IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 15 of 1935.

Between Collie District Deputies' Union of Workers, Applicant, and Amalgamated Collieries of W.A., Limited, and Griffin Coal Mining Company, Limited, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

AWARD.

1.—Definition.

For the purpose of this Award the term "Deputy" shall mean a person in charge of a section or district in a mine, a person in charge of men or boys on any special operations such as haulage, or a person in charge of special work such as development or special maintenance.

1A.-Term.

The currency of this Award shall be for a period of three years from the date hereof.

1B.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the South-West Land Division of the State of Western Australia.

2.—Duties

The duties of a deputy shall be to observe the lawful directions given to him by the manager and to have regard at all times to the interests of the employer. The employer shall at all times endeavour to avoid the work of deputies encroaching on that of members of other Unions, but this shall not be deemed in any way to restrict the deputy from performing any class of work in an emergency or from performing any class of work to complete his shift, when the purpose for which he was called on has been completed.

3 .- Directions of Working Places.

Where the deputy is responsible for the direction of working places, the employer shall keep sight pins within a distance of one hundred and fifty (150) links of the working face, but where such sight pins are not within a distance of one hundred and fifty (150) links from the working face, the deputy shall nevertheless take all precautions in the directions of such working place.

4.-Hours of Work

The hours of employment shall be seven (7) hours bank to bank. Should a deputy be required to commence his shift at any time within the hours of 6 p.m. and 6 a.m., he shall be regarded as working night shift and compensated for accordingly for the whole shift.

5.-Rates of Pay.

(a) The rate of pay to deputies employed under this Award is based upon the basic wage now current, namely, at the weekly rate of ± 3 11s. 2d., being a minimum of eleven shillings and tenpence (11s. 10d.) per shift, with a margin of seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per shift above this rate added thereto, making a total of nineteen shillings and fourpence (19s. 4d.) per shift of seven (7) hours.

(b) Deputies employed on afternoon or midnight shift shall be paid the following additional amount per shift:—For afternoon shift, 6d.; for midnight shift, 1s.

(c) Deputies holding a St. John's First-aid Certificate shall be paid threepence (3d.) per day in addition to their ordinary rate.

(d) If a deputy is compelled to work in water, or if water drips on him in sufficient quantity to inconvenience him in his work, he shall be paid one shilling and ninepence (1s 9d.) per shift extra. Should any dispute arise hereunder, it shall be referred to the Board of Reference for decision.

6.-Afternoon and Night Shift.

Where it is necessary to work deputies on day, afternoon, and night shift, such day, afternoon, and night shift shall be taken in rotation by the deputies engaged at the particular mine, except in cases where a deputy is engaged for a particular purpose and in cases where the uature of the work performed renders it impossible for the manager to arrange for the shifts to be taken in rotation.

7.—Reduction of Hands.

In the event of a reduction of hands in a mine, the last deputy employed shall be the first to be dismissed, but this provision shall not apply if it is necessary to discharge a deputy for gross misconduct or refusal to obey lawful orders. If a deputy has been taken from some other class of work to perform the duties of a deputy, his length of service for the purpose of determining seniority shall be deemed to date from the last time he signed on at the mine during his current period of employment.

8.—Incapacitated Workers.

In the event of a deputy being so incapacitated by accident, illness, or old age as to be unable to adequately perform his duties, be may be allowed to perform any work which the manager may be able to provide for him, and his rate of pay shall be fixed by mutual agreement between the manager, the Union, and himself. In the event of agreement on the rate of pay not being arrived at, the matter shall be referred for settlement under Clause 17 hereof.

9.—Light.

The employer shall supply all underground deputies with sufficient carbide to provide them with artificial light on each shift they work. The deputy shall provide his own lamp, but where a second lamp is required for the purpose of putting up sights, it shall be supplied by the Company. (a) Overtime shall only be worked when it is absolutely necessary. For all time worked in excess of that prescribed by Clause 4 hereof, the following rates shall apply:-

During the first hour:-Ordinary time.

- During the next four (4) hours:—At the rate of time and a half.
- For all time beyond the twelfth hour, or on Sundays and holidays as defined in Clause 11 hereof:— Double ordinary time.

(b) A deputy who is called upon to work on Sundays or holidays shall be paid a minimum of three (3) hours' work.

(c) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to deputies required to work on actually necessitous occasions caused by loss of human life.

(d) In the case of outbreak of fire, time and a quarter shall be paid after the first hour.

11.-Holidays.

(a) The following days shall be considered as holidays without pay:—New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Foundation Day (26th January).

(b) Each deputy shall be entitled to twelve (12) days annual leave each year on full pay: Provided always, that such holiday shall be taken at a time to suit the mutual convenience of the employer and the deputy, or be arranged between the employer and the Union.

12.—Pay Saturday.

The general custom of observing Pay Saturday as a holiday shall be the rule under this Award: Provided always, that the deputy shall, if required by the manager, work on that day. In the case of an underground deputy working on Pay Saturday, five (5) hours bank to bank shall be deemed to be equivalent to the full shift, and shall be paid for accordingly, and, in the case of a surface deputy, five and a half $(5\frac{1}{2})$ hours shall be equivalent to and be paid for as a full shift.

13.-Absence from Work on Union Business.

Should it be necessary for an official of the Union to be absent from work on Union business, the manager shall grant him leave of absence, but it shall be encumbent upon such official to give the manager as much notice as possible of his intended absence.

14.—Deductions from Wages.

The employer may deduct from the deputy's wages the amounts agreed upon on account of contributions for medical benefits, contributions to the Accident Relief Fund and Aged and Infirm Coal Miners' Superannuation Fund, and any other contribution agreed to by both parties.

15.—Higher and Lower Duties.

In the event of a deputy being called upon to work temporarily in any one day in a lower grade of work, he shall suffer no reduction in his wages, but if a deputy is permanently transferred from his work as a deputy during the emrency of the pay fortnight, he shall be paid the rate for the class of work to which he is transferred from the date of such transference.

16.-Members of Union.

All persons engaged by the employer as deputies shall make application to become members of the Union within three (3) months of their engagement, and the Union shall accept them as members, provided they are persons of good character and tender the entrance fees and subscriptions in accordance with the Rules of the Union.

17.-Board of Reference.

In the event of any dispute arising in relation to any matter under this Award, failing a settlement between the manager and the Union, either party may refer the dispute to a Board of Reference consisting of the mine manager, representing the employer, and the Secretary of the Union, with the Inspector of Mines as chairman: Provided always, that the Board of Reference shall not have power to alter or amend any portion of this Award, nor to impose any new conditions, nor shall this provision take away the right of either party to apply to the Court for an interpretation or enforcement of the Award or any part thereof. There shall be no cessation of work pending a settlement of the dispute. Should either party be dissatisfied with the decision of the Board of Reference, they may appeal within seven (7) days to the Court of Arbitration against such decision.

18.—Time Book.

There shall be provided for each deputy a Time Book, in which he shall enter the actual time at which he started his shift and the actual time he completed his shift. This Time Book may be entered and completed by the deputy during his working hours and subsequently handed in at the Mine Office.

Clause 1.—Term:—

Strike out the clause and insert in lieu thereof :——('The currency of this Award shall be three years from the 18th November, 1935.''

Part II .- Traffic Section.

Clause 3.—Hours of Duty:-

Subclause (a):

"A week's work shall consist of forty-four hours, to be completed in six days, spread over seven days, commencing Sunday to the following Sunday at 12.45 a.m." Subclause (c):---

"Eighty per cent. of the motormen and conductors shall be given as nearly as practicable seven hours twenty minutes' work in a spread of ten hours, and the remaining twenty per cent. eight hours' work in a spread of twelve hours."

Clause 5.—Call Back:—

Strike out the clause and insert in lieu thereof:-"When a shift is divided into three portions, the third shall be termed a 'call back,' and for such portion a minimum of two hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a curver, except on Sandays and the holidays specified in Clause 31, when the rate shall be as therein laid down; 'call backs' not to be included in the week's work of forty-four hours. When called upon during the performance of shift to do a 'call back' a meal allowance of 1s. 6d. shall be given: Provided that the interval between time of finishing shift and commencing time of 'call back' is less than one and a half hours.''

Clause 6 .- Sunday Time and Overtime :-

Strike out Subclauses (a), (b), (c), (e), (f) and (g) and insert in lieu thereof: -

Subclause (a):

"The time worked on Sunday up to a maximum of 9 hours shall be included in the week's work of 44 hours, but the extra time prescribed for Sunday time shall stand alone...and be paid for in addition to the week's earnings."

Subclause (b):

"All time other than call backs worked after the spread of ten hours, and within the 12 hours by the 80 per cent. division, shall count as overtime, and be paid for at time and a quarter, with a minimum of two hours; such time not to be included in the week's work. All time worked in excess of 9 hours per day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter."

Subclause (c):

"When any portion of a rostered shift is extended without previous notification, such extension will be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter, with a minimum of one hour, and the time will not be included in the forty-four hours' week's work. This subclause not to apply when the extension is occasioned through accident."
