JAMES MITCHELL, Lieutenaut-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS under Section 2 of "The Native Administration Act, 1905-1936," Native Institution means and includes any mission, reformatory, orphanage, school, home, station, reserve, or other institution for the benefit, protection, or care of the native inhabitants of the State declared by Proclamation to be a Native Institution for the purposes of this Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, hereby declare that the institutions mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be Native Institutions within the meaning of the section.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over 'the State of Western Australia lieutenant-Governor. [L S.] bependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 5 of "The Native Flora Protection Act, 1935," that the Governor may notify by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette that any wild flower or native plant specified in the Proclamation is protected under this Act in any part or parts of Western Australia specified in the Proclamation, that such protection may be for a limited or unlimited period, as specified in the Proclamation, and that the Governor may revoke or amend any such Proclamation at any time by a like Proclamation published in the Government Gazette: And whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient that the wild flower or native plant hereinafter mentioned shall be protected under and within the meaning of the said Act. Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling me, do by this Proclamation give notice that as from the date of the publication hereof in the Government Gazette the wild flower or native plant, to wit Christmas Tree (Nuytsia floribunda) shall be and is hereby protected under and within the meaning of "The Native Flora Protection Act, 1935," in all parts of the State of Western Australia, until this Proclamation is revoked or amended under the said Act and published in the Government Gazette.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 5 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934," that for the purposes of the said Act the word "Town" or "Townsite" means and includes inter alia any land (including privately owned subdivided land) which the Governor may see fit, as he is hereby empowered to declare by Proclamation to be a Town or Townsite for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas all that land situate within the Narembeen Road District, and more particularly described, defined, and delineated in the Schedule hereto, is land which the Governor may by virtue of Section 5 of the said Act declare by Proclamation to be a Town or Townsite for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the said Act and of all other powers in this behalf enabling me, do hereby declare that all that land situate within the Narembeen Road District and more particularly described, defined, and delineated in the Schedule hereto shall be a Townsite, to be known as "Narembeen," within the meaning and for the purposes of "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934."

Vermin Act, 1918. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Vermin Act, 1918," "Vermin" means and includes any animal or bird mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act, and such other animals or birds the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said Schedule: And whereas the name "Emus" was added to the said Schedule by Proclamation dated the 12th day of May, 1926, but wherein the addition of such name was restricted in its operations to the Districts therein set out: And whereas it is desirable that "Emus" shall be declared vermin within the boundaries of the Mount Marshall Vermin Board District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Licutenant-Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers herein in that behalf enabling, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare Emus to be vermin within the boundaries of the aforesaid Mount Marshall Vermin Board District for the purposes of the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1172/34.

HTS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the power conferred by Section 8 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934," doth hereby after the common boundary between the Dowerin and Meckering Road Districts by severing from the Dowerin Road District that portion of Avon Location 24076 as lies within such District and annexing it to the Meckering Road District.

The Government Tramways Act, 1912, and The Public Works Act, 1902.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 2 of "The Public Works Act, 1902," that a tramway is a public work for the purposes of the said Act and by Section 11 of the said Act that the Governor may by Order in Council authorise the Minister to undertake, construct, or provide any public work: And whereas it is enacted by Section 3 of "The Government Tramways Act, 1912," that the Minister may, pursuant to any Order in Council whereby the contruction of tramways is authorised, construct such tramways on roads, and in relation thereto may do and perform all the acts, matters, and things in the said Section 3 mentioned: And whereas it is enacted by Section 2 of the said "Government Tramways Act, 1912," that all tramways the property of the Government and declared by the Governor by Order in Council to be a Government tramway shall be Government tramways within the meaning of this Act: And whereas the Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts by Order in Council made the 28th day of June, 1933, authorised the construction of a trackless tramway as described in the

said Order in Council: And whereas it is now deemed desirable to vary the route and construction of the said tramway in the manner hereinafter mentioned, and also to declare such tramway to be a Government tramway under and for the purposes of the said "Government Tramways Act, 1912": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said two Acts respectively, doth hereby authorise the construction of the trackless tramway as described in the Schedule hereto in lieu of the construction of the tramway as authorised by the Order in Council made the 28th day of June, 1933, as aforesaid, and also doth hereby declare that the said trackless tramway when so constructed as aforesaid shall be a Government tramway under and for the purposes of "The Government Tramways Act, 1912":—

The Schedule above referred to.

Commencing at the intersection of Kensington street and Trafalgar road, East Perth, and proceeding along Trafalgar road in a southerly direction to Brown street; thence along Brown street in a westerly direction to Claisebrook road; thence along Claisebrook road in a southerly direction to Wittenoom street; thence along Wittenoom street in a westerly direction to Hill street; thence along Hill street in a southerly direction to Wellington street; thence along Wellington street in a westerly direction to Market place; thence along Market place under the West Perth Subway and along Sutherland street in a north-westerly direction to Cambridge street; thence along Cambridge street in a westerly direction to Gregory street; thence along Gregory street in a northerly direction to Grantham street; thence along Grantham street; thence along Grantham street in a westerly direction to the intersection of Grantham street and Reserve street, Wembley Park, which point will be the outward terminus.

The return journey will proceed along the same streets as described above but in the opposite direction as far as the intersection of Claisebrook road and Brown street. From this point the route is continued along Claisebrook road in a northerly direction to Kensington street; thence along Kensington street in an easterly direction to the point of commencement at the intersection of Kensington street and Trafalgar road, East Perth, a total distance of 11 miles 18 chains, or thereabouts, and more particularly delineated on Tramway Plan 128/37.

Western Australia.

INCOME TAX REGULATIONS, 1937.

PART I.-PRELIMINARY.

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Income Tax Regulations.

Parts.

2. These Regulations are divided into Parts, as follows:-

I.—Preliminary. Part

Part II.—Administration.

III —Liability to Taxation, IV.—Returns and Assessments. Part

Part

V.—Objections and Appeals. Part

VI.—Collection and Recovery of Tax. Part

Part VII.—Penal Provisions and Prosecutions. Part VIII.-Miscellaneous.

Interpretation.

(1) In these Regulations-

"The Act" means the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937, and when considered in relation to any time, means that Act, or, if it has been amended, that Act as amended as in force at that time;

"Prescribed delegate of the Commissioner" means a person appointed by the Commissioner to be a prescribed delegate of the Commissioner for the purposes of these Regulations.

(2) In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears, any reference to a regulation shall be read as a reference to a regulation contained in these Regulations, and any reference to a form shall be read as a reference to a Form contained in the First Schedule to these Regulations.

PART II.—ADMINISTRATION.

Oath or Declaration by Officers.

The Oath or Declaration which an officer may be required to make in pursuance of Subsection (6) of Section 9 of the Act shall be in accordance with Form 1 or Form 2, as the case may be.

PART III.—LIABILITY TO TAXATION.

Live Stock.

(1) The option which may be exercised in pursuance of Section 24 of the Act, and the selection which may be made in pursuance of Section 26 of the Act, may be notified on the return of the taxpayer, or by a separate notification in writing signed by the taxpayer, which may be in accordance with Form 3 or Form 4 as the case may be,

- (2) The separate notification shall be delivered to the Commissioner at the Taxation Department, Post Office Building, Perth—
 - (a) in the case of persons furnishing returns of income derived during the year ended the thirtieth day of June, 1937, or the accounting period, if any, adopted under the Act in lieu of that year, and in which returns the value of live stock is taken into account—on or before the thirty-first day of January, 1938, or within such extended time as the Commissioner allows;
 - (b) in the case of other persons—on or before the date of the furnishing of the first return in which the value of live stock is taken into account, or within such extended time as the Commissioner allows for the exercise of that option or the making of that selection, as the case may be.
- (3) For the purposes of Section 26 of the Act, the limits within which a taxpayer may select a cost price of natural increase of each class of live stock shall be as follows:—

Agreement by Trustee and Beneficiaries.

6. The notice of agreement which may be given in pursuance of the proviso to Subsection (2) of Section 28 of the Act shall be in writing, signed by the trustee of the estate of the deceased and the beneficiaries (if any) who are liable to be assessed in respect of the income of the business, or of a share in that income, and shall be given to the Commissioner at the Taxation Department, Post Office Building, Perth, on or before the date of furnishing the first return by the trustee of the estate of the deceased, or within such extended time as the Commissioner allows for the giving of that notice of agreement.

Option as to Method of Depreciation.

- 7. (1) The option which may be exercised in pursuance of paragraph (b) of Subsection (1) of Section 58 of the Act shall be notified in accordance with Form 5, and shall be signed by the taxpayer, and delivered to the Commissioner at the Taxation Department, Post Office Buildings, Perth, on or before the date of the furnishing of the first return to which the option applies.
- (2) The notification shall apply to all units of property in respect of which depreciation is allowable under the Act.

Improvements on Leased Land.

8. For the purposes of paragraph (a) of Subsection (1) of Section 87 of the Act, the rate of interest shall be Five Pounds per centum per annum, and the instalment referred to therein may be calculated by reference to the table in the Second Schedule.

Assessment of a Bank upon the Basis of Actual Income.

9. The election which may be made by a bank in pursuance of paragraph (a) of Subsection (1) of Section 107 of the Act shall be in accordance with Form 9, and shall be delivered to the Commissioner at the Taxation Department, Post Office Buildings, Perth.

Conversion of Ex-Australian Funds by the Bank.

10. The election which may be made by a bank in pursuance of Subsection (1) of Section 108 of the Act shall be in accordance with Form 10, and shall be delivered to the Commissioner at the Taxation Department, Post Office Buildings, Perth.

Order of Disposal of Ex-Australian Funds by a Bank.

11. The election which may be made by a bank in pursuance of Subsection (4) of Section 108 of the Act shall be in accordance with Form 11, and shall be delivered to the Commissioner at the Taxation Department, Post Office Buildings, Perth.

PART IV .- RETURNS AND ASSESSMENTS.

Roturns.

- 12. Except as otherwise prescribed, every return under this Act shall-
 - (a) be made and furnished in such of the forms provided by the Commissioner for the purpose as is applicable;
 - (b) contain the information and particulars mentioned or referred to in that form;
 - (c) be verified by declaration as therein set forth; and
 - (d) be accompanied by all balance-sheets, profit and loss accounts, statements and other documents, as are mentioned in the form or as are requisite.

Returns by Persons other than Companies.

- 13. The form of return applicable in the case of persons other than companies shall— $\,$
 - (a) itemise the income derived from various sources and the deductions elaimed;
 - (b) provide for separate Parts as follows:-

Part A-Income from Personal Exertion (when Part C or Part D is unsuitable);

Part B-Income from Property;

Part C—Income from a trade, business, manufacture or concern, not shown in Part A or Part B;

Part D—Income of a farmer, pastoralist or agriculturist, not shown in Part A or Part B;

(c) provide in each Part for particulars to be supplied under separate headings relating to income derived and deductions claimed;

(d) provide for statements as follows:-

live stock schedule; wool statement;

wheat statement; hotels statement;

statement of salaries, wages, and commission paid, and allowances to employees;

statement by trustee or partnership;

deductions claimed in respect of children;

deductions claimed for dependants;

dividends from companies;

interest received;

particulars relating to sources of information; and

(e) provide for a declaration by the person making the return that the particulars shown therein and also those stated in the accompanying statements are true and correct in every particular and disclose a full and complete statement of the total income derived during the year of income.

Returns by Companies.

14. (1.) The form of return applicable in the case of companies shall provide

(a) a statement reconciling the net profit as per the profit and loss account with the net taxable income;
(b) a statement of dividends paid or credited during a period to be specified

on the form;

(c) a statement of particulars relating to sources of information;

(d) a declaration by the Public Officer that the particulars shown in the return and also those stated in the accompanying statements are true and correct in every particular and disclose a full and complete statement of the total income derived during the year of income.

(2.) Every return by a company shall be accompanied (in addition to any other documents required under these Regulations) by statements showing the following particulars or such of those particulars or such modifications of those particulars as the Commissioner from time to time requires, namely:-

(a) the names and addresses of all shareholders and the amount of dividend (if any) paid to each shareholder during the year preceding the year

of tax:

(b) the names and addresses of all persons to whom interest in excess of Fifty pounds was paid or credited during the year preceding the year of tax,

and the amount so paid or credited to each person;
(c) the total amount of interest paid or credited, during the year of income, to depositors and debenture-holders who are not residents of Australia on money secured by debentures of the company and used in the State, or used in acquiring assets for use or disposal in the State, and on money lodged at interest in the State with the company, after deducting (unless the Commissioner otherwise directs) interest paid or credited to a company not a resident of Australia but which is carrying on business in the State and which has a public officer duly appointed under the Act:

(d) the total amount of interest paid or credited during the year of income in respect of debentures payable to bearer, the names and addresses of the holders of which are not supplied to the Commissioner by the com-

pany;

(e) the names and addresses of all holders of debentures payable to bearer which the company is in a position to furnish (whether residents or non-residents), together with the amount of interest paid or credited, during the year preceding the year of tax, to each of such holders of debentures.

Statement to be Furnished by Employers,

15. (1.) Every employer of labour shall, when called upon by the Commissioner either by general notice published in the Gazette or by direct notice to the employer, furnish to the Commissioner a statement showing-

(a) the names and addresses of all persons employed by him during the period

mentioned in the notice;

(b) the capacity in which each person was employed;

- (c) the total amount of remuneration paid to each person during that period; and
- (d) the value of board, residence, or other allowance made to each person during that period.
- (2.) Each statement shall be furnished to the Commissioner at the Taxation Department, Post Office Buildings, Perth.

Returns by Partnerships.

- 16. (1.) A return setting forth a full and complete statement of the income derived by every partnership during the year of income shall, if required by the Commissioner by notice published in the Gazette, be made and furnished by the partners resident in the State or by any one of them.
- (2.) When there is no partner resident in the State, the return shall be made and furnished by the agent in the State for the partnership.

Separate Returns by Partners.

- (1.) Every partner in a partnership shall furnish a separate return of his total individual income (including income from the partnership and other sources) in every case in which he would be required to furnish a return if the same total income had been derived by him from sources other than the partnership.
 - (2.) The return shall state the income derived respectively from-
 - (a) the partnership; and (b) from other sources.

Returns by Trustees.

- 18. (1.) A return setting forth a full and complete statement of the income derived by every trust during the year of income shall, if required by the Commissioner by notice published in the Gazette, be made and furnished by the trustees resident in the State or by any one of them.
 (2.) When there is no trustee resident in the State, the return shall be made
- and furnished by the agent in the State for the trustees.

Returns by Agents.

19. Every person liable to furnish a return as agent for any person shall furnish a separate return for each person for whom he is agent, in addition to his own individual return.

Not Sole Agent.

- 20. If an agent is not the sole agent in Australia for a person for whom he is required to furnish a return, he shall set forth in that return particulars of all his transactions, as agent for that person.
- 21. Every person in the State who sells goods for, or who is instrumental in the sale of goods for a principal carrying on business outside the State, shall furnish a return stating-
 - (a) the full name and address of the principal;

 - (b) the nature of the goods sold by him or through his instrumentality;
 (c) the total sale price of the goods sold by him or through his instrumentality.
- 22. (1.) Every club or company which conducts a horserace shall within fourteen days of the date when the stakes are payable furnish a return stating-
 - (a) the date upon which the meeting was held;
 - (b) the total value of the stakes won, whether in each or otherwise;
 - (c) the amount of tax due thereon.
 - (2.) The tax payable upon such stakes shall be paid when the return is lodged.

Special Returns.

23. Returns required by the Commissioner otherwise than by notice published in the Gazette shall be made and furnished in the form required by the Commissioner.

Substantially Similar Form,

24. The Commissioner may at any time accept a return or form which is substantially in accordance with a prescribed form or a form provided by the Commissioner.

Identification of Statements Accompanying Returns.

- 25. Any balance sheet, profit and loss account and any other statement, document, list, or information, accompanying any return, shall be signed by the person making and furnishing the return, and shall bear an indorsement so that it may be identified as so accompanying the return.
- Every return shall be furnished to the Commissioner at the Taxation Department, Post Office Buildings, Perth.

When Return Deemed to be Furnished.

- 27. A return shall not be deemed to have been duly furnished to the Commissioner unless and until-
 - (a) the proper form signed as required by the Act and Regulations and containing a full, true and complete statement of all matters and things required to be stated therein by the Act and Regulations, the Commissioner, and the form itself; and
 - (b) all balance-sheets, profit and loss accounts, statements, notices, and other documents which, by the Act, the Regulations, or the Commissioner, are required to accompany the return

have been received by an officer authorised by the Commissioner to receive returns.

Persons to Take Necessary Steps for Due Furnishing of Return.

28. Whenever a person is required by the Act, the Regulations, or the Commissioner, to furnish a return to the Commissioner, it shall be the duty of that person to make the required return and to take all steps necessary to insure that the return is received by the Commissioner.

Notice of Address.

29. Every person who furnishes a return shall, in the return, give an address in Australia for service.

Notice of Change of Address.

30. Every person who has given an address for service and who subsequently changes his address shall, within one month after the change, give to the Commissioner, at the Taxation Department, Post Office Buildings, Perth, notice in writing of his new address in Australia for service.

Address for Service.

31. The address for service last given to the Commissioner by any person shall, for all purposes under the Act and Regulations, be his address for service, but where no address for service has been given to the Commissioner, or where the departmental records disclose that such person has subsequently changed his address and he has not notified the Commissioner, either in the return or by separate written advice, of such change, then the address of the person, as described in any record in the custody of the Commissioner, shall be his address for service.

Last Known Place of Business or Abode.

32. The address for service as prescribed in the last preceding Regulation shall, for all purposes under the Act and Regulations, be deemed to be the last known place of business or abode in Australia of any person.

Failure to Notify Change of Address.

33. Any person who changes his address and fails to give to the Commissioner notice of his new address in Australia for service shall not be permitted to plead such change of address as a defence in any proceedings (whether civil or criminal) instituted against him under the Act or Regulations.

Annotations on Returns.

34. (1) The Commissioner may cause or permit his officers to make on any return such marks, figures and annotations as the Commissioner thinks fit.

(2) The marks, figures and annotations shall be made in ink of a colour different from that of the ink used in the return.

Particulars Relating to Sources of Information.

- 35. (1) Every person who charges, directly or indirectly, any fee for preparing or assisting in the preparation of any return shall furnish information in accordance with Form 6 as to—
 - (a) what books of account, if any, are kept by or on behalf of the taxpayer.
 (b) the name and address of the person by whom those books are kept;
 (c) whether the books are audited each year, and, if so, the name and address
 - of the person by whom they are audited;
 - whether the return is in accordance with those books;

 - (e) if the return is not in accordance with those books, the basis upon which, and the information upon which, the return has been prepared; and
 (f) whether he has satisfied himself, and if so, in what manner, that the books of account or other sources of information upon which the return is based are correct and disclose the whole of the taxpayer's income from all sources.

and shall sign the certificate contained in that Form.

- (2) Every person carrying on business who does not furnish with his return an agent's certificate shall furnish the particulars referred to in paragraphs (a) to (e)
- (inclusive) in the last preceding sub-regulation.

 (3) In the case of a return by a company, Form 6 shall be altered by omitting the
 - "B. Every person carrying on business who does not furnish with his return an agent's certificate."

and inserting in their stead the words-

"B. Every company carrying on business which does not furnish with its return an agent's certificate."

PART V.-OBJECTIONS AND APPEALS.

Form of Objection.

(1) An objection against an assessment under Section 168 of the Act may

be made in accordance with Form 7.

(2) The objection shall be posted to, or lodged with, the Commissioner at the Taxation Department, Post Office Buildings, Perth.

Evidence on Appeal.

37. Where the Commissioner has, in pursuance of paragraph (a) of Subsection (2) of Section 159 of the Act, amended an assessment, the production in any proceedings on appeal against the assessment as so amended, of a certificate in writing signed by the Commissioner stating that he is of opinion that the avoidance of tax was due to fraud or evasion, shall be conclusive evidence that the Commissioner was of opinion as stated in the said certificate.

PART VI.—COLLECTION AND RECOVERY OF TAX.

How Tax may be Paid.

- (a) by delivery of cash, bank notes, or cheques at the office of the Commissioner or at the office of any other Commissioner or Deputy Commissioner of Taxation in Australia;
- (b) by remitting the tax to the Commissioner by bank draft, or cheque, or postal money order or postal note payable in Perth.

Post Office to be Agent of Remitter.

When a remittance is posted by a taxpayer addressed to the Commissioner the Post Office shall be deemed to be the agent of the remitter, and payment shall not be deemed to have been made until the remittance has been received by the addressee.

Payment by Cheque,

40. When a cheque has been delivered or remitted to the Commissioner in payment of income tax, the tax shall (notwithstanding any receipt given therefor) not be deemed to have been paid until the amount for which the cheque is drawn has been collected.

Part Payment of Tax.

41. Except with the express consent of the Commissioner, or such officer as he may authorise, no money shall be accepted on account or in part payment of income tax.

Postage to be Prepaid.

42. The postage on every return, statement, communication, remittance, or other matter sent by post, addressed to the Commissioner, shall be fully prepaid by the sender.

Deficient Postage.

43. When any sum is received as payment of income tax, the Commissioner shall first deduct therefrom the amount of postage and surcharge (if any) paid upon any unstamped or insufficiently stamped matter received through the post from the taxpayer and shall credit in payment of tax only the net amount then remaining.

Notice to the Commonwealth or a State.

44. (1) The person upon whom notice may be served in pursuance of Section 189 of the Act in respect to any employee of the Commonwealth or of the State shall be the Paying Officer of the Department of the Commonwealth or a State, as the case may

be, in which the employee is for the time being employed.

(2) For the purposes of this regulation, "Paying Officer" means any officer of the Commonwealth or a State who, by any law, regulation, or appointment, is charged with the duty of disbursing or who does actually disburse any public moneys.

Certificate as to Service of Notice of Assessment, etc.

45. In any action against a person for the recovery of income tax a certificate in writing, signed by the Commissioner, or a prescribed delegate of the Commissioner, certifying that-

(a) the person named in the certificate is a taxpayer;

(b) an assessment of income tax was duly made against him in respect of the year mentioned in the certificate;

(c) the particulars of the assessment are as stated in the certificate;

(d) notice of the assessment was duly served upon him;
(e) the sum named in the certificate was at the date of the certificate due by him to the King on behalf of the State in respect of income tax, shall be prima facie evidence of the facts stated in the certificate.

Evidence by Affidavit.

46. In any action for the recovery of income tax, evidence may be given by affidavit, but the Court may require the deponent to attend for the purpose of being crossexamined.

PART VII.—PENAL PROVISIONS AND PROSECUTIONS.

Certificate as to Failure to Furnish a Return.

- 47. In any proceedings against a person for failing or neglecting to duly furnish a return, a certificate in writing signed by the Commissioner, or a prescribed delegate of the Commissioner, certifying that no return has been received from that person by any officer authorized by the Commissioner to receive returns, shall be prima facie evidence that the defendant has failed or neglected to duly furnish a return.
- 48. In any proceedings against a person for failing or neglecting duly to furnish the Commissioner with any information required by the Commissioner pursuant to Section 225 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937, a certificate in writing signed by the Commissioner, or a prescribed delegate of the Commissioner, certifying—

(a) that the defendant was required by the Commissioner by notice in writing

to furnish the Commissioner with such information; and

(b) that the defendant failed or neglected duly to furnish the Commissioner with such information as and when required by the Commissioner, shall be prima facie evidence of the facts stated in the certificate.

Order to Comply with Requirement.

49. An Order made by a Court in pursuance of Section 194 of the Act may be served in the manner prescribed for the serving of notices by Regulation 51.

Enforcement of Orders for Payment.

- 50. (1) Where an order for the payment of a sum of money by any person to the Commissioner is made under Part VII. of the Act by a Court of Summary Jurisdiction, the Commissioner may obtain from the Clerk or other proper officer of the Court a certificate under Section 209 of the Act.
- (2) The certificate shall be in accordance with Form 8 and shall contain the following particulars:-

(a) the name and location of the Court making the order;(b) the name and address of the defendant; and

(c) the date and amount of the order and the section of Part VII. of the Act under which the order was made.

(3) Upon production of the certificate to the registrar, or other proper officer of a Court having jurisdiction to entertain civil proceedings to the amount of the order, that officer shall register the certificate by entering the particulars thereof in a book to be kept by him.

(4) A certificate shall not be registered after the lapse of twelve months from the date of the order to which it relates unless leave in that behalf has first been obtained from the Court in which it is proposed to register the certificate.

PART VIII .- MISCELLANEOUS,

Service of Notices etc.

51. Any notice or other communication by or on behalf of the Commissioner may be served upon any person-

(a) by causing it to be personally served on him; or

(b) by leaving it at his address for service; or
(c) by posting it by prepaid letter post, addressed to him at his address for service;

and in any case to which paragraph (c) of this regulation applies, unless the contrary is proved, service thereof shall be deemed to have been effected at the time when it would, in the ordinary course of post, have arrived at the place to which it was addressed.

Signatures.

52. Any notice to be given by the Commissioner may be given by any officer of the Commissioner duly authorised in that behalf; and any notice purporting to be signed by the authority of the Commissioner shall be as valid and effectual for all purposes as if signed by the Commissioner in person.

Appointment of prescribed delegate.

53. The Commissioner may, by notice published in the Gazette, appoint any person to be a prescribed delegate of the Commissioner for the purposes of these Regulations.

Appointment of Public Officer.

54. Whenever the position of Public Officer of a company becomes vacant, and it is necessary for a new Public Officer to be appointed, the notice of appointment by the company of a new Public Officer shall be given on Form 12 to the Commissioner at the Taxation Department, Post Office Buildings, Perth.

Expenses of persons required to attend and give evidence.

55. Where a person (other than the taxpayer or a representative of the taxpayer concerning whom the evidence is required) is required under Section 225 of the Act to attend and give evidence before the Commissioner or an officer authorised by him, there may be allowed to that person the sum (not exceeding in any case One pound per diem) actually and necessarily lost by him by reason of his attendance, and in addition (if he resides more than four miles from the place at which he is required to attend) such sum for travelling expenses (not exceeding the sum actually paid) as the person conducting the inquiry thinks reasonable.

Amount of penalty.

56. Any contravention of these Regulations shall be punishable on conviction by a fine of not less than One pound or more than Twenty pounds.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-35.

I, REGINALD CYRIL EVERITT ATKINSON, Commissioner of Public Health of Western Australia, acting under the power and authority conferred on me by Section 207 of "The Health Act, 1911-1935," do hereby make the following general order for the purpose of more effectively checking or preventing the spread of the dangerous infectious disease Acute Anterior Poliomyelitis (Infantile Paralysis):-

1. That the parent or guardian of or any person responsible for the care or custody of any child of the age of 16 years or under who arrives in this State from any other State of Australia or from New Zealand shall immediately notify the Commissioner of Public Health of the arrival of such child, giving the name, the age, and the address or prospective address of such child, together with the date of departure from such other State or from New Zealand.

2. That the parent or guardian of or any person responsible for the care or custody of any child referred to in paragraph 1 hereof shall, upon any change in the address or prospective address of such child, immediately notify the Commissioner thereof.

3. That such child shall remain in isolation at any address so notified until the expiry of twenty-one (21) days from the date of departure of such child from the State or other country in which he was last resident for more than 24 hours, and the occupants of such house shall submit to inspection by and surveillance of officers of the Public Health Department or of the respective Local Health Authority.

4. That as far as possible any such child shall be kept away from all other children in the same house.

5. That any sickness whether of a child referred to in paragraph 1 hereof, or of an adult, occurring at the address of such child during the said period of isolation shall be immediately reported to a medical practitioner.

6. That any medical practitioner called to a case of any such sickness shall

immediately give notice thereof to the Commissioner of Public Health and the medical officer of the District in which such ease occurs.

7. Every Local Authority, pursuant to the power contained in Section 25 of the said Act, is hereby authorised and directed to carry out the provisions of the above order.

8. This order shall have effect within every Health District in the State of Western Australia.

Maximum penalty for non-compliance with these requirements, £50.

THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-1935.

Traffic Regulations, 1936.

Additions and Amendments.

P.W. 662/37.
THE Traffic Regulations, 1936, published in the Government Gazette on the 26th day of August, 1936, are hereby amended as follows:—

1. Paragraph (1) of Regulation 26 is hereby deleted and the following paragraph inserted in lieu thereof:—

(1) A fee not exceeding five shillings may be charged for a duplicate of a certificate of registration.

2. Regulation 104 is hereby deleted and the following inserted in lieu thereof:—
104. (1.) Within the metropolitan area at any place where there are double tramlines no driver of any vehicle and no rider of any cycle or of any animal shall pass any tramear, whether moving or stationary, on the right hand side of the tramear when such vehicle or rider is proceeding or intending to proceed in the same direction.

[†] Mayor elected.

[‡] Auditor elected.

(2.) For the purpose of this regulation loops on single tramlines shall not

be regarded as double lines.

(3.) Every driver of any vehicle and the rider of any cycle or animal must use every care consistent with the safety of the public when passing any stationary transcar, and when proceeding in the same direction as a transcar shall not pass such transcar, but shall stop at least two feet from any entrance of such

tramear whilst the passengers are boarding or alighting.

Provided that it shall not be an offence for the driver of a vehicle or the rider of a cycle or animal in a street set apart for traffic in a specified direction to pass a stationary transcar whilst passengers are boarding or alighting if such vehicle is driven or such cycle or animal is ridden along the right-hand side of such transcar and every care consistent with the safety of the public is exercised.

- Regulation 134 is amended by inserting a new paragraph after paragraph (e) as follows:
- (f) whilst riding any cycle carry anything which might tend to prevent the rider from having proper control of the cycle or which might be likely to cause danger to the rider of the cycle or to any other person.

 4. Regulation 139 is amended by deleting the figures "10" and the word "five" in the second line and inserting the figures "12" and the word "six" in lieu thereof.

 5. Regulation 143 is amended by deleting the figures "10" in the first line and inserting the figures "12" in lieu thereof.

 6. Regulation 287 is amended by deleting the figures "10" in the third line and inserting the figures "12" in lieu thereof.

 7. Regulation 334 is amended by deleting the word "Ninth" in the fourth line of paragraph (i) and inserting the word "Seventh" in lieu thereof.

 8. Regulation 337 is amended by deleting the word "Eleventh" in the fifth line and inserting the word "Second" in lieu thereof.
