HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 23 of the Timber Industry Regulation Act, 1926-1937, has been pleased to amend the Timber Industry Regulations, 1927, as published in the Govern-ment Gazette on the 2nd day of September, 1927, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

The abovementioned Timber Industry Regulations are amended as follows :-

- by deleting the figures ('1927'' at the end of regulation 1 and inserting in lieu thereof the figures ('1927-1938'';
- by inserting in regulation 2 next below the words "7-Election of Workmen's Inspectors" the words "Part 7A-Registration of Saw Mills"; 2.
- 3. by inserting after Part 7 a new Part, to stand as Part 7A, as follows:---

Part 7A-Registration of Saw Mills.

85A. Application for registration of a saw mill pursuant to section 12A of the Act shall be made to the controlling officer and shall be in writing, in accordance with Form 8 in the Appendix to these regulations.

An applicant for registration of a saw mill shall, if so required by 85B. the controlling officer, submit with his application a plan or plans showing in detail the layout of benches, skids, machinery, and other plant under the roof of the saw mill and within forty feet of the saw mill.

(1) Upon receipt of the application an inspector shall, if required so 85C to do by the controlling officer, inspect and examine the saw mill, to which the application relates, and report to the controlling officer whether or not the requirements of the Act and its amendments and these regulations have, except for registration of the saw mill, been complied with.

(2) If the controlling officer is of the opinion that any machine, plan:, matter, thing or practice on or connected with the saw mill is dangerous or defertive so as in his opinion to threaten or tend to bodily injury of any person, he shall withhold registration of the saw mill and cause measures, in accordance with the provisions of section 21 of the Act, to be taken in relation to the saw mill, and at the same time cause the applicant to be informed that registration of the saw mill will be withheld until the requisition made under the said section 21 of the Act has been complied with to the satisfaction of an inspector.

85D. When the saw mill the subject of the application is found to be free from danger or defect as aforesaid, whether upon inspection by an inspector, or by the decision of the magistrate after the hearing of an objection to a requisition under section 21 of the Act, the controlling officer shall register the saw mill by making an entry in a register book, to be kept by him for the pur-pose of recording the particulars relating to the saw mill, and shall issue to the applicant a certificate of registration in accordance with Form 9 in the Appendix to these regulations.

85E. (1) Registration of a saw mill shall have effect for the year ending the 31st day of December in which such registration is effected, but may be (2) Every owner or occupier of a registered saw mill who desires to obtain

officer, in accordance with Form 10 in the Appendix to these regulations, and produce his current certificate of registration.

(3) Where a renewal of registration is granted, p record thereof shall be entered in the register book aforsaid, and a certificate of such renewal shall be issued to the applicant in the Form 9 in the Appendix to these regulations.

85F. The fees payable on the registration or on the renewal of registration of a saw mill shall be those set out in the table hereunder, and shall accompany the application for registration or for renewal of registration. Provided that, when application for the first registration of a saw mill is made after the 30th day of June in any year, the fee to be paid in respect of the unexpired portion of such year ending on the next cusuing 31st day of December shall be one-half of the appropriate fee set out in the table hereunder.

(2) This regulation shall apply and be applied when and as often as an increase in the number of persons employed in connection with a saw mill occurs.

(b) is supplied with particulars in writing of the new location of the saw mill before such saw mill is used at its new site.

A record of all the proceedings of Convocation shall be entered in a minute 8. book.

9. (1) At all meetings of Convocation the Warden shall be Chairman and in his absence the Deputy Warden to be appointed under section 55 hereof shall be Chairman.
(2) In the absence of both Warden and Deputy Warden a chairman shall be appointed by the majority of the members present.

Part II .- Standing Rules and Orders of Convocation.

(i) Conduct of Business.

(1) The order of business at an ordinary meeting shall subject to section 54 10. be as follows:-

(2) The order of business at a special meeting shall be the confirmation of the minutes of the previous meeting the business specified in the requisition if any and such urgent business as the Warden directs to be set down in the notice paper but no other business.

The order of procedure on a proposed statute or regulation shall subject to 11. sections 12 and 13 be-

(a) reception of the statute or regulation

(a) reception of the statute of regulation
(b) committal to Committee of the Whole or to Select Committee
(c) report from Committee of the Whole or Select Committee to Convocation
(d) adoption or rejection of the statute or regulation in the form in which it is reported from Committee.

12. Proposed statutes or regulations alterations to which have been recommended by the Statutes Committee in accordance with sections 48 and 49 shall after reception be committed to Committee of the Whole or to a Select Committee. 13. (1) If no motion is proposed to refer to Committee of the Whole or to a

Select Committee a proposed statute or regulation no alterations to which have been recommended by the Statutes Committee, the proposed statute or regulation may be adopted or rejected without committal.

(2) Any proposed statute or regulation may after being reported from Committee be recommitted.

(3) A motion that a proposed statute or regulation be now received may not be amended.

(4) A motion that a proposed statute or regulation be committed to Committee of the Whole or to a Select Committee may be amended by amendment proposing the substitution of Select Committee or Committee of the Whole respectively but not otherwise.

(5) A motion that a proposed statute or regulation be now adopted may be amended in order that the proposed statute or regulation may be committed or recommitted but not otherwise.

(6) (a) All amendments to a proposed statute or regulation shall be relevant to the subject-matter thereof.

(b) The Chairman shall have power on his own initiative or at the request of any (c) A motion to dissent from the Chairman's declaration may thereupon be pro-

posed and if seconded shall take precedence of other business but shall not be deemed to have been passed unless approved by a two-thirds majority of the members present.
14. (1) All notices of motion must be in writing and duly signed.
(2) Notices must be addressed to the Clerk of Convocation and must reach the

(2) Notices must be addressed to the Clerk of Convocation and must reach the Office of the University at least twenty days before the day of meeting.
(3) A notice of motion may be given by one member on behalf of another.
(4) No motion or other matter shall be considered at a meeting unless the subject with which it deals appears on the notice paper of such meeting or unless two-thirds of those present agree to discuss the subject at the meeting but in no case shall a vote be taken on such motion or matter at that meeting.
15. The regular order of business may be suspended at any meeting by motion approved by a two-thirds majority of those present.
16. (1) Every question shall be decided on the voices or by show of hands unless at least five members demand a ballot.

at least five members demand a ballot.

(2) A ballot shall be taken in such manner as the Chairman shall direct.

(3) When a question has been decided by a show of hands any member may re-quire the number of votes for and against to be recorded in the minutes.

(ii) Rules of Debate.

17. Whenever the chairman rises during a debate any member then speaking or offering to speak shall sit down and the chairman shall be heard without interruption. 18. If the chairman decides to take part in a debate he shall vacate the chair and

shall call upon a member to act as chairman. 19. Every member desiring to speak shall rise in his place and address himself to the chair.

20. When two or more members rise to speak the chairman shall call upon the member who in his opinion first rose in his place.

(1) A member may at any time move that the strict order of debate be 21. observed.

(2) Such motion shall be put to the vote without debate and if it is carried no member without the permission of the chairman shall speak twice during the debate except that the mover of the original motion may reply and that on an amendment being lost the member who proposed such amendment may propose further amendments.

(3) A member who claims to have been misrepresented or misruderstood shall be allowed to explain immediately before the proposer of the original motion replies.
(4) When an amendment becomes the motion it shall be open for discussion as if

(1) when an interfamility becomes the motion it shall be open for discussion as if it were an original motion. 22. A reply shall be allowed to a member who has proposed a motion but not to any member who has proposed an amendment except the member who proposed an amendment which has become the motion.

No member may speak to any question if it has been put by the chairman and 23. the meeting has voted thereon.

24. In the absence of a member who has given notice of motion any member present may propose such motion if he has received written authority to do so from the member who gave such notice.

25. A motion may be amended or withdrawn by the proposer with leave of the meeting.

26. When an amendment is proposed to omit certain words the chairman shall put the question "that such words be omitted." 27. When an amendment is proposed to insert or add certain words the chairman shall put the question "that such words be inserted" or "that such words be added."

28. When an amendment is proposed to omit certain words and to substitute or add others the chairman shall first put the question "that such words be omit(ed" and if that question is rejected the amendment shall lapse but if it is approved then the chairman shall put the further question "that such other words be inserted" or "added" as may be required.

29. Any member proposing an amendment may be required by the chairman to put it in writing and hand it to him. 30. Any motion or amendment which is not seconded shall not be discussed and

no entry thereof shall be made in the minutes. 31. When amendments have been proposed and defeated or withdrawn the motion

shall be put as originally proposed.

32.

(1) A motion may be superseded—
(a) by a motion that "Convocation proceed to the next business"
(b) by a motion that "Convocation adjourn."

(2) Such motions if seconded shall be put forthwith.

(1) A debate may be closed by a motion "that the question be now put" 33 being proposed seconded and carried. (2) After such a motion has been seconded it shall be put forthwith without amend-

ment or debate but shall not be deemed to have been carried unless two-thirds of the members present vote for it.

34. Notice of a motion to rescind any decision of Convocation must have been previously given in writing in accordance with section 14 but no such motion shall be deemed to have been carried unless two-thirds of the members present vote for it.

(iii) Committee of the Whole.

35. A Committee of the Whole may be appointed by the passing of a motion "That Convocation do now resolve itself into Committee of the Whole."

36. The Warden shall be chairman of such Committee but if he is unwilling to act any other member may be voted to the chair. 37. A member may speak more than once on any question. 38. Motions and amendments thereto need not be seconded.

39 The chairman shall have a vote and in the case of an equality of votes a second or easting vote.

(iv) Select Committees.

40. Convocation may refer any matter to a Select Committee.

41. (1) Unless Convocation determines otherwise a Select Committee shall consist of five members three of whom shall form a quorum. (2) The Warden shall *ex officio* be an additional member of all Select Committees

and shall have the right to act as chairman thereof but if he does not wish to act as chairman the Committee shall elect one of its members to be chairman.

The chairman shall have a vote and in the case of an equality of votes a 42 43. The report of a Select Committee shall be written and signed by the chairman

and shall be presented by him to Convocation.

(v) Standing Committee.

44. (1) At its first meeting in each year Convocation shall elect a Standing Committee to consist of not less than seven nor more than eleven members who shall hold office until their successors are elected.

(2) The Standing Committee shall have such powers and perform such duties as are conferred or imposed upon it by Convocation.
45. (1) The Warden shall be an additional member of the Standing Committee and shall have the right to act as chairman thereof.

(2) If the Warden does not wish to act as chairman or if he is absent the Standing Committee shall elect a chairman for each meeting.

(vi) Statutes Committee.

46. (1) At its first meeting in each year Convocation shall elect a Statutes Committee to consist of not less than five nor more than nine members who shall hold office until their successors are elected.

(2) The Statutes Committee shall have such powers and perform such duties as are conferred or imposed upon it by Convocation.

(3) The Warden shall be an additional member of the Statutes Committee and shall have the right to act as chairman thereof but if the Warden does not wish to act as chairman or if he is absent the Statutes Committee shall elect a chairman for each

meeting. 47. The draft of every proposed statute or regulation which it is intended to submit to Convocation shall first be considered by the Statutes Committee which may

submit to convocation shall first be considered by the statutes committee which may recommend any alteration thereof.
48. (1) The draft of every proposed statute or regulation shall be published in the notice sent to members in accordance with section 7 (2).
(2) Any alterations recommended by the Statutes Committee shall also be publications.

lished in the notice.

49The Statutes Committee shall not recommend to a meeting of Convocation any alterations to a proposed statute or regulation which have not been published in accordance with sections 7 (2) and 48.

(vii) General.

50. If at an ordinary or special or adjourned meeting a question shall arise for which no provision is made by these Standing Orders the decision of the chairman thereon shall be final.

51. These Standing Orders or any of them except section 14 and sections 47 to 49 both inclusive may be suspended for the time being on motion proposed with or without notice but no such motion shall be deemed to have been passed unless two-thirds of the members present vote for it.

52. In the election of all Committees by Convocation-

- (a) every candidate for election shall be proposed and seconded
- (b) if there are no more candidates than there are vacancies to be filled the Warden shall declare the persons nominated to have been duly elected.
- (c) if there are more candidates than there are vacancies to be filled an election shall forthwith be held by secret ballot and for this purpose of the candidates in alphabetical order of surnames and the method of scrutiny of the voting papers shall be those prescribed in sections 18 to 22 both inclusive of Statute No. 12.

Part III .- Election of Warden.

53. (1) The election of a Warden shall be held at the first ordinary meeting in each year.

(2) A member of Convocation seeking election as Warden shall at least twenty-one days before the date of the meeting deliver to the Clerk of Convocation a nomination paper signed by him and by two other members of Convocation.

(3) If within the prescribed period only one valid nomination has been delivered to the Clerk of Convocation the member so nominated shall be deemed to have been elected.

(4) If within the prescribed period more than one valid nomination has been delivered to the Clerk of Convocation the following provisions shall apply-

- (a) the Clerk of Convocation shall not later than fifteen days before the date of the meeting send by post to each member resident in Australia a voting paper with a form of printed declaration which shall be attached thereto and shall bear a distinguishing number and shall be initialled by the Clerk
- (b) the voting paper with the form of declaration attached thereto shall be so printed and prepared that the voter may effectually conceal the manner in which he has voted.
 (c) the declaration shall be in the following form:—

I the undersigned declare that I am a member of Convocation of the University of Western Australia.

Date.....

- (d) on the voting paper shall be printed or typed the names in alphabetical order and the addresses and descriptions of all candidates
- (e) the voter shall indicate on the voting paper the order of his preference by placing numbers consecutively starting with the number '1' oppo-site the names of all candidates so that any voting paper on which the name of any candidate is left unnumbered shall be invalid and that any voting paper which bears the signature of the voter or any matter other than the numbers necessary to indicate the voter's preference shall also be invalid
- (f) the voter shall then fold his voting paper and fasten it by means of the gnumed edges in accordance with directions to be printed on the voting paper so that only the declaration shall be visible and he shall then place the voting paper with the declaration attached thereto but without any other matter in a sealed prepaid envelope upon which shall be printed or written the words "Convocation voting paper: Election of Warden" and which shall be addressed to the Clerk of Convocation
- (g) all voting papers so transmitted to and received by the Clerk of Con-vocation not less than twenty-four hours before the time fixed for the meeting shall if otherwise valid be counted at the scrutiny
- (h) no voting paper or declaration other than that officially issued as aforesaid shall be accepted but if the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that a voting paper and declaration have been lost or accidentally destroyed he shall
- (i) all envelopes addressed to the Clerk of Convocation and containing voting paper and declaration ing paper and declaration shall be kept by him unopened until twenty four hours before the time fixed for the meeting and then he together with scrutineers to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor shall proceed to examine the voting papers (j) at such examination the envelopes shall be opened and the voting
- papers sorted in alphabetical order of the names of the persons purporting to have signed the declarations attached thereto
- (k) after the names appearing on the declarations have been checked with the list of members of Convocation the declarations shall be torn off and the voting papers placed unopened in a ballot box but if there is any doubt as to the genuineness of any signature the Vice-Chancellor shall examine the disputed signature and decide whether or not it is genuine his decision to be final
- (1) all the voting papers in the ballot box shall next be opened and scrutiny thereof conducted in accordance with the method prescribed by section 21 of Statute No. 12 but if on report of the Clerk of Con-vocation or of a scrutineer the Vice-Chancellor shall be of opinion that

any voting paper is substantially defective or contains identifying marks or any matter other than the numbers necessary to indicate the voter's preference such voting paper shall be rejected.

(5) (a) If within the prescribed period no valid nomination has been delivered to the Clerk of Convocation he shall inform the chairman of the meeting and thereupon any member of Convocation may be nominated at the meeting and shall be eligible for election.

(b) If only one candidate is nominated at the meeting he shall be deemed to have been elected.

(c) If more than one candidate is nominated at the meeting the names of all can-didates shall be written in alphabetical order on voting papers one of which shall be handed to each member present who shall vote in the manner prescribed by subsection

(4) (e). (d) After the voting papers have been collected a scrutiny shall be conducted in the manner prescribed in subsection (4) (1) but so that the chairman shall take the

(7) The candidate who has been elected unopposed as Warden or who is declared to have been duly elected as Warden after a contested election shall enter upon the duties of his office at the elose of the meeting at which he was elected and shall retain office until the close of the meeting at which his successor shall be elected.

54. All matters relating to the election of Warden shall take precedence of other business at the first meeting held in each year.
55. (1) The Warden for the time being shall nominate a past Warden to be a Deputy Warden for the current year and shall in like manner fill any casual vacancy occurring in the office of Deputy Warden.
(2) The Deputy Warden shall act for and exercise all the powers of the Warden whenever the Warden for any reason is unable to attend a meeting of Convocation or of any Committee of Convocation.

(3) In the event of a vacancy in the office of Warden from whatever cause arising the Deputy Warden for the time being shall become Warden and shall hold office for the remainder of the current year with all the powers of a Warden including the power to nominate a Deputy Warden for the remainder of the year.

INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION. (Award No. 19 of 1938.)

SCHEDULE.

Apprenticeship.

Definitions.

1. (1) "Act" means the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, and any alteration or amendment thereof for the time being in force.

(2) "Apprentice" means any person of either sex of any age who is apprenticed to learn or to be taught any industry, trade, craft, or calling to which these Regulations apply, and includes an apprentice on probation.

(3) "Award" includes Industrial Agreement.

(4) "Court" means the Court of Arbitration.

(5) "Employer" includes any firm, company or corporation.

(6) "Minor" means a person not less than fourteen years of age and not more than eighteen years of age who customarily works under the direction of or in association with an employer, master, or journeyman upon the material and with the tools or implements used in the industry.

(7) "Registrar" means the Registrar of the Court.

Employment-Probation.

2. No minor shall (except where provision is otherwise made in this Award) be employed or engaged in the industry, except subject to the conditions of apprenticeship or probationership herein contained.

3. (1) Every apprentice shall be employed on probation for a period of three months to determine his fitness or otherwise for apprenticeship, and shall work only for such hours per day and for such remuneration as may be prescribed by the Award. In the event of his becoming an apprentice such probationary period shall be counted as part of the term of apprenticeship.

(2) The Court may in any case where it seems expedient to do so, order that the probationary period of em-ployment be extended for a further period not exceeding three months.

(a) Any employer taking an apprentice on probation shall within 14 days thereafter register such probationer by giving notice thereof to the Registrar in the prescribed form. If at the date of the coming into operation of these Regulations an employer is employing any apprentice or probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall forthwith apply for the due registration of such apprentice or probationer.

(b) At the end of the period of probation of each apprentice, if mutually agreed upon by the employer and the legal guardian of the boy, but not otherwise, he may become an apprentice under an agreement.

The employer of every apprentice shall keep him constantly at work and teach such apprentice or cause him to be taught the industry, craft, occupation, or call-ing in relation to which he is bound apprentice, by competent instruction in a gradual and complete manner, and shall give such apprentice a reasonable opportunity to learn the same, and receive, during the period of his apprenticeship, such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as may be necessary. And every ap-prentice shall, during the period of his apprenticeship, faithfully serve his employer for the purpose of being taught the industry, craft, occupation, or calling, in rela-tion to which he is bound, and shall also conscientiously and regularly accept such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as aforesaid, in addition to the teaching that may be provided by his employer.

6. An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under an Award of the Court.

Advisory Committee.

7. A Board to be called "The Advisory Committee" may be appointed by the Court to advise in regard to any apprenticeship matter. Such committee shall consist of the following:

- (a) Some person appointed by the Court who shall act as Chairman.
- (b) Two representatives appointed by the employers.

(c) Two representatives appointed by the industrial union or unions of workers in the trade.

The Advisory Committee shall have such powers and duties as the Court in each case may determine.

8. (i.) No employer shall refuse employment to any person, or dismiss any worker from his employment, or injure him in his employment or alter his position to his prejudice, by reason merely of the fact that the worker is a member of any Advisory Committee, or by reason merely of anything said or done or omitted to be done by any such person or worker in the course of his duty as such member.

(ii.) In any proceeding for any contravention of this Regulation it shall lie upon the employer to show that any person proved to have been refused employment, or any worker proved to have been dismissed or injured in his employment or prejudiced whilst acting as such member, was refused employment or dismissed or injured in his employment or prejudiced for some reason other than that mentioned in this Regulation.

Agreement of Apprenticeship.

9. (a) All agreement of Apprenticesmp. 9. (a) All agreements of apprenticeship shall be drawn up on a form approved by the Court, and signed by the employer, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the apprentice, and the Registrar. No employer, guar-dian, or apprentice shall enter into any agreement or undertaking purporting to add to, vary, alter or amend any such agreement without the approval of the Court.

(b) There shall be three copies of each agreement, of which one copy shall be held by the employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the appren-tice, and one copy shall be retained by the Registrar.

(c) The apprenticeship agreement shall be completed within one month of the termination of the probationary period.

(d) Every agreement of apprenticeship shall be subject to the provisions of the Award in force for the time being applicable to apprenticeship in the industry.

10. Every agreement entered into by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice shall be for a period of five years, but this period may be reduced in special circumstances with the approval of the Court.

11. Every agreement of apprenticeship entered into shall contain-

- (a) The names and addresses of the parties to the agreement.
- (b) The date of birth of the apprentice.
- (c) A description of the industry, eraft, occupa-tion or calling or combination thereof to
- ton or calling or combination thereof to which the apprentice is to be bound.
 (d) The date at which the apprenticeship is to commence and the period of apprenticeship.
 (e) A condition requiring the apprentice to obey all reasonable directions of the employer and requiring the employer and apprentice to comply with the terms of the industrial Award so far as they concern the apprentice.
 (f) A condition that technical instruction of the
- (f) A condition that technical instruction of the apprentice, when available, shall be at the employer's expense, and shall be in the employer's time, except in places where such instruction is given after the ordinary working hours.
- (g) A condition that in the event of any apprentice, in the opinion of the examiners, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense to enable such appren-tice to reach the necessary standard.
- (h) The general conditions of apprenticeship.

Transfer of Apprentices.

12. (a) The Court shall have power to transfer an apprentice from one employer to another either temporarily or permanently-

- (i) if the employer does not provide the necessary
- (i) If the employer does not provide the necessary facilities for the apprentice to become proficient in his trade; or
 (ii) upon the application of the employer or the apprentice for good cause shown.

(b) The transfer of every agreement shall be on a form approved by the Court, and shall be made out in quadruplicate and shall, unless the Court otherwise directs, be signed by the late employer or his assigns, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the apprentice, the Registrar, and the new employer. The transfer form shall be completed within two months of the date on which the transfer is effected.

(c) One copy of the transfer agreement shall be held by the late employer, one shall be held by the new employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one shall be retained by the Registrar.

apprentice, and one shall be retained by the Registrar. 13. Should an employer at any time before the determination of the period of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the service of the apprentice he may with the consent of the apprentice and guardian transfer him to another employer earrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and pay the rate of wages prescribed by the Court in its Award or otherwise according to the total length o time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer.

14. On the transfer or termination of any apprenticeship, from whatever cause, the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate stating what time he has served, full particulars of the branches of the trade or industry in which he has received instruction, the proficiency attained, and shall also notify the Clerk of the Conrt, and the cause thereof.

15. In the event of an employer being unable to provide work for the apprentice or to mutually agree with the legal guardian of the apprentice to cancel the agreement or to arrange a transfer, application may be made to the Court to arrange for such transfer or to have such agreement cancelled.

16. Where a person is apprenticed to partners his agreement of apprenticeship shall upon the retirement or death of any partner be deemed to be assigned to the continuing partner or partners.

Cancellation of Agreement.

17. Every agreement shall include a provision that it may be cancelled, by mutual consent, by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice giving one month's notice in writing to the Court and to the parties concerned that such apprenticeship shall be terminated.

18. If the apprentice shall at any time be wilfully disobedient to the lawful orders of the employer, his managers, foremen or other servants having authority over the apprentice, or be slothful, negligent, or dishonest, or shall otherwise grossly misbehave himself, or shall not conduct himself as a good and faithful apprentice should do, or shall not faithfully observe and keep his part of his agreement, then it shall be lawful for the employer, with the consent of the Court, to discharge the apprentice from his service.

19. The Court may in its discretion for any cause which it may deem sufficient on the application of any party to an apprenticeship agreement vary or cancel the agreement, either unconditionally or subject to such terms and conditions as it may deem advisable.

20. No apprentice employed under a registered agreement shall be discharged by the employer for alleged misconduct until the registration of the agreement of apprenticeship has been cancelled by order of the Court on the application of the employer.

Provided, however, that an apprentice may be suspended for misconduct by the employer, but in any such case the employer shall forthwith make an application for cancellation of the agreement of apprenticeship, and in the event of the Court refusing same the wages of the apprentice or such portion thereof, if any, as the Court may order shall be paid as from the date of such suspension, and, in the event of the application for cancellation being granted, such order may take effect from the date when the apprentice was suspended.

21. Subject to the provisions of the Acts relating to Bankruptcy and Insolvency and the Winding-up of Companies, the following provisions shall apply:

- (a) The following provisions shall apply:
 (a) The Trustee or Liquidator, as the case may be, may give written notice to the apprentice and his parent or guardian of his intention to discontinue the employment of the apprentice from a date to be named in such notice, and therempon the agreement shall be deemed to be terminated from the said date; subject, however, and without prejudice to the right of the apprentice, his parent or guardian, to compound, compromise, or agree upon or to sue for and recover such damages (if any) as he may have sustained through such rescission of the agreement as aforesaid.
 - (b) Any proceedings for damages hereunder must be commenced within six weeks after the service on the apprentice of the notice referred to in subclause (a) hereof, otherwise any claim for damages shall be deemed to be waived and forfeited.

Extension of Term.

22. Subject to Regulation 37, time lost by the apprentice through sickness or any other cause whatsoever may, with the consent of the Court on the application of any party, be added to the original term in the apprenticeship agreement at the end of the year of service in which the time has been lost or at the termination of the apprenticeship period.

23. The term of apprenticeship may be extended by the Court on the failure of an apprentice to pass any of the examinations, and for such purpose it shall be the duty of the examiners to make any necessary recommendation to the Court. Any extension of the term of apprenticeship shall be subject to all the conditions and stipulations in the original agreement, except as to rates of wages, which shall be such amount as the Court may determine.

Technical Education Classes.

24. (a) Every apprentice shall attend regularly and punctually a Government or other approved technical school vocational classes or classes of instruction, for instruction in such subjects as are provided for his trade. This clause shall be deemed to have been complied with if the apprentice takes a course in an approved correspondence school: Provided, however, that attendances shall not be compulsory when the apprentice is resident outside a radius of 12 miles from the place where instruction is given, or in the case of illness of the apprentice the proof whereof lies on him. Provided also that if technical instruction is not available in the locality in which the apprentice is employed and is available by correspondence, at reasonable cost to be approved by the Court, the Court may prescribe such correspondence course as the technical instruction to be taken by the apprentice and paid for by the employer.

(b) The fees for the classes attended by the apprentice shall be paid by the employer.

(c) The period during which apprentices are to attend such technical school or classes if any shall be four hours per week.

25. Where in any case it is shown to the satisfaction of the Court that any apprentice, by reason of his engagement on country work or other good cause, cannot conveniently attend a technical school or other prescribed classes, such of these Regulations as relate to attendance at a technical school or other prescribed classes, and to examinations, shall not apply to such apprentice, but he shall be subject to such conditions as the Court may direct.

26. If the examiners or the industrial union or employer concerned make representations to the Court that the facilities provided by the Technical School, or other place of vocational training for the teaching of apprentices, are inadequate, the Court may make such investigations and such report to the Minister controlling such Technical School, or such other place, as it deems necessary.

27. When an apprentice attends a technical school, vocational classes, or other class or classes of instruction during his ordinary working hours, where such is prescribed, the time so occupied shall be regarded as part of the term of his apprenticeship, and the employer shall not be entitled to make any deduction from the wages of the apprentice for such time.

Examinations.

28 (a) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination at the places and times appointed by the Registrar after consultation with the examiners.

(b) Every apprentice shall, prior to submitting himself to examination, produce to the examiners a certificate that he has made at least 70 per centum of attendances at the technical school or other place of instruction nuless he is exempted from such attendance for good cause.

(c) The clerk of the Court shall notify the examiners of the names and addresses of the apprentices required to submit themselves to examination.

(d) The employer shall place at the disposal of the examiners such material and machinery on his premises as may be required by them, and shall in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.

29. (a) The examiners shall be persons skilled in the industry and appointed as prescribed by the Award. Failing provision or appointment as aforesaid the Court may appoint such person or persons as it may deem fit. In the event of a disagreement between the examiner, the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them or nominated by the Court or the President at the request of any of the examiners, and the decision of such person shall be final and conclusive.

(b) It shall be the duty of the examiners to examine the work, require the production of the certificate of attendance, inquire into the diligence of each apprentice, and as to the opportunities provided by the employer for each apprentice to learn, and to submit a report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination within one month from the date of holding the examination, but this period may be extended by the Court.

(c) Such examination shall, where possible, include theory and practice as applied to the trade, industry, craft, occupation, or calling to which the apprentice is indentured.

30. The Registrar shall, after each examination, issue a certificate to each apprentice indicating his degree of proficiency, taking into consideration the term of apprenticeship served. A duplicate of such certificate shall be lodged by each apprentice with his employer and the secretary of the Union, each of whom shall keep the same in safe custody, and produce the same for inspection by the Industrial Inspector whenever demanded by the latter to do so. When the final examination has been passed the certificate shall also be signed by the examiners.

31. Whenever it is possible so to do, the examiners, before entering upon the examination, shall draw up a syllabus showing what, in their opinion, is the stage of proficiency which an apprentice should attain at each of the examinations prescribed. The syllabus shall be subject to review by the Court at any time, and shall be kept as a record by the clerk of the Court and a copy handed to the examiners before each examination. The said syllabus may be subject to alteration from time to time by the examiners, who shall forthwith notify the clerk of the Court at court at court at any time, and shall be subject to alteration from time to time by the examiners, who shall forthwith notify the clerk of the Court thereof.

32. In lieu of, or in addition to, examiners above referred to the Court may appoint, wholly or partly, examiners to be appointed by the Director of Technical Education for the whole or any portion of the subjects of instruction, and at such remuneration as the Court may determine.

33. In the event of an apprentice failing to pass any of his examinations the employer may apply to the Court to disallow the increase in wages prescribed by the award, and the Court, on any such application, may make such order as the circumstances of the case may seem to require.

34. Upon the failure of an apprentice to pass two consecutive examinations, it shall be the duty of the examiners to report same to the Court with a recommendation as to the cancellation of the apprenticeship agreement, or such other remedial measures (*i.e.*, increased time for technical instruction) as they may deem advisable. The Court, after notice to all parties concerned, may cancel the agreement or make such other order in the circumstances as it may deem necessary.

35. Upon the completion of the period of training prescribed for apprenticeship, each apprentice shall be required to pass the final examination test to the satisfaction of the examiners, and upon passing this test shall be provided with a certificate to that effect by the Registrar.

Lost Time.

36. The employer shall pay the apprentice for all time lost through sickness or the holidays prescribed by this award: Provided

- (a) payment for such sickness shall not exceed a total of one month in each year;
- (b) where the time lost through sickness exceeds four consecutive working days, the employer may demand from the apprentice the production of a medical certificate, and a further certificate or certificates may be required if any time is lost through sickness within seven days from the date of resumption of duty, the cost if any of such certificate or certificates not exceeding 5s. to be borne by the employer;

(c) an apprentice shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the coarse of his employment, or for any accident or sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

37. The employer shall pay the apprentice, in respect of time lost through compulsory military or naval training, the amount by which the wages prescribed by the industrial award for the trade, calling, craft, occupation, or industry exceeds the amount received by the apprentice from the Department of Defence: Provided, however, that this clause shall not apply to military or naval training imposed through failure to attend compulsory parades.

All time lost by reason of compulsory military or naval training other than the additional training mentioned in the above proviso shall count as part of the apprenticeship.

38. When an apprentice is absent from work for any cause other than sickness or in pursuance of the provisions of these Regulations, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the apprentice an amount proportionate to the time so lost.

39. When an apprentice cannot be usefully employed because of a strike the employer shall be relieved of his obligations under the apprenticeship agreement during the period of the strike.

Part-time Employment.

40. Where in any case an employer is temporarily unable to provide work to employ an apprentice for his full time, application may be made by the employer to the Court for permission to employ the apprentice for such lesser time per week or per month and at such remuneration as the Court may determine, being not less than the proportionate amount of the rate of wages prescribed by the industrial award for the trade, calling, or industry. If the Court grants the application holidays will be reduced *pro rata*.

Miscellaneous.

41. (1) The Registrar shall prepare and keep a roll of apprentices containing—

- (2) a record of all apprentices and probationers placed with employers;
- (b) a record of all employers with whom apprentices are placed;
- (c) a record of the progress of each apprentice, recording the result of the examiners' reports;
- (d) any other particulars the Court may direct.

(2) These records shall be open to inspection by employers and the Union of workers interested upon request.

42. For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the twelve months immediately preceding such temployed. Where the employer is himself a journeyman regularly and usually working at the trade he shall be counted as a journeyman for the purpose of computing the number of apprentices allowed. Where a business is in operation for less than twelve months the method of ascertaining the number shall be as agreed by the parties to the Award, or, if no agreement arrived at, as determined by the Conrt.

43. Every industrial inspector appointed in pursuance of the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, shall have the power to enter any premises, make such inspection of the premises, plant, machinery, or work upon which any apprentice is employed or could be employed, interview any apprentice or employee, examine any books or documents of the business relating to the wages and conditions of apprentices, interrogate the employer in regard to any of the abovementioned matters. 44. With a view to determining whether the number of apprentices being trained is sufficient to meet the future requirements of the industry in the matter of skilled artisans, the Registrar may require any employer to furnish him with any specified information relating to the said industry, or relating to the workers engaged therein.

2. The parent (or guardian) and apprentice hereby for themselves and each of them and their and each of their respective executors, administrators, and assigns covenant with the employer as follow:---

(b) That the apprentice will not do or knowingly suffer any damage to be done to the property of the employer.

3. The employer for himself, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns HEREBY COVENANTS with the apprentice as follows:---

(b) That the technical instruction of the apprentice, when available, shall be at the expense of the employer and shall be in the employer's time, except in places when such instruction is given after the ordinary working hours.

(c) In the event of the apprentice, in the opinion of the examiner or examiners appointed by the Arbitration Court, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense to enable the apprentice to reach the necessary standard.

(d) That the employer will observe and perform all the conditions and stipulations of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, or any Act or Acts amending the same and any Regulations made thereunder, as far as the same concern the apprentice, AND ALSO the conditions and stipulations of any relative Award or Industrial Agreement for the time being in force.

4. IT IS FURTHER AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO:---

(a) That the apprentice shall not be responsible for any faulty work or for any damage or injury done to materials, work, or machinery, tools, or plant other than wilful damage or injury during the course of his work. (b) That the apprentice shall not be required to work overtime without his consent.

(c) This Agreement may, subject to the approval of the Court, be cancelled by mutual consent by the employer and parent (or guardian) giving one month's notice in writing to the Court and to the parties concerned that this Agreement shall be terminated, and on such mutual consent being given the apprenticeship shall be terminated without prejudice to the rights of any of the parties hereto in respect of any antecedent breach of the provisions of this Agreement.

(d) Other conditions.

5. This Agreement is subject to amendment, variation, or cancellation by the Court pursuant to the powers to that effect contained in or implied by the provisions relating to apprentices contained in the Award.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT. No. 28 of 1938. (Registered 20/12/1938.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this twentieth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, between F. R. Mann, Lake Way Hotel, Limited (Lake Way Hotel); R. J. Lee, Commercial Hotel (Wiluna), Limited (Commercial Hotel); B. O'Shaughnessy, Club Hotel; and J. Woods, Weeloona Hotel (Wiluna), all of Wiluna, of the one part (hereinafter called the employers), and The Hotel, Club, Caterers, Tearoom and Restaurant Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Western Australia (hereinafter called 'the Union'), of the other part, witnesseth that, for the consideration hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto covenant and agree the one with the other, as follows:—

1.—Hours.

The ordinary working hours shall not exceed fortyfour (44) per week, and shall not exceed eight hours in any one day. Any worker, except as provided in Clause 17, who works a lesser number of hours per week, shall be paid the full week's wage.

2.-Spread of Shift.

(a) The longest spread of shift in any one day shall not exceed twelve hours: Provided that, where employers

cater for an early breakfast for miners, the spread may be (13) thirteen hours.

(b) Daily spread of shift shall mean the time which elapses from the worker's starting time to the finishing time for the day.

(c) Weekly spread of shift shall mean the aggregate number of hours contained in the daily spreads for the week.

(d) The weekly spread of shift shall not exceed (78) seventy-eight hours.

(e) In addition to two breaks of not more nor less than one hour for meal hours, there shall be not more than one break in any one shift, such break to be not less than two hours.

(f) Night shift shall mean where the worker finishes for the day after 8 p.m. Any work done after 12 o'clock midnight and before 5 o'clock a.m. shall be paid at treble time rates, in the case of females and time and a half in the case of male workers.

(g) Not more than three (3) night shifts shall be worked in any one week, or, as an alternative, day and night shifts alternate weeks.

3.—Wages.

The following shall be the minimum weekly rates of pay for the following classes of work:---

Male workers employed on an aerated water machine shall be paid an additional £1 over the above rates.

In addition to the above all workers, whether male or female, shall receive a district allowance of ten shillings (10s.) per week.

4.-Board and Lodging.

No employer shall be required to provide board and/or lodging for a worker, nor shall a worker be required to accept board and/or lodging from an employer. For all workers where full board and/or lodging is provided and availed of, the employer shall be entitled to deduct and avalied of, the employer shall be entitled to deduct for board the sum of one pound $(\pounds 1)$, and for lodging, the sum of ten shillings (10s.), from the wages herein before prescribed. If full board is not provided and/or availed of by the worker, the employer shall be entitled to deduct a sum proportionate to the amount of the board availed of. Full board shall mean three ordinary meals Workers sleeping in shall be provided with a per day. common sitting room apart from their bedroom, and shall also have access to the bathrooms provided for them. Not more than two workers shall be permitted or required to share a bedroom. If any worker considers the accommodation unsuitable, any party to this Agree-ment may refer the matter to a Board of Reference for decision, as provided in clause 23. Lodging shall mean a properly equipped bedroom, suitably furnished with the usual furniture, also clean linen and towels. Under no circumstances shall workers be required or permitted to launder their own bed linen and towels, except in the case of a worker whose ordinary duties includes that of laundry work.

5.—Meals.

A worker shall be provided with three meals per day, as per menu. One clear hour in every six consecutive working hours shall be allowed each worker for meal times and not less than four hours shall elapse between each meal time.

6.—Overtime.

All work done outside the daily spread of hours pro-All work done outside the early spread of nodes pro-vided in clause 2 hereof, or beyond the eight hours in any one day, or beyond 44 hours (44) in any one week, shall be deemed to be overtime. Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and thereafter at double time rates. No worker shall be employed for a longer period of overtime than six (6) hours in any paid week or more than one and a half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ hours in any one day.

7.---Weekly Holiday.

All workers shall be entitled to and receive one full day off per week. A full day shall mean the twenty four hours period between midnight and midnight.

8.-Public Holidays.

Where workers are employed on Xmas Day, Good Friday, Labour Day and Auzae Day, they shall be paid one extra day's pay in addition to their weekly wage. Provided that any worker whose ordinary day off falls on any of the aforesaid public holidays he or she shall be entitled to an extra day off during that week, or as compensation, an extra day's pay.

9.-Annual Holidays.

On completion of twelve months' service each worker shall be entitled to and shall receive three weeks' holi-day on full pay. The holiday shall be granted within one month of its becoming due: Provided that any worker who shall have served one month or over, and whose contract of service shall have been terminated by either party for any cause before the annual holiday becomes due, shall be entitled to receive a proportionate allowance of holiday pay for the time actually served.

10 .--- Weekly Wage.

Wages shall be paid weekly. Except for casual workers, the contract of service shall be on a weekly basis. One week's notice of termination shall be given on either Workers whose service has been terminated shall side. be allowed to remain on the employer's premises until the next train or transport is due to leave the place.

11.-Record.

The employer shall keep or cause to be kept at his business premises, or at each one of them if more than one, a time and wages book, wherein shall be entered the name and occupation of each worker, the time he or she commences and finishes work each day, the hours worked each day, including overtime, and the wages paid to each worker each week. Such book shall be entered up from day to day, and shall be initialed daily, if cor-rect, by each worker. The book shall be open to inspection by a duly authorised representative of the Union, who shall be permitted to take extracts therefrom, on a portion of the employer's premises, during all working hours.

12.—Roster.

Every employer shall post or cause to be posted and keep posted up in a conspicuous position in the kitchen or pantry of his establishment, so as to be easily accessible and easily read by every worker in his employ, a roster showing :-

- (1) Name and sex of each worker employed;
- (2) The class of work performed by each worker; (3) The time at which each worker is required to commence and finish work on each day in
- each week; (4) The hours in each day during which each worker
- (1) The hours in cach any during miner cach dors, is entitled to be off duty each day;
 (5) The time allowed to each worker for meals on each day;
- (6) The day in each week on which each worker is allowed one full day's holiday.

The particulars contained in such roster shall be in respect of the week, Monday to Sunday inclusive, during which it is posted, and may be altered or varied only on account of the sickness or absence of the worker,

or on account of a contingency that the employer could not reasonably be expected to foresee: Provided that no such alteration or variation shall render lawful the employment of any worker for a greater number of hours in any week or in any day or days than is permitted by this Agreement or to deprive any worker of any holiday to which such worker shall be entitled. The roster shall be open to inspection by a duly authorised representative of the Union during any working hours.

13.-Change and Rest Room.

Adequate change and rest rooms for each sex shall be provided by the employer, where the workers do not reside on the premises. In case of complaint, the matter may be referred by either party to the Board of Reference for decision.

14.—Uniforms.

The wearing of headbands or head decorations is hereby prohibited. Where female workers are required to wear white aprons, stiff white cuffs, and/or collars, or coloured uniforms other than plain black, or male workers to wear uniforms or white coats, they shall be provided by, laundered, and remain the property of the employer. "Required" means, for the purpose of this clause, the accepted practice in the particular establishment.

15,-Women Climbing Ladders.

Female workers shall not be permitted to perform any work requiring the use of ladders. Female workers shall not be permitted to clean out bars or men's lavatories.

16 --- Preference of Employment.

No employer shall employ or continue to employ any worker covered by this Agreement who is not a financial member of the Union.

17.-Casual Workers.

Casual workers shall be employed by the day and shall be paid at the rate of time and a half during the first three consecutive days, and thereafter shall receive the full weekly wage.

18.-Board of Reference.

For the purpose of this Agreement a Board of Reference may be appointed, consisting of three persons, each board shall consist of a chairman and two others, one a representative of the employer and the other a representative of the Union. The chairman shall be a person mutually agreed upon by both parties. There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of :-

- (a) deciding matters specifically referred to in this Agreement as being the subject-matter of a decision of the Board;
- (b) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement, or any of them;
- (c) deciding all matters and questions referred to in the Agreement as being the subject of mutual agreement if not agreed upon; (d) deciding any other matter that the parties may
- mutually refer to the Board for settlement.

19.-No Reduction.

No worker in employment at the commencement of this Agreement who prior to the same has been in receipt of a higher rate of pay than provided by this Agreement shall during the continuance of such employment suffer any reduction in such higher rate of pay by reason of this Agreement.

20 .- Higher Duties.

(a) Workers who perform any work which carries a higher rate of pay than the rate for which he or she is engaged shall be paid the higher rate for the time so engaged. Provided that the minimum time paid for shall be one (1) hour.

(b) Workers whose weekly employment is that of nore than one classification, shall be paid the highest rate for any of the classifications at which he or she is employed.

21 .--- Distant Engagement.

(a) When an employer personally or by his agen: engages a worker to proceed to employment at a place other than the town or locality in which the worker is engaged, the employer shall pay reasonable travelling expenses incurred by such worker in journeying to the employment.

(b) If the worker should be discharged on the grounds of his or her gross incompetency within one week of his or her commencing work, or if the worker shall of his or her own volition and through no fault of the employer leave the employment within thirteen weeks of his or her commencing work, the worker shall refund to the employer any moneys the employer may have paid in pursuance of subclause (a) hereof. To insure the refund being made by the worker should it become due, the employer may withhold from the wages of the worker the amount of money paid by him in pursuance of subclause (a) hereof, until the worker shall have completed thirteen weeks' service in his employment, whereupon he shall pay the same to the worker.

(c) If the worker should be discharged by the employer before the expiration of any specified term of service agreed upon at the time of engagement, or, where no such term has been agreed upon, within thirteen weeks of the worker commencing work, the employer shall pay to the worker an amount sufficient to cover reasonable travelling expenses necessary to enable the worker to return to the town or place of engagement, irrespective of whether or not the worker incurs such expense.

(d) If the employer should engage a worker in pursuance of subclause (a) hereof and the employer for some reason not connected with the competency of the worker shall prevent the worker from commencing work, the employer shall pay the worker reasonable travelling expenses incurred by the worker in journeying to and from the town or locality of engagement, together with one week's full pay, as defined by clause 3 of this Agreement.

(e) Travelling expenses shall mean such second class rail fares, saloon boat fares, coach or motor fares, and cost of meals and accommodation as are reasonably necessary.

22.—Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon, such wages as shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker after twenty-four (24) hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the secretary of the Union, who shall if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and, after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the Magis-trate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and to be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six (6) calendar months from the date thereof and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the Union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

23.—Duration.

This Agreement shall come into force as from the 20th day of December, 1938, and continue in force for a period of three years: Provided that, after the expiration of twelve months, the parties may mutually agree to any alteration or modification of the terms herein prescribed.

24.--Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over all hotels within the area comprised within a radius of five (5) miles from the Post Office, Wiluna.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 30 of 1938.

(Registered 23/12/1938.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this Twenty-third day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, between the Minister for Public Health for the State of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as "the employer"), of the one part, and the Hospital Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. (Coastal Branch) (hereinafter referred to as "the Union"), of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall apply to all hospitals under the control of the Minister for Health other than those hospitals already covered by Awards or Agreements.

2.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three (3) years from the date hereof.

3.-Hours of Duty.

(a) Laundry workers:—Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work and shall be worked on not more than 5½ days and not more than nine hours per day.

(b) All other workers:—Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work and shall be worked on any six days of the week'. Provided that eighty-eight hours may be worked in eleven days each fortnight, at the option of the employer.

(c) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to hospitals where the daily average of occupied beds does not exceed nine (9), in which case there shall be no fixed hours of duty.

4.—Overtime.

(a) All workers:—All time worked in any day in excess of the time for which the worker is rostered shall be regarded as overtime and paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and thereafter double time: Provided that, if the overtime is occasioned through the failure of another worker to report for duty, equivalent time off duty may be granted in lieu of paying for overtime.

(b) Workers required to work on the day on which they are rostered off duty shall, at the option of the worker, be paid at the rate of double time for time worked or be paid at ordinary rates and allowed equivalent time off.

5.---Rosters.

Weekly rosters shall be kept posted in a convenient place, setting out the hours of starting and finishing, and the duties of each worker thereon, together with the day each worker is booked off duty. Such roster shall be drawn up in such a manner as to show the hours of each worker forty-eight hours preceding the date the roster commences, and may only be altered on account of sickness or the absence of a worker, or on account of any contingency that the employer could not reasonably foresec.

6.--Time Book.

(a) A time book, to be open for inspection by the representative of the Union at any reasonable time, shall be provided. Each worker must record in such book the exact time he or she starts and finishes duty on each day and also the time booked off for meals or breaks in shift.

(b) The wages sheets shall, upon reasonable notice being given, be open to inspection by the Union secre-tary at the Head Office during ordinary office hours.

7.-Holidays.

(a) The following days shall be observed as holidays, namely:-Good Friday, Labour Day, and Christmas Day. Any worker required to work on any of the foregoing days shall be paid at the rate of double time, or shall have one day added to their annual holiday for each day so worked, at the option of the employer.

(b) A holiday of three weeks on full pay, without any deductions being made for board and lodging, shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of service. A worker not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holiday in proportion to the length of his or her service. Provided always, that if the worker be dismissed for misconduct or any offence, no payment for annual leave or holidays will be granted for any period subsequent to the date of the offence.

8.-Sick Leave.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this Sixth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, between The Metropolitan and South-Western Federated Engine-The Metropolitan and South-Western rederated Engine-drivers and Firemen's Union of Workers of W.A., Perth (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the one part, and Cuming, Smith and Mount Lyell Farmers' Fertilisers, Limited (hereinafter called "the employer"), of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations here-inafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree, the one with the other as follows:--

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall apply to the premises of Cuming, Smith & Mt. Lyell Farmers' Fertilisers, Limited, wher-ever situated in the State of Western Australia.

2.—Term.

This Agreement shall come into operation from its date and shall continue in force for a period of one (1) year.

- (f) Where two (2) or more firemen are employed on one shift, one fireman shall be leading fireman and shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per shift extra.

4.-No Reduction.

Nothing in this Agreement shall in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker below the rate actually received by him at the date hereof.

5.-Hours of Duty.

(a) Day workers :--- Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked as follows, namely -Eight (8) hours on Monday to Friday, inclusive, and four (4) hours on Saturday.

(b) The ordinary hours of shift workers, inclusive of crib time, shall not exceed :-

- (i) Forty-four (44) hours in any one week, or
- (ii) Eighty-eight (88) hours in two weeks, at the option of the employer, to be worked in rotary shifts not exceeding eight (8) hours each day, exclusive of Sundays.

(c) In all cases, in reckoning the time of duty, any time necessarily occupied in raising steam, in starting up or closing down engines, or in banking fires, shall be included.

6.—Overtime.

(a) Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for work done before the recognised time for starting work and after the recognised time for ceasing work in each factory.

(b) Overtime for work done by shift workers shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for all time worked in excess of eight (8) hours in any one day of twenty-four (24) hours where an eight (88) hour fortnight is worked, except so far as the excess is owing to arrangements between the workers themselves, or is necessary for effecting periodical rotation of shifts, or is owing to the relieving man not coming on duty and relieving at the appointed time, in which latter case the overtime rate shall be paid when the period exceeds one (1) hour.

Where a forty-four (44) hour week is worked by shift workers, the provisions of subclause (a) of this clause shall apply, provided that the exceptions as to arrangements between workers, periodical rotation of shifts, etc., as mentioned above, shall apply equally to the forty-four (44) hour shift workers.

(c) Work done on Sunday shall stand alone and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(d) Work done on Christmas Day and Good Friday shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(e) Work done on New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Easter Monday, Labour Day, King's Birthday, and Boxing Day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

7.-Holidays.

Each worker, other than a casual worker, shall be entitled to two (2) weeks' annual leave each year on full pay, or, should the period of continuous employ-ment be less than one year, the worker shall be paid holiday pay in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment. Annual leave shall be taken at a time suitable to the convenience of the employer.

A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall lose all rights under this clause.

Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his employment for any cause whatsoever.

8.-Casual Workers.

(a) A casual worker shall mean and include an em. ployee competent to do the work he is engaged to do who is, without any fault of his own, dismissed or refused work (as it is hereby agreed he may be) before the expiration of six (6) days from and including the date he starts work.

(b) Casual workers shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rates set out above.

9.-Weekly Engagement.

Except as provided in clause (8) hereof, all employment shall be by the week.

10.--Rotation of Shifts.

Where an employee works afternoon or night shift only, or afteruoon and night shifts in rotation, but does not work day shift one week out of three (3), he shall receive one shilling (1s.) per shift in addition to the rates set out above.

If Christmas Day or New Year's Day falls on a Sun-day, the following Monday shall be kept.

11.-Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it or by any other Association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

In the matter of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, and in the matter of a Special Board appointed by the Court of Arbitration under section 72 of the above Act to determine the rights of workers in specified callings to do certain work in the Kalgoorlie Foundry to the exclusion of workers in other callings.

DETERMINATION OF THE BOARD.

THIS is a dispute between the Amalgamated Engineering Union of Workers, Kalgoorlie Branch, and the Federated Society of Boilermakers and Structural Iron and Steel Workers' Union of Workers, Kalgoorlie Branch, as to the rights of blacksmiths to use a certain punch and shearing machine at the Kalgoorlie Foundry. The dispute arose through a blacksmith utilising this

The dispute arose through a blacksmith utilising this punch and shearing machine to cut some round iron that he required for the purpose of his own work. The Boilermakers' Union claimed that it was the exclusive right of members of that Union to operate the machine for all classes of work. They based their claim on the fact that "operating punch and shearing machines" is specifically mentioned in their constitution.

specifically mentioned in their constitution. The Amalgamated Engineering Union contended that it was not the exclusive right of members of the Boilermakers' Union to operate these machines for all purposes, inasmuch as the constitution of the Engineers' Union provided for ''machinists,'' and it was customary in other slops for members of the Engineering Union to operate similar machines when required for cropping iron used in connection with blacksmiths' work.

Evidence, both oral and documentary, was produced to substantiate this contention.

The Board, having heard the evidence and viewed the particular machine, has come to the conclusion that it is within the rights of blacksmiths to use this particular machine for the fabrication of blacksmiths' work; but this decision does not imply that such work on the machine should be done exclusively by blacksmiths:
