### FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1), of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

Upper Blackwood Road Board.

By-laws for the Management and Use of Halls and other Buildings under the Control of the Board.

P.W. 867/37.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1934, the Road Board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act, the Upper Blackwood Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. Interpretation clause:—In the construction of these by-laws the words—

- "Board" shall mean the Upper Blackwood Road Board;
- "Secretary" means the secretary for the time being of the Upper Blackwood Road Board;
- "Hall" means and includes any hall, room, lounge, corridor, stairway, stage, entrance, yard, or land situated within the boundaries of the townsite lot or location upon which any public hall shall be erected;
- "Caretaker" means the caretaker of the hall duly appointed by the Board.

2. Application for the hire of the hall or any room shall be made in writing to the secretary or other duly authorised agent not less than twenty-four hours before the time that such hall or room is required, and shall

state the time and purpose for which such hall or room is required.

3. The name and place of abode of the actual and responsible person or persons hiring the hall or any room shall be given in the application for the hire of the hall or room.

4. The rent of the hall or any room shall be paid with each application and shall be as set out in Schedule A hereto annexed.

5. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall prior to the term of any engagement deposit One pound (£1), returnable if clause six (6) is strictly complied with.

6. Any person or persons having hired the hall or any room shall give up possession promptly at the time agreed upon and shall leave the hall or any room, crockery, and other appliances clean and fit for other occupation or use, and the furniture in good condition and in its normal position.

7. The hours for which any hall or room shall be hired shall be—Day:—from 9 o'clock a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m.; night:—from 7 o'clock p.m. to 12 o'clock midnight:

Provided that extension of time may be granted upon payment of the prescribed fee.

8. The hirer of any hall or room under Schedule A hereto shall not be entitled to the use of the Biograph room.

9. Hirers may decorate the hall, using only those fixtures that are specially provided for the purpose,

and no person shall drive a nail into any part of the hall, windows, floors, doors, etc., or otherwise deface the hall. All decorations used in connection with any entertainment must be removed from the premises and disposed of to the satisfaction of the secretary or caretaker within twenty-four hours from the commencement of the hiring period; provided that, with the consent of the secretary first had and obtained, such decorations may be permitted to remain.

10. Hirers shall make their own arrangements for the safety of anything left in the cloak rooms or any part of the hall, and the Board will accept no liability.

11. The Board may grant to any person or company a lease for the exclusive right to hire the hall for showing sound or other pictures for any period on such nights weekly, as may be required.

12. The Board reserves the right to accept or refuse to hire the hall or any room or crockeryware to any applicant for the hire of same, without assigning a reason for such refusal.

13. The Board may at any time cancel an agreement made for hiring the hall or any room or crockeryware, by giving twenty-four (24) hours' notice other than a contract made for the hire of the hall for motion pictures. The nights granted to picture proprietors under any contract shall not be available to the public for renting the hall or stage.

14. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any hall or room for the same date and hour the Board may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of the hall or room shall be granted.

15. The hirer of the hall or room shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, the Entertainments Tax, or any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hiring or using any hall or room. If in the opinion of the Board all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts mentioned above, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of engagement forbid and prevent the use of any hall or room.

16. In the event of the use of any hall or room being forbidden or prevented under the last preceding by-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of such hall or room as if the hire had been duly fulfilled, and the Board shall not be responsible for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.

17. No fermented or spirituous liquors shall be brought into or consumed in the hall or any room, except when permitted by the Board in writing.

18. No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigar, cigarette, or objectionable substance whilst dancing or during the showing of sound or other pictures in any hall.

19. No person shall in any part of the hall—

- (a) enter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;
- (b) use profane or improper language;
- (c) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever;
- (d) damage, mark, or deface any wall or other part of the hall. (Any person who does, permits, or suffers any such damage shall be liable to pay the cost of all such damage in addition to any penalty imposed by these by-laws.)
- (e) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the passageways or other parts of the hall. (Any person doing so shall immediately disperse on being requested to do so by the secretary, caretaker, or other duly authorised officer of the Board or Police constable, whether in uniform or otherwise.)
- (f) perform any games of athletics whilst wearing boots or shoes, unless such boots or shoes are rubber soled.

20. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons, or anything calculated to produce a disturbance, riot, or breach of the peace, shall be permitted in any hall or room.

21. No encouragement shall be given to improper characters to assemble in the hall or any room.

22. Skating or badminton shall not be permitted under any consideration.

23. Children under the age of ten years must be under responsible supervision.

24. The hirer of the hall or any room shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour in such hall or room, and shall be solely and entirely responsible for the carrying out of these by-laws and for any damage done to the buildings, fixtures, fittings, electric light globes, electric light fittings, furniture, or crockery-ware, and shall pay such damages as shall be assessed by the Board. Any article or crockery-ware not accounted for or in a cracked or broken condition shall be paid for at current rates or prices.

25. The secretary, caretaker, or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or Police constable when dressed in uniform or otherwise, if known as such to the hirer or his servant, shall be permitted to have free ingress to the hall or any room at all times during the term of engagement, and shall be given every facility for seeing that these by-laws are duly carried out.

26. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these by-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such conviction.

27. All by-laws for the management of hall and buildings previously passed by the Upper Blackwood Road Board are repealed from date of gazettal of these by-laws.

## TOWN PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT, 1928.

## Manjimup Road Board Town Planning Scheme.

## Manjimup Townsite.

IN pursuance of the resolution of the Manjimup Road Board dated the 27th day of November, 1937, and notices advertised in accordance with the Town Planning Regulations, 1930, the undermentioned works are planned and projected and regulations made for their enforcement and execution, subject to the provisions of the Act.

## Work No. 1.

Distrioting and zoning the gazetted area of Manjimup Townsite for industrial, business, and residential purposes, as shown on the sealed plan and described in the regulation hereunder; and the area of the Townsite is hereby classified and distrioted.

## Industrial Area.

## Regulation.

1. The industrial areas are defined as the lands within the borders edged purple on the sealed plan, and also those lots on which are established industries at the date of the gazettal of the Scheme.

2. No portion of the townsite shall be used for industrial purposes except those lands within the purple edgings, except as herein provided and more particularly described in the First Schedule hereunder.

Industrial purposes shall mean any work, manufactory, industry, or use not included in the Business Area.

3. No noxious trade as defined by the Health Act shall be established in the Manjimup Townsite.

4. Any industry established in the townsite shall, when and where the Road Board deems necessary, provide for drainage disposal, and elimination of smoke and odours, which the Board may consider detrimental to health or amenity.

5. Within the Industrial Area Lot 354 only shall be used for stock sale yards and any new yards erected shall be adjacent to the existing sale yards.

6. Where an industry is established at the date of the gazettal of the Town Planning Scheme, the land shall not be used for any other industrial purpose or change of use without the approval of the Board in terms of the Scheme: provided that, where a lease or agreement or other document has been executed, registered, or stamped establishing the intention to establish an industry outside the industrial area prior to the gazettal of the Scheme and these Regulations, the provisions in these regulations shall not apply.

## First Schedule.

1. All lands edged purple on the sealed plan.

2. All lots on which industry is established at the date of the gazettal of the Scheme.

3. Lands the subject of any lease or agreement executed prior to the gazettal of the Scheme.

## Business Area.

## Regulation.

1. All those lots within the border edged red and more particularly described in the Second Schedule hereunder.

2. All those lots on which business is established at the date of gazettal of the Scheme.

3. The business area may include any of the following uses:—

(a) Any use permitted in a residential area under the Scheme.

(b) The following:—Theatre, hall, club, or place of amusement, office, bank or hotel, fire station, police station, post office or public building.

(c) Shops, salesroom or showroom for the conduct of wholesale business.

(d) Workrooms connected with retail business in which not more than fifty per cent. of the total floor space is devoted to workrooms.

(e) Garages or petrol-selling or service station.

(f) Such other accessory or ancillary buildings and uses as the local authority may determine, but shall not include any industry, trade, or manufactory.

4. Where dwellings or residential quarters are erected in conjunction with shops or other business on the same lot, each dwelling or residence shall have at least 6,000 square feet of area allotted and available to it. Subject to this regulation and the building regulations or other by-laws for the time being in force, the whole of the frontage of any lot may be occupied by lock-up shops or business.

## Second Schedule.

1. Lots on which business premises exist at date of gazettal of the Scheme.

2. Lots within the red edging on the sealed plan and numbered:—

Giblett street—1 to 10, 72, 32 to 42, and 276; Rose street—11 to 31, 131 to 141, 358, 359, 362, and any lots surveyed out of lot 43; Bath street—142, 143, 357, 360, 107, 108, 118 and 119; Moore street—87, 88, 120 and 121. All numbers both inclusive.

## Residential Area.

## Regulation.

1. All land upon which are erected residences at date of gazettal of this Scheme, but no additional residences or dwellings shall be erected on such lands unless a plan of subdivision or resubdivision, or lease shall have been approved by the Town Planning Board.

2. All lands within the gazetted townsite boundaries not included in the industrial and business areas may be used for residential purposes.

3. Churches, public buildings, or other institutional buildings may be erected in the residential area with the approval of the Board by resolution.

4. Not more than one dwelling may be erected on any lot unless 6,000 square feet or more is provided for each dwelling.

5. No residential lot shall be built on to cover more than one-third of the area of such lot.

6. No lot or land shall be built on until the land is drained to the satisfaction of the Board and provision made for the disposal of roof water and house sullage.

## Work No. 2.

## Regulation.

## Relocation and resurvey of Doust street.

1. Doust street lying between Lots 68, 69, 70, 71, and 352 shall be closed and a new portion of Doust street surveyed and opened within and along the eastern boundaries of Lots 70 and 71.

2. The closed portions shall vest in accordance with the Road Districts Act.

## Work No. 3.

## Sewerage and Drainage of Business and other Areas.

1. Surveys, plans, and estimates shall be prepared to provide for the sewerage and drainage of—

(i) the business area;

(ii) all those portions of the townsite that can be drained to the Scheme serving the business area.



2. The work to be financed in accordance with the provisions of the Road Districts Act or the Town Planning and Development Act, at the discretion of the Board.

*Work No. 4.*

Subdivision for Residential Lots.

1. The area bounded by the main road, Blechynden street, Muir street, and Mount street, together with Lot 202 shown edged yellow on the sealed plan, shall be set apart for subdivision and made available for residential purposes in lots of not less than a quarter of an acre.

*Work No. 5.*

Drainage, Camping, and Flora Reserve.

1. The area within the green edging on the sealed plan shall be set apart as a reserve for—(a) drainage purposes; (b) camping (in lieu of Lot 202), and (c) conservation of native flora.

*Work No. 6.*

Extension of Park Lands and Area for Public Utilities.

1. Reserves No. 21374 to be extended and included as park lands and for public utilities, the area edged green on the sealed plan and bounded by Mottram, Young and O'Connor streets.

*Work No. 7.*

Incorporation of Collier street in Recreation Reserve.

1. Collier street between Leman street and Rutherford street to be closed and incorporated in Reserve 14584.

*Work No. 8.*

Resubdivision of Suburban Lots.

1. The lots within the area edged brown on the sealed plan shall not be subdivided into areas of less than half an acre.

Regulation for the General Control of Buildings.

(1) In addition to any powers already gazetted, acquired, or existing under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, the Manjilup Road Board is empowered to control buildings throughout the area of the Town Planning Scheme for the following purposes, and to enforce this regulation:—

- (a) The height, location, purpose, dimensions, or general character of any building.
- (b) Prevent the erection of ugly buildings, which in the opinion of the Board may destroy local amenities.
- (c) Control the exterior designs of buildings to insure harmony in such designs.
- (d) Subject to the provisions of section 11 of the Act, order the demolition or alteration of any buildings.

(2) No building shall be erected or altered until the Road Board shall have approved, in writing, plans of the building to be erected or altered.

(3) If any person shall either by act or omission contravene this regulation, he shall be guilty of an offence under this regulation, and on conviction for such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and also, if such offence is in its nature a continuing offence, to a daily penalty not exceeding Two pounds during the continuance of the offence.
