102 of the Factories and Snops Act, 1920-1937, that it shall be lawful for shops to which the said section applies (except those in certain districts named in the subsection) to remain open until nine o'clock on one evening in the week, subject to the provisions of the said subsection, and that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation issued on the petition of a majority of the shopkeepers affected determine the day on which such shops shall so remain open in each week on which such shops shall so remain open in each week for any district: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor by a majority of the keepers of such shops in the Black Range Shop District, praying that the day on which such shops in that district shall remain open till nine o'clock in the evening shall be Saturday, and it is desirable to accede to the prayer of such petition: Now, therefore I, the said Lientenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and determine

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-21, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture or by any other speci-fied means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lientenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:-That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets for a period of five years as from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has approved of the undermentioned regulations under the provisions of the Money Lenders Act, 1912-1937.

MONEY LENDERS ACT, 1912-1937.

Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Money Lenders Act Regulations.

2. All regulations heretofore made under and for the purposes of the Money Lenders Act, 1912 (as amended), are hereby repealed.

Form of Application for Registration and Renewal.

3. (1) Every application for registration or renewal of registration as a money lender shall be made in the Form No. 1 in the Appendix to these regulations and shall be signed by the applicant and lodged in triplicate with the Clerk of the Court of Petty Sessions where the application is to be heard at least 14 days prior to the hearing of the application.

(2) Such application shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed by subsection (3) of section 6 of the Act, together with a lodgment fee of 5s.

4. An application for registration or renewal of registration may be signed, in the case of a firm, by any partner or other person duly authorised on behalf of such firm and, in the case of a society or corporate body, by the person responsible for its management, and sealed with the seal of such society or corporate body.

Applications to be Numbered.

5. Every application shall be numbered consecutively in the numerical order in which it is lodged with the Clerk of Petty Sessions commencing in each year with the numeral one.

Certificate of Character of Applicant.

6. Every application for registration shall be accompanied by a certificate in the Form No. 2 in the Appendix to these regulations as to the character of the applicant, and such certificate shall be signed by three reputable persons, who shall have no interest in the application but who shall possess a personal knowledge of the applicant.

7. Where application is made by or on behalf of a firm, such application shall be accompanied by a certificate as aforesaid in respect of the character of each partner, and where application is made by or on behalf of a society or corporate body, such application shall be accompanied by a certificate as aforesaid of the character of the person responsible for its management.

License to be lodged on Application.

8. (a) An applicant for renewal of registration shall lodge his current license with the Clerk of Petty Sessions at the time of application.

(b) An applicant for registration other than renewal shall, if he has at any time been registered as a money lender, lodge with his application the license, or a certified copy thereof, which was last held by him.

Certified Copy of License.

9. Whenever any license or certified copy is lost or destroyed, the licensee may apply to the Clerk of Petty Sessions at the Court from which the original license was issued, and on being satisfied that such license has not been cancelled or suspended, and on the payment of a fee of one pound $(\pounds 1)$, the Clerk of Petty Sessions shall deliver a certified copy of the license to the license or some person authorised by him.

The copy shall contain all indorsements appearing on the original, and the words "certified copy" shall be stamped or written across the face thereof.

Copies of Application to be Posted.

10. The Clerk of Petty Sessions shall on receipt of an application for registration or renewal of registration forthwith post in a conspicuous place on the outside of the court house a copy of such application, and shall keep such copy posted for seven clear days before the day of the hearing of the application,

Application for Registration to be Advertised.

11. (1) An applicant for registration other than for renewal shall advertise his intention to apply for registration in at least one issue of a newspaper circulating in the district wherein his proposed place of business is situate.

(2) If the application is in respect of more than one place of business, a similar advertisement shall be inserted in local newspapers circulating in the district in which the additional places of business are respectively located.

(3) Evidence that this regulation has been complied with shall be lodged with the Clerk of Petty Sessions at least three clear days before the hearing.

Hearing.

12. No application for registration shall be heard by the Court unless a period of fourteen clear days has elapsed from the date of the issue of the newspaper containing a copy of such application.

Clerk to keep a Register.

13. The Clerk of Petty Sessions shall keep a register, called the "Register of Money Lenders," in the Form No. 3 in the Appendix to these regulations, and on receipt of an application shall forthwith record such particulars prescribed therein as shall then be available.

Objections.

14. Any person may object to the granting of registration or renewal of registration by lodging with the Clerk of Petty Sessions a notice signed by him in the Form No. 4 in the Appendix to these regulations.

15. Notice of objection shall be lodged at least three clear days before the date of hearing.

16. On receipt of any such notice the Clerk of Petty Sessions shall forthwith post a copy of such notice to the applicant.

. 17. Upon hearing the objection, if the Court is of opinion that the objection is frivolous, the Court shall have power to order that the objector pay the applicant his costs incurred in sustaining his application.

License to be Issued.

18. On the granting of registration or renewal of registration by the Court, the Clerk of Petty Sessions shall forthwith record such fact in the Register of Money Lenders, and shall issue to the applicant a license in the Form No. 5 in the Appendix to these regulations.

19. The license shall be printed in triplicate and the duplicate shall be forwarded by the Clerk, upon the granting of the license, to the Registrar of Bills of Sale, Supreme Court, Perth.

If through an error it is necessary to cancel a form of license made out or issued, the three copies shall be marked "cancelled" by the Clerk of Petty Sessions, and the original and triplicate copies shall be retained by the Clerk of Petty Sessions. The duplicate copy shall be forwarded to the Registrar of Bills of Sale, and on no account shall the license be destroyed.

20. Every registered money lender, upon ceasing to carry on business, or upon changing his place of business, shall immediately notify the Clerk of Petty Sessions, who shall forthwith record such facts in the Register of Money Lenders kept by him.

Returns.

21. Upon the cancellation or suspension of registration by order of any Court, the Clerk shall forthwith send to the Registrar of Bills of Sale notice thereof in the Form No. 6 in the Appendix to these regulations. Every such notice shall be numbered, commencing in each year with the numeral one.

The General Register.

22. The Registrar of Bills of Sale shall keep a register called "The General Register of Money Lenders," in the Form No. 7 in the Appendix to these regulations, and shall enter therein in alphabetical order the name of every person licensed as a money lender by any Court of Petty Sessions in the State, together with the particulars prescribed therein.

The register shall be compiled from the information contained in the duplicate copies of the licenses and such other returns as shall be furnished by the Clerk of Petty Sessions.

The duplicate copies of the licenses and the returns shall be filed in numerical order under the respective districts, and it shall be the duty of the Registrar to see that all such copies and returns issued by the Clerk of Petty Sessions are received and are duly registered.

23. The General Register of Money Lenders shall be open to the public for the purpose of search at all times, during office hours, on payment of a fee of one shilling.

24. Every Clerk of Petty Sessions shall on the 1st day of July in each year send to the nearest officer in charge of police a list of the names of every registered money lender who has failed to lodge an application for renewal of registration for the current year.

Hawkers.

1. (a) No person shall hawk any fruit, fish, vege-tables, drapery, soft-goods, hardware, or any other articles of merchandise within any part of the Board's district without first obtaining a license from the Board.

(b) Provided that nothing contained in these by-laws shall apply to :-

- i. any person or persons or company carrying on a business or trade whose premises are regis-tered under the Shops and Factories Act;
- ii. a registered milk vendor;
- iii. any church, association, club, or charitable organ-isation established in the district for the benefit of the public.

(c) Any person who trades or travels on foot or with any vehicle or animal, or carries to sell or expose or offer for sale within the Board's district any of the articles or things above named, shall be deemed to hawk same.

A Hawker's License shall be in the Form No. 1 in Schedule A attached hereto.

(d) The fees to be paid for a license issued to a hawker shall be as set forth in Schedule B attached hereto.

Stall-keepers.

(a) No person shall keep or conduct any movable or temporarily fixed stall in or near any street or way, recreation ground, or reserve within the Board's district for the sale of any fruit, fish, vegetables, meat, or any articles of merchandise unless he shall be the holder of a current license from the Board entitling him so to do.

(b) A Stall-keeper's Liceuse shall be in the Form

No. 2 in Schedule C attached hereto. (c) The fees to be paid for the license issued to a stall-keeper shall be as set forth in Schedule D attached hereto.

3. Every person who wishes to obtain a Hawker's or Stall-keeper's License shall apply in writing to the secretary of the Board therefor, stating the term and kind of merchandise for which he desires to be licensed.

The granting of or refusing of a Hawker's or Stall-keeper's License shall be in the absolute discretion of the Board, and on such terms and conditions as the Board may deem fit, and, when granted, shall not be transferable.

The Board may refuse to grant a license for any reason it may see fit, and every license granted under these by-laws shall remain in force for the period stated therein only.

4. Every hawker, whilst hawking, and every stall-keeper, whilst using or occupying his stall, shall carry his license with him, and shall at all times produce the same on demand to any officer of the Board, or to a Police Officer.

5. The secretary of the Board or other officer ap-pointed by the Board, or any officer of the Police Force, may demand from and require of any individual committing or suspected of committing any offence against or breach of these by-laws, his name and address, and every person who shall refuse or neglect to give his name and address when required so to do shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

6. Every person offending against any provision of these by-laws shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1934, the Road Board of any district is empowered to make bylaws for all or any purpose in the said Act mentioned, the Belmont Park Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other anthority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-law:---

1. No person shall within the limits of the Belmont Park Road District, except within the area set forth in the Schedule hereto, but not less than 50 feet from any road or footpath within such area:—

(a) quarry for stone, gravel, or other material, or

(b) do any act or thing for the purpose of recovering any stone, gravel, or other material whereby an excavation is created or enlarged,

without the license of the Board in writing first had and obtained.

2. An application for license to excavate shall be made in writing to the Board and shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee and a plan of the area in which it is desired to excavate, and such plan shall show the situation and estimated size of the proposed excavation, and the distances thereof from adjacent buildings, roads, and footpaths. The Board may either grant or refuse such application or may grant the same subject to such conditions as the Board shall think fit.

3. The fee payable to the Board for the issue or renewal of a license shall be five shillings.

4. A license, nuless previously cancelled by the Board for a breach thereof, shall remain in force for a period of six months, or for such other period as may be specified therein and no longer, and may be renewed by the Board upon payment of the prescribed fee and upon the same or such other conditions and for such further period as the Board shall think fit.

5. On a breach of any condition on which a license is held the Board may cancel the license by notice in writing to the licensee, and such notice may be served on the licensee by letter, posted by ordinary post addressed to him at his address appearing on his application.

6. If any person shall either by act or omission contravene this by-law, or, being a licensee, shall commit any breach of the conditions under which his license is held, or being the owner or occupier of property within the Belmont Park Road District shall knowingly permit any act or omission in contravention of this by-law on any property owned or occupied by him, he shall be gnilty of an offence, and on conviction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT.

(Note .-- Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.-Area.

This Award shall have effect over all hotels within the jurisdiction of the State Hotels Department.

2.—Term.

This Award shall remain in force for a term of three (3) years.

3.—Honrs.

The ordinary working hours for all workers shall not exceed forty-four (44) in any one week and shall not exceed eight (8) hours in any one day. Any worker (except as provided in clause 19) who works a lesser number of hours per week shall be paid a full week's wage.

4.—Spread of Shifts.

(a) Subject to clause 8, the longest spread of shift in any one day shall not exceed twelve (12) hours.

(b) Daily spread of shift shall mean the time which elapses from the worker's starting time to the worker's finishing time for the day.

(c) Weekly spread of shift shall mean the aggregate number of hours contained in the daily spreads for a week.

(d) The weekly spread of shifts shall not exceed seventy-two (72) hours.

(e) In addition to one break for meal hour there shall be not more than one break in any shift, such break to be not less than two (2) hours.

(f) Night shift shall mean when the worker finishes work for the day after 8 p.m. Any work done after twelve o'clock midnight and before five o'clock a.m. shall be paid at treble time rates in the case of females and time and a half in the case of male workers.

(g) Not more than three (3) night shifts shall be worked in any one week, or, as an alternative, day and night shifts alternate weeks.

5.-Wages.

The minimum wages payable to workers employed in the capacities hereinafter mentioned shall be as follows:-

A district allowance of seven shillings (7s.) per week will be paid at Gwalia.

6.-Board and Lodging.

For all workers where full board and/or lodging is provided and availed of the employer shall be entitled to deduct for board fifteen shillings and twopence (15s. 2d.) for males and fourteen shiftings and twopence (14s. 2d.) for males and fourteen shiftings and tempence (14s. 10d.) for females, and where lodging is provided six shiftings and ninepence (6s. 9d.) for males and six shiftings and sixpence (6s. 6d.) for females within the South-West Land Division (excluding the Metropolitan Area.)

Area). In all other portions of the State, excluding the South-West Land Division, he shall be entitled to deduct seventeen shillings and fivepence (17s. 5d.) and seven-teen shillings (17s.) respectively for board and seven shillings and eightpence (7s. 8d.) and seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) respectively for lodging where reasons provided and exciled of same are provided and availed of.

If full board is not provided and/or availed of by the worker, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wage of the worker a sum proportionate to the board availed of.

Full board shall mean three (3) ordinary meals a day. Workers sleeping in shall be provided with a common sitting room apart from their bedrooms, and shall also have access to bathrooms provided for them.

Not more than two (2) workers shall be required to share a bedroom.

If the worker shall consider the accommodation unto a Board of Reference for decision, as provided in clause 25.

7.—Meals.

(a) Workers shall be provided with three (3) meals per day as per menn.

(b) One clear hour in every six (6) consecutive working hours shall be allowed each worker for meal time.

8.—Overtime.

All work done outside the daily spread provided in clause 4, or beyond eight (8) hours in any one day, or beyond forty-four (44) hours in any one week, shall be deemed to be overtime.

Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of one third in addition to the ordinary rate herein prescribed.

No worker shall work for any employer for a longer period of overtime than four (4) hours in any one pay week, except:-

- (a) during the period from Twenty-third December to the Sixth day of January
- (b) the week preceding and the week succeeding
- Easter Sunday; and (e) the week during which an Agricultural Show is held:

when in each of such weeks the maximum period of overtime permissible shall be ten (10) hours, the employer paying double time for all hours of overtime worked in excess of four (4) hours in the pay week: Provided that no worker shall work overtime for a longer period than two (2) hours in any one day if other suitable labour is available.

When computing overtime the district allowance shall not be computed as an addition to the day's pay.

9.-Weekly Holidays.

All workers shall be entitled to one full day off per week.

10.-Public Holidays.

All work done on Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

Provided that any worker whose ordinary day off falls on any of the aforesaid public holidays, he or she shall be entitled to an extra day off during that week, or, as compensation, one extra day's pay.

11 .- Annual Holidays.

On the completion of twelve (12) months' service each worker shall be entitled to three (3) weeks' holiday on full pay, including board and lodging allowance.

The annual holiday shall be granted within three (3) months of its becoming due.

Provided that any worker who shall have served one month or over, and whose contract of service shall have been terminated by either party for any cause other than misconduct before the annual holiday becomes due, such worker shall be entitled to receive a proportionate allowance of holiday pay for the time actually served.

Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his or her employment for any cause whatever.

12.-Weekly Wage.

Wages shall be paid weekly.

Except for ensual workers, the contract of service shall be on a weekly basis: Provided that one day's notice of termination shall be given on either side.

13.-Record.

The employer shall keep or cause to be kept at his business premises, or at each one of them if more than one, a time and wages book, wherein shall be entered the name and occupation of each worker, the time he or she commences and finishes work each day, the hours worked each day, and the wages paid to each worker each week. Such book shall be entered up from day to day, and shall be initialed daily, if correct, by each worker.

The book shall be open to inspection by a duly anthorised representative of the Union, who shall be permitted to take extracts therefrom, on a portion of the employer's premises, during all working hours.

14.—Roster.

A roster of the working hours of all workers shall be exhibited in each establishment in the kitchen or pantry, in such a place as may be conveniently seen by each worker concerned; such roster to be compiled weekly, and shall denote the hours to be worked by each worker for the week ahead, and shall be open for inspection by Union officials during all working hours.

15.-Change and Rest Room.

Adequate change and rest rooms shall be provided by the employer, in cases where the workers do not reside on the premises. In case of complaint, the matter may be referred by either party to a Board of Reference for decision.

16.—Uniforms.

The wearing of head bands is prohibited.

Where female workers are required to wear white aprons, stiff white cuffs and/or collars, or male workers to wear white coats, the employer shall provide and launder them. They shall remain the property of the employer.

If the employer requires workers to wear coloured uniforms, other than plain black, he shall provide and launder same.

17.-Women Climbing Ladders.

Female workers shall not be permitted to perform any work requiring the climbing of ladders.

18 .- Preference of Employment.

Preference of employment shall be given to members of the Hotel, Club, Caterers, Tea Rooms, and Restaurant Employees' Industrial Union of Workers: Provided that any worker or applicant for employment who is a member of another recognised industrial Union, and who produces proof of such membership, shall be entitled to equal preference: Provided that such worker or applicant shall, within fourteen (14) days of the expiry of his current ticket with the other Union, make and complete an application for membership with the Hotel, Club, Caterers, Tea Rooms and Restaurant Employees' Industrial Union of Workers.

19-Casual Workers.

(a) A casual worker shall mean a worker engaged on an honrly contract of service.

(b) Casual workers shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(c) Casual workers shall not be engaged for less than three (3) hours.

(d); Fares to and from the place of engagement and the job shall be paid by the employer.

(e) The wages payable to a casual worker shall be handed to the worker immediately on completion of the engagement.

20.-Higher Duties.

Any worker engaged for one hour or more in any day in any work carrying a higher rate of wage shall receive such higher rate for the actual time worked.

21.-Under-Rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed in writing between the Union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four (24) hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon, such wages as shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker after twenty-four (24) hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the ap-plication mentioned, and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determinimion of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six (6) calendar months from the date thereof and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have again been fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the Union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

22.-Payment for Sickness.

On production of an adequate medical certificate or other evidence satisfactory to the Department, a worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one half day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

23.-Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints for the purposes of this Award a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a Chairman, who shall be a person elected by the representatives of the parties, if such may be agreed upon, or, failing such agreement, appointed by the Court, and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by the employer and the other to be nominated by the Union. Either party may at any time by notification to the other party and the Registrar of the Court change such representative.

(b) There shall be assigned to such Board or Boards the functions of :-

- (i) deciding matters specifically referred to in the Award as being the subject-matter of a decision of the Board;
- (ii) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the (iii) deciding all matters and questions referred to
- (ii) deciding an inatters and questions referred to in the Award as being the subject of mutual agreement, if not agreed upon;
 (iv) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board or Boards from time to
- time.
- (v) An appeal shall lie from any decision of a Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which for this purpose are embodied in and form part of this Award (regulation 92).
- (vi) There shall be no cessation of work pending the reference to and the settlement of any dispute by a Board.

I certify, pursuant to section 63 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, that the foregoing is a copy of the Agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.

Between Anstralian Workers' Union, Westralian Gold-fields Mining Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and West Australian Goldfields Firewood Supply, Limited, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties :---

AWARD.

1.—Area.

The Award shall operate over the land and premises owned or used by the West Australian Goldfields Fire-wood Supply, Limited, in connection with its operation or incidental thereto.

2.—Term.

The term of the Award shall be for two (2) years, and shall take effect on the first day of March, 1938.

3.—Wages.

The minimum wages payable to these workers shall be:-

(a) The basic wage for the time being, the present basic wage being four pounds seven shillings (£4 7s.) per week.

Notwithstanding that the rates above are expressed in weekly amounts, it is hereby declared that the contract of service is a daily contract subject to clause 16. (c) District Allowance:—In addition to the basic wage and the margin above-mentioned, each of the said workers employed in any portion of the respondent's operations conducted at a distance of ten (10) miles or more from the Kelgeorija Peet Office shell be entitled to more from the Kalgoorlie Post Office shall be entitled to a district allowance at the rate of six shillings (6s.) per week, payable for each day upon which the worker is This employed or is available and willing to work. allowance shall also apply to pieceworkers.

4 .--- Hours for Day Workers.

Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked as follows:—Eight (8) hours on each day from Monday to Friday inclusive and four (4) hours on Saturday: Provided, however, that by agreement be-tween the union and the employer the forty-four (44) hours may be worked in five (5) days, Monday to Fri-day inclusive, of eight (8) hours forty-eight (48) minutes each.

5.—Overtime.

All work performed beyond the specified hours of duty on any ordinary day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter. Except for the service referred to in clause 26 work done on Sundays and

holidays shall be paid for at the rate of double time. When computing overtime the district allowance shall not be computed as an addition to the day's pay.

6.-Subcontracting.

(a) All the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth as far as applicable to them respectively shall be observed and carried out by the Company themselves, and by their subcontractors and also by the workers, anything which herein may be read to the contrary notwithstanding.

(b) For the more effectively securing the due observance and performance of the last preceding clause, and the carrying ont of the terms and conditions hereinafter mentioned, the Company, so far as concerns their own acts, and so far as permitted by law, agree that no subcontractors under them shall be allowed to operate on or use the lines, lands, and/or places under the control of the Company for the purpose of supplying firewood without such person or Company first having agreed in writing to the terms and conditions of this Award.

(c) Before any subcontractor shall be allowed to commence operations on or use any of the said lines, lands, and/or places controlled by the Company, he shall notify in writing the secretary of the Union whose members are affected that such subcontractor has agreed in writing to the terms and conditions of this Award.

- -

7.-Holidays.

The following shall be holidays-Christmas Day, Labour Day, and Easter Monday.

8 .- Annual Holidays.

Subject to the proviso herein, a fortnight's holiday on full pay shall be granted once in each year to every worker: Provided he has worked two hundred and ninety-eight (298) working days at ordinary rates of pay; should he have worked on less than two hundred and ninety-eight (298) working days, when the said holiday is taken, or at the termination of his employment, he shall be paid for or allowed a pro-portionate number of holidays. Payment for the said holidays shall be at the rate of pay the worker is receiving immediately before the holiday is taken or employment terminated.

Provided that, should any worker take part in a strike he shall thereupon be deemed to have forfeited any right to holidays accrued to the date of the commencement of the strike under this clause.

Pieceworkers shall be entitled to be paid when on holiday the minimum rate for their grade.

9.—Stores and Supplies.

The Company shall, during the currency of this Award, sell stores and supplies to the workers at Kalgoorlie cash prices, such prices to be revised from time to time by the representative of the workers and the head storekeeper on behalf of the Company on the basis of information obtained by them from the Traders' Association at Kalgoorlie and the principal business firms of Kalgoorlie. Meat prices to be similarly regulated and revised on the basis of the cash prices as obtained from the principal butchers of Kalgoorlie.

10.—Feeder.

(a) Where twelve (12) or more horses are in any

(a) where twerve (12) or more horses are in any camp a feeder shall be employed.
(b) Where the number of horses is more than two (2) and less than twelve (12) a leading driver shall be employed for the purpose at the rate of five pounds seventeen shillings (£5 17s.) per week on a daily contract of service. (Base £4 7s., margin £1 10s.)

11.-Water.

Good drinking water shall be supplied free to all workers, and, in the case of bush workers, shall be de-livered into tanks along the line where the men are working, and in no case shall the distance between tanks be more than half a mile.

12.-Piecework.

(a) Where workers are employed to work at piecework, the rates shall be in accordance with the attached Schedule, but in no case shall payment be less than they would have received had they been working under a contract of daily service at the rates fixed in clauses 3 or 23 hereof (overtime, if any, not being included): Provided, however, that in the case of a worker who has not had three (3) months' experience the minimum rate shall be such as may be mutually agreed upon be-tween the representative of the Union and the bush boss in each case, and, in the event of their disagree-ment, may be referred to the Resident Magistrate for the district. Each such inexperienced worker shall during his period of probation be deemed to be an appren-tice. At the end of each period of six (6) months the Company shall furnish the Registrar with a return showing the number of workers employed under this proviso and the wages and/or other payments made to each.

The Court reserves leave to either party at any future date on giving seven (7) days notice to further apply regarding the subject-matter of the proviso to this subclause.

(b) For the purpose of ascertaining whether each piceeworker is receiving less than the minimum rate under the preceding subclause, the total earnings of such piceeworker for the period of the last preceding two (2) months shall be averaged.

13.-General Conditions of Piecework.

(a) Except in the case of wheel or curve blocks, the minimum frontage shall be two (2) chains for each man in any one party, with a maximum frontage of six

(6) chains, irrespective of the number of men in the party. In the case of double banking, the original cutter shall have the choice of ends.

(b) Cutting or splitting shall be left to the option of the cutters so that they shall not be idle whilst fire-wood is being carted from the back of their blocks.

(c) When a team or teams are earting wood for cutters who have cut out their blocks, such team or teams shall not be withdrawn until all the firewood of the cutter has been cleaned up.

(d) If two (2) or more parties of cutters require blocks at the same time, they shall draw lots for precedence, and the bush boss shall conduct the drawing and measure out the blocks and distribute them between the cutters. Subject to the order of drawing, cutters shall be supplied with new blocks as soon as they have cut out their old blocks: provided their services be re-quired. No cutter shall take a block on his own authority.

(e) In the event of trees being unsuitable to cutters, such trees need not be felled. If a dispute arises as to what constitutes unsuitable trees, the bush boss and the workers' representative shall decide the question. If they cannot agree, the trees in dispute shall be felled and cut and loaded by the cutter at the rate of two shillings (2s.) per hour.

(f) Camps shall be placed so that cutters shall not have to walk more than a mile to the front of the block where they are working. In the case of large blocks tanks shall be placed so that the water shall be available within one and a half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ miles from where the cutters are working.

(g) Wood shall be trucked within five (5) weeks from the time the blocks are cleaned up and, so far as possible, in the order in which it is carted.

(h) (i) Wood burnt on the line shall be paid for at seven shillings (7s.) per load for green wood and eight shillings (8s.) per load for dry wood to the wood cutters, and at the rate of one shilling (1s.) per load for green wood and one shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per load for dry wood to the drivers.

(ii) Wood burnt on trucks shall be paid for at tonnage rates based on the average weight of the rake.

(i) Wood belonging to each cutter or party to be loaded into trucks separately as far as practicable, except when cleaning up the line.

(j) Cutters shall peg their blocks from a point to a line as directed by the bush boss and the Company shall clear the tip.

(k) Cutters who are desirous of leaving their blocks shall give the Company notice, and their wood shall be trucked and paid for within four (4) days after cart-ing, and payment forwarded, when necessary, by registered letter to any address left by the worker. This shall also apply to cutters who have severed their connection with the Company.

(1) Cutters may obtain advances in cash or stores from the Company up to seventy-five per cent. (75 per cent.) of the estimated value of the sum coming to them for wood lying out on their blocks, or on the line; the value of such stores or supplies shall be taken as payment or part payment for any such firewood.

(in) (i) The wood shall be cut in accordance with the following extracts from the mine specifications, viz .- the Company shall supply firewood of locally grown timber, other than black oak, in lengths of five (5) feet with a diameter, if unsplit, of not more than ten (10) inches nor less than three (3) inches at either end, but, if the firewood exceeds ten (10) inches at both ends but does not exceed twelve (12) inches at both ends, the same shall be split in half, and, should the firewood exceed twelve (12) inches at both ends, shall be split in four (4) pieces.

(ii) All cutting shall be done in a face either from the back of the block inwards or from the front outwards. All suitable timber shall be cut into firewood lengths and sizes as specified herein.

(iii) In the event of the cutter having unsplittable logs on hand, the price for same shall be arranged bewho shall also decide, if necessary, the question of whether any log is unsplittable or not.

(n), (i) Drays shall be supplied to clean up blocks as soon as possible after they have been cut out. Tf cutters are idle for more than one day whilst waiting for drays, or to shift camp, the Company shall find work for such cutters, for which they shall be paid at the rate of sixteen shillings ten and ten-elevenths pence (16 10-10/11d.) per day of eight (8) hours. In the event of the Company being unable to find work for such cutters, the cutters shall nevertheless be entitled to receive sixteen shillings ten and ten-elevenths pence (16s. 10-10/11d.) per day of eight (8) hours for each day thus kept waiting for drays or to shift camp after the expiry of the first twenty-four (24) hours.

(ii) Cutters shall be supplied with two (2) teams if earting beyond a mile, provided the block is ent out satisfactorily.

(iii) In the event of cutters being required to walk more than three (3) miles to load wood they shall receive an extra one shilling and twopence (1s. 2d.) per day for each additional mile or part of a mile over three (3). If called out to load on Sundays, entters shall be allowed wages at double the ordinary rates. (iv) (a) The term "culled bush" shall be deemed to mean a block from which firewood or mining timber

(iv) (a) The term "enlled bush" shall be deemed to mean a block from which firewood or mining timber has previously been removed to such an extent as to leave the block so deficient in firewood as to militate against the average firewood cutter's ability to produce approximately his normal output. Any dispute on the question whether the block is culled bush shall be referred to a Forestry Inspector, whose decision shall be final.

(b) A firewood cutter required to work in called bush shall be paid at the rate of not less than threepence (3d.) per ton extra. Any dispute arising out of the application of this portion of the subclause (iv(b)) shall be deemed a minor dispute and shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of clause 20 of this Award.

(o) Engine wood cutters shall have their blocks cleaned up at least once per month.

(p) Horsedrivers' camp shall be so situated that the drivers shall not have to travel more than one mile from the camp to the front of the block.

(q) (i) Facilities shall be provided for watering horses at crib time on the job.

(ii) If drivers are required to travel more than a quarter of a mile from the front of the block to water their horses at crib time, travelling time to be paid both ways at the rate of twenty (20) minutes to the mile.

(r) The cutter shall place his wood in heaps convenient for the driver.

 $(s)^{\prime}$ Horses shall be supplied to the drivers in a fit condition to do the work.

(t) Tips to be cleared and levelled by the Company.

(u) The Company shall provide a sufficient number of trucks for loaders. For any time lost owing to an insufficiency of trucks, loaders shall be paid waiting time at the rate of two shillings and six-elevenths of a penny (2s. 0.6/11d.) per hour, and the check clerk shall keep an account of the time so lost, but this clause shall not apply in the case of a breakdown or for any other cause beyond the control of the Company.

(v) A van or truck shall be attached to trains to bring loaders home from work.

(w) Loaders prevented from loading by wet weather shall be returned to the home camp as early as possible.(x) Loaders shall not travel more than six (6) miles

from the camp to the place of working.

(y) The Company shall deliver all stores required three (3) times per week. Present arrangements for delivery to camps shall continue. In any place where stores are left at on near the railway line to be taken delivery of by the workers, a suitable safe or other receptacle protected from weather and sun shall be provided by the Company for the reception and protection of such stores.

In the case of goods delivered from the Company's bush stores other than by train, the Company shall provide some person to distribute the goods to the men's camps.

(z) Loads shall be tipped not closer to the nearest rail than three (3) feet and not further away from the said nearest rail than eighteen (18) feet.

14.-Mixed Functions.

Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate shall be paid at the rate of such work for the whole of that shift.

15.—Casuals.

All men not employed for the full working week shall be considered casuals and shall receive ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rate specified. This clause shall not apply to pieceworkers.

16.-Full Payment for Shift.

(a) After beginning a shift a worker shall not be paid for less than a full shift, unless he leaves work of his own accord, or is dismissed for misconduct.

(b) If before an employee leaves the works at the end of his shift he is not informed that his services are not required, and because he is not so informed he attends at the next shift willing to work it, and there is not suitable work which he is allowed to perform, he shall be paid the wages he would have been entitled to as if he had worked the shift he was willing to work. This shall not apply in matters beyond the control of the management.

17.-Payment of Wages.

Pay day for day workers shall be at least once every month, not later than the twelfth (12th). Any worker leaving or being discharged shall be paid the full amount of wages due to him within one hour from the time of his application at the Company's office during office hours.

18.-New Classes of Labour.

Should men be employed on a class of labour not specified in the Schedule, the amount of wages to be paid for that class of work shall be mutually arranged between the Company and the Union.

19 .- Existing Customs.

All existing customs and conditions prevailing at the time of this Award and not altered by this Award shall not be varied unless by mutual consent of the parties thereto, and the workers and the Company shall not be deprived of any privileges or rights hitherto enjoyed, nor shall any new conditions detrimental to the interests of either of the parties be imposed unless specifically mentioned herein.

20.-Settlement of Disputes.

Any minor dispute arising as to the working of any portion of this Award, same to be referred to a Board consisting of a representative of the Australian Workers' Union and the Company. Should they be unable to agree they shall refer the matter to an independent Chairman for settlement, such person to have a practical working knowledge of the work in dispute. In the event of the parties being unable to agree as to the Chairman to be appointed, the Industrial Magistrate at Kalgoorlie shall be the Chairman.

21.-Weighing of Wood.

The Company shall cart the wood to the railway line and load it into wagons. Wagons shall be taken across the weighbridge and weighed in the presence of the workers' representative. The weight then ascertained shall be taken as final. Delivery between the cutters and the Company shall be completed when the wood has passed the weighbridge and the weight has been ascertained, unless otherwise agreed to.

22.—Spark Arresters.

In order to safeguard the wood from being burnt, the Company shall employ men as spark arresters.

23.-Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum rate prescribed by this Award may be paid such lesser rate as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the employer and the secretary of the Union, or, failing such agreement within twenty-four (24) hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker after twenty-four (24) hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary who shall, if he so desires, he heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six (6) calendar months from the date thereof and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manuer prescribed. The secretary of the Union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

24.-First Aid.

The Company shall provide at each of its stores, including branch stores and on its railway trains, firstaid equipment, and keep same fully and efficiently supplied. The Company shall also, wherever it may be done without loss or expense or undue interference with its operations, facilitate the efforts of its workers to acquire a knowledge of first aid and aubulance work.

If no person possessed of recognised first aid qualifications is at present employed at each camp at or in the vicinity of which upwards of fifty (50) of the Company's workers are engaged, the Company shall, when engaging workers, give preference to at least one worker so qualified, if he is competent to perform the service required by the Company.

25.-Mining and Sawmill Timber.

Cutting of mining or sawmill timber may be done by day workers at a margin rate of thirteen shillings (13s.) per week; if done by piecework, the piecework rate shall be such as may be mutually agreed upon. Should a difference arise on this question the matter shall be deemed a minor dispute and may be determined as provided by clause 20 of this Award.

Provided always that the piecework rate shall be such as will enable a worker of average capacity using reasonable effort during the whole of the prescribed working day or week to earn the time worker's rate plus at least ten per centum (10%), in addition to a tool allowance at the rate of six shillings (6s.) per week.

26.—Shifting Camps.

When for the purposes of the Company's operations workers are required to shift their own camps, they shall be entitled to an allowance for the time necessarily occupied in dismantling, loading, travelling, unloading, and re-erecting their camps, not exceeding one half day's pay at their prescribed ordinary day work rates. If required to shift camps and/or equipment other than their own, they shall be entitled to payment at their prescribed ordinary time rate for such time as they are so engaged.

27.-Sanitary Arrangements.

The Company shall provide reasonable facilities in the nature of sanitary arrangements for persons carried on its trains, either by the crection and maintenance in proper order of adequate structures alongside the line at intervals not exceeding ten (10) miles, at which the train shall stop as and when required; or alternatively, it shall make some provision ensuring privacy on a suitable part of the train itself.

In witness whereof this Award has been signed by the Acting President of the Court and the Seal of the Court has been hereto affixed this 18th day of Febmary, 1938.

PIECEWORK SCHEDULE.

(L.S.)

The following rates were fixed on a basic wage of four pounds five shillings (£4 5s.) per week. Notwithstanding any alteration in the basic wage, the piecework rates herein prescribed shall remain constant: Provided, however, that on every rise or fall in the basic wage above or below four pounds five shillings (£4 5s.) per week, the daily earnings of the pieceworker shall be increased or decreased, respectively, to the extent of one-sixth (1/6th), in the case of a six (6) day week, or one-fifth (1/5th) in the case of a five (5) day week, of such rise or fall.

The Goldfields basic wage, which applies to the area at present covered by the Company's operations, being at this date four pounds seven shillings ($\pounds 4$ 7s.) per week, the earnings of pieceworkers shall be increased by two shillings (2s.) per week, or a proportionate amount for a lesser period, until the next variation in the basic wage is declared by the Court.

- (xvi) "Low ground" shall mean ground the surface of which where the loader stands is more than 4 ft. 6 ins. below the top of the floor of the wagon.
- (xvii) Loaders over 18 ft. away from line, one penny (1d.) per ton extra.
- (xviii) Horseelipper, seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per horse.

Between Hospital Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, W.A., Coastal Branch, Applicant, and the Hon. Minister for Health, Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties: And whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and de-termination: And whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference: And whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective repre-sentatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 63 of the Act and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memoran-dum hereunder-written to have the same effect as and be dum hereunder-written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Conrt:--

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT.

(Note:-Whenever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Area.

The area of the Award shall comprise the Sanatorium, Wooroloo; the Lazaret, Wooroloo, and Farms and all premises connected thereto. Sanatorium

2.—Term.

The term of the Award shall be three (3) years from the 1st day of January, 1938.

3.-Hours.

(a) Laundry Staff:-Forty-four (44) hours per week, to be worked between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, and between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, and between 8 a.m. and noon on Satur-day: Provided that, if mutually agreed between the Chief Resident Medical Officer and the Laundry Staff, the forty-four (44) hours may be worked on Monday to Friday inclusive.

(b) All other Staff :--- For all other staff (excluding farm hands and horsedrivers) the working hours shall be one hundred and seventy-six (176) in each four (4) weeks: Provided that the maximum hours to be worked in any one week shall be fifty-six (56).

(c) Farm hands:-There shall be no fixed hours for farm hands, which shall remain substantially as at present, but these workers shall receive four (4) days off in each cycle of twenty-eight (28) days.

(d) Horsedrivers:-Horsedrivers' working hours shall regarded as one hundred and thirty-two (132) per week in a period of three (3) weeks, but these workers shall, in their own time, feed, groom, and attend to their horses without extra payment.

(e) Lazaret attendants:-There shall be no fixed hours for Lazaret attendants, whose hours shall remain substantially as at present.

(f) The following number of days shall be granted consecutively in each four (4) weeks to the workers as under:

Maids—six days Orderlies—six days. Farm hand—four days. Horsedriver—existing conditions to continue.

4.—Overtime. (a) Laundry Staff:—All time worked in excess of forty-four (44) hours per week to be regarded as overtime and paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(b) All other Workers, excepting Farm hands and horsedrivers:—All time worked in excess of fifty-six (56) hours in any one week or one hundred and seventy-six (176) hours in a four (4) weeks' period shall be regarded as overtime, and paid for at the rate of time and a half.

5.-Rosters.

Rosters shall be kept posted in convenient places, which may readily be seen by the workers concerned, setting out the hours of starting and finishing each day, the time booked off for meals and the duties of each the time booked off for meals and the duties of each worker thereon, together with the days each worker is booked off duty. The rosters shall be made out for forty-four (44) hours per week, or, alternatively, one hundred and seventy-six (176) hours in each cycle of twenty-eight (28) days. Such rosters shall be posted at least forty-eight (48) hours preceding the day on

which the roster commences: Provided that, in the case of farm hands, it shall be sufficient to post only those days on which the workers are rostered off duty.

6.—Holidays.

(a) The following days shall be observed as holidays, namely—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day. Any worker required to work on the foregoing days shall be paid at the rate of double time or be allowed a day off in lien thereof.

(b) A holiday of three (3) weeks on full pay shall be granted to each worker on the completion of each year of service, without any deductions being made for board and/or lodgings.

(c) A worker other than casual not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holidays in proportion to the length of his or her service: Provided that this shall not apply in the case of any worker summarily dismissed for inisconduct or dereliction of duty.

7.—Sick Leave.

(a) Sick leave, with pay, may be granted on the fol-lowing scale on production of an adequate medical cer-tificate, or in regard to leave not exceeding two (2) days, other evidence satisfactory to the Resident Medical Officer :-

After three (3) months' service and under three (3) years' service: One month on full pay and one month on half pay.

Over three (3) years' service:-Two (2) months on full pay.

(b) Sick leave may be granted in one or more periods, but the aggregate amount of leave on pay shall not in any one triennial period exceed the time provided for in the foregoing scale.

(c) A "triennial period" shall be three (3) years preceding the date of application.

(d) Sick leave with pay will not be granted when the illness is due to the worker's misconduct.

8.-Payment of Wages.

Wages, including overtime, if any, shall be paid fort-nightly, and such payment shall be made in cash.

9.-Engagement.

Fourteen (14) days' notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement; providing that the employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct, or if after receiving fourteen (14) days' notice he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

10.—Uniforms.

(a) All uniforms, *i.e.*, uniformity in dress, shall be supplied free of cost to all workers required to wear them. Aprons shall be provided for all female workers on the kitchen and general staff.

(b) Suitable clothing shall be available for men on "offensive and dirty work."

(c) Boots shall be available for kitchenmen, laundrymen, and wash-house women.

(d) Oilskin coats shall be provided for workers conipelled to work in the rain.

11.-Casual Workers.

All persons engaged for a period of less than six (6) days in any one week shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rates hereinafter prescribed, with a minimum engagement of one day: Provided that this shall not apply in the case of a worker summarily dismissed for misconduct.

12.-No Reduction.

This Award shall not in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker who is at present receiving above the minimum rate prescribed for his or her class of work.

13.—General.

(a) No female worker shall be called upon to clean men's lavatories in or about the Sanatorium.

(b) Twenty-four (24) hours' notice shall be given to any worker who is required to take a day off duty which is not already shown on the roster.

(c) All washing to be provided as at present.

(d) A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate in this Award than that which he or she usually performs shall be entitled to the higher rate while so employed.

(e) When a worker is entitled to annual leave under this Award, such worker shall be given at least two (2) weeks' notice of the date when such leave is to commence.

(f) Overtime rates shall be calculated and based on the aggregate wage, *i.e.*, the amount paid in each plus the deduction for board and/or lodging.

(g) If a worker's day off falls on a day prescribed by this Award as a holiday, such worker shall be allowed another day in lieu thereof.

(h) Stores at contract rates shall be supplied, under conditions to be approved by the Medical Superintendent, to married men whose families are resident in the Woo-roloo district. Such contract rates may include an amount to be agreed upon between the Medical Super-intendent and the Union to defray handling freight and clerical charges associated therewith.

14.-Junior Workers.

Male junior workers may be employed in connection with the farm and poultry yard in the proportion of one junior to every adult.

If any junior workers are required to "live in," the charge for board and lodging shall be arranged between the Union and the Department; in the event of failure to agree, the matter to be referred to a Board of Reference

15.---Wages.

Basic wage:---Males, £3 15s. 10d.; females, £2 0s. 11d.

Deductions: —Where workers receive board and lodg-ing, a deduction of an amount equal to fifty-two per cent. (52%) of the female basic wage, and where lodging only is received, a deduction of an amount equal to seventeen and one-third per cent. $(17\frac{1}{3}\%)$ of the female basic wage, shall be made from the speci-fed workly wage. fied weekly wage.

Allowances: --- When workers leave the Institution on their monthly days off duty, they shall be allowed the amount equivalent to the value of the meals not partaken of at the Institution. Margin.

16 .- Board of Reference.

The Court appoints, for the purpose of the Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties, as pre-scribed by the regulations. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of :-

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
 (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
 (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.
 (iv) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the wayner and subject to the court

- Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

.17.-Preference to Unionists.

All workers covered by this Award shall, within fourteen (14) days of commencing work, make application to the Hospital Employees' Union for membership.

Clause 2-Area:

Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:

"This Award shall apply to the gold-mining in-dustry and shall operate over the Yilgarn, Cool-gardie, Broad Arrow, Dundas, Phillips River, East Coolgardie, North Coolgardie, North-East Cool-gardie, Mount Margaret, East Murchison Goldfields, and Northampton Mining District, and the Murchison, Yalgoo, Peak Hill, and Gascoyne Goldfields, and the area outside those Goldfields in Western Australia comprised within the 20th and 26th parallels of latitude."

Clause 3-Wages:

Delete subclauses (a), (b), and (c) of this clause, and in lieu thereof insert the following .-

"(a) Basic wage at the rate of £4 7s. 0d. per week

(b) Industry allowance at the rate of twelve shillings (12s.) per week, subject to automatic inereases or reductions as follow:—

- (i) The standard price of gold per onnee in Australian currency to the nearest half sovereign as ascertained from a return supplied by the Perth Branch of the Royal Mint, averaged for the quarter ended September, 1934, namely, eight pounds ten shillings (£8 10s.) shall be taken as the norm, and equivalent to an industry allowance of two shillings (2s.) per shift or twelve shillings (12s.) per week;
- (ii) For each increase or decrease of ten shillings
 (10s.) per onnce the said allowance shall increase or decrease, as the case may be, by the sum of fourpence (4d.) per shift, or two shillings (2s.) per week;
- (iii) All calculations for this allowance shall be made on the average price per calcular quarter and the allowance shall remain stationary as then determined until the next quarter's figures are available. The price per onnee for the purpose of this calculation shall be the nearest £ or half-£;
- (iv) Any dispute as to the amount of allowance under these provisions shall be determined by the Registrar of the Court upon figures supplied by the Perth Branch of the Royal Mint compiled similarly to the table appearing in the judgment accompanying the Mining Industry Awards. (See 14 W.A.I.G., 225);
- (v) Any variation in rates of pay made pursuant to the provisions hereof shall take effect as from the pay day following the fifteenth (15th) day of calendar month following the quarter for which the calculations are made.

Delete subclause (c) and insert in lien thereof :---

"(c) Work done on Sunday, Christmas Day, Easter Monday, or Labour Day shall be paid for at double time rate.

With respect to workers under this Award working more than one shift any worker whose ordinary rotation shift falls on Sunday or on any of the abovementioned holidays shall be paid at time and a-third rate for Sunday work, but at the ordinary time rate for work on the other days mentioned.

Any shift worker required to work more than six (6) shifts consecutively shall be paid for the seventh shift at double time rate.

Shift workers required to work weekly rotation shifts shall have their hours of duty so arranged as to permit of one Sunday in every four (4) off duty.

Clause 19-Definitions:

Add a further definition as follows :----

''(j) 'Shift electrician' means an electrician of at least five (5) years' experience who is in charge of a generating station during his shift and is not constantly under the supervision of a superior officer.''
