SCHEDULE.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Bread Act Regulations, 1939.
- These regulations are divided into Parts, as follows:-Part II.—Regulations 3-11—Licensing of Bakehouses.
 Part II.—Regulation 12—Construction of Bakehouses.
 Part III.—Regulations 13-24—Polls of Bakers.
 Part IV.—Regulations 25-26—Miscellaneous.

Part I.—Licensing of Bakehouses.

3. (1) The application for a license for a bakehouse which is located within the boundaries of a Health District under the Health Act, 1911-1937, shall be in accordance with Form No. 1 in the Appendix to these regulations.

(2) The inspector's certificate at the foot of the said form of application shall be obtained from and signed by an inspector of the Local Health Authority of the said Health District in which the bakehouse is situated as aforesaid.

4. (1) The application for a license for a bakehouse which is located elsewhere than in a Health District under the Health Act, 1911-1937, or which is located within a Health District for which there is no health inspector shall be in accordance with Form

No. 2 in the Appendix to these regulations.

(2) The certificate at the foot of the said form of application shall be given and signed by the applicant or one of the applicants for the license.

- The license for a bakehouse shall be in accordance with Form No. 3 in the Appendix to these regulations.
- 6. (1) Every notice by the Chief Inspector of refusal of an application for a license for a bakehouse shall be in accordance with Form No. 4 in the Appendix to these regulations.
- (2) At any time after receipt of notice of refusal of his application, the applicant shall be entitled to receive from the Chief Inspector and shall be refunded the amount of the license fee which accompanied his application which has been refused.
- 7. (1) Any applicant aggrieved by the refusal of the Chief Inspector of Factories to grant his application for a license for a bakehouse, and desirous of appealing against such refusal must, within fourteen days after the receipt by him of notice of refusal of his application from the Chief Inspector, serve upon the clerk of the Court in which the Stipendiary Magistrate to whom the appeal is made presides, notice of appeal in accordance with Form No. 5 in the Appendix to these regulations, signed by the applicant, and also within the time aforesaid serve a copy of such notice of appeal upon the Chief Inspector of Factories.

 (2) Upon receipt of a notice of appeal the clerk of the Court shall submit such notice to the Stipendiary Magistrate, who shall then appoint a day, being not less than fourteen and not more than thirty days, and a time and place for the hearing of the appeal.

8. (1) When the appointment for the hearing of an appeal has been made by the Stipendiary Magistrate, the clerk shall send to the appealant and also the Chief Inspector of Factories notice of the hearing of the appeal, in accordance with Form No. 6 in the Appendix to these regulations, not less than seven days before the date

No. 6 in the Appendix to these regulations, not less than seven days before the date appointed for the hearing of the appeal.

(2) On the hearing of the appeal the parties may be represented by solicitor or counsel, and the provisions of the Local Courts Act, 1904-1931, and the Rules of Court made thereunder relating to the hearing of actions in Local Courts shall, so far as may be, apply and be made applicable.

 (5) The order of the Stipendiary Magistrate on the hearing of the appeal shall, if required by either party to the appeal, be made in writing, in accordance with Form No. 7 in the Appendix to these regulations, and shall be signed by the Stipendiary Magistrate.
- 9. Every application for the transfer of a license for a bakehouse shall be in accordance with Form No. 8 in the Appendix to these regulations, and shall be lodged with the Chief Inspector before the proposed transferree takes possession of the licensed bakehouse.
- 10. The memorandum of transfer to be indersed upon a license upon the transfer thereof shall be in accordance with Form No. 9 in the Appendix to these regulations.
- 11. Whenever a license for a bakehouse has been lost or destroyed the Chief Inspector may, upon application by the person entitled to hold such license, and upon proof to his satisfaction of the loss or destruction of such license, issue to the applicant, upon payment of a fee of five shillings, a duplicate or certified copy of the license lost or destroyed in the place thereof, and such duplicate or certified copy shall for all purposes have the same effect and operation as the license which has been lost or destroyed.

Part II.—Construction of Bakehouses.

- 12. No license for a bakehouse shall be granted unless the following conditions are conformed with:

 - s constructed of sound materials;

 - (i) its constructed of sound materials;
 (ii) its situation, construction, and condition are such as to render impossible contamination of any flour, dough, or other materials used in connection with the making or baking of bread;
 (iii) it is provided with a floor of concrete or other smooth impervious material, the surface of which is not less than six inches above the surface of the land adjoining or nearest to such bakehouse, and is so laid. and graded as to render it capable of being easily washed down and cleansed: Provided that this requirement shall not apply to any bakehouse, the floor of which is of wood, and which prior to the commencement of the Bread Act Amendment Act, 1938, was registered as a factory under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937.
 - (iv) the inner surfaces of all walls are constructed of materials capable of being washed down or lime-washed without injury to such walls;
 (v) it is provided with a ceiling of smooth impervious material capable of
 - being easily washed or lime-washed;
 - (vi) it is rain and weatherproof and the roof is of sound impervious material, suitably graded or pitched and fitted with sufficient guttering and downpipes to effectively discharge into a suitable drain all rain water falling thereou;
 - (vii) it is provided with sufficient natural light in the ratio of not less than one square foot of window area to every ten square feet of floor area;

- 15. The Chief Inspector shall fix the day, date, and time for the return of the ballot papers and the closing of the poll, which shall not be more than one calendar month or less than one week from the date on which the ballot papers are forwarded to the voter.
- The Chief Inspector shall cause to be forwarded to each person entitled to vote a notice of intention to take the poll, and the return date thereof, and the time of closing of the poll, together with a ballot paper and a counterfoil, a ballot paper envelope, and a stamped and addressed envelope.
- 17. The ballot paper shall be in accordance with Form No. 10 in the Appendix to these regulations, and each ballot paper shall be initialed on the back thereof by the Chief Inspector, or by some other officer authorised in writing by the Chief Inspector to initial the ballot papers.
- 18. The nomination of a person to vote at a poll of bakers on behalf of any association, society, or corporation as provided for in paragraph 11 of the second provise to subsection (2) of section 14 of the Act may be in accordance with Form No. 11 in the Appendix to these regulations.
 - The method of marking the ballot paper shall be as follows:-
- If the voter desires to vote in the affirmative on the question numbered (1), he shall do so by striking out the word "NO," and if he desires to vote in the negative on such question, he shall strike out the word "YES." When voting on the question numbered (2) the voter shall strike out the name of the day on which he desires that bread shall be baked in such district,

- 20. (1) A ballot paper shall be deemed to be informal if the voter when voting on question numbered (1) fails to strike out one of the words "YES" or "NO" appearing on such ballot paper, or strikes out both of such words, or if the voter when voting on question numbered (2) fails to strike out the name of one day mentioned therein, or if the voter strikes out the names of both days.

 (2) A ballot paper shall also be informal if it does not bear thereon the initials of the Chief Inspector or other authorised officer.
- 21. When the voter has marked the ballot paper as provided for by regulation 19 he shall enclose and seal the same in the ballot paper envelope sent to him for the purpose, and shall sign the counterfoil with his name in full, and shall then place such counterfoil, together with the sealed ballot paper envelope, in the stamped and addressed envelope and forward such envelope to the Chief Inspector.
- 22. The scrutiny and count of votes returned in the poll shall be conducted by the Returning Officer and shall be commenced as soon as practicable after the closing of the poll.
 - 23. For the purposes of such scrutiny and count the Returning Officer shall-

 - (a) open each stamped and addressed envelope and remove therefrom the counterfoil and sealed ballot paper envelope contained therein;
 (b) before opening the scaled ballot paper envelope, check the name of the voter on the counterfoil with the roll of voters entitled to vote at the poll;
 (c) where the name of the voter on the counterfoil does not appear on the said roll of voters, place the said counterfoil and the sealed ballot paper envelope which accompanied the same, unopened on one side, and exclude such ballot paper envelope with any ballot paper contained therein from the count of votes; the count of votes;
 - (d) where the name of the voter on the counterfoil appears on the said roll of voters, open the scaled ballot paper envelope which accompanied the said counterfoil and remove therefrom the ballot paper contained therein;

 (e) examine such ballot paper for any informality, and, if found to be informal, reject the same and exclude it from the count of votes, and

 (f) count the votes contained in all the formal ballot papers not excluded from the count of votes.

 - such count for any reason aforesaid, and ascertain the determination of the majority of voters by such count of the said votes.
- 24. The Returning Officer shall report in writing to the Minister the result of every poll of bakers taken under section 14 of the Act as soon as reasonably may be after the result of such poll has been ascertained.

Part IV.—Miscellaneous.

- 25. Every baker (as defined in relation to employers) using or occupying a bake-house shall, when requested to do so by an inspector, produce to such inspector the license (if any) held by him for such bakehouse.
- 26. Every vehicle required by section 17A of the Act to be marked shall be so marked, in accordance with the provisions of the said section, with characters of not less than four inches in height and of corresponding breadth.
