Melville Road Board.

By-laws Regulating use of Roads by Animals.

P.W. 658/36.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1938, the Board of any road district is empowered to make by-laws for all or any of the purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Melville Road Board, in pursuance of the

powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. No person shall drive any herd of cattle or flock of sheep on any road within the Board's district between the hours of 8 a.m. and 8 p.m., without first obtaining the permission in writing of the Secretary of the Board.

2. No person shall drive, ride, or lead any animal into or along any road within the Board's district unless the public safety is preserved by the observance of the following conditions:—

- (a) All cattle (except bulls) shall be secured and held by bridle-halter and headstall rope, reins, or other means most suited to keep each animal properly secured and under human control;
- (b) All bulls shall be held and secured by bridle-halter or ring and pole.

3. Any person not complying with or offending against any of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Bridgetown Road Board.

Building By-laws.

P.W. 719/38.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1938, the Road Board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, Bridgetown Road Board, in pursuance of the power vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws, and doth order that such by-laws shall apply to the Townsite of Bridgetown.

1. No person shall erect any building or alter or add to an existing building, or shall permit any person to erect any building or alter or add to an existing building, on land of which he is the owner or of which he has the control, except such building, alteration, or addition is erected in conformity with these by-laws.

2. No person shall build any structure intended to be used for human habitation or occupation, or capable of being used as such, or shall alter or add to any such existing structure without having obtained a Building License from the Board and paying the fees prescribed herein, namely:—

- (a) The fee for Building License.
- (b) The fee for the use of the portion of the street abutting on the building during building operations and deposit as security for the reinstatement and repair of such portion of such street.
- (c) The charge of the local health authority for providing the necessary pans and lids for the privy.

3. Before such Building License is issued plans and specifications, in the form prescribed herein, shall be submitted to the surveyor, and a license will not be granted before seven days after the submission of such plans and specifications, unless in special circumstances, of which special circumstances the surveyor shall be the sole judge.

4. Plans shall be in ink, drawn to scale $\frac{1}{8}$ th inch to foot, on tracing linen or on paper sufficiently strong to stand the erasure of "H" pencil marks without injury to the paper, and specifications shall be in typewriting or in ink manuscript clearly written and on strong paper.

5. Plans shall clearly show ground plans, elevations, and sections as are sufficient to make plain the construction and the dimensions of the proposed structure. The size of the rooms and thickness of walls shall be written on in figures.

Specifications shall show clearly, both as to materials and size of same, the construction of the foundations, floors, internal and external walls, ceiling, and roof; also

the ventilation of the structure, the number of privies and the construction of same, and shall provide for at least one privy of the prescribed construction, provided with the pan supplied by the local health authority.

The ground floor level of any building to be erected abutting on any footpath shall not be less than ten inches above the level of the kerbing of the footpath upon which the building abuts, nor greater than ten inches above such kerbing, unless provision is made in the plan and specifications for safe ingress and egress at all doorways by means of either a suitable ramp or steps.

A block plan, signed by the builder or owner, shall be supplied, showing clearly the position of the intended structure on the block of land on which it is to be erected, and the position of the privy. Such plan will be retained by the Board.

6. If the plans and specifications submitted are in accordance with these by-laws and the prescribed fees are paid, the surveyor shall sign them on behalf of the Board, and issue a Building License in the form prescribed herein and for the period set forth in such license; but if the plans and specifications contain any matter which in the opinion of the surveyor is contrary to the principles of sound or sanitary construction, and such matter is not covered by these by-laws, the surveyor shall refer such matter to the Board at its next meeting, and the Board shall have power to decide any matter referred to in clauses A to K of section 37 of the Building Regulations, when such matter is not defined in these by-laws, and a Building License will not be granted until the Board decides on such matter; provided that such decision will not be unreasonably delayed.

7. No external wall shall be erected on the building line of any street or nearer than eight feet to such building line, unless constructed of brick, stone, or concrete. Where any building is to be used wholly or in part as a shop or warehouse, the surveyor may authorise on behalf of the Board the external walls of such building to be constructed of wood or iron, with wooden framing, except the walls referred to before in this clause, but if any such building is to be erected nearer than six feet to an existing building, the external wall facing such existing building shall be constructed of brick, stone, or concrete.

8. No building shall be erected nearer than six feet to the boundary of the block of land on which it stands, unless such boundary is a street or lane, or unless the external walls facing such boundary are constructed of brick, stone, or concrete, and the surveyor may authorise on behalf of the Board the construction of any dwelling whereof the external walls are constructed of wood or of iron with wood framing, except any walls coming within the distance of ten feet referred to before in this clause.

9. On behalf of the Board the surveyor may authorise the internal linings, partitions, and ceiling of any dwelling, if such building is not nearer than ten feet to any boundary of the block of land on which it stands, to be constructed wholly or partly of inflammable material.

Such authority shall hold good for not more than twelve months after the date fixed for the expiration of the Building License, but may be extended by the Board from time to time on the application of the then owner. If no such extension of time is granted such inflammable material shall then have become erected contrary to the provisions of section 14 of the Building Regulation within the meaning of the said section, and the Board may at any time proceed in the manner set forth in the said section 14.

10. No brick, stone, or concrete wall shall be erected nearer than three feet to the boundary of the block of land on which it stands, unless it is a parapet wall rising to a height of not less than one foot above the roof gutter, and the Board will not approve of the subdivision of land which would have the effect of leaving an existing wall in conflict with this provision.

11. No structure of any kind shall be erected upon, over, or under any street, footpath, or public way unless the plans and specifications have been first submitted to and approved by the Board, and no verandah or signboard will be allowed over any footpath unless a clear way of not less than eight feet above such footpath is provided.

12. No verandah or awning shall be erected over any public road or footpath, except in accordance with a plan submitted and approved by the Board, who may require such verandah or awning to be of the cantilever type of an approved design.

Any such street verandah, gutter, and downpipe shall at all times be kept in repair by the owner of the building in front of which it is built, to the satisfaction of the Board, and the owner shall carry out any repairs in such manner as may be ordered by the Board.

13. No privy shall be erected nearer than six feet to the block of land adjoining that on which it stands. Where a right-of-way adjoins such block, unless otherwise in special circumstances approved by the Board, the privy shall be erected so that the service door is three feet from such right-of-way, screened from observation therefrom, and accessible by means of an opening or gateway at one end of such screen.

14. Before the construction of any building is commenced a privy shall be provided on the land for the use of the workmen.

15. No plan of any new building or part of a building intended to be used as a shop shall be approved by the Board, unless each such shop designed or intended to be let as a separate tenement has at least a width of twelve feet internal measurement of frontage to a street, and no alteration of any existing building shall be approved, unless the provisions of this by-law are complied with.

16. Application for a Building License shall be made in the form of Schedule A hereto annexed.

17. A Building License shall be in the form of Schedule B hereto annexed.

Tents—Canvas Buildings.

18. The Board may grant, subject to conditions, or refuse permission to erect a structure of calico, canvas, or other textile material, and, if any such structure is erected without the Board's permission, may order its demolition.

Timber Construction.

19. All timbers used in any buildings shall be of good sound material, free from rot, free from large and loose knots, and free from shakes and free from any imperfections, whereby the strength of the timber may be impaired. The following conditions shall apply as to spacings and scantlings of timber:—

- (a) Stumps shall not be less than four inches by four inches jarrah or other approved timber, spaced five feet centre to centre. Stumps shall be tarred and sunk at least eighteen inches in the ground. Tarring is to extend for six inches above the ground surface.
- (b) Studs and ceilings joists shall not be less than three inches by two inches, spaced not more than two feet apart, centre to centre, properly secured and braced. Where studs of three inches by two inches are used, the angle of the corner studs shall be of three inches by three inches. Where four inches by two inches studs are used, the angle studs shall be four inches by four inches.
- (c) Rafters shall not be less than three inches by two inches, spaced not more than three feet, centre to centre, in the case of iron roofs, and eighteen inches, centre to centre, in the case of slate, tile or other similar roofs; four-inch by two-inch rafters may be used, but must be spaced at two feet centres for slates or tiles, and not more than three feet apart for any type of roof. All rafters must be securely braced with purlins and collar ties.
- (d) Floor joists shall not be less than four inches by two inches, spaced twenty inches apart, centre to centre.
- (e) Floor bearers shall not be less than four inches by three inches, spaced not more than five feet apart. In addition to the bearers required for this spacing, an addition bearer of four inches by three inches must be placed under each wall or partition.
- (f) Top and bottom plates shall not be less than three inches by two inches.

Motor Garages.

20. Motor garages not exceeding three hundred square feet in floor area may be built in iron, brick, stone or concrete, or timber anywhere in the district, provided that the Board may require—

- (a) that any such motor garage be 50 feet distant from the frontage of any road or street (except in special cases, where the physical configuration of the ground precludes such distance being observed);
- (b) that any such motor garage be five feet distance from the frontage of any other road or street;
- (c) that any such motor garage be 10 feet distant from any building used as a dwelling-house on the same allotment or on any allotment adjoining;
- (d) that the motor garage complies otherwise with all the conditions and limitations of this by-law in regard to buildings.

Damp Course.

21. Every wall or fireplace of brick, stone, or similar material shall have a damp-proof course or courses of asphalt, distilled tar and hot sand, or other approved impervious material, at least six inches above the surface of the ground below the lowest floor, and, in cases where it is not desirable to place the same throughout the building at the one uniform level, then the said damp-proof course must be laid in horizontal layers connected at the end by a vertical course of the same materials, and shall be not less than 1/2 in. thick.

Hollow Walls.

22. External walls may be constructed as hollow walls, if constructed in accordance with the following rules:—

- (a) The inner and outer parts of the wall shall be separated by a cavity which shall throughout be of a width not exceeding two inches or less than one inch.
- (b) The inner and outer parts of the wall shall be securely tied together with suitable bonding ties of adequate strength, formed of galvanised iron, glazed stoneware, or other approved material. Such ties shall be placed at distances apart not exceeding three feet horizontally, and at least every fifth course vertically.
- (c) The thickness of each part of the wall shall throughout be not less than four and a half inches.
- (d) The aggregate thickness of the two parts, excluding the width of the cavity, shall throughout be not less than the minimum thickness prescribed for solid walls of the same height and length.
- (e) No hollow wall of not more than eleven inches in thickness shall be greater in superficial extent than three squares in any one storey, unless strengthened by a partition wall, fireplace, or projecting pier to the satisfaction of the surveyor.

Road and Specified Direction.

Abel street, Boyup Brook:—

- (a) North avenue, being the separate macadamised or gravel roadway on the northern portion:—
 - (a) From west to east.
- (b) South avenue, being the separate macadamised or gravel roadway on the southern portion:—
 - (b) From east to west.

Bridge street, Boyup Brook:—

- (a) East avenue, being the separate macadamised or gravel roadway on the eastern portion:—
 - (a) From north to south.
- (b) West avenue, being the separate macadamised or gravel roadway on the western portion:—
 - (b) From south to north.

3. No person, when riding or driving any animal, or when driving any vehicle along the separate macadamised or gravel roadways referred to in paragraph (2) hereof, shall pass from either or any of such roadways to the other, except by way of the macadamised or gravel ways connecting such roadways.
