FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934," which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.

By adding before the word "whenever" in By-law 23.1 (g) the words:—"The owner and occupier of every house shall cause all openings for ventilation or other purposes to be kept at all times free from obstruction, and shall at all times maintain all openings to drains, traps, and all other fittings in good order and repair.'

By adding a new paragraph, to be known as By-law 23 (h)-

When in the opinion of the health inspector the situation is not suitable for the disposal of liquid refuse by the methods detailed in paragraphs 1 refuse by the methods detailed in paragraphs 1 and 2, such liquid refuse shall be disposed of by dis-charging into a French drain, which shall comply with the following conditions:—

(aa) It shall be constructed of agricultural drain pipes of not less than 4in. diameter laid in a straight line with open joints and completely surrounded with not less than 6-inch of broken blue metal of not less than 3-inch gauge, or other approved material.

- (b) The dimensions of the trench in which the drain is laid shall be determined by an inspector.
- (c) The provisions of By-law 23, paragraph 1, subparagraphs (a), (c), and (e) shall also apply.

Hanging beams for all spans of rooms over eight feet, of not less than 6 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ jarrah.

Rafters-4 x 2 jarrah, at not more than 36 inch centres, securely tied with at least 3 x 11/2 collar ties.

Hips, ridges, and valleys of at least 7 x 1 jarrah. All sheeting externally of wooden structures to be of jarrah boarding, galvanised iron, plain or corrugated asbestos or of similar material. Internal walls of jarrah boarding, galvanised iron, plain or fluted, laid perpendicularly, asbestos sheeting or sheeting of similar nature, or lath and

Height of walls from floor to ceiling to be not less than 10 feet 6 inches in the clear. Alternately, 3 x 2 timbers may be used for studs

and ceiling joists provided centres are not more than 1ft. 9in. apart.

A new clause numbered 54 (a) as follows is added to By-law No. 17:

54 (a) Brick, stone, or concrete walls may be insisted on or required, should the Council be of opinion that such brick, stone, or concrete walls were necessary to preserve, maintain, or improve the general appearance of the street or locality.
