PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by section 158 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation temporarily suspend the operations of the said Act, in so far as it applies to the closing time fixed or appointed for any shop or shops: And whereas it is expedient to exercise such power in manner hereinafter appearing: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive

Council, do hereby by this Proclamation suspend the operations of the said Act between the hours of 1 p.m. and 6 p.m. on Wednesday, the 13th day of April, 1938, in so far as it applies to the closing time of all shops situated in the Kalgoorlie, Boulder, Brown Hill-Ivanhoe, and Hannans Shop District.
