The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage Drainage Act, 1909. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Metropolitan Sewerage, South Perth District, South Perth Main Sewer—4th Section:—24-inch diameter reinformed concrete pipe sewer with all manholes and other apparatus connected therewith, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 6094.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 35 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1935, that the Governor may make regulations prescribing all matters which by this Act are required or permitted to be prescribed or which it may be necessary or convenient to prescribe for giving effect to this Act: And whereas by an Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of September, 1921, the Governor made general regulations under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 20th day of May, 1938, the Governor amended the said general regulations by inserting therein after Division V

a new Division VA (regulation 46A and 46B) relating to Fruit Fly: And whereas it is now deemed expedient to amend the said new regulation 46B contained in the said as now deemed expedient to amend the said new regulation root contained in the Bivesion VA in the manner set forth in the schedule hereunder: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers in this behalf him enabling doth hereby amend the general regulations as published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of September, 1921, and amended by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 20th day of May, 1938, in the mainer set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth hereby declare that the amendment hereby made in the said general regulations shall operate and have effect as from the date of the publication of this Order in Conneil in the Government Gazette.

#### The Schedule:

The regulations made under and for the purposes of the Plant Diseases Act; 1914-1935, and published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of September; 1921, as amended by Order in Council published in the Gazette on the 20th day of May, 1938, are amended as follows:-

Regulation 46B (contained in Division VA-Fruit Fly) is amended by adding

at the end thereof a further paragraph as follows

(c) In every orchard, other than orchards mentioned in paragraph A hereof, containing one or more rose plants or one or more other ornamental plants, when either under section 8A or under section 8B of the said Act the owner or occupier or such orchard is required to take appropriate steps and measures for controlling and eradicating or for preventing the spread of the disease called Fruit Fly (Ceratitis capitata) such owner or occupier shall do or cause to be done the following things, namely, he shall gather all haws, pods or fruits of such rose plants or other ornamental plants and shall destroy the same by helling on the source of the moneyed by the form the same by boiling or by some other method approved by an Inspector.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to section 84 of the Public Service Act, 1904-1935, has been pleased, as from the 13th day of August, 1938, to repeal regulation 8 of the regulations made under and for the purposes of the said Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of September, 1910, and in lieu thereof to make a new regulation, to stand as regulation 8, as follows:-

#### Office Hours.

(1.) Subject as heremafter provided, and as from and after the 15th day of August, 1938, the hours of attendance to be observed by officers not subject to special regulations or departmental arrangements in that behalf, or not specially exempted by the Commissioner, shall be from 8.45 o'clock a.m. to 1 o'clock p.m., and from 1.45 o'clock p.m. to 5.6 o'clock p.m. on all week days except Saturday, and the attendance of officers shall not be required on Saturdays.

Provided that-

- (i) Where the public interest requires that offices shall be open to the public and officers shall be in attendance in such offices on Saturdays or where the nature of the work of any officer requires the attendance on Saturdays, the officers mentioned in this paragraph of this proviso may be required to attend in such offices or on such work on Saturdays between the hours of 9 o'clock a.m. and noon:
- (ii) Where in any office the performance of any statutory duty may be necessary on a Saturday, and only one senior or adult officer is employed in such office, the hours prescribed by paragraph (1) of this regulation shall not apply and such senior or adult officer shall attend in such office on each week day except Saturday between the hours of 9 o'clock a.m. and 1 o'clock p.m. and 2 o'clock p.m. and 5 o'clock p.m. and on Saturdays between the hours of 9 o'clock a.m. and noon:
- (iii) Where, under paragraph (i) of this proviso, the attendance of any officer is required on any Saturday, then during the week days next following such Saturday and preceding the next ensuing Saturday, the hours of attendance of such officer shall be on each such week day from 9 o'clock a.m. to 1 o'clock p.m. and from 2 o'clock p.m. to 5 o'clock p.m., or, snbject to the approval of the Permanent Head of the Department in which such öfficer is employed. the hours of attendance shall be those prescribed by this regulation except on one or more week days aforesaid when the officer shall be allowed time off, either in one period or in two or more periods, equal in the aggregate to the time worked on the Saturday last preceding such week days aforesaid.
- 2. Offices in which members of the public require to transact any business shall be open to the public on week days other than Saturday between the hours of 10 o'clock a.m. and 3.30 o'clock p.m. and on Saturdays between the hours of 10 o'clock a.m. and noon unless it be otherwise arranged by the Commissioner or be otherwise required by statutory rules or regulations:

Provided that, subject to any statutory rules or regulations aforesaid, the Commissioner may arrange that any offices shall not be open to the public on Saturdays.

#### Amendment of Regulations.

C.S.D. 99/36; Ex. Co. No. 1615.

THE Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners hereby amend the regulations made under the Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902, and as reprinted by the Government Printer with all amendments up to the 31st day of December, 1937, as follows:—

By repealing regulations Nos. 268 and 269 and inserting in lieu thereof the following new regulations:—

#### No. 268.

#### Permits Required.

(1) No person shall enter upon the premises of the Commissioners with a vehicle to ply for hire ther with for the carriage of passengers, or of passengers' luggage or of goods, either or all, unless he is the holder of a permit and numbered badge issued for the purpose by the Commissioners.

(2) Applications for such permits and badges shall be made to the secretary of

the Trust upon the form provided.

(3) Every permit issued under this regulation shall, subject to regulation 269, operate and have effect until and including the 30th day of June next following the date of the issue of the permit. Provided that where a permit is issued less than 15 days before the 30th day of June in any year such permit may be issued so as to operate and take effect as from the date of issue and also for a period of 12 months commencing on the 1st day of July next following the date of the issue of the permit but no longer.

#### No. 269.

#### Permits May be Refused or Cancelled.

(1) The issue of permits and badges under regulation 268 shall be in the absolute discretion of the Commissioners, who may refuse to issue any permit, if they shall think fit, without giving any reason for such refusal.

(2) Where any permit has been issued and is still in force, and for any reason which in the opinion of the Commissioners is sufficient, the Commissioners consider that such permit should be cancelled, the Commissioners may cancel such permit by notice

in writing signed by the secretary of the Trust delivered to the holder of the permit or sent to him by post addressed to him at his address as known to the Commissioners; and as from the date of delivery or posting of such notice the permit cancelled thereby shall be null and void.

(3) Where a permit has been cancelled by the Commissioners the holder thereof shall forthwith peaceably deliver up such cancelled permit and the badge issued to him therewith to the secretary of the Trust at his office, whether such delivery has been demanded or not. Any failure on the part of the holder to deliver up such permit and badge as aforesaid shall be an offence against this regulation.

NOXIOUS WEEDS ACT, 1924. Municipality of Geraldton.

BY-LAWS of the Municipality of Geraldton made under section 26 of the Noxious Weeds Act, 1924, and numbered 1 to 4, for regulating the destruction, spread, and propagation of noxious weeds:

In pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by section 26 of the said Act, the Municipality of Ger-aldton, being a local authority within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, hereby makes the following by-laws:-

(1.) Every owner and every occupier of land within the district of the Municipality upon which any noxious weeds are growing or present shall take one or more of the following alternative sets of measures and do the one or more following alternative sets of acts to destroy such noxious weeds, and shall diligently continue to take and do the same until all such noxions weeds have been destroyed:

(a) Pull all such noxious weeds from the ground by hand; or

(b) Sever all such noxious weeds below the surface of the ground by means of a suitable grubbing implement used by hand; or

(c) Cultivate the ground by means of an implement which will sever such noxious weeds below the ground level; or

(d) Plough the ground to a depth to be fixed in each case by the Municipality or by the local inspector appointed by the Municipality; or

(e) Break or cut such noxious weeds at or immediately above the surface of the ground by means of a suitable roller, moving machine, or reaping and binding machine; or

(f) In cases where the plants are dry and there is suitable herbage cover, burn such noxious weeds by means of a running fire.

(2.) The local inspector appointed by the Municipality under the said Act may by notice in writing to the owner or occupier of any land within the said district require him to take any particular measures or do any particular acts mentioned in the last preceding by-law to destroy noxious weeds growing or being on the shall arread an acquired by this and he shall forth. the land owned or occupied by him, and he shall forthwith take or do the same without having the alternative mentioned in such by-law.

(3.) Every owner and every occupier of land within the said district shall, immediately after any noxious weeds on such lands have been removed from the ground or detached from their roots, gather the same into rows or heaps and either bury the same with at least 12

inches of soil covering them to the surface of the ground or burn them immediately they are sufficiently dry for

(4.) Any person who commits any breach of any of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
