WHEREAS by the Game Act, 1912-13, it is provided that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation declare any one or more portions of the State, or any one or more localities, to be respectively defined in such Proclamation, a Reserve for Native Game, or any particular Native Game: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the portions of the State and localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto shall be a Reserve for Native Game.

Schedule.

White Lake:—The whole of the waters of White Lake adjacent to the 19-mile post on the Fremantle-Mandurah road.

WHEREAS by the Fisheries Act, 1905-38, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit (*inter alia*) the taking of any fish whatsoever by any means

of capture whatsoever, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time, in any specified year, or during a specified portion of every year: And whereas it is desirable that the taking of trout (of all species) in those portions of Western Australian waters in which trout (of all species) are likely to be found by any means of capture whatsoever, be prohibited: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the aforesaid powers and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking trout (of all species) in any Western Australian waters situated south of a line starting at Geraldton on the west coast and running due east to the eastern boundary of the State of Western Australia, by any means of capture whatsoever, during any period of the term commencing on and from the 14th day of May, 1939, until the 31st day of December, 1939, inclusive.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-38, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: And whereas by section 10 of the said Act any such Proclamation may be revoked or varied at any time: Now,

therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power thereunto me enabling, vary the Proclamation dated the 14th December, 1937 (published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th December, 1937) by omitting paragraph (7) of the Schedule to such Proclamation and inserting in lieu thereof the following new paragraph (7):—

(7) The whole of the waters of the Harvey River and that portion of the Harvey Estuary south of a line, being the prolongation easterly to the eastern shore of the Estuary of the northern boundary of Location 479.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-38, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from (a) taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture; (b) taking any fish whatsoever by any specified means of capture; (c) taking any fish whatsoever by any means of capture whatsoever, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time in any specified year, or during a specified portion of any year: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of any other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

(1) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the First Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the first day of August, 1939, until the thirty-first day of December, 1939, inclusive.

(2) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Second Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the first day of October, 1939, until the thirty-first day of December, 1939, inclusive.

(3) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Third Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the sixteenth day of May, 1939, until the thirty-first day of December, 1939, inclusive.

(4) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fourth Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the taking of English perch by any method of capture as from the first day of July, 1939, until the thirty-first day of October, 1939, inclusive.

First Locality Schedule.

All that portion of the ocean waters of Rottneet Island lying west of the north-eastern extremity of North Point (on the northern side of the said island) and west of the south-western extremity of Salmon Point (on the southern side of the said island) and within the sea limits of half-a-mile from the foreshore.

Second Locality Schedule.

(a) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending from the north-western side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

(b) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending from the south-eastern side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

Third Locality Schedule.

That portion of the ocean waters near the entrance to Peel's Inlet bounded by the following lines:—On the west by a line drawn in a northerly direction for a quarter of a mile from the extremity of Robert Point (on the western side of the bar), thence by a line drawn to a point on the foreshore lying a quarter of a mile north-east of the bar at the entrance to Peel's Inlet, wherever such bar may be.

Fourth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of the Capel River (near Bunbury), including the creeks flowing into it.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1938.

Westonia Road Board.

P.W. 1928/37.

IN pursuance of the powers and provisions in, under, and by virtue of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1938, the Westonia Road Board hereby repeals by-law No. 114 and amendment published in the *Government Gazette* of February 25th, 1917, and December 4th, 1931, respectively, to provide for the Licensing of Hawkers, and makes and ordains that the following by-law for Licensing of Hawkers and Regulating Hawking within its district be observed and enforced and shall be known as by-law No. 114:—

1. No person shall hawk any article of merchandise within the district of the Westonia Road Board without having obtained a license from the said Board. Every license shall specify the kind of goods to be hawked and shall not be transferable without the permission of the Board.

2. "Hawker" means any person who travels and trades and goes from town to town or to other men's homes there soliciting orders for or carrying or exposing for sale any merchandise.

3. Licenses shall be granted for one year from date of issue of such license.

4. The number of licenses to be issued during any one year shall be as decided by the Board from time to time.

5. The Board may refuse to grant any license.

6. The fee payable for a Hawker's License shall be £5 per year and shall be payable in advance on the issue of such license.

7. Every hawker, whilst employed in hawking, shall produce his license upon being required by any police constable or any officer of the Board.

8. Any unlicensed person doing any act or thing for which a license is required, or any licensed person committing any breach of these by-laws, shall be guilty of an offence against the Road Districts Act, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds (£10).

9. These by-laws shall not apply to persons seeking orders for merchandise from persons who are dealers in such merchandise or selling merchandise to such dealers.

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1938.

By-laws relating to Hawking.

Esperance Road Board.

P.W. 779/24.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 204 (ss. 41) of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1938, the Board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act, the Esperance District Road Board doth, in exercise of its powers aforesaid and of every power enabling it in this behalf, hereby make the following by-laws:—

1. These by-laws shall be known as the Esperance Road Board Hawkers and Pedlars' By-laws and shall be read with and subject to the provisions of the Hawkers and Pedlars Act, 1892, hereinafter referred to as "the Act."

2. The term "hawker" shall when used in these by-laws bear the same meaning as that given to such term by section 1 of the Act.

3. No person to whom section 6 of the Act applies shall, unless duly licensed by the Board as hereinafter prescribed, trade or act within the Board's district as a hawker of fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables or any article of merchandise.

4. (i) Any application for a Hawker's License or renewal thereof must be lodged with the prescribed fee with the secretary to the Board in the Form 1 in the Appendix to these by-laws.

(ii) A Hawker's License may be issued in the Form 2 in the Appendix to these by-laws.

(iii) A Hawker's License may remain in force for a period of one year from the date the license is issued by the Board.

(iv) The fee for a Hawker's License or renewal thereof shall be one pound.

5. (i) A Hawker's License may be issued subject to the following conditions:—

(a) that the hawker shall produce his license upon demand, whilst employed or engaged in hawking, to any police officer or officer of the Board;

(b) that the hawker's name, with the words "Licensed Hawker" immediately thereunder, shall be painted in letters not less than one inch in height on a conspicuous part of the vehicle, if any, used by the hawker, otherwise on a conspicuous part of the basket, tray, case, bag, or other container used by the hawker for carrying his wares;

(c) that the hawker shall not lend, transfer or assign his license.

(ii) The Board may upon the conviction of any licensed person for a breach of any of the conditions of his license cancel the said license by posting a notice to such person addressed to his last known place of abode.

6. (i) Every licensed hawker shall, before commencing to hawk within the Board's district, obtain a badge from the secretary to the Board with a number and the year of issue inscribed thereon.

(ii) Such badge shall be issued upon payment of a fee of five shillings (5s.).

7. Every licensed hawker shall, at all times while hawking within the Board's district display his badge by affixing same to his left arm by means of a leather strap.

8. The badge shall remain the property of the Board and shall be returned to the secretary of the Board when the person to whom it is issued ceases to be licensed.

9. The secretary to the Board may, for the purpose of enforcing the obligation of hawkers and traders to carry scales, institute and carry on proceedings under the Weights and Measures Act, 1915, against any person failing to carry out any such obligation imposed by the said Act.

Municipal Council of Collie—Hawking By-law.

P.W. 148/39.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Collie, made pursuant to the provisions of section 179 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-38, for regulating hawking within the Municipality of Collie:—

By resolution of the Municipal Council of Collie it is ordered as follows:—

(1) In this by-law the term "Hawker" shall have the meaning defined in section 179 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906, as amended from time to time.

(2) Subject to the provisions of the next following section, from and after the gazettal of this by-law no person shall trade or act as a hawker within the boundaries of the Municipality of Collie, and every person offending against this provision shall on conviction before any Justice of the Peace in Petty Sessions be liable, for a first offence, to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, and for any subsequent offence, to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds; the minimum penalty shall in no case be less than one-fifth of the maximum.

(3) The Council may in its absolute discretion grant such number of licenses to such persons as it may think fit to act as hawkers for the sale of fruit, fish, or vegetables within the boundaries of the municipality.

(4) Licenses shall be in the form hereunder, and every hawker whilst acting as such shall produce his license, upon being required so to do by any officer or other person authorised by the Council, and shall also have fixed to some conspicuous part of his cart, barrow, basket, vehicle, or dray a board or plate bearing his name and the words "Licensed Hawker," legibly painted thereon in letters not less than one inch in length. Maximum penalty on conviction two pounds.

(5) Should the Council exercise its discretion under section 3 hereof, then the following fees shall be paid half-yearly in advance from the granting of such license, and if any license fee be not paid on its due date, then such license shall immediately become void and of no effect.

Fees.

For every hawkker with hand basket or tray—5s. per half year.

For every other hawkker—10s. 6d. per half year.

(6) No license hereunder may be transferred, assigned, or used in any way other than by the person whose name it bears. Maximum penalty on conviction—Five pounds.

(7) In any proceedings before a Justice of the Peace for a breach of this by-law the facts complained of shall be deemed *prima facie* evidence thereof.

(8) Any existing by-laws of the Municipality of Collie, with reference to hawkkers, are hereby repealed.
