## FARMERS' DEBIS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1.934," which reads as follows :-

# PUBLIC SERVICE RECLASSIFICATION 

(To date from 1st January, 1936.)

FIRST SECTION-CLERICAL DIVISION.<br>Junior Officers and Officers in the Automatic Range.

The following scales of salary and conditions of appointment and promotion affecting officers of the Clerical Division of the Public Service employed in the Junior range and in the Automatic range, with provision for adjustment in accordance with fluctuations in the basic wage, are published under Section 12 of the Public Service Appeal Board Act, 1920, as preliminary to and part of the general reclassification of the Service to date from 1st January, 1936.

1. This classification relates to all officers now or hereafter in the Clerical Division who are-
(a) Junior officers, i.e., officers under 21 years of age;
(b) Adult officers, i.e., officers 21 years of age and over who are classified as officers to whom the antomatic scale (set out in this classification) applies.
2. (a) Jumior officers are divided into three classes, namely-
(1) Junior Clerks (males).
(2) Junior Typists (females).
(3) Junior Machinists (females).
3. (b) Adult officers in the automatic range are divided into three classes, namely-
(1) Adult males.
(2) Adult Typists (females).
(3) Adult Machinists (females).

## (a) JUNIORS.

The minimum rates of pay of Junior officers classified in the Junior range in the Clerical Division shall be as follows:-
(1)—Junior Clerks (Males).

Where, however, the applicant holds what is, in the opinion of the Commissioner, an equal or higher: University qualification, or satisfies the Commissioner that he las had suitable office experience in addition to the Junior Certificate, he may be appointed at a salary to be fixed by the Commissioner within the limits of the above scale.

No person shall be eligible for entry into this class unless she is the holder of the Junior Certificate of the University of Western Australia, inchding a pass in shorthand and typewriting. Where, however, the applicant holds what is, in the opinion of the Commissioner, an equal or higher University qualification, or satisfies the Commissioner that she has had suitable office experience in addition to the Junior Certificate, she may be appointed at a salary to be fixed by the Commissioner within the limits of the above scale.

> (3)—Junior Machinists (Females).

The scale of salaries for Junior Typists applies also to machinists who have qualified by obtaining the Junior Certificate of the University of Western Australia, including a pass in bookkeeping and typewriting, and who can produce a certificate of efficiency in machining (adding and calculating) from a school recognised by the Commissioner. The rate of salary to be paid to those not qualified as above who have been or may be appointed shall be one grade lower than the scale applicable to those with the qualification. Officers so qualified will be given preference for promotion to the Senior range as against officers who are not so qualified, where efficiency is equal.

## (b) -ADULT OFFICERS. <br> (1)-Adult Males.

The rates of pay of adult male officers classified in what is known as the Automatic range shall be as follows:-

> Age on promotion from
> the Junior Range.

with a married man's allowance, equivalent to the next higher rate than the salary according to age, with a maximum of $£ 270$.

If a male officer is retained on the maximum salary of the Automatic range for five years, and the Permanent Head certifies that such officer is eligible and would be recommended for promotion on the grounds of efficiency and good conduct, he may be paid, on the approval of the Commissioner, an allowance of $£ 10$ per annum, which will cease on his promotion to a higher position.

> (2)-Adult Typists (Females).


The increase from $£ 180$ to $£ 190$ is subject to passing an examination in shorthand and typewriting ( 120 words and 50 words per minute respectively). Officers in receipt of $£ 190$ on 1st January, 1936, will not be required to take this examination.

A female officer shall not be employed on clerical work classified beyond $£ 190$ per annum without the approval of the Commissioner. Female officers already so employed on the permanent staff may be retained. When such positions become vacant they will be filled by male officers.

In the event of a female officer being promoted to a position carrying a salary above $£ 190$ and not exceeding $£ 230$, increases from $£ 190$ shall be at the rate of $£ 10$ per annum. If promoted to positions exceeding $£ 230$, increases above that sum shall be on the scale for male officers.
(3)—Adult Machivists (Females).

The salaries paid to machinists on promotion to the senior range after passing the promotional examination in tabulating and summarising, bookkeeping and typewriting, in addition to a practical test in ledger posting, shall be those paid to adult typists. The increase from $£ 180$ to $£ 190$ is subject to passing an examination in bookkeeping, calculating and ledger posting machines. Officers in receipt of $£ 190$ on 1st January, 1936, will not be required to take this examination.

## GENERAL.

All appointments, increments, and promotions are subject to the Public Service Regulations.

The salary to be paid to persons appointed from outside the Service or from the temporary staff to positions above the Junior range shall be that fixed by the Public Service Commissioner in each case.

## BASIC WAGE.

The rates of pay of male officers throughout the State are calculated on an adult male basic wage of $£ 310 \mathrm{~s}$. 6 d . per week, or $£ 184$ per annum in the Metropolitan Area. This rate has been taken to the nearest multiple of $£ 5$, thus providing an adult male minimum rate of $£ 185$ per aunum.

The rates of pay of female officers throughout the State are based on an adult female minimum rate equal to 75 per cent. (to the nearest multiple of £5) of the adult male minimum rate of $£ 185$ per annum.

The adult male minimum rate and all adult male rates above 8185 per annum shall be subject to adjustment at a rate of $£ 5$ per annum for every variation of 1s. 11d. per week from the current male basic wage rate of $£ 3$ 10s. 6d. per week in the Metropolitan Area.

The adult female minimum rate and all female rates above $£ 140$ per annum shall be subject to an adjustment of 75 per cent. (to the nearest £1) of any adjustment applicable to the adult male minimum rate of $£ 185$ per annum.

The rates of pay of junior male and junior female officers shall be varied pro rata with the adult male minimum rate of $£ 185$ per annum.

Officers who are located in areas where the male basic wage as declared by the State Arbitration Court is higher than the male basic wage for the Metropolitan Area shall be entitled to receive the difference by way of a basic wage allowance. Such basic wage allowance shall be equal to the adjustment which would be made to the salary scale if the higher basic wage rate had application to the Metropolitan Area.

For the purpose of this memorandum the Treasury method of adjustment of salaries and allowances to meet variations in male basic wage declarations of the State Arbitration Court is printed as an appendix to this classification.

## APPENDIX.

Treasury method of Adjustment of Salary rates and basic wage allowances to basic wage variations.

1. Adjustments are to be made in the following manner:-
(a) In the case of adult male officers or male officers in receipt of a saliury of $£ 185$ or more per annum, each adjustment will be at the rate of $£ 5$ per annum or a multiple of $£ 5$ as shown in the scale hereunder.
(b). In the case of adult female officers or female officers in receipt of a salary of $£ 140$ or more per annum, each adjustment will be equal to 75 per cent. (to the nearest $£ 1$ ) of the adjustment applicable to male officers in receipt of a salary of $£ 185$ or more per annum, as shown in the scale hereunder.
(e) In the case of male officers receiving less than $£ 185$ per annum, and female officers receiving less than $£ 140$ per annum, each adjustment will be in the same proportion as their salary rates are to the adult male minimum salary rate.
2. The scale referved to in paragraph 1, subparagraphs (a) and (b), is:-

3. As the classifications of all officers throughout the State are assessed on the basic wage applicable to the Metropolitan Area, those officers who are located in areas where the male basic wage rate is higher than the male basic wage declared by the State Arbitration Court for the Metropolitan Area shall be entitled to receive the difference between the two rates by way of a basic wage allowance. Such basic wage allowance shall be equal to the amount of the annual salary increment that would be payable to officers located in the Metropolitan Area if the higher basic wage rate had application to them.
E.G., the basic wage for the Goldfields Area at present is $£ 44 \mathrm{~s}$. 4 d . per week. Such a rate for the Metropolitan Area would entitle a male officer to an increase in salary of $£ 35$ per amm, the basic wage allowance payable to Goldfields officers is, therefore, $£ 35$ per annum for males and $£ 26$ for females. The anounts payable to Junior male and female officers would be calculated on a pro rata basis.
4. No difference between the basic wage of the Metropolitan Area and the basic wage of any other area will be adjusted by way of a basic wage allowance, unless the amount to be adjusted according to the scale set out herein is at the rate of $£ 5$ per annum or multiple of $£ 5$ per annum for an adult male officer.
5. If the basic wage rate for an area is reduced below the basic wage rate for the Metropolitan Area, salary rates will not be altered to adjust the difference.
