THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1937.

Amendment of By-laws.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1937, a local health authority may make or adopt by-laws, and may amend, repeal, or alter any by-laws so made or adopted: Now, therefore, the Busselton Muni-cipal Conneil, being a local health authority and having adopted the model by-laws published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927, doth hereby amend its by-laws in the following manner:—

Part I .- General Sanitary Provisions.

Add a new by-law, as follows, to stand as by-law 23A:-

23A. Notwithstanding the provisions of by-law 23, the owner of any premises shall, when directed by the local authority, dispose of liquid wastes pro-duced on his premises in the following manner:—

By discharging them into an open jointed french drain complying with the following conditions:---

(a) The trench shall be excavated to a depth of not less than two feet six inches, two feet wide at the top, with the sides sloped to provide a width of one foot six inches at the bottom. Filling to consist of broken blue metal

or other approved material broken to three-inch gauge, to a depth of not less than twelve inches.

Drain pipes of not less than three-inch bore to be then laid with open joints for the full length of the trench. Pipes to then be covered with similar filling to provide cover above the crown of the pipes not less than three inches in depth; filling to then be covered with sheet-iron with a top cov-ering of soil six inches in depth.

The position and length of the trench to be as directed by the Inspector.

- (b) The honse fittings, waste pipes, gully traps, grease traps, drains, and ventilating pipes to be to the approval of the Inspector.
 (c) Grease traps of approved design shall be installed when directed by the Inspector.

WHEREAS it is enacted by sections 111 and 133 of the Health Act, 1911-1937 (as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938), that any local authority which has undertaken or contracted for the collection and removal of nightsoil, urine, and rubbish within its district may by by-law prohibit any person executing or undertaking the execution of the work aforesaid, so long as the local authority or its contractor executes or continues the execution of the said work or is menared and willing to execute or continue the exec is prepared and willing to execute or continue the exe-cution of such work: And whereas Narembeen Road Board, being a local health authority in respect of the Board, being a local health authority in respect of the Health District of Narembeen, within the meaning and for the purposes of the Health Act, 1911-1937, has con-tracted for the efficient collection, removal, and disposal of nightsoil, urine, and rubbish within the Health Dis-trict of Narembeen aforesaid, and deems it desirable and expedient to prohibit any and every person other than the contractor of the said Narembeen Road Board exe-cuting or undertaking the execution of the work afore-said: And whereas the said Narembeen Road Board, as such local health authority aforesaid, by a resolution published in the *Government Gazette* on the 13th day of April, 1933, adopted Series "A" of the model by-laws prepared pursuant to section 295 of the Health Act, 1911-1926, as published in the *Government Gazette* on

the 8th day of April, 1927, and for the purpose of imposing the prohibition hereinbefore mentioned deems it necessary and expedient to amend the said model by-laws as adopted by the said Narembeen Road Board as aforesaid: Now, therefore, it is resolved and determined by the said Narembeen Road Board as such local health authority aforesaid, acting pursuant to sections 111 and 133 of the Health Act, 1911-1937 (as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938), that the said by laws of the said Narembeen Road Board, being the said Series "A" of the model by laws aforesaid, shall be and are hereby amended by inserting therein after by-law 20 a new by-law to stand as by-law 20A, as follows:

Prohibition against Collection, Removal, and Disposal of Nightsoil, Urine, and Rubbish.

20A. The Narembeen Road Board as the local health anthority for the Narembeen Health District, having contracted for the efficient collection, re-moval, and disposal of nightsoil, urine, and rubbish within the said health district by its contractor, no person other than the contractor of the said local health authority shall execute or undertake the collection, removal, or disposal of any nightsoil, urine, or rubbish within the Narembeen Health District, so long as the said contractor as the contractor of the said local authority executes or continues the said work, or is prepared and willing to execute or continue the execution of the said work.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 16 of 1939.

(Registered 25/9/39.)

STATE SHIPPING SERVICE CLERKS.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-35, this 13th day of Septem-ber, 1939, between the Federated Clerks' Union of Aus-tralia Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. Branch, of the one part, and the Minister controlling the State Shipping Service, of the other part, whereby it is mutu-ally agreed as follows:—

1.-Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall operate over an area within a twelve mile radius of the General Post Office, Perth, and shall apply to the positions enumerated herein, which are exempt from the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1904.

2.—Definitions.

(a) "Officer," "worker," shall mean any member of the clerical staff of the State Shipping Service covered by this Agreement.

(b) "Minister" shall mean the Minister controlling State Shipping Service.

(c) "Manager" shall mean the Manager of the State Shipping Service.

3.-Hours of Duty.

(a) The ordinary hours of duty shall be from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, with an interval of one hour for lunch, and between 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

(b) The week of 38 hours may by agreement between the Minister and the Union be worked in five days, Monday to Friday, inclusive.

When it is necessary to work on Saturday mornings equivalent time off shall be allowed in law thereof, in accordance with Government regulations.

4.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked on compiling manifests, wages sheets, and other essential papers in connection with the despatch and arrival of vessels outside the ordinary working hours, as may be required by the Manager, shall be paid at the following hourly rates:—

(b) All work as defined in subclause (a) performed on Saturday afternoons, Sundays, and holidays shall be paid at the above rates plus 50 per cent.

(c) Employees required by the Manager to work out-side the ordinary hours as defined above, other than as specified in subclause (a) of this clause, shall not be entitled to any extra payment, but shall be allowed equivalent time off in lieu thereof, at the convenience of the Manager the Manager,

(d) When an officer is required to return to duty after a period of more than one honr and a half has elapsed, after ceasing ordinary hours of duty, the mini-mum payment shall be as for two hours.

(e) Only overtime duly sanctioned by the Management prior to being worked will be recognised. A proper record of overtime will be kept.

5.-Meal Allowance.

In addition to the overtime prescribed in clause 4, a meal allowance of 2s. shall be paid to each officer, in the following circumstances:-

- (a) Where an officer is required to remain on duty after the usual finishing time and is detained on duty for a period exceeding one hour on
- any working day. (b) Where an officer is required to commence duty earlier than two hours prior to the usual start-ing time on any day, or is not allowed a period of one hour and a half after the usual finishing time before being required to resume duty again on any working day.
- (c) Where an officer is required on duty on other than a working day and commences at or be-fore 12 noon or 5 p.m., or on Saturday at or before 5 p.m., and continues on duty until or beyond 1.30 p.m. or 6.30 p.m., respectively, pro-vided that the actual period of duty in either case exceeds two hours.
- (d) The meal allowance shall be payable in regard to all overtime worked under clause 4 (c).

6.—Salaries.

Basic wage :--- Adult males, £4 2s. 2d. per week; adult females, £2 4s. 4d. per week.

(a) Messenger-maximum age 17 years-fl per week. Junior officers.-The salaries of male officers at or under the age of 21 years shall be :---

- During 1st year's experience-40% of male basic
 - wage. During 2nd year's experience-50% of male basic
 - wage. During 3rd year's experience-60% of male basic
 - wage. During 4th year's experience-70% of male basic wage.
 - During 5th year's experience-80% of male basic wage
 - During 6th year's experience-90% of male basic wage.
 - At 21 years—£5 over basic wage.
 - At 22 years-£20 over basic wage.
 - At 23 years-£40 over basic wage.

(a) (a) An employee attaining the age of 22 years or over shall not be entitled to an increase over the scale which in the opinion of the manager warrants an in-crease; provided that any dispute under this subclause shall be referred to the Minister for final decision. (b) Senior male clerks.—The salaries of officers at the age of 24 years, appointed under the following classification, shall be calculated on margins over the basic wage, as follows :-

When an officer mentioned in this subclause is not receiving the prescribed maximum, such maximum shall be reached by annual increments of £15.

(c) Telephone-Typiste :-

During 1st year-66% of female basic wage. During 2nd year-83% of female basic wage.

During 3rd year-100% of female basic wage.

During 4th year—£15 over female basic wage. During 5th year—£30 over female basic wage.

At 21 years of age-£45 over female basic wage, with a maximum margin of £65, allowable by annual increments of £10.

7.—Higher Duties.

An officer being paid under clause 6 (a) called upon to perform the duties of a position enumerated in clause 6 (b) for a period of one calendar month or longer shall receive the minimum of such higher position for the period he is performing the higher duties.

8.-Public Holidays and Leave.

(a) Public holidays :--- All gazetted Public Service holidays shall be observed.

(b) Annual leave:--Two weeks' leave on full pay for each year of continuous service. When the continu-ous service is over one month but less than twelve months, pro rata leave shall be granted.

(c) Long service leave :--Long service leave shall be granted in accordance with the general conditions relating to Government wages employees.

(d) Sick leave:--An officer who is too unwell to attend his duties may be granted sick leave on production of an adequate medical certificate for such a period and upon such conditions as the Manager shall determine in each case.

9.-Contract of Service.

The engagement of any officer shall be terminated by one month's notice on either side, such notice to expire on the usual pay day, excepting that an officer deemed guilty of gross misconduct or neglect of duty may be instantly dismissed or suspended and shall not be entitled to any such notice or payment in lieu.

Provided that during the first month's service the engagement shall be on a weekly basis.

10.—Accrued Rights.

No privilege or concession at present enjoyed by the officers shall, unless expressly provided herein, be varied or cancelled solely by reason of the provisions of this Agreement.

11.-Preference of Employment.

All officers shall be members of the Federated Clerks' Union of Anstralia: Provided that any officer appointed who at the time of engagement is not a member of such Union shall become a member thereof within fourteen days of such appointment.

12.—Record of Hours.

A record shall be kept showing the name of each worker under this Agreement and the hours worked each day and the wages received each pay day. The said record shall be open during ordinary working hours to the inspection of an accredited representative of the Union.

13 .- Term and Review.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three years: Provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from the commencement of this Agreement, any term or terms hereof may be reviewed by either party giving to the other party one month's notice of their desire to do so. In the event of the parties failing to agree on any matters, it is agreed that the matters in dispute shall be submitted for decision to the Industrial Arbitration Court, or a Board of Reference.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 3 of 1938.

Between the Metropolitan and Sonth-Western Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia, Applicant, and the Commissioner of Railways for the State of Western Australia, respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

AWARD.

1.—Definitions.

(1) "Auxiliary plant attendant" means a worker whose duty is to start, stop, and operate the feed pumps; the circulating and air pump motors in the turbine basement, and watch the operation of the condensing plant; of the high pressure pumps of the seepage pumps, and of the compressors and rotary screens, and attend to the bearings on any such machine where same is immediately necessary in the course of operation.

(2) ''Boiler cleaner'' means a worker who performs any work pertaining to the cleaning of a boiler or economiser including:—

- (a) the removal of dirt from inside or outside of boiler casings;
- (b) the operation of air or steam soot blowers;
- (c) the breaking and making of drum manhole door joints and handhole door joints;
- (d) the searching for leaking tubes or faults;
- (e) the cleaning of scale or rust by hand or machine;
- (f) the turbining of any tubes with machines; or
- (g) the erection and dismantling of stagings around boilers.

(3) "Leading hand boiler cleaner" means a boiler cleaner who is placed in charge of four or more other boiler cleaners.

(4) "Casual hand," in reference to a worker, shall mean any worker (other than the regular operating staff) who is engaged from day to day.

(5) "Coal conveyor man" means a worker who starts and stops a motor used to drive coal conveyors and elevators and regulates the flow of coal to the buckets and trays.

(6) "Fuelman" means a worker employed in the handling or unloading of coal.

(7) "Greaser" means a worker employed in Inbricating or oiling any machinery or shafting.

(8) "Turbine driver" means a worker who with the supervision of the staff engineer starts, stops, or operates turbo-alternators of five hundred (500) kilowatts capacity or over on the main turbine floor, and who performs other duties incidental thereto, including, but without limiting the generality of the foregoing definition, the logging of readings.

2.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to the Generating Station at East Perth, controlled by the Commissioner of Railways on behalf of the Western Australian Government.

3.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be three (3) years from the 26th day of September, 1939.

4.—Contract of Service.

(1) Except with the approval of the Commissioner no worker who has had more than six (6) months' continuous service shall leave the employment of the Commissioner until the expiration of seven (7) days' written notice of his intention to do so.

(2) Except in cases of summary dismissal for misconduct, seven (7) days' notice shall be given by the Commissioner to workers (other than casual workers whose services may be dispensed with at any time) and the reason for dismissal shall be given.

5.-Guaranteed Week.

(1) Subject to subclauses (2) and (3) of this clause the Commissioner guarantees to each worker, other than a casual, a full week's work, except during such period as he is unable wholly or partially to carry on the running of the Generating Station by reason of any action on the part of any section of his workers or for any cause beyond his control.

(2) The guaranteed week may be reduced in respect of any worker under suspension; provided that any worker suspended on a charge which is not sustained shall be entitled to the benefit of the guarantee during the period of his suspension.

(3) A worker losing time through sickness or special leave shall be reduced in wages to the extent of the time actually lost through sickness or actually granted as special leave.

6.-Wages (and see also Clause 7).

(1) The basic wage at the time of the making of this Award is $\pounds 4$ 2s, 2d. per week.

(2) The several margins payable to workers under this Award are as set out hereunder. These rates are framed on a shift-work basis and, except where expressly specified, take into consideration the fact that the worker is or may be required to work on shift work:—

7.—Special Rates and Provisions.

Other Monetary Allowances.

(1) Casual shift work.—Where a worker is required to work on shifts on a type of work not being regularly worked on shifts at the date of this Award, he shall be paid twenty-five per cent. (25%) in addition to his usual rate, unless he works at least five (5) consecutive afternoon shifts or five (5) consecutive night shifts; but nothing herein contained shall derogate from the right of the Commissioner to put any work now performed as day work on a permanent or regular shift basis if he deems it necessary for the more economical er efficient working of the establishment, and in that event the rates prescribed by subclause (2) of clause 6, which have been fixed with due regard to the obligation to do regular shift work, shall apply.

The several special rates hereinbefore provided in this subclause shall not be cumulative, and a worker who would but for the provisions of this paragraph be en-titled to more than one allowance shall be entitled to the allowance for the item which carries the highest rate.

In this subclause "confined space" means a space in which the worker is compelled to work in a cramped position. It is not intended to enlarge or restrict the conception of what has hitherto been regarded as a confined space in the industry, and, subject to this limitation, in cases of dispute as to whether a space is a confined space, the same shall be referred to the Board of Reference constituted under this Award.

(3) Where a worker is required to work overtime for a perod of not less than one hour, and has not received a day's notice that he is so required, he shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) for a meal, unless he is supplied with a meal by the employer, or it is reasonably practicable for him to go home for a meal.

(4) Where a fireman is required to supervise or direct the work of another fireman by some person in anthority, he shall receive an allowance of one shilling (1s.) per day while so supervising or directing.

(5) Workers performing higher duties; workers per-forming duties in lower grades; temporary vacancies:

(a) Any worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his normal rate of pay shall be paid the higher minimum rate for the time he actually performs such work.

(b) Should a worker be required to perform work in a lower grade, his wages shall not be reduced whilst employed in that capacity.

(c) Should a vacancy occur in any higher grade, the next senior worker shall be entitled to promotion to the vacancy, if he is considered competent to fill the higher grade position.

(6) Under-rate workers:

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

(7) No reduction: This Award shall not in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker, including the wages of a worker who was prior to the date of this Award styled a leading fireman, who is at present receiving above the minimum rate prescribed for his class of work.

General.

(8) Entering coal bunkers:

(a) (i) A worker who is required to enter a coal bunker in the course of his duties shall be protected by a safety rope, fixed in such a manner as to afford the worker reasonable protection in the event of a fall or slide of coal.

(ii) No worker shall enter a bunker unless another worker is present on the conveyor floor in possession of a safety rope and remains on the conveyor floor above the bunker during the whole of the time the other worker or workers are in the bunker.

(iii) No worker shall enter a coal bunker unless he has received written instructions from a shift engineer to do so.

(b) Where the provisions of paragraph (a) have not been complied with, a worker who enters a bunker commits a breach of this Award, and if the Commiscommissioner or any person in authority on behalf of the Commissioner permits a worker to enter a bunker in breach of the provisions of paragraph (a), the Com-missioner shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this Award.

(9) Manning boilers .--- Where there are more than six (6) boilers on range, two (2) firemen shall be employed attending the steam and stand-by boilers only.

8.-Hours.

(1) The normal working hours, exclusive of Sunday time, for other than shift workers, shall be eight (8) hours per day on five (5) days of the week, Monday to Friday, inclusive, and four (4) hours on Saturday in cach week.

(2) The normal working hours for shift workers shall be eighty-eight (88) per fortnight, to be worked in alternate shifts, namely, five (5) shifts of eight (8) hours in one week and six (6) shifts of eight (8) hours in the next week: provided that the extra rate prescribed for Sunday time shall stand alone and be paid for in addition to the week's earnings.

9.-Overtime Rates and Special Rates for Sundays and Holidays.

(1) (a) All time worked outside the usual working hours in any one shift shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Extra rates shall be computed on the rate applieable to the day on which the time is worked: Provided that double time, that is to say, twice the ordinary rates for the shift, shall be the maximum.

(2) Subject to subclause (1) (b) all time worked on Sunday, Good Friday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and on the worker's rostered day off shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half. The worker working and paid at such rates shall not thereby lose his claim to a paid holiday under clause 10 hereof.

(3) A worker brought on duty for any purpose ontside his ordinary working hours shall be paid a mini-mini of two (2) hours if the work, exclusive of meal times, is not continuous with his shift. No such worker shall be obliged to work for the two (2) hours, if the job for which he has been brought on has been completed in less time.

(4) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, it shall be a breach of this Award, both by the Commissioner and by the worker concerned, if—

- (a) the worker has not at least eight (8) hours off duty before he commences work on his next shift;
- (b) a worker who is working overtime works more than four (4) hours without a break of at least thirty (30) minutes for a meal.

10.-Annual Leave.

(1) After twelve (12) months' continuous service a worker shall be granted two (2) weeks' leave on full pay in each year. If a worker is booked off and paid or granted leave with pay on any public holiday, the holiday shall be deducted from the two (2) weeks' leave.

Three (3) additional days' holiday shall be granted to shift workers who work twelve (12) Sundays or more in any one year.

Annual holidays shall be allowed to accumulate for two (2) years at the worker's option. In computing the cash equivalent of each day's leave, it shall be taken on the basis of one-sixth (1/6th) of the pay for a normal forty-four (44) hours' work.

(2) Workers shall be paid for annual holidays at their normal rate of pay immediately before the time when such holidays are taken; but if a worker is acting in a higher temporary position and is receiving a rate of pay higher than his normal rate of pay, and has been receiving such higher rate for a period of not less than three (3) months immediately prior to his taking his holidays, he shall be paid for his holidays on the basis of such higher rate. Every worker, other than a casual worker, who has had one month's continuous service shall be entitled to the foregoing holidays in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays to which he would be entitled if he had served for the full period of twelve (12) months.

(3) No deduction shall be made from the annual holidays for any period during which a worker is off duty through sickness, unless the absence exceeds three (3)calendar months.

(4) Notification of annual leave shall be given by the Commissioner or Management to workers entitled thereto at least a fortnight before the intended commencement of the leave.

(5) Subject to the proviso hereto, any worker who may resign or whose services may be terminated shall be entitled to receive payment for any holidays which may be due to him up to the time of resignation or termination, except where he is dismissed for disobedience of lawful orders or for intoxication, when he shall be entitled to payment only for such leave, if any, as has accumulated from the previous year. Further, if the worker is dismissed for dishonesty, he will not be entitled to any payment for holidays for the current year, or for any leave accrued from tag previous year.

11.-Sick Leave.

(1) A worker shall be entitled to payment for nonattendance on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half $(\frac{1}{2})$ day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for such absence through such illhealth shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(2) No worker shall be entitled to the benefit of this clause, unless he produces proof to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, or his representative, of sickness, but the Commissioner shall not be entitled to a medical certificate, unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(3) No payment will be made for any absence due to a worker's own fault, neglect, or misconduct.

12 .--- Preference to Unionists.

Except in the case of junior workers, preference of employment shall be given to unionists: Provided there are unionists capable of and available for the work offering.

13.-Board of Reference.

The Court appoints for the purposes of this Award a Board of Reference. The Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives nominated by the parties. There are assigned to such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of :---

- (a) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any machine, occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the award;
- (b) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of the Award;
- (c) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

In witness whereof this Award has been signed by the Deputy President of the Court and the Seal of the Court has been hereto affixed this 26th day of September, 1939.
