Bulk Handling Act, 1935.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 20 of the Bulk Handling Act, 1935, that the terms and conditions on which all wheat shall be delivered to and handled by the Company shall be in accordance with the Second Schedule to the said Act but that the Governor may by Order in Council published in the Gazette vary from time to time all or any of such terms and conditions: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 13th day of November, 1936, Condition No. 6 prescribed in the Second Schedule to the said Act was varied so that the said Condition No. 6 thereafter read as shown in the Second Schedule to the said Act as reprinted in the Appendix to the Sessional Volume of the Statutes for the year 1936: And whereas by an Order in Conneil published in the Government Gazette on the 18th day of August, 1939, the said Condition No. 6 was further varied in the manner shown in the Schedule to the said Order in Conneil: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient further to vary the said Condition No. 6 in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred upon him by the said Act, doth hereby further vary and amend Condition No. 6 as contained in the Second Schedule to the Bulk Handling Act, 1935, as reprinted in the Appendix to the Sessional Volume of the Statutes for the year 1936 and as thereafter varied and amended by the Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 18th day of Angust, 1939, as aforesaid in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, and doth hereby declare that this Order in Council shall have effect as from the date of the publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

Condition No. 6 in the Second Schedule to the Bulk Handling Act, 1935, as reprinted in the Appendix to the Sessional Volume of the Statutes for the year 1936 and as varied and amended by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 18th day of August 1939, is further varied and amended as follows:—

(a) by deleting subparagraph (b) of paragraph (1) and inserting in its place a

(a) by determine subparagraph (b), as follows:—

(b) In the event of delivery not being so taken, the company shall be relieved of its obligation to deliver wheat under the warrant, and may at any time and from time to time thereafter sell wheat either in one quantity or in several quantities up to an aggregate quantity equivalent to the quantity covered by the warrant, and either separately or together, with any other wheat by whichever of the following methods seems in the opinion of the company most likely to yield the best price to the grower:-

(i) by public tender advertised in the public press; (ii) at market price as defined by section sixteen of the Act; or

(iii) at the best price the company can obtain overseas; and if the company decides to sell the wheat overseas, it may make any shipping arrangements which it considers necessary or advisable.

(b) by deleting from subparagraph (c) of paragraph (1) the words "one tenth of a penny" where they appear in lines four and five of the said subparagraph (c) and inserting in lieu thereof the words "one half penny."

(c) by adding to subparagraph (d) of paragraph (1) a proviso as follows:—
Provided that the company may delay accounting for the proceeds of the sale
or sales of wheat represented by any warrants not surrendered in return for wheat before the thirtieth day of September in any year until all the wheat in store after the thirtieth day of September aforesaid and liable to be sold by the company has been sold, and in such case the following provisions shall apply:—

(i) The proceeds of all sales as and when received shall be placed in a trust

fund or money pool;

(ii) When all the wheat liable to be sold has been sold and all proceeds have been received and placed in the trust fund or money pool aforesaid, the company may deduct from the amount in such trust fund or money pool all expenses and charges common to or in respect of the wheat sold, and shall credit to each individual holder of a warrant or warrants representing part of the wheat sold a proportion of the remainder of the money in the said trust fund or money pool equal to the proportion which the part of the wheat sold represented by the warrant or warrants bears to the whole of the wheat sold; and

(iii) From the individual proportions so credited there shall be deducted railage and also any dockage mentioned in the warrant, and the balance then remaining shall be held by the company on account of the holder of the warrant against surrender thereof to the company, subject, however, to the rights and claims of encumbrancers and of the holders of any other claims or interest in the wheat and of persons entitled to the proceeds

of the sale of the wheat.

Caging of Birds and/or Animals consigned or offered for Sale.

- 43. (1) Any person consigning or offering for sale any native game or imported game shall comply with the following conditions:—
 - (A) Birds (other than emus and similar large birds):-
 - (i) Birds offered for sale in cages shall be housed in cages of box-type totally enclosed at top, sides, and bottom, the front of which shall be of wire.
 - (ii) Birds consigned for sale shall be in cages of box-type.
 - (iii) Proper ventilation shall be provided in all cages.
 - (iv) Perches in cages shall not be placed immediately above one another, and shall be so arranged that droppings will not fall on birds when perched.
 - (v) Roosting perches, with a clearance of at least two inches from the roof, shall be provided in all cages. In addition, one or two perches shall also be provided for use as steps in moving up or down. In the case of cages containing only one bird one perch shall be considered sufficient.
 - (vi) All perches in a cage shall be constructed of wood, and shall be round in shape and of a size suitable for the bird or birds housed in such cage.
 - (vii) Sufficient space shall be provided in all cages to enable birds contained therein to roost comfortably without overcrowding, as follows:—

Budgerigars and birds of similar size 40 ,, Rosellas and birds of similar size 120 ,, King parrots and birds of similar size 150 ,, Galahs and birds of similar size 200 ,, Sulphur-crested cockatoos and birds of similar size 800 ,,

(b) When caged for sale the space which shall be allowed on the perches for each bird shall be as set out hereunder:—

(viii) Sufficient drinking vessels and food receptacles shall be placed in the front of all cages and in such a position that no perches are immediately above them,

(B) Animals and emus:-

Such animals as kangaroos, wallabies and the like, and large birds such as emus being consigned or offered for sale in cages shall be allowed sufficient room to enable them to turn completely around and to stand erect at full height in the cage and to obtain free movement therein.

(2) Any person who in any respect contravenes this regulation shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

Sale of Immature Game.

- 44. (1) No person shall sell, or consign, offer, or expose for sale any young native game or imported game not fully fledged, or not able to stand, or not able to feed unaided.
- (2) Any person who in any respect contravenes this regulation shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

BULK HANDLING ACT, 1935.

The regulations made under the Bulk Handling Act, 1935, and published in the Government Gazette on the 13th day of November, 1936, are amended by inserting therein after regulation 5 a new regulation, as follows:-

Deliveries of Wheat to Company.

5A. If, in the opinion of the Company the delivery of any loose wheat (not in bags) according to the order in which it is offered will by reason of the method and time taken for the delivery thereof by the grower to the elevator unduly delay the delivery of other wheat then and there ready for delivery to the elevator, the Company may arrange the delivery of the wheat to the elevator in such order as it may think necessary or expedient to avoid such undue delay.

THE DAIRY INDUSTRY ACT, 1922-1936.

A new regulation, to stand as regulation 32B, is inserted after regulation 32A, as follows:-

Grading of Butter.

32B. (1) One box of butter from each churn of butter manufactured in premises owned or occupied by licensed manufacturers (other than licensed manufacturers who manufacture butter only from the milk produced from their own cows) shall, for the purposes of grading by an inspector, be submitted within a reasonable time, and not later than seven days after the manufacture thereof, by the manufacturer to such premises at such place as shall be specified by the Superintendent of Dairying in relation to such manufacturer.

(2) Such box submitted for grading shall be marked and branded in accordance

- with regulations 34, 38, and 40.

 (3) Notice of the date when the butter will be submitted for grading shall be given by the manufacturer of such butter to the Dairy Products Marketing Board, the Superintendent of Dairying, and the owner or occupier of the premises at which the grading is to take place not later than the time of arrival of the butter at such premises, and such notice shall be in writing and may be in accordance with Form No. 33 in the First Schedule to the Dairy Products Marketing Regulation Act Regulations.
- (4) The grading shall be performed not earlier than four (4) days after the date of manufacture

(5) All butter submitted for grading under the provisions of this regulation shall be graded for quality in accordance with the provisions of regulation 39 by an in-

spector appointed under the Act.

Provided that, whenever practicable, any grading performed by an inspector under this regulation shall be performed in the presence of an inspector appointed by the Dairy Products Marketing Board under the provisions of the Dairy Products

Marketing Regulation Act, 1934-1937.

(6) The grading officer shall, in respect of butter submitted for grading to him, forward to the Dairy Products Marketing Board and the manufacturer respectively a copy of the grade certificate forthwith after the grading has been performed.

(7) (a) The Department of Agriculture shall pay to the manufacturer of the butter by way of reimbursement for expenses incurred in the submission of butter

- for grading under this regulation, an amount assessed in accordance with a scale or rate to be fixed by the Minister from time to time.
- (b) If, in accordance with regulations made under the Dairy Products Marketing Regulation Act, 1934-1937, the Dairy Products Marketing Board by an arrangement with the Department of Agriculture agrees to reimburse the Department moneys paid or payable by the Department under this regulation, the said Board may on behalf of the Department pay direct to the manufacturer the amount payable to him by the Department.

(8) Any person failing to observe or comply with the requirements of this regulation shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding twenty

pounds.

Provided always, that the minimum rate to be paid to any clerk (male and female) and to any male typist upon the attainment of the age of twenty-one years shall be the sum of Two hundred and twenty pounds per amum, and the minimum to be paid to any female typiste upon the attainment of the age of twenty-one years shall be the sum of One hundred and forty-five pounds per annum: Provided further, that in the case of

6.—Privileges.
