PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, { By His Excellency Sir James Mitchelt, TO WIT. { K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and JAMES MITCHELL, Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

F. & S. 635/28.

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," that the expression "Public Holiday" shall mean certain days therein specified, and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a Public Holiday for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that Wednesday, the 12th day of February, 1936, shall be a Public Holiday throughout the Bunbury Shop District, for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be observed as a Public Holiday under every part of the said Act in which the expression occurs.
