FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934. NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

The plans, specifications, and an estimate of the cost of such works, and a statement showing the proposed expenditure of the money to be borrowed, are open for inspection of ratepayers at the Office of the Board for one month after the last publication of this notice. The hours during which such inspection may be made are 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on week days and 10 a.m. to noon on Saturdays.

The works and undertakings for which the Loan is proposed to be raised will in the opinion of the Board be of special benefit to a portion of the Nedlands Road District, namely, the South Ward as defined in the Government Gazette of the 21st December, 1923, pages 2427-8, and any Loan rate applicable to such Loan will be levied only on the rateable land within the said South Ward of the said district.

FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT, 1920-1937.

Department of Labour.
Office of Chief Inspector of Factories,
Perth, 3rd October, 1939.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenaut-Governor in Council, acting in exercise of the power conferred by section 158 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938, has been pleased to repeal and revoke all the regulations heretofore made and in force under and for the purposes of the said Act, with the exception of the Spray Painting Regulations, 1928, as published in the Government Gazette on the 21st day of December, 1928; the Electric Accumulator Regulations, 1931, as published in the Government Gazette on the 6th day of November, 1931, and the Factories (Poisonous Substances) Regulations, 1932, as published in the Government Gazette on the 28th day of October, 1932, and in lieu thereof to make the new regulations under and for the purposes of the said Act as set out in the Schedule herennder.

 - 2. These regulations are divided into Parts, as follow: -

Part VII.—Regulation 40-49—Closing of Shops.

Part VIII.—Regulation 50-51—Provisions relating to Employment of Assistants in Shops.

Part X.—Regulation 54—Miscellaneous.

Part I.—Preliminary.

In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears, the term "the Act" means the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938, and any Acts amending the same, and terms which are defined in the Act when used in these regulations shall have the same meanings as those given to such terms by the Act.

Part II .- Appointment of Inspectors.

- 4. Every applicant for the position of inspector of factories shall produce satisfactory evidence of character and reliability and shall have passed an examination to the satisfaction of the examiner appointed by the Minister, showing that he or she possesses the following qualifications, namely.-
 - (a) a fair standard of general education, including a sound knowledge of the rules of arithmetic up to and including square root and decimal fractions;
 - (b) a sound knowledge of the Act and these regulations and of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, and any amendment thereto and the regulations thereunder;

 - (c) a sound knowledge of the subject matter of the following text books—
 1. Hope, Hanna and Stallybrass "Industrial Hygiene and Medicine," 1923 edition (excluding pages 278 to 463 and 520-552, inclusive).
 2. Randerson "Australian Sanitary Engineering Practice," 1935 edition (excluding chapters 12, 13 and 14).

Part III.—Registration of Factories.

- 5. An application for registration of any building, premises, or place as a factory shall be lodged with the Chief Inspector in the Form 1 in the Appendix A to these regulations.
- 6. If and whenever the Chief Inspector, pursuant to paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section 20 of the Act, forbids the use of any premises registered as a factory for the purpose for which they are used, or intended to be used, he shall serve a notice on the occupier of the said premises in the Form 2 in the Appendix A to these regulations.
- 7. Every requisition of an inspector pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section 20 of the Act to an applicant for registration of premises as a factory shall be made in the Form 3 in the Appendix A to these regulations.
- 8. A notice of appeal against the requisition of an inspector pursuant to paragraph (4) of section 21 of the Act shall be in the Form 4 in the Appendix A to these regulations, and shall be served on the clerk of the local court nearest to the place where the factory, shop, or warehouse is situated, and on the inspector, within 14 days after service of such requisition.
- 9. Upon receipt of such notice the clerk of the said court shall fix a date for the hearing of the appeal, and set the case down for hearing on such date, and shall cause a notice of the day of hearing to be sent to the parties in the Form 5 in the Appendix A to these regulations.
- 10. A notice pursuant to section 22 of the Act given by the Minister to the owner of premises registered as a factory which require any structural alterations or building additions that he will regard such owner for the purpose of making such alterations or additions as the occupier thereof, shall be in the Form 6 in the Appendix A to these regulations.
- The Chief Inspector shall keep a register of factories in the Form 7 in the Appendix A to these regulations, wherein he shall cause to be entered particulars of every registration effected by him.
- 12. The occupier of every factory registered under the Act shall, on or before the 31st day of January in each year, send to the Chief Inspector, together with the prescribed fee an application for re-registration of such factory, in the Form 8 in the Appendix A to these regulations.

Part IV .- Regulation of Factories and Factory Work.

13. The record of the employees of a factory required to be kept pursuant to paragraph (a) of section 27 of the Act shall be kept in the Form 9 in the Appendix A to these regulations, or in such other form as the Chief Inspector may approve of in writing.

Such record shall be kept at the factory and shall be entered up daily.

- 14. A notice by the occupier of a factory pursuant to paragraphs (a) and (c) of section 37 of the Act of having availed himself of the provisions of sections 33, 35, or 36 of the Act, and specifying the names of the workers to whom the extension of the working hours applied, and the period of such extension, shall be sent to the Chief Inspector within twenty-four hours after the commencement of the extra working, in the Form 10 in the Appendix A to these regulations.
- 15. The industries specified in Appendix B to these regulations shall be special industries for the purposes of section 36 of the Act.
- 16. The record required by section 42 of the Act to be kept by the occupier of a factory who lets out or gives out work of any description in connection with textile or shoddy material to be done by any person elsewhere than in a factory, shall be kept in the Form 11 in the Appendix A to these regulations.
- 17. Application for registration as an outside worker pursuant to section 44 of the Act shall be lodged with the Chief Inspector in the Form 12 in the Appendix A to these regulations.

Part V.—Provisions Relating to Health, Sanitation, and Safety.

Cubic Reserved Space. (Sections 61 (b) and 133 (e)).

18. Every factory, shop, or warehouse, and every portion thereof, shall contain such cubic reserved space as shall be determined by the Chief Inspector: Provided always, that such reserved space shall not be less than 350 cubic feet for each person

employed therein (exclusive of the space occupied by goods, cases, furniture, and fittings). When gas is used as an illuminant, 350 cubic feet of air space shall be deducted for each light.

In the calculation of cubic space the maximum height taken shall be 14 feet.

Ventilation.

(a) If a system of mechanical ventilation approved by the inspector is not installed and properly utilised, each workroom shall be provided with means of ventilainstalled and properly utilised, each workroom shall be provided with means of ventila-tion by openings other than windows or doors, for the inlet and outlet of air, in the proportion (except where otherwise expressly provided) of not less than 12 square inches of inlet openings and 12 square inches of outlet openings for each person employed in such workroom, such space to be calculated exclusive of all bars, ornamenta-tion, or other obstruction thereto. Such inlet openings shall be provided at the height of about 7 feet from the floor level by tubes, shafts, or hoppers in the external walls, external doors, or external windows, and shall be kept permanently open; and such out-let openings shall be provided either in the walls of such room by externally shielded external doors, or external windows, and shall be kept permanently open; and such outlet openings shall be provided, either in the walls of such room by externally-shielded openings as close to the ceiling thereof as may be practicable, or else in the ceiling; and in the latter case, there shall be connected with each such opening an open tube or shaft having a transverse area equal to that required, and leading through and above the roof of the building, and having its upper end terminating in a cowl or other similar contributes. contrivance.

(b) The provisions of this regulation shall not, unless considered necessary by the inspector, apply to a work-room in which there is a fireplace with chimney and a window

made to open, and in which not more than four persons are employed.

Proper means for outlet ventilation shall be provided for all stairwells.

Heating Appliances.

20. (a) Means and appliances for efficiently warming the factory shall be provided, when such means and appliances are considered necessary by the inspector.

(b) The provisions of paragraph (a) of this regulation shall, if required in writing by the Chief Inspector of Factories, be complied with in the case of any building registered at any time as a factory.

21. Except in the case of an electric heater, every heating appliance in every workroom, whether used for the warming of such room or in connection with the work carried on therein, shall be provided with a flue at least four inches in diameter, and extending to the outer air to a point at least eight feet above the appliance.

Lavatories (Section 75).

22. In every factory, shop, or warehouse there shall be provided proper lavatory accommodation to the satisfaction of the inspector. Such accommodation shall consist of wash basins, with sufficient water supply, and fitted with trapped waste pipe or pipes connected with a drain. The basins shall not be fewer in number than one to twenty persons employed, and shall be situated under cover and be convenient of access.

In factories, shops or warehouses in which the majority of those employed or engaged are to be of one sex and not more than two are to be of the other sex, separate and distinct closet accommodation for the persons of different sexes shall not be required if in the opinion of the Chief Inspector the same is suitably provided in

adjoining or adjacent premises.

23. (a) In every factory, shop or warehouse which is connected with any system of sewerage there shall be provided sanitary conveniences for the use of the persons employed or engaged, in accordance with the following scale and conditions:—

Water Closets.	Proportion of Pans to Female Employees.	Proportion of Pans to Male Employees.
When the number of employees does not exceed	One to twenty.	One to twenty-five.
When such number exceeds 100 but does not exceed	One to twenty-five.	One to thirty.
200 When such number exceeds 200	One to twenty-five.	One to forty.

(b) Closets for different sexes shall not adjoin each other, unless separated by a wall of brick, stone, or concrete of approved thickness.

(c) The door of every external closet shall be properly screened at least 6 feet high, and reaching to the ground, and, if required, a screen shall be fixed to prevent the closet being visible from overlooking windows.

(d) Any closet for the use of females shall have a separate entrance behind such

screen, and such entrance shall not be within 12 feet from the entrance of any closet intended for the use of males.

(e) In every factory, shop, or warehouse in which more than twelve males are employed, urinal accommodation shall be provided in the proportion of one stall to each 30 employees.

(a) In every factory, shop or warehouse which is not connected with an approved system of sewerage, there shall be provided sauitary conveniences for the use of the persons employed or engaged, in accordance with the following scale and conditions:

Earth or Pan Closets.	Proportion of Pans to Female Employees.	Proportion of Pans to Male Employees.
When the number of employees does not exceed	One to ten.	One to fifteen.
Where such number exceeds 100 but does not exceed	One to fifteen.	One to twenty.
Where such number exceeds 200	One to fifteen.	One to thirty.

- (b) In every factory, shop, or warehouse, subject to this regulation and in which more than six males are employed, suitable and sufficient arinal accommodation shall be provided to the satisfaction of the inspector.
- (c) The provisions of paragraphs (b), (c), and (d) of regulation No. 23 shall apply in like manner to every factory, shop or warehouse to which this regulation applies.

Fire Escape (Section 80, par. (2)).

- 25. The following requirements regarding means of escape shall be complied with in all factories, provided that places that have been registered and occupied as factories prior to the coming into operation of these regulations may continue to be so registered and occupied while the Chief Inspector considers the means of escape in case of fire are sufficient to ensure the safety of the inmates:
- (a) There shall be provided for every floor of a factory above the ground floor a primary and an alternative escape in ease of fire. These shall be so constructed and situated as to allow of each escape being readily and safely accessible to and usable by all of the persons who may be accommodated on the different parts of every floor so that, should exit by one escape become obstructed by fire or smoke, exit by the other shall be instantly available and safely accessible and people. shall be instantly available and safely accessible and usable.

(b) The main traffic internal stairway for each floor above the ground floor in

every factory shall be deemed to be the primary escape in case of fire.

(c) The alternative escape shall, wherever practicable, be an external stair, any windows in close proximity to which shall have metal frames and sashes and be glazed with wire rolled plate glass. Wherever it is impracticable to build an external stair, it shall be an internal stair completely fire-isolated, situated as far as possible from lifts or other stairs, and having direct communication with the outer air.

(d) Provided that, for any buildings situated within any municipality or road district, other means of escape which do not comply with all the requirements of these regulations may be accepted, if the building surveyor or engineer of such municipality or road district, or the chief officer, W.A. Fire Brigades' Board, certifies in writing that, in his opinion, full compliance is impracticable, unsuitable, or unnecessary and that the other means of escape (specified in the certificate) are at least as safe and effective.

Stairs and Landings.

All stairs and landings shall be constructed of fire-resisting materials with-

(a) straight flights, with half-space or quarter-space landings at intervals of not more than sixteen nor less than two risers;
(b) a securely fixed continuous hand rail on one side at a vertical height of not less than two feet ten inches above the nosing of the tread, and not less than three feet above the landing where the stairway is three feet four inches or less in width, and two such continuous handrails (one on each side) where the stairway is the feet four inches or less in width, and two such continuous handrails (one on each side) where the stairway is given the feet four inches in width, believed. side) where the stairway is over three feet four inches in width; balusters or mid-rails shall be provided to every open side of every unenclosed stair;

(c) a clear headway throughout of not less than six feet six inches;

(d) steps of uniform dimensions throughout, with strongly secured treads, not less than 10 inches, exclusive of nosing, and risers of not more than 7 inches:

(e) the underside of stairs lined, except where risers are fitted;
(f) a landing at each floor of the same width as the stair, with a fire resisting as the landing, and opening outwards, so as not to obstruct the landing. Such door shall be fitted with such fastenings as the Chief Inspector may direct to be provided;

(g) a width of stair not less than two feet eight inches when the floor area is not more than one thousand square feet; three feet four inches where the floor area is more than one thousand and not more than two thousand square feet, and thereafter in accordance with the following scale:-

(h) All exit doors shall be so arranged as to be readily visible, and no obstructions in the form of partitions or other erections interfering with access or

visibility shall be permitted.

(i) Every fire escape staircase, whether internal or external, and whether erected before or after the coming into operation of this regulation, shall be maintained and kept in good and substantial repair and fit for use to the satisfaction of the inspector.

(j) All walls and partitions enclosing any stair shall be of fire resisting material. Fire isolated stairs shall be enclosed by reinforced concrete walls, not less than 4 inches thick, or by terra cotta walls not less than 6 inches thick, or by brick, stone, or concrete walls not less than 9 inches thick.

Fire Extinction.

- 27.~ (1) The following or other appliances, if approved of as equally effective by the Chief Inspector, shall be provided:—
 - (a) In factories in which more than 25 persons are employed-iron pipes, not less than 3 inches in diameter, conducting water from a street water main to within the building, with taps with 2½ inches outlet, fitted with fire brigade standard hose cocks and hoses of the same dimensions and of such numbers and in such positions as may be approved by the Chief Inspector.

(b) In factories in which not more than 25 persons are employed, the iron pipes shall be not less than 3 inches in diameter, with taps with 2½ inches out-let fitted, with fire brigade standard hose cocks and hoses of the same dimensions and of such numbers and in such positions as may be approved by the Chief Inspector.
Provided that, when in respect to any such factory the Chief Officer of

Western Australian Fire Brigades Board has certified in writing that the occupier has provided sufficient and suitable fire-extinguishing appliances to the satisfaction of such Chief Officer, the occupier shall not also be required to provide iron water pipes, taps, standard hose and cocks, and

hose as herein specified.

(c) In every factory which is subject to this regulation, there shall be provided to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector a sufficient number of chemical fire-extinguishers, each of which having a fluid capacity of two gallons shall be provided for every 1,600 square feet of floor space in the

- Arrangements satisfactory to the Chief Inspector shall be made for all appliances to be maintained in an effective condition. Every occupier who has entered into an agreement or arrangement with the W.A. Fire Brigades Board for the supervision and maintenance of fire-extinguishing appliances provided under these regulations shall, so long as such agreement or arrangement is in operation, be deemed to have complied with this regulation.
- 28. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe, or match for any naked light within or into any room or enclosed space, or any cellar or basement, or any part of any premises used as a factory in which any explosive or highly combustible or inflammable material is manufactured or stored.
- 29. A conspicuous notice comprising the words "Smoking strictly prohibited" shall be posted in a conspicuous position in each part of the factory to which the preceding paragraph applies.

Egress Space.

30. The amount of egress space from the ground floor which shall be provided for any factory occupied by not more than twenty-five persons shall not be less than two feet eight inches: if occupied by more than twenty-five persons, but not exceeding one hundred persons, it shall be not less than three feet four inches. If occupied by a greater number of persons, the egress space shall be increased at the rate of 20 inches for every additional 100 or fraction of 100 persons.

Where the amount of egress space required on the ground floor exceeds five feet, at least two separate doorways, placed as far apart as practicable, shall be provided. No doorway or gateway shall be less than two feet eight inches wide and six feet six inches high in the clear.

Internal approaches to Doorways.

31. No aisle may be less than two feet eight inches wide. The aggregate width of aisles, passages, or gangways is to be at least as wide as the stairways or doorways to which they lead.

Doors and Gateways.

- 32. Doors and gates forming exits from a factory shall, if so required by the Chief Inspector, be hing to open outwards towards the nearest road, street, or right-ofway, or to open both inwards and outwards.
- 33. No door or gate shall be hung so as to open immediately on to a flight of steps, or to obstruct, when open, any exit.
- 34. No door or gate shall during the working hours of the factory be secured with fastenings other than such as will allow such door or gate to be readily opened from the inside without a key.
- No door or gate across a passage shall have any other fastening except such as will allow the door to be readily opened from each side without a key and is approved by the Chief Inspector. Knobs and handles of all bolts and locks must be firmly secured.
- 36. No door to a fire-isolated stairway shall during the working hours of the factory be-
 - (a) kept open for a longer time than is necessary for the passage of persons or goods

(b) prevented from closing by wedges or other means.

Provided that, where approved self-closing hardwood doors not less than two inches thick or other approved fire-resisting doors are fitted inside fire underwriters' doors, and are kept closed in accordance with the requirements of paragraphs (a) and (b) hereof, such fire underwriters doors may be kept open by means of an approved fusible link, but not

Such self-closing hardwood or other approved door may be glazed: Provided that the glazing substance employed is fire-resisting and that the glazed area does not exceed 30 per cent. of the total area of such doors.

Prohibition of Employment during Structural Alterations. (Section 82.)

A notice pursuant to section 82 of the Act shall be in the Form 13 in the Appendix A to these regulations.

First Aid Appliances. (Section 88.)

- 38. In every factory where power-driven machinery is used in any process whatsoever, and in every factory where ten or more persons are employed, the occupier shall, if required by an inspector, provide and keep a suitable case or locker, placed in a position approved by the inspector, such case or locker to be equipped and supplied with the following articles, namely:-
 - 1 bottle antiseptic solution.
 - 1 dozen bandages (assorted sizes).

- 2 ounces castor oil.
- 2 onnces tincture iodine.
- 1 pint pierie acid solution. Formula: 11/2 teaspoons powdered pieric acid, 3 onnees absolute alcohol, 2 pints distilled water.
- 1 jar carbolised petrolatum.
- 6 ounces sal volatile.
- 4 ounces absorbent cotton wool.
- 4 small packets absorbent lint.
- 2 packets sterilised plain gauze, 3in.
- reel adhesive plaster, 2in. packet safety pins.

- pair scissors.

 (only) tourniquet.
- pair tweezers.
- (only) glass measure. (only) small enamel bowls.
- (only) eye dropper.
- First Aid Manual.
- 1 pair rubber gloves.

Part VI .-- Special Provisions Relating to Certain Trades.

Stamping Furniture (Section 92).

- All furniture, other than second-hand furniture, which is sold, exposed, or offered for sale, either by wholesale or retail, shall be stamped in the manner set forth hereunder:
 - (a) Every stamp on furniture which is made of wood, or of which wood forms the principal part, shall be of indelible permanent ink or stain, or impression, and shall be of legible type, and the lettering on such stamp shall be in bold-faced sans serif-capital letters of not less than eight points face measurement.
 - (b) Every article of furniture which is manufactured from metal, reeds, rattan, (c) Such label shall be nailed, riveted, screwed, tacked, or attached by other suitable means, firmly secured to or let into such articles in workmanlike manner and so far as reasonably possible in a way that will not poss

 - suitable means, firmly secured to or let into such articles in workmanlike manner, and, so far as reasonably possible, in a way that will not permit of the label or stamp being easily rubbed off, obliterated, or detached in the handling of such articles.

 (d) Of the methods of stamping referred to in paragraph (c) of this regulation, the one used in any particular case shall be the one most fitting to be used to secure permanency, having regard to the composition of the label required to be used, and the nature, composition, size, shape, or other characteristics of the particular article of furniture. characteristics of the particular article of furniture.

Part VII .-- Closing of Shops.

Registration of Small Shops (Section 103).

- 40. Every application to register a small shop shall be made in the Form 14 in the Appendix A to these regulations.
- Every certificate of registration of a small shop shall be in the Form 15 in the Appendix A to these regulations.

Poll of Electors (Sections 100 and 105).

- 42. In lieu of the questions prescribed by subsection (1) of section 118 of the Electoral Act, 1907-1936, the following questions shall be put by the presiding officer to any person claiming to vote:-
- (a) Do you live in the (here state the name of Shop District? and if such question is answered in the negative, the following additional questions:-
 - (b) Have you within the last preceding three months bona fide lived within the (here state the name of Shop District? Shop District?
 - (c) Where was your place of living in the (here state the name of the Shop District) Shop District?
- 43. An elector may record his vote by post before a postal vote officer duly appointed in such capacity under the Electoral Act and at the Chief Electoral Office, Perth: Provided such elector would have been qualified to record his vote by post if the poll under the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, for which he claims to vote by post had been a Parliamentary election, and provided also that voting by post is permissible only within the Shop District for which the poll is being taken.
- The warrant for the issue of the writ, and the writ, may be in the Forms 16 and 17 in the Appendix A to these regulations.

Fees to Returning Officers.

- 45. The fees payable to returning officers, presiding officers, and assistant presiding officers for their services in connection with the taking of any poll under the Act shall be-
 - Returning Officer-£7: Provided that, where in respect of any shop poll more than one electoral district is involved, an additional fee of £1 for each district in excess of one shall be allowed.
 - Presiding Officer and Assistant Presiding Officer—£2: Provided that presiding officers and assistant presiding officers required to assist at the scrutiny and count of votes shall be paid for such services at the rate of three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) per hour.

No transport or meal allowance shall be paid to any officer aforesaid in respect of the day of a poll, but, if approved by the Chief Inspector of Factories, any expense necessarily incurred by an officer for transport on the day of the poll may be recouped to such officer.

The Minister may in special cases approve of the abovementioned fees being increased to coincide with those paid under the regulations under the Electoral Act, 1907-1936, as amended, for State Parliamentary elections.

Suspension of Section 112 and Subsection (1) of Section 113.

- An application to the Chief Inspector for the suspension of section 112 and subsection (1) of section 113 of the Act shall be in the Form 18 in the Appendix A to these regulations.
- The conditions under which a suspension of the provisions of section 112 and subsection (1) of section 113 may be allowed as follow:-
 - (a) that no goods of a description or kind that would necessitate the shop being closed shall be sold or exposed for sale at any hour when the shop would,

(b) that there has been provided and will be maintained a substantial partition of the prescribed description, which will be kept locked (with the key removed) during the hours covered by such suspension;
(c) that the suspension may at any time be revoked by the Chief Inspector by

notification of such revocation being posted to the shopkeeper.

Articles deemed to be appropriate to exempted Shops. (Sections 106 and 112).

The following schedule of articles shall be deemed to be appropriate to the class of business specified hereunder:

"'Newsagents, stationers and booksellers' shops'"—All kinds of books, whether printed or blank, stationery, including all kinds of writing materials, postal materials, Christmas and other cards, cardboard, paper of all kinds, indiarubber stamps, gum, stationery baskets, sealing wax, school bags, photo albums, sheet music, books of music, account books (all sizes), paper, school books, ink, indiarubber bands, pencils (including ornamental pencils), paper size concern whose red tage children's books, ways, magnetines, paper clips, erasers, rulers, red tape, children's books, novels, magazines, newspapers, copy books, exercise books, twine, school slates, visiting and plain cards, serapbooks and scraps, Catholic and English prayer books, bibles, birthday cards, blotting paper, foolscap, wrapping papers, ink bottles, drawing books, music paper, manuscript music books, blotting and writing pads, postage and duty stamps, writing desks, pen racks and paper transfers. "Railway book stall"—All those articles hereinbefore described as being appro-

priate to newsagents, stationers and booksellers' shops, with the addition of

confectionery. "Confectioners' shops'"—All kinds of sweets, pastry, biscuits, fancy bread, cakes, all non-alcoholic beverages, ice and icecream.
"Fruit and vegetable shops and refreshment shops'"—All kinds of fresh or dried

fruits, and cut flowers; all vegetables fresh and dried, including onions and potatoes, all non-alcoholic beverages, ice, icecream, butter, cheese, margarine

and eggs.

"Tobacconists' shops''—Tobacco pipes, tobacco, cigars, cigarettes, snuff and snuff boxes, tobacco pouches, matches, match boxes, cigar, cigarette and pipe cases, eigar and cigarette holders and cutters, pocket eigarette making machines, pocket knives, hairdresser's scissors and hair clippers, razors, razor blades, shaving brushes, shaving soap, bay rum, brilliantine, face cream, shaving cream, florida water, combs, hair brushes, hair oils, talcum or other face powders, razor strops, shaving mugs, and walking sticks.

"Restaurants, refreshment, cooked meat and fish and oyster shops"—Game and poultry, fresh, cured or cooked fish, or shell fish, but not tinned fish, all kinds of cooked foodstuffs other than tinned or bottled foods. All kinds of non-

of cooked foodstuffs other than tinned or bottled foods. All kinds of non-

alcoholic beverages-and butter, cheese, margarine, and eggs.

"Premises in respect of which a publican's general license, wayside house license, Australian wine and beer license, Australian wine license, Railway refreshment room license or Hotel license has been or may hereafter be granted ':-

Tobacco and eigars, eigarettes and other articles made of tobacco. "Chemists' and druggists' shops' —All kinds of medicinal preparations, drugs, patent medicines, and chemicals, surgical, medical, and chemical appliances, instruments and apparatus, disinfectants, antiseptics, and vermin destroyers, prepared food for invalids and children, feeding cups and bottles, toilet requisites, such as sponges, brushes, soaps, powders, cosmetics and perfumery, bay rum, brilliantine, face cream, shaving cream, florida water, combs, hair brushes, hair oils, talemm or other face powders, sprays, puffs, manicuring appliances, and cases or boxes for same.

Substantial Partitions for Mixed Businesses. (Section 113.)

- In the case of shops, where two or more descriptions of businesses are carried on in different parts of the same premises such parts shall be deemed to be separated from each other by a substantial partition, if any, if the following conditions are complied with, namely:-
 - (1) If the several businesses are respectively carried on in entirely distinct and separate buildings;
 - (2) If the parts are separated from each other by a permanent partition, and, when the partition is pierced by a door, if, at the closing hour the door is closed and locked, and the key removed;
 - (3) Close roller-shutters made of wood, iron, or other substantial material approved by the inspector may be used as a partition to separate the parts if at the closing hour they are securely fastened by lock or padlock, and the key removed;

- (4) Movable shutters of wood, iron, or other substantial material approved by the inspector may be used as a partition to separate the parts if when put up at the closing hour they are securely fastened by a horizontal bar, which is padlocked, and if the key thereof is removed;
- (5) Framed glass may be used as a partition to separate the parts if at the closing hour the goods contained behind the glass partition and the glass doors or frames are closed and locked, and if the key thereof is removed;
- (6) Windows boxed in with wood or glass may be used as a partition to separate the parts if at the closing hour the door of the compartment is locked, and if the key thereof is removed:
- and if the key thereof is removed;

 (7) Movable shutters of not greater than 1½ inch mesh wire framed in wood or iron may be used as a separation: Provided they are securely locked to the approval of the inspector, and that the key thereof is removed: Provided further, that if netting of greater mesh than lin, be used, such netting shall be made of wire not lighter than 14 s.w. gauge;
- (8) Movable wooden lattice shutters of not greater than 1½ in. mesh, securely fastened to wooden frames, may be used as a separation, provided they are securely locked, to the approval of the inspector, and that the key thereof is removed.

Part VIII .- Provisions relating to the Employment of Assistants in Shops.

Employment during extended Hours.

(Section 119.)

50. Every notification by the occupier of a shop to the Chief Inspector that such occupier has availed himself of the provisions of section 118 shall be in the Form 19 in the Appendix A to these regulations.

Records to be Kept.

(Section 128.)

51. The form of record to be kept by the occupier of a shop shall be the same as that prescribed for a factory in regulation 13 of these regulations.

Part IX.—Registration of Shops and Warehouses. (Section 132.)

52. An application to the Chief Inspector of Factories by the occupier of a shop or warehouse for registration thereof, pursuant to section 132 of the Act, shall be in accordance with Form 20 in the Appendix A to these regulations.

53. An application for reuewal of registration shall be in the Form 21 in the Appendix A to these regulations.

Part X.—Miscellaneous.

(Section 158.)

54. (1) Any person who contravenes or neglects, refuses, or fails to comply with any provision of these regulations shall be guilty of an offence.

(2) Unless otherwise prescribed any person guilty of an offence against these regulations shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding £5.
