The Fisheries Act, 1905-38. PROCLAMATION

Western Australia, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

C.S.D. 162/21.

WHEREAS by section 17 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-38, it is provided the Governor may by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, declare (inter alia) what length of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for catching any specified kind or kinds of fish, be a lawful net: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, declare and proclaim as follows:—That with respect to fishing nets known as mullet nets, for catching fish of the species set out in the First Schedule hereto, to be used in the tidal waters

open to net fishing at Peel's Inlet (Mandurah), a net with the length of net and size of mesh, as set out in the Second Schedule hereto, shall be a lawful net.

First Schedule.

All marine fish.

Second Schedule.

Total length, not exceeding 300 fathoms, of which not more than 100 fathoms, or a length not exceeding one-third of the total length of the net, shall be of a mesh of not less than 2in. and the remainder of the net shall be of a mesh of not less than 2½in.

The Proclamation relative to mullet nets dated the 10th June, 1914, published in the Government Gazette No. 30 of the 12th June, 1914 (page 2296), is hereby rescinded.

closed against the taking of English Perch by any method of capture whatever for a period of twelve months as from the 8th day of May, 1939.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-38, it is provided that the Governor may by proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the date of publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette until the 31st day of December, 1939, inclusive.

By-laws relating to Blasting, Quarrying, and Excavations.

P.W. 1494/36. WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1938, the Road Board of any district is empowered to make a by-law for all or any purpose in the said Act mentioned, the Mundaring District Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

- 1. No person shall within the limits of the Mundaring Road District:— $\,$
 - (a) quarry for stone, gravel, or other material; or
 - (b) do any act or thing for the purpose of recovering any stone, gravel, or other material whereby an excavation is created or enlarged without a license from the Board in writing first had and obtained
- 2. The application for license to excavate shall be made in writing to the Board and shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee and a plan of the area in which it is desired to excavate, and such plan shall show the situation and estimated size of the proposed excavation and the distance thereof from adjacent buildings, roads,

- and footpaths. The Board may either grant or refuse such application or may grant the same subject to such conditions as the Board shall think fit.
- 3. Fee payable to the Board for the issue or renewal of a license shall be 5s.
- 4. A license, unless cancelled previously by the Board for a breach thereof, shall remain in force for a period of six months, or for such other period as may be specified therein and no longer, and may be renewed by the Board by payment of the prescribed fee and upon the same or such other conditions or for such further period as the Board may think fit.
- 5. The Board may refuse or withhold such license without assigning any reason for such refusal, and this by-law refers to quarries or excavations already established in the Mundaring Road District; also to any other quarries or excavations hereinafter established. Any person who has obtained such license as aforesaid shall, before commencing or suffering or permitting blasting, quarrying, or excavations, erect conspicuous notices in such places as may be directed by the Board or its secretary, and shall keep such notices exhibited during the time blasting, excavating, or quarrying operations are being carried out. The size, type, and lettering of such notices shall be as prescribed by the Board or secretary.
- 6. The secretary of the Board may give such directions (if any) as he deems advisable with respect to the size, weight, or amount of any explosive that may be used in any one charge during blasting operations.
- 7. The Board may in its discretion order that any place where blasting, excavating, or quarrying operations are being carried out shall be fenced in such manner as it may deem advisable for the protection of persons, stock, or property.
- 8. Notwithstanding the granting of any such license as aforesaid, the Board may order any blasting, excavation, or quarrying operations to be discontinued, either forthwith or at a time to be specified in such order.
- 9. Any person who has obtained a license under these by-laws from the Board shall observe all reasonable and proper precautions for the prevention of accident to persons, stock, or property during blasting and quarrying operations, and if the Board considers it necessary, it may order the licensee to sound in a proper and

audible manner a bell or other approved device, not more than ten minutes or less than five minutes prior to any explosion resulting from quarrying or general operations at the site, in order to warn all persons residing in the vicinity of the time and place when and where such explosion is to occur.

10. No person shall be exempt from liability for any damage occasioned to any person, stock, or property arising from any blasting or quarrying operations by reason only of having obtained a license under these by-laws or of having observed the provisions of such

by-laws.

11. If any person either by act or omission contravenes these by-laws or, being a licensee, shall commit any breach of the conditions under which his license is held, or being the owner or occupier of any property within the Mundaring Road District, shall knowingly permit any act or omission in contravention of these by-laws on any property owned or occupied by him, he shall be guilty of an offence, and on conviction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds for every such offence.
