If an applicant wishes to appear before the Land Board in person he may apply to the Head Office or to the Clerk in Charge of any of the District or Branch Land Offices for a certificate to the Railway Department which, on presentation at the nearest Railway Station, will entitle him to a Return Ticket, at Excursion Rates, to the place where the Board will sit, available for seven days from the date of issue.

The selector of a Homestead Farm from any location must take the balance thereof, if any, under Conditional Purchase.

All marketable timber, including sandalwood and mallet, is reserved to the Crown, subject to the provisions of Clause 18 of the Regulations.

# REGULATIONS MADE UNDER THE MEAT INDUSTRY (TREATMENT WORKS) LICENSING ACT, 1937.

1. Every applicant for a license under section 5 of the Act shall make his application to the Minister for Agriculture in the form prescribed in the First Schedule to these regulations.
2. Every license shall be in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule to these regulations.
3. A license granted under the Act shall be personal to the holder and shall not be dealt with in any way nor transferred without the consent in writing of the Minister first obtained.
4. The holder of a license shall in the conduct of the treatment works comply with all laws, regulations, and by-laws under any statute or made by any competent local authority, board, or body, which may in any way relate to the business carried on at the treatment works, or which may impose any obligation on the owner or occupier thereof.
5. The holder of a license shall not treat for export any class or condition of sheep, cattle, or pigs, or the carcasses thereof, which under the laws of the Commonwealth is not permitted to be exported from the Commonwealth.
6. The holder of a license shall at all reasonable times permit the entry of the Minister or his inspectors or officers to the treatment works in respect of which the license is held.
7. Every holder of a license shall at the 31st March and the 30th September in each year forward to the Minister a return showing the number of sheep, cattle, and pigs treated at his works during the preceding six months—(a) on behalf of the works; and (b) on behalf of any other person or persons; the return to be in the form prescribed in the Third Schedule to these regulations.
8. Upon the Minister deciding to suspend or revoke a license under section 8 of the Act, notice to that effect shall be sent to the holder of the license at his last known address. The notice shall be in the form prescribed in the Fourth Schedule to these regulations.
9. The fee to be charged for a license under the Act shall be Five pounds (£5).
10. The maximum charge to be made by the holder of a license for treating sheep, cattle and pigs for members of the public under section 7 of the Act shall be one penny (1d.) per lb. dressed weight, and this charge shall include all expenses of placing the carcasses on board ship.
11. Any undertakings or statements of fact or intention made by an applicant in support of an application for a license shall be deemed to be imported into and become conditions of any license granted by the Minister in pursuance of that application except in so far as any express conditions imposed by the Minister on the granting of the license are inconsistent therewith.
12. For any breach of any of these regulations the holder of a license shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, without prejudice to the Minister's power to cancel the license.
