The Land Act, 1933-1937.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 371/00.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1937. it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of sub-leasing: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 7366, near Dardanup, should vest in and be held by the Dardanup Road Board in trust for Common: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Conneil, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Dardanup Road Board to held by the Dardanup Road Board to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding five (5) years from the date of the lease, subject to the condition that the timber must not be destroyed.

## The Land Act, 1933-1937. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 1673/21.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1937, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with passic purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of sub-leasing: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserves 18722 to 18725 inclusive, at Nornalup, should vest in and be held by the Under Secretary for Lands, the Surveyor General, and the Conservator of Forests in trust for National Park: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the Under Secretary for Lands, the Surveyor General, and the Conservator of Forests in trust for National Park, with power to the said Under Secretary for Lands, the Surveyor General, and the Conservator of Forests to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserves for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease.

### FISHERIES ACT, 1905-1921.

### Premier's Department, Perth, 27th April, 1938.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council, acting in exercise of the power conferred by section 6 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1921, has been pleased to repeal all the regulations heretofore made and in force under and for the purposes of the said Act and in lieu thereof to make the new regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto, under and for the purposes of the said Act, to come into operation as from the publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*.

### The Schedule.

### FISHERIES ACT, 1905-1921.

### Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries Act Regulations.

### Fishing Boat Licenses.

2. Fishing Boat Licenses issued under section 11 of the Act shall be in Form "A" in the Appendix to these regulations.

### Fishermen's Licenses.

3. Fishermen's licenses issued under section 14 of the Act shall be in form " $\pm$  " in the Appendix to these regulations.

### Boat License Transferable.

4. Any person taking out a license for a boat under section 11 of the Act shall, if such boat is destroyed, sold, or otherwise disposed of during the currency of the license, be entitled to have the registered number of the boat licensed transferred to another boat owned by him: provided, however, that no such license shall be transferred to another person.

### Marking of Licensed Fishing Boats.

5. The owner or person in charge of a boat licensed under section 11 of the Act shall paint and keep painted on both port and starboard sides of the boat, near the bow outside above the waterline, white upon a dark ground and black upon a light

ground, in legible letters and numerals not less than four inches in length, the registered number of the boat, preceded by or beneath the capital letters L.F.B., together with the initial letter or letters of the port or place where the license was issued.

### Persons to produce Licenses on demand.

6. Every person licensed to catch fish for purposes of sale shall, upon demand at any time by any Inspector or Assistant Inspector of Fisheries, produce his license or satisfy the Inspector or Assistant Inspector that he has taken out such licensy, and any person failing to produce such license or failing to satisfy the Inspector or Assistant Inspector as hereinbefore set ont shall be liable to prosecution. The owner or person in charge of any boat licensed under the Act failing to comply with the requirements aforesaid shall be guilty of a breach of this regulation.

### Persons to give Name and Address.

7. Any person catching fish for purposes of sale in any Western Australian Waters, or any person using any fishing net, fishing line, or other appliance for the purposes of eatching fish, or any person having in his possession undersized fish, or any lightweight fish known as or called the 'crayfish,' or any 'crayfish'' having eggs or spawn attached to its abdominal appendages, shall, on demand of any Inspector or Assistant Inspector, give his true name and address. Any person who shall refuse or neglect to comply with such demand, or shall give a false or fictitious name or address, shall be guilty of a breach of this regulataion.

## Disposal of Forfeited Fish.

Fish forfeited pursuant to the provisions of sections 6 and 22 of the Act shall be handed over to the authorities of any hespital, benevolent asylum, or charitable institution near to the place where such fish were seized; provided, however, that should in the opinion of the Inspector such fish be nufit for human consumption, they shall be destroyed.

## Disposal of forfeited Fishing Nets, Boats, or other Gear.

9. Fishing boats, fishing nets, or other appliances employed in the capture of fish ordered by any Court to be forfeited under sections 6, 37, and 37A of the Act shall be sold or otherwise disposed of, as the Minister may direct. The proceeds of all sales shall be paid into Consolidated Revenue.

### Finding and disposal of Boats, Nets, or other Gear apparently Abandoned.

10. (1) When any boat, net, line, implement, or appliance for taking fish shall be found by any Inspector in any closed waters without any person in actual posses-sion thereof, such Inspector or another Inspector shall give notice of the finding thereof by posting for seven clear days for public information outside his office, and the nearest Police Station or the nearest Post Office, or, in the case of the said finding having occurred in closed waters near to Perth, outside the Offices of the Fisheries Department, at Perth, full particulars of the thing so found, and the locality where it was found.

(2) If the thing found as aforesaid remains unclaimed for a period of fourteen days from the date when notice of finding was first published as aforesaid, or if a claim of ownership of such thing having been made within the said period of fourteen days such claim is not established to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector before the expiration of the said period of fourteen days, the Chief Inspector may cause the thing found as aforesaid to be sold, either at anction or by private sale.

(3) The proceeds of any sale effected under paragraph (2) hereof, after deducting expenses incurred in relation to the storage and sale of the thing sold, shall be paid into Consolidated Revenue.

### Use of Long-line or "Bultows" Prohibited in Certain Waters.

11. No person, whether licensed as provided by the Act or unlicensed shall, in the waters of the Murray River or Serpentine River, or their tributaries, use or attempt to use for the purpose of catching fish, any line other than the ordinary handline to which not more than two (2) hooks are attached, or a rod and line.

### "Meshing" or "Set" Nets.

- 12. No person shall cast, shoot, fix, or set any "meshing" net, or any "set" net- (a) in the waters of Peel's Inlet, or of Harvey Estnary within fifteen fathoms
   (30 yards) of any other "meshing" net or any other "set" net already
   cast, shot, fixed, or set in the waters aforesaid;

  - (b) in the waters of the Leschenault Estuary (Bunbury) within twenty-five fathoms (50 yards) of any other "meshing" net or any other "set" net already cast, shot, fixed, or set in the waters aforesaid;
  - (c) in the waters of the Swan River between the Railway Bridge at Guildford and the Upper Swan Bridge near Midland Junction within thirty fathoms (60 yards) of any other "meshing" net or any other "set" net already cast, shot, fixed, or set in the waters aforesaid.

### Priority among Netters.

13. (1) The rights of priority in hanling nets, as between fishermen netting on the same ground, are hereby determined as follows:—

(a) The first turn shall belong to the licensed fisherman who first arrives on the same ground with a being fide even of licensed fisherman in a licensed

the ground with a bona fide crew of licensed fishermen in a licensed fishing boat marked in accordance with regulation 5, with a lawful net ready for shooting and hauling.

- (b) The next turn shall belong to the licensed fisherman who next arrives as above, and so on.
- (c) A turn shall come to an end when a fisherman has shot his haul and shall in no case last more than twenty-four hours as against any other licensed fisherman who is on the ground waiting for a haul.
- (d) During his turn a fisherman shall have exclusive right to the haul; provided he remains with his crew on the haul in readiness to "shoot" with one end of his hauling line ashore.
- (e) No licensed fisherman shall have a second turn until all the other licensed fishermen on the ground have had their first turn.
- (f) No unlicensed fisherman or licensed fisherman in an unlicensed boat shall have any claim to a haul as against a licensed fisherman and crew in a licensed boat.

Provided that two or more turns may be taken at the same time if the water to be fished admits of double banking, but no net shall be shot round an inner net within a boat's length of the cork line of such net.

(2) It shall be unlawful to wilfully disturb or frighten fish ou or in the vicinity of a haul so occupied, or in any manner to obstruct a licensed fisherman during his turn.

(3) When a licensed fisherman is lawfully in possession of a haul, no person shall impede him by the process known as "blocking," whereby another person sets or places his net as to prevent or attempt to prevent fish getting to such haul.

(4) The occupancy of the haul, as aforesaid, shall cover a space not exceeding the length of the net being lawfully used, measured along the shore from a point where the boat in possession is moored in the direction in which the net is laid for hauling.

(5) Any licensed fisherman who suffers any loss from a breach of this regulation may be anthorised by the Minister to take legal proceedings at his own expense.

### Testing the Length, Depth, or Mesh of Nets.

14. For the purpose of testing the length of any fishing net, such net shall be measured along the cork line upon which the net is hung. The depth of any net shall be ascertained by counting the number of meshes situated between opposite points upon the cork and leadlines. The size of the mesh shall be determined by measuring from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact. In cases of dispute a half-pound weight shall be slung or attached to one knot of the mesh to be measured and the space between that and the opposite knot shall be measured. In the event of the net being dry, the part to be measured shall be soaked either in fresh or salt water for not less than ten minutes, and the dimensions of a mesh or meshes of the portion so soaked shall thereupon be determined.

### Ova-bearing Crayfish.

15. No person shall at any period of the year remove or attempt to remove from the abdominal appendages of the fish known as or called the "crayfish" any ova or "spawn" attached thereto.

### Destruction of Fish by Use of Firearms.

16. No person shall capture, kill, or destroy, or attempt to capture, kill, or destroy any fish in any Western Anstralian waters by the discharge or use of any gun, rifle, or other firearm whatsoev r, or by the use of any explosive howsoever ignited or exploded. Provided that this regulation shall not apply to the capture, killing, or destruction or the attempted capture, killing, or destruction of fish which do not belong to any species mentioned in the Second Schedule to the Act.

### Deposit of Refuse.

17. No person shall deposit any filth, refuse, or other deleterious matter in any tidal or inland waters or into any watercourse, whether dry or not, leading into any tidal or inland waters where fish are or are likely to be.

18. No person shall deposit any filth, refuse, or other deleterious matter, or discharge any matter from mining works, sawnills, gasworks or other manufactories or boiling-down or wool-washing establishments in any place in a manner which will cause or be likely to cause the destruction of fish in waters near or adjacent to the place in which the matter aforesaid is deposited or discharged or injury to any fishing grounds.

## Landing Place for Fish.

19. (1) The Fish Market Jetty situated in South Bay, Fremantle, is hereby appointed as the place at which fish intended for sale in Fremantle shall be landed by the person taking or capturing the same; and the landing of such fish at any place in Fremantle elsewhere than the Fish Market Jetty aforesaid is hereby prohibited.

(2) Any person who contravenes this regulation shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations.

### Exclusive Licenses.

20. Every application to the Governor for the grant of an Exclusive License under section 30 of the Act shall be in accordance with Form C in the Appendix to these regulations, shall be signed by the Applicant, and be lodged with or sent to the Chief Inspector of Fisheries at the Fisheries Department, Perth.

21. Upon receipt of an application for an Exclusive License made in accordance with regulation 20 hereof, the Chief Inspector shall furnish to the Governor in writing a report thereon concerning all matters which in his opinion are material to the consideration of the application, and in such report shall state whether or not there is more than the one applicant for an exclusive license in respect of the same marine animal life or product of the sea for the same area. In such report the Chief Inspector of Fisheries may make to the Governor, in relation to the application to which his report relates, any recommendations which in his opinion may assist the Governor in his decision, whether the application shall be granted or refused.

 $22. \ \ \, \mbox{An Exclusive License shall be in accordance with Form D in the Appendix to these regulations, with such variations as may be required by the circumstances of the case.$ 

23. When an Exclusive License is granted the name of the licensee, with the material particulars of the license, shall be published in the Government Gazette.

24. Every Exclusive License shall be granted and shall be held by the licensee upon and subject to the conditions hereinafter mentioned and also to such other special conditions which the Governor may think fit to impose, that is to say:—

(a) The rent reserved by the license shall be payable by the licensee at the Fisheries Department in Perth in equal half-yearly instalments on the first day of January and the first day of July in each and every year, or within twenty-one days after the said dates respectively: Provided that the first instalment of rent shall be paid on or before the issue of the license, and that such instalment and also the last instalment of rent shall be apportioned if necessary to the date of the commencement and of the termination of the license.

(b) The royalty (if any) payable by the licensee under the license shall be paid at the Fisheries Department in Perth in such manner in such instalments or in such amounts as are specifically provided for in the license.

(c) A licensee shall not transfer or assign his license or grant any sublicense without the express consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained.

(d) A licensee shall during the term of his license keep continuously employed in collecting or removing the marine animal life or other product of the sea in respect of which his license has been granted from the area of his license or in treating such marine animal life or other product of the sea aforesaid not less than one man for every square mile included in the said area, and in any case shall keep so employed not less than two men, and shall furnish the Minister, when so required by him, with evidence to his satisfaction that men to the number aforesaid have been and are being so employed.

(e) If any rent or royalty payable by the licensee is unpaid for twenty-one days after the same has become due, or if there is any breach, non-observance, or non-performance by the licensee of any of these conditions or of any other conditions to which the licensee is subject, or if for any public work or in the public interest it is, in the opinion of the Governor, necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor may revoke the license, and upon publication in the *Government Gazette* of notice of such revocation, all the interest of the licensee and any person claiming under him in such license shall cease and determine, and the production of the *Government Gazette* containing a notice as aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence of a cause sufficient to authorise such revocation, and that all the interests in the license of the licensee or any person claiming under him have been lawfully determined.

(f) Neither the Governor nor the Minister shall be under any responsibility to any licensee, or any person claiming under the licensee, in the event of any difference or dispute arising between the licensee and any other licensee or other person in regard to the boundaries of any area, any encroachment thereon or otherwise howsoever.

### Transfer of Exclusive Licenses.

25. (1) Every application for the consent of the Minister to the transfer or assignment of an Exclusive License granted under section 30 of the Act, or to the grant of a sublicense by the license of such license, shall be in writing, in accordance with Form E in the Appendix to these regulations, shall be signed both by the licensee and the proposed transferee, assignee, or sublicensee, as the case may require, and shall be lodged with or sent to the Chief Inspector of Fisheries at the Fisheries Department, Perth, together with the license and a fee of ten shillings, and the instrument of transfer, assignment, or sublicense duly executed by the parties thereto.

(2) Upon receipt of such application, the Chief Inspector of Fisheries shall submit the same to the Minister, together with such report and recommendations in writing which, in the opinion of the Chief Inspector, are material to the consideration of the application by the Minister.

(3) The Minister may grant or refuse such application in his discretion, but if the application is refused the fee of ten shillings which accompanied the application shall be refunded to the licensee.

(4) An instrument of transfer or assignment may be in accordance with Form F in the Appendix to these regulations.

26. When, pursuant to an application made in accordance with regulation 25 hereof, the Minister grants the consent applied for, such consent in accordance with Form G in the Appendix to these regulations shall be indorsed upon and signed by the Minister on the instrument of transfer, or of assignment, or of sublicense subnitted with the application; a memorandum of the transfer or assignment or sublicense in accordance with Form H in the Appendix to these regulations shall be indorsed upon the license and be signed by the Minister, and in the case of a transfer or assignment the instrument of transfer or of assignment, together with the license, shall be delivered to the transferee or assignee, and, in the case of a sublicense, the license shall be delivered to the licensee and the sublicense shall be delivered to the sublicensee.

#### Penalty.

27. Every person why by any act or omission contravenes any of these regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, and, where no particular penalty is prescribed by these regulations in respect of any such offence, such person on conviction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

Where an employee is required to play an extra instrument the employee shall receive 12s. 6d. per week in addition to the appropriate ordinary rates.

### (G.) Special provisions as to Rehearsals :---

1. The rates prescribed for rehearsals are for rehearsal between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., provided that, where the rehearsal is with the actors, finishing time shall not be later than 4 p.m.; provided also, that in continuous picture shows the rehearsal may start at 9 a.m. but such rehearsal shall be held in the place where the musician is usually employed, or in a place within half a mile thereof. The cost of transferring the double bass and the drums shall be borne by the employer: provided that the rehearsals in respect to night pictures theatres may be divided into three periods of one hour each, and held on three separate days between the hours of 6.30 p.m. and 8 p.m.: provided also, that should any person fail to attend a rehearsal such person shall be penalised to the following extent by paying to the employer a sum equal to what he, the musician, would have been paid had he attended such rehearsal.

2. Rehearsals after 4 p.m. and concluding not later than 11 p.m.-15s. each.

3. Except where players are engaged in weekly engagements of two performances each day, no rehearsal shall be held on the same day as a matinee, unless paid for as a performance.

4. Where a performance is held on any day, not more than one rehearsal shall be held on that day, unless such extra rehearsal is paid for as a performance; provided, that where one rehearsal is held on any such day, and such rehearsal is continued beyond the period of three hours, overtime only shall be paid in respect of the period by which such rehearsal exceeds three hours. In respect of an employce in receipt of a weekly wage under section C. of clause 4 more than one rehearsal may he held on any one day, where there is no performances on that day, but the rehearsals (with performances if any) in respect of which the weekly wage is paid are seven or thirteen, as the case may be, in any week and no more: provided that, if the employees desire an adjournment for luncheon before the rehearsal is finished, or if the actors refuse to go on before the rehearsal is finished without an adjournment for lunchcon, then the lunchcon period (not exceeding one hour) is not to be included when calculating the period from which overtime is to be paid.

No deduction from any of the rates herein prescribed shall be made for meals supplied by an employer to an employee.

### 5.-Time of Performance.

Where members employed in an orchestra are ready and prepared to start playing at the time when the members are notified by the employer to be ready to start playing, such time shall be the starting time. In eases where no such notification is given it shall be deemed that such members were notified to be ready to start playing at the advertised time for starting the performance. Where members are not ready and prepared to start at the time notified, or at the advertised time of the performance or rehearsal, the starting time shall be the time when the orchestra actually starts playing.

### 6.-Duration of Performance and Rehearsals.

Except where otherwise provided, the duration of the performance for which the rates are prescribed by this Agreement for weekly, intermittent weekly, or casual employees are as follows:—

- (a) In picture shows, two and three-quarter hours.
- (b) In general theatrical performances, three hours. If the performance is longer in duration than such hours, all time in excess shall be paid for at overtime rates.
- (c) Rehearsals shall not exceed three consecutive hours in duration, between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., or where the orchestra is rehearsing with the actors, between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.; provided that if the employees desire an adjournment for luncheon before the rehearsal is finished, or if the actors refuse to go on before the rehearsal is finished without an adjournment for luncheon, the luncheon period (not exceeding one hour) is not to be included when calculating the period from which overtime is to be paid. Luncheon adjournment shall be between 12 noon and 2 p.m.

Overtime shall be paid if the rehearsal continues beyond 3 p.m. or where the rehearsal is, with the actors, beyond 4 p.m.

- (d) Where a performance exceeds two and onequarter hours, an interval of ten minutes shall be allowed, and such interval shall be ineluded in the time worked.
- (e) Where a casual employee is employed for a performance exceeding four hours, such employee shall, unless meals are provided, be paid not less than 3s. 6d. for refreshments expenses in addition to the rates herein set out.
- (f) Whenever it happens that an employer or his representative requires an orchestra, or any member or members thereof, to play over any part or parts of a production immediately after a matinee performance of same has been completed, for the purpose of rectifying or rearranging any part of the score or performance of the play, the musicians so employed shall be paid overtime rates as prescribed in clause 8 (a) of this Agreement: provided that the orchestra or such member or members thereof shall not be kept more than one hour for such purpose.

### 7.—Overtime.

(a) Where the limit for any rehearsal or performance is exceeded, the amount to be paid shall be 2s. for each fifteen minutes or portion thereof up to midnight, and 3s. for each fifteen minutes or portion thereof after midnight.

(b) Where the time limit for any performance is exceeded, the first five minutes shall not be considered as overtime. All overtime worked shall be computed weekly in the aggregate and shall be paid for at the rate above prescribed; provided that no overtime shall be payable on the first night of general theatrical productions which are produced for at least six nights at the theatre, to which the proviso is applied; and production shall not constitute a new production.

## 8.—Provisions as to Overtime, etc., apply to all Employees.

The provisions of this Agreement as to duration of performance or rehearsal, time of performance or rehearsal, and overtime, apply to all employees, whether casual or otherwise.

### 9.—The Contract of Employment.

(a) Where an employee is not expressly engaged as a casual employee he shall be deemed to be engaged as a weekly employee, or an intermittent weekly employee (as the case may be). A casual employee may at any time enter into an agreement with his employer to become a weekly employee, but such agreement shall not affect any casual rates payable by the employer to employee before such agreement is entered into; provided that, if a casual employee is employed as a weekly employee within three days of his employment as a casual employee, his employment as a weekly employee shall in such case date from the beginning of his employment.

(b) An employee, to become entitled to the payment of the wage prescribed for a weekly employee, or for an intermittent weekly employee, is to perform such of the prescribed work as the employer shall from time to time require, on the days and during the hours usually worked by the class of employees affected.

(c) An employee not attending for duty will lose his pay (at the employer's option) for the actual time of such non-attendance.

(d) The weekly wage prescribed by this Agreement shall be paid to each weekly employee and intermittent employee who is ready and willing to perform his stipulated work during any week, whether he is required to perform such work or not, and this provision is to apply to all engagements, whether for open-air performance or otherwise.

(e) The employment of a weekly employee or of an intermittent weekly employee shall be terminated only by a week's notice on either side, but such notice may be given at any time during the week. This shall not affect the right of the employer to dismiss any employee without notice for malingering, inefficiency, neglect of duty or miscoonduct, and in such cases wages are to be paid up to the time of dismissal.

(f) Where an employee is engaged other than as a weekly employee such engagement shall not be altered to a weekly engagement, except on a week's notice to the employee.

### 10.—Discrimination.

(a) When engaging a musician, employers shall not discriminate against the members of the Union.

(b) The employer shall at all times give preference of employment to members of the Union.

### 11 .- Sundays and Holidays.

Work done (whether a performance or rehearsal) on Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday shall be paid for at the rate of double time. Work done on any other holiday shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter; provided that, where the regular weekly rehearsal is held on such other holiday, the payment to be made in respect thereof shall be 5s. in addition to the ordinary weekly wage covering such rehearsal. The following days are holidays for the purpose of the Agreement:—The day observed as New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, and Labour Day, Foundation Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, and, in addition, all other days which are proclaimed by the State Government under the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, as public holidays.

### 12 .- Travelling Allowance and Transit.

(a) For all engagements or performances outside a 30-mile radius of the city or town where the musician is engaged, the employee shall be provided with firstclass return boat or train accommodation; provided that, on the journey from Port Augusta to Kalgoorlie, the employee shall be provided with second-class accommodation; provided also, that when a boat exceeds 6,000 tons, or where such boat carries first, second and third-class passengers, the employee shall, if required to do so, accept second-class accommodation. In addition to the rates herein set out, the employee shall be allowed £1 for the trip from Adelaide to Perth, and 10s. for the trip on board any ship, and all other cases 10s. for each day (including Sunday) in addition to the rates herein set out. The engagement and allowance starts from the first day and from the place where the employee first starts travelling. Where the part spent in travelling of the starting and of the part so spent of the returning day are together not more than 24 hours, 10s. shall be paid for the whole combination of such parts; where they are more than 24 but not more than 36 hours, 15s. shall be paid, and where they are more than 36 hours, 20s. shall be paid.

Provided that, where the employee starts and returns from the trip on the same day, 10s. shall be paid in respect of that day.

Employees when travelling by train at night shall be provided with sleeping accommodation. If such sleeping accommodation is not provided, the employee shall be paid the sum which is charged to the public by the appropriate Railway Department for such sleeping accommodation.

(b) In all casual engagements where the employce has to pay more than 6d. for a return fare, the employer shall pay cost of return transit, computed as from the post office in the city or town where the musician is engaged.

13.—Performing Outside the Orchestra Pit or Well.

(a) Except where the members of a stage band and/or orchestra are employed under clause 4 (E) hereof to perform on the stage in view of the audience, each performer shall receive not less than 2s. 6d. per performance, or 15s. per week in addition to the rates hereinbefore prescribed.

to the rates hereinbefore prescribed. (b) Where a member of the stage band and/or orchestra is required to play either solo, or as one of a duet, trio, or playing other than as part of a complete orchestra in view of the audience, he shall receive not less than 3s. per performance, or £1 per week in addition to the rates fixed by this Agreement.

## 14 .--- Supply of Music, Etc.

(a) Where the music is supplied by the employee and not by the employer, the employee shall be paid 10s. 6d, per week in addition to the rates hereinbefore prescribed.

(b) The rates prescribed by this Agreement do not include any sums to be paid to a conductor leader, or leader, or any other employee for arranging parts, or doing any orchestration.

### 15.—Payment of Wages.

(a) Weekly employees shall receive their wages weekly.

(b) Casual employees shall be paid their wages at the completion of each performance.

(c) Intermittent weekly employees shall be paid each week at the completion of the engagement.

### 16 .- Supply of Uniforms.

Where an employee is required to wear special uniform other than evening dress, such uniform shall be supplied by the employer and shall be clean and in good condition. Cost of renovation shall be paid by the employer.

### 17 .- Time and Wages Book.

A time and wages book shall be kept by each employer at the place where the musician is employed, and in such time and wages book there shall be entered the name of each employee, the nature of his employment, showing whether easual or weekly, and the amount of overtime worked (if any), also the amount of wages received by the employee each week, or on the completion of each easual engagement, and the employees' signature for same.

Starting and finishing times shall be entered in time and wages book.

The employer and the employee shall be severally responsible for the proper posting of the time and wages book each week, or on the completion of each casual engagement, and the said time and wages book shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of the Union or by any person appointed by him in writing, during business hours.

#### 18.—Area.

This Industrial Agreement shall operate throughout that portion of the State of Western Australia south of the 24deg. parallel of latitude.

19.—Term.

This Agreement shall continue in force for a period of three years from its date.

### No. 6 of 1938.

### (Registered 9/4/38.)

AN Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925, this 8th day of April, 1938, between the Westralian Brickyard, Pottery, Porcelain, and Roof Tile Fixers' Union of Workers and Wilton George Blencowe, as Manager of Calyx Porcelain Works, Hay street, Subiaco.

### Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to workers of the classes herein specified, and shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the Perth Post Office.

### Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall be for a term of three years from the date hereof.

### Wages.

The following minimum wages shall apply to the undermentioned workers and is based on a basic wage of £3 14s. 11d. for males and £2 0s. 5d. for females:—

Whenever any female worker is called upon to carry out work of a skilled nature, the margin to be paid shall be such as is mutually agreed upon between the employer and the Union.

All other adult workers, not employed as above, shall be paid not less than the basic wage.

Where a junior worker provides proof of previous experience in the industry, such experience shall be taken into consideration when such worker is engaged.

### Hours of Duty.

Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work and shall be worked within the following hours :---Monday to Friday inclusive—Between 7 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. The ordinary day's work shall not exceed nine (9)

hours from Monday to Friday inclusive.

### Shift Work.

Where two (2) or more shifts in any one day are worked, the hours of shift workers shall be such as are mutually agreed upon between the employer and the Union. Failing agreement, the hours of shift workers shall be fixed by the Board of Reference.

### Holidays.

A worker employed for more than one week and for less than twelve months shall be paid holiday pay in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment.

Twelve (12) days' holiday on full pay shall be granted to each worker on completion of twelve nonths' con-tinuous service, provided that Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, or the days observed in licu, and Union Pienie Day (on a date to be agreed upon between the parties about the middle of February in each year) shall constitute four of such twelve holidays. The remaining eight (8) days' holiday shall be taken between the 24th day of December and the 3rd of January next, inclusive.

### Overtime.

Work performed beyond (9) nine hours on Monday to Friday inclusive, or on Saturday, or beyond forty-four (44) hours in any one week, or before the prescribed starting or after the prescribed finishing time, shall be deemed to be overtime.

Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two hours and time and a half thereafter.

Work performed by all workers on Sunday, Good Fri-

day, Labour Day, New Year's Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day shall be paid for at the rate of double time. The foregoing shall not apply to firemen whilst employed burning, or to cylinder workers.

### Time and Wages Book,

The employer shall keep and enter up or cause to be kept and entered up a book containing :---

The name of each worker to whom this agreement applies.

The class of work performed by him. The hours of work performed each day by him.

The wages (and overtime, if any) paid to him.

The ages of junior workers.

Such book shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union not more than once weekly, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

#### Piecework.

Piecework shall not be introduced unless by agreement between the employer and the Union. Pieceworkers shall not be paid for any work due to the maker's fault, but shall not be paid less than the prescribed rates herein mentioned.

### Termination of Employment.

One day's notice at any time on either side shall be required before the engagement of any but a casual hand shall be determined. Provided that at any time the employer may dismiss an employee for refusal or neglect to obey orders, misconduct, or neglect in the performance of his duties.

### Visiting Employers.

The secretary of the Union shall have the right to interview employees at their place of work during the lunch hour on any day.

### Preference of Work.

Any worker who is not already a member of the Union shall make and complete an application for membership within fourteen days following his engagement.

### Posting of Agreement.

A printed copy of this Agreement shall be posted in the works by the employer in a conspicuous place.

GREENOUGH Road Board, being a local authority

more following alternative sets of acts to destroy such noxious weeds, and shall diligently continue to take and do the same until all such noxious weeds have been destroyed:

- (a) Pull all such noxious weeds from the ground by hand; or,
- (b) sever all such noxions weeds below the surface of the ground by means of a suitable grubbing implement used by hand; or,
- (c) enlitivate the ground by means of an implement which will sever such noxious weeds below the ground level; or,
- (d) plough the ground to a depth to be fixed in each case by the Board or by the local Inspector appointed by the Board; or,
- (e) break or cut such noxious weeds at or immediately above the surface of the ground by means of a suitable roller, mowing machine, or reaping and binding machine; or,
