FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1), of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of lands, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.

IN THE LICENSING COURT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

In the matter of the Licensing Act, 1911 (Consolidated), and in the matter of a Petition for authority to grant a new License.

To His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia.

The humble Petition of the undersigned sheweth as follows:—

(1) That your Petitioners are a majority in number of the Electors of the State of Western Australia living in an area comprised within the circle having a radius of forty chains from the centre of those pieces of land situate at the corner of Stirling highway and Vancluse street, Claremont, being portion of Swan Location 621, and beings Lots 33, 34, 35, and 36 on Plan 1234, Certificate of Title Volume 113, Folio 41, and Volume 661, Folios 196 and 194.

(2) That there has been an increase in population of such area and that such increase is likely to be permanent;

(3) That there are insufficient licensed premises with Publican's General License to meet public requirements within such area;

(4) That an additional hotel is required within the area with a Publican's General License to meet the requirements of the travelling public;

(5) That the situation, namely, the corner of Stirling highway and Vancluse street is a suitable place for such hotel.

Your Petitioners therefore, humbly pray that the Licensing Court may, pursuant to the powers in that behalf contained in the Licensing Act, 1911 (Consoli-

dated), have authority to grant a New Publican's General License within the Claremont Licensing District for the said premises.

Greenough Road Board.

By-laws for the Control and Management of Halls.

P.W. 2062/26.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1934, the Road Board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act, and whereas the Greenough Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. Interpretation Clause.—In construction of these by-laws the words—

- "Board" shall mean the Greenough Road Board
- "Secretary" means the secretary for the time being of the Greenough Road Board.
- "Hall" means and includes any hall, room, lounge, corridor, stairway, stage, entrance, yard, or land situated within the boundaries of the Townsite Lot upon which any public hall shall be erected.
- "Caretaker" means the caretaker of the hall duly appointed by the Board.

2. Applications for the hire of the hall or any room shall be made in writing to the secretary or other duly authorised agent not less than twenty-four hours before the time that such hall or room is required, and shall state the time and purpose for which such hall or room is required.

3. The name and place of abode of the actual and responsible person or persons hiring the hall or any room shall be given in the application for the hire of the hall or room.

4. The rent of the hall or any room shall be paid with each application, and shall be as set out in Schedule A hereto annexed.

5. The board may at any time demand that the hirer shall prior to the term of any engagement deposit One pound (£1), returnable if clause six (6) is strictly complied with.

6. Any person or persons having hired the hall or any room shall give up possession promptly at the time agreed upon and shall leave the hall or any room, crock-

ery, and appliances clean and fit for other occupation or use, and the furniture in good condition and in its normal position.

7. The hours for which any hall or room shall be hired shall be:—Day—from 9 o'clock a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m.; night—from 7 o'clock p.m. to 1 o'clock a.m.

Provided that extension of time may be granted upon payment of the prescribed fee.

8. The hirer of any hall or room under Schedule A hereto shall not be entitled to the use of the biograph room.

9. Hirers may decorate the hall, using only those fixtures provided for the purpose and no person shall drive a nail into any part of the hall, window, floors, doors, etc., or otherwise deface the hall.

All decorations used in connection with any entertainment must be removed from the premises and disposed of to the satisfaction of the secretary or caretaker within twenty-four (24) hours from the commencement of the hiring period; provided that, with the consent of the secretary first had and obtained, such decorations may be permitted to remain.

10. Hirers shall make their own arrangements for the safety of anything left in the cloak rooms or any parts of the hall, and the Board will accept no responsibility.

11. The Board may grant to any person or company a lease for the exclusive rights to hire the hall for showing sound or other pictures for any period on such nights weekly as may be required.

12. The Board reserves the right to accept or refuse to hire the hall or any room or crockery-ware to any applicant for the hire of same, without assigning a reason for such refusal.

13. The Board may at any time cancel an agreement made for hiring the hall or any room or crockery-ware, by giving twenty-four (24) hours' notice other than a contract made for the hire of the hall for motion pictures. The nights granted to picture proprietor under any contract shall not be available to the public for renting the hall or stage.

14. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of the hall or room for the same date and hour the Board may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of the hall or room shall be granted.

15. The hirer of the hall or room shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, the Entertainments Tax, or any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hiring or using any hall or room. If in the opinion of the Board all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts mentioned above, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of engagement forbid and prevent the use of any hall or room.

16. In the event of the use of any hall or room being forbidden or prevented under the last preceding by-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of such hall or room, as if the hire had been duly fulfilled, and the Board shall not be responsible for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.

17. No fermented or spirituous liquors shall be brought into or consumed in the hall or any room, except when permitted by the Board in writing.

18. No person shall, except at a banquet or smoke social, smoke any tobacco, cigar, cigarette, or objectionable substance, nor strike or otherwise ignite any light in any hall or room during any ball or public entertainment, or at any gathering of persons in the said hall or room.

19. No person shall in any part of the hall—

- (a) enter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;
- (b) use profane or improper language;
- (c) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever;
- (d) damage, mark, or deface any wall or other part of the hall. (Any person who does, permits, or suffers any such damage shall be liable to pay the cost of all such damage in addition to any penalty imposed by these by-laws.)
- (e) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the passageways or other parts of the hall. (Any person doing so shall immediately disperse on being requested to do so by the secretary, caretaker, or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable, whether in uniform or otherwise.)
- (f) perform any games of athletics whilst wearing boots or shoes, unless such boots or shoes are rubber soled.

20. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons, or anything calculated to produce a disturbance, riot, or breach of the peace, shall be permitted in any hall or room.

21. No encouragement shall be given to improper characters to assemble in the hall or any room.

22. Skating shall not be permitted under any consideration.

23. Children under the age of ten years must be under responsible supervision.

24. The hirer of the hall or any room shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour in such hall or room, and shall be solely and entirely responsible for the carrying out of these by-laws and for any damage done to the building, fixtures, fittings, electric light globes, electric light fittings, furniture, or crockery-ware, and shall pay such damage as shall be assessed by the Board. Any article of crockery-ware not accounted for or in a cracked or broken condition shall be paid for at current rates or prices.

25. The secretary, caretaker, or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable when dressed in uniform or otherwise, if known as such to the hirer or his servant, shall be permitted to have free ingress to the hall, or any room at all times during the term of the engagement, and shall be given every facility for seeing that these by-laws are carried out.

26. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these by-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such conviction.

Peppermint Grove Road Board—By-laws.

P.W. 1152/35.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1934, the Road Board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all and any of the purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Peppermint Grove Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws which are additional to the by-laws appearing in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd February, 1918, and are to be read and as from the date hereof be deemed to be incorporated therewith:—

74A. No person shall without the previous consent in writing of the Board make any excavation or trench in or otherwise disturb or break up the surface of any footpath road or public way in the Road District. The Board shall have absolute discretion to give or refuse any consent. Any such consent may be given subject to the performance of such acts or subject to such conditions or restrictions as the Board may from time to time either generally or specifically attach thereto.

74B. Every person who with the consent of the Board makes any excavation or trench in or otherwise disturbs or breaks up the surface of any footpath, road, or public way in the Road District shall in every case erect and keep erected an efficient barricade around such excavation, trench, or other disturbance of the surface, and shall also have and keep such lights continuously burning thereon from sunset to the following sunrise as will be reasonably sufficient to avoid accidents during such time as the excavation, trench, or disturbance continues in existence.

74C. Every such excavation, trench, or disturbance of the surface shall be filled in and made good by the person making the same without any unnecessary delay and in any event within any time which may be fixed by the Board.

74D. Any person who omits or fails to observe or perform any act or comply with any condition or restriction attached to any consent or omits or fails to

comply with any requirement of by-law 74B or 74C or commits any breach of by-law 74A shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(a) Forty-eight (48) hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked in six (6) shifts of eight (8) hours each. Provided that the foregoing shifts may be altered at any time by agreement in writing between the parties.

(b) In all cases, in reckoning the time of duty, any time necessarily occupied in raising steam, in starting up or closing down engines, or in banking fires, shall be included.

6.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of eight (8) hours or of any shift agreed upon pursuant to the proviso in clause 5 (a) in any one day shall be deemed overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-half. All time worked on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-half.

(b) Work done on Christmas Day and Good Friday shall be paid for at double time rates. Foundation Day, New Year's Day, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Boxing Day, and Labour Day shall be paid for at time and a-half.

7.—Holidays.

Each worker, other than a casual worker, shall be entitled to two (2) weeks' annual leave each year on full pay, or should the period of continuous employment be less than one year the worker shall be paid holiday pay in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment. Annual leave shall be taken at a time suitable to the convenience of the employer.

A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall lose all rights under this clause.

Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his employment for any cause whatsoever.

8.—Casual Worker.

(a) A casual worker shall mean and include an employee competent to do the work he is engaged to do who is, without any fault of his own, dismissed or refused work (as it is hereby agreed he may be) before the expiration of six (6) days from and including the date he starts work.

(b) Casual workers shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rates set out above.

9.—Weekly Engagement.

Except as provided in clause 8 hereof, all employment shall be by the week.

10.—Rotation of Shifts.

Where an employee works afternoon or night shift only, or afternoon and night shifts in rotation but does not work day shift one week out of three (3), he shall receive one shilling (1s.) per shift in addition to the rates set out above.

If Christmas Day, or New Year's Day falls on a Sunday the following Monday shall be kept.

11.—Definition.

"Engine-driver" means any person employed by the respondents to this Award who starts, stops, takes charge of, or drives any engine or engines or machinery of which the motive power is steam, gas, suction gas, oil, air, electricity, or any other motive power (other than manual or animal power) used for the purpose of generating electric current.

12.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all engine-drivers and firemen engaged in the production of electric current within the area prescribed in clause 1 hereof.

13.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

14.—Payment for Sickness.

A worker, other than a casual worker, shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one half-day for each completed month of service. Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

Between the Coal Miners' Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia, Colliery, Applicant, and Amalgamated Collieries of W.A., Limited, and Griffin Coal Mining Company, Limited, Respondents.

ON the hearing of an application by the abovenamed applicant Union for amendment of Award, numbered 21 of 1935, delivered in the above matter on the 6th day of October, 1936, and upon reading the report of the Industrial Board hereon, dated the 10th day of February, 1938, and upon hearing the parties by their respective agents, the Court of Arbitration doth hereby order and declare that the said Award, numbered 21 of 1935, is hereby amended as follows:—

Subclause (a): After the word "workers" at the end of this clause add the words:—

"The total earnings to be paid to pieceworkers (otherwise referred to as contract workers) shall be increased or diminished as the case may be by an amount equal to the increase or diminution in the basic wage from time to time declared by the Court."

Subclause (b) Omit the amount "17s. 4d." opposite the word "Roadlayer" and insert in lieu thereof the amount "17s. 6d."

Add a new sub-clause as follows:—

"(i) Any worker required to use cement shall be paid sixpence (6d.) per shift while so doing."

2.—Clause 7—Overtime.

(i) Omit the words:—

"During the first hour Ordinary time.

During the next four At the rate of time and
(4) hours .. a half"

and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

"During the first five (5) hours at the rate of time and a half."

(ii) Omit the words "All time worked by pumpmen on Sundays shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter" and insert in lieu thereof:—

"Time worked by pumpmen on Sundays and the holidays prescribed by Clause 11 (a) shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter for the first eight (8) hours and thereafter at the rate of time and a half."

3.—Clause 11—Holidays.

Subclause (d): Under Column 2 omit the figures and words "2 days," "1 day," and "1 day," and insert in lieu thereof the figures and words "1 day," "½ day" and "½ day" respectively.

4.—Clause 14—Cavil.

Subclause (b): Omit the word "or" appearing between the words "fortnight" and "twenty-seven" and insert the word "and" in lieu thereof.

5.—Clause 19—Minimum Number of Days.

(i) Omit the figures "17" and "18" appearing opposite the words "Cardiff" and "Griffin" respectively, and insert the figures "18" and "19" in lieu thereof respectively.

(ii) Omit the word "or" appearing between the words "fortnight" and "twenty-seven" and insert the word "and" in lieu thereof.

6.—Clause 20—Temporary Advancement.

Omit the word "or" appearing between the words "fortnight" and "twenty-seven" and insert the word "and" in lieu thereof.

7.—Clause 31—Tonnage Rates.

Omit the amount "2s. 6d." opposite the words "Stockton Mine" and insert in lieu thereof the amount "2s. 7d."

8.—Clause 34—Elimination of Refuse.

Omit this clause and insert the following in lieu thereof:—

"(a) Where stone comes down from the roof through no fault of the miner or up from the floor and the Manager directs the miner to eliminate it from the coal, payment shall be made at a rate to be mutually agreed upon by the miners concerned and the Manager, or in the event of disagreement between them, at a rate to be determined by the Board of Reference.

(b) If in the Co-operative Mine there is any refuse in the seam worked and the Manager directs the miner to eliminate it from the coal, the rate to be paid for eliminating it and placing it in the gob shall be one penny farthing (1¼d.) per ton for the first three (3) inches or part thereof in thickness, and one halfpenny (½d.) per ton per inch thereafter up to twelve (12) inches and three farthings (¾d.) per ton per inch over twelve (12) inches, in addition to the rates provided in clause 31."

9.—Clause 42—Assisting the Wheelers.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 13 of 1938.

(Registered 28/5/38.)

(Amendment of Industrial Agreement No. 23 of 1936) Between The Western Australia Professional Musicians' Union of Workers, Perth, and The Australian Broadcasting Commission.

THIS Agreement is made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this thirty-first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, between The Western Australia Professional Musicians' Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union") of the one part, and The Australian Broadcasting Commission (hereinafter called "the Commission") of the other part.

Whereas the parties hereto being the parties to an Industrial Agreement dated the first day of October and registered Number 23 of 1936 (hereinafter referred to as "the original Agreement") have mutually agreed that the said original Agreement should be varied as hereinafter appears—

Now this Agreement witnesseth that such original Agreement shall and is hereby varied in accordance with the following terms, provisions and stipulations:—

(1) Each week's work shall consist of Twenty-one hours divided into seven periods (hereinafter referred to as "appearances") of three hours each.

(2) Not more than two such appearances, one of which shall be a performance appearance or a mixed appearance, shall take place on any one day, and at least one appearance shall be counted for each week day whether or not such appearance shall actually have taken place.

(3) Each such appearance shall at the Commission's option be used entirely for performance or entirely for rehearsal or shall be a "mixed appearance." A "mixed appearance" shall be an appearance which includes not more than sixty minutes of performance and not more than ninety minutes of rehearsal: Provided, however, that no public performance may be treated as a "mixed appearance," that the rehearsal period of ninety minutes must be used solely for the current performance, and that there may not be more than four (4) such "mixed appearances" in any week counted as from Sunday to Saturday inclusive.

(4) Any time worked at a "mixed appearance" in excess of the periods allowed under clause 3 of this variation shall be paid at the following rates:—

(a) Performance—2s. 6d. per quarter-hour or part thereof.

(b) Rehearsal—1s. 3d. per quarter-hour or part thereof, it being understood that such rehearsal overtime may not exceed fifteen minutes.

(5) Any overtime worked during rehearsal or performance appearances will be paid for at the appropriate rates set out in the original Agreement.

(6) Rehearsal appearances shall take place between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. Should the orchestra be required to rehearse after 3 p.m. each player will be paid the additional sum of Four shillings; but should the orchestra be required for rehearsal with a choir or chorons which is not available for a rehearsal which would conclude before 3 p.m., the Commission may call a rehearsal to start or finish before or after 3 p.m. without extra payment. Where casual musicians required to augment the orchestra for public or studio performances are unavailable during normal rehearsal periods, the Commission's permanent musicians may be called upon to rehearse after 3 p.m. without extra payment. Provided that players imported from another State who are required to rehearse after 3 p.m. shall be paid the additional sum of Four shillings.

(7) Mixed appearances and performance appearances will take place between the hours of 12 noon and 12 midnight.

(8) The minimum wage to be paid by the Commission to players engaged under this variation will be Six pounds eleven shillings (£6 11s.) per week with the addition in the case of principal players of a further one-seventh of that sum: Provided that the Commission guarantees that not fewer than half the number of players in any of its orchestras to which this variation applies will receive in each week at least Ten shillings (10s.) more than the minimum wage. For this last purpose the minimum wage of a principal shall be deemed to include the abovementioned additional one-seventh.

(8) (a) The said minimum of Six pounds eleven shillings (£6 11s.) mentioned in clause (8) hereof shall from time to time be increased or decreased by the same amount as the basic wage increases or decreases from the amount thereof as at the Fifth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.

(9) Appearances additional to the week's work will be paid for as follows:—

(a) Performance or rehearsal appearances—Rates respectively provided in the original Agreement.

(b) Mixed appearances—£1 per player.

(c) Sunday appearances whether performance, rehearsal or mixed appearances—£1 16s. 0d. per player.

(10) If the players are required to carry out on a Sunday an appearance which is to be included in the week's work they will be allowed one day free of appearances during that week and will be paid One pound (£1) per player in respect of such appearance.

(11) Musicians engaged in the Commission's permanent orchestras will be engaged on a yearly contract subject to one month's probation.

(12) All musicians engaged on a yearly contract for twelve months under this Agreement will be entitled to fourteen days leave on full ordinary pay without penalty rates: Provided that if a musician fails to renew his contract at the request of the Commission or if in the opinion of the Commission he has not given of his best he will not be entitled to such holidays.

(13) The Commission will give musicians a month's notice of its intention to renew or terminate a musician's contract and similarly a musician will notify the Commission one month in advance whether or not he is prepared to accept re-engagement.

(14) The Commission reserves the right to invite members of the public to be present at either a performance in a recognised studio or at final rehearsals without additional payment to players.

(15) Musicians shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on account of any illness or bodily injury as provided in clause 12 of the original Agreement for more than one week at any one time. Musicians on recovery may resume their usual places in the orchestra. This clause is without prejudice to any musician's rights under any State legislation with regard to worker's compensation after the expiration of such week.

(16) This variation refers solely to work done for the Commission: should the Commission require a musician to work for another organisation such work will be paid for at the ordinary rates and will not count in his week's work.

(17) Should musicians be required for recording a performance they will be paid at the rates agreed upon by the Commission and the Union.

(18) Musicians shall not be required to work with non-Unionists.

(19) Orchestras shall be kept at existing strength during the currency of this Agreement.

(20) Brass, brass and reed, or military bands may be employed for a period of thirty (30) minutes for a fee of Ten pounds ten shillings (£10 10s.) per band. The Commission shall not employ any band under the provisions of this clause unless all members of such band are members of the Union.

And the original Agreement shall and is hereby further varied by the deletion of the words "for a period of two years from such date" in clause 21 thereof and the substitution of the words "until the fourth day of December, 1938."

And it is further agreed between the parties:—

(a) This Agreement shall come into operation as from and inclusive of Sunday the fifth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, and shall continue in operation until the fourth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, and thence afterwards in accordance with the provisions of section 35 (5) of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935.

(b) The original Agreement shall continue to apply except where varied by or inconsistent with the terms of this Agreement while the latter remains in force, but where during such time the terms of the original Agreement are varied by or are inconsistent with the terms of this Agreement the latter terms only shall apply.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, of Western Australia, this Twenty-seventh day of May, 1938, between the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, of the one part, and the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia, Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. Branch, of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all employees of the Fremantle Harbour Trust engaged upon clerical work and not provided for by any other Agreement or Award.

2.—Definitions.

“Officer” shall mean any member of the clerical staff of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, male or female, covered by this Agreement.

“Commissioners” shall mean the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust in office for the time being.

“Union” shall mean the W.A. Branch of the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia, Industrial Union of Workers.

3.—Hours of Duty.

The ordinary hours of duty shall be:—

- (a) Administrative Staff—From 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, with an interval of one hour for lunch, and from 9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays.
- (b) Handling and Custody of Cargo Staff and Store Staff—From 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, with an interval of one hour for lunch, and from 8 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays.

4.—Overtime.

Overtime shall mean all time worked outside the ordinary hours of duty and shall be paid for as follows:—

- (a) All such time worked between 5 p.m. and midnight on any of the days Monday to Friday, inclusive, at the rate of time and a-half, provided that in respect of time commencing at or between 6.30 p.m. and midnight, the minimum payment shall be as for two hours at the appropriate rate.
- (b) All such time worked between midnight and the usual starting time, at the rate of double time, with a minimum payment as for two hours, except where the period of duty commences at or within one hour and a-half prior to such usual starting time, when the rate shall be time and a-half for the actual time worked.
- (c) All such time worked after noon on Saturdays, and all time worked on Sundays and holidays, at the rate of double time, provided that in respect of time worked on Sundays or holidays the minimum payment shall be as for two hours at the appropriate rates.
- (d) Overtime shall not be paid for unless such work is authorised by the Manager or the Secretary of the Commissioners.

5.—Meal Allowance.

In addition to the overtime prescribed in clause 4, a meal allowance of 2s. shall be paid to each officer in the following circumstances:—

- (a) Where an officer is required to remain on duty after the usual finishing time and is so detained on duty for a period exceeding one hour on any working day;
- (b) Where an officer is required to commence duty earlier than two hours prior to the usual starting time on any day, or is not allowed a period of one hour and a-half after the usual finishing time before being required to resume duty again on any working day;
- (c) Where an officer is required on duty on other than a working day and commences at or before 12 noon or 5 p.m., or on Saturday at or before 5 p.m., and continues on duty until or beyond 1.30 p.m. or 6.30 p.m. respectively; provided that the actual period of duty in either case exceeds two hours.

6.—Rates of Pay.

Basic Wage.—The Basic Wage hereinafter referred to shall be as determined from time to time by the State Arbitration Court, but at date is £3 14s. 11d. per week for males and £2 0s. 5d. per week for females.

(a) Junior and Unclassified Positions:—

Male Officers: Per Annum.

During 1st year's experience—40 per cent. of basic wage.

During 2nd year's experience—50 per cent. of basic wage.

During 3rd year's experience—60 per cent. of basic wage.

During 4th year's experience—70 per cent. of basic wage.

During 5th year's experience—80 per cent. of basic wage.

During 6th year's experience—90 per cent. of basic wage.

At 21 years of age—100 per cent. of basic wage.

At 22 years of age—£15 margin over basic wage.

At 23 years of age—£30 margin over basic wage.

Female Officers:

During 1st year's experience—66 per cent. of basic wage.

During 2nd year's experience—83 per cent. of basic wage.

During 3rd year's experience—100 per cent. of basic wage.

During 4th year's experience—£15 margin over basic wage.

During 5th year's experience—£30 margin over basic wage.

At 21 years of age—£45 margin over basic wage

(b) Adult and Classified Positions:—

The salaries of adult officers shall be in accordance with the Schedule attached hereto.

(c) Advancement from the minimum to the maximum of the range shall be by annual increments of £15 in respect of positions the maxima of which do not exceed a margin of £240, and of £24 for positions the maxima of which exceed that margin.

(d) Nothing in this Agreement shall entitle any officer to an advancement in salary unless and until such officer shall have served for twelve months at the lower rate. Any such advancement shall be by the appropriate annual increment and shall be subject to the satisfactory conduct, diligence, and efficiency of the officer.

7.—Higher Duties.

Officers required to relieve temporarily in positions outside their own classifications will be entitled to retain their existing salary or be paid the minimum of the position being relieved, whichever is the greater.

8.—Public Holidays.

All gazetted holidays and Picnic Day shall be observed as public holidays.

9.—Annual Leave.

All officers shall be granted leave of absence on full pay for two weeks in each calendar year, as though within the appropriate provision of the regulations of the Commissioners.

10.—Long Service Leave.

All officers shall be entitled to long service leave as though within the appropriate provision of the regulations of the Commissioners. Any officer who resigns or is retired for any reason other than misconduct or unsatisfactory service, and who has served continuously for at least twelve months next prior thereto shall be paid for long service leave pro rata to the date of resignation or retirement.

11.—Sick Leave.

All officers shall be entitled to sick leave with pay as though within the appropriate provision of the regulations of the Commissioners.

12.—Engagement.

(a) The engagement of any officer, other than one in a temporary or relieving capacity, shall be terminable by one month's notice on either side, excepting that an officer deemed guilty of gross misconduct or neglect of duty may be instantly dismissed or suspended, and shall not be entitled to any such notice or payment in lieu.

(b) Temporary officers may be engaged at such daily or weekly rate as may be appropriate to the particular class of work, and shall be subject to one day's or one week's notice as the case may be, provided that any such officer engaged on a daily basis but whose period of engagement has exceeded one week shall be subject to one week's notice, and provided further that the minimum wage payable to a temporary officer shall not be less than the rate prescribed for similar work under this Agreement.

13.—Preference of Employment.

All officers shall be members of the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia, provided that any officer who at the time of engagement is not a member or such Union shall become a member thereof within fourteen days of such engagement, and provided also that the Union shall not refuse to accept as member any such officer who is eligible, and applies in the manner prescribed, under the rules of the Union, to become a member thereof.

14.—Preservation of Accrued Rights.

Nothing herein contained shall affect the rights or privileges accrued to any officer prior to this Agreement.

15.—Time and Wages Record.

Records shall be kept by the Commissioners showing the name of each officer under this Agreement, the nature of the work performed, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received each pay. The said records shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the Union during working hours.

16.—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint for the purpose of the Agreement a Board of Reference. Such Board shall consist of a Chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties hereto, as prescribed by the Regulations. There are assigned to the Board, in the event of agreement not being arrived at between the said parties, the functions of:—

- (a) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement or any of them.
- (b) Classifying and fixing of salaries, rates, and conditions for any position, occupation, or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement.
- (c) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.
- (d) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

17.—Area.

The area covered by this Agreement shall be the whole of the premises controlled by, vested in, or for the time being occupied by the Commissioners.

18.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three years from and including the first day of January, 1938, provided that after the expiration of twelve months from its commencement, any term or terms hereof may, by mutual consent, be amended or revised upon either party giving the other party one month's notice of a desire to so amend or revise.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 3 of the Abattoirs Act, 1909-1931, that the said Act shall be in force only in such portions of the State as the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation declare to be districts for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by Proclamations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of June, 1916, the 27th day of July, 1928, and the 11th day of January, 1935, respectively, the Governor and the Lieutenant-Governor from time to time declared those portions of the State defined and described in the said Proclamations respectively to be one district to be called the Metropolitan District within the meaning of section 3 of the said Act and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas it is now deemed expedient to enlarge the said Metropolitan District by including therein portions of the said State not now comprised within such district: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 3 of the Abattoirs Act, 1909-1931, and of all other powers in this behalf me enabling, do hereby declare that those portions of the State more particularly defined and described in the Schedule hereunder shall be and are hereby constituted as a district, to be known as the Metropolitan District, within the meaning of section 3 of the said Act and for the purposes of the said Act, and that such Metropolitan District now declared and constituted as aforesaid shall take the place of the Metropolitan District heretofore declared and constituted as aforesaid: And that in so far as this Proclamation is inconsistent with the Proclamations heretofore published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of June, 1916, the 27th day of July, 1928, and the 11th day of January, 1935, as aforesaid, this present Proclamation shall prevail and shall be read and take effect accordingly.

The Schedule.

All those portions of the State comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of twenty-five miles from the General Post Office at Perth as the centre, and also all those portions of the State outside the said circumference of the said circle which are comprised within the boundaries of every road district, as constituted for the time being and from time to time under the Road Districts Act, 1919-1933, through which the said circumference of the said circle passes.
