FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934. NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsec-tion 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934," which reads as follows:---

- "Hall" means and includes any hall, room, lounge, corridor, stairway, stage, entrance, yard, or land situated within the boundaries of the Townsite Lot or Reserve upon which any hall vested in the Board shall be erected. "Caretaker" means the caretaker of the hall duly
- appointed by the Board.

Application for the hire of the hall or any room or furniture shall be made in writing to the secretary not less than twenty-four hours before the time that such hall or any room or furniture is required, and shall state the time and purpose for which the hall, room, or furniture is required.

3. The name and place of abode of the actual and responsible person or persons hiring the hall or any room or furniture shall be given in the application for the hire of the hall, room, or furniture.

4. The application for the hire of any furniture or crockery-ware shall state the precise locality to which the said furniture is to be removed, and the Board, when granting the use of any furniture or crockery-ware may fix the date and hour when such furniture and crockeryware shall be returned to the hall.

When any furniture or crockery-ware has not been returned to the hall at the stated date and hour, then the Board may forthwith have the furniture and/or

crockery-ware returned at the hirer's expense. 5. The rent of the hall or any room or furniture or crockery-ware shall be paid with each application, and the fees and hire charges shall be set out by the Board from time to time, and shall be exhibited on the notice board at the building.

6. The Board at any time may demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of engagement.

7. Any person or persons having hired the hall or any room or furniture shall give up possession promptly at the time agreed upon, and shall leave the hall or any room clean and fit for other occupation, and the furni-ture in good condition and in its normal position.

8. The Board reserves the right to refuse to hire the hall or any room or furniture to any applicant for the hire of the same, without assigning any reason for such refusal.

9. The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of the hall or any room or furniture.

Casual hands employed for less than one week to receive 1s. per day above the rates specified for such work.

Men working with tar, bitumen, colas or other roadmaking compounds to receive 1s. 2d. per day above the ordinary rate paid to them as dirt money.

Rubbishmen driving a motor truck and picking up rubbish to be paid 1s. 2d. per day over the rate paid as rubbishmen.

Attendance on horses.—Men having to feed and attend their own horse, 1s. per day extra.

2.-Hours of Labour.

(a) Generally:—The hours for all employees shall not exceed forty-four (44) hours per week, divided as follows:—On Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays. Thursdays, and Fridays work shall commence at 7.30 a.m. and continue with one hour intermission for dinner until 4.30 p.m.

Saturdays—Work shall commence at 7.30 a.m. and continue until 11.30 a.m.; provided always, and it is hereby agreed, that such division may be re-arranged by mutual consent by both parties.

(b) All the employees of the Sanitary Department shall start work at the time arranged by the sanitary manager as most suitable to meet from time to time the exigencies of the several services; provided such work shall not start before 5 a.m. and shall continue for eight hours, with either one hour or half an hour intermission for dinner, as may be mutually arranged between the sanitary manager and the employees, and shall finish not later than 4.30 p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Saturdays—Four hours shall be worked continuously between 5 a.m. and 12 noon.

It is specially agreed that from April 1st to October 1st starting time shall be varied for work not to start before 6 a.m.

Other employees shall start work, where directed, at 7.30 a.m. and continue, with one hour intermission for dinner, until 4.30 a.m., on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Saturdays—Work shall commence at 7.30 a.m. and continue until 11.30 a.m.

3.—Overtime.

All time worked in excess of the hours stated herein, each day's work to stand by itself, shall be considered as overtime, and shall be paid for at the following rates:—For the first two (2) hours after the ordinary time for ceasing work, time and a quarter; after the first two (2) hours and up to four (4) hours, time and a half; after the first four (4) hours, and until the ordinary time for re-commencing work, double time.

Any employee called back to work after leaving the job at the completion of the hours set out herein, after a lapse of a period of one hour or longer, shall be paid at double time rates for all time worked until the ordinary time for recommencing work.

All time worked on Sundays shall be paid for at double time rates.

Sunday, for the purpose of this clause, shall be from midnight Saturday to midnight Sunday.

Overtime rates shall not apply to watchmen, foremen, assistant gardeners, or stablemen.

4.—Holidays, Public.

Every employee, except stablemen, shall be allowed the following holidays on full pay:--Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Labour Day, and Kalgoorlie Cup Day; employees compelled to work on such days shall be paid double time rates, except stablemen.

5.—Sick Pay.

Twelve (12) days' sick pay on half rates on account of sickness shall be granted to all employees. A doctor's certificate to be produced on each occasion a man is off sick; sick pay shall not be granted for more than twelve (12) days in the aggregate in any one year.

6.—Aprons.

Two aprons per year to be provided for the use of the drivers and stagemen in the Sanitary Department if required.

7.—Overalls.

Men employed on the sprinkler to be provided with overalls.

8.—Oilers.

Men having to work in the rain to be provided with oilers.

9.-Mixed Functions.

Any employee using tradesmen's tools and doing the work of tradesmen shall be paid the ruling rate in the District for the class of work on which he is employed, and, in the case of an employee taking the place of a higher paid employee, or doing work classed at a higher rate of wage, he shall be paid the higher rate of wage. If employed at the higher rate for two (2) or more hours, he shall be paid the higher rate for the whole of that shift that shift.

This clause shall not apply to any workmen who may be employed in white-washing or effecting rough carpentry repairs or small painting jobs.

10.-Services not Required.

In the event of an employee turning up to work at the usual starting time and finding his services are not required, he shall be paid for two (2) hours at the ruling rate, unless he has been previously notified that his services would not be required.

11.-Order of Emplyoyment.

In the event of a full complement of men not being required, men shall be employed in rotation. This clause only to apply when it is not the intention of the employer to permanently shorten hands.

12.—Contracts let by the Council.

In all contracts let by the Council for work to be performed, the rates of pay and conditions of work as set out in this Agreement shall be embodied in the conditions of contract.

13.—Annual Holidays.

Every employee shall, in addition to Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Labour Day, aud Kal-goorlic Cup Day, be allowed a fortnight's holiday, in-cluding 12 working days on full pay once in each year; such holidays shall not be allowed to accumulate. Casual hands in the employ of the Council for three months continuously shall be entitled to any of the holidays (public) which may fall due within that period.

14.-Notification of Leave.

Notification of annual leave shall be given to em-ployees entitled thereto, at least seven (7) days before the commencement of such leave.

15.-Annual Leave, Mixed Functions.

Any employee who has been engaged on mixed functions during the year, when their annual leave falls due, shall be paid for such leave at a rate computed on the average weekly earnings of such employee for the

twelve months preceding such leave. Employees working for less than twelve months shall be allowed one day's holiday on full pay for each month employed; provided that, should the employment be terminated before the end of a month, he shall be paid a proportionate amount as holiday pay for such portion of month worked. For the purpose of this clause 26 days to be calculated a month.

16.—Preference to Unionists.

All men becoming employees of the Council shall become members of the Eastern Goldfields Municipal and Roads Board Labourers' Union of Workers within three weeks of commencing work; this clause not to apply to men employed on relief or emergency works.

17 .- First Aid Outfit.

The Council shall at depots and stables provide a reasonable First Aid Outfit for the use of employees, and shall from time to time keep same renewed and in proper order.

18 .- Full Payment for Shift.

After beginning a shift workers shall not be paid for less than a full shift, unless they leave of their own accord, or dismissed for misconduct.

19.-Inspection of Time and Pay Sheets.

A duly accredited official of the Union shall be allowed to collect Union fees at the Pay Office, and shall be allowed to inspect the time and pay sheets relating to any worker affected by this Agreement, and make extracts therefrom.

20 .- Working Plods.

All employees shall fill out a working plod, showing the different jobs he has been employed on during the day, and the hours occupied on each particular job, and rate of pay appertaining to same. The employer shall provide the plods free of charge

to the employee.

21.-Rights and Privileges.

Any employee who may be at the date of the signing of this Agreement in receipt of a higher rate of pay for his particular class of work than is herein prescribed or in receipt of any privilege or allowance other than herein provided, shall not suffer by reason of this Agreement any reduction in the amount which such employee was receiving above the rate prescribed in this Agreement, or loss of any privilege or allowance.

22.-Minimum Wage.

The minimum wage shall be ninety-nine shillings per week of forty-four hours.

23.-Week's Work.

On Mondays to Fridays inclusive eight hours, excluding lunch hour, and Saturdays four hours, excluding lunch hour, shall comprise the week's work

24.-Interpretation Clauses.

For the purpose of this Agreement the terms used shall be interpreted or defined as follows:

Spreaders-A spreader is one who is engaged spreading metal or other material on new works, or works being reconstructed or men engaged levelling or spread-ing after the scarifier, but shall include horse-drivers or motor-drivers spreading his own load or doing patching work.

Men cleaning septic tanks-to mean men engaged cleaning out septic tanks and soak wells, not merely pumping effluent from wells or other receptacles.

Rubbishmen driving motor truck, 1s. 2d. a day extra, to mean men one who performs the double duty of driv-ing a truck and picking up rubbish, not a man merely driving.

Rubbishmen means one who collects rubbish which has been deposited by householders in boxes or other uten-sils, also rubbish thrown in the streets, or in any right of way, but does not drive the truck.

Stablemen means one who works in the stables, grooming horses, cleaning harness, cleaning stables, and mix-ing horses' feed.

Concreters means one who under the instructions of the supervisor of works or foreman, carries out the doing of any concrete work.

Casual hand means one who is employed by the Council for less than one week.

25.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall come into force on the 13th day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and shall remain in force for the period of one year thence next ensuing, and thereafter subject to the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," and shall apply to all works and undertakings carried out by the said employer in the Municipality of Kolegarities. of Kalgoorlie.
