Metropolitan Sewerage, Claremont District-Reticulation Area No. 10 :- 12 -inch, 9 -inch, 6 -inch and 4 -inch diameter reticulation pipe sewers, with all manholes and all other apparatus connected therewith, between Leoll street and Beatrice road and Alexander road and the Swan River foreshore, as shown in pink on Phan M.W.S.S. \& D.D., W.A., No. 6184.

The owners or occnpiers of all holdings within the District of the Board, with the exception of Townsites, are to carry out the work of destroying rabbits on the whole of their holdings three times on or before the 19th January, the 19th February, and 19th April, 1939. The poisoning must be done to the satisfaction of the Inspector.
The method to be adopted is the laying of poison baits in furrows, baits to be not more than four feet apart.

IN ITHE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 9 of 1937.
Between The West Australian Shop Assistants and Ware house Employers' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and Frank Green and Company and others as per schedule attached, Respondents.
THE Industrial Board for the industry of Shop Assistants, in pursuance of the powers and duties conferred upon it by section 107 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1012-1935, and in pursuance of a remission to it by the Court of Arbitration, doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:-

## AWARD.

## 1.-Scope.

This Arard shall apply to the industries mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereunder and to the industries conducted by the respondents in the second column hereunder and similar industries conducted by other persons, firms, or companies in respect of workers following the vocations mentioned herein: Provided that it shall not apply to workers who are at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Wesfern Australia or in any industrial Agreement registered in accordance with the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912 1935.

> 2.--Area.

This Award shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of fifty (50) miles from the General Post Office in the Town of Geraldton.
3.-Terı1.

The term of this Award shall be three (3) years from the 28 th of November, 1938.

> 4.-Definitions.
(a) The ter'm 'sslop assistant', includes workers 11 country order departments, cashiers and carpet and linoleun layers and planners, and milk bars and soda fountain assistants.
(b) The term 'chead storeman" shall mean a person performing the duties of a storeman and/or who is in charge of one (1) or more adult store hands.
(c) The term "casual hand" shall mean a worker crigaged by the hour who may be put off, or leave the employer's service, at any monent without notice: Provided that a casual hand may be employed for not less than four (4) hours in any one (1) day.

A worker engaged and not permitted to commence work shall receive two (2) hours' pay at the prescribed rate.
(d) "Adult": For the purpose of this Award the word "adult" shall mean a worker twenty-one (21) years of age and over, or a worker who is in receipt of the prescribed adult rate of pay.
(e) The term "weekly hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminable by not less than one (1) week's notice on either side. Such week's notice cannot le continued from week to week: Provided that any worker employed for a period of four (4) consecutive weeks or less shall be classed as a casual hand and paid not less than the mininum rate of wages herein prescribed for a casual hand, but this
proviso shall not apply in cases where a worker employed as a weekly hand has been dispensed with for incompetence or unsuitableness or any eause referred to in Chusc 15 hereot.

## 5.-Chemist Shops.

Any worker employed in a chemist shop shall be sub. ject to the terms of this Award up to the time he or she becomes indentured to the profession.

## 6.-Hours.

The hours of work shall be as follows:-
(a) Porty-six (46) hours shall constitute a week's work for males sixteen (16) years of age and over.
(b) Forty-four (44) hour's sliall constitute a week's work for females and for males under sixteen (16) years of age.
(c) Except as provided by subclauses (d) and (e) hereof, the hours of worls shall be performed as follows:-
(i) On the day of the late shopping night, between 8.40 o'clock a.m. and 9 o'cloek p.m.;
(ii) On the day observed as the half holiday, between 8.40 o'elock a.m. and 1 o'clock p.in.;
(iii) On the other four (4) days of the week (excluding Sunday) between 8.40 o'elock a.m. and 6 o'clock p.m.;
(iv) The hours of workers in wholesale stores may be performed between the hours of 8 o'elock a.m, and 5.30 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, and 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Wednesdays and 8 a.m. to 12 noon on the day observed :as a half holiday.
(d) Workers employed in shops comprised in the Fourth Schedule of the Factories and Shops Act shall be worked to suit the convenience of the employer: Provided that the worker slall be notified of the half day (which shall be granted on an afternoon in each week) upon which his or her services shall not be required.
(e) Workers employed in stores directly comected with motor garages shall be employed for such hours as will conform to the Engineering Award applying to the locality for the purpose of supplying mechanics working in the motor garage with necessary parts and materials.
(f) Ou the day mutually agreed upon by the parties hereto to be observed as Christmas Eve for the purpose of a late shopping niglit, the ordinary hours of work may be extended by agreement between the parties.

## 7.-Meal Times.

(a) Retail Shops other th:m Fourth Schedule Shops:One (1) hour shall be given and taken for meals. Lumel hom shall be between 12 noon and 2.15 p.m. Tea hour shall start within forty-five (45) minutes after the prescribed finishing time.
(b) Fourth Seledule Shops:-Meal hours in Fourth Schedule shops shall be taken at the times most con renient to the employer's business: Provided that one (1) hour shall be given and taken for each meal and that not more than five (5) or less than three (3) hour interval shall be worked without on interval for a meal being taken.
(c) All other Workers:-One (1) hour shall be given and taken for a meal. Lunch hour slall be taken between 12 noon and 2.15 p.m. Tea hour shall start within forty five (45) minutes after the usual finishing time.
(d) Where work is performed outside the ordinary working hours one (1) hour's break for a meal slaall br allowed between 12 o'clock midnight and 1 o'elock a.m. and between 7 arm , and 8 am .

The meal hours referred to in this clause shall be taken in one (1) emutinuous period.

Notwithstanding anytling contained in this clanse, the lunch hour for workers in retail establishments other than Fourth Schedule Shops shall, during the first two (2) days of each of three (3) sales per amum and during Chistmas week, be given and taken between the hours of $11.30 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$, and $2.30 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$.

## 8.-Meal Money.

Workers who are subject to the starting and finishing times prescribed in chause 6 (c) of this Award slabll, if required to continne working for more than three-quarters (3) of an hour after the preseribed finishing time, bo paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) as meal money.

## 9.--Overtime.

(a) Excepting as provided hereunder, all overtime worked shall be paid for at the rate of time and a halt for the first four (4) hours and double time therenfter. In the conputation of overtime each day shall stand by itself.
(b) Where orertime is worked in Fourth Schedule shops, the worker shall be paid overtime as provided in subclause (a) after the prescribed weekly hours of work have been exceeded. Work performed on Sundays and/or prescribed holidays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
(c) Where workers :ure required to work continuously after the first four (4) hours of overtime have been worked (except on Saturday) they shall be paid at the mate of double time up to the time they fimish work: Provided that that hon shall not be later than the prescribed starting time the next day.
(d) All time worked in establishments, other thim those preseribed in subclause (b) hereof, before the usual starting time or after the usual finisling time, shall be paid for at overtime rates. Work performed in the afternoon of the day on which the weekly half-holiday is observed, on Sundays and/or preseribed holidays, shiall be paid for at double tine.
10.-Holidays.
(a) The following days shall be observed as holiday: and paid for', namely, New Year's Day, Ammersary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday. Labour Day, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing' Day.
(b) A holiday of one (1) week on full pay shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of service. A worker not completing a yen of service shall be granted pay in lien of holidays in the proportion that his length of service bears to the full year's employment.

Provided that when a worker is entitled to holidays under this subelanse he shall receive at least two (2) weeks' notice from his employer of the date when it will be convenient to the employer that such worker should take lis holidays.
(c) Hoiday pay shall not acerne during a worker's absence from his employment for any cause whatsoever.
(d) A worker who is smmmarily dismissed for miseonduct or dereliction of duty, or who illegally severs his contract of service, shall lose all rights under this elause.

And thereafter the prescribed minimum adult rate. Where ar canvasser or collector provides his own bicyele le shall be paid an allowance of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per week.
Casual Hands:
(i) Male and female:-Rates prescribed by this Award plas threepence (3d.) per hour.
(ii) Juniors-Male and fenale:-Rates prescribed by this Award plus one penny halfpenny ( $11 / 2 \mathrm{~d}$.) per hour.

## 12.-No Reduction.

Nothing lerein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was being paid a ligher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

## 13.-Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Aw:urd than that which he or she usually performs, shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate while so employed.

## 14.-Proportion of Juniors.

(a) The number of male juniors shall not exceed the proportion of oue (1) to one (1) for the first five (5) male adnlts, and thereafter one (1) junior to every two (2) male adults or fraction thereof.
(b) Where no adult worker is employed one (1) jumior male or one (1) junior female may be employed.
(6) Where one (1) adult female assistant is employed two (2) junior female assistants may be employed.
(d) Where two (2) adult fem:le assistants are employed three (3) junior female assist:ints may be employed.
(e) Where three (3) adult female assistants are enployed four (4) junior female assistants may be employed.
(f) Where four (4) adult female assistants are employed five (5) jumior female assistants may be employed, and thereafter the proportion shall not exeeed five (5) jumior female assistants to four (4) adult female assist ants.

Provided that the whole of the foregoing provisions of clanse 14 hereof shall not come into foree or be of :any effect until the first of January, 1939.

## 15.-Engagement.

One (1) week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement: Provided that an employer at any time may dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for miscondnct, or if, after receiving one (1) week's notice, snch worker does not carry out his or her duties in the same manner as lie or she did prior to such notice.

## 16.--Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or c:anse to bo kept and entered up, a record containing the mames of cach of his workers to whom this Award applies, the chass of work performed by and the wages paid to each worker, the :lge of each junior worker and the time during which each worker has been employed. Such record shall be open to inspection by a represcutative of the Union between the hours of 10 anm. and 4 p.m. on :my working d:y, from Monday to Friday inclusive.

## 17.-Under-Rate Workers.

(i) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimun wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upou in writing between the Union and the employer.
(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
(c) Pending the Board's decision, the worker slall be cutitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

## 18.-Bond of Reference.

(a) The Board appoints for the purpose of the Award a Board or Boards of Reference. Rach Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agrecment being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of:-
(i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the partics from time to time, except snch as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
(ii) classifying :und fixing wages, rates, and conditions for :any oceupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
(iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.
(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Tudustrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.
19.-Conntry Work and Travelling Tine.
(a) When : worker is engaged on outside work the employer shall pay all fares, and a proper allowance at current rates shall be paid for all necessary meals. Fares shall be second-class, except when traveling by coastal boat, when saloon faves shall be paid.
(b) When a worker is engaged at such : distance that he c:mot return at night, suitable board and lodging shall be fonnd at the employer's expensc.
(c) Travelling time ontside ordinary working hours slall be paid for at ordinary rates up to a maximum of twelve (12) hours in any twenty-fonr (24) honr period from the time of starting on the journey: Provided that, when the travelling is by boat, not more than eight (8) hours shall be paid for in such period.

## 20.-.Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:-(a) Name in full, (b) Age and date of birth, (c) Length of service with each previous employer.

The certificate shall be signed by the worker.
No worker shall have any claim for addition:l wages in the event of his age or length of service with a previons employer being wrongly stated on this certificate.

## 21.-Payment for Sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the gromod of personal inthealth for one half ( $1 / 2$ ) day for fach completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hercunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar yen or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickuess to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation muder the Workers' Compensation Act.
lhe worker shall, if required by the employer, produce moof satisfactory to the employer of sickness.

Provided always, and it is hereby expressly agreed and lecharel, that nothing in this Award shall apply to workers in :ny wholesale business (excepting wholesale hardware) other than the following-head storemen, storemen, storemen working singly, packers, junior packers, jumior storemen, junior despatch hands, casual packers, despatch hands, c:sual storemen, casual despatch hands (junior and adult) junior and :udult messengers.

## INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 26 of 1938.
(Registered 8/11/1938.)
THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this 21st day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, between the Bunbiny Tally Clerks' Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the Union"'), of the one part, and the several employers carrying on business in the port of Bunbury whose names are set forth in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the other part, witnesseth as follows:--

## Area.

1. This Agreement shall apply to so much of the Koombana Bay in the Port of Bumbury as is within the highwater mark and also to such ballast grounds as may from time to time be appointed for use by the Harbour Master of the said port.

Scope of Agreement.
2. This Agreement shall apply to the tallying of all cargoes of which the employer may decide to have tallies taken.

## Disposition of Men.

3. An employer or his agent in charge of the tallying shall regulate at his discretion the number of tally clerks he may desire to employ and their disposition in accordance with the requirements of the work to be done, provided that-
(a) Where it is required by the employer that the detail contents of trucks shall be tallied, one tally clerk shall be employed at each hatch, but this shall not apply where the contents of the trucks are represented by piles and beams.
(b) For the tallying of piles and beams, or if it is not required that the contents of the trucks be tallied, not more than two (2) tally elerks shall be employed at each vessel, and each of such tally clerks may be called npon to tally for one or more shippers.
(c) If required, the size and length of all timber tallied shall be recorded by the tally derk as well as the number of pieces.
(d) Nothing in the foregoing shall be taken as agreeing that tally elerks shall be employed except when required by the employer.

## Rates of Pay.

Basic Wage-£4 1s. Od. per week.
4. (a) The rates of pay for all classes of cargo shall be the current general cargo rates payable to nembers of the Waterside Workers' Federation Bunbury Branch.
(b) If during the curreacy of this Agreement the Arbitration Court of Western Australia should prescribe a basic wage for the South-West Land Division differing in amount from that now prescribed, then the marginal differences between the present basic wage and the minimum rates herein preseribed shall be deemed to be increased or decreased as the case may be to the same extent as the present basic wage may be decreased or increased by the said Arbitration Court as aforesaid, to the intent that the rates herein prescribed shall remain constant, subject to subclause (a) hereof.

## Ordinary Hours of Duty and Holidays.

5. The ordinary hours of duty and holidays shall be the same as those observed by the Waterside Workers' Federation Bumbury Branch in accordance with the Award covering their employment for the time being.

## Engagement Places and Times.

6. The engagement places and times shall be those times and places recognised for the purpose of engaging waterside workers, but should it be found that one or more tally clerks are reqnired outside the recognised times for picking ap, it shall be the employer's responsibility to locate the man or men required and it is hereby agreed that any man or men so engaged will attend at the job as directed. Time shall commence and end on the job. Where men are required to work in the roads, free conveyance shall be provided by the employer both ways and time shall be paid both ways.

Tally Records.
7. The tallies shall be recorded as required by the employer or his agent and on forms provided by the employer.

## Receipts.

8. Where receipts for cargo are required by the employer from a receiving ship, they shall be obtained by
the tally clerk as instrncted from the anthorised ship's officer.

## Union Rules.

9. There shall be no Union Rules which may conflict with this Agreement or prevent an enployer from utilising men in lis employ according to the requirements of the work at his disposal.

## Disputes.

10. In the event of a dispute arising from any reason whatsoever work shall contime without intermission pending' a settlement by the employer or employers and the anthorised representative of the Union of the matter in dispute, and if they are unable to come to an agreement the matter to be referred to a Board consisting of a representative of the employers, a representative of the Union, and a Chaimman to be mutually agreed upon by the representatives; failing their agreement, the Registrar of the Arbitration Court of Western Australia or his deputy shall aet as Chairman. The decision of the Chairman shall be final and binding on both parties.

Penalty.
11. Penalty for any breach of this Agreementproved damages.

Term.
12. The term of this Agreement shall be for three years from the date hereof.
