WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from—(a) taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture; (b) taking any fish whatsoever by any specified means of capture; (c) taking any fish whatsoever by any means of capture whatsoever, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time, in any specified year, or during a specified portion of any year: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers

aforsaid and of any other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing lines as from the 20th day of July, 1936, until the 31st day of October, 1936, inclusive.

Gordon River (near Tambellup):—The whole.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: And whereas it is desirable to vary Proclamations under the said Section of the said Act dated the 14th day of November, 1934, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 16th November, 1934, and dated the 17th day of December, 1934, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 21st December, 1934, respectively, in regard to certain Western Australian waters described therein being closed against the use of fishing nets: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby vary the said Proclamations by declaring that it shall be lawful to use fishing nets of legal length and size of

mesh in the waters described in the Schedule hereto from the 1st day of July, 1936, until the 31st day of October, 1936, inclusive.

Schedule.

(a) Princess Royal Harbour (Albany):—All that area of Western Australian waters on the northern side of Princess Royal Harbour, Albany, north of a line drawn from Residency Point to the southern extremity of the Town Jetty; thence to the southern extremity of the Deep Water Jetty; and thence north-easterly to Point King.

(b) (12):—All that area of the southern portion of the waters of Oyster Harbour (Albany) and the waters of the Channel Entrance to Oyster Harbour from King George's Sound bounded by the following lines:—On the south by a line drawn in an easterly direction from a point on the foreshore ten (10) chains south of Emu Point to the opposite foreshore; on the north by a line drawn in a north-easterly direction from a peg on the foreshore marked 14 (about 440 yards westward of Emu Point) to the southern extremity of Green Island; and thence by a line drawn in an east-south-easterly direction from the southern extremity of the said Green Island to a point on the southern foreshore of Oyster Harbour 115 chains eastward of the eastern point of entrance to Oyster Harbour.
