WHEREAS it is enacted by section 2 of the Public Works Act, 1902, that a tramway is a public work for the purposes of the said Act, and by section 11 of the said Act that the Governor may by Order in Council authorise the Minister to undertake, construct, or proauthorise the Minister to undertake, construct, of provide any public work: And whereas it is enacted by section 3 of the Government Tramways Act, 1912, that the Minister may pursuant to any Order in Council whereby the construction of tramways is authorised construct such tramways on roads, and in relation thereto may do and perform all the acts, matters, and things in the said section 3 mentioned: And whereas things in the said section 3 mentioned: And whereas it is enacted by section 2 of the said Government Tramways Act, 1912, that all tramways the property of the Government and declared by the Governo by Order in Council to be a Government tramway shall be Government tramways within the meaning of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in executive of the representations of the security of the s Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said two Acts respectively, doth hereby authorise the construction of the trackless tramway as described in the Schedule hereto, and doth hereby declare that the said trackless tramway when so constructed as afore-said shall be a Government tramway under and for the purposes of the Government Tramways Act, 1912:—

Commencing at the south-western intersection of William street and St. George's terrace, Perth, and proceeding in a westerly direction along the south side of St. George's terrace to Mill street; thence along Mill street in a southerly direction to Mount's Bay road; thence along the south side of Mount's Bay road in a westerly direction to the junction of Mount's Bay road and Stirling highway at Crawley; thence along Stirling highway in a westerly direction to the Junction of Stirling highway and Congdon street, Claremont, which point will be the outward terminus. Commencing at the south-western intersection of Wilpoint will be the outward terminus.

The return journey will proceed in the opposite direction along the north side of Stirling highway and Mount's Bay road to Mill street, Perth; thence continuing in an easterly direction along Bazaar terrace to William street; thence along the west side of William street in a northerly direction to the point of commencement at the south-western intersection of William street and St. George's terrace—a total distance of 12 miles 10% chains or thereabouts and more particularly de-lineated on Tramway plans.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has approved of the attached rules and regulations made by the Bruce Rock Memorial Hospital Board.

THE HOSPITALS ACT, 1927.

Rules and Regulations of the Bruce Rock Memorial Hospital.

1.—Name.

The name of the Institution shall be "The Bruce Rock Memorial Hospital."

2.-Life Governors.

Any person subscribing not less than Ten pounds (£10) in one sum, the same not having been collected from the public, shall be entitled to be declared a Life Governor, and shall have the privilege of attending any meeting of the Board, if he or she so desires. In addition it shall be within the power of the Board to confer this honour upon any person who has given signal service to the Hospital.

3.-Board of Management.

There shall be a Board of Management, consisting of seven members, nominated as hereinafter provided and appointed by the Governor. The Board shall have entire control of the Institution.

At the annual meeting held in July of each year one third of the members of the Board, or as near as may be, shall retire, i.e., in July, 1938, two members; in July, 1939, two members: in July, 1940, three members, and thereafter in regular rotation.

Every member who retires or vacates his seat by rotation or otherwise, shall, if otherwise qualified, be eligible for re-election.

4.—Persons Eligible for Election to Board of Management.

Any resident of the district shall be qualified to stand for election as a member of the Board of Management, but must be nominated and seconded by residents of the district.

5.—Annual General Meeting.

There shall be an annual general public meeting held in the month of July each year. Notice of such meeting shall be given by the chairman and secretary at least seven clear days before the date of such meeting, and such notice shall be advertised in one or more newspapers circulating in the Bruce Rock District.

6.-Order of Business at Annual General Meeting.

Confirmation of the minutes of the previous annual meeting; chairman's report; financial statement and auditor's report; medical officer's report; nominations for Board of Management; election of residents' auditor.

Any other general business. A copy of the annual report and balance sheet shall be published not less than one week before the annual meeting.

7.—Chairman.

The Board shall at their first meeting after the annual general meeting elect one of their number to be chairman. The chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Board, and at the annual general meeting, and shall be ex officio a member of all Committees. In the absence of the chairman, the members present shall appoint an acting chairman.

8.—Seats Declared Vacant.

In the case of any member of the Board of Management being absent from three consecutive monthly meetings without leave of absence, the Board may recommend to the Governor that his seat be declared vacant.

9.—Vacancies.

The Board shall fill all vacancies in their number and recommend same to the Governor for appointment. They shall also fill any vacancy in the office of auditor.

10.—Board Meetings.

The Board shall meet at the Hospital regularly on the second Monday in each month. A majority of the Board shall form a quorum.

11.—Special Board Meetings.

Special meetings may be called by the chairman on the requisition of any three (3) members of the Board.

12.—Order of Business at Board Meetings.

Minutes, correspondence, Visiting Committee's report, Medical Officer's report, secretary's financial statement, accounts, appointment of Visiting Committee, general business.

13.—Visiting Committee.

At each monthly meeting of the Board two members shall be appointed as a Visiting Committee for one month. This Committee shall visit the Hospital at least once before the next ordinary meeting and report to the Board

14.-Appointment of Secretary.

The secretary shall be appointed by the Board and shall retain office at the Board's discretion.

15.—Duties of Secretary.

The duties of the secretary shall be:-

- to summon and attend all the meetings of the Board and of the Committees:
- and of the Committees; to take notes of minutes and prepare reports;
- to conduct all correspondence and carry out all resolutions of the Board as contained in the minutes;
- to keep proper books of accounts, issue receipts, and attend to all due payments of money;
- to give all the information in his power (when desired) to the members then present and prepare all reports and statements required;
- to carefully examine all the tradesmen's accounts for provisions and other articles, and make up the accounts for presentation to the Board at the monthly meeting;
- to receive all moneys paid to the Hospital and pay them into the Bank within seven days of collection:

 to make all payments by cheque, which shall be signed
 by the chairman or one member of the Board and
 countersigned by the secretary; upon receipt of
 a report from the matron of any derangement in
 sanitary or domestic appliances, or of breakage
 or want of repair of any of the furniture, immediately examine the same and deal with it, as
 may be required; to examine the financial position
 of patients and take such steps towards assuring
 payment as may be directed by the Board or the
 Medical Department; to carry out all lawful
 demands of the Board which are not herein enumerated

He shall receive such salary as may be determined by the Board.

The secretary shall be insured in an approved insurance company for an amount to be fixed by the Board. Such fidelity bond premiums shall be paid by the Board.

16.-Matron.

The matron shall be appointed by the Board and shall retain office at the Board's discretion.

17.—Duties of Matron.

The matron shall, subject to the direction of the The matron shall, subject to the direction of the Board, have full control of the internal administration of the Hospital and all things appertaining thereto. The matron shall be responsible for the good order and cleanliness of the Institution and the clothing of the patients; the preparation and service of meals, and the proper and efficient nursing of patients. She shall arrange that in her absence the Hospital is at all times left in the absence the start nurse that the report left in the charge of a competent nurse; that the report books are entered up regularly. She shall be responsible books are entered up regularly. She shall be responsible for all stores; see that the directions of the Doctor to the nursing staff for the medical and surgical needs of the patients are carried out; take charge of all moneys and valuables of the patients, and, in the case of insanity or death, hold same to the order of the Board. She shall present a monthly report to the Board, and in all matters, requiring urgent attention, report promptly to the secretary. She shall, in conjunction with the Medical Officer, prepare a list of all drugs and appliances required and hand same to the secretary. All accounts shall be checked by the matron, and certified as correct before handing same to secretary. The matron shall on taking charge, check and sign a stock book containing a list of all surgical instruments, furniture, bedding, linen, clothing, cutlery, glass, crockery, cooking, and kitchen utensils, etc., and be responsible for same.

The matron shall not permit strangers or visitors to remain after the usual visiting hours, but shall request such visitors to retire at the specified times.

18.—Nurses.

Each nurse shall be responsible to the matron for the efficient nursing of the patients, the charge of all linen, furniture, and other articles, and the cleanliness and management of her ward or wards. She shall strictly chey orders of the matron, and take such day or night duty as the matron may direct. All nurses shall reside on the premises.

19.—Servants.

All members of the domestic staff shall be ready to carry out orders at any time. They shall faithfully execute all orders of the matron and be respectful and orderly in conduct. They shall not be absent without leave from the matron, who shall, if possible, grant leave of absence for one half day per week and each Sunday afternoon.

20.—Residential Rule.

No patient shall be absent from the Hospital without persons other than patients or those employed shall reside on the premises, or have any meals at the Institution. No visitor to employees shall under any circumstances be permitted to remain at the Institution after 10 p.m. or during hours of duty, without the consent of the matron.

21.—Ministers of Religion.

Ministers of religion visiting the Hospital for the purpose of ministering to the patients shall visit only those patients who desire their ministrations, and shall vot interfere with the repose and quiet of the other patients. The consent of the matron must be obtained before entering a ward.

22.—Visitors.

The public will be admitted to the Hospital daily between the hours of 3 p.m. and 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. All visitors must obey the directions of the matron or nurse on duty. No visitor shall enter any ward without first obtaining permission from the matron or nurse in charge. No intoxicating liquor of any kind shall be brought into the Hospital, except by the direction of a medical practitioner, nor shall any fruit or food be brought into the ward or be received by patients without the sauction of the matron,

23A.—Patients.

No patient shall be admitted unless ordered by a medical practitioner; in eases of emergency, the matron may admit patients, but such cases must be referred to a medical practitioner as early as possible after admission. Maternity patients shall give the matron reasonable notice of their intention to use the Hospital.

23C.—Payment of Fees.

Before a patient leaves the Hospital all fees must be handed to the matron or secretary, or a satisfactory guarantee for payment left in the hands of the matron or secretary, except in bona fide or indigent cases.

24.—Notification to Patients' Friends.

Should a patient be dangerously ill the matron shall at once notify some of the relatives of such patient, and, should the patient desire that a clergyman be sent for, his or her wishes in this respect are to be immediately attended to.

25.—Complaints.

Complaints of all kinds affecting the internal management of the Hospital, whether made by the patients, staff, or others, shall be made directly to the secretary star, of others, shall be made directly to the secretary in writing within seven days of the occurrence, and such complaints shall be dealt with by the Board after receiving the matron's report thereon. The decision of the Board shall be final. The Board may refuse to consider any complaints that are not lodged as herein provided. provided.

26.—Removal of Patients.

Patients leaving the Hospital of their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving, and such declaration shall be signed by the friend removing such patient.

27.—Employees to Receive Copy of Rules.

A copy of these rules shall be handed by the secretary to every employee, at the commencement of his or her service. The same shall be signed for, and, on completion of service, returned to the secretary.

28.—Alterations of Rules and Regulations.

These rules and regulations shall not be altered. amended, varied, or added to except upon notice in writing given to the secretary stating the proposed alterations, additions, cancellations, and the secretary shall give each member of the Board fourteen days' notice in writing thereof prior to the matter being discussed.

1.-Hours.

2.—Injury to Things.

No person shall pluck any of the wild or cultivated flowers, or walk on the beds, borders, or putting greens, nor pull up or dig or otherwise disturb any grass, or climb upon or get through or over the fences, or remove or injure any of the gates, turnstiles, fences, buildings, or flags, nor disturb, damage, destroy any of the property or things within the bounds of the Reserve.

During the constructing, building, making, repairing, or maintaining of any beds, borders, or greens, links, buildings, or other improvements, no person shall interfere with the workman, gardeners, caretakers, or rangers, or do or cause to be done any act which will be likely to interfere with or prevent such construction, building, making, or maintaining.

6.-Misconduct.

Any person in a state of intoxication or misconducting himself or herself shall be liable to be removed from the reserve.

7.—Rubbish.

No person shall deposit rubbish or any offensive matter on any part of the Reserve.

8.

No person other than the workman, gardeners, care-takers, or rangers referred to in paragraph 5 hereof shall light fires on the Reserve.

9.—Games.

In the event of the permit of the Reserve being granted to any person or persons or club for the purpose of enabling any particular games or game to be established on the Reserve, then so long as such permit remains in force no game shall be played on the Reserve which may prevent, hamper, interfere, or compete with any such person or persons or club in the use of the Reserve for the purpose set forth in such permit, and no person shall do or cause to be done anything which will or may be likely to interfere are country to with which will or may be likely to interfere or compete with such person or persons or club in any manner in commencing, playing, or carrying on such games.

$10. {\color{red}\textbf{--}} Enforcement.$

Any permit-holder shall have power to enforce these by-laws and take any proceedings hereunder any time.

11.-Penalties.

Any person offending against any part of these bylaws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for each offence.


