PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 117 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, that the expression "Public holiday" shall mean certain days therein specified and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a public holiday for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that Monday, the 1st day of May, 1939, shall be a public holiday throughout the State for the purposes of section 117 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, and all shops (except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule and registered small shops) shall be closed.

Public Works Act, 1902-1933.

Coolup District Drainage—Coolup Main Drain and Subsidiaries.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 78/39; Ex. Co. No. 838.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Public Works Act, 1902-1933, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and

consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby authorise the Honourable Minister for Works to undertake, construct, or provide Coolup Main Drain and Subsidiaries for Coolup District Drainage on the land approximately shown coloured red on the Plan P.W.D., W.A. 28895, which may be inspected at the Office of the Minister for Works, Perth.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 301/39.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works; And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor-in-Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Sewerage, Bayswater System, Proposed Pumping Station:—(a) Concrete tanks with brick and tile superstructure, electric pumps, and all apparatus connected therewith; (b) inlet sewer from existing man-hole in r.o.w. south-west of pumping station; (c) rising main from pumping station to existing rising main in r.o.w. south-west of pumping station; (d) excavated sump adjoining pumping station; as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 6285.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 19th day of April, 1939.

Explosives Act, 1895.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Mines 431/1936.

WHEREAS it is by the Explosives Act, 1895, amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, or repeal by-laws and regulations dealing with any of the following matters:—

1. The conveyance, loading and unloading of gunpowder and other explosives within any harbour of Western Australia;
2. The packing and storage of gunpowder and other explosives;
3. General rules for factories, magazines and stores:

And whereas the Governor in Council, exercising the said powers has heretofore made by-laws and regulations dealing with the matters aforesaid, but it is now deemed desirable and expedient to repeal and revoke all the said by-laws and regulations heretofore made and in force as aforesaid and in lieu thereof to make new by-laws dealing with the matters aforesaid: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers in this behalf him enabling, doth hereby repeal and revoke all Orders in Council heretofore made by the Governor in Council under the said Act whereby the Governor in Council made by-laws and regulations dealing with the matters aforesaid, and doth hereby repeal and revoke all such by-laws and regulations heretofore in force and in lieu of such by-laws and regulations now repealed and revoked as aforesaid His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting as aforesaid, doth by this Order in Council make the new by-laws under and for the purposes of the said Act, as set forth in the Schedule hereunder; and doth hereby declare that such new by-laws shall come into operation and have effect as from and after the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *Government Gazette*: And also that this Order in Council and the said new by-laws set forth in the Schedule hereunder shall not in any way affect, prejudice, or interfere with the by-laws relating to the conveyance of gunpowder and other explosives heretofore made by the Minister charged with the administration of the Explosives Act, 1895, under section 30 of the said Act as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of March, 1936, which are still in force and operation or with any by-laws for regulating the conveyance, loading, or unloading of gunpowder and other explosives on the Government Railways heretofore made by the Commissioner of Railways under section 28 of the said Act which are still in force and operation.

The Schedule.

THE EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1895.

By-laws made by the Governor in Council relating to the conveyance, loading, and unloading of gunpowder and other explosives within the Harbours of Western Australia, to the packing and storage of gunpowder and other explosives, and to the general rules for factories, magazines and stores and for other purposes:—

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Explosives Act (Governor in Council) By-laws, 1939.
2. These by-laws are divided in Parts as follows:—
 - Part I.—By-laws 3 and 4—Preliminary.
 - Part II.—By-laws 5 to 17—Conveyance, loading, and unloading of gunpowder and other explosives within harbours.
 - Division 1.—By-law 5—Exemptions.
 - Division 2.—By-laws 6 to 12—By-laws applicable to ports of Albany, Bunbury, and Geraldton.
 - Division 3.—By-laws 13 to 17—By-laws applicable to ports other than the ports of Albany, Bunbury, Geraldton, and Fremantle.
 - Part III.—By-laws 18 to 26—Packing and storage.
 - Division 1.—By-laws 18 to 20—Packing.
 - Division 2.—By-laws 21 to 26—Storage.
 - Part IV.—By-laws 27 to 32—General rules for factories, magazines, and stores.
 - Part V.—By-laws 33 to 43—By-laws relating to certain specified explosives.
 - Part VI.—By-laws 44 to 45—Miscellaneous.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

Application.

3. The by-laws contained in Part II. of these by-laws shall not apply to the conveyance, loading, and unloading of gunpowder and other explosives within Fremantle Harbour as constituted under the Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902.

Interpretation.

4. In these by-laws, unless inconsistent with the subject-matter or context—
 - (a) the word "ship" means and includes every description of navigable vessel, howsoever propelled, and also any lighter, barge, or other vessel not usually provided with independent means of propulsion;
 - (b) whenever an explosive is distinguished as belonging to a particular class or division of a class the reference is made to the classification of explosives contained in any Order in Council classifying explosives made pursuant to section 56 of the Explosives Act, 1895, and for the time being in force.

PART II.—CONVEYANCE, LOADING, AND UNLOADING OF GUNPOWDER AND OTHER EXPLOSIVES WITHIN HARBOURS.

Division 1.—Exemptions.

5. (1) Nothing in the by-laws contained in this Part shall apply to any ship having on board exclusively explosives of the kind or kinds hereinafter mentioned, or to the loading or unloading into or out of any such ship of any explosives of the kind or kinds aforesaid.

(2) The explosives referred to in paragraph (1) of this by-law are the following, that is to say:—

- (a) Those explosives classified in Division 1 of class 6 (Ammunition) and being:—
 - (i) safety cartridges for small arms;
 - (ii) percussion caps;
 - (iii) railway fog signals;
 - (iv) safety fuse for blasting.
- (b) Those explosives classified in Division 2 of class 7 (Fireworks) and being—squibs, crackers, serpents, rockets (other than war rockets), maroons, stars, lances, wheels, and Roman candles.
- (c) Other explosives, in such quantities, under such authorities, and subject to such conditions as may be from time to time approved by the Chief Inspector of Explosives.
- (d) Explosives on ships of war.
- (e) Explosives carried for the ships' own use up to the quantity necessary for signalling purposes as required by law; provided such explosives are kept in a magazine of copper or other suitable material, while the ship is in port, and if two or more of the explosives hereinafter mentioned be in the ship at the same time, such explosives are kept in separate and completely enclosed receptacles in the magazine while the ship is in port as aforesaid, namely:—
 - (i) Gunpowder.
 - (ii) Rockets.
 - (iii) Sound signal rockets.
 - (iv) Blue lights.
 - (v) Holmes lights.
 - (vi) Pyrotechnic signals of any other kind.

Division 2.—By-laws applicable to the Ports of Albany, Bunbury, and Geraldton.

6. The by-laws contained in this Division of this Part shall apply only to the Ports of Albany, Bunbury, and Geraldton and shall be read subject to Division 1 of this Part.

7. Ships carrying any gunpowder or other explosive shall not, except with the special permission of the Inspector of Explosives, berth or tie up to any wharf, jetty, or other landing place or anchor within a quarter of a mile of any other ship or within half a mile of any wharf, jetty, or other landing place.

8. (1) Ships having a fixed mast or masts with gunpowder or other explosives on board shall fly the red burgee at the main or the only mast while loading or unloading such gunpowder or other explosives in port.

(2) Ships, without masts, with gunpowder or other explosives on board shall fly a red flag or vane at least two feet square on a flagpole, to be provided on the ship for such purpose while loading or unloading such gunpowder or other explosives in port.

9. When boats are used to convey gunpowder or other explosives, either to or from any ship, wharf, jetty, or other place, the following provisions shall apply and be observed, namely:—

- (a) The boat and the persons manning the boat shall be subject, so far as the same may be applicable, to all by-laws by whatsoever authority made under the Act and in force regulating the management of magazines and relating to the wearing by persons of inflammable clothing and to the precautions to be observed to prevent accident by fire or explosion.
- (b) The gunpowder or other explosive being conveyed shall not be deposited in any part of the boat where there is any iron or steel, unless such iron or steel is covered either permanently or temporarily with leather, wood, cloth, lead, or other suitable material.
- (c) The gunpowder or other explosive being conveyed shall be effectually protected from accident by fire from without—
 - (a) in the case of a boat having a close deck, by being deposited in the hold and the close deck being kept securely closed; and
 - (b) in the case of a boat not having a close deck, by being completely covered with tarpaulins or other suitable material.
 Provided that, where the gunpowder or other explosive in the hold of a boat having a close deck is not effectually protected as aforesaid by the close deck being kept securely closed, such gunpowder or other explosive shall whilst in the hold be also completely covered with tarpaulins or other suitable material.
- (d) In the stowing of the gunpowder or other explosive in the boat, due precautions shall be taken by means of a partition or otherwise and by careful stowing to prevent such gunpowder or other explosive from being brought into contact with or endangered by any other article or substance in the boat which is liable to cause fire or explosion.
- (e) No person whilst on, in, or attending the boat shall smoke or conduct himself in a dangerous or reckless manner; and
- (f) No intoxicated person shall be permitted or suffered to be on or in the boat or to attend the boat.

10. Except with the special permission of an Inspector of Explosives, no gunpowder or other explosive shall be put on board or discharged or unloaded from any ship or boat, or be placed in or removed from any magazine at any time other than between the hours of sunrise and the next following sunset.

11. Subject as hereinafter provided, no gunpowder or other explosive shall be conveyed in a ship or boat whilst such ship or boat is carrying passengers or plying for passengers, without the written consent of an Inspector of Explosives first had and obtained.

Provided that this by-law shall not apply where the quantity of gunpowder or other explosive conveyed is less than 5 lbs. avoirdupois, such quantity is securely covered and all due precautions are taken to prevent accident by fire or explosion.

12. Nothing contained in this Division shall authorise or be deemed or taken to authorise the loading or unloading or conveyance of—

- (a) any gunpowder or other explosive which is not packed and marked in accordance with the provisions of the Act or these by-laws; or
- (b) any explosive, the importation, manufacture, or sale in Western Australia of which is prohibited.

Division 3.—By-laws applicable to Ports other than the Ports of Albany, Bunbury, Geraldton, and Fremantle.

13. The by-laws contained in this Division of this Part shall apply to all ports of Western Australia other than the Ports of Albany, Bunbury, Geraldton, and Fremantle.

14. No ship having gunpowder or explosives on board shall go alongside a wharf, jetty, or landing place for any purpose, or lie within a distance of a quarter of a mile to seaward of any wharf, jetty, or landing place without the express permission in writing in every case of an inspector of explosives.

15. Ships, when entering a port with gunpowder or other explosives on board, and while in port, shall fly a red burgee at the main until all gunpowder and all other explosives have been discharged.

16. Ships with gunpowder or other explosives on board, when entering a port, shall anchor as prescribed in these by-laws, and the person in charge of the ship shall not remove hatches or move from the anchorage until after he has communicated with the Port Officer.

17. Save and except to the extent by which the same are negatived or modified by by-laws 14, 15, and 16 of this Division, by-laws 9, 10, 11, and 12 of Division 2 of this Part shall be deemed to be included in, to form part of, and to be incorporated with this Division and, save and except as aforesaid, shall apply and have effect in relation to the subject-matter thereof respectively in the ports or harbours to which this Division applies, as if the said by-laws 9, 10, 11, and 12 were expressly repeated in this Division.

PART III.—PACKING AND STORAGE.

Division 1.—Packing.

18. All explosives, other than gunpowder, imported into, or manufactured in or stored in, the State of Western Australia, shall be packed in accordance with the general rules in this by-law hereinafter prescribed, and in determining to what class or division of a class any explosives may belong, the classification of explosives for the time being and from time to time made and in force under section 56 of the Act shall be strictly observed, that is to say:—

- (a) With respect to explosives of the second class (Nitrate mixture) and the third class (Nitro-compound)—
 - (i) the explosive, if not exceeding 5 lbs. in quantity, shall be contained in a substantial case, bag, canister or other receptacle made and so closed as to prevent any of the explosive from escaping;
 - (ii) the explosive, if exceeding 5 lbs. in quantity, shall be contained in a double package. The inner package shall be a substantial case, bag, canister, or other receptacle made and so closed as to prevent any of the explosive from escaping; and the outer package shall be a box, barrel, or case of wood, or metal or other solid material and shall be of such strength, construction, and character that it will not be broken or accidentally opened or become defective or insecure while being conveyed or stored, and will not allow any of the explosive to escape. The quantity of the explosive in any one outer package shall not exceed 50 lbs., except with the consent of and upon conditions imposed by an inspector of explosives.
- (b) With respect to explosives of the fourth class (Chlorate mixture)—
 - (i) the explosive, if not exceeding 5 lbs. in quantity, shall be contained in a substantial bag, canister, or other receptacle made and so closed as to prevent any explosive from escaping;
 - (ii) the explosive, if exceeding 5 lbs. in quantity, shall be contained in a double package. The inner package shall be a substantial case, bag, or covering without any metal in the construction thereof, and so made as to prevent any explosive from escaping, and any one of such packages shall not contain more than 10 lbs. of explosive, and the outer package shall be a box, barrel, or case of wood or other solid material (other than metal) and shall be of such strength, construction, and character that it will not be broken or accidentally opened or become defective or insecure whilst being conveyed, and will not allow any explosive to escape; and the quantity of explosive in any one outer package shall not exceed 50 lbs., except with the consent of, and upon conditions imposed by, an inspector of explosives. In addition, both the inner and outer packages aforesaid shall be completely waterproof.
- (c) With respect to explosives of the fifth class (Fulminate)—
 - (i) an explosive of the said class which is of such a character that it cannot be packed mixed with water, or that danger would arise from such mode of packing, shall be packed in such manner as shall be specially directed by the Chief Inspector of Explosives;
 - (ii) any other explosive of the said class to which the next preceding subparagraph (i) does not apply, shall be packed as follows:—It shall be packed in bags or coverings of calico, canvas, or other material permeable to water and containing each not more than 25 lbs. of explosive, and so made and closed as to prevent any explosive from escaping. Such bags or covering shall be packed in a case containing sufficient water to ensure the explosive being kept constantly wet, and such case (hereafter called the inner case) shall be packed in an outer

- case, containing water sufficient constantly to surround the inner case, and the inner case and the outer case shall both be of such strength, construction, and character that neither of them will be broken or accidentally opened or become defective or insecure whilst being conveyed or will allow any explosive or water to escape. The quantity of explosive in any one outer case shall not exceed 200 lbs., except with the consent of, and upon conditions imposed by an inspector of explosives.
- (d) With respect to explosives of the First Division of the sixth class (Ammunition), the explosive shall be contained in a box, barrel, or case of wood, metal, or other solid material, and of such strength, construction, and character that it will not be broken or accidentally opened or become defective or insecure whilst being conveyed and will not allow any explosive to escape.
- (e) with respect to explosives of the Second Division of the sixth class (Ammunition)—
- (i) a shell or torpedo containing any explosive material, whether such shell or torpedo be separate or form part of a rocket or other appliance, shall be packed in such manner as may be specially directed, with reference to such explosive by the Chief Inspector of Explosives;
 - (ii) an explosive material, when made up into a cartridge or charge for cannon, shells, mines, blasting, or other like purposes shall be packed in the manner required for the same explosive material when not so made up: Provided that, where a double package is required the enclosing case of each cartridge or charge, if it satisfies the conditions required for the inner package, may be treated as being the inner package;
 - (iii) any other explosive, to which the next preceding subparagraphs (i) and (ii) do not apply, shall be packed in a box, barrel, or case of wood, metal, or other solid material, and of such strength, construction, and character that it will not be broken or accidentally opened or become defective or insecure whilst being conveyed, and will not allow any explosive to escape. Any one such package shall not contain more than 100 lbs. of explosive, except with the consent of, and upon conditions imposed by, an inspector of explosives.
- (f) With respect to explosives of the Third Division of the sixth class (Ammunition), the explosive shall be packed in a double package. The inner package shall be a substantial bag, case, canister, or other receptacle made and so closed as to prevent any explosive from escaping, and shall not contain more than 25 lbs. of such explosive. The outer package shall be a box, barrel, or case of wood, metal, or other solid material, and shall be of such strength, construction, and character that it will not be broken or accidentally opened or become defective or insecure whilst being conveyed, and will not allow any explosive to escape. Any one such outer package shall not contain more than 50 lbs. of explosive, except with the consent and upon conditions imposed by an inspector of explosives.
- (g) With respect to detonators, the general rules prescribed in the next preceding paragraph (f) hereof shall apply, and in addition thereto further general rules shall be observed as follows:—
- (i) Where the number of detonators in any one consignment does not exceed one thousand—
 - (a) the detonators shall be packed in packages of not more than 100; and
 - (b) the detonators in each such package and the spaces between such detonators, and the spaces between such detonators and the sides of the said package shall be filled with fine sawdust or other similar material which will leave the detonator tube freely and not leave any particles on the said tube being shaken or lightly tapped; and
 - (c) a layer of felt or other soft-yielding material shall be placed between both ends of all the detonators in each such package and the interior of the package in which the same are contained, in such a manner and so secured that both ends of the detonators will rest upon the said felt or other material aforesaid; and
 - (d) every such package, if made of metal, shall be lined throughout with paper or other soft material; and
 - (e) the spaces between such packages aforesaid and between such packages and the sides of the outer package in which such first-mentioned packages are placed shall be filled with fine sawdust or other similar material, in such a manner as to prevent any collision between the said inner packages or between the said inner packages and the outer package whilst the same is being conveyed.
 - (ii) Where the number of detonators in any one consignment exceeds one thousand—
 - (a) the detonators shall be packed in inner packages in accordance with the general rules prescribed in subparagraphs (a), (b), (c), and (d) of the next preceding subparagraph (i); and
 - (b) such inner packages shall be placed inside a substantial case of wood or metal made and so closed as to prevent any of the said inner packages escaping therefrom;
 - (c) and such case shall be placed inside an outer package in such manner and so secured as to leave a space of not less than three inches between the case and every part of the interior of the said outer package; and
 - (d) such space shall be filled with sawdust, straw, or other similar material, or may contain a light framework or battens of wood to keep the case aforesaid in position in the said outer package.
 - (iii) Where the number of detonators in any one consignment exceeds five thousand—
 - (a) the general rules prescribed by the next preceding subparagraph (ii) hereof shall apply; and
 - (b) the outer package in which the detonators are contained shall be provided with handles or some other contrivance by means of which such outer package can be safely and conveniently carried.

(h) With respect to explosive of the seventh class (Firework)--

- (i) an explosive of the First Division of the said class shall be contained in a double package. The inner package shall be a substantial canister, case, or other receptacle, hermetically closed and containing no more than 1 lb. of explosive; the outer case shall be a box or case of wood, metal, or other solid material and shall be of such strength, construction, and character that it will not be broken or accidentally opened or become defective or insecure whilst being conveyed and will not allow any explosive to escape; and any one outer package shall not contain more than 20 lbs. of explosive, except with the consent and upon conditions imposed by an inspector of explosives. There shall not be any iron or steel in the construction of any such inner or outer package, unless the same is effectually covered with tin, zinc, or other suitable material;
- (ii) an explosive of the Second Division of the said class exceeding 5 lbs. in weight shall be contained in a box, barrel, or case of wood, metal, or other solid material, and of such strength, construction, and character that it will not be broken or accidentally opened or become defective or insecure whilst being conveyed, and will not allow any explosive to escape; and the amount of explosive in any one package shall not exceed 100 lbs. except with the consent of and upon conditions imposed by an inspector of explosives.

Provided that, in addition to their being contained in a box, barrel, or case of wood, metal, or other solid material, magic pin-crackers shall be packed in numbers not exceeding twelve in stout paper, and each such package shall be placed singly in a box of wood or cardboard properly secured against escape of explosive.

19. Any explosive which for the time being is not authorised by license to be manufactured for general sale shall be packed in such manner as may be especially directed by an inspector of explosives.

20. Whatever be the quantity of the explosive or the Class or Division to which it belongs--

- (a) the interior of every package, whether single or double, shall be kept free from grit and otherwise clean;
- (b) no package, whether single or double, when actually used for packing fireworks shall be used for any other purpose;
- (c) on the outermost package there shall be affixed in conspicuous characters by means of a brand or securely attached label or other marks the word "Explosive," and the name of the explosive, followed by the name and number of the class and division to which it belongs; and in the case of the second (nitrate mixture), third (nitro-compound), fourth (chlorate mixture), and Second Division of the sixth (ammunition) classes there shall also be exhibited a mark indicating the date of manufacture of the explosive.

Division 2.—Storage.

21. The by-laws contained in this Division apply only to the storage of explosives at the Woodman's Point Magazine Reserve and the landing shed on the magazine jetty.

22. The following storage charges shall be payable in respect of explosives stored in the Government magazines, that is to say, for each and every barrel or case containing gunpowder, or other explosive--

- (a) for the first week or fraction thereof 4d.
 (b) for every subsequent week or fraction thereof 2d.

23. All handling of explosives into or out of the Government magazines shall be performed by the owners of the explosives under the direction of the magazine keeper.

24. The landing shed shall be available for use by importers of explosives when transferring explosives from lighters to the magazines or trucks, but such explosives shall not be left in the shed for a longer period than is required for the purposes of such handling.

25. Should explosives be left in the landing shed for any period exceeding three working days, an additional charge for storage equal to twice the ordinary storage charge under these by-laws shall be payable by and recoverable from the owner of such explosives.

26. Neither the Crown nor any person having charge of the Government magazines shall have any responsibility or be under any liability whatsoever in relation to any explosives while the same are stored or placed in the landing shed.

PART IV.—GENERAL RULES FOR FACTORIES, MAGAZINES, AND STORES.

27. Subject to this Part the general rules for factories, magazines, and stores for gunpowder contained in Part I. of the Explosives Act, 1895, shall apply in like manner to factories, magazines, and stores for explosives of every kind.

28. Where any of the by-laws contained in this Part are in any respect inconsistent with the general rules for factories, magazines, and stores for gunpowder contained in Part I. of the Explosives Act, 1895, as aforesaid, the by-laws contained in this Part shall prevail, and the general rules aforesaid shall be deemed to be and shall be read and construed as being amended accordingly.

29. In respect to the different kinds of explosives which may be stored together the following division shall be observed and only those explosives classed under a particular division shall be stored together, that is to say:—

- Division A.—The various explosives of Class 1 (Gunpowder), Class 2 (Nitrate mixture), Class 3 (Nitro-compound), Safety fuse belonging to Division 1 of Class 6 (Ammunition), and the various explosives belonging to Division 2 of Class 6 (Ammunition) as do not contain any exposed iron or steel.
- Division B.—The various explosives belonging to Division 1 of Class 6 (Ammunition).
- Division C.—Such of the explosives belonging to Division 2 of Class 6 (Ammunition) as contain any exposed iron or steel.
- Division D.—The various explosives belonging to Division 3 of Class 6 (Ammunition).
- Division E.—The various explosives belonging to Class 7 (Fireworks).

30. In the case of stores licensed for keeping and selling gunpowder and also other explosives, then in relation to the storage of explosives other than gunpowder, the provisions of subparagraphs (a) and (b) of paragraph (2) of section 18 of the Explosives Act, 1895, shall apply, with the following modifications, that is to say:—

- (i) Where such other explosives are stored in compliance with the provisions of subparagraph (a) of paragraph (2) of section 18 aforesaid and consist of fireworks, the maximum quantity which may be so stored shall be such quantity as may be approved by an inspector of explosives.
- (ii) Where such other explosives are stored in compliance with the provisions of subparagraph (a) of paragraph (2) of section 18 aforesaid and consist of explosives other than gunpowder and fireworks, the maximum quantity of such other explosives which may be so stored shall be one-half of the quantity of gunpowder which may be so stored.
- (iii) Where such other explosives are stored in compliance with the provisions of subparagraph (b) of paragraph (2) of section 18 aforesaid and consist of fireworks, the maximum quantity which may be so stored shall be such quantity as may be approved by an inspector of explosives.
- (iv) Where such other explosives are stored in compliance with the provisions of subparagraph (b) of paragraph (2) of section 18 aforesaid and consist of explosives other than gunpowder and fireworks, the maximum quantity of such other explosives which may be so stored shall be one-quarter of the quantity of gunpowder which may be so stored.
- (v) Nothing in this by-law shall be deemed to authorise the storing in the same place at the same time of gunpowder and any other explosive.
- (vi) Where, in accordance with by-law 29, gunpowder and any other explosive may be stored together, the quantity of such other explosive which may be stored, together with the gunpowder, shall not exceed one-half of the quantity of the gunpowder stored with such other explosive.

31. Where a store license is required under the Explosives Act, 1895, to enable the preparation and adaptation of explosives in class 4 (Chlorate mixtures) for immediate use in quarries and for land clearing, a fee of ten shillings shall be charged for such license, and shall be payable on the issue thereof.

32. When any room is used in connection with any store for the purpose of filling cartridges, such room shall be distant from the store not less than ten feet at the point nearest to the store.

PART V.—BY-LAWS RELATING TO CERTAIN SPECIFIED EXPLOSIVES.

33. The by-laws contained in this Part shall apply only to those explosives known as "Lithyte," "Raekarock," "Rendrock," and "Shatterite" (in this Part hereinafter referred to as "the said explosives").

34. Insofar as the manufacture of any of the said explosives is not prohibited under the said Act, the manufacture of the said explosives shall be authorised and permitted only upon the conditions and subject to the restrictions in this Part hereinafter specified.

35. The Minister may issue to such persons as he may think fit licenses authorising the manufacture by such persons of any of the said explosives, and no person shall manufacture any of the said explosives unless he is the holder of a license issued to him by the Minister for that purpose and still current.

36. No person, other than the person to whom the license is issued or some person in his employ duly authorised in writing by him, shall carry on the manufacture of the said explosives.

37. The manufacture of the said explosives shall not be carried on underground in any mine.

38. The names of the ingredients to be used in the manufacture of the said explosives respectively shall be mentioned in each license issued for the manufacture of the said explosives.

39. The quantity of any of the said explosives to be manufactured at any one time shall not exceed such a quantity as would be required for the purposes of a mine for six working days, and, in the event of any quantity of any of the said explosives being stored or kept for a period of more than seven days from the manufacture thereof, the license then held for the manufacture thereof shall be liable to immediate forfeiture by the Minister.

40. If an inspector of explosives find any store for any of the said explosives, or for the ingredients which when combined constitute any of the said explosives or any part of any of the said explosives, or find any practice in such store or connected therewith to be unnecessarily dangerous or defective so as in his opinion to tend to endanger the safety of any person, and no express condition or restriction relating to the possible cause of danger is contained in the license authorising the manufacture of any of the said explosives, the inspector of explosives may require the person to whom the said license has been issued to do such acts and take such measures immediately as are necessary or expedient to remedy or remove any such cause of danger or to correct any such defect. If such person thereafter fail or neglect in any respect to comply with or observe the requisition aforesaid of the inspector he shall be guilty of a breach of these by-laws.

41. The Minister may, either with or without notice, at any time stop the manufacture of any of the said explosives by any licensed person, if and when he deems such stoppage to be necessary in the interest of public safety, or may, in the said interest, direct such licensed person or his agent to alter or amend his process of manufacture in such manner as the Minister or any person duly authorised by the Minister in that behalf may think fit.

42. The Minister may by notice in writing declare any license issued by him under this Part to be void, if and when he is satisfied that the manufacture of any of the said explosives authorised by such license is not being carried on in accordance with the conditions of the license or with directions given under the authority of these by-laws, and that the continuance of such manufacture will imperil the public safety.

43. The conveyance of any of the said explosives in any vehicle or boat in or upon any public thoroughfare, river, harbour, or public place, save and except as elsewhere in these by-laws or by any other by-laws lawfully made under the Explosives Act, 1895, permitted or authorised, is hereby prohibited.

PART VI.—MISCELLANEOUS.

44. Any person who by any act or omission shall commit or attempt to commit any breach of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws, and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 and, where such offence is of a continuing nature, to an additional daily penalty not exceeding £10 for each day or part of a day during which such offence continues. In addition to any such penalty aforesaid the offender shall be liable to the forfeiture to the Crown of all or any part of the explosive in respect of which the offence against these by-laws has been committed, as may be ordered by the Court which has convicted the offender of the said offence.

45. These by-laws shall be read and construed and shall have effect as being separate and distinct from the by-laws relating to the conveyance of gunpowder and other explosives as made by the Minister under section 30 of the Explosives Act, 1895, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of March, 1936, and now in force and operation, and from any amendments of such by-laws for the time being and from time to time in force, and also as being separate and distinct from all by-laws as made by the Commissioner of Railways under section 28 of the said Act relating to the conveyance, loading, and unloading of gunpowder and other explosives on the Government Railways and now or hereafter in force, and from any amendments of such by-laws at any time and from time to time in force, and these by-laws shall not in any way affect or interfere with the operation of any of the other by-laws aforesaid.

Pursuant to section 61 of the Bunbury Harbour Board Act, 1909, the Bunbury Harbour Board hereby amends the regulations of the Board made under the said Act, as follows:—

1. Bulk Wheat:—The first paragraph of Regulation 104a is amended by the deletion of "1s. 3d. per ton" in the third line and the substitution of "1s. 6d. per ton" in lieu thereof.

2. A new regulation is inserted, as follows:—

Regulation No. 151a.

Special indemnity of Board against Liability.

(1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained elsewhere in these regulations, neither the Board nor any member of the Board shall be responsible or liable in any manner or in any respect or in any capacity for any damage, injury, or loss occurring in relation to any goods of any kind or description whatsoever whilst such goods are in the custody or under the con-

trol or power of the Board or its servants or agents, or upon the Board's premises, save and except where such damage, loss, or injury is directly caused by the wilful and deliberate negligence of a servant or agent of the Board, the proof whereof shall lie upon the person making a claim against the Board in respect of such damage, loss, or injury. Provided that nothing in this regulation shall operate so as to prevent the Board from entering into a special agreement in writing with any person whereby, upon payment of a special consideration to be paid by such person to the Board, the Board will assume responsibility or liability in respect of damage, injury, or loss of goods specified in such agreement, in accordance with the provision thereof, in the circumstances and to the extent stated therein.

(2) The exemption or indemnity provided for in paragraph (1) of this regulation shall, subject to any special agreement entered into by the Board thereunder as aforesaid, be read and construed and have effect as being supplementary and additional to all other exemptions and indemnities from liability provided elsewhere in these regulations for the benefit of the Board and the members thereof.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-35, this 30th day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, between the Swan Brewery Company, Limited; the Emu Brewery Company, Limited, and the Redcastle Brewery, Limited, all of Perth and Fremantle districts (hereinafter in these presents called the "employers"), of the one part, and the Metropolitan and South-Western Federated Engine-drivers' & Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia, being an industrial union of workers registered under the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-35: Whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that the several stipulations, conditions, and provisions set out herein shall in all cases be binding upon and shall be faithfully and promptly carried out, observed, performed, and complied with, according to the true intent and meaning thereof, by the parties hereto.

1.—Definitions.

For the purpose of this Agreement "the above-mentioned companies" shall mean the "employers" and the "Union" shall mean The Metropolitan and South-Western Federated Engine-drivers' & Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia.

(a) "Engine-driver" shall mean and include any person who operates or drives any engine or engines the motive power of which is either steam, gas, air, oil, water, compressed air, or electricity.

(b) "Fireman" shall mean any person employed in a stokehole, attending a steam boiler or suction gas generator over 6 H.P.

(c) "Greaser" shall mean an employee who is employed mainly in oiling engines or shafting, and who assists the engine-driver as required.

2.—Schedule.

The parties to this Agreement mutually agree that the minimum rate of wages that shall be paid by the employers respectively to the persons employed by such employers in the capacities under-mentioned is as follows:—

(b) Engine-drivers, firemen, or greasers who shall be employed on boiler cleaning work, cleaning inside of pasteuriser, or bottle soaker, shall receive an additional 1s. per hour in addition to his ordinary or overtime rate of pay.

(c) "Shift workers," when employed on afternoon or night shift, shall be paid 1s. per shift in addition to their ordinary rates for such shifts.

3.—Hours.

Forty-four hours, consisting of eight hours per day, from Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, and four hours on Saturday, shall constitute a week's work for engine-drivers, firemen, and greasers, who shall commence work not before 5 a.m. on any day, and the employer may require any engine-driver, fireman, or greaser to start work at any time after that time, but such work shall not be less than eight hours per day, from Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, and four hours on Saturdays, so that each engine-driver, fireman, and greaser shall work forty-four hours from Monday to Saturday in every week. Where one shift only is worked, such shift shall begin not later than eight a.m.

(c) In all cases, in reckoning the time of duty, any time necessarily occupied in raising steam, in starting up or closing down engines, or in banking fires shall be included.

4.—Overtime.

If any employee works earlier than his starting time or later than his quitting time, he shall be paid overtime at the rate of time and a half. Each day to stand alone.

5.—Record Book.

Each company shall keep a record of the name of each employee, the time he starts and finishes each day, total number of hours worked, overtime worked, wages paid to each employee, and such record book shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of or any other person appointed by the employees' Union, during working hours.

Each employee shall sign the record book kept for all moneys received by him.

6.—Sundays.

All work performed on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

7.—Holidays.

All holiday shifts to rotate; if no work be done, the ordinary rates shall be paid for holidays. If work is performed on a holiday, ordinary rates shall be paid in addition.

The days to be observed as holidays, according to the provisions of this Agreement, are:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, New Year's Day, Eight hours' Day, Show Day, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Sovereign's Birthday, Annual Picnic Day, Anniversary Day (in January), Anzac Day, and Foundation Day (in June).

8.—Annual Leave.

Two weeks' annual leave on full pay shall become due to workers with twelve months' service, such leave to be taken at times to be mutually agreed on between the employees and employer, between the 30th April and the 30th September in each year, in addition to the holidays enumerated above. Temporary hands with less than twelve months' service on retirement shall receive proportion of two weeks' holiday equivalent to eight hours pay per month of service.

Relieving engine-drivers and firemen shall be paid for annual holidays *pro rata* to the length of time they have been employed on the higher rates.

9.

The engagement between the employer and employees, except casual hands, shall be weekly, a week's notice from either party to terminate same, except in case of the employee absenting himself without leave, not obeying lawful commands, or being guilty of misconduct, or of the works of the employer being stopped through fire or tempest, when such agreement may be terminated immediately.

10.

Any employee being unable through sickness or accident to attend to his duties shall notify the employer not later than 10 a.m. on the day he first absents himself from duty, and he shall also satisfy the employer that he is unable to attend to his duties, and, if called upon, shall provide a medical certificate that he is unfit to perform his work through sickness.

11.

All employees on day shift engaged in or about a brewery or bottling works shall, if required to work more than one (1) hour's overtime after 5 p.m., knock off between 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. for refreshments.

12.—Area.

This Agreement shall apply to all workers engaged in the Brewing Industry as engine-drivers, firemen, and greasers in the South-West Land Division in the State of Western Australia.

13.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall operate from the 20th day of November, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, and shall remain in force for three (3) years from that day: Provided that either party shall have a right to apply for amendment after the expiration of twelve months, and provided that the rates of pay will be subject to amendment in accordance with the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-35.
