Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1935.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, | By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, | K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia lieutenant-Governor. | Lis.]

WHEREAS by "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1935," it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation—(a) revoke any Proclamation made under the said Act; (b) prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with Regulations, the bringing into any specified portion of the State from any other specified portion thereof of any specified kind of plant, fruit, or other thing which would in his opinion be likely to introduce any diseasint the first-mentioned portion thereof: And whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient to revoke the Proc-

lamation hereinafter mentioned and made under the said Act: And whereas, in the opinion of the said Lieutenant-Governor in Council the bringing (contrary to any prohibition hereinafter contained) of the fruits hereinafter mentioned into those portions of the State into which their introduction is hereinafter prohibited, from any part or parts of the State hereinafter specified would be likely to introduce disease, namely, Fruit Fly: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation—

- (1) Revoke the Proclamation made under the said Act and dated the 7th day of September, 1921;
- (2) Subject as in this paragraph hereinafter provided prohibit absolutely the bringing into those portions of the State described in the Second and Third Schedules hereto of loquats, apricots, peaches, plums, nectarines, figs, pears, quinces plantains, pomegranates, guavas, tacsonias, persimmons and citrus fruits (other than lemons) from that portion of the State described in the First Schedule hereto:

Provided that any of the fruits aforesaid intended to be taken from a place within that portion of the State described in the said First Schedule to another place situated within the State but outside those portions of the State described in the Second and Third Schedules hereto may be carried through that portion of the State described in the said Second Schedule in the course of transit to the place of destination, if the most convenient route for the transport of such fruit from the place of loading to the place of destination lies through such last-mentioned portion of the State;

(3) Subject as in this paragraph hereinafter provided, prohibit the bringing into those portions of the State described in the Second and Third Schedules hereto of apples, lemons, grapes, tomatoes, pineapples, and passiflora fruits from that portion of the State described in the First Schedule hereto, except in accordance with and subject to the relative regulations for the time being in force;

Provided that-

- (a) the bringing of any of the said fruits into that portion of the State described in the Third Schedule hereto permitted under the exception aforesaid shall be subject to the prohibition declared in paragraph (4) hereof; and
- (b) any of the fruits aforesaid intended to be taken from a place within that portion of the State described in the First Schedule to another place situated within the State but outside those portions of the State described in the Second and Third Schedules hereto may be carried through that portion of the State described in the said Second Schedule in the course of transit to the place of destination, if the most convenient route for the transport of such fruit from the place of loading to the place of destination lies through such last-mentioned portion of the State;
- (4) Subject as in this paragraph hereinafter provided, and notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in paragraph (3) hereof, prohibit absolutely the bringing into that portion of the State described in the Third Sche dule hereto between the thirtieth day of November and the first day of May next following in any yearly period of loquats, apricots, peaches, plums, nectarines, figs, pears, quinces, plantains, pomegranates, guavas, tacsonias, persimmons and citrus fruits (other than lemons) from any portion of the State other than that portion of this State described in the Third Schedule hereto, and also prohibit the bringing into that portion of the State described in the Third Schedule hereto between the dates aforesaid of apples, lemons, grapes, tomatoes, pineapples, and passifiora fruits from any portion of the State described in the Third Schedule hereto:

Provided that this paragraph shall not operate so as to prohibit the bringing into that portion of the State described in the Third Schedule hereto of apples, lemons, grapes, tomatoes, pineapples, and passiflora fruits brought from any part of the State and citrus fruits (other than lemons) brought from that part of the State described in the Second Schedule hereto, between the dates aforesaid, which have been certified by a departmental inspector to be free from fruit fly, and which are so brought in in accordance with the relative regulations for the time being in force.

(5) Subject as hereinafter in this paragraph provided, prohibit absolutely the carriage into that portion of the State described in the Third Schedule hereto from any other portion of the State of any empty second-hand fruit case which had previously been used to contain any of the following fruits, namely, loquats, apricots, peaches, plums, nectarines, figs, pears, quinces, plantains, pomegranates, guavas, tacsonias, persimmons, apples, grapes, tomatoes, pineapples, passiflora fruits, and citrus fruits:

Provided that the prohibition contained in this paragraph shall not apply to any empty second-hand fruit case aforesaid, notwithstanding that it has previously been used to contain any of the fruits aforesaid, if before being carried into that portion of the State described in the Third Schedule hereto it has been treated and marked under supervision at a factory duly registered under "The Fruit Cases Act, 1919-1933," as required by Regulations 3, 4, and 5 of the Regulations made under and for the purposes of the last-mentioned Act;

(6) Subject as hereinafter in this paragraph provided, prohibit absolutely the carriage into that portion of the State described in the Second Schedule hereto from any other portion of the State except that portion of the State described in the Third Schedule hereto of any empty second-hand fruit case which had previously been used to contain any of the following fruits, namely, loquats, apricots, peaches, plums, nectarines, figs, pears, quinces, plantains,

pomegranates, guavas, tacsonias, persimmons, apples, grapes, tomatoes, pineapples, passiflora fruits and citrus fruits:

Provided that the prohibition contained in this paragraph shall not apply to any empty second-hand fruit case aforesaid, notwithstanding that it has previously been used to contain any of the fruits aforesaid if before being carried into that portion of the State described in the Second Schedule hereto it has been treated and marked under supervision at a factory duly registered under "The Fruit Cases Act, 1919-1933," as required by Regulations 3, 4, and 5 of the Regulations made under and for the purposes of the last-mentioned Act.

First Schedule.

All that portion of the State of Western Australia bounded on the south by the 331d parallel of south latitude from the west coast to a point immediately south of Saddleback Hill, on the east by a straight line drawn from that point to a point midway between Baker's Hill and Clackline; on the north by a straight line drawn at right angles to the eastern boundary line from the last-mentioned point to the west coast, and on the west by the west coast.

Second Schedule.

All that portion of the State of Western Australia bounded on the north by the 33rd parallel of south latitude from the west coast to a point fifteen miles east of the Great Southern railway; on the east by a line commencing at such point and running in a southerly direction parallel with the Great Southern railway to a point on the No. 2 Rabbit-proof Fence where a line drawn from Cape Clairault on the west coast and running due east meets the No. 2 Rabbit-proof Fence; on the south by the said last-mentioned line from the said point in No. 2 Rabbit-proof Fence to Cape Clairault aforesaid and on the west by the west coast between Cape Clairault aforesaid and the 33rd parallel of south latitude.

Third Schedule.

All that portion of the State of Western Australia bounded on the north by a line commencing on the west coast at Cape Clairault and running thence in a direct easterly direction until it reaches No. 2 Rabbit-Proof Fence; thence running in a direct southerly direction until it meets the south coast; thence following the coast in a westerly and northerly direction to Cape Clairault aforesad.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 23rd day of December, 1936, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1935.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Plant Discases Act, 1914-1935," the Governor may make Regulations prescribing all matters which by this Act are required or permitted to be prescribed or which it may be necessary or convenient to prescribe for giving effect to the said Act: And whereas by an Order in Council made the 7th day of September, 1921, and published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of September, 1921, the Governor made certain Regulations under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas it is deemed expedient to amend Regulation 25 of the said Regulations and to repeal the First Schedule to such Regulations as hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore,

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby repeal Regulation 25 of the Regulations made under the repear regulation 25 of the Regulations made under the said Act by Order in Council dated the 7th day of September, 1921, and published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of September, 1921, and also the First Schedule to such Regulations, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make a new Regulation, to stand as Regulation 25, under and for the purposes of the said Act, as follows: lows:-

- 25. (1) Where by virtue of any Proclamation made under "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1935," 25. the bringing or sending of any fruit specified in such Proclamation from one portion of the State to another portion of the State is permitted subject expressly to the condition that such fruit is permitted to be so brought or sent only in accordance with the relative Regulations made under the said Act, any person who desires to bring or send fruit from one portion of the State to another portion of the State in accordance with the permission in that behalf granted by such Proclamation aforesaid, shall make application to an inspector for such fruit to be so brought or sent.
- (2) An applicant for permission under this Regulation shall, if so required by the inspector, furnish the following particulars:
 - (a) The place where such fruit has been packed for carriage;
 - (b) The place from which and the place to which the fruit is intended to be carried;
 - (c) The kind and quantity of the fruit proposed to be carried;
 - (d) Whether the cases or coverings in which the fruit is packed for carriage are new or second-hand;
 - (e) The place where such fruit prior to carriage as proposed may be inspected by the inspector;
 - (f) The method of transportation and the proposed route of transportation.
- (3) Upon receipt of such application and of such further particulars as the inspector may require, the inspector shall, before granting approval:—
 - (a) examine the said fruit and the cases or coverings in which the fruit is packed for carriage;
 - (b) satisfy himself that the proposed carriage of the said fruit is not absolutely prohibited by any Proclamation for the time being in force under "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1935'';
 - (c) if the cases or coverings in which the fruit is packed for carriage are second-hand cases or coverings, satisfy himself that the use of or carriage in such cases or coverings of such fruit as proposed is not prohibited by any Proclamation made under "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1935," or by any Regulations made under "The Fruit Cases Act, 1919-1933," for the time being in force;
 - (d) if second-hand fruit cases are being used for the carriage of the fruit as proposed, and the use of such cases is not prohibited by any Proclamation made under "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1935," or by any Regulation made under "The Fruit Cases Act, 1919-1933," provided they are first treated and marked as required by the last mentioned Regulations, satisfy himself that the cases have been so treated and marked
 - (e) where apples are the fruit proposed to be carried, satisfy himself that such apples have been for a period of six weeks placed into a cold store at a temperature of not more than 32 degrees.
- (4) If after due inquiry the inspector is satisfied that the fruit proposed to be carried can properly and lawfully be carried from and to the places stated by the applicant, the inspector shall grant to the applicant approval for the carriage of such fruit as proposed.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 1930/36. WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:-

Metropolitan Sewerage, Claremont-Cottesloe District, Reticulation Area No. 7A, Cottesloe:—12-inch, 9-inch, 6-inch and 4-inch diameter pipe sewers, with manholes and all other apparatus connected therewith, between Stirling highway and View street and Irvine street and Glyde street, as shown in pink on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 5820.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 31st day of December, 1936.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 927/33.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934," which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.

THE FRUIT CASES ACT, 1919-1933.

Department of Agriculture, Perth, 23rd December, 1936.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 11 of "The Fruit Cases Act, 1919-1933," has been pleased to repeal all Regulations heretofore made under and for the purposes of the said Act, and in lieu thereof to make new Regulations under and for the purposes of the said Act as set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

THE FRUIT CASES ACT, 1919-1933.

1. Fruit cases shall be in conformity with the measurements and capacities prescribed in the First Appendix to these Regulations.

Provided that the dimensions of such cases may be varied to the extent of not more than ten per cent. (i.e., five per cent. under or five per cent. above) on the total cubic capacity of each of such cases.

- 2. (1) Every person who desires to register a fruit brand for the purposes of paragraph (b) of Section five of the Act shall make application to the Director of Agriculture in accordance with Form No. 1 in the Second Appendix to these Regulations.
- (2) Such application shall be accompanied by duplicate copies of the form of the brand proposed to be registered together with the registration fee of seven shillings and sixpence.
- (3) The Director of Agriculture shall keep a register for the purpose of registering therein fruit brands in respect whereof applications for registration under Regulation 2 hereof are granted.
- (4) Upon receipt of an application for registration of a fruit brand made in accordance with Regulation 2, the Director of Agriculture, if satisfied concerning the truth of the particulars contained in the application, shall submit to the Minister for his approval the form of the brand proposed to be registered.
- (5) If the form of such brand is approved by the Minister, such brand shall be registered by the Director of Agriculture by inserting in the said register one copy of the said form of brand, together with the particulars contained in the application and by returning the other copy of the form of brand, with a certificate of approval and registration annexed thereto to the applicant.
- (6) If an application for registration of a fruit brand is not approved by the Minister, the applicant shall be notified thereof, and the registration fee which accompanied the application shall be refunded to the applicant.
- 3. Before any second-hand fruit case is again used for containing fruit under the authority of the proviso to Subsection (1) of Section eight of the said Act, all brands appearing on such case shall be removed, and the case shall be steamed or dipped in boiling water at the registered factory or place where the case is to be packed with fruit as aforesaid, and such steaming or dipping shall be carried out under the supervision of an inspector.

- 4. Before any second-hand fruit case, which has been treated as provided for in Regulation 3, is forwarded from the registered factory to a fruit-grower or seller, such case shall be legibly branded on one end thereof in stencilled letters with the words "Steamed" or "Dipped" (as the case may be), and shall also be branded with the name of the registered factory or place where such steaming or dipping was effected. The stencilled letters so used shall not be less than one-half of an inch in height.
- 5. Any second-hand fruit case which has been treated as provided for in Regulation 3, and which is subsequently received at a registered factory with fruit contained therein, shall not again be used for the carriage of fruit or be forwarded to a grower or seller of fruit unless and until such case has again been treated in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 3.
- 6. All prescribed cases imported into the State containing bananas or pineapples shall be steamed or dipped in boiling water and branded as directed by an inspector before being again used.
- 7. The transport of fruit in second-hand cases from one place to another place within the State under the authority of paragraph (iii) of the proviso to Subsection (1) of Section eight of "The Fruit Cases Act, 1919-1933," shall be subject to the following provisions, namely:—
- (a) Subject as in this paragraph hereinafter provided, a second-hand case used to contain fruit in any portion of the State, other than those portions described in Part 2 and Part 3 of the Third Appendix to these Regulations, may be transported either by rail or road between any places not being situated within either of those portions of the State described in Part 2 and Part 3 of the said Third Appendix, but shall not be transported at all to any place situated in either of those portions of the State described in Part 2 and Part 3 of the said Third Appendix.

Provided that a second-hand case containing fruit used by a registered factory and treated and marked before transport as required by Regulations 3, 4, and 5 of these Regulations may be transported by rail or road between a place not situated in either of the portions of the State described in Part 2 and Part 3 of the said Third Appendix, and a place situated in either of the said last-mentioned portions of the State.

(b) Subject as in this paragraph hereinafter provided, a second-hand case used to contain fruit in that portion of the State described in Part 2 of the Third Appendix to these Regulations may be transported either by rail or road between any places within the said portion of the State, or between a place within such portion of the State and any other place situated in any other portion of the State, other than that portion of the State described in Part 3 of the said Third Appendix, but shall not be transported at all to any place within that portion of the State described in the said Part 3.

Provided that-

- (i) A second-hand case containing fruit used by a registered factory and treated and marked before transport as required by Regulations 3, 4, and 5 of these Regulations may be transported by rail or road between a place situated in that portion of the State described in Part 2 of the said Third Appendix and a place situated within that portion of the State described in Part 3 of the said Third Appendix; and
- (ii) Where, under the authority of this paragraph, a second-hand case has been transported from a place within that portion of the State described in Part 2 of the said Third Appendix to a place situate elsewhere in the State than in those portions described in Part 2 and Part 3 of the said Third Appendix, such second-hand case shall thereafter be a second-hand case to which paragraph (a) of this present Regulation applies, and shall be subject thereto accordingly.
- (c) Subject as in this paragraph hereinafter provided, a second-hand case used to contain fruit in that portion of the State described in Part 3 of the Third Appendix to these Regulations may be transported either by sea, rail, or road between any places within the said portion of the State or between a place situated within the said portion of the State and any place situated in any other portion of the State.

Provided that-

- (i) Where under the authority of this paragraph a second-hand case has been transported from a place within that portion of the State described in Part 3 of the said Third Appendix to a place situated outside that portion of the State described in Part 3 of the said Third Appendix and also outside that portion of the State described in Part 2 of the said Third Appendix such second-hand case shall thereafter be a second-hand case to which paragraph (a) of this Regulation applies and shall be subject thereto accordingly; and
- (ii) Where under the authority of this paragraph a second-hand case has been transported from a place within that portion of the State described in Part 3 of the said Third Appendix to a place situated within, that portion of the State described in Part 2 of the said Third Appendix such second-hand case shall thereafter be a second-hand case to which paragraph (b) of this Regulation applies and shall be subject thereto accordingly.
- (d) The foregoing paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this Regulation shall be read in conjunction with and as being subject to every Proclamation, Order in Council, or notice issued, made, or promulgated under the provisions of "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1935," and for the time being and from time to time in force, which in any way relates to the transport of fruit or specified fruits, or to the transport of second-hand fruit cases, whether containing fruit or not, between places within the State.

- 8. (1) Every person who desires to be registered as a Factory Buyer under Section 9 of the said Act shall make application to the Director of Agriculture, in accordance with Form No. 2 in the Second Appendix to these Regulations.
- (2) Such application shall be accompanied by a registration fee of seven shillings and sixpence.
- 9. (1) The Director of Agriculture shall keep a register for the purpose of registering therein the names of registered Factory Buyers.
- (2) Upon receipt of an application under Regulation 8, the Director of Agriculture, if satisfied concerning the truth of the particulars contained in the application, shall register the applicant as a Factory Buyer by entering in the said register the name and address of the applicant, together with such other relevant particulars as are contained in the application.
- (3) When an applicant has been registered as aforesaid he shall be entitled to receive from the Director of Agriculture a certificate of such registration.

First Appendix.
