AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 4th day of May, 1939, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Health Act, 1911-1937.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Youanmi Local Board of Health.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (11) of section 20 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, that the Minister may at any time by notice published in the Government Gazette direct that after the expiry of the term of office of the then existing members of any Local Board of Health named in the notice the members of such board shall for the future be chosen by election, and also that subject to subsection (11) aforesaid the Governor may make regulations relating to such elections, and may by such regulations adopt and apply with or without modification any of the provisions contained in Subdivisions (6), (7), (8), (9), or (10) of Part III, of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1933: And whereas pursuant to subsection (11) aforesaid of section 20 of the said Act, the Minister has by a notice published in the Government Gazette on the 21st day of April, 1939, inter alia, directed that after the 31st day of May, 1939, that is to say, after the expiry of the term of office of the present members of the Youanni Local Board of Health as constituted under section 20 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, the members of the Yonanni Local Board of Health shall for the future be chosen by election, and has appointed the nomination day and the election day for the first election to be held for choosing the persons to be members of the said Local Board of Health after the 31st day of May, 1939, as aforesaid: And whereas it is necessary to make regulations under the said subsection (11) of section 20 aforesaid relating to such election, and to all subsequent elections of members of the Local Board of Health: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Conneil and in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon him by paragraph (d) of subsection (11) of section 20 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereunder, under and in accordance with the provisions of the said subsection (11) of section 20 aforesaid, to apply and have ef

Schedule above referred to. HEALTH ACT, 1911-1937.

Regulations relating to Election of Members of Youanmi Local Board of Health.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Health Act (Youanmi Local Board of Health Elections) Regulations, 1939.

2. Subject as hereinafter provided all the provisions contained in Divisions (6), (7), (8), (9), and (10) of Part III. of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1933, are hereby adopted and shall, with such adaptations as may be necessary, apply to and have effect in respect of each and every election for choosing persons to be members of the Youannii Local Board of Health after the 31st day of May, 1939: provided that—

(i) this regulation shall operate and have effect subject to the provisions of subsection (11) of section 20 of the Health Act, 1911-1937; (ii) whilst the boundaries of the Youanmi Local Beard of Health aforesaid are and continue to be coterminous with the benudaries of the Youanmi Ward of the Black Range Road District as constituted under the Road Districts Act, 1919-1933, the electoral roll for the said Youanni Ward of the Black Range Road District aforesaid, as prepared by the Black Range Road Board and for the time being and from time to time in force under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1933, aforesaid, shall, for all purposes relating to elections of persons to be members of the Youaumi Local Board of Health aforesaid be and be deemed to be the electoral roll of the said Youanni Local Board of Health, and a copy of the said electoral roll of the Yonanmi Ward of the Black Range Road District, certified in writing under the hand of the chairman of the Black Range Road Board to be a true copy of the said electoral roll, shall be used as the electoral roll of the Youanmi Local Board of Health for the election of its members accordingly, and it shall not be necessary for the Youannii Local Board of Health itself to prepare any list or any electoral roll as required by Division (6) of Part III, of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1937, adopted by this regulation;

(iii) the provisious of section 61 as contained in Division (7) of Part III. of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1933, relating to annual elections shall not apply, but in lieu thereof there shall be deemed to be a provision in Division (7) aforesaid that an election of members shall be held every three years on a day to be appointed by the Minister;

(iv) the provisions of section 68 as contained in Division (8) of Part III. of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1933, prescribing and fixing the nomination day shall not apply, but in lieu thereof there shall be deemed to be a provision in Division (8) aforesaid that the nomination day in respect of any election shall be such day as may be appointed by the Minister, being not less than twenty-one and not more than twenty-eight days next preceding the day appointed by the Minister for the holding of the election.

- 1.  - (iii) a director, trustee, member, or officer of any incorporated body or non-corporate body (not being a co-operative company) which is licensed as a manufacturer.
- (c) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in paragraph (d) hereof, a person shall not be eligible for selection for nomination under paragraph (d) hereof, unless such person, if he be an individual person licensed as a manufacturer, is himself producing fifty-two tons of dairy products per annum, or, if he be a partner in a firm licensed as manufacturers or a director, trustee, member, or officer of an incorporated body or non-corporate body which is licensed as a manufacturer, unless such firm or such incorporated body or non-corporate body, as the case may be, produces fifty-two tons of dairy products per annum.

(f) Save and except as hereinafter provided, any person mentioned in paragraphs
(c) and (d) hereof shall not be eligible for selection for nomination as a representative of the producers or of the dealers:

Provided that this paragraph shall not apply to a person who is a member or a director, trustee, or officer of a co-operative company or of any other incorporated body, or a non-corporate body which is licensed as a manufacturer, and such person shall be eligible to represent the dealers; but such person shall not be eligible to represent the dealers and at the same time to represent the co-operative companies as licensed manufacturers or the other licensed manufacturers.

- (g) Persons to be selected for nomination as representatives of the producers shall be bona fide producers within the meaning of the Act; but such persons shall not be eligible to represent either the co-operative companies or the other manufacturers or the dealers at the same time.
- (h) The person to be selected for nomination as representative of the dealers shall be a licensed dealer, and shall not be eligible for selection for nomination as the representative either of the co-operative companies or of the other manufacturers or of the producers at the same time.

 - (g) Where the number of condidates submitted for nomination and appointment does not exceed the number of representatives to be nominated and appointed, the Returning Officer shall forthwith certify that fact, together with the names, addresses, and occupations of the candidates submitted, in accordance with Form No. 15 in the First Schedule hereto, to the Minister. And such certificate, when received by the Minister, shall be decided to be and shall be treated as the nomination of the candidates whose names appear in the certificate by the constituent body whose representatives they are intended to be on the Board;
 - (h) As soon as reasonably may be after the receipt of the said certificate from the Returning Officer, and not later than the nomination day hereinafter prescribed, the Minister shall submit to the Governor in Council for appointment as members of the Board the name or names of the person or persons mentioned in the said certificate.
