(f) Provided that, in respect of wheat coming within the description of Grade Western Australia No. 2 prescribed for the 1938-1939 wheat season, the following shall be the scale of dockages. Such dockages shall be made from the ruling price from time to time for the particular wheat:—

59 lbs. and over but less than 60 lbs. Nil.
58 lbs. and over but less than 59 lbs. 1d.
57 lbs. and over but less than 58 lbs. 2d.
56 lbs. and over but less than 57 lbs. 3d.

Dockages for barley, oats, drake, foreign grain, and hardball smut shall be on the same basis as in the preceding paragraph (e).

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1937.

The City of Perth—Health By-laws (Amendment).

M.P.H. 2565/18; Ex. Co. No. 2922.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1937, a Local Health Authority may make by-laws and may amend, repeal or alter any by-law so made: Now, therefore, the Council of the City of Perth, being a Local Health Authority, doth hereby order that the by-laws made by it under the said Act and gazetted on the 24th day of December, 1925, be amended as follows:—

Part 1 is amended by the addition after clause 6 of the following new clause, to be numbered 6A:—

6A. (1) No person shall erect, rebuild, maintain, or use any dwelling-house without providing for the same a bathroom equipped with a plunge bath at least 5 feet in length, with an adequate supply of water laid on thereto, to the satisfaction of an inspector. For the purpose of this subclause every residential flat shall be deemed to be a separate dwelling-house.

(2) Such bathroom shall be not less than 5 feet in width at its narrowest point and the floor area of such bathroom shall be not less than 30 square feet and the cubic content of such bathroom shall be not less than 300 cubic feet.

(3) No person shall erect, rebuild, maintain, or use any dwelling-house (which term shall include residential flat buildings) without providing for the same a laundry, with facilities consisting of at least one pair of washing troughs, with an adequate supply of water laid on thereto, and also one copper properly supported and enclosed, to the satisfaction of an inspector: Provided that the Local Authority may permit the provision of other facilities in lieu of the troughs abovementioned, upon such conditions as the Local Authority may in each case specially determine: Provided further, that in the case of residential flat buildings there shall be a laundry equipped with the facilities abovementioned for every ten flats in such building, any odd number of flats less than ten being treated as ten for the purpose of this proviso.

(4) The owner of any premises upon which there is no bathroom or laundry facilities as required by this clause shall, when required by the Local Authority, provide a bathroom and/or laundry facilities, as the case may be, in accordance with the requirements of this clause.

PURSUANT to section 41 of the Bulk Handling Act, 1935, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council hereby makes regulations dealing with the receipt, handling and delivery of a grade of wheat to be styled "Grade Western Australia No. 2," and prescribes a standard for that grade, as follows:—

Grade Western Australia No. 2, 1938-1939 Wheat Season.

1. The company may receive wheat of the 1938-1939 wheat season which complies with the standard hereinafter specified.

2. All such wheat shall be handled separately from and binned separately from other wheat received by the company.

3. The following shall be a description of the standard:—

(a) Subject to the conditions stated hereunder, it will include wheat which is below the limits of variation allowed for other prescribed grades;

(b) The wheat shall be dry, free from weevils or other insects and free from smutty, musty, or other commercially objectionable smell;

(c) The bushel weight of the grain as received by the company will be less than 60 lbs., with a limit of variation to 56 lbs.

4. The company shall issue a distinctive warrant for every parcel of wheat received of this grade so that the wheat can be clearly distinguished from other grades prescribed.

5. The form of warrant may be the same as that issued for Western Australian Standard White, except that it shall have a distinct statement at the head of the warrant that the warrant is issued in respect of Grade Western Australia No. 2 wheat, and shall be on a different coloured form from that used for the 1938-1939 wheat season for Western Australian Standard White.

6. The dockages shall be as prescribed in the Act.

7. The company shall be entitled to make a charge to cover the actual cost of any extra railage reasonably incurred by reason of the special nature of the wheat; for example, by reason of the light weight of the wheat, trucks cannot be loaded to their full capacity in weight.

8. For extra services occasioned by special handling and binning of this grade of wheat the company shall be entitled to make an additional charge of $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per bushel.

9. The company shall not be bound to accept wheat of this standard at any particular siding where there is not sufficient quantity of the wheat offering to justify the company economically in receiving the wheat:

Provided that any person aggrieved by reason of the refusal of the company to receive any wheat of this standard at any particular siding for reasons stated in this regulation may appeal within fourteen days after such refusal to the Minister, whose decision shall be final.
