THE ADMINISTRATION ACT, 1903-1934.

Regulations Relating to Estate and Succession Duties.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Estate and Succession Duties Regulations, 1935.
2. With every application for a grant of probate or letters of administration, an affidavit shall be sworn setting forth the particulars and value of the estate of the deceased person, according to the Form No. 1 in the Schedule hereto, and shall be lodged at the Probate Office, Supreme Court, Perth. A similar form shall be used for the purpose of Section 66 of the Act.
3. The said affidavit, after the grant has been made, shall be forthwith forwarded by the Master of the Court to the Commissioner of Stamps for the purpose of having the estate duty assessed on the estate referred to in such affidavit.
4. The Commissioner may require the production of all books, papers, vouchers, and other documents in the custody or power of the person to whom the grant is made, for the purpose of vouching for the correctness of the facts stated in the affidavit and of affording the Commissioner any further information he may require relating to the estate concerned.
5. On payment of the duty assessed by the Commissioner, the Commissioner shall indorse on the grant or attach to the grant a certificate in accordance with Form No. 2 in the Schedule.
6. The trustee or any person interested under any settlement shall within the time prescribed under Section 81 of the Act, after the death of any person in respect of whose death the interest of any such person arises under the settlement, file with the Commissioner a statement in the Form No. 3 in the Schedule within one calendar month of such interest arising, together with the original settlement, or a properly authenticated copy thereof, where the Commissioner is satisfied that the same cannot be produced by reason of the same having been filed or registered in some other jurisdiction, together with an additional copy of each settlement for filing.
7. The statement to be filed by persons becoming beneficially entitled to any property charged with duty under Section 88 of the Act, or by any trustee, guardian, or committee in whom the property is vested, shall be in accordance with Form No. 4 in the Schedule, and shall contain such other particulars as the Commissioner may require in the particular circumstances of the case.
8. The Commissioner may require the production of any books, vouchers, letters, and documents and other particulars for the purpose of vouching for the correctness of the facts stated in any statement required to be filed under the provisions of the preceding Regulations Nos. 6 and 7.
9. Where any person succeeds to an annuity or life interest, such person shall disclose his age, and shall, if required by the Commissioner, verify his age by production of a certificate of birth or other satisfactory evidence.
10. The return required to be furnished by life assurance companies or societies under the provisions of Section 117 of the Act shall be in accordance with Form No. 5 in the Schedule.
11. The return which is required to be furnished by foreign companies under the provisions of Subsection (2) of Section 111 of the Act, shall be in accordance with Form No. 6 in the Schedule.
12. If the death of a member of any such company is not known to the company within six months after the date of the death, or within sufficient time to permit of the return required by Section 111 to be furnished by the company within such period, the return shall be furnished by the company and the duty paid within thirty days after any evidence of the death has been notified to or lodged with the company, or within such further time as the Commissioner may have allowed upon application being made to him.
13. The Commissioner shall not be bound to accept any undertaking for the payment of duty, and may require the whole of the duty payable to be paid before a certificate is issued to the Master as required by Subsection (2) of Section 69 of the Act.
14. The Commissioner may cause to be made on any

 15. Every person guilty of a breach of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934," which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.

## THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-33.

## Amendment of By-laws.

M.H.D. 144/22; Ex. Co. 2081.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-33," a Local Health Authority may make By-laws, and may amend, repeal, or alter any By-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Buckland Hill Road Board, being a Local Health Authority, doth hereby amend its By-laws, as follows:—

## By-law 21.

After the word "domestic" in the third line insert the words "or trade."

Insert the following clauses:—

Whenever it is intended to carry out any work in connection with the construction or laying of any drains, or any plumbing work in connection with the disposal of liquid refuse on any premises, the owner of such premises or his agent shall make application in writing to the Local Authority for permission to do so. Such application shall be accompanied by a block plan and a specification in duplicate, drawn to a scale of not less than one-eighth of an inch to one foot. Such plan shall show—

- (a) the position of the drains in relation to adjacent buildings;
- (b) the situation and designation of the various fittings, disconnecting, traps and vents;
- (c) the ultimate disposal of the liquid refuse, whether by soak well or impervious receptacle.

When the work in connection with such drains and plumbing is complete and ready for inspection, the owner of the premises shall forthwith notify the Local Authority in writing. Upon receipt of such notice the Local Authority shall, as soon as practicable, arrange for the inspection of such drains and plumbing work. Until such inspection has been made, all drains, connections, etc., shall remain exposed. If the work has been carried out in accordance with these By-laws, and with the plans and specifications approved of, the Local Authority shall issue to the owner a "Certificate of Completion" to utilise such drainage and plumbing. No drainage, plumbing work, or fittings in connection therewith shall be used until such certificate has been issued.

## By-law 23.

Delete the whole of paragraph (a) in Clause (1) and add to Clauses (1) and (2) the following words:— "The work to be carried out in accordance with and as provided for in paragraphs (c) and (d) of By-law 23."

Delete Subclause (1), Clause (c), and substitute in lieu thereof the following:—

All waste pipes from lavatory basins, sinks, baths and laundry troughs shall be of galvanised wrought



iron; provided that, where the fitting is of porcelain or stoneware, lead pipes shall be used from the fitting to a point on the outer wall, where it shall be connected to a galvanised wrought iron pipe by a screwed connection, and continued by wrought iron to discharge in the open air over a gully trap or "P" trap on the line of drainage.

All waste pipes from sinks, baths, lavatory basins, and laundry troughs shall be properly trapped and vented; provided that, where the length of the waste pipes from lavatory basins, baths, and laundry troughs does not exceed 10 feet in length, or the seal of the trap is not reduced by the discharge from the fitting, and where laundry troughs are in open sheds detached from a house, the vent may be omitted.

Waste pipes shall be of the best quality, and of the weights and dimensions specified in Schedule A attached hereto.

Where lead pipes are used they shall be of solid drawn lead, supported by lugs wiped on the pipe in pairs; such lugs shall be not more than three feet apart for 1½-inch pipes, and 2 feet 3 inches apart for 2-inch pipes. The dimensions of the lugs shall be 4 inches by ½ inch thick for 2-inch pipes and 3 inches by ¼ inch thick for 1½-inch pipes.

All joints of lead pipes shall be of the kind known as "wiped joints."

All junctions, tees, and bends on wrought iron waste pipes shall be of brass or malleable wrought iron, provided with inspection openings. The wrought iron pipe, where connecting with these fittings, shall form a smooth butt joint against the internal shoulder of the fitting.

Junctions, tees, and bends fitted on vent pipes may have the inspection opening omitted.

Sinks, baths, laundry troughs, and lavatory basins shall be so fitted to be graded with a fall to the outlet so that when the plug is out no water will remain in the fitting.

The traps in each case shall be placed as near the outlet from the fitting as possible.

The grade of all waste pipes shall be as steep as circumstances will permit, but in no case shall they be less than 1 in 15 for a 2-inch pipe and 1 in 10 for 1½-inch pipes.

Wrought iron waste and vent pipes shall be rigidly secured to the walls with wrought iron pipe hooks or saddles spaced not more than 6 feet apart.

Sinks, laundry troughs, and drainage boards shall be flashed with 5lb. lead, when required, by an inspector.

Vent pipes installed inside of a house shall be of lead or galvanised iron. When on the outside of the wall, they shall be of galvanised wrought iron to a point 18 inches above the highest fitting, the balance of which may be of galvanised iron not less than 24-gauge.

Delete Subclause (1), paragraph (d), and substitute the following in lieu thereof:—

From the gully trap or "P" trap mentioned in paragraph (c), liquid wastes shall be conducted to the soak well or impervious sump, by means of a drain constructed with glazed earthenware pipes not less than 4 inches in diameter, laid with a uniform fall of 1 in 40; all joints to be made with cement mortar composed of two parts of clean sharp sand to one part cement, properly cleaned off and smoothed internally.

Drains shall, as far as practicable, be laid in straight lines. Where a change of direction is necessary, it shall be effected by the use of oblique junctions or bends; an inspection opening shall be provided giving access to each line.

An educt vent of the same diameter as the drain to be vented shall be provided at the head of the line of drain, and an induct vent at the lower end; any portion of the vent pipes below the surface of the ground shall be of cast iron or glazed earthenware.

All materials and fittings used in connection with any waste water disposal shall be of the size, quality, and pattern as required by the Regulations of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Department.

Galvanised iron vent pipes of less thickness than 24 gauge shall not be fitted; all joints shall be thoroughly air-tight. The first six feet of the vent pipe above the ground surface shall be of cast iron or 18-gauge galvanised iron; the pipes shall be painted on the inside with asphaltum or other approved composition paints.

Vent pipes shall be supported by wrought iron galvanised clips fastened to plugs, in brick, stone, or concrete walls, and by approved screws to wood buildings. There shall be one clip to each six feet of the pipe, and the top clip shall in all cases be bolted through or into the wall.

The pipes shall be carried up vertically to a point not less than two feet above the eaves of the building, or to such higher level as may be required by the Inspector.

The inlet to any yard, gully or "P" trap shall be raised to such a height above the surface of the ground as may be determined by the Inspector, as will prevent the ingress of surface water into the drainage system.

No person shall permit any rain water pipe to be connected to or discharged into any drainage system provided for disposal of liquid wastes or sewage, unless approved in writing by an inspector.

Grease intercepting traps of approved design shall be provided at all premises when directed by an inspector.

The owner and occupier of every house shall cause all openings for ventilation or other purposes made in accordance with these By-laws to be kept at all times perfectly free from obstruction, and shall at all times keep all openings to the drains upon the premises, whether for ventilation or otherwise, and all traps and other fittings in good order and free from obstruction.

#### BY-LAWS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE CARBUNUP PUBLIC CEMETERY.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and amending Acts, of the By-laws as set out hereunder, for the Caribunup Public Cemetery, Reserve No. 19380.

#### PUBLIC CEMETERY, CARBUNUP.

By-laws.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Caribunup, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the

application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the secretary.

6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate, bearing the name of the deceased, stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this By-law shall be admitted to or interred in the Cemetery.

7. Every grave shall be at least 6 feet deep at the first interment, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3 feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

8. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

9. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

10. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.; 1st May to 31st August—week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m., and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour, except by written permission of the Trustees.

11. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

12. No hearse, mourning coach or other vehicle shall enter the Cemetery, or proceed, except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

13. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

14. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the Cemetery or to discharge any fireworks therein.

15. No dogs shall be allowed within the Cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the Cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

17. No person shall promote, or advertise or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

18. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.

19. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees in writing, specifying the locations of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

20. Subject to the By-laws the secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.

21. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the prescribed "Form" in the Schedule.

22. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the prescribed "Form" in the Schedule.

23. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for Right of Burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

24. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

25. If application be made for an "Order for Right of Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

26. Should the grantee be unable to produce the "Grant of Right of Burial" on making application for a grave to be reopened for the purpose of interment, through having lost same, the said grantee shall make a sworn declaration to this effect, and shall pay the fee for a copy of such "Grant of Right of Burial," as prescribed in Schedule A, before an "Order for Burial" will be issued by the Trustees.

27. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

28. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

29. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

30. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing same.

31. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws is not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

32. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all materials required by the tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

33. No catacomb shall be allowed.

34. Every grave, vault, monument, tombstone, kerbing, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the grantee. Should the grantee's residence not be known, or be out of the State, the Trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the grantee.

35. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave, except such as shall be approved by the Trustees.

36. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workmen permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees, commit an offence against these By-laws.

37. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

- (a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed;
- (b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees;
- (c) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees;
- (d) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

38. Prior to the conducting of any interment within the Cemetery, or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the Trustees an annual fee of £3, and shall, at the time of making such payment, give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit," to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July following, and, unless in the possession of such a "Permit," no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

39. The Trustees may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantees so to do. If the grantees do not desire the Trustees to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Trustees for that purpose.

40. Any person committing any breach of these By-laws and Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations or By-laws, lawfully made under authority of any Act relating to Cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and, in the case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall forthwith be removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees, the secretary or other officer of the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly.

41. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation, and number of grave, and a Register of all Certificates of "Right of Burial" shall be kept at the Office.

*Additional By-laws.*

42. Notwithstanding anything contained in the existing By-laws to the contrary, permission may be granted to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth to erect headstones on the graves of deceased soldiers, without payment of any fee.

43. Free ground may be granted, if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Trustees:—

- (a) That the deceased was a returned soldier, and that he died as a result of injuries or disease received in the late war;
- (b) and that the relatives of the deceased are in necessitous circumstances; provided that such "Grant" shall be made subject to the condition that only the remains of deceased soldiers shall be interred in the grave.

## INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

Metropolitan Weekly Newspapers.

Journalists' Agreement.

(Registered 23-10-35.)

No. 18 of 1935.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-25," this Fourth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, between "The Western Press, Limited," proprietors of the newspapers "The Sunday Times" and "The Mirror," of the one part, and the Metropolitan Journalists' Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia, a Union registered under the said Act, of the other part: Whereby it is agreed that the following rates and conditions shall govern employment with respect to the said newspapers:—

This Agreement shall operate over an area comprised within a radius of fifteen miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

This Agreement shall come into force on and be operative as from the First day of September, 1935, and shall continue in operation until the 31st day of August, 1937, and thereafter until a new Agreement is entered into between the parties.

## 1.—Minimum Rates of Pay.

The minimum weekly rates of pay shall be as follows, and shall not be affected by any increase or decrease in the basic wage as declared by the Court of Arbitration so that the total rates of pay hereinafter shall not be altered in any way during the currency of this Agreement.

Basic wage:—Males, £3 10s. 6d.; females, £1 18s. 1d.

## 2.—Cadets.

(a) An employee who is constantly or regularly in training for journalism, or who substantially performs the work of one in training for journalism, and has not had three years' experience in journalism, shall, for the purpose of this Award, be termed a cadet, and shall become a member of the Australian Journalists' Association within two months of his appointment, unless he makes a statutory declaration to the effect that he has conscientious objections to doing so.

(b) The services of a cadet shall be regarded as continuous, notwithstanding that he may have been employed on more than one newspaper during his period of cadetship.

(c) Except with the consent in writing of the Association, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, not more than one cadet shall be employed to every five members of the employer's staff.

(d) The rates of pay for cadets shall be as follows:—

(e) The period of cadetship shall not exceed three years: Provided, however, that after the completion of this period of cadetship, should there be no vacancy on the classified staff to which he could be appointed, a cadet may, with the consent of the Australian Journalists' Association, continue in such employment at the rate provided for a third-year cadet until such time as a vacancy for a junior occurs under the percentage grading prescribed in this Award within a period consented to by the Association. In the event of his services being terminated by his employer without just cause in law during such period, or should the Association refuse to consent to a further period, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, the cadet shall receive the difference between the third-year cadet rate and the rate for a junior journalist, from the time of completion of his third-year cadetship until the date of termination of his services. If the cadet leaves his employment of his own accord during or after such periods no such extra payment shall be made.

(f) No person shall commence his cadetship unless he has a knowledge of English equivalent to the standard of the Intermediate or Junior examination at any Australian University.

(g) A cadet shall be fully and thoroughly taught and instructed by his employer in the profession of journalism.

Such instruction shall include:—

- (1) Instruction as to the alterations, emendations, and corrections of copy, and especially the copy he supplies;
- (2) Provision to accompany at suitable times, as opportunity occurs, for practical instruction and experience, members of the classified staff when they are employed on various forms of journalistic work.

(h) Each cadet shall be permitted by his employer to absent himself during ordinary working hours for periods not exceeding a total of four hours in any one week, for the purpose of attending shorthand and type-writing classes, University or other lectures, or classes in literature, economics, civics, history, logic, and other subjects covered in the course of any Diploma of Journalism granted by any Australian University.

(i) All lecture and other fees, and the requisite books for such studies, shall be provided by the employer.

### 3.—Casual Journalists.

(a) A casual journalist shall be one who may be employed on the ordinary routine work of the Literary Staff for not more than seven (7) days in any period of one month, except when he is engaged to replace a permanent journalist absent on sick, holiday, or other emergency leave.

(b) Casual journalists shall only be engaged and paid as follows:—

(c) Casual journalists employed for supplying sporting results only on Saturday afternoons shall be paid lineage rates, or a minimum sum of seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.), for the afternoon.

### 4.—Contributors.

Writers who contribute matter for publication, but who are not on the classified staff, and who do not usually act as general members of the staff, and who are not otherwise provided for, and contributors generally, shall be paid at the following rates:—

For articles (except leading), paragraphs, reports, etc.—2d. per line.  
For leading articles or verse—2½d. per line.

### 5.—Correspondents.

District correspondents regularly employed as such shall be paid at least the rates prescribed for junior journalists.

### 6.—Classification of Journalists.

(a) Journalists, with the undermentioned exceptions, shall be classified as follows:—Senior journalists; general journalists; junior journalists.

(b) Classified journalists shall be classified in the following proportions:—Three-fifths of the Staff shall be seniors, not more than one-fifth shall be juniors, and the rest shall be generals. Where the calculation of the percentage results in a fraction, such fraction if over point five, shall be reckoned to the higher integer, and, if point five or less, to the lower integer.

(c) The exceptions to the classifications mentioned in this clause shall be:—

1. Editors in chief, casuals, cadets, district and country correspondents, contributors and journalists employed outside the Commonwealth.
2. "Contributors" in this subclause means a person who is not employed as a member of the general staff, or to act as if he were a member of the general staff (and who is not a district or suburban or country correspondent as hereinafter defined), but who in and at his own time prepares matter to be submitted to his employers for acceptance or rejection at the employer's option.

### 7.—Hours of Employment.

(a) The ordinary working hours for journalists shall not exceed forty-six hours.

(b) There shall be two clear days (one of which may be Sunday) off in each week.

(c) Subject to the next succeeding subclause the period between the time of entering on duty, as hereinafter defined, and the time signed off as the time of completion, shall be reckoned as actual time worked, except such time as is usually occupied in meal time.

(d) After the expiration of a period of eleven hours in any one day from the time of entering on duty, as hereinafter defined, all time until the time signed off as the time of completion shall be reckoned as overtime and either allowed off or paid for as hereinafter provided.

(e) When the weekly maximum number of hours is exceeded in any week, time to the amount of the excess shall be deducted from the forty-four hours to be worked during the next succeeding week.

(f) The time due as arrears shall be allowed off continuously: Provided that, by agreement between the employer and the journalist, the time off may be taken in periods of not less than half a day each.

(g) Notice of time off shall, as far as possible, be given before 5 p.m. on the preceding day.

(h) If the time off is not allowed in the next succeeding week, it shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-half.

### 8.—Time Book.

(a) A Time Book, in a form to be agreed upon by the parties, shall be provided by the employer and kept on the premises. It shall, among other things, provide for the entries hereinafter mentioned.

(b) Except on country engagements, the working day of a journalist shall commence at the time of his entering on duty.

(c) "Entering on duty" means:—

1. arrival at the office for the first time in the day for the purpose of performing duty; or
2. beginning to perform the first engagement, whichever is the earlier, a reasonable time being allowed in the latter case to cover the period required to reach the engagement from home.

(d) Except as otherwise provided, all journalists shall make the following entries in the Time Book: each of them shall personally, on entering on duty, or as soon thereafter as circumstances reasonably permit, sign on in the Time Book and write therein the time of entering upon duty as above defined. He shall also, on completing his work for the day, or as soon thereafter as circumstances reasonably permit, sign off, stating the time of completion.

(e) Entries so made, if not disputed within twenty-four hours, shall be taken to be correct.

(f) The Time Book shall be open for inspection during office hours by (1) every member of the staff, (2) by the Secretary of the Metropolitan Journalists' Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia, or a member of the said Union authorised in writing to inspect it.

## 9.—Country Engagements.

On country engagements, time on duty shall be reckoned as follows:—

(a) If the engagement is confined to one day, the whole time during which the journalist is absent from the city.

(b) If the engagement or engagements extend beyond one day, five-twelfths of the time the journalist is absent from the city.

## 10.—Expenses.

(a) All employees embraced in this Agreement shall be paid reasonable out of pocket expenses incurred while on duty.

(b) If a member's duty compels him to take more than one meal a day away from his home, such meal or meals in excess of one a day shall be paid for by the employer.

(c) Women members employed upon work requiring attendance in evening dress shall be provided with reasonable vehicular facilities.

## 11.—Holiday Leave.

(a) All journalists regularly employed on salaries, and district correspondents fully employed as such, shall receive three consecutive weeks' holiday after forty-nine (49) weeks' service on full pay irrespective of sick leave: Provided that, in any year in which the member concerned travels to any point east of Adelaide, the holiday leave shall be four consecutive weeks on full pay, irrespective of sick leave.

(b) If a journalist is not employed for a full year, then a proportional part of the annual leave shall be granted.

(c) The term "full pay" in this clause relating to district correspondents shall be taken to mean pay at the same rate as that of a junior journalist.

(d) Members of the classified staff shall have a clear day off on full pay on Christmas Day and on Good Friday, or, in lieu thereof, on the day before or after each of these days. This shall be in addition to the ordinary weekly two days off.

## 12.—Sick and Incapacity Pay.

(a) All members regularly employed on salary, and also all district correspondents solely employed, shall, in every year of their employment be paid weekly whilst absent through illness or bona fide incapacity (upon production of a medical certificate, if required), at not less than the following scale:—

1. For every two months or part of two months he has been employed up to six months, he shall be paid the first week at full pay, the second week at half pay, and the third week at quarter pay;
2. After he has been employed six months, he shall be paid for the first four weeks at full pay, the second four weeks at half pay, and the third four weeks at quarter pay;
3. After he has been employed five years, he shall be paid the first two months at full pay, the second two months at half pay, and the third two months at quarter pay.

(b) In the case of district correspondents, "full pay" in this clause means £5 5s. a week.

(c) Where any other provision has been made for the case of an employee's illness, either alone or in conjunction with any other contingency, that provision shall be substituted in whole or in part, and either generally as to all employees, or as to any individual case, in the place of the provision for sick pay made by this clause, if there be obtained the written consent of the Union and of the Company, and the certificate of the Registrar that in his opinion the substituted provision is as beneficial to the member of the Union as the provisions hereby made.

(d) If in any particular case the Company is required by law to make any payment or compensation to the journalist who is ill, then, to the extent of such payment or compensation actually made, the provision in this Award for sick pay, or in any substituted provision, shall abate.

(e) For the purpose of this division, the period or periods absent in twelve months shall be regarded as cumulative, and not as applying to separate illnesses and/or incapacity that may occur during the course of the twelve months.

## 13.—Relieving.

Any journalist or cadet temporarily taking the place of another of higher grade shall, while doing so, be paid at the higher rate: Provided that this does not apply to holidays or sick leave where the absent journalist or cadet is paid by the employer.

## 14.—Termination of Employment.

Termination of employment of journalists who have been in the employ of the Company for two months or more shall be subject to four weeks' notice: Provided that, in the case of sub-editors, the period shall be four months, and, in the case of seniors, two months, but in cases where a journalist has been guilty of misconduct or refusal of duty, the Company shall be entitled to dismiss such journalist immediately.

## 15.—Salaries and Conditions to Continue.

Any journalist who, prior to this Agreement coming into force, was in possession of status and conditions of employment better than those prescribed herein, shall not have such status or conditions reduced or abrogated in any way.

## 16.—Names to be Furnished.

(a) The names of all journalists employed by the Company, together with a statement as to the grade in which they are employed, shall be entered and, when necessary, added to or corrected by or on behalf of the Company in a book to be kept by the Company for the purpose.

(b) A copy of such entries shall, on application in writing by the Secretary of the Metropolitan Journalists' Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia, at any time be furnished by the Company to any member of the said Union authorised in writing to receive it.

## 17.—Preference.

It shall be a condition of the employment of any new member of the classified staff or any district correspondent that he shall either be a member of the Association or become one within a period of three months from the commencement of such employment, unless he make a statutory declaration to the effect that he has conscientious objections to doing so. The Association shall not refuse admittance to its membership of anyone applying for same under this clause. A member of the Association in employment before this Award, shall remain a member unless he make a statutory declaration of conscientious objections, or leaves the profession.

The making of a statutory declaration of conscientious objections by a member who is in arrears with his financial obligations to the Association shall not exempt him from his obligation to remain a member.

## 18.—Male and Female Employees.

All provisions of this Agreement shall apply equally to male and female employees.
