FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1), of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

Mullewa Road Board.

By-laws Regulating Supply of Water.

P.W. 1549/37.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1934, power is vested in Road Boards to make by-laws regulating the supply and distribution of water under the authority of any Road Board and for imposing, collecting, and enforcing payment of charges therefor by consumers: Now, therefore, the Mullewa District Road Board doth by resolution duly carried hereby make the following by-laws in respect thereof:—

1. The Mullewa District Road Board shall hereafter be empowered to supply and deliver water to consumers and to charge therefor at the rate set out in the Schedule hereunder. Such water may be supplied from the supplies of water owned by the Board, but

the Board shall also have the power, if deemed necessary, to purchase water or to arrange to be supplied therewith in case of emergency.

2. The Board shall be empowered to erect a stand-pipe or pipes at such places as it shall from time to time decide and to remove at any time any such stand-pipe to any other place.

3. A copy of these by-laws shall be displayed and exhibited at or near each of such places of supply.

4. All sales of water shall be for cash, and any person who shall obtain any such water without paying for the same shall be guilty of an offence and shall (in addition to being liable to be sued for the amount due in respect thereof) be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

5. Any person who shall interfere with any such stand-pipe or any pipe or pipes leading thereto, or any other fitting connected therewith, or who shall at-

tempt to obtain water without authority, or who shall tear down, disfigure, or deface any copy of these by-laws exhibited as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence and liable as aforesaid to a fine not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

6. The Board shall use its best endeavours to maintain a supply of sound, clean, and pure fresh water, but the same shall be supplied without any warranty as to its condition or as to its suitability for consumption by human beings or stock, or for any other purpose, and the Board shall be under no liability for any damage resulting from the use or consumption of such water.

7. Water will be supplied at and between the hours mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

The price of water shall until further notice be One shilling (1s.) cash per 100 gallons. The hours of supply shall be from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on week days, excepting Wednesday, on which day the hours shall be from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

By-laws relating to Sea Bathing at Scarborough Beach.

THE Perth Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1934, and all other powers enabling it, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

THE TOWN PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT, 1928.

Section 30 (1), Second Schedule.

By-laws Fixing Building Lines.

1. Whenever a local authority has made a by-law under its local Government Act prescribing that any building proposed to be erected on any parcel or allotment of land shall not be erected unless it is erected a prescribed minimum distance from the street alignment, then no building shall be erected on any such parcel or allotment of land closer to the street boundary than the distance so prescribed.

2. Where a local authority has not made any such by-law and the parcels or allotments of land between the two nearest street corners to the land or allotment in question on the same side of the street are vacant, no building shall be erected closer to the street boundary of such land, or of any of the parcels of land, than thirty feet, except in areas set aside and gazetted for uses other than as residential areas under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928, or under the provisions of any local government Act; provided that any building may be set back a distance greater than thirty feet from the street boundary, at the option of the owner.

3. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, and whether a building line has been prescribed or not, no building on any lot between the two nearest street corners to the land or allotment in question and on the same side of the street shall be erected closer to the street than the mean distance which the nearest two existing buildings on the same side of the street are set back from the street boundary.

4. A local authority shall not approve of the erection of any building or of a plan for the erection of any building which does not conform to these by-laws.

5. The diagram hereunder illustrates what is meant by vacant land between houses and between two cross streets, and is incorporated with and shall be used as a guide to the construction of these regulations.

6. If any person shall, either by act or omission, contravene any of these by-laws, he shall be guilty of an offence under these by-laws, and on conviction for such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and also, if such offence is in its nature a continuing offence, to a daily penalty not exceeding Two pounds during the continuance of the offence.

7. These by-laws shall have the force of law in the district of every local authority in the State of Western Australia.

These by-laws shall be administered and enforced by the executive officer of each or any local authority. The

Town Planning Commissioner or his Deputy may exercise similar powers of enforcement.

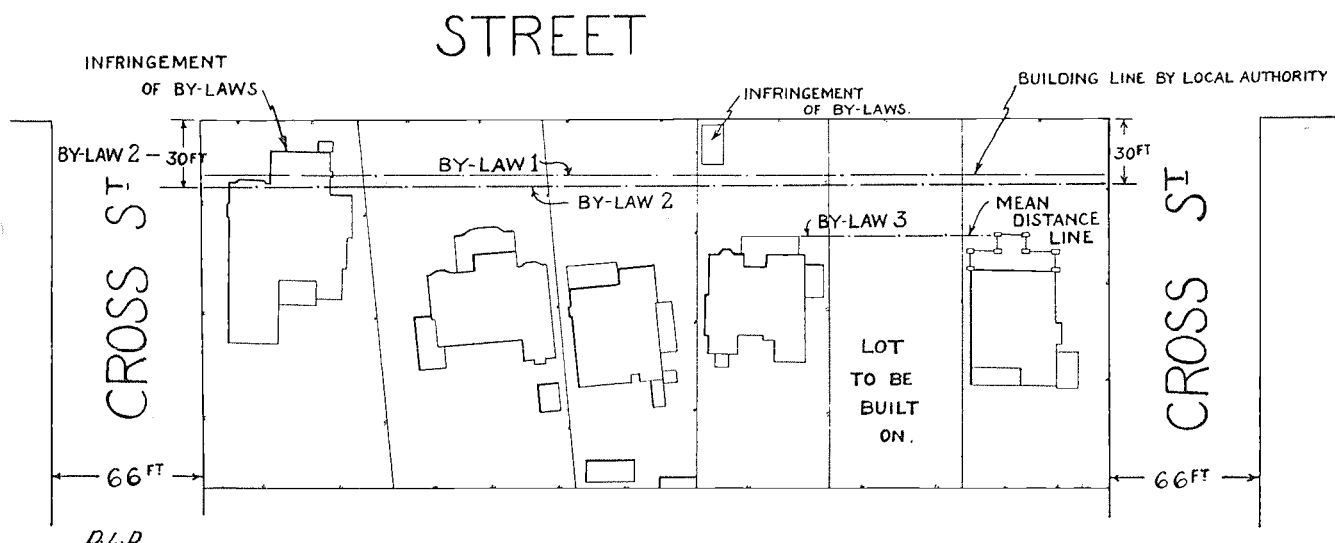
