THE TIMBER INDUSTRY REGULATION ACT, 1926, AND THE REGULATIONS THEREUNDER.

Election of Workmen's Inspector.

(One position with a salary of £1 13s. 0d. per week above the basic wage, for a period not exceeding two years.)

Nomination of Candidates.

1. Nominations of Candidates for election as Workmen's Inspector (one position) under the abovementioned Act are hereby invited, and Thursday, 5th September, 1935, at noon, are hereby appointed to be the day, date, and time up to which such nominations are receivable by the undersigned at the State Chief Electoral Office, Hay Street, Perth.

2. Every nomination shall be made in writing, in the Form No. 5 in the Appendix to the Regulations, addressed to the undersigned as Returning Officer, signed by at least six persons bona fide employed in the Timber Industry, and shall contain the written consent of the candidate to act, if elected, and shall be forwarded so as to reach the Returning Officer before noon on Nomination Day. Each nomination must be accompanied by testimonials or other evidence in support of the Candidate's eligibility, and such nomination must be indorsed as prescribed on the back thereof with a Statutory Declaration signed by the Candidate declaring his names in full, occupation, place of residence, age, place and date of birth, nationality, the nature and extent of his experience in the Timber Industry, and that he is in good health and physically fit for the position. Only natural-born or naturalised British subjects who have been engaged in general practical bush and mill work in the industry will be eligible for nomination and appointment, if elected.

Forms of Nomination and of Statutory Declaration are obtainable from the Controlling Officer, Forests Department, Perth; from the Secretary of the West Australian Sawmilling and Sleeper Cutters' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, and of the South West District Council of the A.L.P., Collie, and at all Timber Mills and Police Stations in the Districts concerned, or from the undersigned.

By-laws for the Regulation and Licensing of Hawkers. P.W. 5857/21.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act; and whereas the Kulin District Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:

1. In the construction of these By-laws, subject to the context:—"Board" shall mean the Kulin District Road Board.

2. No person shall hawk any fruit, fish, vegetables, or any article of merchandise within any part of the Board's District, without having first obtained a license from the Board.

3. Any person who trades or travels on foot, or with any vehicle or animal, or carries to sell, or expose or offer for sale, within the Board's District, any of the articles or things abovementioned, shall be deemed to hawk same.

Provided that nothing contained in this section shall apply to any person or persons paying rates, or liable to pay rates, for any shop or store carrying on the usual business, trade, and delivery trade, or delivery of goods therefrom.

4. A Hawker's License shall be in the Form No. 3 in Schedule A attached hereto.
5. The fees to be paid for licenses issued to hawkers shall be as set forth in Schedule B attached hereto.
6. Every application for a Hawker's License shall be wrede during the currency of the financial year in

be made during the currency of the financial year in which the license is to have effect; and every such license shall have effect for and during that year, or

the unexpired portion thereof, and no longer. 7. Every hawker, whilst employed in hawking, must produce his license upon being required to do so by any police officer or officer of the Board.

8. Every hawker shall rigidly affix to some conspicu-ous part of his cart, barrow, or other vehicle, or basket, and at all times maintain thereon, a board or plate bearing his name and the words "Licensed Hawker" legibly written thereon in letters not less than one inch in height and of corresponding breadth.

n height and of corresponding breadth.
9. No person to whom a Hawker's License shall have been granted shall lend, transfer, or assign his license, and no person shall borrow or make use of such license granted to a person other than himself.
10. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such conviction. £10 for every such conviction.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:--

1.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the area comprised in the South-West Land Division of the State of Western Australia, except the area occupied by Binney & Son at Welshpool, in or in connection with the business in which they are engaged.

2.—Term.

This Award shall operate for a period of three (3) years from its date: Provided that after the expiration of the first twelve (12) months from this date and after the expiration of any subsequent period of twelve (12) months application may be made to the Court by any party to the Award for a review of any of the provisions of this Award.

3.-Wages.

(The wages hereunder mentioned are expressed in weekly amounts, but the employment is under a contract of daily hiring and service, except as to the occupations specifically mentioned in Clause 11.) No junior worker less than seventeen (17) years of age shall be employed in wheeling bags of superphosphate or other similar material up an inclined ramp or board. No boy of less than eighteen (18) years of age shall be employed on night shift.

Casual Workers.

Any worker employed for less than six (6) consecutive days shall be entitled to two shillings (2s.) per day in addition to the ordinary rates prescribed for the particular class of work in which he is employed.

4.—General Conditions.

(a) Men employed in grinding sand for sulphur burners shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate prescribed herein whilst so employed.
(b) Men employed working on scaffold twelve (12) feet or more from the ground shall be allowed one shilling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate herein whilst

ling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate herein whilst so employed.

(c) Men employed stacking bales of bags two (2) tiers high or over shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate herein whilst so employed, but where mechanical means are employed for lifting this allowance shall not apply unless, in the opinion of a Board of Reference, the extra exertion is still required.

(d) Men employed lifting or carrying bags of nitrate of soda shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate herein whilst so employed.

(e) Men employed handling ground limestone shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate herein.

(f) Men employed working with tar, or using mexphalt, shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate herein whilst so employed.

(g) Men employed cleaning the septic tank shall be paid an allowance of five shillings (5s.) per day or part thereof over the minimum rate herein.

(h) Men employed mixing concrete shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate herein,

(i) Men employed as splicers or riggers shall receive two shillings (2s.) per day over the minimum rate herein.

(j) Men using explosives shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate herein.

(k) Hammer and gadmen shall be paid two shillings (2s.) per day over the minimum rate herein.

(1) Rubber gloves shall be provided for men who work in or about acid plants.

(m) Four (4) men shall be engaged in acid chambers. The fourth man for the time being may be employed at any other work in the industry, at the appropriate rate of wages attached thereto, as fixed in the Schedule. Each man shall have one Sunday off in four (4).

(n) Loaders-out and baggers shall be provided with leather aprons.

(0) Men working on shifts, other than men working continuous shifts, shall be paid sixpence (6d.) per shift extra whilst so working. This allowance shall not apply to workers employed solely on day shift.

(p) Work done in the meal time, or any portion there-of shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half, but this shall not apply to cases involving completion of work commenced before such meal time, and not occupying more than fifteen (15) minutes from the commencement thereof, in which case the meal time will be extended by such period beyond the ordinary time.

(q) The hours of shiftmen shall include twenty (20) minutes for crib, but the time so occupied shall be taken at such a time, when possible, as to avoid a stoppage of work.

(r) Dust glasses or goggles shall, where necessary, be supplied to workers.

5.---Mixed Functions.

Men working on a higher grade of work than that on which they are usually employed shall be paid at such higher rate for the time they are so employed. The worker relieving the watchman shall work the same hours as the watchman whilst so relieving.

6.—Hours.

(a) Day Workers: Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked as follows, namely, eight (8) hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and four (4) hours on Saturdays: Provided, however, that be worked in five (5) days of eight (8) hours fortyeight (48) minutes each.

(b) Shift Workers: The ordinary hours of shift workers, inclusive of crib time, shall not exceed:---

(i) Forty-four (44) hours in one (1) week; or

(ii) Eighty-eight (88) hours in two (2) weeks at the option of the employer, to be worked in rotary shifts not exceeding eight (8) hours each day.

(c) Continuous process may be worked, and shifts shall rotate weekly so that as far as practicable all workers shall have a fair share of day shifts.

(d) Where a worker is called on to work a quick shift he shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter for such quick shift.

"A quick shift" shall mean a shift where a worker is brought on to work a full shift before having had at least eight (8) hours off.

(e) Watchman's Hours: Watchman's hours shall not exceed fifty-six (56) per week, but he shall be allowed one day off for each four (4) weeks without deduction of pay.

(f) The provisions of this and the following clause (Clauses 6 and 7) shall take effect from the first pay day in August, until which time the corresponding existing provisions shall apply.

7.—Overtime.

(a) Overtime shall be paid for work done before the recognised time for starting work and after the recog-nised time for ceasing work in each factory.

Each day shall be reckoned by itself.

This subclause shall not apply to men working on shifts.

Overtime for work done by workers (other than those on continuous shifts) on any day other than specified holidays or Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(b) Overtime for work done by men working on continuous shifts shall be paid for at the rate of double time (i.e., time in addition to ordinary time) for all time worked in excess of eight (8) hours in any one day of twenty-four (24) hours, except so far as the excess is owing to arrangements between the workers themselves, or is necessary for effecting periodical rotation of shifts, or is owing to the relieving man not coming on duty and relieving at the appointed time, in which latter case the overtime rate shall be paid when the period exceeds one hour.

Limitation of Overtime: Overtime shall be limited to sixteen (16) hours in any one week, unless the overtime is necessitated through a breakdown in plant.

Differentiation in rates of overtime: Overtime shall be paid at the rate prescribed above for the first twelve (12) hours, but all overtime worked over twelve (12)hours in any week shall be paid at the rate of double time.

Call Back: When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.

8.-Holidays.

(a) Continuous Shiftmen and Watchmen:

(i) Shiftmen working on roasters, burners or chambers or other acid plants, and also watchmen shall be granted a holiday of twelve (12) working days on full pay on completion of each year of service. A shiftman or watchman who does not complete one year of service shall be entitled to one day's pay in lieu of holidays for every month of service. These holidays shall be taken at a time mutually convenient. Failing agreement, the holidays shall be taken at a time suitable to the convenience of the employer, between the 10th day of September and the 10th day of the January following.

(ii) All work done on specified holidays except Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day by shiftmen on continuous shift and by watchmen shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(iii) All work done on Christmas Day, Good Friday, or Labour Day, by shiftmen and watchmen as aforesaid shall be paid for at the rate of treble time.

(iv) All work done on Sundays by shiftmen shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half. This provision does not apply to watchmen.

(v) "Specified Holidays" shall mean New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Dav. King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(b) Other Workers:

(i) Twelve (12) days' holiday on full pay shall be granted to each worker upon completion of twelve (12) months' service, of which nine (9) days shall be taken consecutively, at a time mutually convenient. Failing agreement, the holidays shall be taken at a time suitable to the convenience of the employer, between the 10th day of September and the 10th day of the January following. The other three (3) days shall be Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day. If Christmas Day falls on a Sunday the following Monday shall be given in lieu thereof.

(ii) A worker who does not complete one year's service shall be entitled to one day's pay in lieu of holidays for every month of service in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment.

(iii) All work done on any of the specified holidays (except Christmas Day, Good Friday, or Labour Day) and on Sundays, shall be paid for at the rate of double time. This provision does not apply to watchmen.

(iv) Any work done on Christmas Day, Good Friday, or Labour Day shall be paid for at the rate of treble time.

(v) If no work is done on any other of the specified holidays (subclause (a) (v) hereof), the worker shall not be entitled to pay therefor.

(c) Holidays without deduction of pay shall be limited to twelve (12) days per annum as aforesaid.

(d) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence for any cause whatsoever.

(e) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct shall lose all rights under the Holiday Clause.

9.-No Discrimination,

No employer shall, in the employment or dismissal of his workers, discriminate in any way against the members of the Union, nor shall they, in the conduct of their business, do anything with a view to directly or indirectly injuring the Union.

10 .--- Under Rate Workers.

A worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn' the minimum rate of wages herein prescribed may be employed at a lower rate, which shall be agreed upon in writing ' between the worker and the secretary of the Union. If within seven (7) days after being notified in writing of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wages than the prescribed rate, the said secretary and worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing to the Resident or Police Magistrate within whose Magisterial District the proposed employment will take place to fix such lower rate of wages. The worker shall give such secretary two (2) days' notice in writing of his intention to apply to the Magistrate, and the said secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The Magistrate may fix the rate of wages, and his decision shall be final. Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by any employer within the district to which this Award applies for such lower wage for the period of six (6) calendar months thereafter and, after the expiration of the said period, until fourteen (14) days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the secretary of the Union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause.

11.—Contract of Service.

The contract of hiring of every worker, except juniors, watchmen, despatch clerks, tally clerks, and storemen shall be deemed to be a contract of hiring by the day.

12.-Time and Wages Book.

Each employer shall keep or cause to be kept at his usual place of business, or at each of them if more than one, a book containing a record of the names of all workers employed by him at the particular factory, the class of work performed by each worker, the wages paid to each such worker, the starting and finishing time on each day, and the amount of overtime, if any. Such book shall be open to inspection by the secretary, or such person as may be appointed by the union, on any day during working hours.

13.-Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent, except such stoppage is due to shortage of railway trucks.

14.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

(a) Junior workers, upon being engaged, shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:---

(i) Name in full;

(ii) Age and date of birth.

(b) The certificate shall be signed by the worker.

(c) No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional wages in the event of his age being wrongly stated on this certificate, nor shall the employer in such case be deemed guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of the award founded upon an age limitation, except in the case of collusion.

(d) If any junior worker shall wilfully mis-state his age in the above certificate he shall be guilty of a breach of this Award.
