FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1), of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

Schedule.

ADMINISTRATION ACT, 1903-1934.

Regulations.

- These regulations may be cited as the Administration Act Regulations, 1939.
- The regulations are divided into Parts, as follows:—
 - Part I.—Regs. 3-16—Regulations for the purposes of Part VI. of the Act relating to Estate and Succession duties.
 - Part II.—Reg. 17—General.
 - Appendix—Forms.
- Part I.—Regulations for the purposes of Part VI. of the Act relating to Estate and Succession Duties.
- With every application for a grant of probate or letters of administration, an affidavit shall be sworn setting forth the particulars and value of the estate of the deceased person, according to the Form No. 1 in the Appendix hereto, and shall be lodged at the Probate Office, Supreme Court, Perth. A similar form shall be used for the purpose of section 66 of the Act.
- The said affidavit, after the grant has been made, shall be forthwith forwarded by the Master of the Court to the Commissioner of Stamps for the purpose of having the estate duty assessed on the estate referred to in such affidavit.
- The Commissioner may require the production of all books, papers, vouchers, and other documents in the custody or power of the person to whom the grant is made, for the purpose of vouching for the correctness of the facts stated in the affidavit and of affording the Commissioner any further information he may require relating to the estate concerned.
- On payment of the duty assessed by the Commissioner, the Commissioner shall indorse on the grant or attach to the grant a certificate in accordance with Form No. 2 in the Appendix hereto.
- The trustee or any person interested under any settlement shall within the time prescribed under section 81 of the Act, after the death of any person in respect of whose death the interest of any such person arises under the settlement, file with the Commissioner a statement in the Form No. 3 in the Appendix hereto within one calendar month of such interest arising, together with the original settlement, or a properly authenticated copy thereof, where the Commissioner is satisfied that the same cannot be produced by reason of the same having been filed or registered in some other jurisdiction, together with an additional copy of each settlement for filing.
- The statement to be filed by persons becoming beneficially entitled to any property charged with duty under section 88 of the Act, or by any trustee, guardian,

or committee in whom the property is vested, shall be in accordance with Form No. 4 in the Appendix hereto, and shall contain such other particulars as the Commissioner may require in the particular circumstances of the case.

9. The Commissioner may require the production of any books, vouchers, letters, and documents and other particulars for the purpose of vouching for the correctness of the facts stated in any statement required to be filed under the provisions of the preceding regulations Nos. 7 and 8.

10. Where any person succeeds to an annuity or life interest, such person shall disclose his age, and shall, if required by the Commissioner, verify his age by production of a certificate of birth or other satisfactory evidence.

11. The return required to be furnished by life assurance companies or societies under the provisions of section 117 of the Act shall be in accordance with Form No. 5 in the Appendix hereto.

12. The return which is required to be furnished by foreign companies under the provisions of subsection (2) of section 111 of the Act shall be in accordance with Form No. 6 in the Appendix hereto.

13. If the death of a member of any such company is not known to the company within six months after the date of the death, or within sufficient time to permit of the return required by section 111 to be furnished by the company within such period, the return shall be furnished by the company and the duty paid within thirty days after any evidence of the death has been notified to or lodged with the company, or within such further time as the Commissioner may have allowed upon application being made to him.

14. The Commissioner shall not be bound to accept any undertaking for the payment of duty, and may require the whole of the duty payable to be paid before a certificate is issued to the Master as required by subsection (2) of section 69 of the Act.

15. The Commissioner may cause to be made on any complete forms, or on any accounts or returns furnished to him for the purpose of the Act, such additions, corrections, observations, or directions as he thinks fit. Such writing shall be made in a different coloured ink from that in which the original document has been made and shall be noted by the person making it.

16. Every person guilty of a breach of this Part of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

Part II.—General.

17. (1) Whenever probate or administration has been granted, the Master may, by order under his hand, require any person to attend before him at such time and place as he may direct, for examination on oath for obtaining information to aid any executor or administrator or the Curator of Intestates' Estates in carrying out any of the objects of the Act.

(2) Any person upon whom any such order has been served who, without just cause, shall neglect to attend before the Master in accordance therewith, or shall refuse to answer any questions lawfully put to him at such examination, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

ACT, 1920.

The City of Perth.

Buildings on Endowment Lands and Linckilus Estate
(By-laws No. 43 and 44).

P.W. 228/38.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in Part VII. of the City of Perth Endowment Lands Act, 1920, and the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-38, the Lord Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth hereby order as follows:—

A. That by-law No. 43 be repealed.

B. That by-law No. 44 be amended by the deletion of clauses 28 to 50, both inclusive, and that clause 51 be renumbered as clause 28.

C. That a new by-law, to be numbered 43, be made as follows:—

By-law No. 43.

Interpretation.

1. (a) "Building" includes detached garages, sheds, wash-houses, and sanitary conveniences.

(b) "Building surveyor" means the building surveyor or acting building surveyor for the time being of the City of Perth.

(c) "Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Perth.

(d) "Reserve" shall mean the Endowment Lands and the Linckilus Estate as described in the Preamble to the City of Perth Endowment Lands Act, 1920.

Classification of Districts.

2. The following portions of the reserve are classified as residential districts, namely:—

(a) The land bounded on the south-west by Challenger drive, on the north-west and north by The Boulevard, on the east by Templetonia crescent, and on the south by a line following Kingsland avenue from Templetonia crescent west to Boronia crescent, thereafter following the southern boundaries of the building lots fronting Kingsland avenue to Hesperia avenue, and thereafter following Hesperia avenue to Challenger drive.

(b) The lands known as Floreat Park Estate No. 1, Floreat Park Estate No. 2, Floreat Park Estate No. 3, Floreat Park Estate No. 4, Floreat Park Estate No. 5, and Floreat Park Estate No. 6, as shown on the plans in the office of the City of Perth.

3. The following portions of the reserve are classified as business districts, namely:—

(a) The land bounded by Ocean drive, Challenger drive, and a continuation west of Lowanna way.

(b) The land bounded by Ocean drive, The Boulevard, and a continuation west of Dampier avenue.

Residential Districts—General Regulations.

4. The provisions of this clause shall apply to all land classified as a residential district under this by-law:—

- (1) No building shall be erected other than a dwelling-house, garage and other usual outbuildings appurtenant to a dwelling-house.
- (2) No semi-detached building, residential flat building, or terrace of buildings shall be erected.
- (3) No more than one dwelling-house with the usual outbuildings shall be erected on any one lot.
- (4) No fence, wall, or hedge on or near a street alignment shall be of a greater height than 4 feet above the street level.
- (5) No subdivision of a lot or of an area comprising less than three adjacent lots shall be effected. Subject to the permission of the Town Planning Board, an area comprising

three or more adjacent lots may, with the consent in writing of the Council, be subdivided: provided that in no case shall a lot be formed having less than 60 feet frontage and 132 feet depth.

- (6) Every dwelling-house shall front the street adjoining the land on which it is erected: provided that if such land shall adjoin two or more streets, such house shall front the street which shall in each particular case be specified by the Council.
- (7) All dwelling-houses, other than detached garages and outbuildings, shall be constructed of brick, stone, concrete, or similar material.
- (8) All buildings shall be roofed with tiles, slates, or shingles composed of terra cotta, slate, cement, concrete, asbestos, or other incombustible material approved by the Council.
Provided that the Council may permit flat roofs, or roofs with a pitch of less than 30 degrees, to be constructed of reinforced concrete, glass, or corrugated asbestos, if such roofs are surrounded on all sides with a parapet to the satisfaction of the building surveyor.
- (9) No building shall be erected, except in a position approved by the building surveyor.
- (10) No part of any building shall be erected nearer a street than the building line prescribed in respect of the lot on which such building is erected: provided that the Council may waive compliance with this clause in any case where strict compliance is not practicable.
- (11) All buildings, fences, and other erections shall be wholly completed, in accordance with the approved plans and specifications, within twelve months of the granting of such approval; in default of which the Council may withdraw such approval, and it shall be as if such approval had never been granted.
- (12) Every dwelling-house shall be connected to a deep sewerage system, or shall be provided with a septic tank appurtenant to that house alone.
No plans for a dwelling-house shall be approved by the Council, unless such plans show that this clause will be complied with.
- (13) No advertisement, hoarding, sign, signboard, placard, notice or illuminated sign shall be erected or attached to any building, wall, fence, tree, or post, and no person shall permit any such erection or attachment on land under his control: provided that this clause shall not apply to "For Sale" or "To Let" notices.
- (14) No person shall write, stencil, or paint any notice or advertisement on any building, wall, fence, tree, or post, and no person shall cause to be done any of the acts hereby prohibited, and no person shall permit to be done any of such acts upon land under his control.

Residential Districts—Special Regulations.

5. The provisions of this clause shall apply to the Residential District specified in clause 2 (a) of this by-law:—

- (1) No dwelling-house shall be erected which with the buildings appurtenant thereto shall cost less than £800.
- (2) The plans and specifications for a dwelling-house shall not be approved by the Council, if they are identical with or nearly similar to the plans and specifications for a dwelling-house already approved for erection on an adjoining lot, if such last-mentioned approval is still effective.
- (3) A building line is prescribed at a distance of 25 feet from the street boundary of every lot measured at right angles from such boundary.

6. The provisions of this clause shall apply to the residential districts specified in clause 2 (b) of this by-law:—

- (1) A building line is prescribed at a distance of 30 feet from the street boundary of every lot, measured at right angles from such boundary.

Business Districts.

7. The provisions of this clause shall apply to the business districts specified in clause 3 of this by-law:—

- (1) Not more than two shops and not more than one residence, in addition to such shop or shops, shall be erected on any one lot.
- (2) Every shop and residence shall be connected to a deep sewerage system, or shall be provided with a septic tank appurtenant to the buildings on that lot alone.

(as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 11th day of September, 1936) to the regulations made and now in force under and for the purposes of the said Act, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Appendix IV., as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 11th day of September, 1936, to the regulations under the Education Act, 1928, is amended as follows:—

1. The whole of paragraph 6 is deleted and in lieu thereof a new paragraph is inserted in the said Appendix as follows:—

6. (a) One exhibition will be awarded to the candidate who obtains the highest marks in English and either History or Geography; one to the candidate who obtains the highest marks in any two languages other than English; one to the candidate who obtains the highest marks in Maths "A" and "B," and either Applied Mathematics or Physics; and one to the candidate who obtains the highest marks in any two of the following:—Biology, Geology, Chemistry, Physics, Agricultural Science: provided that, if the Minister considers that no candidate of sufficient merit has presented himself or herself in any of the above groups, the exhibition in question shall be awarded on the same conditions as the remaining six. In awarding the above exhibitions the aggregate gained for the best five subjects, including English, will be taken into consideration. For the purpose of this regulation Music and Drawing will not be considered as satisfactory subjects. Exhibitors shall take one of their special subjects as a major in the University course, unless the Department, on application from the exhibitor, decides otherwise.

(b) The remaining six exhibitions shall be awarded to the six candidates who, after the exclusion of any who have been successful in gaining exhibitions under section (a) have obtained the highest aggregate in any of the five subjects, of which English must be one, in which they have passed the examination. If Mathematics "A," Mathematics "B," and Applied Mathematics are taken, candidates will be allowed to count only the two best marks in these three subjects.

(c) The Minister reserves to himself the right to withhold all or any of the above exhibitions in the event of candidates not showing sufficient merit.

2. Paragraph 7 is amended by inserting therein after the word "examination," in line 3 of the said paragraph, the words "and shall submit a certificate that it is the first occasion on which he or she has sat for the Leaving Certificate."

3. The whole of paragraph 8 is deleted and in lieu thereof a new paragraph is inserted in the said Appendix as follows:—

8. An additional exhibition will be awarded annually to a candidate who has specially entered for it and who is prepared to take the course prescribed for the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Agriculture. The exhibition will be of the same value as the others, and will be tenable on the same conditions during three years of attendance at classes. Candidates for this exhibition must have passed the Leaving Certificate. The exhibition will be awarded on the aggregate marks gained in English, Mathematics "A," Mathematics "B," Agricultural Science, and one other Science. The exhibition will not necessarily be given to the candidate obtaining the highest marks. The candidate's personality and aptitude for an agricultural career may also be taken into consideration.

4. Paragraph 9 is amended as follows:—

(a) By deleting therefrom subparagraph (b) and inserting in lieu thereof a new subparagraph (b) as follows:—

(b) Candidates for these exhibitions must have passed the Leaving Certificate. The exhibition will be awarded on the aggregate marks gained in English, Mathematics "A," Mathematics "B," and any two of the following sciences, namely, Agricultural Science, Biology, Chemistry, Geology and Physics.

(b) By adding to the paragraph at the end thereof a new subparagraph, to stand as subparagraph (d), as follows:—

(d) Before these exhibitions are finally awarded the candidates securing the best results must satisfy a Board approved by the Minister for Education as to their fitness for the teaching profession and must also obtain on the prescribed forms satisfactory medical certificates.
