WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1934, that for the purposes of the said Act the word "Town" or "Townsite" means and includes *inter alia* any land (including privately owned subdivided land) which the Governor may see fit, as he is hereby empowered, to declare by Proclamation to be a Town or Townsite for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas all that land situate within the Sussex Road District and more particularly described, defined, and delineated in the Schedule hereto is land which the Governor may by virtue of section 5 of the said Act declare by Proclamation to be a Town or Townsite for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the said Act and of all

other powers in this behalf enabling me, do hereby declare that all that land situate within the Sussex Road District and more particularly described, defined, and delineated in the Schedule hereto shall be a Townsite, to be known as "West Busselton," within the meaning and for the purposes of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1934.

### Schedule.

All that portion of Sussex Location 5 bounded on the north by the shores of Geographe Bay from their intersection with the production north of the west boundary of Lot 33 to the production north of the western side of West street; on the east by lines commencing at the latter intersection and extending southward along the said production and part of the western side of West street to intersect the left bank of the New River; on the south by the said left bank of the New River from the last-mentioned point of intersection to intersect the west boundary of Lot 161; on the west by lines commencing at the last-mentioned point of intersection and extending northward along part of the west boundary of said Lot 161 and west boundaries of Lots 125, 28, 29, 152, and 14 and onward to and along the west boundary of Lot 33 and its production northward to the starting point.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 244 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1934, that rates throughout the district shall be uniform, except in so far as a Board may

fix the rates for any townsite or for any special area, defined for that purpose by Proclamation, at a higher figure within the limits set forth in the said section: And whereas it is desirable to proclaim and declare that all that portion of the Upper Blackwood Road District defined in the Schedule hereto shall be an area within which the Upper Blackwood Road Board may rate at such higher figure: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that all that portion of the Upper Blackwood Road District defined in the Schedule hereto shall be an area within which the Upper Blackwood Road Board may fix the rate at such higher figure as aforesaid, within the limits mentioned in section 244 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1934:—

#### Schedule.

All that portion of the Upper Blackwood Road District bounded on the northward by lines commencing at the south-west corner of Nelson Location 305 and extending east along the south and north along the east boundaries of the said location, east, south, and again east along a south, a west, and the southernmost boundary of Location 1872 and north along part of the west boundary of Location 441 and eastward along the southern side of Road No. 2519 through the last-mentioned location to its east boundary; on the eastward by a line commencing at the last-mentioned point and extending southward along part of the western boundary of Location 1007 and the western boundary of Reserve No. 2647, eastward along the southernmost boundary of the former and to and along the northern boundary of Location 4176, south along the east boundary of the last-mentioned, east and south along the north and east boundaries of Location 3567, south and north-westward along the east and south-western boundaries of Location 6664, south and west along part of the east and part of the south boundary of Location 1265 and south along the east boundary of Location 1213 to the south-east corner of the last-mentioned; on the southward by a line commencing at the last-mentioned point and extending west and north along the southernmost and part of a west boundary of Location 1213, west along part of the south boundary of Location 223 and south and west along the east and the south boundaries of Location 696 to the south-west corner of the last-mentioned; thence north-westward and west to and along the south boundary of Location 695 to its south-west corner; on the westward by a line commencing at the south-west corner of Location 695 aforesaid and extending north and west along parts of the east and north boundaries of Location 8467, north along the east boundaries of Locations 722, 721, and 720, west and north along part of the south and the west boundary of Location 734, west, north, and east along part of the south, the west, and part of the north boundaries of Location 1043 and north along the west boundaries of Locations 850 and 1033 to the starting point (exclusive of the Boyup Brook Townsite).

Kununoppin-Trayning and Nungarin Road Districts—  
Alteration of Common Boundary.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 694/37.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1934, doth hereby alter the common boundary between the Kununoppin-Trayning and Nungarin Road Districts by severing those portions of the Kununoppin-Trayning Road District described in the Schedule hereto and annexing them to the Nungarin Road District.

To come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1938.

#### Schedule.

(a) All that portion of the Kununoppin-Trayning Road District bounded by lines commencing on the district boundary on the west boundary of Reserve No. 11215 and extending north and east along part of the west and part of the north boundary of said Reserve to the westernmost corner of Avon Location 14973; thence northward along the western boundary of said location and the western boundaries of Locations 14971 and 25207 to the north-west corner of the last-mentioned; thence east along the north boundary of said Location 25207 and its continuation across the Dowerin-Merredin Railway Reserve to the southern boundary of Location 14974; thence eastward along the southern boundaries of said Location 14974 and Reserve No. 13794 and part of the southern boundary of Location 14968 to rejoin the district boundary at the production north-eastward of the south-eastern boundary of Location 14970; thence following the district boundary south-westward along the south-eastern boundary of said Location 14970, south-eastward along part of the north-eastern, and south-westward along the south-eastern boundary of Location 21309, south-westward along a south-eastern boundary of Location 14972, north-westward along the south-western boundary of the last-mentioned location and Location 26812, and westward along the southernmost boundary of Location 14973 to the east boundary of Reserve No. 11215 aforesaid; thence south along part of the east, west along the south, and north along part of the west boundary of Reserve No. 11215 to the starting point.

(b) The whole of Avon Locations 15495 and 15497 bounded by lines commencing on the present district boundary at the south corner of the latter location and extending north-westward along its south-western boundary and northward along its western boundary and the western boundary of the former location to rejoin the district boundary at the latter's north-west corner; thence following the district boundary east along the north boundary of said Location 15495 and south along its east boundary, and southward along the eastern boundary of said Location 15497 to the starting point.

Armada-Kehnscott Road District—Redivision into  
Wards.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1934, doth hereby redivide the Armada-Kehnscott Road District into five Wards, with the names, boundaries, and number of members allotted to each Ward as described in the Schedule hereto:—

#### Schedule.

##### Central Ward.

Bounded on the northward by lines commencing at the intersection of the production westward of the southern side of Lilian avenue with the eastern side of the South-Western Railway Reserve (L.T.O. Plan No. 2647) and extending east, south, east, north, and again east along said side of Lilian avenue (L.T.O. Diagram No. 9719) to the eastern side of the Perth-Bunbury road on the western boundary of Lot 120 of Canning Location 31; thence southward along part of the western boundary of said Lot 120 and eastward along the northern boundary

of Lot 119, southward along part of the western boundary of Lot 122, eastward along the southern boundary of said Lot 122 and the southern boundaries of Lots 123 and 124 (L.T.O. Plan No. 694, Sheet 1) to the north-western boundary of Lot 190; on the eastward by a line commencing at the last-mentioned point and extending south-westward along part of the north-western boundary of Lot 190 and a western side of Road No. 1479 to a southern side of the Perth-Albany road; thence in a general southerly direction along the western side of the Perth-Albany road to the northern side of Road No. 4592 (L.T.O. Plan No. 4587); on the southward by a line extending westward from the last-mentioned point along said northern side of Road No. 4592 and its production to the boundary of the Armadale Townsite as gazetted on the 26th of February, 1909, and along said gazetted boundaries to the western side of the South-Western Railway Reserve; thence southward along said side of Railway Reserve to the production south-eastward of the south-western side of Seventh road; thence north-westward to and along said side of Seventh road to rejoin the said townsite boundaries and along the latter to the western corner of Lot 59; on the westward by the said gazetted boundaries from said corner of Lot 59 to the southernmost corner of Lot 49; thence north-westward along the south-western boundaries of said Lot 49 and Lots 11 and 10 of Lot 40 to the north-western side of Eighth avenue; thence north-eastward along the north-western side of Eighth avenue and its prolongation to the eastern side of the South-Western Railway Reserve; thence northward along said side of railway reserve to the starting point. (1 member.)

#### *Kelmscott Ward.*

Bounded on the westward and northward by lines commencing on the district boundary at the intersection of the production north-westward of the north-eastern side of Road No. 1679 (a south-western boundary of Jandakot A.A. Lot 85) and extending north-eastward and eastward along the district boundary to its junction with the northern side of Road No. 2051 passing through Canning Location 516; on the eastward by a line extending south from the latter point along east boundaries of Canning Locations 516, 515, 404, and 330 and the east boundary of Kelmscott Townsite, west along part of the south boundary of said townsite and south-westward along the south-eastern boundaries of Lots 126 and 124 of Canning Location 31 (as shown on L.T.O. Plan No. 694) to the boundary of the Central Ward above-described; on the southward by the boundaries of the Central Ward to the eastern side of the South-Western Railway Reserve; thence northward along the eastern side of the said railway reserve to the production south-eastward of the north-eastern boundary of Lot 24 (as shown on L.T.O. Plan No. 694) north-westward, following said production and boundary of Lot 24 to the south-eastern side of Third avenue, south-westward along the said side of Third avenue to the south-western side of Second road, north-westward along the south-western side of Second road to the south-eastern side of Road No. 1058, south-westward along said side of Road No. 1058 to its intersection with the production south-eastward of the south-western side of Road No. 1120, north-westward along part of the south-western side of said Road No. 1120 and a north-eastern boundary of Canning Location 326, north-eastward along part of the south-eastern boundary of Canning Location 321 and north-westward along the north-eastern boundary of the latter location and a south-western boundary of Jandakot A.A. Lot 85 to the starting point. (1 member.)

#### *West Ward.*

Bounded on the northward by part of the northern boundary of the district and part of the southern boundary of the Kelmscott Ward; from the northern corner of Jandakot Agricultural Area Lot 177 to the junction of the southern boundary of the Kelmscott Ward with the western boundary of the Central Ward; on the eastward by the western and part of the southern boundary of the Central Ward and the western side of the South-Western Railway Reserve; from the said junction point to the southern boundary of the district; on the southward and westward by the district boundaries; from the last-mentioned point to the starting point. (2 members.)

#### *East Ward.*

Bounded on the northward and eastward by part of the northern and part of the eastern boundaries of the district; from the eastern boundary of the Kelmscott Ward to a south boundary of the district, being an east

and west line passing through the 105-M.P. on the boundary of the Canning Reservoir watershed; and on the southward by said east and west line and its production westward to its intersection with the western side of Road No. 6963 (Perth-Albany road); on the westward by a line commencing at the last-mentioned point and extending northward along said side of Road No. 6963 and a western side of Road No. 945 to the northern boundary of Canning Location 534, west, and south along the north and part of the west boundaries of said Location 534 to a south-east corner of Lot 33 of Canning Location 32 (as shown on L.T.O. Plan No. 4670), south-westward along the south-eastern boundary of said Lot 33 to the south-western side of a closed road on its south-western boundary, north-westward along said south-western side of said closed road to a south-eastern boundary of Lot 34, south-westward, north-westward, and north along the south-eastern, the south-western and the west boundaries of said Lot 34, west along the north boundary of Lot 4 of said Location 32 (as shown on L.T.O. Diagram No. 9569), north along part of the east boundary of Reserve No. 4127, the east boundary of Canning Location 681 and the east boundary of Lot 3 of Location 31 and westward and northward along the southern and western boundaries of Lot 4 of said location (as shown on L.T.O. Diagram No. 9094) to the eastern boundary of the Kelmscott Ward; thence east and north along the eastern boundary of the Kelmscott Ward to the starting point. (1 member.)

#### *South Ward.*

Bounded on the northward by part of the western boundary of the East Ward from the north-east corner of Canning Location 534 to the eastern boundary of the Kelmscott Ward and by part of the eastern boundary of the Kelmscott Ward and the eastern and part of the southern boundaries of the Central Ward to the junction of the latter boundary with the eastern boundary of the West Ward on the western side of the South-Western Railway Reserve; on the westward by part of the eastern boundary of the West Ward from the last-mentioned junction point to the southern boundary of the district; on the southward by part of the southern boundary of the district from the last-mentioned point to an east and west line passing through the 105-M.P. in the boundary of the Canning Reservoir watershed, and on the eastward by part of the southern and the western boundaries of the East Ward. (1 member.)

**FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.**

## FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST.

## Notice to Mariners.

No. 1 of 1938.

Australia—West Coast.

Fremantle, Outer Harbour.

Wreck marking buoys established.

Position—4 cables, 162° from the light tower on North Mole.

Details—For the special protection of launches and other small craft, a cylindrical wooden buoy, painted green, has been placed at each end of the position of the wreck "Lygnern," in anticipation of the complete disappearance during the coming winter of what little of this wreck now remains above water. Small craft, no matter how shallow their draught, are warned against attempting a passage between these buoys.

## MINES REGULATION ACT, 1906.

Department of Mines,  
Perth, 9th March, 1938.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council, acting in accordance with section 63 of the Mines Regulation Act, 1906, has been pleased to amend regulation 4 of the regulations made under and for the purposes of the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of November, 1934, and amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th day of December, 1936, by deleting from the said regulation 4, General Rule 48B and inserting in lieu thereof a new General Rule 48B as follows:—

Maximum depth of Hole where Nitro-glycerine Compound used.

48B. Subject as hereinafter provided no hole of a greater depth than nine feet shall be charged with any nitro-glycerine compound unless the consent thereto in writing of the Inspector of Mines shall have been first obtained.

Provided that this general rule shall not apply to quarries.

## MINES REGULATION ACT, 1906.

NOTICE is hereby given that His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council, acting in accordance with the powers conferred by section 63 of the Mines Regulation Act, 1906, has been pleased to amend the regulations made under and for the purposes of the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of November, 1934, by deleting General Rule 48 of regulation 4 of the said regulations and inserting in lieu thereof a new General Rule 48, as follows:—

48. Subject as hereinafter provided, the manager shall cause the times of working shifts and of blasting operations in every section of the mine to be so arranged that workmen shall not be exposed to fumes and dust from blasting.

Provided that—

- (i) Blasting shall be allowed at noon, 3 o'clock in the afternoon, eight o'clock in the evening and eleven o'clock at night.
- (ii) With the consent in every case of the manager or the underground manager, blasting may be carried on at times other than those prescribed in paragraph (i) of this proviso for the purpose of removing obstructions in ore passes or box holes, or for the purpose of making the hanging safe, or for blasting misfired holes in development faces.
- (iii) With the consent in each case of the Senior Inspector of Mines, blasting may be carried on at times other than those prescribed in paragraph (i) of this proviso for the purpose of sinking shafts and in other special work not included in paragraph (ii) of this proviso.
- (iv) Blasting shall not be carried on during crib time, unless and until the workmen have been removed to the intake side of all places where blasting is to be done and where the resultant smoke and dust will not affect them in the section where they congregate during crib time.
- (v) In any mine where ordinary mining operations are not undertaken during night shift, blasting may be carried on between the hours of midnight and six o'clock a.m. next ensuing, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained elsewhere in this proviso.

# IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 1 of 1937.

Between Hospital Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, W.A., Coastal Branch, Applicant, and the Hon. Minister for Health, Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties: And whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination: And whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred, and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference: And whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court pursuant to section 63 of the Act and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

## MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT.

(Note: Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

### 1.—Area.

The area of this Award shall be the Old Men's Home, Nedlands, and the premises connected therewith.

### 2.—Term.

The term of the Award shall be three (3) years from the 1st day of January, 1938.

### 3.—Hours.

(a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked in any six (6) days of the week: Provided that orderlies may be worked eighty-eight (88) hours in eleven (11) shifts per fortnight. The spread of shifts shall not exceed ten (10) hours.

(b) Maid at Nurses' Quarters:—The hours of work and conditions of employment shall continue substantially as at present.

### 4.—Overtime.

All time worked in excess of forty-four (44) hours in any one week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and thereafter double time: Provided that, when the overtime is necessitated through the failure of another worker to report for duty when rostered, the above conditions shall not apply, and equivalent time off shall be allowed in lieu thereof.

### 5.—Holidays.

A holiday of three (3) weeks on full pay shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of his service. A worker not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holidays in proportion to the length of his or her service: Provided that this clause shall not apply in the case of any worker summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

Public holidays:—The following days shall be observed as holidays—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday and Labour Day.

Any worker required to work on any of the foregoing days shall be paid at the rate of double time, or shall have one day added to the annual holiday for each day so worked.

### 6.—Uniforms.

Each male worker shall be supplied with one blue serge tunic and pair of blue serge trousers in every eight (8) months, or, alternatively, with two (2) pairs of blue serge trousers in every eight (8) months.

### 7.—Sick Leave.

(a) Sick leave, with pay, shall be granted on the following scale on production of an adequate medical certificate, or, in regard to leave not exceeding three (3) days, other evidence satisfactory to the Superintendent:

Over three (3) months and under three (3) years' service:—One month on full pay, and one month on half pay.

Over three (3) years' service:—Two (2) months on full pay.

(b) Sick leave may be granted in one or more periods, but the aggregate amount of leave on pay shall not in any one triennial period exceed the time provided for in the foregoing scale.

A "triennial period" shall be the three (3) years preceding the date of application.

(c) Sick leave with pay will not be granted when the illness is due to the worker's own fault, neglect, or misconduct.

(d) Any worker necessarily absenting himself from duty through sickness shall send immediately notice to his Officer-in-Charge and at once apply for sick leave.

At the discretion of the officer authorised to approve of sick leave, the medical certificate may, if so requested by the worker, be dispensed with if the period of absence does not exceed three (3) days.

Where the medical certificate is not in the first place given by a Government Medical Officer, a further certificate from a Government Medical Officer may be required. If the certificate of the Government Medical Officer does not in the opinion of the Minister, indorse the certificate first obtained, the worker shall pay the fee due to the Government Medical Officer, and leave with pay will not necessarily be granted.

### 8.—Higher Duties.

Any worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his regular pay shall be paid such higher minimum for the time actually engaged upon such higher work.

### 9.—Roster.

Rosters shall be arranged monthly and shall be posted forty-eight (48) hours before coming into operation, but may be varied without notice when necessary.

### 10.—Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid fortnightly.

### 11.—Engagement.

Retirement:—Except in cases of summary dismissal for neglect or offences, one month's notice on either side shall be given of termination of employment: Provided that, by mutual consent, notice may be waived.

### 12.—Rates of Pay.

Basic wage:—Males, £3 14s. 11d.; females, £2 0s. 5d. Workers covered by this Award shall be paid the following rates:—

Maid at Nurses' Quarters:—This worker shall be paid a margin of nineteen shillings (19s.) per week, exclusive of board and lodging. Her hours of work and conditions of employment and holidays shall continue substantially as at present.

Casual Hands.—Any worker employed for a period of less than one week shall be paid ten per cent. (10 per cent.) above the rates hereinbefore prescribed.

### 13.—Record Book.

A time book, to be open for inspection by the Union secretary at reasonable times, shall be provided, in which each worker must record the time he starts and finishes work on each day and also the times booked off for meals. The wages sheets shall be open for inspection at the Head Office of the Department by the secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Union, upon reasonable notice.

### 14.—Preference to Unionists.

All workers covered by this Award shall, within fourteen (14) days of commencing work, make application to the Hospital Employees' Union for membership.

## 15.—Board of Reference.

The Court appoints, for the purpose of the Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a Chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties, as prescribed by the regulations. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of:—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.
- (iv) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

I certify, pursuant to section 63 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, that the foregoing is a copy of the Agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.

UPON hearing Mr. John Howson Millar, the duly appointed agent of Federated Society of Boilermakers and Iron and Steel Workers' Union of Workers, Kalgoorlie Branch, No. 11 (the applicant Union first above-named not being officially represented before the Court) and Mr. Lionel Lewin Carter, the duly appointed agent of the Lake View and Star, Limited, one of the gold-mining companies affected by the proceeding (the other gold-mining companies affected though not officially represented before the Court having had due notice of the proceeding) and having heard and considered the evidence and contentions submitted on behalf of the said parties respectively, the Court, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 90 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, doth hereby order that the said Award be and the same is hereby amended in the manner indicated in the schedule hereto.

## Clause 2—Area:

Delete this clause and insert in lieu the following:—

“This Award shall apply to the gold-mining industry in the Coolgardie, North Coolgardie, Yilgarn, Dundas, Phillips River, Broad Arrow, and Mount Margaret Gold Mining Districts, East Coolgardie, North-East Coolgardie, East Murchison, Murchison, Northampton, Yalgoo, Peak Hill, Gascoyne Goldfields, and the area outside those Goldfields in Western Australia comprised within the 20th and 26th parallels of latitude.”

## Clause 3—Wages:

Delete subclauses (a), (b), and (c) of this clause, and in lieu thereof insert the following:—

- “(a) Basic wage at the rate of £4 7s. per week.
- (b) Industry allowance at the rate of twelve shillings (12s.) per week, subject to automatic increases or reductions as follow:—
  - (i) The standard price of gold per ounce in Australian currency to the nearest half-sovereign as ascertained from a return supplied by the Perth Branch of the Royal Mint, averaged for the quarter ending September, 1934, namely, eight pounds ten shillings (£8 10s.) shall be taken as the norm and equivalent to an industry allowance of two shillings (2s.) per shift or twelve shillings (12s.) per week;
  - (ii) For each increase or decrease of ten shillings (10s.) per ounce the said allowance shall increase or decrease, as the case may be, by the sum of fourpence (4d.) per shift, or two shillings (2s.) per week;
  - (iii) All calculations for this allowance shall be made on the average price per calendar quarter, and the allowance shall remain stationary as then determined until the next quarter's figures are available. The price per ounce for the purpose of this calculation shall be the nearest £ or half £;
  - (iv) Any dispute as to the amount of allowance under these provisions shall be determined by the Registrar of the Court upon figures supplied by the Perth Branch of the Royal Mint compiled similarly to the table appearing in the judgment accompanying the Mining Industry Awards. (See 14 W.A.I.G., 225.)
  - (v) Any variation in rates of pay made pursuant to the provisions hereof shall take effect as from the pay day following the fifteenth (15th) day of the calendar month following the quarter for which the calculations are made.

- “(n) Workers engaged on repair work to the roasters under circumstances subjecting them to serious inconvenience from fumes shall be entitled to payment of sixpence (6d.) per hour extra (with a minimum of one shilling (1s.)) while so engaged.
- (o) A boilermaker employed during two (2) hours or more in any one day on work which comes within the scope of a boilermaker's and/or angle-iron smith's work shall be entitled to sixpence (6d.) extra for such day's work.”

## Clause 5—Hours:

Subclause (a): Delete the words “and workers regularly working underground” appearing in the second proviso to this subclause.

Subclause (b): Delete “one (1) hour” and insert in lieu thereof “forty-five (45) minutes.”

Subclause (c): Delete and insert in lieu thereof:—

“(c) Workers working underground shall work the hours provided in Award, numbered 2 and 6 of 1934, as amended by Order numbered 134 and 409 of 1936, for underground workers.

Should the worker's service underground occupy less than the full underground shift of seven (7) hours twelve (12) minutes, he shall, on the completion of two (2) hours of such service, be credited at ordinary time rate with having performed six (6) minutes' additional service in respect of each hour's absence from the surface on duty; and, at the employer's option, this may be adjusted by allowing time off duty corresponding to such credited additional service.”

## Clause 6—Overtime:

Delete subclause (c) and substitute in lieu thereof:—

“(c) Work done on Sunday, Christmas Day, Easter Monday or Labour Day shall be paid for at double time rate.

With respect to workers under this Award working more than one shift, any worker whose ordinary rotation shift falls on Sunday or on any of the above-mentioned holidays shall be paid at time and a-third rate for Sunday work but at the ordinary time rate for work on the other days mentioned.

Any shift worker required to work more than six (6) shifts consecutively shall be paid for the seventh shift at double time rate.

Shift workers required to work weekly rotation shifts shall have their hours of duty so arranged as to permit of one Sunday in every four (4) off duty."

#### Clause 20—Apprentices:

Delete subclause (f) and insert in lieu thereof:—

"(f) Apprentices may be taken to boilermaking or to boilermaking and welding."

Between Hocking and Company, Limited, Newspaper Proprietors, Kalgoorlie, Applicant, and Printing Industry Employees' Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Respondent.

THE Industrial Board for the industry of Job and/or Newspaper Printing, in pursuance of the powers and duties conferred upon it by section 107 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, and in pursuance of a remission to it by the Court of Arbitration, doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

#### AWARD.

##### 1.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to work done in the Printing Industry.

##### 2.—Term of Award.

This Award shall operate for a period of three years from the first of January, 1938: Provided that, after the expiration of any period of twelve calendar months from the said date, application may be made for alteration, revision, or amendment by any party or person affected by its provisions.

##### 3.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the area contained within a radius of twenty miles of the Post Office, Kalgoorlie.

##### 4.—Hours of Labour.

(a) The maximum number of hours to be worked each week in the Newspaper Section shall be:—

(c) In the event of a permanent worker not being provided with work for the maximum number of hours in each week, he shall receive not less than the minimum wage for his grade provided in clause 5.

(d) "Day work" shall mean work done between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Work done by a day worker before or after these hours and/or before or after the hours of his rostered shift, shall be paid for at overtime rates.

(e) "Night work" shall mean work done between 6.30 p.m. and 8 a.m. Work done by a night worker before or after these hours and/or before or after the hours of the rostered shift shall be paid at overtime rates.

(f) It shall not be necessary for all sections to commence work at the same time but, where individual workers are called in before the usual starting time or retained after finishing time, they shall be paid overtime.

(g) In offices where a weekly as well as a daily paper is issued, time worked on the ordinary weekly issue shall be counted as part of the week's work.

(h) Provided always, that in the case of papers other than dailies, special arrangements shall be made between the union and the employer regarding the distribution of the weekly working hours.

(i) Time off:—All workers working six full shifts per week day or night (*i.e.*, workers who do not regularly get two days or two nights or Saturday afternoon after 12 noon and Sunday off consecutively) shall be allowed one full shift off every four weeks, to be paid for. In the week in which the day or night off is taken the weekly hours shall be reduced by one-sixth of the weekly hours prescribed respectively for each section.

(j) Shifts:—The maximum number of hours of an ordinary shift shall be:—

Such hours to include meal times.

Work done beyond these hours shall be paid for at overtime rates.

(k) The minimum shift for time workers shall be six hours day or five hours night, with the exception of the Saturday morning shift between 8 a.m. and 12 noon, when the minimum shift shall be four hours.

(l) In offices where a regular shift is worked between the hours set down in this Award for day work and night work, the wages shall be a rate proportionate to the number of hours day work and night work, but if more than one hour is worked beyond 6.30 p.m. the weekly hours shall be those for night work.

(m) Roster:—The working hours of each day and night of each office shall be conspicuously displayed in each workroom, and shall continue unchanged until altered by agreement between the employer and the Printing Industry Employees' Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Perth: Provided that the roster of the newspaper section may be varied by half an hour by giving twenty-four (24) hours' notice to the worker.

(n) Five-day Week:—When the employer desires to work the ordinary working hours in a five-day week, he may do so. The employer and the employees may thereupon agree upon the hours of commencing and finishing work with a starting time not earlier than 7.30 a.m. and a finishing time not later than 6 p.m.

(o) No assistant linotype attendant shall be employed at night work until he has reached the age of 19 years.

Jobbing machine compositors working part time doing newspaper work on display machines shall be paid a proportionate rate between the newspaper operator and jobbing rates, this provision to apply only when employed for more than one hour per shift on the machine. If employed for four hours or more the time operator's rate shall be paid for the full shift.

Girl in charge—10s. per week extra.

Provided that a junior worker receiving wages in excess of the rates provided in this clause shall suffer no reduction.

Basic Wage.

The basic wage upon which the rates prescribed in this Award are based is £4 7s. per week for males and £2 7s. per week for females.

- 6.—Casuals.
- (a) A "Casual" is a worker on time work paid by the hour or per day and whose term of employment in any one office does not exceed thirteen consecutive full weeks. For the purpose of this clause the continuity of employment shall not be affected by reason of an interruption in any week due to non-publication of the paper on any of the holidays provided in this Award.
- (b) If a casual employee commences duty on any day or night or is directed to attend for duty and actually attends on any day or night, such employee shall in respect of such day or night be paid at the rate herein provided and for four hours day and a full shift at night at the least.
- (c) Casuals who are sent for and whose services are not availed of shall be paid a "call" at the rate of two hours' pay at casual rates.
- (d) A casual employee, whether working on day or night shift, shall be paid for such work the hourly rate prescribed for such work, with the addition of ten (10) per cent.
- (e) Casuals working day work, if employed for a full week, shall be paid the prescribed weekly wage, with no extra allowance per shift.
- (f) If employed for a full week at night, casuals shall be paid the prescribed weekly wage, plus four shillings and threepence (4s. 3d.), with no extra allowance per shift.
- (g) A casual employee, when working overtime, shall have his rate of pay as a casual employee increased by the same proportion as the weekly worker's rate applicable to the class of work done by the casual employee is directed to be increased under this Award for work done on overtime, with the addition of ten per cent. (10%). For the purpose of this subclause "Overtime" shall mean all work performed outside the usual working hours and/or the usual shift of the section or department in which the casual worker is working, and/or if the casual worker has already performed a shift equalling the number of hours usually worked per shift in the section or department in which he is working.
- (h) A casual working for twenty-three (23) shifts in any four weeks shall be allowed one full shift off in such four weeks to be paid for: Provided that, for the week in which such time is allowed off and paid for, the extra allowance for casuals shall not apply: Provided also, that such shift allowed off and paid for shall count as a shift worked for the purpose of subclause (a) of this clause.
- (i) Casuals working mixed shifts, i.e., shifts commencing before 6.30 p.m. and ending after 6.30 p.m., shall be paid day rates: Provided the work after 6.30 p.m. does not exceed one hour. If it does, then night rates are to be paid throughout, and the guarantee to be four hours in the Newspaper Section and six hours in the Jobbing Section.
- 7.—General Conditions.
- (a) Workers regularly employed on night work, if called on to work during the day, shall be paid night work rates, and workers regularly employed on day work if called on to work at night shall be paid night work rates.
- (b) Workers shall be paid at the rate for the classification at which they are usually employed, and when put to work of a higher grade for more than one hour during a day or night shift shall receive while so employed the difference in pay between their ordinary rate and higher rate. If employed for four (4) hours or more they shall be paid the higher rate for the full shift. A worker put to work on a lower grade shall be paid his ordinary rate: Provided that a worker relieving one of a higher grade during the illness or leave not exceeding one (1) week other than annual leave of a worker who is being paid his ordinary wages shall not be entitled to the higher rate.
- (c) Conveyance home.—Whenever the finishing time of any worker in the Jobbing Section working overtime is such as to cause him to miss his usual means of conveyance home, he shall be conveyed home in a suitable manner without delay at the expense of the employer.
- (d) Payment on termination.—If an employee's services be terminated during the course of the week he shall be paid all money due to him immediately at the termination of his service.
- (e) Work not to be taken off employer's premises.—No work shall be taken off the employer's premises to be executed by any employee.

(f) Seating provision.—Any male employee whose work requires him to be seated shall be provided with a reasonably comfortable seat.

(g) Any female employee whose work permits of her being seated or requires her to be seated shall be provided with a reasonably comfortable seat.

#### 8.—Machine Operating.

(a) No person other than a composing apprentice, compositor, or duly qualified operator shall be employed to operate a linotype or other type-setting machine.

(b) Compositors learning machine operating shall be paid the compositor's time rates of wages—jobbing or news—according to the class of work in which he is engaged, and shall serve a probationary period of twelve months: Provided that at any time when a compositor shall be able to set and correct an average of seven thousand ems per hour based on minion matrices, thirteen ems measure, the matter to be solid, he shall be deemed a proficient operator and shall be paid the minimum rate for operators. The test of the operator's proficiency to be his ability to set the above number of ems in a full day on fair copy, and to approximately maintain these averages. Each employer may adopt the usual means of accurately testing the proficiency of a probationer: Provided further, that a probationer may apply for a test at any time within the twelve months.

(c) An operator shall not be required to do engineer's or attendant's work, except when he is being paid extra for looking after his machine: Provided in all cases operators shall assist in changing their machines when called upon to do so.

(d) An operator having to look after his own machine shall be paid 10s. per week extra; where a machine is worked more than one shift, the 10s. extra shall be paid to the operator on each shift.

(e) An operator required to go on hand work shall be paid the machine time rate. No operator shall be permanently changed from machine to hand work without one week's notice.

#### 9.—Overtime.

(a) Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and one third for the first two hours, time and one half for the next two hours, double time thereafter. When overtime is worked any part of a quarter of an hour shall be counted as a full quarter of an hour.

(b) Double time or double rate shall be paid for all work done on Saturday after 12 noon, and (with a minimum of four hours' work or pay equivalent thereto) on Sunday: Provided that this subclause shall not apply to the usual Sunday shift in respect to newspaper workers.

(c) Overtime shall be rotated amongst employees in the News Section and, as far as practicable, in the Jobbing Section.

(d) All overtime rates earned by an employee shall be paid in full, and no deduction shall be made from such overtime rates by reason of any time not worked by such employee.

(e) Where the hours of the ordinary working week are worked within five days any work done on the sixth day shall be paid for at double time, or double rate.

(f) Where the hours of the ordinary working week are worked within five night shifts, any work done on the sixth night shift shall be paid for at double time or double rate.

(g) Where notice of overtime in excess of one hour has not been given to any employee, including an apprentice, in the Job Printing Section during the previous shift, or where notice of overtime has been given but overtime has not been worked, 1s. 6d. shall be paid as an allowance for tea money. The same allowance shall be made for each meal reasonably occurring during such overtime work.

(h) No employee under 16 years of age shall be employed on overtime. No employee under 17 years of age, nor any female or apprentice shall be on duty in any event before 8 a.m. or later than 9 p.m. on any working day.

(i) An employer shall not require or permit any female employee to work overtime after 6 p.m., unless at least one other female person is working with her.

(j) An employer shall not require or permit an employee to work overtime or on night shift in connection with power-driven machinery unless he works in company with at least one other person: Provided that an apprentice shall not be permitted to work

overtime unless at least one journeyman from the same section is employed in company with the said apprentice.

(k) Any employee required to work more than six consecutive shifts without a clear interval of thirty-six (36) hours after the sixth shift shall be paid double rate for all work performed by him after the sixth shift until he shall have had such clear interval of thirty-six (36) hours between shifts: Provided that this subclause shall not apply where shifts are being changed, or to a case where it is necessary for an employee to work in place of an employee who is absent through sickness.

(l) Overtime shall be calculated on the actual wage received.

(m) The rates provided in this clause shall be applicable to the man in charge of the composing room and the head mechanic in the newspaper section.

#### 10.—Holidays.

(a) Every worker shall receive eighteen consecutive working days' annual holiday in each year on full pay, at a time convenient to the employer: Provided always, that should the services be brought to a termination after the expiration of three calendar months but before the expiration of twelve calendar months, the said eighteen days' holiday shall be commuted to a holiday for one day and a half for each calendar month's service or greater part thereof: Provided that, if any of the holidays mentioned in the next subclause fall within the eighteen days above-mentioned, extra days shall be added to the eighteen days in lieu thereof.

(b) One day at Christmas, one day at Easter, and Labour Day shall be paid holidays for the Newspaper Section, and Easter Monday, Boxing Day, and Labour Day shall be paid holidays for the Jobbing Section, and should an employee be required to work on these days and/or nights or on any day and/or night of his annual leave, he shall receive double pay for the time worked in addition to holiday pay: Provided that, should any of the holidays above-mentioned fall on a Saturday or Sunday and/or on the usual day or night off of any worker, another day's holiday shall be substituted. For overtime worked on any holiday the rates shall be those prescribed in clause 9, subclause (a) and calculated on the basis of the pay prescribed for work performed on any holiday.

(c) Casual workers shall receive proportionate annual holidays, provided they have worked an average of three shifts per week over a period of not less than six months.

(d) Where the employer terminates the employment within one week of a day on which a holiday occurs, the employee shall be paid for such holiday or holidays prescribed by this Award: Provided that such employee had been employed by the employer for a period of at least one month prior to the termination of the employment.

#### 11.—Termination of Employment.

Any worker having been employed for thirteen consecutive full weeks in any office shall be entitled to one week's notice that his services are to be dispensed with, and any such worker leaving his employment shall likewise give one week's notice. In the case of casual workers no notice is necessary.

#### 12.—Time Book.

(a) Each employer shall keep a time and wages book, correctly and fully written in ink, showing the name of each employee, and his occupation, the hours worked (including overtime) each day or night, the time of the commencement and the ending of each shift, and the wages, overtime, and allowance paid each week. The book shall be open for inspection by duly accredited officials of the Printing Industry Employees' Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, during the usual office hours, at the place of business of the employer. The inspecting official shall be entitled to take a copy of any entry in such book or time card, and may in any relevant proceeding tender such copy in evidence. Every book kept under this clause shall for at least twelve months



after the making of any record thereon be kept by the employer at his place of business and shall be there open for inspection under this clause.

(b) The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper posting daily of such time book.

#### 13.—Union Chapel Delegates.

Delegates chosen from the chapel of workers (but not more than three) shall be allowed the necessary time in working hours to interview the employer or his representative for the purpose of discussing industrial matters.

#### 14.—Union Officials Visiting Factory.

An employer shall permit two officials of the Printing Industry Employees' Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, to enter the workroom during working hours to interview the Father or Clerk of the Chapel or individual members, or to collect subscriptions, or to see that this Award is being observed, but shall not interview members severally in such manner as to delay work.

#### 15.—Call.

(a) A worker sent for and/or called to work otherwise than in his usual working hours shall, if he attends, be paid two hours at ordinary rates as a "call" in addition to his ordinary wage.

(b) This clause shall only apply when a worker is not notified before he leaves work that he will be required for special duty: Provided that any man so called shall be paid at least two hours at overtime rates.

(c) If no work is available to a worker when sent for or called, two hours shall be paid for.

#### 16.—Health Conditions.

(a) Type metal shavings or type metal dust shall not be permitted to accumulate in a workroom in such a manner that it may be inhaled by the workers to the detriment of their health.

(b) Dry-cleaning shall not, so far as practicable, be permitted or carried out in any room or place where lead or type metal dust is accumulated.

(c) Efficient ventilation shall be provided in all workshops and factories.

(d) The employer shall provide suitable places for workers to wash their hands.

(e) Proper facilities shall be provided by the employer for the changing and protection from dust of the clothing of workers taken off during working hours.

(f) All metalpots heated by gas or other fume-producing means shall be provided with suitable hoods, so fitted that all noxious fumes and gases may be conducted into the open air.

(g) Where artificial lighting is used it shall, as far as possible, be of such a nature and be so situated as to prevent undue strain to the eyes.

(h) A first aid ambulance chest shall be provided in all establishments, equipped to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector of Factories with all usual necessary furnishings and appliances and placed in a position approved of by such official.

(i) In workshops, factories, or offices where the floors are composed of materials known as granolithic, or concrete, or combination of cement stone or asphalt, employers shall provide some suitable mats upon which the workers may stand whilst at work.

#### 17.—Disputes.

Any dispute arising out of this Award which cannot be satisfactorily settled between the Father of the Chapel which attends to the interests of the worker concerned and the Printer shall be referred to the Union concerned and the House. If not then settled, it shall be referred to the Board of Reference.

#### 18.—Board of Reference.

(a) For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, consisting of a Chairman and one representative of the employers and one representative from the Union, nominated by the parties.

(b) The parties shall submit the name or names of persons from whom the Chairman may be chosen by the Court of Arbitration, but the Court may appoint any other person as Chairman.

(c) The Board shall hold its deliberations in private unless the majority of the representatives of the parties or the Chairman otherwise decides.

(d) A majority of the members, one of whom must be the Chairman, shall constitute a quorum.

(e) The Board may sit at such times and places as the majority may decide and may adjourn from time to time and from place to place.

(f) A member may resign at any time by certification in writing signed by him and served upon the Registrar of the Court. Any party may at any time vary its representatives and fill any vacancy.

(g) All meetings of the Board shall be convened by the Chairman by notice served upon the members thereof.

(h) The decision of the Board shall be the decision of the majority of the members and shall be signed by the Chairman and forwarded to the Clerk of the Court, who shall forthwith notify the parties.

(i) The decision of the Board may be reviewed and altered by the Court on the application of any of the parties: Provided that notice of an application to the Court to review such decision shall be given within seven days from the date thereof to the Chairman and the opposite party and the application lodged with the Registrar asking for such review within fourteen days of such decision: Provided further, that all parties shall abide by the decision unless and until the same is altered by the Court.

(j) The functions of the Board shall be:—

(i) to settle and/or determine any matters left to the decision of the Board by this Award.

(ii) to settle, allow, determine, and deal with any matter or thing which the Court may from time to time refer to the Board;

(iii) subject to the jurisdiction of the Court of Arbitration, generally to settle and/or determine any dispute or questions arising out of this Award, except a matter involving the interpretation of any of the terms thereof or any variation in the rates of wages or any other term hereof.

#### 19.—Preference to Unionists.

In the employment of persons under this Award no discrimination shall be exercised against the members of the Printing Industry Employees' Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Perth: Provided that, where a worker other than a member of the Union is engaged, such worker shall within fourteen days of engagement make application for membership of the Union, and, if accepted, shall complete such application.

#### 20.—Award, etc., to be Posted.

A copy of this Award, with any variation thereof, shall be kept posted in a prominent place in each workroom where it may be read by employees. The Printing Industry Employees' Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, shall be permitted to post notices as to Union meetings on a board at each establishment in a reasonable manner.

#### 21.—Health Notices.

Notices containing advice for the preservation of the health and protection of workmen, if provided by the Printing Industry Employees' Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, shall be kept prominently posted and displayed in all workrooms by the employer.

#### 22.—Classes of Labour.

(a) Only two classes of labour—journeymen and apprentices—shall be employed in any branch of the industry, with the exception of junior assistant readers and junior assistant linotype mechanics, as provided in this Award.

(b) Nothing in this clause shall affect the employment of boys in such work as going messages, sweeping-up, and cleaning printing machines and pulling galley proofs.

#### 23.—Meal Period.

(a) The minimum time allowance for meals shall be one hour for day workers and half an hour for night workers: Provided that by agreement with the Printing Industry Employees' Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, the period may be reduced to not less than half an hour.

(b) No employee shall be compelled to break shift except for meals, and no shift shall exceed five hours without a break for meals.

(c) Where an employee is required to work during his usual meal period, he shall be paid one-half extra on the hourly rate of his weekly wage for the time so worked and be allowed his usual meal period as soon as it can be arranged: Provided that the extra rate shall not apply when twenty-four (24) hours' notice has been given by the employer.

#### 24.—Sick Pay.

Permanent male and female workers absent through illness shall be entitled to sick pay during such illness not exceeding the wages for six (6) shifts in any one year, in the case of male workers, and not exceeding the wages for twelve (12) shifts in any one year, in the case of female workers.

The provisions of this clause shall not be deemed to exclude any right of a worker under the Workers' Compensation Act or the Employers' Liability Act.

#### 25.—Artificial Light.

Where the construction of the building is such that the worker is obliged to work in artificial light, he shall be paid ten per centum (10%) increase on the rates hereinbefore prescribed during the time he is so engaged: Provided that this provision shall not apply during the time overtime rate applies nor to occasions upon which dullness of natural light through weather conditions makes artificial light necessary, or to night work: And further provided that the attention of the employer has been drawn to the defect in the natural lighting of the building and he has failed within a reasonable time to remedy the defect.

#### 26.—Bronzing or Dusting-off.

(a) All workers employed on bronze work shall be paid double time rates while so employed. Milk shall be provided before commencing and occasionally during the progress of the work. The work shall be done in a room or place devoted solely to this operation. There shall be provided—

- (i) suitable overalls and head coverings for all persons engaged in bronzing or dusting-off, which shall be washed or otherwise effectively cleaned at least once every week when in use;
- (ii) for all persons engaged in bronzing or dusting-off, a suitable place or places for clothing put off during working hours.

(b) Every person employed in bronzing or dusting-off shall—

- (i) wash the face and hands before partaking of any food or leaving the premises;
- (ii) wear the overalls and head coverings supplied, as provided herein;
- (iii) deposit clothing put off during working hours in the place or places provided in pursuance of Clause 16 (e).

(c) Where bronzing or dusting-off is regularly done there shall be provided and maintained in a clean state and in good repair for the use of all persons employed in bronzing or dusting-off, a lavatory with a sufficient supply of clean towels and soap and nail brushes, and having a supply of hot and cold water.

(d) Where bronzing or dusting-off is not done regularly, a reasonable supply of hot water shall be available for each person engaged in bronzing or dusting-off.

#### 27.—Female Section.

(a) Rest interval for Females:—There shall be an interval of ten minutes, at a time fixed by the employer, between 10 a.m. and 11 a.m. for rest on each day, Monday to Saturday inclusive, in each week for each female employee on time work, such time to count as time worked. Reasonable facilities shall be provided by the employer for the employee to have refreshments during such interval if the employee so desires.

(b) Females not to Wash-up or Feed Machines, etc.:—A female shall not be required or permitted to wash-up or clean a printing machine; or feed any armory press or platen machine used for carton cutting, or operate any power guillotine machine, or feed any printing machine, or to do bronzing or dusting-off work.

(c) A junior female shall not be permitted to operate a power-driven stapler, puncher, or perforator until she has completed her first six months.

(d) A female employee shall not perform night-shift work.

(e) On the termination of the employment the employer shall provide the worker with a note stating the date when such employment began and the date of its termination; such note shall be the property of the worker, and shall be shown to the employer and/or a duly accredited Union official on demand.

(f) Juniors (Female):—The term "junior" shall mean a female who has had less than three years' experience or has not attained the age of 21 years, but shall not include any female in receipt of the adult wage.

(g) No department shall be exclusively manned by junior females.

#### 28.—Definitions.

(a) "Journeyman" shall mean a man who has served an apprenticeship of not less than five years or who is capable of earning and is being paid the minimum rate set out herein for his class of work.

(b) A timeworker's hourly rate for any work for which a weekly rate is prescribed by this Award shall be ascertained by dividing the weekly rate by the number of hours which constitute the employee's ordinary working week.

(c) The word "factory" or the words "factory or workshop" shall include every room or place where work in respect of which a wage is prescribed by this Award is carried out by employees.

(d) A day's work or a night's work shall mean work done between the usual hours of commencing and finishing work on any day or night shift respectively, or any mixed day and night shift.

(e) "Assistant reader" shall mean a person employed to hold and read copy and generally assist a Reader in his work.

(f) "Union" shall mean the "Printing Industry Employees' Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Perth."

(g) "Court" shall mean "The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia."

#### 29.—Clauses to cover All Workers.

All clauses in this Award shall apply equally to all workers, whether male or female, except where specifically stated otherwise.

#### 30.—Apprentices.

##### *Apprentices to Composing and Machining.*

Apprentices shall be engaged under the terms and regulations herein set forth:—

(1) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this Award.

(2) The employer of every apprentice shall keep him constantly at work and teach such apprentice, or cause him to be taught the industry, craft, occupation or calling in relation to which he is bound apprentice, by competent instruction in a gradual and complete manner, and he shall give such apprentice a reasonable opportunity to learn the same and receive, during the term of his apprenticeship, such technical trade and general instruction and training as may be necessary. And every apprentice shall during the period of his apprenticeship faithfully serve his employer for the purpose of being taught the industry, craft, occupation, or calling in relation to which he is bound, and shall also conscientiously and regularly accept such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as aforesaid in addition to the teaching that may be provided by his employer.

(3) Every office covered by this Award shall be entitled to an apprentice for every four or fraction thereof of journeymen compositors and operators permanently employed, and an apprentice for every four or fraction of four flatbed machinists, but no office shall be entitled to more than four apprentices to each section at one time. Apprentices shall not be allowed to work at night until the last year of their apprenticeship. Provided that no apprentice shall be allowed to work at night to the exclusion of a permanent journeyman. If so employed at night, he shall be paid 10s. weekly in addition to his wages in clause 30, subclause (7). The usual working hours of apprentices shall be the same as provided in clause 4 of this Award.

The term "permanently employed" in this subclause shall mean having been fully employed for a period of twelve (12) months previously.

(4) (a) An apprentice to hand composition shall be taught and instructed in all phases of hand composition and all things incidental thereto.

(b) An apprentice to letterpress machining shall be taught and instructed in all phases of letterpress machining and all things incidental thereto. For this purpose the employer shall have and use in his business at least one cylinder machine. An attendance at the Technical College or correspondence therewith, if such can be arranged, shall be a sufficient compliance with this clause as to colour printing.

(c) The term of apprenticeship shall be five years.

(5) A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be allowed, such probationary period to be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship. On completion of the probationary period application for registration shall be made to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration.

(6). (a) Before being indentured the apprentice shall prove to the satisfaction of his employer that he is physically capable of carrying out the duties.

(b) The apprentice shall submit to an eyesight test and obtain a certificate of his fitness to be apprenticed to the trade, and a copy of such certificate shall be attached to the notice of registration of the apprentice.

(c) An apprentice shall be required to prove that he has passed the seventh standard, or an equivalent examination, or to produce a certificate that he has attained that standard before being registered.

(7) The minimum weekly wage payable to an apprentice shall be—

During the first six months	20% of basic wage.
During the second six months	25% of basic wage.
During the third six months	30% of basic wage.
During the fourth six months	35% of basic wage.
During the fifth six months	40% of basic wage.
During the sixth six months	45% of basic wage.
During the seventh six months	50% of basic wage.
During the eighth six months	60% of basic wage.
During the ninth six months	70% of basic wage.
During the tenth six months	90% of basic wage.

No deduction shall be made from the wages provided in the above scale, except as provided in subclauses (44) and (45) of this clause.

The above rates shall be paid to all apprentices notwithstanding anything contained in their indentures: Provided that an apprentice receiving wages in excess of the above rates shall suffer no reduction.

(8) An apprentice shall not be allowed to operate a linotype machine until he has completed the fourth year of his apprenticeship as a hand compositor and has reached the age of 19 years. Should he be put on a machine during the fifth year he shall be given at least four (4) hours' practice a day and shall receive 10s. per week in addition to the wages above prescribed. An apprentice shall not be fully employed on a machine to the exclusion of a permanent operator.

(9) Any employer taking an apprentice on probation shall within fourteen days thereafter register such probationer by giving notice thereof to the Registrar in the prescribed Form 1 (a) in Appendix, and if at the date of coming into operation of this Award an employer is employing an apprentice or probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall forthwith apply for the due registration of such apprentice or probationer.

(10) The Court may in any case where it seems expedient to do so order that the probationary period of employment be extended for a further period not exceeding three months.

(11) The apprenticeship agreement shall be completed within fourteen days of the termination of the probationary period.

(12) All agreements of apprenticeship shall be drawn up on Form 6 in Appendix and signed by the employer, the legal guardian of the apprentice, and the apprentice. No employer, guardian, or apprentice shall enter into any agreement or undertaking purporting to add to, vary, alter, or amend any such agreement without the approval of the Court.

(13) The agreement shall be executed in triplicate; one part shall be held by the employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one shall be retained by the Registrar.

(14) Every agreement of apprenticeship shall be subject to the provision of any industrial Agreement or Award in force for the time being applicable to apprenticeship in the industry.

(15) Every agreement of apprenticeship entered into shall contain:—

- (a) the names and addresses of the parties to the agreement;
- (b) the date of birth of the apprentice;
- (c) a description of the industry, craft, occupation or calling to which the apprentice is to be bound;
- (d) the date on which the apprenticeship is to be commenced and the period of apprenticeship;
- (e) a condition requiring the apprentice to obey all reasonable directions of the employer and requiring the employer and the apprentice to comply with the terms of the industrial Award, so far as they concern the apprentice;
- (f) a condition that technical instruction, when available, shall be at the employer's expense and shall be in the employer's time;
- (g) a condition that in the event of any apprentice in the opinion of the examiners not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense during the fifth year of such apprenticeship, to enable such apprentice to reach the necessary standard;
- (h) the general conditions of apprenticeship.

(16) The Court may order the transfer of an apprentice from one employer to another, either temporarily or permanently:—

- (a) if the employer does not provide the necessary facilities for the apprentice to become proficient in his trade; or
- (b) upon the application of the employer or the apprentice, for good cause shown.

(17) The transfer of every apprentice shall be on Form 2 in Appendix, and shall be made out in quadruplicate, and shall, unless the Court otherwise directs, be signed by the late employer or his assigns, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the apprentice and the new employer. The transfer form shall be completed within one month of the date upon which the transfer is ordered to be effected.

(18) The document of transfer shall be held, one part by the late employer, one by the new employer, one by the legal guardian of the apprentice and one shall be supplied by the employer to and be retained by the Registrar.

(19) Should an employer at any time before the determination of the period of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice and guardian, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business qualified and willing to continue to teach the apprentice and pay the rate of wages prescribed by the Award or otherwise, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer.

(20) Every agreement shall include a provision that it may be cancelled, by mutual consent, by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice giving one month's notice in writing to the Court and to the parties concerned that such apprenticeship shall be terminated.

(21) On the transfer or termination of any apprenticeship from whatever cause, the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate stating what time he has served, full particulars of the branches of the trade or industry in which he has received instruction, the proficiency attained, and shall also notify the Clerk of the Court of the cause thereof.

(22) When an apprentice is discharged for cause the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge and the cause thereof to the Clerk of Court in Form 3 in the Appendix.

- (a) No apprentice employed under an Award shall be discharged by the employer for alleged misconduct until the registration of the agreement of apprenticeship has been cancelled by order of the Court, on the application of the employer.
- (b) It shall not be obligatory to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him.

Provided, however, that the apprentice may be suspended by the employer for misconduct, but in any such case the employer shall forthwith make an appli-

education for cancellation of the agreement of apprenticeship, and, in the event of the Court refusing same, the wages of the apprentice, or such portion thereof as the Court may order, shall be paid as from the date of such suspension and, in the event of the application being granted, such order may take effect from the date when the apprentice was suspended.

(23) When an apprentice cannot be usefully employed because of a strike, the employer shall be relieved of his obligations under the apprenticeship agreement during the period of the strike.

(24) Subject to subclauses 28 and 29 of this clause, time lost by the apprentice through sickness or any other cause whatsoever may, with the consent of the Court on the application of any party, be added to the original term in the apprenticeship agreement.

(25) In the event of an employer being unable to provide work for the apprentice, or to mutually agree with the legal guardian of the apprentice to cancel the agreement or arrange a transfer, application may be made to the Court to arrange for such transfer or to have such agreement cancelled.

(26) When in any case an employer is temporarily unable to provide work to employ an apprentice for his full time, application may be made by the employer to the Court for permission to employ the apprentice on other work in the factory or establishment.

(27) The employer shall pay the apprentice, in respect of time lost through compulsory military or naval training, the amount (if any) by which the wages prescribed by the Award for the trade, calling, craft, occupation, or industry exceeds the amount received by the apprentice from the Department of Defence: Provided, however, that this clause shall not apply to military or naval training imposed through failure to attend compulsory parades.

(28) All time lost by reason of compulsory military or naval training, other than the additional training mentioned in the above proviso, shall count as part of the apprenticeship.

(29) When an apprentice attends a Technical College during his ordinary working hours, the time so occupied shall be regarded as part of the term of his apprenticeship and the employer shall not be entitled to make any deduction from the wages of the apprentice for such time.

#### *Apprentices to Stereotyping.*

(30) (a) Every office covered by this Award shall be entitled to an apprentice for the first four journeymen or fraction thereof and one for every additional four permanently employed. Apprentices shall not be allowed to work at night, except in the last year of their apprenticeship. If so employed at night an apprentice shall be paid 10s. weekly in addition to his wages in clause 9: Provided that apprentice stereotypers over 18 years of age employed on weekly newspapers may work without extra pay on the night the paper is printed, if his usual weekly hours are not exceeded.

The provisions of this subclause shall only apply if the employer has facilities for teaching the apprentice in the daytime.

(b) The apprenticeship shall be for a term of five years, and no apprentice shall be allowed to commence his apprenticeship until he has attained the age of 16 years. The wages of an apprentice to stereotyping shall be those set out in this Award for apprentices to the composing and letterpress sections. The general conditions covering apprentices to the composing and letterpress section, set out herein, will, as far as they are applicable, cover apprentices to stereotyping.

(31) The Apprenticeship Board constituted under Award of Industrial Board No. 6 of 1928 and governing apprentices in the Job Printing Industry shall function in regard to apprentices covered in this Award: Provided that two representatives of the employers and two representatives from the Union shall be added to the Board.

(32) The function of the Apprenticeship Board shall be as follows:—

(a) To advise the Court as regards apprenticeship matters in the Printing Industry within the area covered by the Award, and in particular on the following heads:—

(1) the appointment or re-appointment of examiners;

(2) the preparation of a syllabus for the course of instruction from time to time;

(3) the methods of instruction to be followed;

(4) the conduct of examinations of apprentices;

(5) schemes for the institution of scholarships and prizes.

To receive monthly or other periodical reports from the instructors for the purpose of amending or correcting any laxity in attendance or conduct of apprentices at classes of instruction.

To assist in selecting the best type of apprentice and to advise upon ability of any person, firm, or company to effectively train an apprentice or apprentices and to encourage and foster the study of subjects bearing upon the trade or occupation in the evening classes or other classes instituted for the purpose.

To advise the Court and parties interested as to what additional plant is required from time to time for the effective training of the apprentice.

To assist in the promotion of classes for instruction in branches of the industry not already provided for.

To consider and recommend improvement in the training of apprentices from time to time.

(b) The Apprenticeship Board shall hold its deliberations in private, unless a majority of the representatives of the parties or the Chairman otherwise directs.

(c) A majority of the members, one of whom must be the Chairman, shall constitute a quorum: Providing that, in the case of differences of opinion between members representing the said Union of workers and members representing the employers, the decision of the Chairman shall be accepted and taken as the decision of the Apprenticeship Board.

(d) The Apprenticeship Board may sit at such times and places as the majority may decide and adjourn from time to time and place to place.

(e) The decision of the Apprenticeship Board may be reviewed and altered by the Court on the application of any of the parties: Provided that notice of an application to the Court to review such decision shall be given within seven days from the date thereof to the Chairman and the opposite parties and the application lodged with the Registrar asking for such review, within fourteen days of such decision: Provided further, that all parties abide by the decision unless and until the same is altered by the Court.

(f) Any party may at any time vary its nomination of representative member.

(33) (a) Every apprentice shall attend a Government or other approved technical school, vocational classes, or classes of instruction, for instruction in such subjects as are provided for his trade. This clause shall be deemed to have been complied with if the apprentice takes a course in an approved Correspondence School. Provided, however, that attendances shall not be compulsory when the apprentice is resident outside a radius of twelve (12) miles from the place where instruction is given. Provided also, that if technical instruction is not available in the locality in which the apprentice is employed and is available by correspondence, at reasonable cost, to be approved by the Court, the Court may prescribe such correspondence course as the technical instruction to be taken by the apprentice and paid for by the employer.

(b) Where in any case it is shown to the satisfaction of the Court that any apprentice by reason of his engagement on country work or other good cause cannot conveniently attend a technical school or other prescribed classes, such of these regulations as relate to attendance at a technical school or other prescribed classes, and to examinations, shall not apply to such apprentice, but he shall be subject to such conditions as the Court may direct.

(34) The fees for the classes attended by the apprentice shall be paid for by the employer.

(35) The period during which the apprentices are to attend such technical school or classes shall be four hours per week.

(36) Where instruction is provided for any branch of the trade, the method of training shall be as follows:—

- (a) The name of each applicant for apprenticeship, as soon as he is registered as such, shall be forwarded by the Clerk of Court to the Apprenticeship Board, which shall keep a waiting list of such enrolments.
- (b) The full course of instruction shall be designed to cover the whole period of the apprenticeship term: Provided that, in the event of failure to satisfactorily complete such course by the end of the period of instruction, the term may be extended.
- (c) Each year's instruction shall be divided into two terms, ending June and November respectively.
- (d) Each session of instruction shall consist of four hours weekly.
- (e) The syllabus covering the whole period of apprenticeship shall be drawn up by the instructors in collaboration with the Apprenticeship Board.
- (f) The instructors shall complete the course set down by the syllabus for each term in time to hold the terminal and annual examinations.
- (g) All practical work given out by the instructors shall be entered upon a "Work Docket," and this, with the student's first proof and final proof, shall be examined by the instructor, allotted the deserved number of marks, and carefully preserved in a "Dossier," for reference during and at the completion of his student course. These practical tests shall be recorded on a special form, which may be inspected from time to time by members of the Apprenticeship Board, who shall have the right to make periodical visits of inspection during class hours.
- (h) The instructors shall forward to the Apprenticeship Board a monthly report of the attendance and conduct of students, and such report to be in the hands of the secretary of the Board by the seventh day of the following month.

(37) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by the examiners hereinafter provided for.

(38) The Clerk of the Court shall notify examiners of the names and addresses of the apprentices required to submit themselves to examination.

(39) The examiners shall be persons skilled in the industry: one shall be nominated by the employers and one by the workers, for each particular branch of the trade. Failing such nomination or nominations the Court may appoint such person or persons as it may deem fit. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners, the matter in dispute shall be referred to the Apprenticeship Board, at the request of any one of the examiners, and the decision of such Apprenticeship Board shall be final and conclusive.

(40) It shall be the duty of the examiners to examine the work, inquire into the diligence of each apprentice, and, where any apprentice fails to show progress, to inquire as to the opportunities provided by the employer for such apprentice to learn, and to submit a report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination within fourteen days from the date of holding the examination.

(41) Such examination shall include theory and practice as applied to the trade, industry, craft, occupation, or calling to which the apprentice is indentured.

(42) The method of conducting the examination of apprentices in those branches of the trade where technical instruction is provided shall be as follows:—

- (a) Except in the case of the first examination, no apprentice shall be examined unless he has gained a pass in the previous examination.

(b) The whole of the practical work of the examination shall be performed at the technical college class room (in those branches of the trade where no technical instruction is provided, the examination shall be held at the factory where the apprentice is employed, and it shall then be the duty of the employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways facilitate the conduct of such examination).

(c) The terminal (June) examination shall be for theory only, and shall be conducted by the instructors during the last week but one preceding the end of the term. The questions shall also be set by the instructors, and the written answers checked, and the deserved marks allotted. These, with each student's practical work for the term under review, shall be handed to the examiners, who shall approve or otherwise of the instructors' decisions. Any divergence of opinion that cannot be agreed upon mutually shall be referred to the Apprenticeship Board, whose decision shall be final.

(d) The examiners shall, during the month of June, make their annual visit of inspection to each factory where apprentices are employed, and personally interview the employer (or foreman) and also the apprentice, and shall satisfy themselves as to the assiduity of the apprentice in his daily work, and especially as to the facilities afforded him to enable him to make the required progress in his particular branch of the trade.

(e) The examiners shall present a report to the Court as to the progress made by the students during the term, and at the same time forward a copy to the Apprenticeship Board. The terminal report shall also cover their inspection of factories.

(f) The annual examination shall take place in November. The test papers shall be set by the examiners in collaboration with the instructors. The practical tests set during the term shall be checked by the examiners, who shall also set each student a special practical test, which shall be performed under their direct supervision at the technical school class room during the second week of the examination. With these three results before them, viz., the written answers of the theory examination, the term's progressive tests already marked by the instructors, and the special tests judged by themselves, the examiners shall draw up their annual report and submit same to the Court at least three days before the date fixed for the final day of the term. A copy of such report shall be forwarded to the secretary of the Apprenticeship Board.

(g) Marks shall be awarded for these examinations as follows:—

A first-class certificate shall be granted to all who secure 90 per cent. and over of marks; a second-class certificate shall be awarded to those who secure 80 to 89 per cent. marks, while 70 to 79 per cent. shall entitle a student to a pass. Less than 70 per cent. marks shall necessitate a student continuing his studies another term.

(h) At the conclusion of the student's course he shall sit for his final examination, which shall be conducted entirely by the examiners. A student securing marks totalling 96 per cent. and over shall be deemed to have obtained "Honours," and shall be entitled to receive an additional "Honours" certificate. A first-class certificate shall be granted to all who secure 90 per cent. and over of marks. A second-class certificate shall be awarded to those who secure 80 to 89 per cent. marks, while 70 to 79 per cent. shall entitle a student to a pass. Less than 70 per cent. of marks shall necessitate a student continuing his studies another term.

(i) The Registrar shall, after each examination, issue a certificate to each apprentice indicating (on Form 4 in the Appendix) the result of his examination and the final certificate in Form 5 in Appendix.

(j) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this Award. Upon any proceedings against him in respect of such breach, the report may be received in evidence.

(k) Any apprentice claiming to have cause for complaint regarding instruction, either in technical college or in workshop, shall have the right to appeal to the Apprenticeship Board.

(l) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the Examiners, as the Court shall allow.

(43) If the Apprenticeship Board makes representations to the Court that the facilities provided by the technical college or other place of vocational training for the teaching of apprentices are inadequate, the Court may make such investigations and such report to the Minister controlling such technical college or other such place as it deems necessary.

(44) The term of apprenticeship may be extended by the Court on the failure of an apprentice to pass any of the examinations, and for such purpose it shall be the duty of the examiners to make any necessary recommendation to the Court. Any extension of the term of apprenticeship shall be subject to all conditions and stipulations in the original agreement, except as to rates of wages, which shall be such amount as the Court may determine.

(45) Upon the failure of an apprentice to pass two consecutive examinations, it shall be the duty of the examiners to report same to Court, with a recommendation as to the cancellation of the apprenticeship agreement, or such other remedial measures as they may deem advisable. The Court, after notice to all parties concerned, may cancel the Agreement or make such order in the circumstances as it may deem necessary.

available in ordinary working hours shall be  
at the expense of the employer and shall be in  
the employer's time.

(f) in the event of the apprentice, in the opinion of  
the examiners appointed by the Arbitration  
Court, not progressing satisfactorily, increased  
time for technical instruction shall be allowed,  
at the employer's expense, to enable the appren-  
tice to reach the necessary standard.

2. And the said apprentice and the said parent  
covenant with the said employer that.....the  
said apprentice during the said term will:

- (a) well, faithfully, and honestly serve the said employer as an apprentice in his trade or business aforesaid;
- (b) willingly obey the lawful orders and commands of the said employer, or of such of his representatives as he the said apprentice shall be placed under in the said business;
- (c) not do or suffer to be done or committed any waste, damage, or other injury to the property or goods of the said employer, or any firm or company of which he may be a member, or sell or lend them to any person without the consent of the said employer;
- (d) not unlawfully absent himself from the service of the said employer during working hours;
- (e) not by word or action induce other apprentices to disobedience;
- (f) duly perform and observe the covenants, conditions, and stipulations contained in this Award so far as the same relates to the apprenticeship.
3. It is hereby further agreed by and between the parties thereto:—
- (i) The apprentice shall not be entitled to receive any pay for any time during which he shall from any cause whatsoever be absent from the service of the said employer without leave;
- (ii) time lost by the apprentice through absence from any cause whatsoever shall be added to the term of this agreement and so that the amount of such lost time during any six monthly period shall be made up before the ensuing period of six months shall be deemed to commence;
- (iii) If at any time during the said term the said employer shall die or cease to carry on his business aforesaid as now carried on by him, he or his executors, administrators, or assigns shall be at liberty within one month from the date of such death or ceasing to carry on, to assign or transfer the said apprentice to some other employer upon and subject to the same or the like conditions and stipulations as are herein contained. Provided that, if the said employer or his executors, administrators, or assigns as aforesaid shall not within the said period of one month be able to find another such employer able and willing to accept the apprentice, then the said employer or his executors, administrators, or assigns as aforesaid shall have the right to discharge the said apprentice, and to terminate this agreement by giving the said apprentice one week's notice in writing;
- (iv) that if the employer shall remove his business to some place beyond the radius of three miles from his place of business at the date hereof, the parent and the apprentice may, within one month of such removal by notice in writing, elect to have the apprentice transferred to some other employer within the said radius, if there be one such able and willing to accept the apprentice, and on receipt of notice in writing of such election, the employer will use his utmost endeavours to find such an employer and to obtain the transfer of the said apprentice, and it is further agreed, that if at the expiration of three months from the date of such election there shall not have been found another such employer able and willing forthwith to accept the apprentice, then the parent and the apprentice may by a further notice in writing claim to have this agreement terminated;
- (v) if at any time during the said term the said apprentice shall neglect or refuse to obey the lawful commands of the said employer or his representative, or shall commit a breach of any of the covenants on his part herein contained, the said employer shall have the right, subject to confirmation by the Court, to discharge the said apprentice and to terminate this agreement by giving the said apprentice one week's notice of his intention so to do;
- (vi) that upon the termination of this agreement by any means before the expiration of the said term and confirmation by the Court, no proceedings shall be taken by any one party against the other or others in respect of anything which has taken place before the date of such termination;

(vii) this Agreement may be cancelled by mutual consent by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice giving one month's notice in writing to the Court;

and for the further performance of all and every of the said covenants and agreements each of the said parties bindeth himself to the other by these presents.

## DAIRY PRODUCTS MARKETING REGULATION ACT, 1934-1936.

Regulations concerning the holding of an Election for the Nomination by Producers of two Members to be appointed by the Governor under paragraph (d) of subsection (3) of section 8 of the Act and the Nomination of a Member by the Dealers under paragraph (c) of the same subsection.

1. The following special regulations shall apply to and in connection with the holding of an election to fill the offices to be vacated by the two present producers' representatives and the present representative of the dealers, pursuant to the amending Act No. 40 of 1936, on the 18th day of May, 1938.

2. Nominations from the producers and from the dealers for the two vacant offices of producers' representatives and the one vacant office of the dealers' representative shall reach the Minister not later than the 31st day of May, 1938.

3. Applications for enrolment by persons qualified to be enrolled shall be in the hands of the returning officer not later than four o'clock in the afternoon of the 8th day of April, 1938.

4. The returning officer shall complete the preparation of the rolls by the 11th day of April, 1938.

5. The closing date and time for the submission of names to the returning officer of candidates who desire to stand for election shall be four o'clock in the afternoon of the 20th day of April, 1938.

6. The returning officer shall not later than the 27th day of April, 1938, complete the printing of the ballot papers and post the same to each person whose name appears as an elector on the electoral roll.

7. The poll shall close at 4 o'clock p.m. on the 18th day of May, 1938.

8. Subject to the foregoing specific regulations all the regulations made under the Act and published in the *Gazettes* of the 17th day of May, 1935, and the 5th day of March, 1937, shall apply to the special election.

Amendments to Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th day of May, 1935.

1. A new regulation is added after regulation 43 of the Regulations made under the Act and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th May, 1935, as follows:—

43A. Any person who, not being entitled to be enrolled as an elector for the purpose of an election held under the Act, makes a claim to be enrolled, and any person who makes any statement which is to his knowledge false in any application for enrolment, or in any statement accompanying a ballot paper verifying the elector's right to vote, commits an offence under these regulations and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

2. Form No. 14, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th day of May, 1935 (page 1014), is amended by striking out all words after the word "roll" in line two of paragraph (6) and inserting the following at the end of the form:—

I, the abovenamed (a).....hereby state that the particulars furnished in the above application are true and correct and I make this statement with full knowledge of the fact that any wilfully false statement in this respect is punishable under the regulations made under the Act by a fine not exceeding fifty pounds.

3. Form No. 16, as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th May, 1935 (page 1015), is amended—

(a) by striking out the word "declaration" at the beginning of the title to the form and substituting the word "statement";

(b) by striking out the words at the commencement of the form beginning "I" down to and including the words "declare that" and substituting the following:—

I (a).....of (b).....in the State of Western Australia (c).....hereby submit the following facts in verification of my right to vote, according to the accompanying ballot paper:—

(c) by striking out all words after the word "election" in paragraph (3) down to and including the words "before me" in the provision for the attesting signature and substituting the following paragraph and further details:—

(4) That I make this statement with full knowledge of the fact that if it is wilfully false in any particular I am liable to a penalty under the regulations not exceeding the sum of fifty pounds;

## AGRICULTURAL SEEDS ACT, 1923.

## Regulations.

1. Sales of seeds by the grower to a seed merchant are exempted from the operation of the Agricultural Seeds Act, 1923 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), and sales of seeds by a farmer who does not carry on the business of a seed merchant to another farmer who resides within ten miles of the residence of the seller are exempted from the operation of the Act.

2. The name of the agricultural seed to be written on or attached to a parcel of agricultural seeds shall be the common name of the seed. The common names of seeds and plants having the botanical names set out in Appendix A shall be the common names as stated in such appendix.

3. In the application of section 6 of the Act, the following provisions shall apply:—

- (a) The proportion in which seeds contained in a mixture are mixed shall be stated by weight.
- (b) The percentage of pure seeds capable of germination shall be expressed by number.
- (c) In the case of seeds belonging to the family Leguminosae, hard seeds, if any, shall be stated as a percentage of the pure seeds.
- (d) The proportion or amount of weed seeds shall be expressed as a percentage of the weight of the parcel.
- (e) The proportion or amount of impurities shall be expressed as a percentage of the weight of the parcel.
- (f) In the case of lupin and lucerne seeds, the country or State where the seed was grown (country of origin) shall be indicated on the label or statement.

4. Any statement in regard to germination, weed seeds, and impurities shall be deemed correct if on examination by the botanist it does not differ from his finding more than the limit of variation stated in Appendix B.

5. The minimum amount of seed required to constitute a sample under section 7 of the Act shall be as stated in Appendix C.

6. The seeds of the plants mentioned in Appendix D are hereby declared to be noxious weed seeds for the purposes of section 11 of the Act.

7. For the purposes of section 11 of the Act, the proportion of weed seeds which may be contained with agricultural seeds shall be those proportions set forth in respect of the various weed seeds as set forth in Appendix E.

8. The fee for an examination or for a copy of a report by a botanist shall be as stated in Appendix F.

9. Any person who commits a breach of or fails duly to observe any of these regulations shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.
