II of the Second Schedule hereto.

35. The benefits mentioned in Subsection (2) of Section 49 of the Act for a mine worker prohibited as suffering from tuberculosis without silicosis, and for his dependants, shall be those specified in Scale I of the Second Schedule hereto.

36. The notice mentioned in Subsection (1) of Section 50 of the Act shall be in the Form "R" in the First Schedule hereto.

37. The register mentioned in Subsection (2) of Section 50 of the Act shall be in the Form "S" of the First Schedule hereto.

38. The certificate of registration and the application for renewal of registration mentioned in Subsection (3) of Section 50 of the Act shall be in the Form "T" and "U" respectively, in the First Schedule hereto.

39. The notices mentioned in Subsection (2) of Section 51 of the Act shall be in the Form "V" or "W" in the First Schedule hereto, as the case may be, and the register mentioned in the said subsection shall be in the Form "X" in the said schedule.

40. The benefits for mine workers and their dependants mentioned in Section 56 of the Act shall be those specified in Scale I of the Second Schedule hereto.

41. Any person desiring to contribute to the fund as a mine worker under paragraph (a) or (b) of Subsection (1) of Section 57 of the Act shall make application to the Secretary of the Mine Workers' Relief Board in the Form "Y" or "Z" in the First Schedule hereto, as the case may be, and annex thereto a certificate from the Commonwealth Health Laboratory, Kalgoorlie, that he is free from—

- (a) the diseases mentioned in Clause 2 of Regulation 7 of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906," or
- (b) the diseases mentioned in Clause 2 of Regulation 7 of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906," with the exception of silicosis in the early stage.

Provided that:—

(1) If any prospector is prospecting at a place so far distant from Kalgoorlie that to obtain a certificate from the said Laboratory would impose upon him unreasonable delay and expense, the Board may accept the certificate of the legally qualified medical practitioner residing nearest to him, conditionally that he obtains the necessary certificate from the said Laboratory within twelve months of the date of his application, or such further time as the Board may allow; and

(2) If any prospector shall have obtained a provisional certificate from a medical practitioner as provided in the next preceding proviso, and thereafter shall be medically examined by the said Commonwealth Laboratory, or by a medical officer or practitioner appointed under or for the purposes of "The Mine Workers' Relief Act, 1932," and such prospector is then found to be suffering from any of the diseases mentioned in Clause 2 of Regulation 7 of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906," and, in the opinion of the officer or practitioner making such medical examination, the person examined by him was, in his opinion, suffering from the said disease or diseases at the time when he previously obtained the certificate of a medical practitioner as aforesaid, the Board may revoke such permission and refund the total amount of contributions paid into the Fund by the said prospector.

This proviso shall not be construed as applying to any prospector who at the date he obtained a provisional certificate was only suffering from silicosis in the early stage and had for a period or periods amounting in the aggregate to five years been personally engaged in prospecting in Western Australia.

42. The register mentioned in Subsection (2) of Section 57 of the Act shall be in the Form "Z1" in the First Schedule hereto.

43. The certificate mentioned in Subsection (4) of Section 57 of the Act shall be in the Form "D" in the First Schedule hereto, and shall be forwarded to the Minister who shall transmit the same to the person named therein, together with a notice in the Form "E," "F," or "J" in the First Schedule hereto, as the case may be, and shall also forward a copy of the said certificate or notice to the Secretary of the Mine Workers' Relief Board.

44. The benefits payable under the Act shall commence as from—

- (a) the day following the day upon which the mine worker ceases work, if he is employed as a mine worker at a mine on the date of the prohibition;
- (b) the day following the day upon which the mine worker ceases work, if he is employed as a mine worker at a mine after the date of his medical examination under this Act, which resulted in his being prohibited as aforesaid, and is not so employed on the date of such prohibition;
- (c) the day of his medical examination under this Act which resulted in his being prohibited as aforesaid, if the mine worker is not employed as a mine worker at a mine after the date of such examination and on the date of such prohibition.

45. In the event of a mine worker or his dependants receiving the Commonwealth invalid or old age pension, the Board shall deduct the amount of such pension from the benefits payable from the Fund.

46. Any prohibited or notified mine worker, or the dependant of such mine worker, who leaves Australia to reside in a foreign country, or the dependant of such mine worker who at the date he was prohibited or notified was residing in a foreign country, shall not be entitled to more compensation than that specified in Scale I of the Second Schedule hereto.

47. If any person receiving benefits under the Act is convicted of an offence and sentenced to any term of imprisonment, the Minister may forfeit the benefits, or any portion thereof, of any such person during the term of his or her imprisonment, and in the case of such a person having dependants the amount forfeited during the term of his or her imprisonment may be paid to such dependants.

48. No compensation shall be payable to the dependants of a mine worker unless at the date when the mine worker was prohibited or notified, and also within the twelve months immediately preceding such date, the said dependants were in fact wholly or in part dependent upon the earnings of the said prohibited or notified mine worker.

49. In the event of the death of the father and the mother of any dependent infant child, payment of any benefit to which such child is entitled under the Act, may be made to any suitable person or institution willing to take charge of and maintain such child, as may from time to time be approved in writing by the Minister; and the receipt or acknowledgment in writing given by such person or institution for and in respect of any payment made under the provisions of this regulation shall be sufficient discharge to the Crown as against the child on whose account such payment has been made.

50. Application for compensation by a prohibited or notified mine worker, or the dependant of such mine worker, shall be in the Form "Z2" or "Z3" in the First Schedule hereto respectively.

51. In the case of partial dependants, such weekly sum shall be paid as may be approved by the Minister.

52. The Board shall cause full and true accounts to be kept, showing—

- (a) the investments of the fund;
- (b) all sums received by or due to the fund from any source;
- (c) all amounts paid out by the Board; and
- (d) all ascertained liabilities of the fund.

53. The Board shall cause the books and accounts of the fund to be balanced every year up to the last day of January in such year, and a balance sheet to be made up showing as at that date the assets of the fund (including the investments) and the existing and accruing liabilities thereof.

54. An annual report containing the balance sheet (signed by the chairman and secretary of the Board), financial statements showing the income and expenditure in connection with the administration of the fund, and such further information as the Board may deem necessary shall be submitted to the Minister.

55. The balance sheets, together with the accounts of the Board aforesaid, shall be audited by the Auditor General. The report of the Auditor General upon such accounts and balance sheet, together with the annual report aforesaid, shall be laid upon the Tables of both Houses of Parliament by the Minister within fourteen days after receipt thereof by him, if Parliament is then in session or, if Parliament is not then in session, within seven days after the commencement of its next ensuing session.

56. Except where otherwise provided any notice under the provisions of the Act or these Regulations required or authorised to be given to any person may be served:—

- (a) by delivering same to such person; or
- (b) by leaving the same at his usual or last known place of abode or business; or
- (c) by forwarding the same by post in a prepaid letter addressed to such person at his usual or last known place of abode or business.

57. Any person who neglects or refuses to observe and comply with, or otherwise commits a breach of any of these Regulations, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and shall on conviction be liable, except where otherwise provided, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

50 to 60 years of age—20s. per week until re-marriage and 5s. per week for each child under the age of 16 years.

60 years and upwards—10s. per week and 5s. per week for each child under the age of 16 years.

The maximum benefits in any case shall not exceed £2 5s. per week.
