AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 20th day of December, 1939, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S 869/25.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889, whereby the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council does not apply to minor appointments which by Order in Council are vested in the Heads of Departments or other Officers or persons within the State: And whereas it is desirable that the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed at a daily wage on water supply, sewerage, and drainage works under the control of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Department should be vested in various officers: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby further amends Schedule appended to the Order in

Council gazetted on the 6th April, 1939, by the addition of the name of D. Munro and of any person or persons appointed temporarily to act in the place of such officer, and the cancellation of the appointment of V. C. Munt.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 829/34.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909, it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council from time to time alter or extend the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage and Drainage Area or of any District: And whereas it is desirable to extend the boundaries of the said Area and of the Metropolitan Water and Sewerage District as hereinafter described: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby order and declare as follows:—That the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage and Drainage Area, and of the Metropolitan Water and Sewerage District, are hereby extended by including therein the land described in the Schedule hereto:—

Schedule.

Bounded by lines commencing at the intersection of the shores of the Indian Ocean with the production westerly of the northern side of Road No. 246, and proceeding thence in a northerly, then north-westerly direction along the shores of the Indian Ocean to the intersection of the northern boundary of Location E1 with the said shores; thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of Location E1 to the south-western corner of Location 2515; thence in a southerly direction along the prolongation southerly of the western boundary of Location 2515, through Locations E1, 1315, G and H to the southern boundary of Location H; thence in a westerly direction along the southern boundary of Location H and its prolongation

through Location 1315 to and along the northern side of Road No. 246 to the point of commencement as shown in brown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 6425.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 5th

day of January, 1940.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1937.

The City of Perth.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1937, the Governor caused to be prepared and to be published in the Government Gazette on the 29th day of September, 1939, a model by-law relating to the transport of meat in the form hereinafter set forth: And whereas under the provisions of the said Act a Local Authority may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-law with or without modification: Now, therefore, the Council of the City of Perth being a Local Authority under the said Act doth hereby resolve to adopt the whole of such by-law without modification.

The by-law referred to above is as follows:-

(a) Every vehicle used in the transport of meat (excepting butchers' delivery vehicles used for delivery of cut joints to householders and vehicles used by the producer for the conveyance of carcase meat to the market) shall conform with the following:-

i. The vehicle shall be completely enclosed so as to protect the meat from the weather and from flies

and dust.

ii. The vehicle shall be constructed of wood or metal, and all internal surfaces shall be finished to a smooth surface.

iii. The vehicle shall be properly ventilated.
iv. The vehicle shall be provided with rails and hooks secured to the upper portion thereof, and shall be of ample proportions so that meat hung on such hooks shall be clear of the floor.

v. No meat (except edible offal) shall be placed on the floor of the vehicle.
vi. Edible offal, when carried on the floor, shall be contained in impervious containers.
vii. The vehicle, edible offal containers, hooks and rails shall at all times be kept in a thoroughly elem earlitim. clean condition.

- (b) No vehicle used for the transport of meat shall be used at any time for the transport of any offensive matter.
- (c) No meat shall be carried on any railway, except in trucks provided for that purpose, or unless such meat is hung on hooks and is clear of the floor.
- (d) Any person engaged or employed in the transport or delivery of carcase meat shall at all times when so engaged wear a cap with a detachable covering made of durable washable material, and an overall coat of durable washing material, which shall completely cover his clothes. He shall cause such cap covering and overall to be kept at all times in a thoroughly clean condition
- (e) i. Butchers' delivery vehicles shall be completely enclosed to protect the meat from the weather, flies and dust. The vehicle shall be constructed of wood or metal, and all internal portions finished to a smooth surface
- ii. They shall be properly ventilated. The floor of such vehicles shall be constructed of or completely covered with a smooth impervious metal.
- (f) Butchers' cutting carts shall be constructed in a similar manner as specified for butchers' delivery carts, but shall be of ample dimensions to permit all carcase meat to be hung on hooks affixed to the roof of such

vehicle. All carcase meat shall be hung on such hooks, in such manner that the meat is clear of the floor. Carcase meat in this clause shall mean any quarter or more of any carcase.

- (g) All carcase meat conveyed by producers to the market shall be completely covered with clean canvas or other wrappings, approved by the inspector, in such manner as thoroughly to protect such meat from flies and dust.
- (h) In this by-law the word "producer" shall mean n person who delivers to the market carcases of animals reared or produced on his own farm or property.

Municipality of Geraldton—Town Plauning Scheme. In pursuance of the resolution of the Geraldton Municipal Council of the eighth day of November, 1939, and notices advertised in accordance with the Town Planning Regulations, 1930, the undermentioned provisions are made:—

Provision 1.—Classifying, Districting and Zoning. Classifying the area of the Municipality and that portion of the Geraldton Road Board District shown on the plan of the Scheme within the blue boundary line of the Scheme, into industrial, commercial, tenement and residential districts, these districts being more particularly described in the Scheme; and the areas in the Scheme are hereby so classified and districted.

Provision No. 1 (a)—Industrial Districts.

- (1) Within the district described and delineated the lands may be used for any purpose permitted in a residential or commercial district, or any use not permitted in a business or residential district.
- (2) Noxious trades as defined hereunder:—Establishments confined to and permitted only in Industrial Area No. 4 and gazetted on the 9th September, 1938, viz., slaughter houses, piggeries, artificial manure depots, bone mills, places for storing, drying or ore-serving bones, hides, hoofs, or skins, fat melting, fat extracting, or tallow melting establishments, blood drying, fell mongeries, establishments for gut scraping, gut spinning and preparation of sausage skins.

Noxious Trades as defined hereunder to be permitted in any Industrial Area excepting Industrial Areas No. 1 and 2:—Flock Factories, Chemical Works, Rag and Bone Merchants' premises, Marine Stores, etc., where bones, etc., are handled, wool scouring establishments and Manure Works.

Noxious Trades as defined hereunder to be permitted in any industrial district:—Fish shops, fish curing establishments, laundry and cleaning establishments, dye works in a small way, marine stores excepting where they deal with bones and similar offensive materials and woodyards.

(3) All those lots on which the existing industry is established at the date of the Scheme (1) providing that, should such industries cease to operate and the premises be vacated for a period exceeding three months, the laud and buildings shall not be used for any Industrial purposes, where such industries are situated within the residential or commercial districts, even although such industries were existing at the date of the Scheme.

Provision No. 1 (b)—Commercial and Business District.

- (1) The districts described for commerce and business are comprised in the Schedules hereunder and delineated on the plan of the Scheme.
- (2) All those lots or parcels of land on which shops business premises or commercial premises are erected at the date of the Scheme are included in (1) provided that where such land or buildings are within the gazetted residential districts at the date of gazettal of the Scheme, such land and buildings shall not be permitted to be utilised for any purpose other than that permitted in the residential area, should such existing business at any time close down or the premises be vacated for a period exceeding three months.
- (3) The uses to which the land comprising the commercial and business districts shall be put may include any of the following uses:—(a) Any use permitted in a residential district; (b) Theatre, hall, club, or place of amusement; (c) Office, bank or hotel, fire station, police station, Post Office, or public building, or places of worship; (d) Shops, salesrooms or showrooms for the conduct of wholesale or retail business; (e) Workrooms connected with retail business; (f) Garages, petrol selling bowsers or service stations; (g) Businesses sometimes classified as Noxious Trades as defined hereunder:—Fish shops, fish curing establishments, which have an output of not more than 5 cwt. of product perweek, laundry and cleaning establishments, dye works in a small way, marine stores excepting where they deal with bones and similar offensive materials; (h) Light manufactory or light industrial establishments such as dressmaking establishments, bootmaking and repairing shops (but not boot factories), harness and saddle makers, bookbinding, printing and newspaper establishments, painting and oil shops, produce stores, ships' chandlers, small goods shops, undertakers' premises, watchmakers' shops, bakeries, butcher shops (not developing any power), builders' yards, oil fuel depots, aerated water factories, blacksmiths, establishments using oxy or electric welding plant; (i) Such other accessory or ancillary uses as the Local Authority may determine but shall not include any heavy industrial or heavy manufactory.
- (4) No public street or public reserve shall be used as a petrol selling station nor shall petrol bowsers be erected or maintained therein.
- (5) Where dwellings or residential quarters are crected in conjunction with shops or other business on

the same lot of land each dwelling or residence shall have at least 6,000 square feet of area allotted and available to it. Provided that where a separate Crown Grant or Certificate of Title has been issued at the date of the Scheme for a lot or parcel of land less than 6,000 square feet in area, this clause shall not apply.

Provision 1 (c)—Residential Districts.

- (1) The residential districts include all lands not included in Schedules hereto.
- (2) Where residences are erected at the date of the gazettal of the Scheme no additional residences, dwellings, or buildings shall be erected nor re-erected unless a plan or sub-division or re-subdivision or lease shall have been approved under the provisions of the Town Planuing and Development Act, 1928, and amendments.
- (3) No lot in the residential district shall be covered by buildings to a greater extent than one third of the area of such lot.
- (4) Not more than one single family dwelling shall be erected on any lot or parcel of land of less area than 6,000 square feet and at least 6,000 square feet of land shall be provided for each dwelling provided that this provision shall not apply to land or lots of lesser area than 6,000 square feet for which a Crown Grant or Certificate of Title had been issued at the date of gazettal of the Scheme.
- (5) No lot or parcel of land shall be built on until the land is drained to the satisfaction of the Council and its building surveyor and in accordance with the Health Act and until provision has been made for the disposal of roof water and house sullage to the satisfaction of the Council and its building surveyor.
- (6) No building in the residential district shall be erected closer to the street boundary on the frontage than 25 feet, provided that where the majority of the dwellings erected at the date of gazettal of the Scheme between the two nearest cross streets are a less distance from the street boundary than 25 feet, any building shall not be closer than either of the adjoining nearest houses and in this case the position of the new building to be fixed by the Council. On corner blocks the distance the buildings to be set back from the side street to be fixed by the Council.
- (7) Public buildings, places of worship or other institutional buildings (including private hospitals) may be erected in the residential districts by resolution of the Council amending the provisions of the Scheme for such purpose.
- (8) Boarding houses will be permitted in the residential district.

Provision 1 (d)—Tenement or Apartment House District.

- (1) The erection of tenement or apartment houses is confined to the area described in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the plan of the Scheme as the Commercial District.
- (2) In the construction of these provisions, unless the context otherwise requires:—(a) The expression "tenement house" shall mean a dwelling house containing two or more flats or tenements and to include semi-detached houses, viz., two tenements with one party wall; (b) The expression "Habitable rooms" shall include bedrooms, dining rooms, sitting rooms, and kitchens, but shall not include bathrooms, water closets, pantries and storerooms, or kitchens used for cooking only (for these purposes any room utilised for the partaking of meals shall be classified as a dining room); (c) The expression "floor area" applied to a tenement shall mean the aggregate superficial areas of so many horizontal sections thereof as there are floors in the said tenement. The horizontal section of each floor shall be made at the point of its greatest surface dimensions, exclusive of external walls.
- (3) The number of apartment or tenement houses to be erected to the acre within the area of Geraldton Town Planning Scheme shall not exceed:—(a) Tenement houses capable of being divided into two flats, two to the acre; (b) Tenement houses capable of being divided into more than two flats, one to the acre. Provided that the total number of flats to be constructed in any tenement house shall not exceed six. This provision shall not apply to a single family dwelling house, which may be creeted anywhere within the district of the Scheme upon a subdivisional allotment of land,

- (4) Where a building is let or occupied in flats or tenements, each flat or tenement shall be deemed to be a separate house or dwelling.
- (5) A tenement house consisting of one floor only shall not cover an area exceeding half of the allotment or parcel of land upon which it is built. Where a tenement house has more than one floor, the total space of the allotment to be left unbuilt upon shall be at least equal to the total floor area of the building erected thereon.
- (6) No person shall erect, or have or permit or suffer to be erected any tenement house to contain or containing more than two floors in height.
- (7) Each tenement shall be self-contained and shall be provided with a separate kitchen, separate bathroom and separate water closet on the same floor as the other rooms of such tenement, and each tenement shall be provided with a separate entrance, and when the tenement is not on the ground floor, the stairway shall be of brick, stone or concrete.
- (8) The total floor area of each separate tenement shall be at least 450 square feet, and, in addition, there shall be attached thereto open verandah space for the exclusive use of such tenement at least 100 square feet in floor area.
- (9) The minimum floor area to each habitable room shall be 100 square feet and the average floor area for such rooms of any tenement shall be 110 square $f^{\mu\nu}$. Where kitchens utilised for cooking only are permitted the floor area under any circumstances to be not less than 70 square feet.
- (10) Any person who constructs, alters or redesigns any premises in contravention of this Scheme shall within 30 days from notice given by the Geraldton Municipal Council remove, pull down, or alter any building so as to comply with the Scheme.
 - (11) Terraced houses are prohibited.

Provision 11—Preservation of Amenities.

- (1) No part of a building or of anything annexed to a building which is exposed to public view shall be used for advertising purposes, or for the erection of hoardings or signs, or structures for advertising purposes thereon, and no person shall maintain any sign, advertisement, or hoarding in contravention of this provision. Provided that the owner or occupier of business premises bona fide used as such may with the consent of the Local Authority and in accordance with any by-laws of the Local Authority and not in conflict with the provisions of the Scheme:—(a) Where the premises are provisions of the Scheme:—(a) Where the premises are in a residential district exhibit his name or trade or calling on any portion of the front of the building except the roof; (b) Where the premises are in a business area or industrial area: (i) Exhibit his name and trade or calling on any portion of the front of the building except the roof; (ii) In addition except on the front. ing except the roof: (ii) In addition, erect on the front of the premises hoardings, signs or structures for the purpose of advertising the goods sold or the nature of the business or businesses conducted in the premises: (iii) Erect in the commercial or industrial district illuminated signs which are (a) do not extend higher than the roof line of the building on which they are erected (b) do not overlang the public street or project beyond the face of the main building to which they are affixed a greater distance than provided in the by-laws pertaining thereto (e) do not include or exhibit any colour which in the opinion of the Council may be seen by and constitute a danger to traffic by land, sea or air.
- (2) Nothing in this provision shall prevent the continued use of hoardings, signs, or advertising devices erected or used for advertising purposes at the date of gazettal of the Scheme for a period of six months from such date of gazettal. Provided that the Council may subject to the compensation clauses of the Act require the removal of any hoarding, sign or advertising device not conforming to the provisions of the Scheme.

 (3) Where in the opinion of the Council the condi-
- (3) Where in the opinion of the Council the condition of any premises, land, garden curtilage or private open space in the area of the Scheme any building, structure, fence or work on any such premises is such as to interfere with the amenities of any district or tends to the depreciation in the value of adjoining properties or interferes with the reasonable enjoyment of his property by a neighbouring property owner or occupier, whether such interference amounts to a legal nuisance or not, the Council by resolution may serve a notice on the owner by addressing a registered letter

- to his last known place of address requiring him within a reasonable time to be specified in the notice, not being less than one month, to take such action and to execute such works, including works or removal as may be necessary to abate the nuisance.
- (4) When in the opinion of the Council the facade or appearance of any building to be erected is likely to detract from the value or amenity of such building, street or neighbourhood, the Council may require the plans for such building to be altered or amended to be in harmony with the exteriors of adjacent or neighbouring buildings before approving of such plans, in accordance with the Municipal Corporations Act and this Scheme, and the Council may prevent the erection of ugly buildings which may destroy local amenities.

First Schedule.

Area comprising the Scheme.

(a) The gazetted area of the Municipality.

Industrial District No. 3.—Sub-lots 31-32 fronting Chapman road, all land held by the Railway Department at the date of the Scheme. 6. No person shall wash or soak clothing in any dam on these Reserves.

No person shall commit or cause to be committed any act to cause contamination or pollution of any water on these Reserves.

8. No person shall light or cause to be lighted unv fire on these Reserves except in such places as are set aside for that purpose.

No person shall occupy, camp on or make use of these Reserves for a continuous period exceeding 48 hours, unless permission in writing is obtained from the secretary of the Board.

The secretary of the Board or other officer appointed by the Board, or any officer of the Police Force, may demand from and require of any individual committing any offence against or breach of these by-laws, his name and address, and every person who shall refuse or neglect to give his name and address when required so to do shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

11. Every person offending against any provision of these by-laws shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
