GEORGE THE SIXTH, by the Grace of God of Great Britain and Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, Greeting:

To the Honourable Charles George Latham, M.L.A.; the Honourable Percy Douglas Ferguson, M.L.A., and Emil Nulsen, Esquire, M.L.A.; William Patrick, Esquire, M.L.A., and Frederick James Withers, Esquire, M.L.A.:

I, THE said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint you Charles George Latham, Percy Douglas Ferguson, Emil Nulsen, William Patrick, and Frederick James Withers to be an honorary Royal Commission, without payment of remuneration, to do the following things, namely:—

1. Inquire into, consider, and report generally upon—
 - (a) the areas and localities of the light lands and the poison-infested lands within the State of Western Australia, whether such lands are alienated or unalienated lands of the Crown;
 - (b) the nature and extent of the disposal of the said lands, whether by the Crown or by any Crown instrumentality or by any company, society, association, body, or person other than the Crown during the last preceding fifty years, including the terms, conditions, and prices which obtained in, and the methods of such disposal of the said lands;
 - (c) the nature and extent of the occupation and use of the said lands during the said period;
 - (d) the nature and extent of the production of wealth from the said lands during the said period;
 - (e) the comparison between the prices, terms, and conditions charged and imposed by the Crown, and the prices, terms and conditions charged and imposed by other bodies or persons in connection with the disposal of the

said lands, which have been disposed of by the Crown or by other bodies or persons aforesaid during the said period;

- (f) the comparison between the prices, terms, and conditions at the present time fixed and prescribed by the Crown in relation to the disposal of the said lands, and the prices, terms, and conditions at the present time fixed and prescribed by other bodies and persons as aforesaid in relation to the disposal of the said lands;
 - (g) the manner in which, the extent to which, and the purposes for which, such of the said lands as are occupied at the present time are being used;
 - (h) the cost at the present time of working the said lands necessary to yield a profit by such working; and
 - (i) such other matters relating to the said lands as are incidental or related to any of the matters in this paragraph hereinbefore mentioned.
2. Inquire into, consider, and report upon—
 - (a) the nature, extent, and methods of encouragement and assistance which should be afforded by the Crown, by financial institutions or by companies, societies, associations, or persons concerned or interested in the said lands for the purpose of promoting, encouraging, inducing, and assisting the greatest and best possible occupation and use of the said lands and the greatest and most profitable production of wealth from the said lands;
 - (b) the manner in which and the methods by which an equitable relationship between the prices, terms, and conditions fixed and imposed by the Crown, and the prices, terms, and conditions fixed and imposed by other bodies and persons aforesaid in connection with the disposal of the said lands may be established and maintained; and
 - (c) such other matters relating to the said lands as are incidental or related to any of the matters in this paragraph hereinbefore mentioned.
 3. To consider and make any recommendations which in the opinion of the Commission are justified or war-

ranted by any of the inquiries and investigations made under paragraphs 1 and 2 hereof.

And I hereby appoint you the said Charles George Latham to be Chairman of the said Commission.

And I declare that you shall by virtue of this Commission be a Royal Commission within the Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902, as reprinted in the Appendix to the Sessional Volume of the Statutes for the year 1928, and that you shall have the powers of a Royal Commission or the Chairman thereof under that Act.

And I hereby request you, as soon as reasonably may be, to report to me in writing the result of this your Commission.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-21, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portions of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, by this Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of seine nets, namely, nets with meshes less than two and a quarter inches in any part which when used in the capture of fish are hauled or drawn to the shores, in any portion of the waters defined in the Schedule hereto, for a term of three years as from and inclusive of the 1st day of July, 1938:—

The whole of the coastal waters of Western Australia situated between the parallels of 31 deg. and 33 deg. south latitude.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-21, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from—(a) taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture; (b) taking any fish whatsoever by any specified means of capture; (c) taking any fish whatsoever by any means of capture whatsoever, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time in any specified year, or during a specified portion of any year: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of any other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the taking of snapper by any means of capture whatsoever as from the 1st day of October:—

Schedule.

Warnbro' Sound (Safety Bay).—The whole of the waters of Warnbro' Sound (including the waters surrounding the off-shore rocks and islets) within the following boundaries, namely:—On the north by a line drawn from Mersey Point and extending seawards to a position one mile westward of Mersey Point; thence by a line drawn in a generally southerly direction to a position one and a half miles westward of Beecher Point; thence by a line drawn in an easterly direction to Beecher Point.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

Description and Location of Reticulation Works Approved and Exempted—Subiaco Sewerage, Extension to Reticulation Area No. 20:—6-inch diameter reticulation sewer commencing at existing sewer in Gregory street opposite the south-west corner of Lot 35, Gregory street, and proceeding north along the east side of Gregory street to a point opposite the south boundary of Lot 46, Gregory street, at a total distance of 580 feet with two manholes.

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvement, Subiaco Municipality:—Thirty-inch water main in Bagot road, Rowland street, and Hay street, from Thomas street to Railway road, with valves and all necessary apparatus (length about eighty-two chains), as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 6047.

Model By-laws.

M.P.H. 4452/21; Ex. Co. No. 796.

PART III.—PRIVATE HOSPITALS.

THE following amendments to the Model By-laws have been prepared by direction of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, in pursuance of the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1937:—

Delete by-law 1 and substitute in lieu thereof the following:—

1. For the purpose of these by-laws "Private hospitals" shall be divided into the following classes:—

"A." Hospitals which admit for treatment all medical, surgical, and obstetrical cases other than those specified in Class "B":
Provided that, where obstetrical cases are taken, these shall be nursed in a portion of the building specially set apart for such cases and otherwise complying with the regulations governing maternity homes.

"B." Hospitals in which the following cases are treated:—Scarlet fever, diphtheria, measles, mumps, whooping cough, typhus fever, epidemic poliomyelitis, smallpox, plague, and cholera.

"C." Hospitals in which convalescent patients and patients requiring medical supervision, but not requiring constant nursing attention, are admitted.

Amend by-law 6, section (a), as follows:—

6. (a) Hospitals in Classes "A" and "C" shall be so situated that the building used as the hospital shall on all sides have between it and the boundary of the land used for the purposes of a hospital a clear space of not less than fifteen feet.

Hospitals in Class "B" shall be so situated that the building used as the hospital shall on all sides have between it and the boundary of the land used for the purposes of a hospital a clear space of not less than thirty feet.

Delete by-law 18 and substitute in lieu thereof the following:—

18. Every person conducting a Class "A" or Class "B" private hospital shall at all times maintain the nursing staff at not less than the following standard, that is to say:—

(a) Not less than one general trained nurse to every three patients or portion thereof.

(b) Not more than one probationer or nursing assistant to each general trained nurse.

(c) Provided that at all times there shall be on duty at least one trained nurse.

Provided that in Class "A" hospitals in the midwifery section there shall be a minimum staff as laid down for such institution, that is, one trained midwife to every four patients or portion thereof.

In Class "C" hospitals there shall be not less than one trained nurse on the staff.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1934, the Road Board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for regulating the supply and distribution of water under the control and authority of the Board, the Wyalkatchem Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-law:—

The Board may regulate the supply of the water at any well, dam, tank, or other watering place under its authority or control within its district for domestic or other purposes by affixing a notice, duly signed by the secretary, at such well, dam, tank, or other watering place.

Any person using or attempting to use any water for other purposes than those for which it has been set aside by the Board, unless specially authorised by the Board in writing, shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law and shall be liable for a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Fremantle Road Board.

Building By-laws.

P.W. 740/37.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1934, the Road Board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all or any of the purposes in the said Act, and whereas the Fremantle Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

Interpretation.

“Act” means the Road Districts Act, 1919-1934.

“Board” means Fremantle Road Board.

“Dwelling-house” means a building used, constructed, or adapted to be used wholly or in part for human habitation.

“Commercial building” means a building used or constructed or adapted to be used wholly or in part for commercial purposes.

Building By-laws.

(i) No buildings shall be commenced, or alterations to an existing building begun, until a plan and specification thereof in accordance with regulations 2 and 3 of the building regulations, the Second Schedule of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1934, and section 122, ss. (1), of the Health Act, 1911-1935, be submitted to the supervisor, the license fees paid, and his approval on behalf of the Board obtained for the proposed works. At the same time a locality plan, and also a plan or tracing not less than 22-inch x 15-inch in size of the ground plan (scale 8 feet to 1 inch) of all buildings, showing the size of all rooms, the position of windows, the thickness of walls, and the covered floor area of such

buildings, and the relative position of all boundaries, out-buildings, proposed drains and dry wells, also the relative position and nature of buildings on the adjoining property, if within 10 feet of the common boundary, shall be deposited with the surveyor, to remain permanently in his custody.

Fees.

(ii) License fee for new building of brick, stone or concrete—5s.

License fee for new building of wood, iron, or other approved material—2s. 6d.

License fee for alterations or additions to existing building—2s. 6d.

(iii) No dwelling-house or commercial building shall be erected on any block of land of a frontage of less than sixty-six feet and a depth less than one hundred and sixty-five feet without the permission of the Board, except in the case of blocks of less dimensions, which were subdivided previous to the passing of this by-law.

(iv) No building shall be erected on any block of land within twenty-five feet of the front boundary or within three feet of any side boundary without the permission of the Board.

(v) Rooms intended for sleeping in shall not be of less cubic capacity than eight hundred cubic feet and less height than ten feet, and to have direct ventilation.

Where a skillion is erected, height at the lowest side shall not be less than eight feet.

(vi) All other rooms shall have walls not less than ten feet in height.

Every person offending against the provisions of these by-laws shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds (£10).

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 3 of 1938.

(Registered 29/3/1938.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this Fourth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, between Rottneest Board of Control, hereinafter referred to as "the Employer," on the one part, and the Amalgamated Road Transport Union of Workers, Perth, hereinafter referred to as "the Union," of the other part. The parties hereto mutually covenant and agree as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to workers employed on Rottneest Island by the Rottneest Board of Control, following the vocations mentioned in clause 2 hereof:—

2.—Wages.

Basic wage £3 15s. 10d. per week.

3.—Hours.

Eight hours per day or 44 hours per week. A daily spread of 12 hours between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 7.30 p.m.; the week's work being spread over seven days when necessary in the opinion of the managing secretary.

4.—Overtime.

Time and a-half for all time of duty:—

- (a) before 7.30 a.m. or after 7.30 p.m. on any one day or
- (b) in excess of 8 hours in any one day; or
- (c) on the worker's day off.

Overtime to stand alone and be paid for in addition to the weekly wage.

5.—Day Off.

One day in each week to be allowed; such day to be mutually agreed upon between the employer and the worker.

6.—Holidays.

New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, and Christmas Day shall be holidays for the purpose of this Agreement, and paid for. If the employee be called upon to work on all or any of these days he shall have the time so worked added to his annual leave.

7.—Annual Leave.

Two consecutive weeks' holidays on full pay at the expiration of every twelve months' service shall be granted each worker. Leave to be given as soon as possible after becoming due and at a time to suit the convenience of the employer. When the engagement of any worker is terminated before the expiration of any twelve months' period, he shall be paid in lieu of holidays in proportion to the length of his service.

8.—Time and Wages Book.

The employer shall provide a time and wages book, to be kept at a place where it is easily accessible to the employer and the worker. This book shall show the name of each worker, the time he starts and finishes work each day, the number of hours worked by and the wages and overtime paid to each worker, and the worker's signature therefor. The employer and worker shall be severally responsible for the proper posting of the book daily. Such book shall be open to inspection during working hours, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, and between 9 a.m. and 12 noon Saturdays, by the secretary of the Union or any other person authorised in writing by him.

9.—Firewood, Electric Light, and Stores.

The present custom operating in connection with the supply of firewood and electric light and transport of stores shall be continued.

10.—Term.

This Agreement shall come into operation from the date hereof and remain in force for three years.
