1. On the 24th day of January, 1936, the Clerk of the Writs issued Writs for the Election of one Member of the Legislative Assembly for each Electoral District within the State of Western Australia and the following dates were appointed for the purpose of such Election:-

- 2. For taking the Poll in case of the Election being contested, Saturday, the 15th day of February, 1936;

An Election for the District of East Perth was held on the 15th day of February, 1936, in pursuance of the said Writ, at which Election your Petitioner and the three persons mentioned in paragraph 3 hereof were the candidates for the District of East Perth, and after the polling at such Election the said Thomas John Hughes was declared by the Returning Officer to have been elected, and the Returning Officer by indorsement under his hand certified on the original Writ that the said Thomas John Hughes was the candidate elected for the said District of East Perth, and the said Writ was returned to the Clerk of the Writs on the 20th day of February, 1936.

5. On the 14th day of January, 1936, the said Thomas John Hughes was adjudicated bankrupt under "The Commonwealth Bankruptcy Act, 1924-1933," by the Court of Bankruptcy, Western Australian District, and thereafter until the 25th day of February, 1936, he was an undischarged bankrupt. (a) Any of the uses permitted in a residential area.(b) The following:—

1. Theatre, hall, club, or place of amusement.

- 2. Office, bank or hotel.
- 3. Fire station, police station, post office or public building.
- 4. Shops, salesroom or showroom for the conduct of retail or wholesale business.
- 5. Workrooms connected with retail business in which not more than 50 per cent. of the total floor area is devoted to workrooms.
- 6. Garage or petrol-selling or service station.
- 7. Such other accessories as the authority might determine, but shall not include any industry, trade, or manufactory.

RESIDENTIAL AREAS.

(a) All lots or land within the Road Board District not included in the Industrial or Shopping Areas may be used for residential purposes.

Provided not more than one dwelling is erected on an area of 6,000 square feet or under. THE EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1895.

Department of Mines, Perth, 1st March, 1936.

IN accordance with Section 30 of "The Explosives Act, 1895," the Hon. Minister for Mines has been pleased to make the following By-laws, to come into operation as from the 1st day of March, 1936.

Schedule. EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1895. (Section 30.) BY-LAWS.

Conveyance of Gunpowder and other Explosives.

1. (1) No gunpowder or any other explosive, in quantities greater than 100 lbs., shall be conveyed in quantities greater than 100 10s. shall be conveyed in any carriage other than a carriage which has been ap-proved by an Inspector of *Explosives and unless and until a permit authorising the conveyance of such gun-powder or other explosive has been issued by an In-spector of Explosives.

(2) Such permit shall specify the maximum quantity of gunpowder or other explosive to be conveyed in any one carriage, and the route to be traversed by such car-riage, and shall contain such other special conditions as the Inspector of Explosives issuing the same may

consider necessary. 2. No gunpowder or other explosive shall be conveyed in any carriage, while such carriage is being used for the conveyance of passengers.

3. Carriages being used for the conveyance of gunpowder or other explosive shall not traverse any route used by tramways.

4. Save and except under a special permit issued by an Inspector of Explosives authorising the same, no other article or chattel shall be conveyed in a carriage whilst the same is being used for the conveyance of gunpowder or other explosives.

5. In addition to gunpowder, only those explosives which by regulations made and in force under "The Explosives Act, 1895," are permitted to be stored together shall be conveyed in the same carriage at the same time.

6. Gunpowder and other explosives shall not be conveyed in a carriage within the boundaries of any Municipality or Townsite except during the day between sunrise and sunset.

7. No person in charge of a carriage in which gunpowder or other explosive is being conveyed shall smoke or commit any other act liable to cause fire or explosion, and every such person shall take every reasonable precaution to prevent other persons upon or near the carriage in which gunpowder or other explosive is being conveyed from smoking or committing acts liable to cause fire or explosion.

8. Every person who commits or attempts to commit any breach of the foregoing by-laws shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws, and shall be liable, on a conviction summarily by Justices sitting in Petty Sessions, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to an additional penalty of Ten pounds for each day or part of a day during which such offence continues, and shall be liable also to forfeiture of all or any part of the gunpowder or other explosive in respect of which the breach of these by-laws has been committed.

9. In the foregoing by-laws the term "explosive" shall have the same meaning as that given to the said term in Section 4 of "The Explosives Act, 1895," and the term "carriage" shall have the same meaning as that given to the said term in Section 6 of the said Act.

10. The foregoing by-laws shall apply in all cases where rules, regulations, or by-laws relating to conveyance of gunpowder or other explosives and made under Sections 26, 27, 28, or 29 of "The Explosives Act, 1895," do not apply.

MINE WORKERS' RELIEF ACT, 1932. (Section 13, Subsection (1).)
