FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACI', 1930-1934. NOTICE is hereby givon that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with section 7 , subsection (1), of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930 . 1934, which reads as follows:-

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

## Non. $f$ of 1939

## (Registered 6-4.39.)

THIS Agreement, made $i_{n}$ pursunnce of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this 17th day of Marel, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, between the Kalgoorlie Brewing and Ice Company, Limited, whose registered office is situate at Brookman street, Kalgoorlie (heremafter ealled the employer), of the one part, and the Eastern Goldfields Breweries Employees; Industrial Union of Workers, under the provisions of the Industri:al Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, and having its registered office at the Trades Hall, Kalgoorlie (hereinafter called the Union), of the other part, whereby it is agreed as follows:-

## Interpretation.

(a) "Casual hands', shall mean :my person who is employed for not more than forty-four hours ordinary working hours $7.30 \mathrm{a}, \mathrm{m}$. to $4.20 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. The number of casual hands shall not exceed one in every ten permanently employed or portion of the first ten men employed by each company.
(b) "Cellarmen'- The term eellarmen whenever used in this Agreement shall me:n one who "racks," "tops," "fines," or deals with beer in :my way in the cellar, and/or tends "filter"' and/or "refrigerator."
(c) "Motor drivers"-Motor driver shall not include one who drives : motor velicle for the removal of refuse, slops, or liquid waste.

## 1.-Schedule.

The parties in this Agreement mutually agree that the minimum rate of wages payable for the following classes of work slanll be:-


The above rates are based on a basic wage of $\mathfrak{x 4} 15 \mathrm{~s}$. 2d. per week for males. It is hereby agreed between the partics for the period of this Agreement that, in the event of the basic wage being incrensed or reduced in atcordance with section 124 of the Arbitration Act, such reduction or increase shall not affect the rate of wages as set ont in "1". "Schedule" of this Agreement; providing always, should the increase in the basic wage exceed the minimm wige set out herein, such increase, being one shilling or shillings, such increase shall be paid.

Adalt libomer.-Adult labomers employed in or about the Bottling Works or Brewery not covered by any other industrial Agreement or industrial Award must not receive less th:m the mimimm wage of 5515 s . $6 d$, per week.
Cylinder cleaners,--Cylinder cleaning, which shall inclade scraping and/or cleaning :and/or painting cylinders, shall be paid for at the ate of 4 s . Od. per hom.

Boiler cleaners.-Any employee, if called upon, shall be paid 4s. 0d. per hour for scraping and/or cleaning and/or painting boilers.

Boots.--The employer slall, for use during working hours only, supply suitable boots to those employed at the bottle-washing at the tanks, at the tubs, at the filters, at the cask-washing shed, at the bottlers, and to any employees working in or about water, such boots to be supplied free of cost.

Oilers and aprons.-Employers shall, for use in their work only, supply oilskin conts, eash and docket satchels, and leather aprons to motor lory drivers free of cost.
2.-Boys.

Per Week.

(b) The number of boys employed shall not exceed one in every ten men permanently employed or portion of the first ten men employed by each comp:my.

## 3.-Hours.

Forty-four hours sh:1ll constitute a week's work for all employees. Employees shall begin at 7.30 a.m. and conclade work at 4.20 p.m., from Monday to Friday, inclusive, with an allow:ance of one hour for meals, and slall commence work at 7.30 am , and conchade at 12.20 p.m. on Saturday.

Shift cellamen-Worty-four hours shall constitute a week's work for shift cellarmen, and the hours to be worked slall be:-
(a) Day shift: -8 a.m. to 4.20 p.m., with one hour off between 12 noon and 1 p.m. for lunch.
(b) Afternoon shift:-4.20 p.m. to 11.40 p.m. on week days and 3 p.m. to 11 p.m. on Sundays, inclusive of thity minutes each shift for erib.
(c) Night shift:--11.40 p.m. to 7 am . on week days and 11 p.m. on Sundays to 7 a.m. on Monday morming, inclusive of thirty minutes each shift for crib time.
The luncheon hour on Saturday to be between 11.20 a.m. and 12.20 p.m.

Provided always, that the quiek shift man shall not work on Sund:ys, and that the night shift man shall have at least one week on day shift in crery four weeks.
4.-Orertime.

If any employee works earlier than his starting time or later than his ordinary quitting time, he shall be paid overtime at the rate of time and a half, each day to st:ud alone.

## 5.-Casual Hands

All casual hands to be paid at the existing rates specified in this Agreement, according to the duties performed by them.

## 6.-Record Book.

Each company shall keep a record of the time of each employec, of the time he starts and finishes each day, and the total amonnt of hours worked, and of the wages paid to each employee. Such record shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of or any person :lppointed by the employees' Union during working hours. Each employee shall sign the record kept for all moneys received by him.

## 7.-Smidays.

All work performed on Sundays by employees in any department (shiftmen excepted) shall receive parment for the sime at the rate of donble time rate.

## 8.-Holidays.

All work performed by employees in any department on holidays shall be paid for at double time rates, and, as far as reasonably permitted, employees shall be employed on the holiday shift in their turn as holidays oceur.
Tt is agreed between the employer and the Union that in the event of any driver being called upon to work on holidays, such driver is to be paid at double time rate per hour worked (a part of an hom to be paid for as a full howr) up to 10 :am., and if such driver works after 10 ams, he shall be paid for the full shift at double time rate. Any driver ealled mpon to work on holidays after 10 a.m. shatl be paid for the full shift at double time rate.
Any employee (excepting drivers) working any part of a shift on a holiday shall be paid for the full shift at donble time lates; all holiday shifts to rotate, If no work be done, the ordinary rate shall be paid for holidays. The days to he observed is holidays, according to the provisions of this Agreement, are:-Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Good Priday, Easter Monday, Union Picmic Day, Labou: D:y, Kalgoorlie Cup Day, Boulder Cup Day, New Years Day, and Anzac Day. In ease any of the above holidays fall on a Simday, :mother day in lieu thereof shall be given, but such day shall be added to the :mnual holidays. Provided always, that when Boxing Diy falls on :l Saturday all men dequired shail work on thist day, and mother day shall be given in lica thereof.

## 9.

Any employee, excepting those as herein provided, at the request of the employer starting work at a time during the day later thm $7.30 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$, shall continue his employment without a break, other than for meals, unti] he has completed on the first five days of each week-a
service of seven homrs twenty minutes per day and a term of five hours fifty minutes on the sixth day. During each shift so worked such employees, except those as herein provided, shall be paid overtime rates after 4.20 p.m.

## 10.

Any enployec, excepting those as herein provided, on day shift who is required to work before 7.30 a.m., shall not be called upon by the employer to cease work until 4.20 p.m., and shall be paid overtime rates for the time worked previous to $7.30 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$.

## 11.-Aunual Holidays.

Twelve days' annual leave on full pay shall become due to workers with twelve months' service, such leave to be taken at times to be mutually agreed upon between the employer and the employees, between the 30 th April and the 30 th September in each year, in addition to the holidays enumexated in clause 8 of this Agreement. Temporary hands with less than twelve months' service shall on retirement receive a proportion of the ammal holidays in ratio to their service.

## 12.

No contract or piecework shall be permitted.

## 13.

The engagement between the employee and the employer, except casual hands, shall be weekly; a week's notice from either party to terminate same, except in the case of an employee absenting hinself from duty, not obeying lawfin commands, or being guilty of misconduct, or of the works of the employer being stopped through fire or tempests, when such agreement shall be terminated immediately.

## 14.

No employee who has previously been in receipt of ligher wages than arranged for in this Schedule shall be reduced in wages under his present employment, and shall receive a similar increase to all other employees.

## 15.

Any employee being unable through sickness or accident to attend to his duties, shall notify his employer not later than $10 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. on the day he absents himself from duty, and he shall also satisfy the employer that he is unable to attend to his duties, and, if called upon, shall provide a medical certificate that he is unfit to perform his work through sickness.

## 16.

Any enployee who considers himself unfit or not capable of earning the wages hereinbefore prescribed may be paid such less wages as may be agreed upon between the employer and the secretary of the Union. In default of such agreement being arrived at within twenty. four hours after application has been made in writing to the secretary of the Union, the matter may be referced to the nearest Resident Magistrate for settlement. Any employee whose wage has been so fixed may work and be employed by any employer for such less vage for a period of six ealendar months then next ensuing, and thereafter until fourteen days' notice in writing shall be given to such employee by the secretary of the Union reguiring his wages to be again fixed.

## 17.

All employees on day shift engaged in or about a Brewery or Eottling Works shall, if required to work nore than one hour overtime after 4.20 p.m., knock off between 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. for refreshments.

## 18.

The employers shall make it a condition of employment that all workers covered by this Agreement shall be members of the Eastern Goldfields Breweries Employees' Industrial Union of Workers and/or become such within fourteen days of their employment under its terms.

## 19.

Where an employee is required to take a "leading position', he slall, during the time he occupies such position, receive the sum of ten shillings per week in addition to his ordinary rate of pay.

## 20.

This Agreement shall commence from the 17 th day of December; One thousand uine hundred and thirtyeight, and apply to the Eastern Goldfields District, which district, for the purposes of this Agreement, shall mean that area cuclosed by a circle drawn with a radius of 150 miles, with the Kalgoorlie Post Office as the central point, and shall remain in force until the 17 th day of December, One thonsanu nine hundred and thirty-nine, and for such time thereafter until terminated by one month's notice of termination by either party to this Agreement.

## No. 154 of 1939.

In the matter of an Award made by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Industrial Board on the $24 t \mathrm{t}$ day of December, 1938, and Numbered 26 of 1937, and in the matter of an Appeal against certain provisions of the said Award by the Coastal and E.G. Government Water; Sewerage, and Drainage Enployees' Industrial Union of Workers, and in the matter of a CrossAppeal against certain provisions of the said Award by the Hon. Minister for Water Supply Sewerage, and Drainage, and in the matter of an Application to amend the said Award pursuant to section 88 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912. 1935.

UPON reading the Notices of Appeal by the abovenamed appellants respectively, dated the 15th day of March, 1939, and upon reading the Memorandum of Agreement, dated the $15 \mathrm{th}_{1}$ day of March, 1939, and signed by the representatives of the said appellauts respectixely, whereby it was mutually agreed that the respective appeals be allowed in the terms following, that is to say:-
(1) Staike out subclause 3 (f) of clanse 9 , and substitute the following:-
"Sewerage punping station attendants shall work five (5) shifts of eight (8) hours each, Monday to Friday, inclusive, and four (4) hours on Saturday, and shall work one (I) shift on a rotation system at continuous process rates (see subclause (5) of clause 11) on Sunday. In arranging shifts for these workers the Minister shall endeavour to so adjust the rotation that each worker is called on for Sunday work at as long intervals as are practicable."
(2) Strike out the words "sewerage pumping station attendants'" in subclause (2) of clause 12.

Now, therefore, the Court of Arbitration, pursuant to the Agreement above referred to, by consent of the parties, hereby orders and declares that the said appeals be allowed in the terms hereinbefore appearing: And whereas the parties to the said Award have further applied to the Court to amend the said Award pursuant to the provisions of section 88 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, by omitting the

Words and figures "Labourers on stages: B̀s. 0d." :pppearing as Item 25 in the Wrages Schedule, and inserting in lieu thereof the following:-
'Labourers on Stages:--Sce clatuse \&, subelanse (29)."

Now, therefore, the Court, br consent of the parties. and pursuat to the powers in the said section contamed, hereby amends the said Award acordingly.

Should the womery service underground ocenpy less than the full underground shift of seren ( $\overline{7}$ ) hours twelve (12) minutes, he slabll, on the completion of two (2) hours of such service, be aredited at ordinary time 1:Ite with having performed six (6) minutes aditional servec in respect of each hour's absence from the surface on duty ; and at the employer's option this may he adjusted by allowing time of duty corresponding to such credited additional service.
(d) By agreement between an employer and the Thion the hours of work may in his ase be worked mater a roster, which shall provide for an aremge of forty-four (14) lours per week, spread over a perios of three (3) weeks.

## 6.-Overtime.

(a) For all work done besond the hours of duty on any ordinary day, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.
(b) Repairs to the machinery of the employer which is broken down ma has caused a stopage of opera. fions shall be paid for at time and a half for Sundays and holidays.
(c) Work done on Sundays or on Christmas Day, Easter Monday or Labour Day shall be paid at double time. With respect to workers under this Award working more than one shift, any worker whose ordinary rotation shift falls on a Sunday, or on any of the abovementioned holidays, may be emploved at ordinary time. Any shift worker required to work more that six (6) shifts consecutively shall be paid for the verenth shift at double time.
(d) When a worker is recalled to work after learing the premises, he shatl be paid for at least two ( 2 ) hours at overtime rates.
(e) When a worker is required to contina working after the usual knock-oft time for more thon one hom withour haring been notified on the previons day, he shall be provided with any meal required or shatl be paid two shillings (2s.) in respect of any such meal required.
(f) When a worker is required to hodd himself in readiness for a call after ordinary hours, he shatl be paid at ordinary mates for the time that he holds himself in readiness.
(g) When a worker is required for duty during ans meal time whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one hour, he shall be paid at orertime rates untit he gets his meal.
(i) When computing orertime, any district alow ance shall not be computed as an addition to the day s pay.
(i) Systomatic overtime shall not be worked. Orertime shall be considered systematic when two (2) weeks contimons overtime has been worked. No worker shall be permittied to work more than twentyfour (24) hours overtime in any one week: Provided that this subelanse shall apply only within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from Kalgoorlie Town Hall and shall not apply to cases where, after application to the secretary of the applicant lnion, extra competent babour is not arailable.

## 7.-Molidays

(a) Each Worker shall be entitled to twelve (12) days ammal leave on full pay, or, shonld the period of continous employment be less than one year, the worker shall be paid holiday pay in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment. Ammal leare shall be taken at a time suitable to the convenience of the employer: Provided that, where a worker is dismissed for wiful misconduct, he will not he entitled to the benefits of this clause.
(b) The amoments to be paid under subelause (a) shall be ealalated at the rate prevaling at the time the payment is made.
(c) The following shan be holidars:-Chistmas Day, Faster Nomlay, and Labom 1ay If Christmas Day falls on : Sunday the following Monday shall be kept. These days, it not worked, shall not be paid for.
(d) The provisions as to sumual leave shall mot apply to casual workers.

## 8.-Weekly Hiring.

(a) A week's notice of intention to terminate the employment shall be given on either side, exeept in the case of casual workers.
(b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty, except such absence from work is due to illness and comes within the provisions of clause 9 , or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled moler the prorisions of the Award.
(c) This clanse does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.
(d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker camot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affilated with it, or by any other Association or Union, or throngh the breakdown of the employers' machincry, or any stoppage of work by any eause which the employer canot reason ably prevent.

## 9.--Payment of Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be chtitled to payment for nonattendance on the groand of personal ill-health, for one half day for each completed month of service: Provided that parment for absence through such int heath shall be limited to six (6) days in each calen. dar rear. Parment heremader may be adjusted at the (nd of each calendar rear, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entifled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickuess oceurred. This chase shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers Compensation Act.
(b) Ans the in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay under the preceding provisions, shall not count for the purposes of determining his right to holidars.
(e) A worker shall not be entifled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the resuit of an accident not arising out of or in the conse of his employment, or for :ny aceident, wherever sus tained, arising out of his own wilful defanlt or for sickness arising out of his own wilful defant.
(d) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisiactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical ecrtificate maless the absence is for three (3) dars or more.

## 10.-.Shifts.

(a) Whenever shift work is worke:, all shifts except the day shift shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter.
(b) Work other than day shift shall not be recognised as night shift, moless five (5) consecutive nights are worked, lint shall be deemed to be overtime. On the completion of the fifth consecutive night's work, the worker shall be deemed to hase been employed on night shift during that and the preceding four (f) nights, and thereafter during any subsequent consecutive nights he is so employed. The intervention of a Sunday or a holiday on which work is not performed shall not be demed to break the sequence.
(c) When night shift is to be paid at time ant a quarter rate, as prescribed in the preceding subelanse, overtime slatl be based on the time and a quarter rate and ealeubated under clanse 5 (a) of Award Numbered 385 and 336 of 1930 .

## 11.-Payment of Wages.

Any worker learing or being discharged shall be paid the full amount of wages due to him within one hour of ceasing work, or within one hour of the opening of the office, if such offee was closed at the time of his wasing wotk, whenerer same is praticable.

## 12.-Record Book.

A Time and Wages Book slall be kopt by each emplover, in which shall be entered the mane of each worker, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day; and the amomet of wages received by him each week. The employer shall be responsible for the proper posting of the book each week; the said book shall be open to the anthorised representative of the Gnion at any time during working hours, and he shall be allowed to take necessary extracts therefrom: Prorided that any system of antomatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed a compliance with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.

## 13.-Representative Interviewing Workers.

In the case of a dissgreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Aw:ard, an acordited representative of the Union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal honr, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be cxereised without the consent of the employer more than onee in any one week.

## 14.-No Reduction.

Any worker who has been prior to the date of this Award in receipt of al higher rate of pay for his particnlar class of worls shall not by reason of this Award snffer any reduction in pay.

## 15.-Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is mable to earn the minmm wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed mpon in writing between the Union and the cmployer.
(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed

## 16.-Piecework.

(a) Subject to the minimum wage rates and other conditions herein prescribed, an employer may remmerate any of his workers moder any system of payment by resilts.
(b) The Union may during the enrrency of the Award apply to the Court for the correcting or regnlation of any piecework rate, time bonus rate, task rate, or any other system of payment by results.

## 17.--Definitions.

"Casual worker" means any worker whose services are dispensed with by the employer before he shall have completed six (6) days of his engagement.
"Leading hand" means any tradesman placed in charge of three (3) or more other tradesmen or six (6) other workers.

## 18.-University Students.

Provision may be made by agrecment between tlie parties as to terms and conditions for employment, but any such agreement shall be submitted to the Court for approval within onc month after the making thereof.

## 19.-Apprentices.

(a) The provisions of Schedule II. hereto, marked "Apprenticeship Regnlations," subject to any modifications or alterations contained in this clause, are hereby embodied in and form part of this Award.
(b) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer slatal be in the proportion of one apprentice to cvery three (3) or fraction of three (3) journeymen employed by him: Provided that the fraction of three (3) shall not be less than one.
(c) If the apprentice shall at any time during the said term be wilfully disobedicnt to the lawful orders of the employer, his managers, foreman, or other sexvants, having authority over the apprentice, or be slothful, or negligent, or dishonest, or shall otherwise grossly misbelave limself, or shall not conduct liimself as a good and faithful apprentice should do, or shall not faithfully observe and keep his part of his agree. ment, then it shall be lawful for the employer, with the consent of the Court, to discharge the apprentice from his service.
(d) The Court may in its diseretion for any cause which it may deem snfficient on the application of any party to an apprenticeship agreement, abrogate or cancel the agreement, either menditionally or subject to such terms and conditions as it may deem advisable.
(e) Apprentices shall be allowed to the following:-Moulding and coremaking.

## 20.-Away from Home Allowance.

(a) When a worker is engaged on ontside work, the employer shall pay all fares, and a proper allowance at current rates shall be paid for all necessary meals. Fares shall be second-class, except when travelling by coastal boat, when saloon fares shall be paid.
(b) When a worker is engaged at such a distance that he cannot retum at night, suitable board and lodging shall be found at the employer's expense.
(c) Travelling time outside ordinary working honrs shall be paid for at ordinary rates up to a maximum of twelve (12) hours in any twenty-four (24) hourperiod from the time of starting on the journey: Provided that, when the travelling is by boat, not more than eight (8) hours shall be paid for in such period.
(d) Such workers shall not be entitled in addition to receive the district allowances prescribed by this Award.
(e) Workers who are engaged at the job shall be entitled to the district allowance provided by this Award for the particular district in which the job is situated and to the industry allowance as provided by clause 3 hereof, if working on a gold mine.

## 21.-Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints, for the purposes of the Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman, who shall be a person selected by the representatives of the parties, if such may be agreed mpon, or, failing such agreement, the Warden or Resident Magistrate, if agreeable and willing to act, and it not, a Government Inspector of Mines, and two (2) other representatives, one representing the employer and the other a representative of the union, appointed for such purpose by the Union, which may at any time by notification to the employer and the Registrar change such representative.
(b) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of:-
(i) deciding matters specifically referred to in the Award as being the subject-matter of a decision of the Board;
(ii) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award, or any of them;
(iii) deciding all matters and questions referred to in the Award as being the subject of mutual agreement if not agreed upon;
(iv) deciding any other matter that the Court may reter to such Board from time to time.
(c) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the mamer and subject to the conditions preseribed in the Regnations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which for this purpose are ombodied in and form part of this Award (regulation 92).
(d) There shall be no cessation of work pending the reference to and the settlement of any dispute by the Board.

## SCHEDULE I.

## District Allowances

(i) In addition to the wages prescribed in clanse 3 of this Award, the following allowanees shall be paid for six (6) days per week to workers employed in the districts which are hereinafter respectively described, with the exception of districts contained therein which are sitnated within a radins of ten (10) miles of Kalgoorlie, Coolgardie, and Soutliern Cross, viz:-
(a) First District: Lying south of Kalgoorlie and comprised within lines starting from Kalgoorlie, then W.S.W to Woolgangie; thence S.E. to Dundas; thence N.E. to a point ten (10) miles east of Karonie on the Trans-Australian Line, and thence back to Kalgoorlie:-At the rate of five shillings and threepence (5s. 3d.) per week extra for those mines within ten (10) miles of the railway and eight shillings (8s.) per week for those outside.
(b) Second District: Starting from Kalgoorlie W.S.W. to Woolgangie; thence N.N.W. to the intersection of the 120 E . meridian with the 30 S. parallel of latitude; thence N.E. by E. to Kookynie; thence back to the point ten (10)
miles east of K:uronie on the Trans-Austrahan Line, and thence back to Kalgoorlie:-At the rate of seven shillings (7s.) per week extra for those mines within ten (10) miles of the milw:y and nine shillings (9s.) per week for those ontside.
(c) Third District: Starting from and Enchuding Kookyie, then N. by W. to Kmrrajong' thence N.E. to Stone's Soak; thence S.E. to and including Burtrille: thence S.W. through Pindimie to Kookgie:-At the rate of seren shillings (7s.) per week extra for those mines within ten (10) miles of the raibsuy and nine shilhings (9s.) per week for those outside.
(d) Fourth District: Surrounding Southern Cross within a radius of thirty ( 30 ) miles: For those mines ontside a radius of ten (10) miles from Southern Cross, inchding Westonia ancl Bull finch:-At the rate of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per week.
(e) Fifth District: Comprising all mines not specifically defined in the foregoing boundaries, but within the area comprised within the 24th and e6th parallels of latitude:-At the rate of twere shillings (12s.) per week.
(ii) Notwithst:mding :mything herein contaned, the following allowances shall be paid in the districts mentioned hereunder:-

(iii) In the case of any mine or district within the area to which this Arsurd applies which is not deat with under the provisions of this Sehedule, the mion may :apply to the Court at any time for the purpose of having an allowance prescribed, upon serving upon the enployer concerned fourteen (14) days' notice thereof prior to the date of such application. The service of such notice shall be made pursuant to the provisions relating thereto prescribed by the Regulations muder the lulustrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935.

## SCHEDULE II.

Apprenticeship.

## Definitions.

1. (1) "Act" mems the Induswinl Arbitration Act, $1910-1935$, and any alteration or amendment thereof for the time being in force.
(2) "Apprentice" means any person of either sex of any age who is apprenticed to learn or to be taught :my industry, trade, cratt, or calling to which these Regulations apply, and includes an apprentice on probation.
(3) "Award"' inchudes Industrial Agreement.
(4) "Court" means the Court of Arbitration.
(5) 'Employer'' iuchudes any firm, company or corporation.
(6) 'Minor'" means a person not less than fourteen years of age and not more than eighteen years of age who custoniarily works under the direction of or in association with an employer, master, or journeyman upon the material and with the tools or implements used in the industry.
(7) "Registrar" means the Registrar of the Court. Employment-Probation.
2. No minor shall (except where provision is otherwise made in this Award) be ennployed or engaged in the industry, except subject to the conditions of apprenticeship or probationership herein contained.
3. (1) Every apprentice shall be employed on probation for a period of three months to determine his fitness or otherwise for apprenticeship, and shall work only for sach lours per day and for such remuneration as may be prescribed by the Award. In the event of his beconing an apprentice such probationary period shall be counted as prot of the term of apprenticeship.
( 2 ) The Court may in any case where it seems expedient to do so, order that the probationary period of enrployment be extended for a further period not exceeding three montlis.
4. (a) Any enıployer taking an apprentice on probation shall within 14 days thereafter register sueh probationer by giving notice thereof to the Registrar in the prescribed form. If at the date of the coning into operation of these Regulations an enployer is employing any apprentice or probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall forthwith apply for the due registration of such apprentice or probationer.
(b) At the end of the period of probation of each apprentice, if mutually agreed upon by the employer and the legal guardian of the boy, but not otherwise, he may become an apprentice under an agreement.
5. The employer of every apprentice shall keep hin constantly at work and teach such apprentice or cause hinn to be taught the industry, craft, occupation, or calling in relation to which he is bound apprentice, by competent instruction in a gradual and complete manner, and shall give such apprentice a reasonable opportunity to learn the same, and receive, during the period of his apprenticeship, such technical, trade, and general instrue. tion and training as may be necessary. And every apprentice shall, during the period of his apprenticeship, faithfully serve his employer for the purpose of being tanght the industry, craft, occupation, or calling, in relation to which he is bound, and shall atso conscientiously and regularly accept such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as aforesaid, in addition to the teaching that may be provided by his employer.
6. An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under an Award of the Conrt.

## Advisory Committee.

7. A Board to be called "The Advisor'y Committee"; may be appointed by the Court to advise in regard to :01y apprenticeship matter. Such committee shall consist of the tollowing:-
(a) Some person appointed by the Court who shall act as Chairman.
(b) Two represent:tives appointed by the employers.
(c) Two representatives appointed by the industrial union or unions of workers in the trade.
The Adrisory Committee shall have such powers and duties as the Court in each case may determine.
8. (i.) No employer shall refuse employment to any person, or dismiss any worker from his employment, or mijure him in his employment or alter his position to his prejudice, by reason merely of the fact that the worker is a member of any Advisory Committee, or by reasom merely of auything said or done or omitted to be done by any such person or worker in the course of his duty as such member.
(ii.) In any proceeding for any contravention of this Regulation it shall lie npon the employer to show that any person proved to have been refused employment: or any worker proved to have been dismissed or injured in his employnent or prejudiced whilst acting as such nember, was refused employment or dismissed or injured in his employment or prejudiced for some reason other than that mentioned in this Regulation.

Agreement of Apprenticeship.
9. (a) All agreements of apprenticeship shall be drawn up on a form approved by the Court, and signed by the employer, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the apprentice, and the Registrar. No enmployer, guar-
dian, or apprentice shall enter into any agreement or undertaking purporting to add to, vary, alter or amend any sueh agreement without the approval of the Court.
(b) There shall be three copies of each agreement, of which one copy shall be held by the employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the apprentice: and one copy shall be retained by the Registrar.
(c) The apprenticeship agreement shall be completed within one month of the termination of the probationary period.
(d) Every agreement of apprenticeship slall be subject to the provisions of the Award in force for the time being applicable to apprenticeship in the industry.
10. Every agreement entered into by the employen and the legal guardian of the apprentice slall be for a period of five years, but this period may be reduced in special circumstances with the approral of the Court.
11. Every agreement of apprenticeship entered into shall contain-
(a) The uames and addresses of the parties to the agreement.
(b) The date of birth of the apprentice.
(c) A description of the industry, craft, occupation or calling or combination thereof to which the apprentice is to be bound.
(a) The date at which the apprenticeslip is to commence and the period of apprenticeship.
(e) A condition requiring the apprentice to obey all reasonable directions of the employer and requiring the employer and apprentice to comply with the terms of the industrial Award so far as they concern the apprentice.
(f) A condition that techinical instruction of the apprentice, when available, shall be at the employer's expense, and shall be in the employer's time, except in places where such instruction is given after the ordinary working hours.
(g) A condition that in the event of any apprentice, in the opinion of the examiners, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for techical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense to enable such apprentice to reach the necessary standard.
(1) The general conditions of apprenticeship.

## Transfer of Apprentices.

12. (a) The Court shall have power to transfer an apprentice from one employer to another either temporarily or permanently-
(i) if the employer does not provide the necessary facilities for the apprentice to become proficient in his trade; or
(ii) upon the application of the employer or the apprentice for good cause shown.
(b) The transfer of every agreement slall be on a form approved by the Court, and shall be made out in quadruplicate and shall, unless the Court otherwise directs, be signed by the late employer or his assigus, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the apprentice, the Registrar, and the new employer. The transfer form shall be completed within two months of the date on which the transfer is effected.
(e) One copy of the transfer agreement shall be held by the late employer, one shall be held by the new employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one shall be retained by the Registrar.
13. Should an employer at any time before the determination of the period of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the service of the apprentice he may with the consent of the apprentice and guardian transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to contimue to teach the apprentice and pay the rate of wages prescribed by the Court in its Avind or otherwise according to the total length " time serred, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer.
14. On the transfer or termination of any apprenticeship, from whatever cause, the employer shall give the apprentice 2 certificate stating what time he has served, full particulars of the branches of the trade or industr: in which he has received instruction, the proficiency attained, and shall also notify the Clerk of the Court, and the canse thereof.
15. In the erent of an employer being unable to provide work for the apprentice or to mutually agree with the legal guardian of the apprentice to cancel ine agrement or to arrange a transfer, application may be made to the Court to arrange for such transfer or to have such agreement cancelled.
16. Where a person is apprenticed to partaers his agrement of apprenticeship shabl upon the rotirement or death of any partner be deemed to be assigned to the contiming partner or partners.

## Cancellation of Agreement.

7. Every agreement shall include a provision that it mar be cancolied, by mutual consent, by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice giving one month's notice in writing to the Court and to the parties coneorned that such apprenticeship shall be terminated.
8. If the apprentice slall at any time be wilfully disobedient to the lawful orders of the employer, his managers, foremen or other servants having authority ure the apprentice, or be slothful, negligent, or dishonest, or shall otherwise grossly misbehave himself, or shall not conduct himself as a good and faithful apprenfiee shouk do, or shall not faithfully observe and keep his part of his agreement, then it shall be lawful for the employer, with the consent of the Court, to discharge the apprentice from his service.
9. The Court may in its discretion for any cause which it may deem sufficient on the application of any party to an apprenticeship agreement vary or cancel the agreement, either unconditionally or subject to such terms and conditions as it may deem advisable.
$\therefore 0$. No apprentice employed mader a registered agree ment shall be discharged by the employer for alleged misconduct matil the registration of the agreement of apprenticeship has been cancelled by order of the Court on the application of the employer.

Provided, howerer, that an apprentice may be suspended for misconduct by the employer, but in any such case the employer shall forthwith make an application for cancellation of the agreement of apprenticeship, and in the event of the Court refusing same the wages of the apprentice or such portion thereof, if any, as the Court may order shall be paid as from the date of such susponsion, and, in the eront of the application for cancellation being granted, such order may take effect from the date when the apprentice was suspended.
21. Subject to the provisions of the Aets relating to Bankruptey and Insolvency and the Winding up of Companies, the following provisions shall apply:
(:1) The Trustee or Liquidator, as the case may be, may give written notice to the apprentice and his parent or guardian of his intention to discontinue the employnent of the apprentice from a date to be named in such notice, and thereupon the agreement shall be deened to be terminated from the said date; subject, howerer. and withont prejudice to the right of the apprentice, his parent or guardian, to compound. compromise, or agree upor or to sue for and recover such damages (if any) as he may have sustained through such rescission of the agreement as aforesaid.
(b) Any proceedings for danages lereunder must bo commenced within six weeks after the service on the apprentice of the notice referred to in subclanse (a) hereof, otherwise any claim for damages shall be deemed to be waived and forfeited.

## Extension of Term.

22. Subject to Regulation 37, time lost by the apprentice through sickness or any other cause whatsoever: may, with the consent of the Court on the application of any party, be added to the original term in the apprenticeship agreement at the end of the year of service in which the time has been lost or at the termination of the apprenticeship period.
23. The term of apprenticeship may be extended by the Court on the failure of an apprentice to pass any of the examinations, and for such purpose it shall be the duty of the examiners to make any necessary recommen. dation to the Court. Any extension of the term of apprenticeship shall be subject to all the conditions and stipulations in the origimal agreement, except as to mites of wages, which shall be such amount as the Court may determine.

## Teelmical Education Classes

24. (a) Every apprentice shall attend regularly and punctually a Government or other approved techinical sehool rocational classes or classes of instruction, for instruction in such subjects as are provided for his trade. This clause shall be deemed to have been complied with if the apprentice takes a course in an approved correspondence school: Provided, however, that attendances shall not be compulsory when the apprentice is resident outside a radius of 12 miles from the place where instruction is given, or in the case of illness of the apprentice the proof whereot lies on dim. Provided also that if technical instruction is not arailable in the locality in which the apprentice is employed and is available b. correspondence, at reasonable cost to be approved by the Court, the Court may prescribe such correspondence course as the technical instraction to be taken by th. apprentice and paid for by the employer.
(b) The fees for the classes attended by the apprentice shall be paid by the employer.
(c) The period during which apprentices are to attend such technical school or classes if any shall be four hours per week.
:5. Where in any case it is shown to the satisfaction of the Court that any apprentice, by reason of his engagement on country work or other good cause, cannot conreniently attend a technical school or other prescribed classes, such of these Regulatious as relate to attendance at a techmical sehool or other prescribed classes, and to examinations, shall not apply to such apprentice, but he shall be snlbject to snch conditions as the Court may direct.
25. If the examiners or the industrial union or employer concerned make representations to the Court that the facilities provided by the Technical School, or other place of vocational training for the teaching of apprentices, are inadequate, the Comt may make such investigations and such report to the Minister controlling such Technical School, or stele other place, as it deems necessary.
26. When an apprentice attends a technical school, vocational classes, or other class or classes of instruction during his ordinary working lours, where such is prescribed, the time so occupied shall be regarded as part of the term of his apprenticeship, and the employer shall not be entitled to make any deduction from the wages of the apprentice for such time.

## Examinations.

28 (a) Every apprentice slall be bound to submit himself to examination at the places and times appointed if the Registrar after consultation with the examiners.
(b) Every apprentice shall, prior to submitting himself to cxamination, produce to the examiners a certificate that he has made at least 70 per contum of attendances at the techmical school or other place of instruction unless he is exempted from such attendance for good cause.
(c) The clerk of the Court shall notify the examiners of the names and addresses of the apprentices required to submit themselves to examination.
(d) The employer shall place at the disposal of the examiners such material and machinery on his premisey as may be required by them, and shall in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.
29. (a) The examiners shall be persons skilled in the industry and appointed as prescribed by the Award. Failing provision or appointment as aforesaid the Court may appoint such person or persons as it may deen fit. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners, the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them or nominated by the Court or the President at the request of any of the examiners, and the decision of such person shall be final and conclusive.
(b) It shall be the duty of the examiners to examine the work, require the production of the certificate of attendance, inquire into the diligence of each apprentice, and as to the opportmities provided by the employer for each apprentice to learn, and to submit a report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination within one month from the date of holding the examination, but this period may be extended by the Court.
(c) Such examination shall, where possible, include theory and practice as applied to the trade, industry, craft, occuparion, or calling to which the apprentice is indentured.
30. The Registrar shall, after each examination, issue a certificate to each apprentice indicating his degree of proticiency, taking into consideration the term of apprenticeship served. A duplicate of such certificate simal be lodged by each apprentice with his employer and the secretary of the Chion, each of whom shall keep the same in safe custody, and produce the same for inspection by the Industrial Inspector whenever demanded by the latter to do so. When the final examination has been passed the certificate sliall also be signed by the examiners.
31. Whenever it is possible so to do, the examiners, before entering upon the examination, shall draw up a syllabus showing what, in their opinion, is the stage of proficiency which an apprentice should attain at each of the examinations prescribed. The syllabus shall be subject to review by the Court at any time, and shall be kept as a record by the elerk of the Court and a copy landed to the examiners before each examination. The said syllabus may be subject to alteration from time to time by the examiners, who shall forthwith notify the clerk of the Court thereof.
32. In lien of, or in addition to, examiners above re. fored to the Comrt may appoint, wholly or partly, examiners to be appointed by the Director of Technical Education for the whole or any portion of the subjects of instruction, and at such remuneration as the Court may determine.
33. In the event of an apprentice failing to pass any of his examinations the employer may apply to the Court to disallow the increase in wages prescribed by the award, and the Court, on any such application, may make such order as the circmustances of the case nay seem to require.
34. Upon the failare of an apprentice to pass two consecutive examinations, it shall be the duty of the examiners to report same to the Court with a recommendation as to the cancellation of the apprenticeship agrement, or such other remedial measures (i.e., increased time for technical instruction) as they may deem adpisable. The Court, after notice to all parties concerned, may cancel the agreement or make such other order in the circumstances as it may deem necessary.
35. Upon the completion of the period of training preseribed for apprenticeship, each apprentice shall be required to pass the final examination test to the satisfaction of the examiners, and upon passing this test shai be provided with a cortificate to that effect by the Registrar.

## Lost T'ime.

36. The employer shall pay the apprentice for all time lost through sickness or the holidays prescribed by hhis award: Provided-
(a) payment for such sickness shall not exceed a total of one month in cach year;
(b) Where the time lost through sickness exceeds four consecutive working days, the employer may demand from the apprentice the production of a medical certificate, and a further certificate or certificates may be required if any time is lost through sickness within seven days from the date of resumption of duty, the cost if any ot such certificate or certificates not exceeding 5 s . to be borne by the employer;
(c) an apprentice shall not be entitled to reccive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the resnlt of an accident not arising out of or in the coarse of his empleyment, or for any accident or sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
37. The employer shall pay the apprentice, in respect of time lost through compulsory military or naval train. ing, the amount by which the wages prescribed by the industrial award for the trade, calling, craft, occupation, or indnstry exceeds the amount received by the apprentice from the Department of Defence: Provided, however, that this clanse shall not apply to military or maral training imposed through failure to attend compulsory parades.

All time lost by reason of compulsory military or naval training other than the additional traming menlioned in the above proviso shall count as part of the apprenticeship.
38. When an apprentice is absent from work for any canse other than sickness or in pursmance of the provisions of these Regulations, the employer shall be entitled to dednct from the wages of the apprentice an amount proportionate to the time so lost.
39. When an apprentice cannot be usefnlly employed because of a strike the employer shall be relieved of his obligations under the apprenticeship agreement during the period of the strike.

## Part-time Employment.

40. Where in any case an employer is temporarily mable to provide work to employ an apprentice for his full time, application may be made by the enoployer to the Conrt for permission to employ the apprentice for such lesser time per week or per month and at such remmeration as the Court may determine, being not less than the proportionate amomit of the rate of wages prescribed by the industrial award for the trade, calling, or industry. If the Conrt grants the application holidays will be reduced pro rata.

## Miscellaneons.

41. (1) The Registrar shall prepare and keep a roll of apprentices containing-
(a) a record of all apprentices and probationers placed with employers;
(b) a record of all employers with whom apprentices are placed;
(c) a record of the progress of each apprentice, recording the resnlt of the examiners' reports;
(d) any other partienlars the Conrt may direct.
(2) These records shall be open to inspection by employers and the Union of workers interested upon request.
42. For the parpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the average number of journeynen employed on all working days of the twelve months immediately preceding such time shall be deened to be the number of jonmeymen enployed. Where the employer is himself a jomeneynan regularly and nsually working at the trade he shall be counted as a journegman for the propose of computing the number of apprentices allowed. Where a business is in operation for less than twelve months the method of ascertaining the mmber shall be as agreed by the parties to the Award, or, if no agreement arrived at, as dete:mined by the Comit.
43. Every industrial inspector appointed in pursuance of the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1910-1935, shall have the power to enter any premises, make such inspection of the premises, plant, machinery, or work upon which any apprentice is employed or conld be employed, interview any apprentice or employee, examine any books or docmments of the business relating to the wages and conditions of apprentices, interrogate the employer in regard to any of the abovementioned matters.
44. With a view to determining whether the number of apprentices being trained is sufficient to meet the future requirements of the industry in the matter of skilled artisans, the Registrar may require any employer to furnish him with any specified information relating to the said industry, or relating to the workers engaged therein.
