The Bread Act, 1903-1937.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Ex. Co. 1553; F. & S. 89/38.

WHEREAS His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council may make regulations under the provisions of the Bread Act, 1903-1937, prescribing the method of taking a poll for the purpose of section 16 (b) of that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting in pursuance of such powers and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations:—

THE BREAD ACT, 1903-1937.

Regulations.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Bread Act (Polls of Bakers) Regulations, 1938.
- 2. The Chief Inspector of Factories, or in his absence such other person as the Governor may appoint, shall be the returning officer for the purpose of any poll taken under section 16 (b) of the Bread Act and these regulations.
- 3. Upon receipt of a request from any person carrying on the business of a baker in any municipal or road district that a poll be taken pursuant to section 16 (b) of the Bread Act, 1903-1937, the Chief Inspector of Factories shall as soon as practicable cause a roll of every person carrying on the business of a baker in such municipal or road district to be prepared.
- 4. The Chief Inspector of Factories shall fix the day, date and time for the return of the ballot papers and the closing of the poll which shall not be more than one calendar month or less than one week from the date on which the ballot papers are forwarded to the voter.
- 5. The Chief Inspector of Factories shall cause to be forwarded to each person entitled to vote a notice of intention to take the poll and the return date thereof and the time of closing of the poll, together with a ballot paper and a counterfoil and a stamped and addressed envelope.
- 6. The ballot paper shall be in the form of schedule A to these regulations. Each ballot paper shall be initiated by the Chief Inspector of Factories or some officer duly appointed by him in writing.
 - 7. The method of marking the ballot paper shall be as follows:-
 - The voter shall strike out the name of the day on which he votes that bread shall not be baked in such district.
- 8. A ballot paper shall be deemed to be informal if the voter fails to strike out the name of either day mentioned therein, or if the voter strikes out the names of both days.

- 9. When the voter has marked the ballot paper he shall enclose and seal the same in the envelope sent to him for the purpose and shall sign the counterfoil with his name in full and shall then place such counterfoil, together with the sealed ballot paper, in another envelope and forward such envelope to the Chief Inspector of Factories.
- The result of the poll shall be ascertained by a scrutiny of the ballot papers and by count of the votes by the Chief Inspector of Factories.
- 11. The scrutiny and count of votes shall commence as soon as practicable after the closing of the poll by the returning officer who shall open all envelopes containing ballot papers, count all votes found therein (rejecting all informal ballot papers) and ascertain the determination of the majority of voters from such count of the votes
- 12. The Chief Inspector of Factories shall notify the Minister of the result of every poll taken under these regulations.

Discount for Rates.

The Board may allow discount, not exceeding five per entum, for prompt payment of rates, but such discount shall be allowed in respect of general rates only (not including supplementary rates), and shall not be allowed in respect of rates not paid on or before the 30th day of September of the year in which the rates have been imposed: Provided that the Minister, under special circumstances, may agree to an extension of time for a period not exceeding one month.

- 4. No person shall throw stones or other missiles in any park or public reserve, or leave therein any bottle, orange peel, banana skins, paper, cast-off clothing, or any refuse or litter.

Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner or using indecent, profane or insulting language, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or making harangues whereby a crowd is collected, or committing any act of indecency in any park or public reserve, shall be liable to be forthwith removed by any officer or servant of the Board, or by any constable, and shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

- 6. No person shall cause, allow, or suffer any horse or cattle to be or to depasture upon any park or public reserve without first having obtained a license from the Board to do so.
- 7. No person, unless authorised in that behalf by the Board, shall lead, ride, or drive any horse, cattle, bicycle, tricycle, or vehicle upon or over any portion of any park or public reserve except upon a carriage-way.
- 8. No person, unless authorised in that behalf by the Board, shall leave any vehicle, whether in charge of any person or not, stationary upon any park or public reserve except upon a carriage-way.
- 9. No person shall, unless authorised by the Board in that behalf, interfere with or remove any plant or flower, or enter or walk upon any bed or border or plot of ground set apart for garden or plantation purposes in any park or public reserve.
- 10. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in any park or public reserve any goods or articles of any description, without having previously obtained written permission from the secretary.
- 11. No person shall light any fire within any park or public reserve without permission from the secretary.
- 12. No person shall deface or write upon, or post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint or otherwise affix, or cause to be posted, stuck, stamped, stencilled, painted, or otherwise affixed, any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, writing or picture whatsoever upon any tree, building, fence post, gate, wall, flagging or path in or around any park or public reserve without the written consent of the Beard first obtained.
- 13. No person shall carry firearms through any park or public reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any bird or animal therein.
- 14. No person shall use any spring gun or catapult in any park or public reserve.
- 15. No person shall bathe in any park or public reserve.
- 16. No person shall in any park or public reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use thereof, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult, or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any caretaker, ranger, or other servant of the Board.
- 17. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats or any structure or erection within any park or public reserve.
- 18. No person shall gamble, or play pitch and toss or any other game of chance in any park or public
- 19. No person shall bring, carry or take into any park or public reserve any fermented or spirituous liquors, nor shall any person consume or drink same therein, nor shall be found therein having any fermented or spirituous liquors in his possession or under his control except with the written permission of the Board.
- 20. No person shall camp, lodge, or tarry over night in any park or public reserve, or frequent the same for the purpose of camping, lodging or tarrying over night therein.
- 21. No person or organised club shall practise or play at any game on any park or public reserve without having first obtained a written permit from the Board so to do.

27. No person shall commit a unisance on or in any part of any pavilion, dressing room, or other building erected on any part of any park or public reserve.

28. No person shall fly any kite or balloon on any

park or public reserve.

29. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not exceeding £20.

THE regulations relating to disputes between Local Authorities concerning the question as to the district in which a license has been wholly, mainly, or substantially exercised under the provisions of subsection (2) of section 11 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1935, published in the *Government Gazette* of March 27th, 1936, are hereby repealed and the following inserted in lieu thereof:-

Regulations relating to disputes between Local Authorities concerning the question as to the district in which a license has been wholly, mainly, or substantially exercised under the provisions of subsection (2) of section 11 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1935.

1. Any Local Authority (hereinafter called "the applicant") desirous of having any dispute between the applicant and any other Local Authority (hereinafter called "the respondent") tried and determined by a Police or Resident Magistrate under the provisions of section 11 of the Act may lodge an application in the office of the Police or Resident Magistrate nearest to the office of the applicant.

The application shall be in the form in the Schedule.

2. A copy of the application shall be served on the respondent within seven days of the lodgment of the application with the Magistrate, or such further time as the Magistrate may allow.

3. On proof by affidavit to the satisfaction of the Magistrate that the application has been duly served, the Magistrate shall cause written notice to be sent to the parties of the date and time for hearing of the application.

Such date shall not be less than 14 clear days from the service of the application

on the respondent.

- 4. If either party neglects to appear by its Town Clerk, Secretary, or Traffic Inspector, or by Counsel or Solicitor, on the date and at the time fixed for the hearing, the Magistrate may hear and determine the matter in the absence of such party, or adjourn the application to some other date.
- 5. On the determination of the matter the Magistrate may make any order for payment of the license fee, the subject of the dispute, by one party to the other which necessarily follows as the result of his determination of the matter, and may also make such order as to costs as he thinks fit.

#### NOXIOUS WEEDS ACT, 1924.

Northampton Road Board-By-laws.

NORTHAMPTON Road Board being a local authority within the meaning and for the purposes of the Noxious Weeds Act, 1924, hereby makes the following by-laws in exercise of the powers in the behalf conferred by section 26 of the said Act, such by-laws to be in addition to the by-law already made in exercise of the said powers.

(2) Every owner and every occupier of land within the district of the Board npon which any noxions weeds are growing or present shall take one or more of the following alternative sets of measures and do the one or more following alternative sets of acts to destroy such noxions weeds, and shall diligently continue to take and do the same until all such noxions weeds have been destroyed:—

(a) Pull all such noxious weeds from the ground by hand; or
(b) sever all such noxions weeds below the surface

(b) sever all such noxions weeds below the surface of the ground by means of a suitable grubbing implement used by hand; or

(c) cultivate the ground by means of an implement which will sever such noxious weeds below the ground level; or

(d) plough the ground to a depth to be fixed in each case by the Board or by the local Inspector appointed by the Board; or

(e) break or cut such noxious weeds at or immediately above the surface of the ground by means of a suitable roller, mowing machine, or reaping and binding machine; or

(f) in cases where the plants are dry and there is suitable herbage cover, burn such noxious weeds by means of a running fire.

(3) Any local Inspector appointed by the Board

(3) Any local Inspector appointed by the Board under the said Act may by notice in writing to the owner or occupier of any land within the said district require him to take any particular measures or do any particular act mentioned in the last preceding by-law to destroy noxious weeds growing or being on the land

owned or occupied by him, and he shall forthwith take or do the same without having the alternatives mentioned in such by-law.

(4) Every owner and every occupier of land within the said district shall, immediately after any noxions weeds on such land have been removed from the ground or detached from their roots, gather the same into rows or heaps and either bury the same with at least 12 inches of soil covering them to the surface of the ground or burn them immediately they are sufficiently dry for that purpose.

(5) Any person who commits any breach of any of the above by-laws numbered (2) to (4) inclusive shall be guilty of an offence and be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

### Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note: Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

### 1.—Interpretations.

- (a) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker employed for less than six (6) consecutive working days.
- (b) "Overtime" shall mean all or any time worked on any one day or night in excess of the ordinary number of working hours.

  (c) "Road-man" shall mean a worker engaged
- (c) "Road-man" shall mean a worker engaged forming or constructing roads or street surfaces, including footpaths.
- (d) "Wood blocker" or "Cube layer" shall mean a worker who is setting or laying wood blocks or stone cubes.
- (c) The term "Gardener" shall include workers who do pruning, hedge cutting, or cutting grass with a scythe.
- (f) "Wet ground" shall mean ground in which, in the opinion of the engineer in charge of the particular work, it is impracticable for the workers to work without getting wet feet.

# 2.-Hours of Labour.

(a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work for all workers, except night watchmen or night stablemen and attendants at public latriues. Such hours shall commence at the place of the particular work and close at the place of the particular work.

#### 6.—Conditions.

- (i) One shilling (1s.) per day extra shall be paid to the following workers:
  - (a) men engaged on tar or bitumen work.
  - (b) Men sweeping roads prior to tarring.
  - (c) Men working in wet ground.
  - (d) Concretors.
  - (e) Casual hands (in addition to the rate provided for the particular class of work on which

they are employed).

If any worker is employed for less than six (6) consecutive working days in any of the work covered by the classifications contained in subclauses (a), (b) and (c) of clause 5 (ii) (Wages) he shall also be deemed to be a casual hand.

- (f) Workers using slag in building or repairing roads.
- (g) Tar mixers and tar boilers.
- (h) Wood blocks and cube layers.(i) Men employed behind the wood block tarring machine (in addition to tar allowance).
- (j) Men required to throw with a shovel, metal or other material more than six (6) feet into a wagon.
- (k) Men engaged in drying or screening metal.
- (1) Men camped on the job.
- (ii) One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per day extra shall be paid to stone crushers, where no appliances are provided for preventing dust.
- (iii) Two shillings (2s.) per day extra shall be paid to men operating the tar-spraying pressure machine.
- (iv) Three shillings (3s.) per day extra shall be paid to men cleaning bitumen tank or boiler when so employed.
- (v) Leading hands in charge of not less than three (3) nor more than ten (10) men shall be paid fifteen shillings (15s.) per week in advance of the workers whose work they direct. Leading hands in charge of more than ten (10) men shall receive one pound (£1) per week in advance of the men whose work they direct.
- (vi) Relief: Any worker temporarily employed relieving another worker shall not be reduced in wages whilst so employed.

#### 7.—Drivers.

### S .- Performing Higher Duties.

Workers called upon to perform a duty for which a higher rate is provided than that which they are ordinarily in receipt of, shall be paid for the day, such higher rate, if so employed for one hour or more in any one day.

### 9.-Aged and Infirm Workers.

Any worker who through old age or infirmity is unable to earn the prescribed minimum wage may be employed at such lesser rate as may be agreed upon between the employer and the President and Secretary of the Union.

# 10.-Travelling Allowance.

Workers required to walk more than a mile and a half from the yard or depot shall be provided with travelling facilities or reimbursed any tram or train fares necessarily incurred.

#### 11.-Record Book.

The employer shall keep or cause to be kept a record book containing the following particulars:-

- (a) The name of each worker.(b) The time he starts and finishes work each day.
- (c) The total number of hours worked.
- (d) All overtime worked.
- (e) The wages (and overtime, if any) paid to each worker.

Such record shall be signed by the worker and shall be open for inspection during working hours by the Secretary of, or other person appointed by, the workers' union.

#### 12.-Leave of Absence to Officers.

For the purpose of this Award leave of absence from duty without prejudice shall be granted to the President or Secretary of the Union without pay, provided that they shall first find satisfactory substitutes if so required by the Head of their Department.

# 13.—Payment for Sickness.

- (a) Any worker not attending for duty will lose his pay for the actual time lost, unless he produces evidence satisfactory to the employer that his nonattendance was due to personal ill-health or accident, necessitating such absence, when the following provisions shall apply:-
  - A worker shall be entitled to payment for nonattendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one half day for each completed month of service, provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (b) The year referred to in the preceding clause begins on the date on which this Award comes into force and the said six (6) days may be apportioned accordingly.

# 14.—Scope of Award.

This Award shall apply to workers eligible to belong to the applicant Union directly or indirectly employed by the respondents or any of them in the work to which the Award relates.

#### 15.—Board of Reference.

The Court appoints for the purpose of the Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of :-

(i) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award, or any of them;

(ii) Classifying and fixing wages, rates and condi tions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;

(iii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

### 16.—Term of Award.

This Award shall come into operation as from the 18th day of December, 1937, and shall remain in force for three (3) years, subject to the right of any party to the Award to apply to the Court for a review of any of the provisions of this Award in accordance with the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935.

#### 17.—Area.

This Award shall apply to the area contained within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the General Post Office at Perth, and to the Townsite of Northam.
