### FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1), of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

By-laws relating to Hawkers and Stallholders.

P.W. 1128/35.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1938, the Board of any road district is empowered, for the order and good government of its district, to make by-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned: And whereas, by the Interpretation Act, 1918, the power to make by-laws is deemed to include the power to revoke the same: Now, therefore, the Murray Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Acts and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby revoke the by-laws relating to hawkers and stallkeepers, numbered 1-4, inclusive, and every Schedule thereto annexed, which said by-laws were made on the 12th day of December, 1936, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 25th day of March, 1937, and the amendment thereof made on the 11th day of September, 1937, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 26th day of November, 1937, and doth hereby make and publish the following new by-laws in substitution therefor:—

Interpretation.

1. In the construction of these by-laws:—

(a) "District" means the district controlled by the Murray Road Board.

(b) "Hawker" includes any person who trades or travels on foot or with any vehicle or animal from one town to another town, or from place to place, or to other men's houses, carrying with him any fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, vegetables, drink, eatables, or any article of merchandise, for the purpose of selling the same, or exposing or offering the same for sale, and also includes any person who sells any such commodity, or exposes or offers the same for sale by outcry or some similar form of advertisement, in or near any public reserve or common or street or way, or on the foreshore of any river, or the sea: and "Hawk" includes every act done by a person which would cause him to be regarded as a hawker as defined above.

(c) "Stall" includes any movable and/or temporarily fixed stall and any vehicle in or from which the stallholder sells meat, fish, poultry, game, fruit, vegetables, drink, eatables, or articles of merchandise. A fixed stall shall be deemed to have been temporarily fixed, unless it is a building erected in accordance with the Building Regulations of the Board and with the approval of the Board, as provided for in those regulations.

(d) "Fish" shall include fresh, salted, smoked, or dried fish, oysters, crayfish, crabs, prawns and shrimps.

Hawkers.

2. Any person who desires to hawk any fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, vegetables, drink, eatables, or any article of merchandise within any part of the district



shall first apply for a license from the Board by completing and signing an application, in Form number (1) in the Schedule hereto.

3. The Board may either—

- (a) Grant the application, or
- (b) Refuse to grant the same, for any of the following reasons:—
  - (i) If in the opinion of the Board the applicant is not a fit and proper person to hold a license.
  - (ii) If the applicant has not been a *bona fide* resident and ratepayer of the district for a period of at least one year expiring on the date of his application.
  - (iii) If the commodities which the hawkker intends to hawk will not be produced in the district.
  - (iv) If in the opinion of the Board the granting of a license or hawking by the applicant may prejudice the interests of any *bona fide* resident and ratepayer of the district.
  - (v) If the Board does not desire hawkkers to operate in the portion of the district in which the applicant wishes to hawk.

4. If the Board grants the application, it shall issue to the applicant a license, in Form number (2) in the Schedule hereto, and also a badge, with a number and the year of issue displayed, upon the licensee paying to the Board a fee of 2s. 6d. for his license and 2s. 6d. for his badge.

5. Every license shall be granted subject to the conditions:—

- (a) that the licensee shall not hawk any commodity which was not produced in the district, unless no such commodity is being produced in the district at the time such commodity is hawked;
- (b) that the licensee shall not hawk any commodity other than those specified in his license;
- (c) that the licensee shall not hawk any commodity in any portion of the district other than that portion which is specified in his license;
- (d) that the licensee shall not commit any offence, rendering him liable to prosecution and conviction summarily or after indictment.

These conditions shall be printed on the back of every license.

6. The Board may cancel any license by notice in writing, if the licensee commits a breach of any of the conditions mentioned in clause 5, whereupon the licensee shall surrender his license and badge to the Board.

7. Unless cancelled as provided in clause 6, every license shall remain in force for one year from the date of issue thereof.

8. Every licensee shall display his badge upon demand when hawking.

9. No person shall hawk any fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, vegetables, drink, eatables, or any article of merchandise within the district unless he is the holder of a current Hawker's License from the Board.

**Stallholders.**

10. Any person who desires to place, erect, keep, or conduct any stall on the foreshore of any river, or the sea or elsewhere within the district, shall first apply for a license from the Board, by completing and signing an application, in Form number (3) in the Schedule hereto.

11. No stall shall be placed, erected, kept, or conducted in or near any street or way, or on any reserve, within one hundred yards of any shop, the occupier of which sells goods of a similar nature to any of those sold by the stallholder.

12. On receiving such an application, and provided that the position of the stall does not offend against the provisions of clause 11, the Board shall issue a license to the applicant, in the Form number (4) in the Schedule hereto, upon the licensee paying to the Board a fee of £1.

13. Every license shall be issued subject to the conditions:—

- (a) that the licensee shall not sell any commodity which was not produced in the district, unless no such commodity is being produced in the district at the time such commodity is sold;

- (b) that the licensee shall not sell any commodity other than those specified in his license;
- (c) that the licensee shall not place, erect, keep, or conduct his stall, or carry on the business of a stallholder, at any place other than the place specified in his license.
- (d) that the licensee shall attach his license to his stall in a prominent position but protected from the weather;
- (e) that the licensee shall not commit any offence rendering him liable to prosecution and conviction summarily or after indictment.

These conditions shall be printed on the back of every license.

14. The Board may cancel any license by notice in writing, if the licensee commits a breach of any of the conditions mentioned in clause 13, whereupon the licensee shall surrender his license to the Board.

15. Unless cancelled as provided in clause 14, every license shall remain in force for one week, but may be renewed from time to time, upon payment of the fee mentioned in clause 12, but subject to the provisions of clause 11.

16. No person shall place, erect, keep, or conduct any stall, or carry on the business of a stallholder, on the foreshore of any river, or the sea, or elsewhere within the district, unless he is the holder of a current Stallholder's License from the Board.

17. In conducting his stall every stallholder shall be quiet and courteous and shall not do anything which may lead to a breach of the peace, or commit any offence rendering him liable to prosecution and conviction summarily or after indictment.

18. Every stallholder shall keep his stall and the immediate surroundings thereof clean and tidy.

19. No stallholder shall sell any commodity which was not produced in the district unless no such commodity is being produced in the district at the time such commodity is sold.

**Offenders.**

20. The secretary or other officer appointed by the Board, or any officer of the Police Force, may demand and require his name and address from any individual committing or suspected of committing any offence against or breach of clauses 1-19, inclusive, of these by-laws, and every person who shall refuse or neglect to give his name and address, when required so to do, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

21. Every person offending against any provision of clauses 1-19, inclusive, of these by-laws shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding £20.

## INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 12 of 1939.

(Registered 14/6/1939.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925, this eighth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, between the City of Perth Municipal Council and the Fremantle Gas and Coke Company, Limited (hereinafter called "the employers"), of the one part, and the Metropolitan Gas Works Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part: Whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that the several stipulations, conditions, and provisions set out in this Schedule hereto shall in all cases be binding upon and shall be faithfully carried out and observed, performed, and complied with by all parties concerned.

## Clause 1.—Schedule of Wages.

Leading Hands:—Leading hand (not otherwise specified) in charge of three or more men shall be paid 1s. 3d. per day above the ordinary rate of pay for such work.

Leading hand (being a tradesman) in charge of three or more tradesmen or six or more other workers shall be paid 2s. 6d. per day above the rate prescribed for his trade.

Working inside boilers, etc.:—Men engaged inside the gas, tar, or water space of any boiler, or inside the boiler flue, in cleaning or scraping work; or in tar stills, tar tanks, superheaters, or carburetters (Water Gas Plant) after such vessels have been in commission, cleaning off and removing the residue therefrom, shall be paid a margin of 6d. per hour for the time when so engaged.

Men cleaning the tar tanks of the Waterless Holder only shall be paid a margin of 1s. per day for the time when so engaged.

Cleaning out septic tanks:—Men engaged in cleaning out septic tanks shall be paid a margin of 3s. per day for the time when so engaged.

Working in "wet ground":—Any employee working in wet ground shall be paid 1s. per day in addition to his ordinary or overtime rate of pay. "Wet ground" means ground in which, in the opinion of the engineer, it is impracticable for workers to work without getting wet feet: Provided that, where watertight boots are supplied by the management, there shall be no allowance for wet ground.

Height money:—Any employee working on any temporary scaffolding, swinging stage, bosun's chair or ladder at a height of 40 feet or over from the ground shall be paid 1s. per day in addition to the rate of pay for the job, providing he so works four hours or over

in any one day. If he works less than four hours he shall be paid at the higher rate for the time of working only.

Mixed functions:—Any employee required to do more than one class of work in any one day shall be paid at the higher rate for the day, provided he works for four hours or over at this rate, otherwise he shall be paid the higher rate only for the time so worked.

Industry money:—In addition to the wages as prescribed in this Agreement, "Industry money" shall be paid at the rate of three shillings (3s.) per week to all workers covered by this Agreement, with the exclusion of the workers enumerated in clauses 10 and 16 hereof, and men discharging coal from railway trucks.

When the basic wage as declared by the State Arbitration Court exceeds £4 5s. 0d., industry money shall be decreased by the amount by which the basic wage exceeds £4 5s. 0d. until at £4 8s. 0d. and over no industry money shall be paid.

## Clause 2.—Provision of Oilskins.

Service men, all regular employees of the main-laying gangs, and complaint men, shall be supplied with oilskins, leggings, coat, and sou'-wester, every two (2) years. The worker shall be responsible for any loss of or damage to the same (ordinary wear and tear excepted) before the expiration of such period. If the worker leaves or is dismissed from his employment before the expiration of two (2) years from the issue, he shall return the oilskin, leggings, coat, and sou'-wester issued to him.

## Clause 3.—Travelling Allowance for Main Gangs and Outside Workers.

Where an employee commencing work at starting time on the job incurs extra tram or railway fares over and above one tram fare each way, or over and above the amount he would incur if starting work at Wellington street works, Perth; Gas Works, Fremantle, or Cottesloe Depot, this extra amount of fares shall be refunded to him each week, providing that this clause does not apply to any worker who has been allotted a special district whilst working in such district.

## Clause 4.—Time Allowance outside the Two-mile Radius.

Employees working temporarily outside the two-mile radius of the Wellington street Works, Perth; Gas Works, Fremantle, or Cottesloe Depot, and not within two miles of their place of residence, shall be allowed one-half hour per day travelling time, without loss of pay, in addition to above travelling allowance, when required to report for work on the job.

## Clause 5.—Hours.

The hours of duty shall not, without payment for overtime, exceed 44 hours per week, and the hours of duty for any day shall not, without payment for overtime, exceed eight hours. Provided also, that if it is found necessary, arrangements may be made for employees to commence work earlier or later and finish earlier or later than the ordinary hours. Each shift to consist of eight hours.

## Clause 6.—Overtime.

Payment shall be made for overtime at the rate of time and one-half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job, he shall be paid for at least two hours at overtime rates.

When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one hour, he shall be provided with any meal required, or shall be paid two shillings (2s.) in lieu thereof. This provision shall not apply in case of emergency breakdown repairs, nor to men unloading coal.

## Clause 7.—Shift Work.

The hours of duty without payment for overtime shall not for shiftmen (except watchmen) exceed an average of 44 hours per week, to be worked in shifts not exceeding eight hours each. Such shifts to be distributed as the employers choose, but so as to make an aggregate shift time on duty, not exceeding 176 hours in each period of four weeks.

For all duty performed on his day off in the week, not being a Sunday or a holiday, the minimum ordinary rate prescribed for a shiftman shall be increased by one-half, but in the case of a Sunday it shall be doubled.

For all time worked on a Sunday and holidays (not being his day off), the minimum ordinary rate for a shiftman shall be increased by one-half for a Sunday, but in the case of a holiday it shall be doubled.

In the case of a shiftman working on his day off at the request of another employee, the rate to be paid shall be the ordinary rate payable for the day or shift.

A shiftman shall be deemed to be working on a continuous process.

In the case of a man, after his usual day's work, being called on for Retort House work between 5.0 p.m. and 7.30 a.m., he will be paid at the rate of time and one-half, unless notified before 5 p.m. that he will be required for the night shift.

Clause 8.—Holidays.

The following days shall be recognised as holidays and the usual rates of pay shall be paid for same: Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Eight Hours' Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, and Union Picnic Day.

Any days which are prescribed by the laws of the State to be observed in lieu of the holidays above-mentioned will be treated as the days to which this clause applies.

All employees, other than shiftmen, shall be free from duty on holidays, without loss of pay for the day, but any employee may be required for duty on any Sunday or holiday, and, if so required, shall be entitled to the ordinary rate for the time worked on Sunday, and on holidays, the ordinary day's pay plus the holiday pay for the day.

The rates for shiftmen and any employee required to work as a shiftman shall be time and one-half for Sundays and double time for holidays.

Clause 9.—Annual Leave.

A working week of forty-four hours' leave of absence will be granted annually on full pay after twelve months' service, in addition to the eight days' holiday already specified herein; leave not to be accumulative and to be taken at the discretion of the Management, so as to interfere with the routine of the works as little as possible.

Employees not completing twelve months' service shall receive holidays, or pay in lieu thereof, after six months' service, in proportion to the length of service, that is, one day's holiday for every two months' service, calculated at the rate of one-sixth of the 44-hour week's pay for each day's holiday, unless summarily dismissed for misconduct, dereliction of duty, etc., in which case no holiday pay shall be granted.

Retort operators and men engaged on shiftwork shall receive two working weeks' (eighty-eight hours) leave on full pay after twelve months' service.

Men on the Water Gas Plant and Tar Plant shall be classed as shift workers for annual holidays, when two or more shifts are being worked continuously per day.

Retort operators and shift workers shall receive holidays, or pay in lieu thereof, in proportion to the length of service; that is, one day's holiday for each one month's service, calculated at the rate of one-sixth of the 44-hour week's pay for each day's holiday, unless summarily dismissed for misconduct, dereliction of duty, etc., in which case no holiday pay shall be granted.

Clause 10.—Casual Workers.

A casual worker shall be paid ten per cent. increase on the prescribed rate for the particular class of work he is required to perform.

"Casual worker" means a worker (other than men picked up for unloading coal) employed for less than fourteen consecutive days.

Clause 11.—Junior Workers.

Junior workers shall be paid in accordance with the following scale:—

21 years of age—adult wage.

From his fifteenth birthday a junior worker shall be paid "Industry money," starting at the rate of threepence (3d.) per week and increasing by threepence (3d.) per week each half-year, until at 20½ years he will receive three shillings (3s.) per week "Industry money" in addition to the wages prescribed in this Agreement.

Clause 12.—Weekly Hiring.

(a) Except as to casual workers, the employment is terminable on either side by one week's notice, given on any day. But for the first fourteen days' of employment the hiring shall be from hour to hour, and during this period an hour's notice or an hour's pay shall be sufficient.

(b) If a weekly worker absents himself from duty, a sum proportionate to his time of absence may be deducted from his pay.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

(d) The employers shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or the Unions affiliated with it, or by any other Association or Union, or through any breakdown of the employers' machinery, or any stoppage of work, or by any such strike or breakdown which the employers cannot reasonably prevent.

(e) Sick Pay.—The employers will, in the case of personal accident or personal sickness necessitating absence from work, pay for a total period of six days in the year, for such absence from work.

Providing also, that the employee will lose his pay for the time of such absence from work, unless he produces or forwards within forty-eight hours of the commencement of such absence a medical certificate or other evidence satisfactory to the Management that his absence was due to personal accident arising out of and in the course of his employment, or to personal ill-health necessitating such absence.

Provisions.

Clause 13.—Service Layers.

Service layer's work to terminate within six feet of inside of building or street line.

Clause 14.—Maintenance work.

Maintenance work shall not constitute gas fitter's work, unless it is found necessary to remove the fittings and replace them to repair a fault.

Clause 15.—Tools.

All tools required by the abovenamed employees (service and maintenance men) in connection with any work performed by them on behalf of the employers, to be provided by the employers, with the following exception—All tools (small) generally known as "Pocket tools," to be found by the employees.

Clause 16.

Plumbers, carpenters, blacksmiths, fitters, and turners and other trades provided for under the various Federal and State Awards are not included in this Agreement.

Clause 17.—Forty-four Hour Week.

The 44-hour week in this Agreement having been agreed to in consequence of the State Arbitration Court having awarded a 44-hour week to the Amalgamated Society of Engineers, it is hereby agreed that, should the Court increase or decrease the hours to any other number of hours per week to the Amalgamated Society of Engineers, this Agreement shall be amended to include such provision.

**Clause 18.—Settlement of Disputes.**

Should any question or dispute arise regarding this Agreement or any matter not provided for herein, it shall be referred to a representative of the employers and of the Union, who shall meet and endeavour to effect a settlement.

This clause shall not be taken to interfere with any rights of either of the parties to proceed for a penalty for a breach of this Agreement.

**Clause 19.—Locality of Agreement.**

This Agreement shall apply to the whole of those areas in which the City of Perth Municipal Council and the Fremantle Gas and Coke Company, Limited, have the right to supply gas.

**Clause 20.—Basic Wage.**

The basic wage as declared by the State Arbitration Court being adopted as the standard in this Agreement, any variation of the basic wage declared by the Court will become the standard in this Agreement, and all other rates will be altered so as to preserve the margins shown in this Agreement.

**Clause 21.—Duration of Agreement.**

This Agreement shall operate from the 8th day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, to the 7th day of June, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, inclusive, and thereafter, until superseded or varied, subject to the right of either party to apply to the Court of Arbitration (State) at any time after the expiration of the first twelve months from the 8th day of June, 1939, and after the expiration of any subsequent period of twelve months to vary or amend this Agreement.

“Casual clerk” shall mean a clerk employed from day to day at a daily or weekly rate of pay.

**3.—Hours of Duty.**

The ordinary hours of duty shall be from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, with an interval of one hour for lunch, and between 9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays: Provided that the hours of the lodge-keeper and orderly shall be 44 per week, the hours worked shall not exceed 8 per day, from Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, and 4 on Saturdays.

**4.—Overtime.**

Payment for overtime, when approved by the Board, shall be on the scale and under the conditions set out in clause 3 of Agreement, dated the 23rd day of June, 1938, made between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) and the Public Service Commissioner of Western Australia.

**5.—Meal Money.**

Officers who may be required by the Board to attend after ordinary office hours to bring up arrears of work may be allowed 2s. for tea money, provided they work up to 6.30 p.m., and on Saturdays a luncheon allowance of 2s. may be paid, provided the officers work up to 1.30 p.m.; provided further, that the Board may supply a suitable meal in lieu of the allowance.

Meal money shall not be paid in addition to overtime payment.

**6.—Classification and Rates of Pay.**

(a) The salary rates contained herein shall be subject to adjustment, in accordance with the basic wage declarations made by the Court of Arbitration, in the following manner:—

(1) Adult male officers:—The nearest multiple of five pounds (£5) to the result obtained by multiplying the State weekly basic wage by fifty-two and one-sixth (52 1/6th).

Basic wage in the Metropolitan Area as at the 1st day of January, 1936, £3 10s. 6d. (deemed to be equivalent to £185 per annum for the purposes of this Agreement).

(2) Adult female officers:—Seventy-five per centum of the adult male rate, calculated to the nearest £1.

(3) Officers under 21 years of age:—*Pro rata*, with the adult male minimum of £185 per annum.

**INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.**

No. 11 of 1939.

(Registered 9/6/1939.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this 26th day of May, 1939, between the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. Branch, of the one part, and the Minister of Public Health, of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed as follows:—

**1.—Area and Scope of Agreement.**

This Agreement shall apply to all members of the staff engaged on clerical work, including telephonists of the Fremantle Hospital, with the exception of the secretary.

**2.—Definitions.**

“Officer” shall mean any clerical worker engaged on the staff of the Fremantle Hospital, male or female, covered by this Agreement.

“Board” shall mean the Board of Management of the Fremantle Hospital for the time being.

“Minister” shall mean the Minister of Public Health for the time being.

“Union” shall mean the W.A. Branch of the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers.



7.—Annual Increments.

Subject to the certification of the secretary of the Hospital as to efficiency, ability, and conduct, the progression of officers from minimum to maximum salaries shall be by yearly increments, to be approved by the Board.

Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to limit the power of the Board to pay any officer at a higher rate within his or her grade or classification than is being paid, where the Board may consider the same to be merited or warranted by the service of the officer.

8.—Higher Duties.

An officer performing the work of another officer may be granted by the Board increased remuneration on the following basis:—

(a) When acting in a position for a period of one month or longer the minimum value of which exceeds his own salary, the minimum value of such position for the whole time he is acting.

(b) When acting in a position for a period of one month or longer the minimum value of which does not exceed his own salary, at the rate of half the difference between the respective salaries for the whole time he is acting.

9.—Holidays.

(a) The days to be observed as public holidays shall be those set out in Public Service regulation 50: Provided that, if any officer is required to work on any of the holidays referred to, he shall be allowed time off on some other day, to be mutually arranged between the secretary of the Board and himself.

“Time off” shall mean the granting of a half-day off duty for all time less than a half-day worked on a public holiday, and a full day off duty for all time worked in excess of a half a day.

(b) Annual holidays:—All officers shall receive leave of absence for recreation for two (2) weeks in each calendar year: provided that officers dismissed for gross misconduct shall lose all rights to leave.

(c) Sick leave:—Sick leave shall be granted by the Board to all officers in accordance with and subject to the provisions set forth in the Public Service Regulations.

(d) Casual clerks shall be granted one day’s leave for each month of service.

10.—Long Service Leave.

Officers may be granted by the Board three months’ long service leave on full pay after seven years’ continuous service dating from the date of this Agreement. The conditions relating to such leave, when granted, shall be similar to those set out in regulation 56 and to the practice and procedure followed in the Public Service in relation thereto.

11.—Engagement.

(a) One month’s notice of termination of engagement shall be given by either side.

(b) The services of a casual clerk may be dispensed with at any time by the Board.

Provided that any officer may be summarily dismissed for gross misconduct, in which case he shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

12.—Preservation of Accrued Rights.

Nothing herein contained shall affect any rights or privileges accrued to any officer prior to this Agreement.

13.—Recognition of Unions.

All officers shall be members of the Union: provided that any officer appointed, who at the time of engagement is not a member of the Union, shall become a member of the Union within fourteen (14) days.

14.—Record Book.

A Record Book shall be kept by the Board, showing the name of each officer under the Agreement, and the nature of the work performed, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received each pay. The said record shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the Union during working hours.

15.—General.

Should any question or matter arise, apart from the specific terms of this Agreement or the interpretation of its terms, such question or matter may be considered and decided by the Board in accordance with the provisions and conditions of the Public Service Regulations as amended, where such regulations apply to such a question or matter; failing which the question or matter may be decided by the Board.

16.—Reference.

A reference shall be given to any officer of not less than three months’ service, containing all necessary information in regard to length of services and duties performed.

17.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three years from the date hereof.
