## pROCLAMATTON

Western Australia, ? By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell. TO WIT. Lieutenant-Governor [L.S.]
K.C.M.G. Lieuten Si-Governor in and B.C.M.G., Lieutemant-Governor m and
over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.
Whereas it is emacted by section 15 of the wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act. 1938, that the Govemor: may from time to time, on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee as constituted by the said Act, by Proclamation fix minimum and maximum prices at which substances included in the definition of flour or in the definition of wheat products may be sold in the State, or in any specified part of the State, by :my person: And whereas by Proclamation under the said Act published in the Government Gazette on the 6th day of January, 1939, the Governor, acting in accordance with the said Act, fixed certain prices (to be both minimum and maximum prices) at which cert:ain specified liinds of bread miglit be sold by persons in the Metropolitan Area as defined by such Proclamation: And whereas the Whent Products Prices Committec aforesaid has now recommended to the Governor the fixation of certain minimum and maximum prices in relation to flour, bread, and other substances, and it is now deemed desirable and expedient that the Proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 6 th day of Jamary, 1939, as aforesaid, shall be revoked, and that the minimum and maximum prices now recommended by the Wheat Products Prices Committec for fixation as aforesaid shall be fixed accordingly under and for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieatenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in accordance with the recommendation aforesaid, and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred non me by the sat Act, do hereby cancel and revoke the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned and published in the Government Gazette on the 6th day of January. 1939, and also do by this present Proclamation, but subject as hereinafter provided, fix the prices at which flom, bread, and the other substances hereinafter specified, being wheat products within the meaning of the said Act, may be sold by any person in the various portions of the State specified heremnder, in accordance with the various prices set forth hereunder in relation to flour, bread, and the other substances aforesaid respectively: Provided this Proclamation shall not apply in the case of sales of flour, bread, and the other substances aforesnid under contract to public charitable institutions or to Goverment in-stitutions:-

1. The prices (both minimum and maximum) in reation to best bakers' flour and standard wheatmeal, bran, pollard, fiaky bran and semolina are fixed $n$ fol-lows:-
(A) Best bakers' flour and standard wheatmeal-
(i) when sold for delivery in the aren served by the railway from South Beach, Frematle, to Midland Junction, and by the railway from Perth to Cannington, and delivered on buyers premises in bags or other contaners of approximately 150 lbs weight- f 12 1s. 0d. per ton of $2,000 \mathrm{lbs}$.
(ii) when sold for delivery in the are: served by the railways afores:id and delivered to bnyers elsewhere than on buyers' premises in bigs of approximately 150 lbs. weight£12 1 s . Or. per ton of $2,000 \mathrm{lbs}$;
(iii) when sold for delivery elsewhere than in the area served by the railwoys aforesaid and delivered in bags or other contamers of approximately 150 lbs . weight delivered to buyers at mill doos, or mill siding, or mailway siding or ports north of the Port of Fremantle-the appropriate price as fixed in the Schedule hereunder;
(iv) wheresoever sold or delivered, when contained in-
(a) 2511 . bags- the price fixed under sub-subparagraph (i), (ii), or: (iii) herof as the case may be, plus 81 2s. 6d.:
(b) double 25 lb . begr--the price fixed under subsubparagraph (i): (ii), or (iii) hereof as the case may be, plus £2 10s. Od.;
(c) in 50 lb . bags-the price fixed under subsubparagraph (i), (ii), or (iii) hereof as the case mar be, phas $15 s$;
(d) in double 50 lb . bags-the price fixed uade: sub-subparagraph (i), (ii), or (iii) hercof as the ease may be, plus $£ 110 \mathrm{~s}$. 0d.;
(e) in 3 double 50 lb . bags in comsack-tho price fixed under sub-subparagraph (i), (ii), or (iii) as the case may be, plus \&1 17s. 6d.
(f) in 3 single 50 lb . bergs in consack--the price fixed under sub-subparagraph (i), (ii), or (iii) hereof as the case may be, plus \&1 2s. 6d.;
(g) in double sack-the price fixed under subsubparagraph (i), (ii), or (iii) hereof as the case may be, plus 5s.;
(h) in 100 ll . bags-the price fixed under subsubparagraph (i), (ii), or (iii) hereof as the case may be, plus 7 s . 6d.
(r) The prices fixed in sub-subparagraph (iii) :bove of this subparagraph (A) include delivery to buyers on buyers' premises as well as ex mill or ex mill store, in the case of sales for delivery at Albany, Rockinglam and Spearwood.
(ri) Where the flour is sold F.O.B. ship at Fremantle or Geraldton for delivery at any other constal port, the prices fixed heroby in respect of such flour by the foregoing prorisions of this Proclamation are by this paragraph increased by the sum of Es. 6a. above the said prices for such flom as fixed for flour sold and delivered at Fremantle or Geraldton, as the case may be.
(B) Bran and pollard sold in any part of the State-
(i) when delivered at mill door, at mill siding or ex mill store- 5510 s . 0 d . per ton of 2,000 lbs.;
(ii) when delivered on rails at milway stationsthe appropriate price per ton of 2,000 lbs as fixed by the Schedule hereunder.
(C) Semolina-the prices :is fixed for best bakers' four, plas $£ 1$.
(D) Flaky bram-the priees as fixed for hr:m, plus 10 s .
2. The minimum price in relation to flow, other than best bakers' flom and standard wheatmeal, shall, in accordance with that part of the State in which it is sold for delivery, be the same as the minimum price fixed for best bakers' flow and standard wheatmeal when sold for delivery in the same place.
3. The prices as fixed for flow delivered ex mill or ex mill store or on burer's premises are so fixed on the basis of sales of six long tons ( $2,240 \mathrm{lbs}$.), the prices as fixed for bem or pollard delivered ex mill or ex mill store are so fixed on the basis of sales of six long tons ( $2,240 \mathrm{lbs}$ ) or of four tons of $2,000 \mathrm{lbs}$. each, if the latter be part of a total consignment of six long tons of any mill products and the prices as fixed for flour, bran, or pollard delivered on rats at railway other than on mill siding are so fixed on the basis of sales of six long tons (2,240 ibs.). Therefore, where in any sale a quantity less than that used as the basis for fixing the price as aforesaid is sold and by reason thereof the net profit to the seller will be reduced as a consequence of the corresponding increase in the expense of cartage from mill to siding or in the expense of freight from siding to siding in relation to such less qumbity charged against the seller, the seller may charge against the burer, in addition to the fixed price, a further :mont equivalent to such reduction in net profit.

## Provided that-

(i) for the parpose of calculating the expense incurred by the seller for freight, the freight deemed to be payable by the sellex shall be the freight which would be payable if the goods had been supplied from the mill ne:rest to the buyer's railmay station and not from the mill actually delivering the goods, and
(ii) the term 'the will nearest to the buyer's railway station'" means that mill whose goods could be landed at the ralway station nearest to the buyer's place of delivery most
cheaply after adding to the mill door price the cost of freight from such mill to surh railway station.
4. The prices fixed as aforesaid for flour, bran, pollard, semolina, and faky bran are so fixed upon the basis that such price shall be payable forthwith on sale. Therefore, where in any sale of any of the mill produets aforesaid other than flomr, the quantity sold is not less than the quantity mentioned in paragraph 3 hereof as the basis upon which the price of the goods sold is fixed, or where in any sale of flour, the quantity sold is not less than one ton of $2,000 \mathrm{lbs}$, and the buyer does not pay cash forthrith on sale or within the times respectively fixed in the table hereunder, that is to say, within-
(a) seven days, where the place of delivery is within twenty miles of the mill or store; or
(b) ten days, where the place of delivery is within one lmudred miles of the mill or store; or
(c) fowteen days, where the place of delivery is more than one hundred miles from the mill or store
the seller may charge against the buyer, in addition to the fixed price, a further price of five shillings per ton: Prorided that, where goods sold are shipped for delivery at any port north of Carnarvon, the said additional price of five shillings per ton may only be charged against the buyer as aforesaid when the buyer fails to make payment of the purchase price by the first postal mail following the receipt by him of the goods.
5. The prices fixed for bread are fixed in respect of sales within the Metropolitan Area as hereinafter defined, as follows:-
(A) White bread, standard wheatmeal bread, and brown hread sold as No. 2 loaves within the meaning of the Bread Aet, 1903-1938:-
(i) Retail:

(ii) Wholesale-2s. 6d. per dozen No. 1 loaves; Es. per dozen No. 2 loaves.
(C) Rolls (white, wheatmeal, or brown)-
(i) Retail-9d. per dozen 2 o\% rolls; 1.s. per dozen 4 oz. rolls;
(ii) Wholesale- $61 / 2 \mathrm{~d}$. per dozen 2 oz. rolis; $81 / 2 \mathrm{~d}$. per dozell 4 oz. rolls.
(D) Viemm rolls (horseshoe shape):--
(i) Retail-Is. 3d, per dozen.
(ii) Wholesale-Is. Id. per dozen.
6. In respect of sales of the goods specified in paragraph 5 hereof at Rothest Tsland, the various prices specified in the said paragraph 5 are increased in each and every ease by one half-pemy respectively.
7. Fancy breads are not included in any of the goods specified in paragraph 5 aforesaid.

For the purposes of this paragraph the term "Fancy bread" includes the following breads known as:-

8. For the purposes of this Proclamation-
(a) "Metropolitan Area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of 25 miles from the General Post Office at Perth.
"Brown bread", means bread made wholly from wheatmeal or from white flour mised with wheatmeal, bran or molasses, or a mixture of any or all thereof. This term shall not include standard whentmeal bread.
"Dozen" means twelre, notwithstanding any custom, usage, or minderstanding to the contrary.
"Fancy bread," in addition to the breads mentioned in paragraph 7 hereof, includes raisin bread, currant bread, and any other bread designated as fancy bread by its trade name, the formula for which is registered with the Wheat Products Prices Committee and approved by that Committee as fancy bread:

Provided that all fancy bread when sold shall lave attached to it or associated with it a band, badge, label: or ticket on which is stated, in a manner approved by the said Committee, those ingredients used in its manufacture which cause it to be different from ordinary bread sold as No. I and No. 2 loaves Within the meaning of the Bread Act, 19031938, and in letters not less than 24 points higln, its trade name, and in letters not less than 10 points high, the name and address of the baker thereof.
"Public charitable institution": means a public hospital, a public benevolent iustitution, or a religious organisation, and includes any public organisation which the said Committee is satisfied is established and maintained for the relief of unemployed persons:

Provided that, where any religious organisation conducts a college or boarding selool the exemption given by this Proclamation in respect of sales to public charitable institutions shall not include sales to such religious organisation of any of the substances lerembefore specified in relation to the fixation of prices for use in such college or boarding school.
"Standard wheatmeal" means wheatmeal milled or compounded so as to contain the gristed produce of cleaned and sound wheat mixed with wheaten flour in the proportion of 30 parts of the latter to 70 parts of the former.
"Standard wheatmeal bread"' means bread made from standard wheatmeal without the addition of any other flour.
"Tienna bread" means Viemna bread within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1938.
"White bread"' includes any bread other than standard wheatneal bread, brown bread, fancy bread, or Viemna bread.
"Wholesale," as applied to sales of bread, means the sale by the baker of not less than one hundred and twenty No. 2 loaves (whether ordimary or Vienna) within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1938, per week to the one purchaser, and when for resale, means the sale by the purchaser thereof from the baker of not less than thirty of such loaves per week to the one purchaser.
(b) (i) Rolls may be white, wheatmeal, brown, fancy, or Vienna, but include only rolls (other than fancy or Viemna) when sold as 2 oz . and 4 oz . rolls.
(ii) $\mathrm{I}_{n}$ computing quantities in relation to prices wholesale two No. 1 ordinary loaves shall be equivalent to one No. 2 ordinary loaf and two No. 1 Yiema loaves shall be equiralent to one No. 2 Vienna loaf.
(iii) Tickets or tokens in relation to sale of: bread slall be sold in half dozen lots or in multiples of half dozens.
(ir) Unless otherwise provided by this Proclama. tion, the price of two No. 1 ordinary loaves sold to the one purchaser shall be the same as the price fixed for a No. 2 ordinary loaf and the price of two No. 1 Viemar loaves sold to the one purchaser sliall be the same as the price for a No. 2 Vienna loaf.
(v) In respect of the prices fixed in this Proclamation in relation to bread and rolls under paragraph 5, the tern "cash" or "cash payment", shall inchude payment regularly at weekly or fortnigltity payment periods as well as payment at time of sale or delivery.
