PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," that the expression "public holidays" shall mean certain days therein specified and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a public holiday for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation made the Sixth day of March, 1936, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the Sixth day of March, 1936, Thursday, the Twelfth day of March, 1936, was declared to be a public holiday in the Bunbury Shop District for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be observed as a public holiday under every part of the said Act in which the expression occurs: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the said Proclamation shall be varied and that Thursday, the

Twelfth day of March, 1936, shall be a public holiday for the purposes of the said Act in the Bunbury District after the hour of one o'clock after noon: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and acting under the powers of the said Act and every other power me in this behalf enabling, do hereby proclaim that Thursday, the Twelfth day of March, 1936, after the hour of one o'clock after noon shall be a public holiday in the Bunbury Shop District for the purposes of the said Act, and also that the said Proclamation made and published in the *Government Gazette* on the Sixth day of March, 1936, is hereby varied to the extent to which it is inconsistent herewith.
